Our response:

The data provided below is for Hamilton City boundaries for the period of 1 July 2023 – 31 October 2024.

In July 2023 Hamilton City Council started a new road maintenance contract with Downer Group and reporting requirements were significantly enhanced to enable spend to be traced by categories, including potholes. Prior to this, pothole repairs were captured as part of the general

footpath maintenance budget and are unable to be separated out as a specific category within that budget as requested.


