THE GAME

- After making its first-ever trip to the ACC Championship Game on Dec. 2, the No. 10 Miami Hurricanes will be playing in the Orange Bowl for the first time since the 2003 season when they take on No. 6 Wisconsin at Hard Rock Stadium on Dec. 30. Kickoff for the game is set for 8 p.m.
- Miami is playing in the Orange Bowl for the tenth time in history and has a 6-3 record in the game; UM has a 20-20 all-time mark in bowl games.
- The game will be broadcast on ESPN with Steve Levy (play by play), Brian Griese (color), Todd McShay (sideline) and Molly McGrath (sideline) on the call. Joe Zagacki (pxp) and Don Bailey, Jr. (color) are in the 560 WQAM radio booth for their 16th season together, while Josh Darrow will handle the sideline duty on the flagship station. Jose "Chamby" Campos (pxp) and Joe Martinez (color) will broadcast on 990AM ESPN Deportes.

- The all-time series between the Hurricanes and Badgers is tied, 2-2; Wisconsin won the last matchup between the two teams at the 2009 Champs Sports Bowl in Orlando - the only other neutral site meeting between the two programs. The series is also tied, 1-1, in games played in Miami.
- In the modern era of Miami Hurricanes football (since 1979), UM holds a 2-1 advantage, including a win in the only game played in Madison in 1989.

THE HURRICANES

- The Miami Hurricanes are looking for their seventh Orange Bowl title in their 10th time participating; Miami is 6-3 all-time in Orange Bowl games.
- Miami is competing in the Orange Bowl for the first time since the 2003 season, when the Hurricanes beat Florida State, 16-14, on January 1, 2004.
- UM is competing in a "New Year's Six" game for the first time in program history; the NY6 games began with the College Football Playoff in 2014.
- Miami checked in at No. 10 in the latest College Football Playoff rankings released on Dec. 3, and was ranked in every CFP poll for the first time ever.
- Last time out on Dec. 2, the Hurricanes fell in the ACC Championship Game to Atlantic Division champion and No. 1 Clemson, 3-38, in Charlotte, N.C.

THE OPPONENT

- Wisconsin is under the direction of third-year head coach and Badgers alum Paul Chryst, who has guided his team to a 12-1 record. Wisconsin's last contest was the Big Ten Championship Game, where the Badgers fell, 21-27, to Ohio State, UW is No. 6 in the College Football Playoff rankings.
- The Badgers offense is led by RB Jonathan Taylor (1,847 rushing yards, 13 rushing TDs) and QB Alex Hornibrook (2,386 passing yards, 21 passing touchdowns). Wisconsin's defense is led by ILB Ryan Connelly (80 tackles), OLB Garret Dooley (12 TFLs, 7.5 sacks) and S Joe Ferguson (4 INTs).

THE COACH

- Miami is in its second season under the direction of head coach Mark Richt; in his first season at The U, Miami finished with a 9-4 record and won their first bowl game since 2006. His 10-0 start to the 2017 season was his best as head coach; his previous best was 8-0 at Georgia in 2002.
- Richt, who grew up in nearby Boca Raton, Fla., played quarterback as a student-athlete at Miami and is a 1982 graduate of the university, was named the 24th head coach in the history of the Hurricanes football program on Dec. 4, 2015. He is 19-6 in his first 25 games at The U.

QUICH HITS

MIAMI PLAYING IN FIRST OB SINCE 2003

- . No. 10 Miami will be making its first in the Orange Bowl since the 2003 season, facing No. 6 Wisconsin on Dec. 30 (8 p.m., ESPN). . Miami enters the Orange Bowl with a
- 10-2 record marking its first 10-win season since 2003 - and a 7-1 record in ACC play.
- Miami's seven wins in ACC play were its most ever; its previous best was six (2005).
- . Mark Richt has never competed in the Orange Bowl as a head coach, but competed in the Orange Bowl four times as an offensive coordinator at Florida State.
- The all-time series between Miami and UW is tied, 2-2; the Badgers won the last meeting between the two teams, 20-14, at the 2009 Champs Sports Bowl in Orlando

UM FALLS TO TIGERS IN ACC TITLE GAME

- . The Coastal Division champion Hurricanes dropped their first ACC Championship Game appearance in program history on Dec. 2, falling to No. 1 Clemson, 3-38.
- . Miami won the Coastal Division for the first time, posting a 7-1 ACC record in conference play to earn a trip to Bank of America Stadium in Charlotte, N.C.
- . WR Braxton Berrios led Miami with seven catches for 51 yards in the ACC Championship Game, including a long reception of 21 yards.
- . LB Shaq Quarterman led all Hurricanes defenders with 10 tackles, while DL Chad Thomas had 2.0 tackles for loss and one

DEFENSE DOMINATING UNDER DIAZ

- Miami's defense is delivering once again under the direction of second-year defensive coordinator Manny Diaz.
- . UM entered its bowl game ranked among the nation's leaders in a number of key categories, including first in team sacks (3.58 per game), second in tackles for loss (8.8), second in turnover margin (+1.25) and second in turnovers gained (30).
- . In one of the most important metrics for measuring a college football defense in 2017 - opponent yards per play - UM checked in at No. 10 nationwide (4.5 yards per play) for the second-best mark in the ACC.
- The Hurricanes are one of just 10 teams in the country whose opponents average 4.5 yards per play or fewer.

