

What we said last year - themes for 2019


- Drought starting to bite in many areas
- Rising input costs
- Fewer quality/scale properties on market




Victoria - 2019 what did happen?

- A divided state
- Northern Vic struggles due to drought
- Central and southern Vic buoyant
- Dairy industry in southern Vic and Tas continues resurgence
- Farmer confidence maintained at levels higher than other states. (source: Rabobank survey)
- Significant rise in (most) land values
- Fewer sales
- Limited stock of larger scale rural property available
- Increasing demand for leasing cropping country


















Temp Water Leasing


























Dairy Sector

- Milk prices up by 40% in 3 years
- Average seasons in S-W Vic and western Gippsland
- Land values rising slightly in southern Vic \$8,000/ha to \$10,000/ha now common
- Changing land use in northern Vic (and southern NSW)



Cropping

- Wimmera and central Vic continue strong growth
- \$6,000/ha \$7,500/ha now common
- Strong demand for land
- Leasing now more common
- Mallee also rising
- \$1,850/ha \$3,500/ha now common




Horticulture

- Land values for most crops were stable through 2019
- Fewer sales
- Commodity prices good
- Wineries chasing red grapes; prices have risen
- Expansion of most crops slowing limited by water



What happens in a dry year?

Horticulture demand and consumptive water availablility downstream of Barmah Choke in Victoria, NSW and South Australia




The yellow and red lines include an allowance of 200 GL for water traded in from the Goulburn and Murrumbidgee valleys. Trade assumptions are approximate and will vary year on year depending on seasonal conditions, crop prices and other drivers.
