Please find below my reasoning and supporting information for why I **OPPOSE ALL** of the Weston lea limited – Amberfield Development Resource Consent.

RE: Safety of local resident's current and future plus visitors to the Peacocke area during and post construction due to unsafe and not fit for purpose roading.

As a very experienced builder and manager of developments across New Zealand I am well aware of the heavy machinery and heavy traffic required to construct such a large development. Plus, the significant increase in traffic volume pre and post construction.

The uniqueness of this proposed large SATELLITE development (where you go from residential housing then to rural for approximately 2kms then back to proposed residential) does not have sufficient safe roading to access the proposed Amberfield development. There are only 3 access routes Bader, Dixon and Raynes Rd.

Both Bader and Dixon are streets full of families and many of these with young children and many of whom are out on the streets at many times unsupervised, especially through Bader.

This is no place heavy vehicles and high-volume construction traffic over months and months should be traveling.

I have lived in Peacockes Rd with my family for over 27 years and in Anthony crescent off Pine avenue off Bader street for 20years through my childhood. I am well qualified in knowing these streets.

Then once the heavy trucks and construction vehicles get through these streets we are presented with a very narrow country road being Peacockes road. A country road with no footpaths, no cycle ways and no curb & channel. With some areas not having a centre line. All at 80kph. Photo's

showing the road and width are pasted below. I will be providing a video at my presentation of this submission showing the reality of the existing Peacockes road.

This road is not appropriate for high volume construction or heavy vehicle traffic. Please note the amount of road available when two heavy vehicles pass each other. I am disappointed these Safety issues haven't been highlighted within the *TDG Integrated Transportation Assessment Report*.

I can speak with some authority on this topic due to my experience with heavy vehicles. I have provided a copy of my license showing all the heavy traffic licenses I hold. Which is every NZ heavy traffic licence possible. *Pasted below.*

There are obvious Safety concerns for all other traffic including cyclists and pedestrians.

These concerns I have, have also recently been expressed by councillor Dave McPherson.. newspaper article.

Access to Amberfield was a big concern for Councillor Dave Macpherson, who was alarmed to hear Bader Street would be the main route pending a new bridge over Waikato River.

Getting there through Dixon Road was longer but preferable, he said.

"We shouldn't create a situation where we're pouring a lot of traffic through an area where a lot of young families live."

Dave Macpherson and my concerns are unfortunately substantiated with the recent deaths we have had on our country roads. I'm sure most councillors will agree with these concerns once they are better informed.

A man struck and killed in the darkness of a Waikato road was pushing a trolley along the road at the time.

He is one of two pedestrians to die on rural roads on the outskirts of Hamilton on Wednesday after another man was killed while out walking his dog.

Whilst I'm opposed to the development due to the serious roading safety risk to many people including children. I would support the development post the construction of the council approved and budgeted new bridge and the completed construction of the proposed roads that would provide suitable and safe roading via the new bridge access from main arterial routes. This is supported in the

TDG Integrated Transportation Assessment Report and can be deciphered within the below TDG summary.

9. Summary and Conclusions

The Amberfield subdivision in Peacockes is planned to accommodate approximately 1,000 households between Peacockes Road and the Waikato River. The main access to the site will be provided by the Peacockes Road-Norrie Street-Bader Street route until the Southern Links infrastructure proposals are commenced, possibly through the HIF.

The WRTM in association with 2016 traffic counts has been used to assess how the existing transport network in the study area to the southwest of Hamilton currently operates, how it is expected to operate in the future and the impact of the development of the Amberfield subdivision on the network.

The current network is operating acceptably with the exception of the intersections on Ohaupo Road (SH 3) with Dixon Road and Raynes Road where the side roads are performing at a level of service F at peak times. However a new roundabout is proposed on SH3 to resolve the issue at Dixon Road and Raynes Road is likely to be relieved when the Waikato Expressway is completed. The former will allow local traffic to divert from the Bader Street route and the latter will reduce traffic on Ohaupo Road.

The Amberfield subdivision could generate unacceptable delays at the Normandy Avenue /
Lorne Street intersection towards the completion of the subdivision. However it has been
identified that improvements could be implemented to mitigate this effect. They involve

the construction of a signalised left turn lane on the southern approach which is expected to be able to be implemented within the current road reserve. If the HIF infrastructure projects, such as the proposed new river bridge and the Wairere Drive extension, are in place before the Amberfield subdivision is completed, the Normandy Avenue / Lorne Street improvements are unlikely to be necessary.