SEASON OF FIRSTS CONTINUES: MIAMI RETURNS TO THE ORANGE BOWL

- The No. 10 Miami Hurricanes will be playing in their first Orange Bowl since the 2003 season when they take on No. 6 Wisconsin at Hard Rock Stadium on Dec. 30. Kickoff is set for 8 p.m. (ESPN).
- Miami checked in at No. 10 in the latest College Football Playoff rankings released on Dec. 3, marking
 its fifth straight week inside the CFP top 10. Miami had never been ranked by the CFP prior to 2017.
- With a 44-28 win over Virginia on Nov. 18, Miami clinched its first 10-win season since 2003 (11-2).
- With that win over the Cavaliers, UM closed out a perfect home slate for the first time since 2002.
- Miami's 7-1 record in ACC play was its best in history; its previous best ACC mark was 6-2 in 2005.
- The Hurricanes opened the season with ten straight victories for the first time since the 2002 season.
- Last time out, Miami fell to Atlantic champion Clemson, 38-3, in the 2017 ACC Championship Game. It
 was Miami's first time representing the Coastal Division in the conference title game in Charlotte, N.C.
- Before a loss to Pitt on Nov. 24, Miami had won 15 games in a row for the first time since 2001-02 (Nov. 24, 2001 - Dec. 7, 2002). UM's last loss before Pitt came at Notre Dame on Oct. 29, 2016.

LAST TIME OUT: MIAMI FALLS IN FIRST ACC TITLE GAME APPEARANCE

- The Hurricanes dropped their first ACC Championship Game appearance in program history on Dec. 2, falling to Atlantic Division champion and No. 1 Clemson, 38-3, at Bank of America Stadium.
- QB Malik Rosier threw for 110 yards on 14-of-29 passing, while the Canes totaled 104 rushing yards
 against one of the nation's top-ranked defenses; ATH DeeJay Dallas led Miami with 44 rush yards.
- WR Braxton Berrios led all pass-catchers in the game with seven receptions totaling 51 yards.
- LB Shaq Quarterman paced the Hurricanes with ten total tackles (five solo) and added 1.5 tackles for loss. DL Chad Thomas finsihed with seven tackles, 2.0 tackles for loss and one four-yard sack.
- DL **Trent Harris** became the 16th Hurricane to wear the turnover chain when he recovered a fumble.

ANOTHER FIRST: RICHT LEADS MIAMI TO COASTAL DIVISION CROWN

- Since taking over at his alma mater in December 2015, head coach Mark Richt has led Miami to its
 first bowl win since 2006 (31-14 over West Virginia, 2016 Russell Athletic Bowl), its first 10-win
 season since 2003 (10-1, 2017) and its first ACC Coastal Division Championship in history (2017).
- Richt has also led Miami to its highest position ever in the CFP rankings (#2, Nov. 21, 2017), its first #2 ranking in both major polls since 2003 and its longest winning streak since 2001-02 (15, 2016-17).

DEFENSE DAZZLING UNDER DIAZ FOR SECOND STRAIGHT SEASON

- Miami defensive coordinator Manny Diaz has directed the' defense into one of the more dominant
 units once again, and was named a Broyles Award semifinalist for the nation's top assistant coach.
- Miami's defense ranks ninth nationally in opponent yards per play (4.5), one of the most important metrics when measuring a college football defense in 2017. In 2016, UM ranked No. 16 in OYPP (4.7).
- The Hurricanes lead the nation in team sacks (3.58) and rank second in the nation in team tackles for loss (8.8). Miami ranks second in turnovers gained (30) and is second in turnover margin (+1.25).
- The Canes rank No. 19 nationally in scoring defense, allowing an average of 19.9 points per game.
- Miami is one of just 22 teams in FBS to be holding opponents to fewer than 20 points per game.

TEN HURRICANES EARN ALL-ACC RECOGNITION: BADGLEY FIRST TEAM

- Headlined by senior K Michael Badgley's placement on the All-ACC First Team, 10 Miami Hurricanes earned all-conference recognition in the league's year-end voting selection by coaches and media.
- Miami's 10 selections were second-most in the ACC, trailing only Atlantic champion Clemson (13).
- Badgley, who became Miami's all-time leader in field goals made earlier this season, earned All-ACC recognition for the third time; he was an All-ACC Third Team selection by coaches in 2015 & 2016.
- TE Christopher Herndon IV, RB Travis Homer, DT RJ McIntosh, CB Michael Jackson and S Jaquan Johnson were all named to the All-ACC Second Team. It was the first honor for each of those Canes.
- LB Shaq Quarterman picked up the second All-ACC honor of his career, earning a second-team spot.
 Quarterman was named to the All-ACC Third Team by ACC coaches during his 2016 freshman season.
- WR Braxton Berrios, LT Kc McDermott and DE Trent Harris were all named to the All-ACC Third
 Team. It was the first honor of each of those Hurricanes' careers, all coming in their senior season.
- Six more Canes earned All-ACC Honorable Mention recognition, bringing the total to 16 honored.

