STORY LINES

- The Miami Hurricanes will resume their Atlantic Coast Conference slate with a return to College Park, Md. for a weekend series against the homestanding Maryland Terrapins. Miami took two of three last time out at Shibley Field (2011).
- Despite dropping two of three to fifth-ranked Florida State last weekend, Miami enters the most recent Ratings Percentage Index (RPI) at No. 17 - and with the second-toughest strength of schedule in the nation, according to *WarrenNolan.com*.
- The Hurricanes' weekend rotation of southpaws **Chris Diaz**, **Bryan Radziewski** and **Andrew Suarez** delivered another strong series against the fifth-ranked Seminoles, allowing just four combined earned runs over 18.1 innings of work.
- Among last season's top performers against the Terrapins at Alex Rodriguez Park: **Dale Carey** (three hits, three RBI's), **Michael Broad** (three hits, two RBI's), **Brad Fieger** (three RBI's) and **Tyler Palmer** (three hits, three runs).
- John Szefc**, in his first season at the helm in College Park, has guided Maryland to an 18-15 overall record and a 4-11 mark in conference play. By contrast, Miami skipper **Jim Morris** is in his 20th season at Miami and 35th overall as head coach.
- Some of Miami's most impressive wins have come on the road, including victories over No. 1 UNC (4-1) and No. 5 Virginia (4-3).

3 JIM MORRIS 2001, 1999 & 1994 COACH OF THE YEAR • 2008 ACC COACH OF THE YEAR



In his 20th season at Miami, no other program nor head coach, has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament an NCAA-record 40 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 19 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006.

- Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 872-335-3 (.724) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,376-602-4 (.696) Division I record in 31+ years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 34 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,507-643-4 (.701) mark
- In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 19 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium project.

MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

- Jim Morris earned his 28th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2012 when he guided the Canes to one of 16 host sites for the first round of the postseason. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 19 seasons (1994-2012), winning 15 of his last 19 appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.
- Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris led the 2012 Hurricanes to their 40th-straight NCAA Tournament. Five players from the 2012 team were selected in last year's Major League Baseball Draft: E.J. Encinosa, Eric Erickson, Steven Ewing, Peter O'Brien and Stephen Perez.

MORRIS IN 35th SEASON AS A COLLEGE COACH

- Morris currently has a 1,376-602-4 (.696) record at the Division I level. As a head coach overall, he has compiled a 1,507-641-4 (.701) record over 30-plus years.
- Jim Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later, he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern on March 23, 2001.
- Morris entered 2013 as the fifth-winningest active coach in Division I baseball history with 1,354 wins. His impressive win total ranks him No. 12 all-time for any coach, regardless of division.
- Including his time at DeKalb C.C., Morris won his 1,500th game as a head coach in Miami's 4-1 upset of No. 1 North Carolina on March 15, 2013 in Chapel Hill, N.C.



JIM MORRIS MAKING HISTORY

- The only coach in NCAA history to take a school to the College World Series in each of his first six years at a program. Morris has gone to Omaha with Miami in 11 of 19 seasons and led the Canes to 13 straight NCAA Regional Championships, an NCAA record.
- Named National Coach of the Year five times while at Miami by Baseball America in 1994 and by the ABCA and Collegiate Baseball in 1999 and 2001.

HIT THE ROAD...

- After wrapping up their five-game homestand with a dominant 8-2 win over visiting Stetson, the Hurricanes resume their conference slate with a road series at Maryland (April 12-14).
- Though the Hurricanes have just a 4-6 record outside their home ballpark, a few of their most impressive wins - including a victory over No. 1 UNC and another over No. 5 Virginia - have taken place on the road.
- The weekend trip to Maryland marks Miami's fourth road series of the season. In the 18 match-ups between the two programs, the Hurricanes own an all-time series advantage of 13-5.

BUILDING MOMENTUM...

