Transport activity signals city's economic success

New transport data shows half of Hamilton's peak hour traffic (7am - 9am) is made up of commuters from outside the city.

Better roads, more transport options and a thriving job market are cementing Hamilton's reputation as a business powerhouse. And it's the city's status as an economic hub for the region which is helping draw large volumes of commuters each workday.

The large number of commuters coming from outside the city can be linked to a variety of factors:

- Increased employment opportunities, with job numbers growing 4.4% in the year to June 2022. As of 2021, there were 100,420 jobs filled in the city. Hamilton's unemployment rate fell to 4.3% in July this year.
- An uplift in commercial, industrial and logistics activity at locations such as Waikato Innovation Park and the Te Rapa precinct.
- Improved transport connections such as the new Cobham Drive bridge over Wairere Drive and the newly opened Hamilton section of the Waikato Expressway.

Attracting workers and visitors into the city leads to more transactions with city businesses. This is reflected in electronic card spending in the city which increased 7.4% in the June quarter when compared to the first quarter of 2022.

Ruakura Superhub opening soon

Tainui Group Holdings (TGH) are on track to open the Ruakura Inland Port in the last quarter of this year.

Ruakura has a direct connection to the four-lane Waikato Expressway, helping future proof the area as the city's next economic hub. The development of the Ruakura Superhub will deliver 6000 - 12,000 jobs over the next 10 years.
