## Your request:

The article mentioned that some councillors approved the move while others were opposed to the move. The article does not mention the name of any of councillors. Are you able to share the names of the councillors who were for the move and the names of the councillors who were against the move. Please also advise if any councillors had a neutral view for the move or didn't vote of the move and their names too.

## Our response:

The Anglesea Street public transport improvements went to the Infrastructure and Transport Committee meeting on 7 March 2023 as part of a report on the Low-Cost Low Risk Transport Improvement Programme. The agenda, minutes and livestream recording of the meeting can be found here.

The resolution was as follows:

That the Infrastructure Operations Committee:

- receives the report;
