**No. 20 MIAMI HOSTS NO. 14 GEORGIA TECH THURSDAY NIGHT**

► The University of Miami opens its 2009 home schedule at Land Shark Stadium on a national stage Thursday night, squaring off against Atlantic Coast Conference opponent Georgia Tech on ESPN. The Hurricanes are coming off a thrilling 38-34 win at No. 18 Florida State in Tallahassee on Labor Day while the Yellow Jackets enter the contest after early season wins over Jacksonville State and Clemson.

► Both teams enter tonight's contest ranked in the Top 25, as Miami entered both polls following its win over FSU while Georgia Tech has climbed a few spots after a No. 15 ranking in both preseason polls.

► The Hurricanes came out of the gate in 2009 with an impressive victory over the Seminoles in Tallahassee, edging out FSU on a national stage and in front of 81,077 fans in attendance at Doak Campbell Stadium.

► Quarterback Jacory Harris, running back Graig Cooper and wide receiver Travis Benjamin were three of the biggest stars in Miami's win over FSU. Harris etched his name into the UM record books, tossing for the 10th-most passing yards in a single game in school history with 386 yards through the air against the 'Noles. Cooper finished the game with 232 all-purpose yards, with the majority of those (177) coming on kick returns. Benjamin had one of the best receiving performances in recent UM history, catching four passes for 128 yards and a touchdown.

► Defensively for the 'Canes, cornerback Brandon Harris led the charge with a game- and career-high nine tackles (three solo), in addition to breaking up two passes against the 'Noles. Clinging to a four-point lead with FSU on the Miami two-yard line with nine seconds remaining, he defended a Christian Ponder pass to help seal the win for the Hurricanes. Veterans Colin McCarthy (eight tackles) and Randy Phillips (six tackles, INT) also had big performances in the opener.

**The MIAMI-GEORGIA TECH SERIES**

► Georgia Tech leads the all-time series between the two schools, 10-4. Miami's only win over Georgia Tech in ACC play came in the team's first year in the league when the 'Canes beat the Yellow Jackets, 27-3, on Oct. 2, 2004 in Atlanta.

► Give Miami its second win over a ranked opponent this season, improve its record to 2-0 in league play and give Randy Shannon his third straight victory in a home opener.

**'Canes IN THE CLASS ROOM**

▶ Miami's APR score in 2009 ranked 7th nationally with a score of 977. This score was the highest among all Florida institutions and second highest in the Atlantic Coast Conference.

▶ Of the 20 seniors on this year's squad, eight have already earned degrees, while the remaining 11 are all on course to graduate either in December of 2009 or May of 2010.

▶ The eight players that have already earned degrees include: Jake Byrne (Finance), Joe Joseph (Sports Administration), Eric Moncur (Bachelor of Liberal Arts), Matt Perrelli (Marketing and Management), Matt Pipho (Biology), Darryl Sharpton (Finance), A.J. Trump (Management and Organization), Jimmy Graham (Management and Marketing).

▶ Last season, Miami had 13 early graduates, which were the most in the nation.

▶ Four graduates on the 2009 roster are currently pursuing their master's degrees: Joe Joseph (Master's of Liberal Arts), Jimmy Graham (Master's of Liberal of Arts), Matt Perrelli (Sports Administration) and Jake Byrne (Master's of Business Administration).

**GAME DAY PRESS POLICIES**

Only working press will be admitted to the Land Shark Stadium press box. Seats will be issued according to the following criteria:

1. State newspapers by circulation, wire services, national publications, newspapers from opponent's area, and student newspapers from UM and opponent's schools.
2. Other daily newspapers, with preference to those that regularly cover UM.
3. Radio and television personnel not broadcasting, but considered reporting.
4. Non-daily newspapers, with preference to those which regularly cover UM.
5. Scouts. Freelance and/or non-daily writers may be asked to produce copies of actual publications in which their work has appeared. In some cases, these materials will be required as verification of the writers' status.

