

LARRAÑAGA BY THE NUMBERS

- 5 Coach Jim Larrañaga is one of five ACC coaches with a Final Four appearance to his credit. In 2006, Larrañaga became the first coach at a mid-major school to take his team to the NCAA Final Four in 27 years.
- 6 In 31 years of coaching, Jim Larrañaga has a winning record in the NCAA Tournament, a 7-5 mark in six appearances.
- 7 Larrañaga is no stranger to the ACC. In his seven seasons as an assistant coach at Virginia, the Cavaliers participated in the NCAA Final Four in 1981 and 1984, won three ACC Championships and finished in the Top 5 of the rankings.
- 10 The 2015-16 marks the 10th anniversary of Larrañaga's Cinderella run to the 2006 NCAA Final Four with George Mason. Both associate head coach Chris Caputo and director of operations James Johnson were on that GMU staff.
- 15 Larrañaga has made 15 postseason appearances in the past 26 years, including six NCAA tournaments.
- 32 Larrañaga is in his 32nd year as a head coach and has successfully transitioned three institutions into successful programs: Miami, Bowling Green and George Mason.

LARRAÑAGA - WHY MIAMI?

Along with returning to the best basketball conference in the country, Coach L had a few personal reasons for accepting the head coaching job at Miami. Coach's grandfather was from Cuba, where he produced the Larrañaga [lare-en-YAH-ga] cigar. Coach's father was raised in Key West before moving to The Bronx, N.Y., getting married and raising six children. Coach L was raised in The Bronx, but vacationed to Florida as a boy. He also has owned a house in Sarasota - which he bought from Dick Vitale's daughter - and three of his siblings have retired to Florida.

HOT SHOOTING CANES

All 10 scholarship players are shooting at least 42.5 percent from the field, and six players are hitting more than 50 percent of their shots. Sheldon McClellan leads the way with his 59.2 percent shooting, followed by Ivan Cruz Uceda (57.5%), Ebuka Izundu (57.1%) and Kamari Murphy (56.5%).

CANES TOP 10 NATIONALLY IN SHOOTING

Miami is one of seven teams in the country shooting at least 50.7 percent from the field and 41.8 percent from long distance.

The Canes have made more than 50 percent of their shots in 11 of 16 halves this season, including five first halves and six second stanzas. Miami has only shot less than 42 percent once; in the first half of the first game of the year, UM shot 27.6 percent against UTRGV.

THE LAST TIME OUT AGAINST FLORIDA - NOV. 17, 2014

The Canes defeated then-No. 8/7 Florida on Nov. 17 in the Stephen C. O'Connell Center, led by Angel Rodriguez' 22 points in the final nine minutes, draining five 3-pointers in the last seven minutes to help Miami to the win. With the victory, the Canes snapped Florida's 33-game home winning streak and 25-game home non-conference winning streak at the O'Connell Center. The 33-game streak was the third-longest in the country, behind 34 from both Duke and Stephen F. Austin. For a complete recap, check page seven of the notes.

IN 2014, RODRIGUEZ PLAYS D, DRAINS 24 IN WIN OVER FLORIDA

PG Angel Rodriguez scored 22 his 24 points in the final nine minutes against No. 8/7 Florida, draining five 3-pointers in the last seven minutes to help Miami to the win. Rodriguez also showed his strong defense by drawing a charge with three seconds remaining in the game. In 36 minutes, Rodriguez totaled three assists, three steals and two rebounds with his 7-14 shooting, hitting five from distance, and had a 5-7 mark at the free throw line.

LARRAÑAGA VS. FLORIDA

Coach Jim Larrañaga led his Miami team to a win over No. 8/7 Florida in 2014.

In 2006, Larrañaga led George Mason to the NCAA Final Four, falling, 70-58, to the eventual champion Gators, after defeating powerhouses Connecticut, Wichita State, North Carolina and Michigan State.

MIAMI HOLDS THE LEAD

In Miami's seven victories - 1,425 minutes played - the Canes have lead for 1,414 minutes and 19 seconds. Miami hasn't trailed in three games - against Utah, Butler and Charlotte. Miami led for 33:25 minutes against UTRGV, 37:33 against Louisiana, 37:52 vs. Mississippi State and 34:22 at Nebraska. Miami trailed by only three points in each of its first two games against UTRGV and Louisiana, two points against Mississippi State, three points at Nebraska and never trailed against Charlotte or nationally ranked Utah and Butler.