RICHT EARNS TWO COACH OF THE YEAR HONORS: ACC & WALTER CAMP

- On Nov. 28, Mark Richt became the first Miami Hurricanes head coach to win ACC Coach of the Year.
- Richt picked up his second major coaching honor as Walter Camp Coach of the Year on Dec. 5.
- Despite a 38-3 loss to Clemson last time out, Miami was ranked in the top 10 in the College Football Playoff rankings for the fifth straight week. UM had never been ranked in the CFP before 2017.



SOUTH FLORIDA'S TEAM BACK PLAYING IN SOUTH FLORIDA'S GAME

- The University of Miami has played in the Orange Bowl 10 times and has a 6-3 record in those games.
- Miami has not played in the Orange Bowl since joining the ACC, its last appearance coming during the 2003 season with a 16-14 win over Florida State in the 2004 Orange Bowl (Jan. 1, 2014).
- The Hurricanes lost their first Orange Bowl appearance, 0-26, to Bucknell in 1935; the most points they have ever scored in an Orange Bowl game was in a 23-3 win over Nebraska in the 1989 game.

WEATHERING A STORM ON THE WAY TO CAPITAL ONE ORANGE BOWL

- Miami's season was rocked in the early going by Hurricane Irma, forcing UM to abruptly change the course of 2017, including the cancellation of one game and its bye week, as well as two reschedulings.
- Due to the rescheduling, the ACC Championship Game against Clemson on Dec. 2 marked Miami's
 11th straight playing a football game. The Hurricanes' Sept. 9 game at Arkansas State was cancelled,
 and a Sept. 16 game at Florida State was postponed and rescheduled for Oct. 7 a mutual bye week.
- Miami's scheduled Oct. 12 game against Georgia Tech on a Thursday night at Hard Rock Stadium was pushed back two days to Sat., Oct. 14 due to the long Hurricane Irma-induced layoff.
- The Hurricanes were dismissed on Sept. 7, regathered as a team at the Disney Wide World of Sports Complex in Orlando on Sept. 15 and returned to Miami for a Sept. 23 game against Toledo.

ROSIER TIES TESTAVERDE'S SINGLE-SEASON UM TOUCHDOWN RECORD

- After throwing for two touchdowns in the regular season finale vs. Pitt (Nov. 24), QB Malik Rosier has
 accounted for 30 total touchdowns in 2017 tying Vinny Testaverde's single-season record (1986).
- Rosier will be making the 14th start of his career and eighth start inside Hard Rock Stadium on Dec.
 30. As a starting QB, Rosier has career records of 7-0 at home, 4-1 on the road and 0-1 in neutral sites.
- With 25 touchdown passes this year, the Mobile, Ala., native is tied with Bernie Kosar (1984) and Ken Dorsey (2000) for sixth-most at Miami. The single-season Miami record is 29 (Steve Walsh, 1988).
- Rosier ranks fifth in the ACC in passing efficiency (133.2) with 25 passing TDs and 11 interceptions. He also ranks fifth in total offense (277.9 yards per game) and sixth in passing yards per game (263.9).
- In seven career starts at Hard Rock Stadium, Malik is 7-0 with 1,740 yards on 134-of-218 passing (61.5 percent) with 15 touchdowns & six interceptions. He has added 283 rushing yards and four rush TDs.
- Rosier's only start prior to 2017 came on Oct. 31, 2015, when he played in place of injured Brad Kaaya
 in a 30-27 win at Duke. Rosier finished 20-for-29 for 272 yards with two touchdowns in the victory.
- The Mobile, Ala., native was announced as Miami's starting QB by head coach Mark Richt on Aug. 22.
- Rosier redshirted the 2014 football season and served as back-up in 2015 and 2016. He was on the 2015 UM baseball team that went to the College World Series, though he did not travel to the CWS.

WHO'S ROCKING THE TURNOVER CHAIN?

- The now famous University of Miami "turnover chain" made its debut Sept. 2 vs. Bethune-Cookman, when sophomore DB Malek Young was rewarded for an interception with an oversized sparkling "U" chain on the sidelines at Hard Rock Stadium. 16 different players have worn "the chain."
- The 16 Hurricanes who have "officially" worn the chain: DB Jaquan Johnson (four interceptions, two fumble recoveries), LB Michael Pinckney (interception, fumble recovery), DB Malek Young (two interceptions, fumble recovery), DB Michael Jackson (four interceptions, fumble recovery), DB Sheldrick Redwine (fumble recovery, two interceptions), DL RJ McIntosh (fumble recovery), DL Ryan Fines (fumble recovery), DL Pat Bethel (fumble recovery), DB Dee Delaney (interception), LB Shaq Quarterman (fumble recovery), DL Demetrius Jackson (interception), LB Charles Perry (interception), DB Trajan Bandy (interception), DL Jonathan Garvin (two fumble recoveries), RB Travis Homer (fumble recovery on special teams) and DL Trent Harris (fumble recovery).
- DB Jaquan Johnson has worn the chain the most (six times); DB Michael Jackson is second (five).
- Beginning with a game against Syracuse on Oct. 21, Miami forced four turnovers in four straight games - the first time time an FBS team has done it vs. four Power-5 opponents since at least 2004.

