Week 2 Budget Week Reports

This week, the Georgia General Assembly met throughout the week to listen to presentations from state departments and other agencies that receive state funding to discuss Governor Kemp's \$32.5 billion spending proposal for the upcoming year. Leading the meetings were Senator Blake Tillery, Chairman of Senate Appropriations, and Representative Matt Hatchett, Chairman of House Appropriations. No Legislative Days were used this week, but Speaker Burns announced Chairmanship assignments for House Committees, so the Georgia General Assembly will be ready to hit the ground running for Legislative Days 5-8 next week.

Governor's Budget

The Fiscal Year (FY) 2024 Budget reflects Governor Kemp's emphasis on supporting Georgia's educational system, with more than \$1.1 billion in funding for K-12 education, and \$303 million earmarked for salary increases for teachers and other certified personnel. This would include raises of \$2,000 next budget year. Governor Kemp also proposed \$61.2 million to the state's HOPE scholarship program, allowing full-time students to save an average of \$444 each year. Also included in the Governor's Budget Report was \$15 million in grant funds to encourage paraprofessionals to pursue teaching certification, \$115 million in AFY 2023 for \$50,000 school safety grants to every K-12 school in the state, and \$25 million for learning loss grants for schools to tailor programs fit to their unique needs. Additionally, \$1 billion is proposed to provide a second state income tax refund to every eligible taxpayer in Georgia, and \$1.1 billion is proposed for a one-time Homeowner Tax Relief Grant program. This would provide property tax relief of, on average, \$500 for every eligible homeowner in Georgia.