MIAMI'S STARTERS SHOW EXPERIENCE

In Miami's game at Nebraska, the Hurricanes started three seniors and a pair of juniors. Those players have now combined for 284 career starts and 473 games played. Sheldon McClellan has started 69 games playing in 114, Tonye Jekiri has 61 starts in 112 games, Angel Rodriguez is at 77/105, Davon Reed 39/71 and Kamari Murphy 38/71.

Those five players have been on a Division I team a combined 21 seasons, as McClellan and Rodriguez are both in their fifth year on the court, Jekiri and Murphy are each in their fourth season, and Reed is a true junior.

The average age of that starting five is 21.8 years old: Rodriguez - 23; McClellan - 23; Murphy - 22; Jekiri - 21; Reed - 20.

McCLELLAN ON THREE NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE YEAR WATCH LISTS

Senior shooting guard Sheldon McClellan is turning heads across the country, earning nods on a trio of watch lists for national player of the year awards. He is one of 50 players on the Naismith Trophy Men's College Player of the Year early season watch list, one of 33 players on the watch list for the Oscar Robertson Trophy for Men's National Player of the Year and is among the 20 players named to the watch list for the 2016 Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year Award.

While leading the Canes to a 7-1 record and No. 17/20 position in the polls, McClellan is currently ranked nationally in 10 statistical categories. He is No. 44 in free throw percentage (89.7%), No. 50 in field goal percentage (59.7%), No. 81 in total points (119) and No. 96 in field goals made (96). His 59.7 percent shooting is ninth in the nation among guards and fourth-best among players on teams in the top eight basketball conferences (Power Five plus A-10, BIG EAST & American).

MIAMI LANDS HUELL, BROWN AND MILLER

The Miami men's basketball team landed a pair of top-30 players in Dewan Huell and Bruce Brown, and top 100 player Rodney Miller.

With the addition of these three players, Miami would have six top 100 players next season: Huell (25), Brown (44), Ja'Quan Newton (52), Miller (90), James Palmer (98).

Huell, at 6-10 and 218 pounds, is a five-star, top-25 power forward from Miami Norland High School. Nationally, he is ranked the No. 21 player by ESPN, No. 23 by Rivals and No. 25 by Scout. ESPN and Scout rank him fifth at his position, and Scout says he's the top player in the state of Florida, while ESPN and Rivals have him second in the state. A fluid player who finishes around the rim, Huell runs the floor and can beat his man off the dribble. He can hit the open 15-footer, as well as play with his back to the basket, scoring with a jump hook. Huell has the ability to elevate quickly, giving him the ability to block shots and grab offensive rebounds.

Brown, from Wakefield, Mass., is a four-star shooting guard at Vermont Academy in Saxton's River, Vt. At 6-4 and 205 pounds, Brown is ranked No. 30 by ESPN, No. 44 per Scout and No. 49 by Rivals. A combo guard with a 6-9 wingspan, Brown is one of the best defenders in the country and plays with tremendous energy. He is physical, has the ability to score off the dribble and can play multiple backcourt positions.

Miller is a 6-foot-11-inch, 245-pound center playing prep ball at Oak Hill Academy in Virginia. A native of Laurelton, N.Y., Miller is a consensus four-star recruit, ranked No. 90 overall by Scout.com and

No. 114 by Rivals.com. As a center, he is ranked No. 17 by Scout.com and No. 15 by ESPN. Miller, with a 7-foot-1-inch wingspan, has the ability to alter shots defensively, is a blue-collar rebounder and has good offensive touch around the rim.

CANES SIGN TOP 10 RECRUITING CLASS

The 2016 recruiting class of Dewan Huell, Bruce Brown and Rodney Miller is being named a top-10 recruiting class in the country, with 247Sports ranking the class No. 7, Scout at No. 8, ESPN at No. 9 and Rivals at No. 10.