- In the latest Ratings Percentage Index rankings from both *Boyd's World* and *WarrenNolan.com*, Miami is ranked No. 17 in RPI. Additionally, *Warren Nolan* has Miami with the second-toughest schedule of any team nationwide.
- The Hurricanes have six wins against teams ranked in the Top 20 in *Boyd's World* RPI, and have ten wins against *Boyd's World* Top 50 RPI teams.
- Miami's last weekend series with fifth-ranked Florida State marked the team's fourth straight weekend against a ranked foe.

STARTING OFF STRONG...

- Sophomore Chris Diaz has impressed as Friday night starter, delivering a team-best six quality starts in eight chances this season. The Florida City, Fla., native ranks eighth in the ACC with an ERA of 2.05, and fourth in the conference with 52.2 innings pitched.
- Having surrendered just three earned runs all season, junior Bryan Radziewski boasts a team-best ERA of 0.78. He has also recorded an eye-popping 49:8 strikeout-to-walk ratio through six starts, while his 49 punchouts are the fifth-most in the conference.
- Radziewski (0.82, No. 1), Diaz (2.94, No. 15) and sophomore Andrew Suarez (3.18, No. 16) all rank in the top 20 in ERA among ACC starters in conference competition this season.

CLOSING IT OUT...

- Senior Eric Nedeljkovic has been Miami's most reliable reliever out of the bullpen, and has allowed just two runs in 17.2 innings of work this season.
- The Folsom, Calif., native, who has the second-most saves of any reliever in the conference (six), has allowed only 12 hits in 16 appearances, and has a dominant 20:2 strikeout-to-walk ratio.

SCOUTING THE TERRAPINS...

- Maryland enters the weekend series with an 18-15 overall record and a 4-5 mark in Atlantic Coast Conference play. The Terrapins were swept by No. 1 UNC in their most recent weekend series, but are ranked at No. 30 in the most recent *Boyd's World* RPI (April 11).
- Offensively, the Terps have been paced by Charlie White (.349 average, 20 RBI's), Kyle Convissar (.325 average, 32 RBI's) and LaMonte Wade (11 doubles, two triples).
- On the hill, Maryland has been led by starters Jimmy Reed (2.98 ERA, 4-3 record) and Brady Kirkpatrick (3.33 ERA, 3-4 record), along with relievers Brandon Casas (1.26 ERA), Kevin Mooney (1.93 ERA, four saves) and Bobby Ruse (3-0 record, 3.04 ERA).

GETTING DEFENSIVE...

- When healthy, Miami's infield defense has been one of the brightest spots on the season.
- Miami's 2013 infield features four newcomers: freshmen first base platoon David Thompson & Christopher Barr, junior second baseman Alex Hernandez and freshman shortstop Brandon Lopez. Junior third baseman Brad Fieger completes the cast.
- The play of the Hurricanes infield has been the catalyst for a majority of the team's 32 double plays - the third-most of any team in the Atlantic Coast Conference.

QUALITY AND QUANTITY...

- Head coach Jim Morris and his staff have received 16 quality starts from their starters this season - including two in the team's most weekend recent series with No. 5 Florida State.
- Chris Diaz set a new personal record by going eight innings against Virginia Tech (March 22), allowing two earned runs. He did not allow an earned run in seven innings against FSU (April 5).
- Bryan Radziewski has dominated since being inserted into the weekend rotation. He went seven shutout against the Seminoles last time out (April 6), lowering his ERA to 0.78.
- Andrew Suarez delivered three straight quality starts against Duke (March 10), UNC (March 17) and Va Tech (March 24), and ranks 15th in the ACC with a 2.92 ERA.
- Javi Salas delivered Miami's second complete game of 2013 in the team's most recent 8-2 win over Stetson (March 10).

FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH...