**Right BETWEEN THE NUMBERS**

- ▶ The UM football team currently consists of 53 freshmen and sophomores and only 37 juniors and seniors.
- ▶ No position on the UM roster is as young as the receiver position, where junior Leonard Hankerson is the lone upper classmen expected to garner significant playing time. Behind Hankerson, the next seven receivers are all entering just their second year in the program.
- ▶ Jacory Harris etched his name into the Hurricanes' record books in tossing for the 10th-most passing yards in a single game in school history with 386 yards through the air against the Seminoles in the season-opener.
- ▶ Miami's season-opening win at Florida State on Labor Day night was ESPN's second-most viewed regular season college football game in the history of the network – second to only the Miami-FSU Labor Day battle in 2006.
- ▶ UM's 12 scheduled opponents this season had a combined record of 93-61 (.604) last season, with eight of the 12 opponents having won at least eight games.
- ▶ Four UM receivers stand at 6-3 or taller: Leonard Hankerson and Aldarius Johnson are 6-3, LaRon Byrd is 6-4 and Tommy Streeter is 6-5.
- ▶ A year after Travis Benjamin collected 274 all-purpose yards against FSU, Graig Cooper nearly matched the impressive feat in tallying 232 yards against the 'Noles in Tallahassee in the season opener.
- ▶ For the second straight year, UM opened the season without an upperclassman at the top two quarterback spots on the depth chart (2008 – Robert Marve and Jacory Harris; 2009 – Jacory Harris and A.J. Highsmith).
- ▶ Allen Bailey and Marcus Robinson, who ranked first and second respectively in sacks last season, each recorded a sack of FSU quarterback Christian Ponder in the season-opener last week.
- ▶ Nine different players either led or tied for the team-lead in receptions in a game last season. Of those players returning in 2009, Thearon Collier, Graig Cooper, Aldarius Johnson and Dedrick Epps led the team in catches more than once. In UM's season-opener, Travis Benjamin and Leonard Hankerson led the team with four catches a piece.
- ▶ Miami is 7-3 in the month of September under Randy Shannon and 26-7 in September this decade.
- ▶ Miami led the Atlantic Coast Conference in both red zone offense (93.6 percent) and fourth down conversions (68.4 percent) in 2008.
- ▶ After Miami's 38-34 win at FSU on Labor Day to open the 2009 season, the margin of victory in the last eight meetings between Miami and FSU has been single digits. The last time one of the teams won by more than 10, the 'Canes won 49-27 in Tallahassee on Oct. 13, 2001.
- ▶ Eleven different players on the 2008 roster finished with double-digit catches. Aldarius Johnson led the 'Canes with 31 catches, while Graig Cooper ranked second with 29 and Thearon Collier ranked third with 26.
- ▶ Wide receiver LaRon Byrd was the only Hurricane to catch a pass in at least 12 games in 2008.
- ▶ Miami reached its 23rd bowl game in the last 26 years with an Emerald Bowl appearance in 2008.
- ▶ After playing 21 true freshmen in the season-opener last season, Miami played just five true freshman in the 2009 opener in Tallahassee.

- ▶ The Hurricanes, who are 13-2 all-time on ESPN Thursday night, trail only Wake Forest (4-0) in winning percentage while Virginia Tech (15-4) owns the most wins in the league on college football's biggest stages.
- ▶ Thursday's game marks the second time that Miami and Georgia Tech will have met on an ESPN Thursday night, after the Yellow Jackets won on Nov. 20 last season in Atlanta.
- ▶ The highest-rated Thursday night game ever on ESPN was UM's first, a 40-10 win over Houston on Sept. 12, 1991 that drew a 6.50 rating.
- ▶ Miami is 4-2 on the road and a perfect 9-0 at home on ESPN Thursday night.
- ▶ Georgia Tech is 10-11 all-time on ESPN Thursday night.

**Jacory HAS RECORD GAME AGAINST FSU**

- ▶ Sophomore quarterback Jacory Harris, making just his third career start, had one of the top passing performances in school history in Miami's season-opening 38-34 win at No. 18 Florida State.
- ▶ Harris etched his name into the Hurricanes' record books in tossing for the 10th-most passing yards in a single game in school history with 386 yards through the air against the 'Noles.
- ▶ It was the most passing yards ever by a Miami quarterback ever against FSU and was the most by a 'Cane since Ken Dorsey tossed for 422 yards against West Virginia in 2002.
- ▶ Harris, who earned ACC Offensive Back of the Week honors for his performance, finished the contest 21-of-34 with two passing touchdowns and a rushing touchdown.