If the subdivision is developed prior to the possible HIF upgrading of Peacockes Road, a shared off-road pedestrian and cyclist facility along the rural section of Peacockes Road will be required to ensure safe and efficient operation of the road with the traffic generated by the subdivision. Bus services will also need to be provided once the subdivision has been developed to a level that creates sufficient demand to justify a bus service. Such provision for alternative modes could also trigger lesser effects on access roads from vehicular traffic and reduce the need for mitigation. This can be reviewed as the subdivision progresses and as the status of the HIF is determined.

As well as providing safe and efficient transportation links to adjacent areas and the wider network, the subdivision proposal provides an internal network of traffic, cyclist and pedestrian facilities that will ensure convenient and safe accessibility, connectivity and amenity. This will be integrated with the adjacent sections of Peacockes Road which will be upgraded to either a minor arterial or collector road standard depending on the Council's requirements at the time.

This report clearly shows there is many logical Health and Safety reasons the right approach is to delay the Amberfield development until the proposed new bridge and roading is in place.

Development in the south is inevitable and is positive for the city. Let's do it in a safe and managed way for all existing residents and the future residents (including Amberfield residents) who will want a safe environment for their community. To ensure this we must not rush and we must have safe roading in place.

Safe roading is one of the first parts of development infrastructure that needs to future proof any new development. The Amberfield development is trying to cut corners and these corners could have server consequences to the health and wellbeing of many Hamiltonians or our visitors. The Hamilton City councillors need to understand the risk and accept these should they allow the subdivision to proceed without the planned appropriate new roading in place.

In summary my note above clearly shows there is significant safety risk to all the residents on route to the development and the risk can be averted by delaying the Amberfield development until the new bridge and roading is constructed.

Should the council wish, I'm more than happy to do a letter drop or door knock to the homes on route to see if my views are supported by the residents along the routes. I expect they will be.

I look forward to presenting my opposed submission to the Council.





SUBMISSION DETAILS:

I **oppose** parts or all of the application of the Resource Consent on the application made by made by Weston Lea Limited to subdivide land at 337-461 Peacockes Road, Hamilton.

ADDITIONAL DETAILS:

- 1. The particular parts of the application I oppose are:
 - 1.1. The inadequate provision for safe and efficient road access to the proposed subdivision in the initial period of the development, when the proposed arterial access roads, including a bridge over the Waikato River, have not been constructed.
- 2. The reasons for my submission are:
 - 2.1. A lack of consideration has been given to negative impacts of increased road traffic on the activities, safety and wellbeing of local residents, schools and businesses. The AEE has not considered the impact of additional light and heavy traffic along the proposed access roads on residents and on people using a day care centre, a kohanga reo, two busy shopping centres, bus stops, and a playing field. The roads would become more dangerous for cyclists. As well, Bader Street and Norrie Street and neighbouring streets in particular are home to many children who are often seen playing on the street and walking to and from their primary and secondary schools. There are only two pedestrian crossings on all of these access roads and no more are planned (c.f. City Council proposed mitigation measures). These crossings would be inadequate with additional traffic, including heavy trucks.
 - 2.2. The impacts of heavy vehicles associated with the proposed subdivision development on the local roads has not been described or considered adequately. These roads are not designed for heavy traffic as their condition and configuration shows. The cartage of bulk sand supplies into the area for building platforms has apparently been ignored.
 - 2.3. There has been no direct consultation with people who live along the local residential streets which would be affected by increased traffic in their neighbourhoods. Consultation has been inadequate.
 - 2.4. The mitigation measures proposed by the City Council for the local access roads (Bader, Norrie, Peacocks, Waterford and Dixon) to be used by subdivision residents

and construction traffic are superficial and inadequate. In particular, they would not result in wider carriage ways, or provide adequate road parking space, or improve the safety of pedestrians crossing these roads, or improve the sharp corner on Peacockes Road near the junction with Norrie Street.

