STORY LINES

- After dropping their rivalry series with No. 2 FSU last weekend, No. 16 Miami opens a homestand with a midweek pair against Villanova. Miami has not played the Wildcats since 2000, and holds a flawless 4-0 record all-time against VU.
- Miami will continue its nonconference slate before opening ACC play this coming weekend against BC. The Hurricanes have played series with then-No. 16 Florida and No. 2 FSU in nonconference play, as well as 2013 NCAA Regional foe FAU.
- Miami is ranked in the top 20 in every major college baseball poll. The Hurricanes check in at No. 16 in Baseball
 America, No. 20 in Collegiate Baseball Newspaper's rankings, No. 20 in Perfect Game and No. 17 in USA Today Coaches.
- Freshman LHP Danny Garcia (0.0, 0.00 ERA) will make his career-first start Wednesday. Team captain and senior RHP
 Javi Salas who tossed four shutout innings in an exhibition against the Marlins (2/26) is expected to pitch Tuesday.
- Miami captured its third win of the season against a top 25 team with a 3-1 victory in its series opener against #2 FSU
- Tuesday's matchup will open a six-game homestand, which includes two games against VU and a weekend series with Boston College. The Hurricanes will travel to Stetson and Georgia Tech following the conclusion of the homestand.
- After struggling to hit for power in 2013, Miami has eight home runs through its first 10 games the most of any team in the ACC. Dale Carey, Zack Collins and Garrett Kennedy each have two home runs this season.

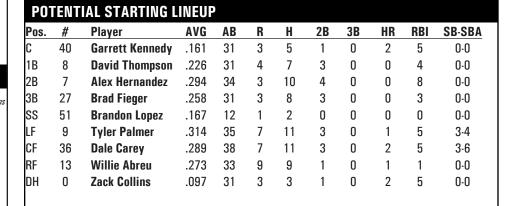

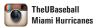

THE HURRICANES SKIPPER

In his 21st season at Miami, few programs have qualified for the College World Series as much as Jim Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament an NCAA-record 41 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 20 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006.

Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 892-350-3 (.717) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,396-617-4 (.693) Division I record in 32 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 36 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,527-657-4 (.698) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 20 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium project.

MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

Jim Morris earned his 29th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2013 when he guided the Canes to a No. 2 seed in the Louisville [Ky.] Regional. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 20 seasons (1994-2013), winning 15 of those appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.

Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris led the 2013 Hurricanes to their 41st-straight NCAA Tournament. Despite six signees being drafted in the 2013 MLB Draft, the Hurricanes reeled in a top 5 recruiting class by national publications.

MORRIS IN 36th SEASON AS HEAD COACH

Morris entered 2014 as the fifth-winningest active coach in Division I baseball with 1,391 wins. His impressive win total ranks him No. 12 all-time for any coach, regardless of division. Including his time at DeKalb C.C., Morris won his 1,500th game as a head coach in Miami's 4-1 upset of No. 1 North Carolina on March 15, 2013 in Chapel Hill, N.C.

Morris currently has a 1,396-617-4 (.693) record at the Division I level. As a head coach overall, he has compiled a 1,527-657-4 (.698) record over 30-plus years.

Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later, he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern in March 2001



MAJOR LEAGUE GUIDANCE

Over 150 professional baseball players have played under Morris during their college careers at Miami, Georgia Tech and DeKalb.

Among the players Morris coached at Miami that went on to play in the Major Leagues were Yonder Alonso (San Diego), Ryan Braun (Milwaukee), Pat Burrell (Tampa Bay), Alex Cora (New York Mets), Yasmani Grandal (San Diego), Bobby Hill (San Diego), Aubrey Huff (Detroit), Ryan Jackson (St. Louis), Chris Perez (Cleveland), Cesar Carrillo (San Diego), Brian Barton (St. Louis), Eddy Rodriguez (San Diego), Gaby Sanchez (Florida), Blake Tekotte (Chicago White Sox), Charlton Jimerson (Houston), Jay Tessmer (New York Yankees), Danny Valencia (Minnesota Twins), Jon Jay (St. Louis), Danny Graves (Cincinnati) and Jason Michaels (Houston).

Standout players under Morris from his days at Georgia Tech were Nomar Garciaparra (Los Angeles Dodgers), Jay Payton (Oakland A's) and Jason Varitek (Boston Red Sox).

Morris has also enjoyed success on the International scene. From 1989-90, Morris served as head coach of the USA Baseball team that won a Silver Medal in the 1989 Presidential Cup (Taiwan), Bronze Medal at the Goodwill Games and the 1990 International Baseball Association (IBA) World All-Star Game in Atlanta. At the Goodwill Games, his USA squad won two of three games against Cuba, marking the first time in history a senior-level team won a series with Cuba. In 1987, Morris served as pitching coach under Ron Fraser at the Pan American Games (Silver Medal).

WEEKEND NEWS & NOTES

STARTING OUT STRONG...