**Ratings REPORT: MIAMI-FSU**

- ▶ Miami's season-opening win at Florida State on Labor Day night was ESPN's second-most viewed regular season college football game in the history of the network – second to only the Miami-FSU Labor Day battle in 2006.
- ▶ The '09 Labor Day game recorded 5,820,001 household impressions, had 8,406,103 viewers and drew a rating of 5.89.
- ▶ The Hurricanes have now been a part of four of ESPN's five most-watched regular season games on the network. The record 2006 Miami-FSU game in the Orange Bowl garnered 6,329,828 household impressions and had a rating of 6.86.

**Its ALL ABOUT THE BENJAMIN**

- ▶ Sophomore wide receiver/return man Travis Benjamin has had the best two games of his young career against arch-rival Florida State.
- ▶ Last year against the Seminoles in Miami, he collected an impressive 274 all-purpose yards - the most by a Hurricane since Edgerrin James had 310 all-purpose yards (299 rushing, 11 receiving) against UCLA in 1998. He finished the contest with 185 yards on kick returns, 71 yards receiving and 18 yards rushing.
- ▶ Last week against FSU in Tallahassee, Benjamin didn't match his total yardage from 2008, but he did have the best receiving game of any Hurricane since 2006, catching four passes for 128 yards and a touchdown. His four catches went for gains of 39, 29, 20 and 40 yards.
- ▶ Benjamin ranked second on the team with 1,012 all-purpose yards last year and has 140 after one game this year, adding a five-yard rush and seven punt return yards to his receiving total in Tallahassee.
- ▶ He now has three career touchdowns against the Seminoles, scoring the first two touchdowns of his career last season (18-yard rushing TD, 51-yard receiving TD) before picking up his third last week (39-yard receiving TD).
- ▶ Last year, Benjamin was named a Rivals.com Freshman All-American after finishing the season with team-highs in punt return yardage (181), kick return yardage (496) and yards per reception (16.3).

**Freshmen SEE FIRST ACTION**

- ▶ After playing 21 true freshmen in the season-opener last season, Miami played just five true freshman in the 2009 opener in Tallahassee. Ray-Ray Armstrong, Mike James, Brandon McGee, Olivier Vernon and Brandon Washington all saw action against the 'Noles, with Vernon seeing the most significant time at the defensive end position.

**Coop DOES IT ALL**

- ▶ A year after Travis Benjamin collected 274 all-purpose yards against FSU, Graig Cooper nearly matched the impressive feat in tallying 232 yards against the 'Noles in Tallahassee in the season opener.
- ▶ The junior collected 177 kick return yards - the fourth-highest single game total in school history.
- ▶ He averaged 35.4 yards per return - including a 63-yard return in the third quarter.
- ▶ In addition to his return yardage, Cooper added 31 rushing yards and 24 receiving yards.
- ▶ Cooper scored the eventual game-winning touchdown against FSU in the opener on a 3-yard run to put the 'Canes up 38-34 with 1:53 to play. Earlier in that fourth quarter, Cooper scored his first receiving touchdown of the season, catching a 24-yard touchdown pass from Jacory Harris.

**It's BEEN A WHILE**

► Sophomore quarterback Jacory Harris entered the season snapping a streak of at least 16 years since a player from Miami-Dade County quarterbacked a University of Miami team. Hialeah High School's Ryan Collins started the last seven games of the 1993 season, but did not go into the season as the starter. Kary Baker was the last Miami-Dade County quarterback to enter the season as the starting quarterback. Baker, from Miami-Edison High School, was UM's starter in 1974 and also was Miami's first African-American quarterback.

**Miami ON THE BIG STAGE**

► The Hurricanes come right out of the gate in 2009, playing each of their first two games in Primetime on ESPN. Miami opened its season Labor Day night in Tallahassee with a 38-34 win over No. 18 Florida State, 10 days before playing host to the Yellow Jackets on Thursday night.