- A number of the Hurricanes' most important contributors were part of a recruiting class ranked in the top 10 by national publications - including *Baseball America* and *Collegiate Baseball*.
- Despite starting 19 of the team's 36 games, 1B Christopher Barr is reaching base at a team-best .429 clip. He ranks second on the team with 18 walks.
- RHP Frank Grandinette ranks third on the team in appearances (14), just a few shy of fellow bullpen regulars AJ Salcines (17) and Eric Nedeljkovic (16).
- Junior INF Alex Hernandez is one of just two Hurricanes to start all 36 games this season, and ranks third on the team with a .282 batting average. He leads the team in several offensive categories, including runs scored (27), hits (35) and walks (21).
- Freshman 1B David Thompson, who has two homeruns on the season, leads the team in RBI's (24). His .416 slugging percentage is highest among regular starters, while his seven doubles are tied for the second-most among any Hurricane.

HEATING UP...

- After a slow start to the season, junior outfielder Dale Carey is hitting .357 in the team's last five games (5-for-14), a stretch in which he has started every game.
- Senior Chantz Mack is hitting .333 over the past five games, a mark that includes a team-best total of six hits (6-for-18).
- Sophomore catcher Garrett Kennedy, who has started four of the team's past five games, is hitting at a .385 clip with five hits in 13 at bats.
- Junior Alex Hernandez has been a key offensive contributor all season, and leads the team with five runs scored over the past five games.
- Miami's pitching staff has allowed just 10 earned runs over the past five games, good for a staff ERA of just 2.00. In their past four games (2-2 record), Miami starters have allowed four total earned runs over 27.1 combined innings of work.

Remembering "The Wizard of College Baseball"

The Hurricanes have dedicated the 2013 season in memory of former head coach Ron Fraser, who passed away before the season after a battle with Alzheimer's Disease.

Miami has taken special steps to remember "The Wizard of College Baseball," who helped guide the Hurricanes to over 1,200 wins and two national championships in his storied 30-year tenure as head coach.

During a special tribute night against Milwaukee on Feb. 23, head coach Jim Morris called for the "Grand Illusion," a trick play for which Fraser became instantly famous after the 1982 College World Series. A new outfield banner portraying the legendary coach was also unveiled by Fraser's wife Karen, his three daughters and five grandchildren during the game.

The Hurricanes are wearing patches in remembrance of Fraser; #1 patches adorn the right breast of each and every jersey, while #1 decals have been placed on the back of each player's batting helmet.

A commemorative home plate painted on the field with the number 1, Fraser's retired jersey number, will remain all season.

Alex Rodriguez Park took form in a three-phase process:

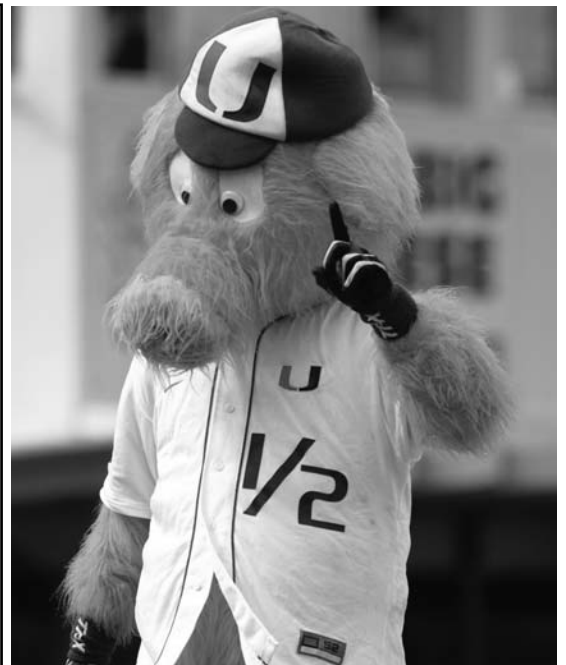
- Phase I called for seating modifications, new dugouts, new stadium lighting and utility infrastructure and new rest rooms.