The 2016 class rankings top Miami's best mark from 2005, when the Canes signed four four-star recruits — Jimmy Graham, Brian Asbury, Adrian Thomas and Denis Clemente — in a class that was ranked No. 12 in the nation by Scout.

In 2009, Miami's signing class was nationally ranked No. 19 by Scout and No. 24 by ESPN. That Hurricanes' heralded 2009 class was comprised of ESPNU 100 picks Durand Scott, Garrius Adams and Donnavan Kirk, in addition to May signee Antoine Allen.

Since 2002, Miami has signed 16 Scout.com top 100 players, including three five-star, top-25 players in DeQuan Jones (22, 2008), Huell (25) and Durand Scott (25, 2009). Since Larrañaga's arrival, his staff has signed five top-100 players in Huell (25), Brown (44), Ja'Quan Newton (52, 2014), Rodney Miller (90) and James Palmer (98, 2014)

Huell is the most lauded signee for Miami since Scott in 2009, Jones in 2008, No. 32 Guillermo Diaz in 2003 and McDonald's All-American Darius Rice in 2000.

MIAMI WINS PUERTO RICO TIP-OFF

Miami defeated Mississippi State 105-79, then downed No. 16 Utah 90-66 and dropped No. 22/20 Butler 85-75 to win the 2015 Puerto Rico Tip-Off. The Canes outscored their opponents by 20.0 points per game, and out rebounded opponents by 8.7 rebounds per game. Miami also won the event in 2007-08.

to at least No. 15 in the following week's poll, joining Connecticut, Syracuse, Florida, Villanova and Minnesota. It is also the highest ranking for Miami during the month of November in the history of the AP poll; the Hurricanes reached No. 17 in November in the 2008-09 and 2014-15 seasons.

Just one season ago, Miami went from unranked to No. 17/20 in the Nov. 24 polls, following a win over No. 8/7 Florida and a championship run in the Charleston Classic. The Canes were ranked five weeks last season. The Hurricanes were last ranked the week of Jan. 26, 2015, when the Canes were No. 23 in both polls.

Prior to the arrival of Coach L, Miami had not been ranked in the top 15 in either poll since Feb. 18, 2002 when the Canes were No. 17/13

JEKIRI NAMED ACC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Senior forward Tonye Jekiri was named the Atlantic Coast Conference Player of the Week on Nov. 23. Jekiri was named to the Puerto Rico Tip-Off All-Tournament Team, where in three games, he averaged 13.3 points, 11.3 rebounds, 1.3 assists and 1.3 blocks in 28.0 minutes. He was 15-21 (71.4%) from the field and 10-11 (90.9%) at the line. Against No. 16 Utah and national center of the year nominee Jakob Poeltl, Jekiri posted his career high 20 points and grabbed 12 rebounds. He was 8-10 from the field and 4-5 from the stripe in 32 minutes. He also had a steal, assist and block.

THE BUC IS SOLD OUT

In just his fifth season in Coral Gables, Jim Larrañaga continues to set records with the Miami men's basketball team. Miami has SOLD OUT the ticket allotment for all home games this season at the BankUnited Center. This is the first time in Miami athletics history a team has sold out their season. Due to the season ticket sales, seats will not be available on a single-game basis.

In Coach Larrañaga's fifth season at The U, fans have bought 5,500 season tickets, more than doubling the total number of season tickets sold in his first season in Coral Gables. When Coach L began his reign in Miami, fans bought 2,251 season tickets for the 2011-12 campaign. After a record-breaking season on the court in 2012-13, season tickets peaked at 3,674 for the 2013-14 year.

In 10 wins over ranked opponents since the arrival of Coach L in 2011-12, Miami has won five games by 10+ points, including 27 points over No. 1 Duke in 2013 and 24 points over No. 16 Utah in 2015. Miami has also scored 90+ points against a ranked team in three outings: 90-63 over No. 1 Duke in 2013, 90-74 over No. 4 Duke in 2015 and 90-66 over No. 16 Utah in 2015.