► Although it has yet to be determined, the 'Canes in all likelihood will play their third and fourth games (at Virginia Tech – Sept. 26; vs. Oklahoma – Oct. 3) on national television.

**'Canes AT LAND SHARK**

► Miami is 7-2 all-time in Land Shark Stadium, going 3-0 in bowl games and 4-2 last season.

► The 'Canes won the 1996 Carquest Bowl over Virginia, the 1998 Micron PC Bowl over NC State and the 2003 Orange Bowl over Florida State before beating Charleston Southern, UCF, Wake Forest and Virginia Tech in the team's inaugural season at its home stadium.

**Miami VS. AP-RANKED TEAMS**

► Miami has won 25 of its last 40 games against ranked teams, dating back to the 2000 season.

► Miami is 86-113-1 vs. AP-ranked teams since its first game against a ranked opponent in No. 18 Alabama in 1941.

► Miami is 39-57 vs. AP top-10 teams since playing No. 6 Alabama in 1947.

► Miami is 22-33 against AP top-5 teams since playing No. 3 Maryland in 1953.

► Miami's victory over No. 1 Florida State on Oct. 7, 2000, extended UM's record to 10-7 against No. 1-ranked teams. Of those 16 meetings with No. 1, six of the past eight have been against FSU.

**Miami VS. RANKED OPPONENTS SINCE 1990**

► Since 1990, Miami has registered a 46-37 mark against Associated Press ranked teams and a 125-16 record against unranked opponents. Miami's loss to North Carolina in 2004 marked the first loss to an unranked team since losing to East Carolina in 1999, a span of 65 games.

**Running FOR RECORDS**

Here is a quick look at some individual UM career rushing records to watch out for during the 2009 season:

► With 11 carries in Miami's season-opening win at Florida State, senior running back Javarris James moved into sole possession of seventh place on the program's all-time rushing attempts list. James now has 413 career attempts, passing Tyrone Moss (412 attempts from 2003-06). With 28 more attempts, James will pass Clinton Portis (440 attempts from 1999-01) for sixth place and with 62 more attempts, he would move into sole possession of third place behind only Ottis Anderson (691) and James Jackson (541).

► Both Javarris James (1,706) and Graig Cooper (1,554) have a chance to move into the all-time Top 10 in rushing yards (Alonzo Highsmith is currently 10th with 1,914 career yards). James needs 509 rushing yards and Cooper needs 661 to move into sole possession of fifth place on the program's rushing list.

► Graig Cooper also ranks in a tie for ninth all-time with five career 100-yard games. (Javarris James ranks 12th with four).

**Other RECORDS TO WATCH**

► Jason Fox has started 37 games in his career. He could tie William Joseph for a UM record 50 career starts if the 'Canes play in the ACC Championship game and a bowl game and Fox starts all 14 games. (Ed Reed is second on the list with 48 career starts).

► Matt Bosher is 6th all-time in consecutive PATs (45) and 10th in FGs made (19) and points scored by a kicker (102).

**The TOUGH BIG FOUR TO OPEN**

► The University of Miami's first four games of the 2009 season are against four ranked opponents in Florida State, Georgia Tech, Virginia Tech and Oklahoma. Those teams were all ranked in the final polls last year and had a combined 2008 record of 40-14. This week, Georgia Tech, Virginia Tech and Oklahoma are all ranked inside the Top 15.

► Not only are Miami's first three games against ACC schools, but it's against the top three ACC teams going into the season as predicted by the Atlantic Coast Conference media. (Florida State 1st in Atlantic, Virginia Tech 1st in Coastal and Georgia Tech 2nd in Coastal).

► If that's not difficult enough, the University of Miami opens up nonconference play with Oklahoma - the National Championship runner-up to Florida last year.

**Torretta TO BE HONORED THURSDAY**

▶ Former Hurricane great Gino Torretta will be honored at Thursday night's game after it was announced on April 30 that he will be inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame. Archie Manning – the chairman of The National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame – announced that Torretta would join 15 fellow First Team All-America players and two legendary coaches in the College Football Hall of Fame Class of 2009.