- 2.5. No timetable has been confirmed for these proposed mitigation measures. Therefore, it is uncertain whether they would be completed before development began.
- 2.6. Traffic volume counts used in the AEE are out of date. In the past two years there has been substantially increased traffic through Bader /Norrie / Peacockes / Waterford/ Dixon roads. This increase appears to be associated with new subdivisions in the Dixon Road area and the behaviour of because motorists from SH3 attempting to avoid traffic congestion on Ohaupo Road by using Dixon, Waterford/Bader streets to get to central Hamilton. These recent increases in traffic movements have not been taken into account.
- 2.7. The subdivision relies on the public provision of roading infrastructure, however, there is no definite timetable for this provision, costings have not been completed, resource consents have not been obtained and funding has not been secured. This means that existing services such as road access could have to be relied upon for a substantial period, further overloading them.
- 3. The decision I wish the Council to make is:
 - 3.1. Decline the application.
 - 3.2. Allow the application to be resubmitted if and when the Southern Links arterial access roading and bridge infrastructure that is to service the proposed subdivision is in place.
 - 3.3. We have a pitiful record of considering the plight of our endangered species. These bats will be doomed to extinction if we deprive them of yet another habitat.


Everyone will benefit in many ways from having a forest reserve added to the resources of the city e.g. visual impact from the other bank, a recreational resource for walking, cycling etc.



The following submission is on behalf of Cycle Action Waikato, cawaikato@can.org.nz.

Cycle Action Waikato is a collective of cyclists from Hamilton and the Waikato who are passionate to see the region become a safe and attractive place for people on bikes of all ages and skill sets. CAW believe that by encouraging more people on to bikes during their day to day lives the city and region will benefit, through improved health, reduced congestion and better lifestyle. To encourage more people of all ages on to bikes the status quo needs challenging when considering and promoting healthy modes of transport.

CYCLE ACTION WAIKATO SUPPORTS THE FOLLOWING:

- 1. CAW supports the typical cross section for Amberfield minor arterial roads with the 3.0m shared path for people cycling and walking. This provides a safe and accessible route for vulnerable healthy transport users separate from vehicle traffic.
- 2. CAW supports the cycle path network on Figure 19 of the ITA (appendix I), and recommends conditions requiring the off-road cycle path in Figure 20 be extended all the way along Peacockes Road, through the roundabout at Waterford Rd, to Norrie St as noted below. The alternative access north should be considered if it can provide a more accessible route with grades suitable for all users.
- 3. CAW supports the use of the shared path in Section 4.6 and Figure 20 of the ITA, and the provision of lighting for safety and security at night.
- 4. CAW supports the comment in Section 8.5 that even minor enhancements that promote healthy transportation use will have a large impact on reducing vehicle congestion in and out of Amberfield. CAW recommends conditions that require these enhancements be implemented in the early stages of the design, to reduce the need for retrofitting at a later date. Early inclusion of these measures will help facilitate the adoption of healthy modes of transport by the first occupants of Amberfield.
- 5. CAW supports the implementation of side road intersection treatments off Peacockes Road in Figure 23, giving priority to vulnerable users crossing the side roads.

CYCLE ACTION WAIKATO OPPOSE THE FOLLOWING:

 CAW opposes the roundabout design at Peacockes Rd/Waterford Rd where people biking are required to share with people driving. CAW recommends conditions requiring safe separated paths for people biking and walking to navigate the roundabout. Submission for Resource Consent application by Weston Lea Limited for Land Use and Subdivision applications at 337-461 Peacockes Road, Hamilton.

- 2. CAW opposes the proposal to place all people on bicycles on Peacockes Road with ALL vehicle traffic between the Peacockes Rd traffic island and the shared off-road path heading into Weston Lea Drive, as shown in Figure 22. The proposed treatment serves to isolate any commuters wishing to take an alternative mode of transport to or from the development. CAW recommends conditions requiring a separated shared path in this area, to help people on bicycles move safely through and past the proposed roundabout.
- 3. CAW opposes the "Local Road with Cycle Lanes: 20m", 18A of the ITA. CAW recommends a separate off-road shared path for people walking and people biking to encourage healthy transport use including children and the elderly who may not feel safe or confident cycling on roads next to vehicle traffic.

CYCLE ACTION WAIKATO ALSO PROPOSE THE FOLLOWING:

