With modified electric 'golf' buggies, volunteer buggy drivers shuttle patients between key hospital locations within the grounds, whilst providing a friendly and helpful welcome.

The buggy service has 10 volunteers who commit to half a day each week on a fixed rota. Each shift last approximately 4-4.5 hours, Monday to Friday. We also have a small number of standby drivers who cover when the regular drivers are unable to .

Buggy service drivers are provided with training, uniform, and ongoing support from the voluntary services team.

Practical Considerations

All volunteers at the hospital are required to:

- complete a criminal records check (DBS)
- complete an occupational health assessment
- provide details of two people able to provide references
- attend an induction

In addition, volunteer buggy drivers will be required to:

- possess a clean driving license (if you have points on your license, please note on your application what these were for)
- attend a driver training and vehicle check session

Please note that buggy driver volunteers must be 21 or over.