▶ He will be inducted in the Hall of Fame on Dec. 8 in New York City and officially enshrined at the Hall in South Bend, Ind., during ceremonies in the summer of 2010. Joining Torretta in the class is an impressive group of college football names, including Notre Dame wide receiver Tim Brown, Ohio State linebacker Chris Spielman and legendary coaches John Robinson and Dick McPherson.

▶ With the announcement, he became just the fourth Hurricane player to be selected for induction in the Hall, joining Bennie Blades (2006), Don Bosseler (1990) and Ted Hendricks (1987) in prestigious company.

**Big BAILEY INSIDE**

▶ First a linebacker, a year later, a defensive end, now, at 6-4 and nearly 300 pounds, junior Allen Bailey has made the move to defensive tackle in 2009. Bailey, who led the 'Canes with five sacks in 2008, played mostly on special teams as a freshman linebacker in 2007 before moving to defensive end last season, becoming the team's sack leader. In the opener at FSU, Bailey was back to business, recording one of Miami's two sacks.

**Old WISE MEN**

▶ Safety Randy Phillips and defensive end Eric Moncur return in 2009 as the senior citizens of the Hurricanes' defense. Moncur came to UM in 2004 and redshirted that season before Phillips joined him on the field in 2005. The pair has combined to play in 71 games (Moncur – 36, Phillips -35).

**Jimmy, JIMMY**

▶ With five national championships and decades of success on the gridiron, football players at "The U" are usually the most recognizable athletes. However, one of the most recognizable names on the 2009 roster is former UM basketball player Jimmy Graham.

▶ Graham, who is among the program's all-time Top 10 in career blocks, opted to join the football team in lieu of pursuing a professional basketball career after his basketball eligibility expired at the conclusion of the 2008-09.

▶ At 6-8, Graham is the second-tallest player on the UM football team (reserve offensive lineman Ian Symonette stands at 6-9).

▶ He is one of four former college basketball players making the switch to the gridiron in 2009 - Arizona forward-turned-Houston tight end Fendi Onobu, Michigan point guard-turned-slot receiver Kelvin Grady and Duke point guard-turned Syracuse quarterback Greg Paulus.

**Shields SHIFTING GEARS**

▶ After three seasons as a wide receiver, veteran Sam Shields has made the move over to cornerback for his senior season.

▶ Shields, who had just 470 receiving yards combined the last two seasons after tallying 501 yards as a freshman, is UM's fastest player (4.2 40-yard dash) and instantly add another dimension to the UM secondary.

**All-Purpose YARDS RETURN**

▶ Miami returns nine of its top 10 players in terms of all-purpose yards gained in 2008, with only Kayne Farquharson (280 yards) not back this season.

▶ Graig Cooper (1,133) led the team in all-purpose yards in '08.

▶ Travis Benjamin (1,012) ranked second on the team in all-purpose yards. It marked the second time a UM freshman recorded at least 1,000 all-purpose yards in the last three seasons, after Javarris James tallied 1,002 yards as a freshman in 2006.

▶ Javarris James (404), Thearon Collier (359), Aldarius Johnson (332), Dedrick Epps (304) and Brandon Harris (299) ranked 3rd through 7th.

▶ After Farquharson, LaRon Byrd (228) and Sam Shields (159) ranked 9th and 10th respectively.

**FOX ON SPORTING NEWS TODAY**

▶ University of Miami offensive tackle Jason Fox is among 18 college football stars writing weekly diaries throughout the season in Sporting News Today, the world's first digital daily sports newspaper.

▶ The diaries, which will cover topics on the field and off it, began a week before the season-opener at FSU. To sign up for the free digital newspaper, which is no fewer than 30 pages a day, go to sportingnewstoday.com. At 7 a.m. ET each day, subscribers are sent an e-mail directing them to that day's edition.

**Coop AND BABY J**

▶ So much of Miami's success offensively comes from the running back tandem of junior Graig Cooper and senior Javarris James. In the rushing duo's time together at UM, the Hurricanes have a 6-2 record when the two combine to get at least 25 carries, and a 4-9 record when they both play and are under the 25-carry mark.