JAQUAN NAMED TEAM MVP AND A SECOND-TEAM ALL-AMERICAN

- Junior DB **Jaquan Johnson** has been one of the nation's top defensive backs this year, and was named to the All-America Second Team by Sports Illustrated and American Football Coaches (AFCA).
- After leading Miami in tackles (85) and interceptions (four), he was named recipient of the Jack Harding Team MVP award at Miami's annual Football Awards Show on Sat., Dec. 16.
- He was of four defensive players named semifinalists for the Walter Camp Player of the Year (Nov 15).
- Johnson was named ACC Defensive of the Back three weeks in a row (Nov. 6, Nov. 13, Nov. 20), becoming the first Hurricane player to ever be honored by the ACC in three consecutive weeks.
- The last ACC player to earn honors in three straight weeks was Deshaun Watson of Clemson in 2014.

BIG-TIME BOWL BOSS

- The 2017 Capital One Orange Bowl will be head coach Mark Richt's 27th bowl game as a coach and his 16th as a head coach. Richt owns a 10-5 record in bowl games as a head coach during his career.
- Richt will serve as head coach during the Orange Bowl for the first time in his career; he has taken part in four prior Orange Bowls, all as an assistant coach at Florida State, and is 3-1 in those games.
- All five of Mark Richt's bowl losses as head coach have come by five points or fewer. Richt's last bowl loss came during the 2013 season (2014 Gator Bowl). He has won four of his last five bowl games.
- Richt is 1-0 in bowl games at Miami, having guided the Hurricanes to a 31-14 win over West Virginia in the 2016 Russell Athletic Bowl - Miami's first bowl win since the 2006 season (MPC Computers Bowl).
- In addition, Richt has coached in four national championship games, all as an assistant coach.

BALLHAWKING IN THE SECONDARY

- The Hurricanes rank first in the ACC and are second nationally with an average turnover margin of +1.25 per game (+15 for the season), and a big reason is standout play in the Miami secondary.
- Miami's 30 gained turnovers are the second-most nationally and its 17 interceptions are ninth-most.
- UM, who ranks first in the ACC in turnover margin & turnovers gained, forced just 19 turnovers in 2016.
- DB Trajan Bandy's pick-six vs. Notre Dame on Nov. 11 was Miami's first defensive score of the season
 and the first interception returned for a TD by a Hurricane since Tyriq McCord vs. Cincinnati in 2014.
 DB Jaquan Johnson followed up Bandy's pick-six with his own against Virginia (Nov. 18).

BRAXTON BALLING IN FINAL SEASON AT THE U - ON THE FIELD & OFF

- Senior WR **Braxton Berrios** served as Miami's top offensive threat during the regular season. He leads all Hurricanes pass catchers in catches (52), receiving yards (634) and receiving touchdowns (nine).
- Berrios' stat line in 2017 exceeds his combined final statistical line from his first three seasons, when he totaled 45 catches, 496 receiving yards and five receiving touchdowns in 36 games.
- Off the field, the Raleigh, N.C., native has been just as impressive; Berrios was named a finalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy, considered the "Academic Heisman," in early November. He graduated with a 3.96 GPA as a double major in entrepreneurship and finance at The U on Dec. 14.
- Berrios won the Pop Warner Little Scholars College Football Award (for a senior who has made a
 difference on the field and in the community), was named the recipient of the ACC's Jim Tatum Award
 as the top football scholar-athlete and was valedictorian of the School of Business Administration.
- Berrios was one of three Canes to accept invitations to the 2018 Reese's Senior Bowl in Mobile, Ala.
- Last time out vs. Clemson (Dec. 2), Berrios led all pass-catchers with seven catches totaling 51 yards.
- Berrios posted his first and only career 100-yard receiving game vs. Toledo on Sept. 23. He hauled in five passes, including a career-long 55-yard reception, for 105 yards with one receiving score.
- Named one of four team captains and Offensive MVP, Berrios was selected to the All-ACC Third Team.

CLOSING IT OUT: MIAMI IMPRESSING IN SECOND HALVES UNDER RICHT

- Since Mark Richt's arrival as head coach, Miami has outscored its opponents in the second half in 19 of 25 games. A streak of 11 straight games where Miami won the second-half point battle ended in a win over Syracuse on Oct. 21, when the Hurricanes were outscored 14-16 over the final 30 minutes.
- Miami has a second-half point differential of +214 in 25 games under Richt, good for an average of +8.6 points in second halves. UM has lost the second-half battle just five times under Richt.
- Miami's only five games on the wrong end of second-half scoring came vs. Florida State (-11) and at Virginia Tech (-14) in 2016, and vs. Syracuse (-2) and at Pitt (-7) in 2017. UM also lost the second-half battle vs. Clemson (-14) in the ACC Championship Game at Bank of America Stadium in Charlotte, N.C.
- The Hurricanes have outscored opponents 444-227 in the second half in 25 games under Richt, and have held an opponent to 10 points or fewer in the second half in 17 of 25 games.

"BADG-O-MATIC" THE TOP KICKER IN MIAMI FOOTBALL HISTORY

- With two field goals against Notre Dame on Nov. 11, K Michael Badgley made history by becoming
 UM's all-time leader in field goals made with 74. He hit his 75th field goal against Virginia (Nov. 18)
 and added the 76th field goal of his career in the ACC Championship Game vs. Clemson (Dec. 2).
- Badgley, who was named a semifinalist for the Lou Groza Award, moved past Hurricane great Carlos
 Huerta (1988-1991), who had 73 in his career. Badgley hit a Miami-record 25 field goals in 2015.
- Badgley 397 career points are tied with Huerta for the most points scored in history by a Hurricane.
- The New Jersey native, who was named to the All-ACC First Team for the first time in his career, has
 enjoyed a strong final season at Miami, going 16-for-20 on field goals and 42-for-43 on PATs.
- Badgley connected on a game-winning field goal with four seconds left vs. Georgia Tech (Oct. 14).