- CAW recommends that the alternative modes mitigation, mentioned in Section 8.5, be
 considered the baseline for transportation choice. The benefits of a higher, earlier uptake
 in alternative modes of transport will benefit the development and the city together.
 Encouraging a change in modal use at a later date may prove a much harder task than
 anticipated.
- CAW recommends conditions requiring the development of the Cycleway / Walkway bridge across the Waikato River from the Peacockes Area to the Hamilton Gardens, noted in 3.2 Peacockes Structure Plan, Figure 12: "Proposed Roading Network Contained Within Structure Plan".
 - This connection would open up an additional healthy transport route to a larger part of the city, reducing the pressure on the existing Peacockes Rd/Bader St network.
- CAW recommends the local roads with cycle lanes (18A) are modified to use off-road shared paths to help keep healthy transport users completely separate from people in cars and encourage high uptake of healthy transport options in and around the Amberfield and wider Peakcockes area.
- 4. CAW recommends the exception made on Page 54 of the ITA becomes a requirement, "modifying the collector road standard to provide....shared paths instead of on-road cycle lanes."
- 5. CAW recommends conditions requiring a shared use path along the external cycle links corridor noted in red on Figure 19 of the ITA and noted in grey as "Future North / South Arterial" in Figure 22. This connection would direct healthy transportation users away from the Peacockes Rd/ Waterford Rd roundabout, providing a safer route to Cobham Dr Bridge and access to the hospital, CBD and Hamilton East along existing healthy transport routes.

Submission for Resource Consent application by Weston Lea Limited for Land Use and Subdivision applications at 337-461 Peacockes Road, Hamilton.

6. CAW recommends conditions that require all local minor park edge roads, Figure 18B of the ITA, incorporate a shared path on the park side of the road to allow complete access to the open space facilities by all users.

CAW supports the development of new areas within Hamilton City and suggests that the Amberfield development can become a great model for the city's commitment to healthy transport options, with the results benefiting community health, roading infrastructure cost reductions, and decreased vehicle traffic congestion to, from, and within the area.

CAW recommends conditions requiring collaboration with community groups such as Cycle Action Waikato and Living Streets Hamilton throughout the detailed design stage of the development.

Director-General's interest in the application

- 1. The Director-General of Conservation ('the Director-General') has all the powers reasonably necessary to enable the Department of Conservation ('the Department') to perform its functions. A function of the Department is to advocate the conservation of natural and historic resources generally. Section 2 of the Conservation Act 1987 defines 'conservation' to mean 'the preservation and protection of natural and historic resources for the purpose of maintaining their intrinsic values, providing for their appreciation and recreational enjoyment by the public, and safeguarding the options of future generation'.
- The decisions sought in my submission are required to ensure that the proposed development recognises and provides for the matters of national importance listed in Section 6 of the Resource Management Act 1991 (the Act) and to have particular regard to the other matters in

Section 7 of the Act, as well as promoting sustainable management of natural and physical resources.

Summary of the Director General's concerns

- The proposed development site contains some high conservation values including: as a roosting (including maternity roosts), foraging, and commuting habitat for the nationally critical longtailed bat, lizard species such as the copper skink and their habitats, and freshwater values in the downstream environment (Waikato River).
- 2. The proposed subdivision and land use activities have the potential to adversely affect long-tailed bats, freshwater, and herpetofauna values at the site and within the surrounding landscape. No certainty is provided in the application to satisfy the Director-General's concerns (as laid out below). The proposed development will have a potentially significant impact on the habitat of long-tailed bats in an area where their habitat is highly restricted. The disturbance from the proposed activities will result in the loss of potential maternity and other roost trees, reduce the available roosting and foraging habitat and limit the connectivity of the remaining suitable bat habitat in the surrounding area potentially rendering habitat unavailable. There is also the potential for the proposed developments to have a negative impact on lizard species located within the proposed development site. Limited information has been presented by the applicant regarding the watercourses located at the site and the potential effects of the proposed activities in the downstream environment. It is acknowledged that currently the conservation values of the watercourses are low, however this does not preclude the potential for them to be restored and support higher values into the future.

My reasons for submission are that:

- 3. The proposed subdivision and landuse activities have the potential to cause negative effects on the freshwater values through the proposed instream works and effects of sediment entering watercourses. The proposal will result in the loss of about 250 metres of intermittent and ephemeral watercourses.
- 4. I understand that there is proposed enhancement of the watercourses on the site which will be detailed in a stream mitigation plan. This plan has not been provided with the application and there is no certainty on what it contains. It is therefore difficult to assess its adequacy at mitigating the potential effects of the proposed activity on the freshwater values.

