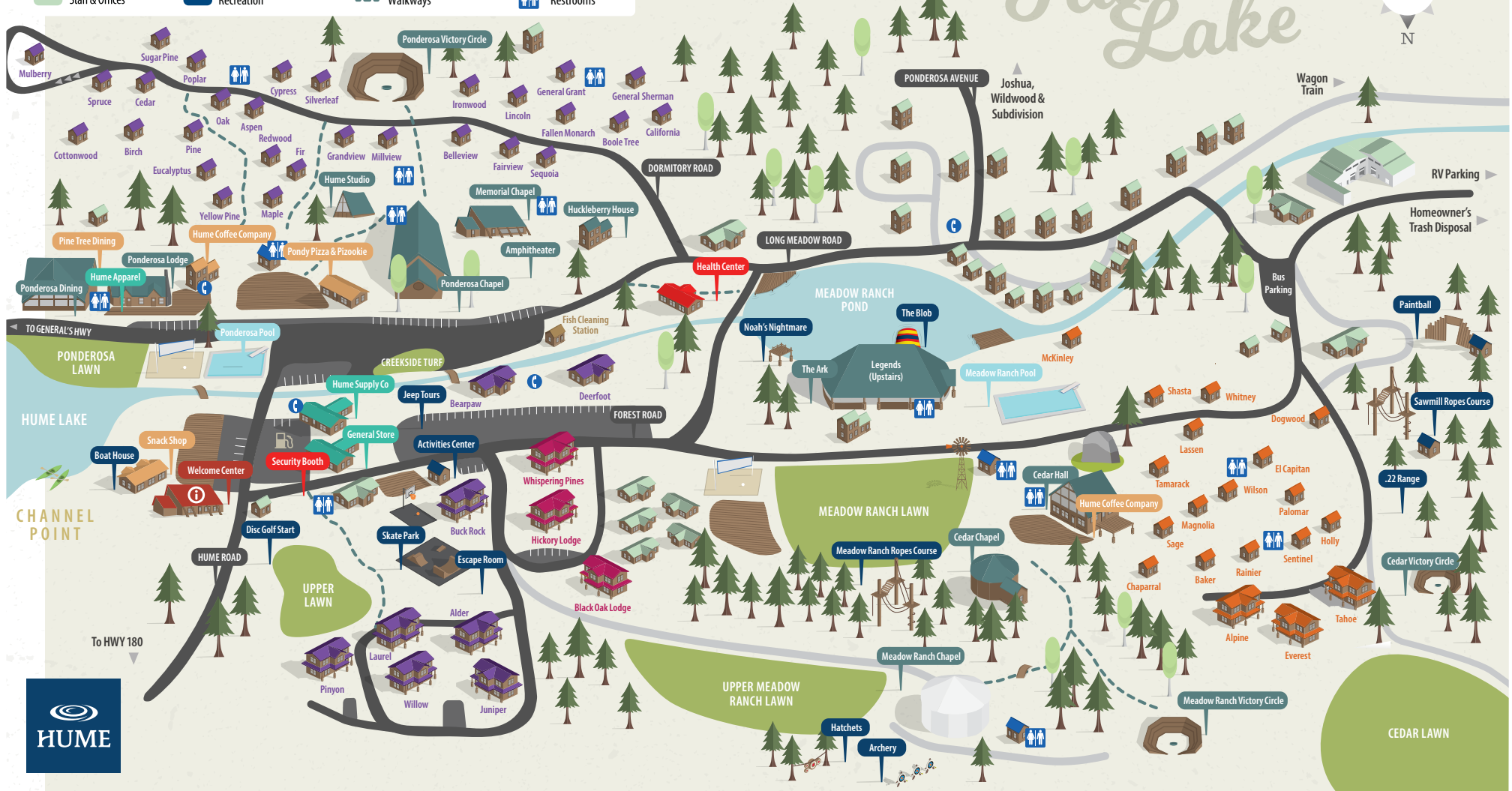
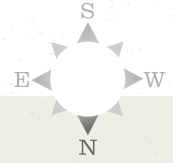

THE HEALTH CENTER

You as a counselor are IN A POSITION to assist in having a safe week.

It is your responsibility to see that your campers' health and safety are maintained while at camp.

- Encourage campers to eat all meals and to drink enough water. Teens need about 48-64 ounces per day. If they are very active, they may need to drink more ounces and will also need to replenish electrolytes. Many common health complaints are a result of dehydration.
- Do not hike or compete in activities barefoot. Bare feet are allowed in the pool and waterfront areas only.
- Be sure to apply sunscreen regularly and use insect repellent.
- Do not swim if you have an earache or sore throat.
- Please monitor your campers to assure compliance with any restrictions they may have (i.e. concussions, water activity restriction, etc.) as you will be held accountable.
- Before leaving camp, don't forget to turn in any equipment lent out to a camper.