"TOOLBOX TRENT" MAKING PLAYS IN FINAL SEASON AT THE U

- Senior DL Trent Harris has been among Miami's top defensive playmakers in his final season at Miami, and was recognized for his standout play by earning a spot on the All-ACC Third Team.
- Harris, who had 6.5 career sacks entering 2017, has three multi-sack games this season alone and ranks first on the team in sacks with 8.5. His 10.5 tackles for loss is tied for second on the Hurricanes.
- For his career, Harris has 25.0 tackles for loss & 15.0 sacks. Both of his 2017 marks are career bests.

HURRICANES DROP TO #10 IN COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF RANKINGS

- After a 38-3 loss to Clemson in the ACC Championship Game, Miami fell to No. 10 in the College Football Playoff rankings on Dec. 3. Miami was ranked in the top 10 of every CFP poll this year.
- The Hurricanes earned their highest ever position in the College Football Playoff rankings relased on Nov. 21, jumping one spot from No. 3 to No. 2; it was their second straight week in the "top four."
- After a 41-8 win over Notre Dame on Nov. 11, UM moved up four spots in the playoff rankings released on Nov. 14, jumping from No. 7 into their first position ever inside the "top four" at No. 3.
- Miami's four-spot leap matched the biggest jump by any team into the top four since the CFP's
 inception in 2014, matching Alabama's four-spot jump in 2014 and Oklahoma's similar leap in 2015.
- Miami debuted at No. 10 in the initial College Football Playoff rankings of 2017 released on Oct. 31

HERNDON'S SENIOR CAMPAIGN COMES TO AN END WITH INJURY

- Miami was expecting a big year from senior tight end Christopher Herndon IV and he delivered a
 dominant campaign, earning second-team All-ACC recognition in his final season at The U.
- Herndon, who was one of eight semifinalists for the Mackey Award honoring the nation's top tight eend, saw his season ended with a left knee injury suffered against Pittsburgh on Nov. 24.
- Herndon set career marks in catches (40), receiving yards (477) and receiving touchdowns (four) in 11 games, besting his previous highs set as a junior in 2016 (28 catches, 334 yards, two touchdowns). Herndon recorded career-high totals of 10 catches and 96 yards with one TD vs. Syracuse on Oct. 21.
- The Georgia native, who started all 11 games this year, ranks second on the team with 40 receptions for 477 yards. He was named ACC Receiver of the Week on Oct. 23 for his performance vs. Syracuse.
- In 43 career games, Herndon made 26 career starts and totaled 86 receptions, 1,048 yards and seven touchdowns. He started 12 of 13 games in 2016, when he set career marks in every category.
- Herndon's 2016 tight end partner, David Njoku, was selected in the first round of the 2017 NFL Draft by the Cleveland Browns. Njoku has 24 catches for 258 receiving yards with three TDs this season.
- Njoku (2017) became the fifth Miami tight end drafted in the first round since 2000, joining Bubba Franks (2000), Jeremy Shockey (2002), Kellen Winslow (2004) and Greg Olsen (2007).

THE NATION'S LONGEST ACTIVE WINNING STREAK COMES TO AN END

- The Miami Hurricanes had won 15 games in a row dating back to 2016 before falling to Pittsburgh, 14-24, on the road on Nov. 24. The loss snapped what was the longest winning streak in FBS.
- UM had not lost since a 27-30 defeat at Notre Dame in South Bend, Ind., on Oct. 29, 2016. The 15-game winning streak was the fourth-longest in ACC history and longest in **Mark Richt**'s career.
- Miami's average margin of victory during its 15-game winning streak was an impressive 16.9 points.
- Since taking over, **Mark Richt** has guided Miami to a 19-6 record and Miami's 19 wins have come by an average of 20.9 points. The five losses have come by an average of just 8.4 points.

THE QUARTERBACK WHISPERER

- Under the watchful eye of head coach and quarterback guru **Mark Richt**, play at the QB position was instrumental during Miami's 15-game winning streak the fourth-longest in ACC history.
- Miami's quarterbacks threw for 37 touchdowns compared to just 10 interceptions over the 15-game winning streak and compiled a total of 4,184 passing yards - an average of 278.9 yards per game.
- In 25 games since taking over as head coach at The U, Richt has helped his quarterbacks compile a touchdown-to-interception ratio of 52:18 and 6,497 passing yards an average of 259.9 per game.

CONSISTENT CANES

- Of the 22 field positions, 10 Hurricanes have been starters in every game this season: QB Malik
 Rosier, WR Braxton Berrios, LT Kc McDermott, LG Trevor Darling, C Tyler Gauthier, RT Tyree St.
 Louis, DL Chad Thomas, DL RJ McIntosh, LB Shaquille Quarterman and DB Jaquan Johnson. DL
 Kendrick Norton has started 11 of 12 games on the defensive line.
- McDermott's 33-game consecutive start streak is the longest on the team.
- Sophomore LB Shaquille Quarterman has started every game of his Hurricanes career (25).