MIAMI VS. RANKED TEAMS

- Prior to Nov. 20 against No. 16 Utah and Nov. 22 vs. No. 22/20
 Butler, Miami last won back-to-back games over ranked teams in 2006, downing No. 14/12 Maryland 84-70 on Jan. 7, then seven days later with no game in-between No. 20 North Carolina 81-70 on Jan. 14.
- Miami has now won four games against ranked teams at neutral sites, including March 19, 2000 vs. No. 8 Ohio State (75-62), March 8, 2007 vs. No. 17/21 Maryland (67-62), Nov. 20, 2015 vs. No. 16 Utah (90-66) and Nov. 22 vs. No. 22/20 Butler (85-75).
- The last time Miami won two-straight matchups against ranked teams was in 2014-15, when the Canes took down No. 8/7 Florida (69-67) on Nov. 17, 2014, then defeated No. 24/25 Illinois (70-61), on Dec. 2, 2014.

FOUR PLAYERS BOAST NCAA TOURNAMENT EXPERIENCE

Senior Tonye Jekiri returns from Miami's 2012-13 ACC Championship and NCAA Sweet 16 team. Sheldon McClellan (Texas), Kamari Murphy (Oklahoma State) and Angel Rodriguez (Kansas State) also have played in the NCAA Tournament, each with their previous schools.

AMONG UNIVERSITY OF MIAMI COACHES, LARRAÑAGA ...

- has the highest winning percentage of a Miami coach in the NCAA Tournament, a .667 mark with a 2-1 record.
- is one of two Miami coaches to post three 20-win seasons. Larrañaga has recorded three 20-win seasons in four years at Miami
- .647 winning percentage is the best mark since Bruce Hale posted a .663 mark from 1955-67, including three seasons led by Rick Barry.
- has led the Canes to 41 ACC wins in just four seasons. Miami won 43 ACC games the previous seven seasons.
- Under Coach L, Miami has posted three of the Canes' top five finishes in ACC play, including the 2013 championship, tied for fourth in 2012 and tied for sixth in 2015. In 2008, Miami tied for fifth in league play, and in 2005, tied for sixth.
- In four seasons under Coach L, Miami has tallied six wins in the ACC Tournament. In the previous seven seasons, Miami went 6-7.
- In two NIT appearances under Coach L, Miami is 5-2 for a .714 winning percentage. In Miami's other 10 NIT appearances combined, the Canes went 6-10 for a .375 winning percentage.

DID YOU KNOW ...

Coach L became the first Miami coach to win 20+ games in his first two seasons at UM and only the third of 12 UM coaches to post three 20-win seasons.

Former Cane Rick Barry was named one of the Greatest Players in NRA History

Miami native and former Cane James Jones won the 2010-2011 NBA All-Star Weekend 3-Point Contest and the NBA Championship in the 2011-2012 and 2012-13 seasons.

Six-time NBA All Star Amar'e Stoudemire enrolled at UM in 2013 and took classes to earn his bachelor's degree.

UM is in its 12th season in the ACC.

Coach L led the George Mason Patriots to the 2006 Final Four with big wins over some of basketball's elite teams such as Michigan State, UNC and UConn. He was the first coach to take a mid-major to a Final Four in 27 years (Penn '79) when his team advanced in 2006.

In 14 years at George Mason, Larrañaga led the Patriots to five NCAA Tournament appearances (2011, 2008, 2006, 2001, 1999), including the 2006 Final Four.

Miami basketball received APR (Academic Progress Rate) Public Recognition Awards for being among the top 10 percent in APR in its sport. Miami ranks in the top 10 percent NCAA men's basketball with a 990 APR.

The Miami Department of Athletics recorded a Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 89 percent. Miami's department-wide GSR is 16th overall among FBS programs. UM has exceeded the NCAA average GSR in each of the last 10 years.

The Canes have averaged 20.0 wins over the last 11 seasons.

The Hurricanes have made at least one trey in 911 of 917 games since the NCAA adopted the 3-point shot in 1986. The last time Miami was held without a 3-pointer was Feb. 26, 2014 at Virginia.

Miami has held 770 of its last 771 opponents to less than 100 points. North Carolina was the last team to score 100+, defeating UM 105-64 on Jan. 31, 2007.