VISITING THE HEALTH CENTER

Hours: 8:00am to Lights Out (Closed during Chapel)

- The camp nurse is usually in the Health Center during free time and recreation times but may step away. If your camper is ill or injured, find a Hume Lead Counselor and they will radio the Camp Nurse to meet you there.
- Please discourage friends from coming to the Health Center, only the sick or injured camper and their adult leader is able to enter.
- Please refrain from visiting the Health Center after lights out or during chapel and use discretion to determine what cannot wait until the Health Center is open. If your camper's medical need cannot wait, find a Hume Lead Counselor to radio the Camp Nurse to meet you at the Health Center.

MEDICAL EMERGENCIES:

Remain calm when someone is badly injured or is having a medical emergency. An adult should stay with the camper and send someone to get a Hume staff member with a radio to activate camp EMS or to use any camp phone to dial 911, which will also activate our camp EMS.

MEDICATION

Under California State Law you are not allowed to administer any medicine to a minor, even over the counter medicine. Students are not allowed to have any medicine on them or in their cabin, including over-the-counter medications and supplements. Students are only allowed to have emergency EpiPens, inhalers, and diabetes medications (insulin and glucagon).

We will provide each counselor with a list of the campers in their cabin that have medications to take during meals. Please help to remind them to come and take those medications at the Medication Station in Ponderosa Lodge during the times listed below. Even if they are not prescription, if parents send them with instructions to be given, the students need to take them while they are at camp.

In your cabin there is a lock box for you to keep your medicine and personal belongings. Please store them safely in there.

Students may pick up their medicine at the Ponderosa Lodge during the following times:

- 7:45-9:00am
- 12:15-1:30pm
- 5:00-6:45pm

*****Bedtime meds should be picked up by the counselor at Ponderosa Lodge during dinner.***

CPR TRAINING

If a camper is found unconscious and unresponsive please do the following:

- + **CHECK** the scene, then **CHECK** the person.
- + Tap on the shoulder and shout, "**Are you okay?**" and **quickly look for breathing.**
- + Send someone to **CALL or radio for 9-1-1** if no response and get an AED.
- + AED's are located in: Welcome Center, Ponderosa Dining in the buffet room, Ponderosa Chapel and the Security Truck.
- + If no response & not breathing, **BEGIN CHEST COMPRESSIONS.**
- + Put the heel of one hand on the center of the chest with the heel of the other hand on top of it. Keep your arms straight with shoulders over your hands.
- + Push hard (adult at least 2", child 2"), & fast (100-120/minute, to the rate of the song "Baby Shark").
- + Let the chest rise completely before pushing down again.
- + Continue chest compressions.
- + **DO NOT STOP** unless: You see signs of life, another trained responder arrives and takes over, EMS takes over, you are too tired to continue, to put the AED on, or if the scene becomes unsafe.
- + If an AED arrives, instructions for use are attached to the AED.

FREE TIME

TOURNAMENTS

Get involved in either the Volleyball or Basketball Tournament. The Volleyball Tournament is for teams of 6 players. Teams must include two people of the opposite gender and you may have one counselor.

The Basketball Tournament is for 3 players and each team may have one counselor. Guys play guys, girls play girls.

THE BOATHOUSE

Cost: \$10 per hour for Rowboats/Canoes/Kayaks/Paddleboards || The Boathouse is open every day during Free Time.

ARCHERY

Cost: \$5 for 1 hour session || Sessions are Tuesday and Thursday during Free Time. Sign up at the Activities Center on Sunday night after chapel.

ESCAPE ROOM

Cost: \$10 per person || Sign up at the Activities Center on Sunday night after Chapel.

PAINTBALL

Cost: \$20 per person and includes a full hopper of paintballs. Bring money to purchase extra rounds at \$5 per hopper. || Sign up at the Activities Center on Sunday night after Chapel. Meet in front of the Activities Center for the bus pickup.

HIGH ADVENTURE ROPES COURSE

Cost: \$20 per person || Sign up at the Activities Center on Sunday night after Chapel. Meet in front of the Activities Center for the bus pickup.

SKATE PARK

Cost: FREE || Open every day during Free Time.

DISC GOLF

Cost: \$10 deposit to rent discs from the Skate Park. Full refund once discs are returned. || Hole 1 begins at the Upper Lawn.

METAL CRAFT

Cost: \$5 & Up || Open Tuesday and Friday at 1:30-4:30pm at Creekside Turf.

THE ARK & MEADOW RANCH POND

Cost: FREE || Open every day during Free Time.