HOMER DAZZLES IN FIRST EIGHT GAMES AS STARTING RUNNING BACK

- Stepping into a role vacated by Preseason All-ACC running back Mark Walton due to injury, sophomore RB Travis Homer has impressed and was named an All-ACC Second Team pick.
- The West Palm Beach native is just 98 yards shy of reaching the 1,000-yard mark this season.
- Homer delivered a dominant 170-yard rushing game in the first start of his career vs. Georgia Tech (Oct. 14) no back has had more rushing yards in his first UM start since at least 2000.
- The Palm Beach native became the eighth Miami tailback to have recorded a 100-yard game in his
 first career start since 2000, and the fourth to do it in an Atlantic Coast Conference game.
- Homer's performance was just the 22nd game of 170 yards or more by a Miami back since 1980.
- Homer had 96 rushing yards and a 19-yard rushing touchdown in the victory over Virginia (Nov. 18).
- Homer had the third 100-yard rushing game of his career vs. Notre Dame (Nov. 11) with 146 yards.

DEFENSIVE LINE PLAYING IT "KOOL" UNDER ONE OF NATION'S BEST

- Assistant head coach and defensive line coach **Craig Kuligowski**, widely regarded as one of the best line coaches in America, has made an immediate impact in his first two seasons at The U.
- UM ranks first in FBS in team sacks (3.58) and second nationwide in tackles for loss per game (8.8).
- With one game remaining, Miami's 105 tackles for loss are already its eighth-most since 2000.
- In a win over Virginia on Nov. 18, the Hurricanes tied a season high with 11 tackles for loss and had its second-most sacks (five) of the year. Senior DL Trent Harris had 2.5 TFLs and two sacks.
- Facing what many considered the best offensive lines in the nation, Miami totaled nine tackles for loss (29 yards) and five sacks against Notre Dame on Nov. 11. Harris also had two sacks in that game.
- Miami finished the 2016 season fifth in the nation in tackles for loss per game (8.3) and ranked 22nd in sacks per game (2.85). The Hurricanes finished 2016 with 108 tackles for loss and 38 sacks..
- Following the 2016 season, Kuligowski was promoted to Assistant Head Coach/Defensive Line.

- Over three games from Oct. 14-28, no player was a bigger contributor on offense than WR Jeff
 Thomas, who exploded for 240 yards and two touchdowns over those three games.
- Thomas has been on the receiving end of the two longest pass plays of the season: a 70-yard reception against Georgia Tech on Oct. 14 and a 78-yard touchdown vs. North Carolina on Oct. 28.
- The former four-star recruit and Under Armour All-America Game MVP had just four catches for nine receiving yards in his first four games but caught multiple passes in his next four games.

SO CLOSE

- Miami's four losses in 2016 came by a combined 32 points (8.0 points per game average). Two of Miami's four losses came by three points or fewer (vs. FSU, 20-19, at Notre Dame, 30-27).
- Only one loss last season came by more than one score a 16-37 defeat at Virginia Tech on Oct. 20. On the flip side, 15 of Miami's 19 wins under Mark Richt have come by 14 points or more.

KEEPING IT IN THE "U FAMILY"

- As is often the case at the University of Miami, a number of Canes have family ties to 'The U'
- Four Hurricanes had fathers who suited up in orange and green: sophomore TE **Michael Irvin II** (father is Michael) II, DL **Scott Patchan** (Matt), DL **Pat Bethel** (Randy) & P **Zach Feagles** (Jeff).
- WR **Evidence Njoku** is the younger brother of David, who was taken by Cleveland in the 2017 NFL Draft, while OL **Kc McDermott** is the younger brother of OL **Shane McDermott** (2010-2014).

OFFENSIVE LINE NAMED TO JOE MOORE AWARD HONOR ROLL

- Miami's offensive line was one of 22 named to the Joe Moore Award Honor Roll on Oct. 9, honoring the men up front who displays qualities of the best offensive lines in the country.
- The Hurricanes' offensive line has consisted of four starters who have started every game LT Kc McDermott, LG Trevor Darling, C Tyler Gauthier and RT Tyree St. Louis.

HOMER 98 YARDS SHY OF TOPPING 1,000 RUSHING YARDS IN 2017

- Despite not making his first start until the fifth game of the season, RB **Travis Homer** is on the verge of reaching the 1,000-yard rushing plateau in his first season as Hurricanes' starting running back.
- After rushing for 41 yards last time out against Clemson on Dec. 2, Homer has 902 yards on 151 carries. He ranks seventh in the ACC in rushing yards per game (75.2) but did not start until Game 5.
- If Homer rushes for 1,000, Miami will have four straight seasons with a 1,000-yard rusher for the first time ever; **Duke Johnson** (2014), **Joe Yearby** (2015) and **Mark Walton** (2016) reached 1,000.
- Homer would become just the 11th back in Miami history to total 1,000 yards if he eclipses the mark.