- 5. There may be the potential for sediment to enter the water courses on the site during storm events and earthmoving activities which will have negative impacts on the freshwater values in the downstream environment (the Waikato River).
- 6. There is strong policy direction in the Hamilton City Council District Plan to avoid adverse effects on Significant Natural Areas (Policy 20.2.1d, 20.2.1e, 20.2.1f, 20.2.1g, 20.2.1j, 20.2.1k, 20.2.1n). These policies give effect to policies 11.1 and 11.2 in the Waikato Regional Council Regional Policy Statement and implement the District Plan objective 20.2.1:

"Significant Natural Areas are protected, maintained, restored and enhanced"

Given the policy direction in the Hamilton City Council District Plan, the negative effects associated with the proposed landuse and subdivision activities on the long-tailed bat population should be avoided, remedied, or offset

- 7. The site is used as a commuting and foraging corridor for long-tailed bats and the impacts of the proposal are likely to be very high on the local long-tailed bat population. The proposed subdivision and landuse activities mostly avoid the mapped Significant Natural Areas alongside the Waikato River riparian margin, however the effects of the proposed activities will likely have a negative effect on the habitat of long-tailed bats in the vicinity of the proposed development with potential consequences for the long-term viability of the population. The applicant states that the disturbance from the proposed activities will likely make the site, in effect, permanently impermeable to bats. I agree with this assessment and note that it is possible that the loss of habitat may lead to a local extinction particularly in conjunction with the proposed future development in the Peacockes Structure Plan area. Previous studies have identified reduced bat occupancy in parts of Hamilton with more intensive urbanisation, lighting, and noise, therefore it is likely that the proposed development will have a large negative effect on the local bat population.
- 8. The applicant has stated that the trees located at the site are unlikely to be frequently used as roost sites. I disagree with this statement and note that more survey work would be required to qualify this.
- 9. I understand there is some additional work being undertaken to identify areas in the South Hamilton area to off-set or compensate for the potential effects of the proposed activities on

the local long-tailed bat population through the development of a bat management plan. There is no certainty on what this management plan contains. Without seeing this plan, it is difficult to assess the effectiveness of any mitigation offsetting or compensation that could potentially be used in support of the application.

- 10. The application documents discuss the mitigation of potential negative effects on herpetofauna through the use of a Lizard Management Plan. This plan has not been provided with the application and I understand that it will be developed in conjunction with an application for a Wildlife Act Authority. There is no certainty on what the Lizard Management Plan contains. It is difficult to assess the proposed mitigation without seeing the Lizard Management Plan and therefore its adequacy at mitigating the potential effects associated with the proposed activities.
- 11. The information provided with the application is insufficient to determine the potential effects that the proposed development will have on any lizards present at the site. A lizard survey has not been undertaken by the applicant. The applicant does not provide any evidence that the proposed vegetation planting will have a net benefit for lizards located at the site. The applicant has assessed the impact of the proposed activities has having a very low ecological effect on lizards. I disagree with the statement. The scale and nature of the proposed activities may cause the loss of any resident lizard species at the site.

The Director-General seeks the following decisions from the consent authority:

12. I seek the following:

- a) That the consent authority declines the applications unless suitable conditions are imposed such as, but not limited to, requiring the applicant to engage and consult with the Department regarding the development of a Bat Management Strategy, Stream Management Plan, Lizard Management Plan; and,
- b) Suitable conditions are imposed to ensure that any Bat Management Strategy developed contains, but is not limited to: quantitative outcomes for the maintenance and enhancement of the Hamilton South long-tailed bat population, the identification of an area, or areas, of bat roosting habitat and associated commuting corridors, a legal means of protecting these areas as ongoing bat habitat, the specification of management and other activities including pest management, vegetation restoration, and further survey work to identify potential roost trees; and,

- c) Suitable conditions are imposed to ensure that any on-site mitigation for the negative effects on bats include, but is not limited to: the retention of any bat feeding, commuting, and potential roosting habitats with effective buffering vegetation between them and the proposed housing, bat sensitive lighting design with appropriate monitoring, ongoing revegetation, noting that there are no, or unlikely to be any, mitigation available to address effects on bats in the short term; and,
- d) Suitable conditions are imposed to ensure that any Stream Mitigation Plan developed contains, but is not limited to, suitable stream restoration objectives, a comprehensive monitoring programme including water quality standards as triggers; and,
- e) Suitable conditions are imposed to ensure that there will be no change in instream clarity in the Waikato River between upstream and downstream of the site during construction; and,
- f) Suitable conditions are imposed to ensure that any Lizard Management Plan developed requires, but is not limited to: a baseline lizard survey undertaken by a suitably qualified herpetologist, a detailed planting plan that with relevant objectives to create lizard habitat that will benefit the local lizard population and ongoing monitoring; and,
- g) Such other relief as may be necessary and appropriate to address my concerns.