▶ In 2007, reaching this mark was extremely important to the team's success as all five of UM's victories came when the two combined to reach the 25-carry mark.

▶ Last year, James missed the better part of five games with a high ankle sprain, and the only time the pair combined for more than 25 carries the 'Canes won at Virginia when Cooper and James ran 33 times for 186 yards.

**Red ZONE RESULTS**

▶ The Hurricanes had an impressive success rate of 93.6-percent (44-for-47) when reaching the red zone in 2008 and were off to a good start in 2009, going 4-for-4 at FSU in the season-opener.

▶ The 93.6-percent rate in 2008 led the Atlantic Coast Conference (NC State was 2nd - 90.9, FSU was 3rd - 90.6).

▶ The 'Canes scored 29 touchdowns (15 rush, 14 pass) and kicked 15 field goals when reaching the end zone last year. In Tallahassee last week, Miami scored three touchdowns and kicked one field goal in its four red zone appearances.

**Fourth DOWN FORTUNE**

▶ One of the team's strengths in 2008 was its success rate on both sides of the ball on fourth down.

▶ Offensively, UM led the ACC and ranked 13th nationally in converting 68.4 percent of its fourth down attempts.

▶ On the defensive side, the 'Canes ranked fourth in the ACC and 23rd nationally with a 38.1 percent success rate on fourth down.

▶ The 'Canes came in ahead of Boston College (64.0) and Maryland (53.3) on offense and trailed only Duke (26.3), UNC (26.3) and Virginia Tech (35.3) on defense.

**Coaches AT THEIR ALMA MATERS**

▶ Miami's Randy Shannon is one of 15 head coaches working at their alma maters this season. The Hurricanes are scheduled to face two coaches coaching at their alma maters this season (Frank Beamer - Virginia Tech; Al Groh - Virginia).

**ACC HONORS FOR JACORY AND BRANDON**

- ▶ Miami quarterback Jacory Harris and defensive back Brandon Harris have been selected Atlantic Coast Conference football players of the week, as announced Tuesday by the ACC.
- ▶ Jacory Harris earned ACC Offensive Back of the Week honors after throwing for a career-high 386 yards and two touchdowns on 21-of-34 passing in Miami's 38-34 upset of No. 18 Florida State in Tallahassee.
- ▶ Brandon Harris was selected ACC Defensive Back of the Week after tallying a game- and career-high nine tackles (three solo) and breaking up two passes against Florida State.
- ▶ Clemson also appeared on the list twice as C.J. Spiller and Brandon Maye were selected as a specialist and defensive lineman, respectively.

**Butkus BOYS**

- ▶ Senior Darryl Sharpton and sophomore Sean Spence were named to the initial watch list for the 2009 Dick Butkus Award, given annually to the nation's top linebacker.
- ▶ Eight Atlantic Coast Conference linebackers were among the 35 selected to the list while Miami was one of eight schools nationally with two players represented on the list, along with Penn State, Georgia, USC, Alabama, Oklahoma, North Carolina and Iowa.
- ▶ Spence was named 2008 ACC Defensive Rookie of the Year last season while Sharpton returns after starting 10 of 13 games a season ago.

**Bosher NAMED TO GROZA WATCH LIST**

- ▶ Junior Matt Bosher was named to the preseason watch list for the Lou Groza Award, given annually to the nation's top collegiate kicker.
- ▶ Nine 2008 semifinalists – including Bosher – are named to the list. As a sophomore in 2008, Bosher earned second team All-ACC honors as a kicker and punter and also was awarded Miami's Jack Harding Award, given to the team's most valuable player.
- ▶ Bosher led Miami with 94 points while connecting on 18-of-20 field goal attempts and 40-of-40 PAT's.

**Best BEHAVIOR**

- ▶ Through head coach Randy Shannon's first 26 games at the helm of the University of Miami football program, the statistics have shown a drastic change in the Hurricanes' discipline on the field. The last two seasons, the Hurricanes were close to even when it came to penalty differential. The last time the Hurricanes finished the season with fewer penalty yards than their opponents was 1994, when UM was penalized for 775 yards compared to 807 for its opponents.