MIAMI BASKETBALL – THE EARLY YEARS

The University of Miami basketball program was dormant for 14 years from 1971-1985. In 1983 Director of Athletics Sam Jankovich announced the resurrection of men's basketball at Miami, with the reinstatement vote by the UM Board of Trustees on Oct. 12, 1983. Head coach Bill Foster was hired March 21, 1984, adding assistants Clint Bryant, Seth Greenberg and Cesar Odio by July 1. Tim Harvey was the staff's first recruit, a 6-10, 240-pound center from Plainfield, N.J., who transferred from Georgia Tech. On Oct. 15, 1984 the first men's basketball practice in 12 years was held on the patio in the center of campus, viewed by more than 200 students. Miami defeated The Citadel, 85-77, on Nov. 22, 1985, in the first game of the new era of UM basketball.

THE LAST TIME OUT - MIAMI VS. CHARLOTTE ...

Miami opened the game with its third starting lineup of the season: Angel Rodriguez, Ja'Quan Newton, Davon Reed, Kamari Murphy and Tonye Jekiri. Sheldon McClellan wasn't in the starting lineup due to a lower extremity injury ... Against Charlotte, nine players scored, marking the eighth-straight game with seven-ormore players scoring. Miami has eight players score once, nine four times and 10 once ... Miami notched 46 first-half points, the fifth time this season the Canes scored 40+ points in the first stanza ... The Canes dished out 19 assists as a team against the 49ers, just short of the season-best of 20 against Mississippi State in the Puerto Rico Tip-Off ... Four Hurricane players finished in double figures: Davon Reed (12), Kamari Murphy(11), Ja'Quan Newton (14), and Ivan Cruz Uceda (11) ... All 12 Miami players saw action in Saturday's game against the 49ers ... The largest lead of the game came during the second half, at 8:37, with Miami leading Charlotte by 36 points ... Tonye Jekiri pulled down five first-half rebounds, the seventh time this season he has been halfway to double-digit rebounds in the first 20 minutes. Jekiri ended with 10 boards for the game, his seventh game with 10+ rebounds ... Ivan Cruz Uceda knocked down three shots from long range, his fifth game with multiple 3-pointers made. He has hit at least three from downtown in three outings ... Ja'Quan Newton tallied 14 points and has scored double-digit points in seven of eight games after only scoring 10+ in four games as a rookie ... Newton shot 90 percent from the line, hitting 9-of-10 ... Newton also recorded a season-best six assists, one more than his five against Louisiana and Mississippi State ... With five rebounds against Charlotte, Davon Reed has grabbed at least three rebounds in every game ... Kamari Murphy scored a season-best 11 points, topping his 10 at Nebraska. He also grabbed a season-high seven rebounds against Charlotte, topping his best of six vs. Northeastern ... With one 3-pointer against Charlotte, Angel Rodriguez has knocked down a 3-pointer in every game ... Sheldon McClellan dished five assists, tying for his career high, which he last recorded at Virginia Tech on March 7, 2015.

BALANCED SCORING IN FIRST THREE GAMES

In the first three games of the 2015-16 season, Miami had five, six and seven players score in double digits, respectively. Against UT Rio Grande Valley, Sheldon McClellan (18), Ivan Cruz Uceda (16), Davon Reed (14), Ja'Quan Newton (11) and James Palmer (11) notched double-digit points, while Reed (19), Angel Rodriguez (18), McClellan (16), Cruz Uceda (13), Anthony Lawrence Jr. (12) and Newton (11) did against Louisiana. Mississippi saw seven Canes with double digits: McClellan (18), Newton (15), Palmer (14), Izundu (11), Rodriguez (11), Cruz Uceda (10), Lawrence (10).

MIAMI PREDICTED TO FINISH FIFTH IN ACC

Miami was predicted to finish fifth out of 15 teams in the Atlantic Coast Conference this season, as announced by the league during Operation ACC Basketball in Charlotte, N.C., Oct. 28. North Carolina was picked to win the league, followed by Virginia, Duke and Notre Dame.

In 2012-13, the Canes were picked to finish fifth, then won the league's regular season and tournament championship. In all four of Larrañaga's seasons at Miami, the Canes have finished the season better than predicted at ACC media day.