- The No. 16 Miami Hurricanes continue their challenging start to the 2014 season with a midweek series against visiting Villanova.
- Miami has three wins against teams ranked in the top 25 through its first 10 games, including two in a series victory over then-No. 16 Florida (Feb. 21-23). The Hurricanes also captured the series opener against No. 2 FSU 3-1 on the road on Feb. 28.
- Miami's other nonconference competition has included a series victory over 2013 America East regular season champions Maine and a 5-2 midweek loss to FAU, who qualified for the 2013 NCAA Tournament.
- The schedule doesn't get any easier for the Hurricanes, who open ACC play this weekend against **Boston College** (March 7-9) before traveling to Stetson (March 12) and Georgia Tech (March 14-16).

POWER SURGE...

- Miami ranks first in the ACC with eight home runs through the first three weekends of the regular season. Dale Carey, Zack Collins and Garrett Kennedy lead Miami with two homers each.
- The Hurricane offense exploded for six home runs in its series with Florida (Feb. 21-23), the most for a Miami team in a single series since an April 2010 weekend set at Virginia Tech.
- Collins became the first Hurricane since current San Diego Padres slugger Yonder Alonso (2006) to record a home run as his first collegiate hit - a three-run blast against Florida (Feb. 22). He also recorded home runs in an exhibition with the Marlins (solo HR, Feb. 26) and on the road at Florida State (two-run HR, March 2).
- Miami did not record its eight home run of the 2013 season until a 5-3 win over Maryland on April 13 - the team's 38th game of the spring.

FRESHMEN PHENOMS...

- Three freshmen were in head coach Jim Morris' Opening Day lineup: Zack Collins (first base), Willie Abreu (designated hitter) and Johnny Ruiz (second base). Laz Rivera, Jacob Heyward and Brad Zunica have also earned starts through the first three weekends of the season.
- Freshman closer Bryan Garcia recorded the first two saves of his career in back-to-back wins over Florida (Feb. 21-22). He recorded his third save of the season against Florida State (March 1), and ranks second in the ACC with three saves this season.
- Abreu, Collins and Zunica found themselves on the same lineup card for the first time in the series finale against FSU (March 2), and combined for seven hits, two doubles, one home run, four RBI and four runs scored.
- Freshmen who have seen early playing time out of the bullpen are righthanded reliever Cooper Hammond and lefthanded pitcher Danny Garcia.
- Four players from the recruiting class were selected in the 2013 MLB Draft but opted to play collegiately: Abreu, Collins, Heyward and righthanded pitcher Derik Beauprez.
- The freshman class was rated No. 4 by Collegiate Baseball and No. 6 by Baseball America - its highest ranking from the publication since 2006.

WEEKEND NEWS & NOTES

THREE UP, THREE DOWN...

- Junior LHP Chris Diaz picked up his third straight win to open the 2014 season in a 3-1 victory over Florida State (Feb. 28).
- Diaz, who ranked second in the ACC in ERA in 2013 (1.64), did not pick up his third win of the 2013 season until March 22 against Virginia Tech. He finished 2013 with a 7-5 record.
- The Florida City, Fla., native went seven innings without allowing an earned run against No. 2 FSU, and lowered his career ERA to 2.18 with the standout performance.

CANES LEGENDS RECOGNIZED...

- Alex Fernandez and Mike Fiore will be among the seven-member Class of 2014 to be inducted into the College Baseball Hall of Fame, the College Baseball Foundation announced.
- Fernandez and Fiore join former head coach Ron Fraser (Class of 2006), assistant coach/player **Skip Bertman** (2006) and pitcher **Neal** Heaton (2008) as University of Miami inductees into the College Baseball Hall of Fame.
- Fernandez was named Freshman of the Year and a first-team All-American in 1989, where he won 15 games with a 2.01 ERA and 177 strikeouts in 147 innings. A four-year UM starter, Fiore set 12 UM career batting marks, including hits (341), runs (258), doubles (63), runs batted in (235) and total bases (506).

RADZIEWSKI EARNS PRESEASON ACCLAIM...

- Redshirt junior LHP Bryan Radziewski ended the 2013 season as the only Hurricane to earn All-ACC recognition (first team), and was named a 2014 preseason All-American by a number of publications, including Collegiate Baseball, The Sporting News and NCBWA.
- In 2013, Radziewski became the Hurricanes first All-American since 2010 with Louisville Slugger second-team honors from Collegiate Baseball and Rawlings third-team honors from ABCA.

HIGH EXPECTATIONS...

- Miami entered the 2014 season ranked among the 20 teams in every major college baseball poll. The Hurricanes were rated No. 11 in Collegiate Baseball Newspaper's preseason rankings, No. 16 by Baseball America and No. 17 in the USA Today coaches poll.
- The Hurricanes pitching staff is expected to lead the way in 2014. Friday and Saturday night starters Chris Diaz (1.64 ERA) and Bryan Radziewski (1.75) ranked second and third, respectively, in ERA among all ACC pitchers in 2013.
- Joining the nucleus was a recruiting class ranked among the best nationwide - including a No. 4 ranking from Collegiate Baseball and No. 6 rating from Baseball America.

EARLY RETURNS...

- The returning umbers for the 2014 pitching staff show reason for optimism in 2014: 442.0 innings (80.1%), 31 wins (83.7%), 357 strikeouts (79.8%), and 59 of 62 starts (95.1%).
- Not far behind are returning hitting numbers, including 353 hits (69.3%), 61 doubles (73.4%), 174 RBI (70.4%) and 12 of 14 home runs (85.7%).