- ▶ After recording just nine total tackles and 2.0 tackles for a loss in UM's first nine games last season, defensive end Marcus Robinson came alive in the 'Canes last four contests, recording team-highs in solo tackles (19), total tackles (26), tackles for a loss (7.0) and sacks (4.0) over that span.
- ▶ Over the last four games of last season (vs. Virginia Tech, at Georgia Tech, at NC State, vs. California), Robinson averaged 6.5 tackles, 1.75 tackles for a loss and one sack per contest.

- ▶ Rising junior running back Damien Berry carried 14 times for 114 yards including a 54-yard touchdown run and quarterback Jacory Harris completed 9-of-16 passes for 141 yards as the Miami offense shined in a 52-3 win over the defense at Lockhart Stadium on March 28 in the annual UM Spring game.
- ▶ Miami's offense racked up 406 total yards on 71 total plays while scoring 52 points in a scoring system put together by the Hurricane coaching staff. The offense scored six points on a touchdown, three points on a field goal, one point on a PAT, one point for crossing the 50-yard line and one point for every first down.
- ▶ UM's defense was able to score six points for any defensive touchdown, two points for a fumble, two points for an INT and one point for a three-and-out. The defense scored its three points on an INT by safety Randy Phillips and one point for a three-and-out.

**Coordinators ON TAP**

► Randy Shannon's 2009 staff has two new assistant coaches – assistant head coach Mark Whipple and defensive coordinator John Lovett.

► **Mark Whipple, Assistant Head Coach/Quarterbacks/Offensive Coordinator** - Whipple is a veteran of 27 seasons as a coach on both the collegiate and professional levels.

Whipple spent the 2008 season as an offensive assistant coach with the Philadelphia Eagles helping the team to an appearance in the NFC championship game. Before joining the Eagles, he served as the quarterbacks coach of the Pittsburgh Steelers from 2004-06 where he was instrumental in the development of Ben Roethlisberger, who became the youngest starting quarterback to win a Super Bowl. In 2004, Roethlisberger became the first NFL quarterback to finish a season undefeated with a 13-0 record in games he started. Prior to his move to the NFL, Whipple coached 16 seasons as a head coach at the collegiate level compiling an overall record of 121-59 (.672) at stops at the University of Massachusetts, Brown and New Haven.

While at UMass, he posted a 49-26 (.653) record in six years (1998-2003) leading the Minutemen to a Division I-AA National Championship in his first season with the team in 1998. He also won a pair of conference championships. His 1998 national championship team finished with a school record in wins finishing the season 12-3. He was named National Coach of the Year by the American Football Coaches Association and Don Hansen's National Weekly Football Gazette in 1998 and earned Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year honors in 2003. He posted five winning seasons in only six years as head coach. He coached nine different players who won first team All-America honors.

► **John Lovett, Defensive Coordinator**– Lovett has 18 years of experience as a defensive coordinator with stops at Clemson, Auburn and Mississippi, Lovett inherits a unit that returns 15 players with starting experience, including three Freshman All-Americans. Lovett spent the last two seasons as the special teams coordinator and a defensive assistant at North Carolina, where the kickoff coverage unit ranked among the nation's top 15 and the Tar Heels blocked six kicks in 2008. He coached the NCAA all-time leader in combined kick return yards in Brandon Tate. Tate also established the ACC career mark for kickoff return yards. Kicker Connor Barth set the school career mark for field goals.

Prior to going to North Carolina, Lovett was the defensive coordinator at Bowling Green from 2005-06. In addition to coordinating the defense at Bowling Green, Lovett coached linebackers in 2005 and defensive backs in 2006. In his first year with the Falcons, Lovett's defense ranked 20th in the country in turnover margin. Lovett served as the defensive coordinator at Clemson from 2002-04 and helped develop one of the ACC's top defenses. In 2004, Clemson was 11th in the nation in pass defense efficiency (103.4) and 26th in total defense (327.3). In 2003, his defense allowed just 19.2 points per game as Clemson finished the year with nine wins and a top 25 national ranking.

**The NORTHWESTERN SEVEN**

▶ Last season's freshman class included seven players from Northwestern High School in Miami.