THE LAST TIME OUT AGAINST FLORIDA - NOV. 17, 2014

The Canes snapped Florida's 33 game home winning streak and 25-game home non-conference winning streak at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center. The 33-game streak was the third-longest in the country, behind 34 from both Duke and Stephen F. Austin ... Miami's last road win over a Top 10 team was Feb. 5, 2012 at No. 7/5 Duke (78-74, OT) ... Miami's last road win over a ranked team was Feb. 2, 2013 at No. 19 NC State (79-78) ... Miami is 48-135 overall against ranked teams with a 14-63 mark on the road ... Against ranked teams since the arrival of Coach Larrañaga in 2011, Miami is 6-14 overall, 3-6 on the road and 2-1 in regular season non-conference matchups ... Miami is now 23-45 in the series against Florida, which dates back to the 1927-28 season. The Hurricanes are 7-29 on the road against the Gators. Since the rebirth of UM basketball in 1985, Miami is 3-9 against UF, and under Coach L, Miami is now 1-0 ... Miami is now 2-2 in the last four matchups with the Gators. The Canes' last win over the Gators was Dec. 4, 2004, a 72-65 victory in Gainesville ... Head coach Jim Larrañaga has a 538-370 overall record in his 31st season as a head coach. He is 68-36 in his third season at the University of Miami ... Starters: Angel Rodriguez, Manu Lecomte, Sheldon McClellan, Joe Thomas and Tonye Jekiri ... Angel Rodriguez scored 24 points his first 20-point game as a Cane, also topping his previous collegiate career-high. His previous career-high was 22 points against Baylor (2/16/13) when he played for Kansas State ... Rodriguez knocked down five 3-pointers in the game, all five in the last 6:21 in the game. He also knocked down three-straight FTs after being fouled on a 3-point attempt ... Rodriguez also notched three assists, three steals and two rebounds in 36 minutes ... Tonye Jekiri tied the game with a free throw and then took a 56-55 lead at the 3:48 mark, which was Miami's first lead of the game. Miami was down by 14 at the 8:29 mark ... Tonye Jekiri grabbed eight rebounds and blocked three shots to lead the Canes on the boards ... Freshman James Palmer had his first double-figure scoring game of his collegiate career with 10 points ... Omar Sherman scored his first points of his collegiate career on a 3-point play at the 10:10 mark in the first half ... Omar Sherman made a 3-point shot, then blocked a Gator shot, which led to a Tonye Jekiri shot, in which he got fouled, then tied and gave Miami the lead with 3:48 left in the game ... Eight different Canes scored in the first half ... Miami was 9-of-11 (81.8 percent) from the free throw line in the last five minutes of the game ... Miami shot 65.2 percent from the field and 70 percent from the 3-point line in the second half ... Miami's game against Florida was the first of an 11day roadtrip where the Canes play five games in nine days in three states.

IT'S ALL ABOUT LOCATION

Miami's complete 13-man roster includes players from: Three countries - Nigeria (2), Spain, U.S.; One U.S. commonwealth - Puerto Rico; Eight states - Connecticut, Florida, Nevada, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Texas; and Washington, D.C.

COACHING CHANGES FOR THE HURRICANES

After having the same assistant coaching staff his first four years in Miami, Larrañaga has two new assistant coaches in 2015-16 in Jamal Brunt and Adam Fisher, following the departure of Eric Konkol (Louisiana Tech) and Michael Huger (Bowling Green). Konkol had been an assistant with Coach L 11 seasons and Huger was an assistant coach for eight years and player for four seasons.

Due to the lack of turnover, Coach L has only had nine assistant coaches in the last 14 seasons. Five of his assistants left for a D-I head coaching job, and two others who have worked their way into head coaching jobs. In those 14 seasons, only twice two assistants left at the same time, 1996 (Stan Heath and Steve Merfeld) and 1989 (Jeff Snyder and Ricky Stokes).

Chris Caputo, in his 14th season on Larrañaga's staff and fifth in Coral Gables, was promoted to associate head coach in the summer of 2015.