RECORDING STUDIO

Cost: \$25 per recording session (single musician or group) || Session includes an hour of time in the recording studio, an emailed .mp3 file attachment of the recording, and one shirt. Additional shirts can be purchased for all members of the recording group for an additional \$10 each. Sign up at the informational meeting each Monday afternoon at 1pm. Recording time slots are Tuesday-Friday 1pm-5pm. ***Session availability is subject to change.*

THINGS TO KNOW

SWIM TESTS

All campers who wish to swim in any body of water at Hume must take a swim test. Swim tests will be held from 1:00-2:00pm on Monday and Tuesday at the Ponderosa Pool. For more info, see a Lifeguard at the Boathouse.

CAMP PHOTO

Cost: \$5 || The camp photo will be taken after recreation on Tuesday. Please turn in your order forms for camp photos by end of day on Tuesday at the General Store.

LATE NIGHT PIZOOKIE

Cost: \$30 || Surprise your students and have a late-night treat at your cabin! Our Hume pizookie is a 9x14 sheet cookie with ice cream on top. Includes plastic silverware and napkins. OUR PHILOSOPHY BEHIND RECREATION

Above all, our desire is that recreation is simply another tool for bringing your students into a living, meaningful relationship with Jesus Christ. It is an opportunity for your students to bond together and for walls to breakdown, allowing trust and friendships to be built. Hopefully, this trust and friendship will translate into enriching conversations in your cabin discussions.

BE INTENTIONAL WITH RECREATION

Encourage your students to get involved. If you are sitting under the tree not wanting to participate or having a bad attitude, they will follow you. Whether you win or lose, remember the point is to have fun and to build unity within your group.

BE RESPECTFUL

It is easy to get a little too competitive, even as counselors. Remember, these students are watching you!! If you are yelling at the refs or are being rude to the other teams, it will just turn ugly. Show your students what it looks like to be competitive with integrity.

TRY TO INCLUDE ALL THE STUDENTS

Try to highlight all your students throughout the different competitions. Some of your students will be more athletic than others, so try to include everyone on your team and look for ways to let each student feel like they are included.

DRESS APPROPRIATELY

Help us by making sure your students are NOT wearing sandals or have bare feet during recreation, unless they are at the pool. Please be sure that students do NOT cut their shirts inappropriately and are NOT wearing short shorts, spandex shorts, or skirts. Some games may be in the pool or lake, and may require you to wear a swimsuit.

MEMORY VERSE GUIDELINES

PHILOSOPHY

In light of recreation as a tool to bring students into a living, meaningful relationship with Jesus Christ, do not limit the use of these memory verses to winning recreation. Memory verses do earn valuable points, but more importantly, they are to assist you in meeting the spiritual needs of your students.

Each day is designed for you to gauge the spiritual temperature of your campers. Do these verses have any relevance, any meaning in their lives? It is your responsibility and privilege to counsel and encourage them.

With the above philosophy in mind, please do not "force feed" your students. If they do not desire to memorize Scripture, they do not have to. In light of the eternal value, not just temporal point value, encourage them as much as possible.

DAILY VERSE GUIDELINES

- + Any translation may be used.
- + Each verse must be said word perfect. No outside assistance.
- + Verses may be recited any day.
- + Scoresheet must be turned in to the Ponderosa Office by 3:00pm on Friday.
- + Counselors may participate in memory verses.
- + Memorized verses count for team points toward recreation.

BONUS VERSE GUIDELINES

- + Any student is eligible to say the bonus verse.
 - + The bonus requires reciting Philippians 2:1-11 before 3:00pm on Friday afternoon.
 - + Students are allowed up to three mistakes for the whole passage (i.e. missing word, wrong word, etc.). No outside assistance.
 - + Bonus verses may be written out, but only if a counselor is present.

MEMORY VERSES

Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves. Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others. Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

MONDAY

DEVOTIONAL: *Jesus is Fully God & Fully Man*

All of Scripture points to Jesus who fulfills the Old Testament prophecies and then establishes the kingdom of God on earth. Jesus is the central figure of the Bible and the central figure of all of human history. Because of this reality, we are all faced with the question, "Who do you say Jesus is?"

At this moment, who is Jesus to you?

Jesus being fully God and fully human is both a confusing and profound truth. Our finite minds may have trouble grasping this reality, so we look to Scripture to help us understand the divinity and humanity of Jesus.

Read Colossians 1:15-20 to learn about the divine nature of Jesus:

"He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation. For by him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities—all things were created through him and for him. And he is before all things, and in him all things hold together. And he is the head of the body, the church. He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in everything he might be preeminent. For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, making peace by the blood of his cross."

Write down what these verses say about the divine nature of Jesus.

Read Hebrews 4:15 and Philippians 2:5-8 to learn about the humanity of Jesus:

"For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sin."

"Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross."

Write down what these verses say about the divine nature of Jesus.

Why is it significant that Jesus is both God and human?

Prayer: Ask God to help you understand the truth of who Jesus is. Thank God that Jesus understands you; He knows you so intimately because He is fully God and fully human.