McINTOSH, NORTON AMONG TOP DEFENSIVE TACKLE TANDEMS

- Miami's defense ranks first nationally in team sacks and second nationally in team tackles for loss, and a big part of that equation is junior defensive linemen RJ McIntosh and Kendrick Norton.
- McIntosh was named to the All-ACC Second Team while Norton was an Honorable Mention pick.
- McIntosh has started all 12 games for Miami and has totaled an impressive 12.5 tackles for loss, 2.5 sacks, six pass breakups and one fumble recovery. His 49 tackles are sixth-most on the defense.
- Norton, who has started 11 of 12 games, has 22 tackles with 6.5 tackles for loss and 2.0 sacks.

ALMOST PERFECT 10

- Teams rarely beat Miami when scoring 10-or-fewer points.
- The Hurricanes are 164-2 in their last 166 games when holding opponents to 10 points-or-fewer, after winning 41-8 vs. Notre Dame on Nov. 11, 2017 and 28-10 vs. Virginia Tech on Nov. 4, 2017.
- That run goes back to Oct. 1, 1977 a season that began with Miami holding its first two opponents
 to exactly 10 points apiece and still lost both of those games. The only 10 points allowed-or-fewer
 losses: Nov. 8, 2003 to Tennessee (10-6) & Sept. 5, 2005 to Florida State (10-7).
- Head coach Mark Richt and defensive coordinator Manny Diaz have helped Miami hold opponents to 10 or fewer points in five games since the staff arrived prior to the 2016 season.

RICHARDS BATTLES THROUGH INJURY-PLAGUED SOPHOMORE YEAR

- After missing the first two games of 2017 with a hamstring injury suffered during training camp, WR
 Ahmmon Richards returned vs. Duke on Sept. 29, starting and totaling 106 receiving yards.
- Richards ranks third in catches (24), receiving yards (439) and touchdown catches (3) this year.
- The sophomore sensation suffered a season-ending injury prior to the ACC Championship Game.

- Georgia Tech entered the Sat., Oct. 14 matchup at Hard Rock Stadium ranked sixth nationwide in total defense (260 yards per game) and 20th nationwide in total offense (479.3 yards per game).
- The Hurricanes outgained the Yellow Jackets 481-281 in the 25-24 win, marking just the ninth time Georgia Tech has been outgained by 200 or more yards since the 2004 season.
- DC **Manny Diaz** & Miami held GT to 226 rushing yards 170 below its average entering the game.

OFFENSE LOSES WALTON TO SEASON-ENDING INJURY VS. NOLES

- The only returning running back in the ACC who posted a 1,000-yard rushing season in 2016, RB **Mark Walton** was off to a sizzling start to 2017 before suffering an ankle injury at Florida State.
- Walton started and recorded 25 rushing yards against the Noles before what coach Mark Richt deemed a "season-ending" right ankle injury Walton was carted off the field in Tallahassee.
- Walton was averaging 107.0 rushing yards per game through four games and 7.6 yards per carry

MANY MEMBERS OF #SQUAD17 MAKING AN EARLY IMPACT AT THE U

- The University of Miami football team announced its 2017 signing class on Feb. 1, and the group of 24 student-athletes was ranked the 12th-best class nationwide by ESPN and 247Sports.
- The signing class featured 10 early enrollees Robert Burns, Amari Carter, DeeJay Dallas, Navaughn Donaldson, Zach Dykstra, Jonathan Garvin, Bradley Jennings, Jr., Brian Polendey, Waynmon Steed and Cade Weldon and also featured 10 ESPN300 recruits and 16 players from FL.
- A number of Hurricanes have made an immediate impact in their first seasons at The U; Donaldson
 has served as starting right guard, Garvin has two strip-sacks on defense, Carter has been a special
 teams captain, while WRs Jeff Thomas and Mike Harley as well as OL Corey Gaynor have all
 started games. DB Trajan Bandy has started and recorded a touchdown against Notre Dame.

WALTON AMONG TOP BACKS IN MIAMI'S STORIED HISTORY AT RB

- With 1,995 career rush yards, Walton now sits in 11th place all-time at Miami; he entered the season No. 21 in all-time rush yards. His eight 100-yard rush games are tied for eighth-most.
- With 25 yards against Florida State in his final game of 2017, Walton moved from No. 12 to No. 11 in the record books, leapfrogging UM legend **Frank Gore** (2001-04), who totaled 1,975 career yards.
- Walton opened 2017 with a bang, recording 148 yards and two rushing touchdowns in Week 1. He
 followed that up with the seventh 200-yard rushing game ever in Week 2 vs. Toledo. Walton now
 has 28 career TDs in 30 career games and is tied for fifth in rushing TDs at Miami (26).
- In 2016, Walton became just the 10th running back in Miami history to rush for over 1,000 yards.
- The impressive feat marked the 11th 1,000-yard rushing season in Miami's and the third straight
 year the Hurricanes had a 1,000-yard rusher; **Duke Johnson** rushed for 1,652 yards in 2014 while
 Joe Yearby finished with 1,002 yards on the ground in 2015.