COACH L REUNITED WITH JAMES JOHNSON

Larrañaga completed his 2015-16 staff with the addition of James Johnson as the team's director of basketball operations. Johnson, who was on Larrañaga's staff for two seasons at George Mason University, including the historic NCAA Final Four run in 2006, came to Miami after seven seasons on staff at fellow Atlantic Coast Conference school Virginia Tech, where he was the head coach for two seasons after five years as an assistant coach.

LARRAÑAGA CONTRACT EXTENDED THROUGH 2022

The University of Miami extended Coach Jim Larrañaga's contract through May 31, 2022, Director of Athletics Blake James announced in September 2014. Larrañaga first signed a five-year contract in April 2011, then was granted a three-year extension in 2012.

PROCANES REPORT

Former Hurricanes James Jones and Shane Larkin have taken their talents onto NBA rosters this season, as Jones is in Cleveland with the Cavaliers and Larkin joins a new team, the Brooklyn Nets, after playing across town with the Knicks last season.

LARRAÑAGA MEMBER OF UM FACULTY

Coach Jim Larrañaga is an Adjunct Assistant Professor of Kinesiology and Sport Sciences at the University of Miami. Due to his head coaching responsibilities, Larrañaga is a guest lecturer at several different classes in the School of Education and Human Development throughout the semester.

COACH L TIES TO THE ACC

Coach Jim Larrañaga was an assistant coach at Virginia from 1979-1986, under the leadership of Terry Holland. In those seven seasons, Larrañaga helped the Cavaliers to five NCAA appearances: Final Four twice, Elite Eight once, Sweet 16 once and Round of 64 once, as well as two NIT appearances, including the Championship and Quarterfinal round.

MIAMI SETS SCHOOL RECORD FOR GAMES PLAYED, SECOND-

Miami played a school-record 38 games last season, topping the 36 games played in 2012-13. The Canes' 25 wins were second all-time in school history, behind the 29-7 mark in 2012-13.

CANES POST 20+-WIN SEASON

With a victory at Virginia Tech on March 7, 2015, Miami posted its third 20-win season in four years since the arrival of Jim Larrañaga. Since 2011-12, Coach L has tallied seasons of 20-13, 29-7, 17-16 and 25-13, for an average of 22.8 wins per season. Since joining the ACC in 2004-05, Miami posted three 20-win seasons before Larrañaga, 23-11 in 2008, 20-13 in 2010 and 21-15 in 2011.

MIAMI'S ROAD WINS RANK TOP 11 NATIONALLY

Miami was one of 38 teams in the country, and one of 11 teams from a Top 8 conference, to win 10+ games away from its home arena last regular season. Gonzaga led the way with 14 road and neutral site victories

The Canes have posted 10+ wins away from home in two of Coach L's four seasons at Miami. In 2012-13, Miami won 15 on the road, including five neutral-site games. Last year, Miami was 10-5 away from the BankUnited Center, with a 3-1 neutral-site record, in the regular season.

CANES IN NATIONAL STATS, VIA NCAA.COM

Miami was 13th in the country in turnovers per game (10.1), committing less than 15 turnovers in 35 of 38 outings.

The Canes knocked down 292 shots from 3-point range, good enough for 20th in the nation. UM hit at least seven shots from long range in 23 games, and tied a school record of 15 made in a game, going 15-of-25 at Virginia Tech on March 7.

UM shot 74.6 percent from the free throw line, which was the 22nd-best mark in the country. Miami drained at least 70 percent of its free throws in 28 games last year. The Canes' 544 free throws made were No. 39 in the NCAA.

Miami averaged just 15.6 fouls per game, a mark that was 22ndbest in the nation, grabbed 1317 total rebounds (29th) and posted a 1.27 assist-to-turnover ratio (44th).

CANES FINISH SIXTH IN ACC AFTER BEING PICKED 10TH

Miami finished sixth in the 2014-15 ACC rankings after being projected to finish 10th by the media at Operation Basketball in October. In each of Coach L's four seasons at Miami, the Canes have exceeded preseason expectations. In his first season, Miami was picked fifth and finished tied for fourth. In just his second season, UM won the ACC after being projected to finish fifth. A year ago, the Canes were selected 12th, but ended 10th.

