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Kia Ora,

I refer to your **information request below**, Hamilton City Council is able to provide the following response.

**Request one:**

I would like specifics per day, week, month & year (over the last four years if possible) within the city for:

- Trips made by bike/cycles
- Trips made by car/vehicles
- Trips made on foot/pedestrians
- Trips made by public transport i.e. by bus

**Response one:**

Hamilton City Council, like most other Councils, does not count or keep records of all transport modes within the city on a daily basis. Unfortunately, we are therefore unable to supply the information you request above as this information does not exist per [s17\(e\) of LGOIMA](#). While this is the case, Council can provide you with other sources of data that staff use to indicate levels of use of different transport modes across the city.

Some general information is available from [Figure NZ](#), which is a snapshot from the 2018 census. Some of this information has been presented in the [Access Hamilton Strategy August 2022](#) (see page 18).

The links below are publicly available and supply information relating to cycling, walking and traffic counts at multiples locations within Hamilton, where Council has installed strategic counters:

While Council has installed more city-wide pedestrian counters in recent years, only five or six historical locations are publicly available. These are available from our pedestrian count data (the last link above) when filtered to the 'EcoVisio' source system. Given the uptake of multi-mode

use, Council has identified the need to capture more data and will continue to install more counters across the city to capture this.

**Request two:**

How many on street parking spaces were in the CBD in 2020 and how many on streets parks there are in the CBD now.

**Response two:**

In 2020, there were 1,356 on-street carparks. As of 6 October 2022, there are 1,299 on-street carparks.