17 TRUE FRESHMEN PLAY IN THE OPENER VS. BETHUNE-COOKMAN

- The Hurricanes tied for the national lead with 17 true freshmen playing against Bethune-Cookman on Sept. 2. Both Georgia and LSU also had 17 true freshmen also play in their openers.
- In addition to starts by WR Mike Harley and OL Navaughn Donaldson, DL Jonathan Garvin, DL DJ Johnson, DL Jonathan Ford, WR Jeff Thomas, WR DeeJay Dallas, P Zach Feagles, OL Corey Gaynor, OL Kai-Leon Herbert, LB Bradley Jennings, Jr., DB Amari Carter, DB Trajan Bandy, DB Derrick Smith, TE Brian Polendey, LB De'Andre Wilder and WR Marshall Few also saw time,

GETTING DEFENSIVE

- Under defensive coordinator Manny Diaz, the Hurricanes held opponents to just 4.75 yards per play in 2016 - a figure that ranked ninth among teams at the FBS level.
- The Hurricanes ranked in the top 25 nationally in four different defensive categories: scoring defense (No. 12/18.5), team sacks (No. 22/2.85), tackles for loss (No. 5/8.3) and total defense (No. 20/345.5). Miami held 11 of its 13 opponents under their 2016 scoring average, including West Virginia in the Russell Athletic Bowl on Dec. 28.
- In 2016, nine Miami Hurricanes had at least 5.0 tackles for loss on defense. In 2015, just four players finished the season (13 games) with at least 5.0 tackles for loss.

• The Miami Hurricanes signed 19 student-athletes during the early signing period. Included in the group are 15 players from the state of Florida, four Under Armour All-Americans, four U.S. Army All-Americans, 12 players in the ESPN300 and 12 players in the 247Sports Top 247.

MARK RICHT

HEAD COACH | SECOND SEASON AT MIAMI (17TH OVERALL) | 164-57 (.742)

In just two seasons as head coach, Mark Richt has made an indelible impact on his alma mater's football program -- both on and off the field.

Richt has posted a 19-6 record over those two seasons, the third best start in Miami history, and a stretch that included a 15-game winning streak -- UM's longest since 2002. The Hurricanes won 10 games in 2017, climbing as high as second in the College Football Playoff rankings. Miami captured the Atlantic Coast Conference's Coastal Division for the first time in its history and earned an invitation to the Capital One Orange Bowl for the first time in 13 years. Richt won 2017 ACC Coach of the Year honors and was also named the 2017 Walter Camp Coach of the Year.

The Hurricanes led the nation in turnover margin in 2017, forcing 30 takeaways, and ranked first in team sacks per game (3.55). Junior quarterback Malik Rosier accounted for 30 total touchdowns, tying Vinny Testaverde's single-season school record, and helping Miami rank 12th in the nation in red zone offense (92.7 percent). Junior defensive back Jaquan Johnson had a breakout season, leading the team with 85 tackles, picking off four passes and earning ACC Defensive Back of the Week honors three times. Overall, 10 Hurricanes earned All-ACC honors, including kicker Michael Badgley, who was named first-team All-ACC.

Off the field, Richt has energized the program, from supporting the fundraising efforts for the Carol Soffer Football Indoor Practice Facility to launching The U Network, which assists former Hurricanes in networking and career placement after their playing careers have concluded. Miami was one of three schools, along with Stanford and Northwestern, to earn the 2016 American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Academic Achievement Award. In addition, the Hurricanes ranked first among all FBS programs in 2016 in the NCAA Team Works Helper Helper Community Service Competition.

Richt was named the University of Miami's 24th head football coach on Dec. 4, 2015. His hiring provided immediate dividends as the Hurricanes posted a 9-4 record in his first season in Coral Gables. Miami then defeated West Virginia, 31-14, in the Russell Athletic Bowl for the program's first bowl victory in 10 years. The Hurricanes were ranked No. 20 in the final Associated Press poll and No. 23 in the final Amway Coaches Poll – the program's

first season-ending rankings since 2009.

Miami had 10 players earned ACSMA All-ACC honors in 2016, while quarterback Brad Kaa-ya became Miami's all-time passing yards leader. Freshman wide receiver Ahmmon Richards broke the 31-year-old freshman receiving record at Miami originally set by Michael Irvin, while sophomore running back Mark Walton became the 11th 1,000-yard rusher in program history.

Richt, born in Omaha, Neb., and raised in Boca Raton, Fla., returned to his alma mater after leading the University of Georgia football program for the previous 15 years. He compiled a 145-51 overall record and an 85-40 mark in Southeastern Conference play. Georgia won two SEC championships, six SEC East titles and nine bowl games under Richt, and finished the season in the Associated Press Top-10 rankings seven times.

Richt's 164 career wins rank fourth among active FBS head coaches and his .744 winning percentage ranks as the seventh best among current FBS coaches with at least five years of experience. Richt is one of only seven head coaches in SEC history to record four straight 10-win seasons (2002-05).

During his tenure in Athens, 85 of Richt's players were selected in the NFL Draft, including eight chosen in the 2002 and 2013 NFL Drafts – the most Georgia players ever selected in a single year. Richt also placed a strong emphasis on academics as 292 Georgia players earned their degrees during his tenure.

In 2016, Richt was named the first-ever honorary head coach of the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team for his commitment to giving back to others. In 2013, Richt received the Stallings Award given for commitment to humanitarian and community service efforts, and in 2010, he was named to the AFCA Board of Trustees.

Richt is married to the former Katharyn Francis of Tallahassee. The couple has four children – Jonathan, David, Zach, and Anya. Jon, the Miami quarterbacks coach, was married to the former Anna Cearley, in May 2010. They have one daughter, Jadyn.