TUESDAY

DEVOTIONAL: Jesus is The Teacher/Messenger of God's Kingdom

Jesus is not just some random teacher that came onto the scene. He is the Son of God and therefore has authority as the ultimate teacher to whom we must listen and obey.

Read Matthew 7:24-29 about Jesus addressing those listening to His teaching:

"Everyone then who hears these words of mine and does them will be like a wise man who built his house on the rock. And the rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat on that house, but it did not fall, because it had been founded on the rock. And everyone who hears these words of mine and does not do them will be like a foolish man who built his house on the sand. And the rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat against that house, and it fell, and great was the fall of it." And when Jesus finished these sayings, the crowds were astonished at his teaching, for he was teaching them as one who had authority, and not as their scribes."

Jesus' teachings often involve symbolism. After reading these verses, what is Jesus saying about wisdom and obedience?

Why were the crowds astonished at Jesus' teaching?

Throughout His teaching, Jesus often talks about the "kingdom of heaven" or the "kingdom of God. In saying this, He is teaching about a new type of kingdom that is counter-cultural. It is sometimes referred to as the upside-down kingdom because Jesus teaches concepts like "the last will be first, and the first last" (Matthew 20:16). In addition, Jesus often taught in parables which are simple stories that have a deeper message within them. Through parables, He desires for His people to seek Him.

Read these parables about the kingdom of heaven from Matthew 13:44-46:

The Parable of the Hidden Treasure

"The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field, which a man found and covered up. Then in his joy he goes and sells all that he has and buys that field."

The Parable of the Pearl of Great Value

"Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant in search of fine pearls, who, on finding one pearl of great value, went and sold all that he had and bought it."

After reading these two parables, what did you learn about the kingdom of heaven?

What should our response to Jesus' teachings be?

Prayer: Ask God to help you develop a love for and an understanding of Jesus' teachings. Thank God for providing you with His Word, the Bible.

THURSDAY

DEVOTIONAL: Jesus is Messiah & Savior; He is the Only Way to Heaven

Throughout this week, we have learned that Jesus is: Immanuel (God with us), the fulfillment of the Old Testament prophecies, fully God & fully man, the teacher of God’s kingdom, and a miracle worker. **With all of this in mind, read Matthew 16:13-16 which describes an important conversation between Jesus and His disciples:**

“Now when Jesus came into the district of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, “Who do people say that the Son of Man is?” And they said, “Some say John the Baptist, others say Elijah, and others Jeremiah or one of the prophets.” He said to them, “But who do you say that I am?” Simon Peter replied, “You are the Christ, the Son of the living God.”

Simon Peter declares that Jesus is “*the Christ, the Son of the living God.*” Christ means Messiah, Savior, Anointed One, and Chosen One. “*Who do you say that I am?*” is the question that Jesus asked to His disciples, and therefore is a necessary question to ask yourself.

As you have learned about Jesus this week, who do you say He is?

Read the following verses that describe Jesus further:

John 3:16-17

“For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him.”

John 14:6

“Jesus said to him, “I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me.”

Romans 10:9

“If you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved.”

After reading these verses, why did God send His Son to the earth?

In John 14:6 Jesus declares, “*I am the way, and the truth, and the life.*” **What does this mean? Do you believe Jesus is who He says He is?**

Throughout Scripture, we see that Jesus is who He said He is, and that He did what He said He would do. **Have you put your faith and trust in Jesus?**

Prayer: Ask God to help you receive the love that He has for you. He sent His Son Jesus to save you because He loves you so deeply.

FRIDAY

DEVOTIONAL: Jesus is Lord & He Will Return

After Jesus' death, burial, and resurrection, He appears to His disciples before ascending into heaven. **Read Matthew 28:16-20 to hear Jesus' last words spoken to His disciples:** *"Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. And when they saw him they worshiped him, but some doubted. And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."*

What were the disciples' responses to Jesus when they saw Him?

What did Jesus charge His disciples to go do among the nations?

When Jesus says, "I am with you always, to the end of the age," what do those words mean?

Jesus tells His disciples to teach the nations all He has commanded until He returns.

Read Matthew 22:36-40 to see the two greatest commandments:

"Teacher, which is the great commandment in the Law?" And he said to him, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the great and first commandment. And a second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. On these two commandments depend all the Law and the Prophets."

Jesus declares that these two commandments are the basis of all of the laws and commands of Scripture. In essence, when learning how to follow Jesus and obey His commands, these two commandments are a necessary starting point. It's important to recognize that our love for others stems from our love for God.

How can you begin to practice these two commandments?

Read Philippians 2:9-11 about our Lord Jesus Christ:

"Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father."

Jesus is our Savior who has been given authority by God, and He is therefore our Lord. Is Jesus truly Lord of your life?

Prayer: Thank God for being with you always through His Holy Spirit. Ask God to help you love Him and love others.