The Canes and Notre Dame both made a jump of four spots: Miami from 10th to sixth and Notre Dame from seventh to third. Wake Forest and Virginia Tech were the only schools who were slotted in the correct spots. In order of preseason projections, here are the final mis-projections of each team: Duke -1, North Carolina -3, Louisville -1, Virginia +3, Syracuse -3, Pittsburgh -4, Notre Dame +4, Florida State -3, NC State +2, Miami +4, Clemson +2, Wake Forest +0, Georgia Tech -1, Boston College +1, Virginia Tech +0.

LARRAÑAGA POSTS FOURTH 25-WIN SEASON

With a 25-13 mark last season at Miami, Coach Jim Larrañaga has posted four 25-win seasons as a head coach. His first was a 27-8 mark at George Mason in 2005-06, when he led the team to the NCAA Final Four and in 2010-11 he was 27-7 with a 1-1 mark in the NCAA Tournament. At Miami, Coach L led the Canes to a 29-7 mark in 2012-13, winning the ACC regular season and tournament, then taking UM to the NCAA Sweet 16.

CARDIAC CANES - YEAR TWO

Miami played 16 games last season that were decided by five points-or-less. The Canes had five losses by a total of 22 points in the month of February. Three of those games were decided by a total of five points. Miami and Georgia Tech each had 13 games decided by four points or less last season. Miami and Notre Dame led the ACC with nine wins in close games. In 2013-14, Miami led the ACC having played 13 games decided by five points-or-less or in OT.

MIAMI VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

Miami was 3-6 against ranked teams in 2014-15, including 1-1 against top-5 teams and 2-2 against top-10 teams. Of the six losses, one was a double-overtime defeat against Virginia, and the Canes came up 6.1 ppg short in the other five outings. The Canes were 1-3 at home, 2-2 on the road and 0-1 at neutral sites vs. Top 25 opponents. See a complete list vs. ranked opponents since the arrival of Coach L on page 10.

LARRAÑAGA RETURNS HOME, NY COACHES IN NIT

Coach Jim Larrañaga returned to his roots for the NIT, playing in his home state of New York. Larrañaga grew up in the Parkchester neighborhood of The Bronx, playing high school basketball for Jack Curran at Archbishop Molloy High School in Queens.

Since 2000, only four coaches originally from the state of New York have led their team to the championship game of the NIT. In 2015, coach Jim Larrañaga is from The Bronx. In 2014, Larry Brown (Brooklyn) was the runner up with SMU. John Beilein (Burt) won the event in 2007 with West Virginia. In 2000, Matt Doherty (East Meadow) was runner up with Notre Dame.

COACH L IN MADISON SOUARE GARDEN

In Larrañaga's 31 years of coaching, he had never been the head coach of a team playing a game in Madison Square Garden, until March 31 against Temple. He played in the World's Most Famous Arena multiple times while playing college ball for Providence, and was an assistant coach for Virginia when the Cavaliers won the NIT in 1980. Larrañaga's final collegiate game as a Friar was played against UNC in 1971, an 86-79 loss for PC in the NIT Elite 8.

MARCH WAS HURRICANE SEASON

Miami was 7-1 in the month of March last season, and Jim Larrañaga is 19-8 in the month of March while coaching at Miami.

BALANCED ATTACK IN THE POSTSEASON

In five NIT games Miami presented a balanced attack with ...

*Six players averaging more than 7.6 points per game: McClellan (13.2 ppg), Reed (10.8), Jekiri (8.0), Lecomte (8.0), Newton (7.8), Burnett (7.6).

*Nine guys knocking down a 3-pointer: Burnett (7), Cruz Uceda (6), McClellan (6), Reed (4), Lecomte (3), Newton (2), Sherman (1), Jekiri (1), Palmer (1).

*Five players grabbing 3.8 or more rebounds per game: Jekiri (7.5), Reed (7.0), McClellan (5.0), Cruz Uceda (4.8) and Newton (3.8).

SECOND-HALF SCORING FUELS CANES

In five NIT games, Miami scored 40.4 points per game in the second stanza after just 25.6 per game in the first half. For the season, Miami averaged 30.0 points in the first and 37.0 in the second period. Miami scored 35+ in the second period in all five NIT games, led by 45 at Richmond after scoring just 18 in the first half against the Spiders.
