National Profile of Volunteering

Key workers

an employee **[volunteer]** who provides a vital service, especially in the police, health, or education sectors

Volunteers recognised for their contribution and mentioned in various streams of the media alongside NHS staff and other key worker roles

Examples of Innovative volunteering solutions

NHS Responders - Three quarters of a million people applied to be an NHS Volunteer Responder within 48 hours of launch

- Nearly 750,000 people were accepted
- Responders were not asked to do a regular shift but to undertake single tasks
- More people can fit volunteering around existing commitments
