Drugs (unless prescribed by a doctor), alcohol, tobacco, vapes, fireworks, firearms, electronic devices.

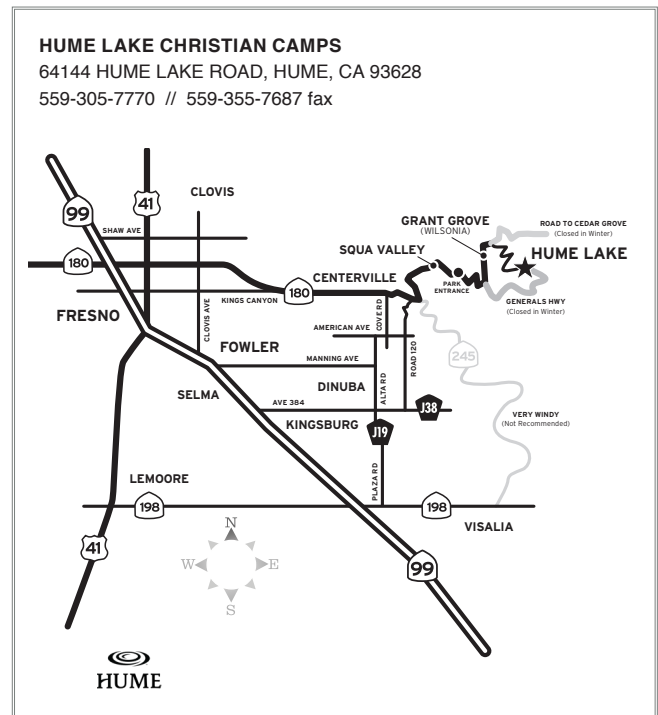
Arrival/Departure:
