Volunteering For Health Project Update

Our Vision is: "A thriving volunteering culture supports the Staffordshire and Stoke-on-Trent (SSOT) Integrated Care System to deliver high quality health and care for our local population."

We plan to reach this vision by:

- Delivering a step change in the volume of volunteering and the range of volunteering opportunities in SSOT ICS
- Ensuring volunteers have a positive and rewarding volunteering experience
- Creating the infrastructure to enable SSOT ICS workforce to build local VCSE sector capacity at all levels whilst improving their wellbeing
- Enabling strategic leadership and systemwide learning to embed Volunteering for Health ambition in SSOT ICS.

Recent updates and developments:

- Volunteering for Health projects outcomes and milestones have been mapped out and submitted to the National Programme Facilitator. Excitingly, as soon as this document is signed off the programme will officially move into the delivery phase. Watch this space!
- We continue to strengthen our established partnerships, the Steering Group for the project as well as we are developing new connections across the NHS Trusts (UHNM, MPFT & NSCHC). We continue to raise the profile of the Volunteering for Health Programme and its potential to make a positive impact on Health and Care system.
- Working with the national Volunteering for Health programme and its 15 different partnerships on refining the strategy, overcoming barriers and sharing the best practice around shaping new and more sustainable system, including policies and processes and volunteer passporting.

- To design and deliver bespoke Volunteer Management training programme meeting NHS staff needs while raising awareness of best practice when working with volunteers.
