Home Sweet Home...

The Hurricanes wrap up their home schedule beginning with Friday's series opener against the Demon Deacons on ESPNU (8 p.m.). After a midweek contest on Tues., May 15 against Florida Gulf Coast, the Canes will travel for their final regular season series with conference foe Georgia Tech in Atlanta, Ga. The ACC Tournament in Greensboro, N.C. is set to begin Wed., May 23 while the NCAA Tournament is scheduled to open Fri., June 1.

Sunshine State Battle...

The Hurricanes don't have to travel far to face tough competition, as 16 of their 24 non-conference games all come against teams from the state of Florida. The Canes are 10-5 so far in non-conference games played against competitors from the Sunshine State, including their most recent sweep of Bethune-Cookman.

Midweek Warriors...

The Hurricanes, facing many talented in-state competitors in their midweek matchups, have improved their record to 9-2 in games taking place on either Tuesday or Wednesday. Their nine wins include a 3-0 victory at Florida Gulf Coast, a series sweep of Florida Atlantic, a 3-2 win at No. 12 UCF in a hostile environment, a close win over Stetson, and an 11-4 drubbing of Saint Thomas University (Fla.)

Last Time Out...

The Hurricanes jumped out to a 4-0 lead over the Demon Deacons by the bottom of the third inning, holding onto a 4-2 win in their ACC Tournament finale at Durham Bulls Athletic Park in Durham, N.C.

Rony Rodriguez' 12th homerun of the year, a ball that cleared the famous bull on the top of the left field wall, powered the Canes to victory. E.J. Encinosa earned the victory and improved to 5-5 on the year with the win. The flamethrower tossed 5.2 innings, allowing only one earned run while striking out six.

Scouting the Competition: Wake Forest...

Though their conference record sits at only 9-15, the Deacons are 27-20 on the year and have some impressive series wins to their pedigree. Wake Forest has captured home series with Virginia Tech (2-of-3) and Georgia Tech (2-of-3), and swept an earlier set with Maryland in March.

The Deacons have been led offensively by slugger Mac Williamson (14 homeruns, 42 RBI), Conor Keniry (.314 average, 23 RBI) and Carlos Lopez (.293 average, eight homeruns, 43 RBI).

On the hill, Wake Forest has been guided by Brian Holmes (6-2 record, 3.08 ERA) and Tim Cooney (5-5 record, 3.43 ERA) along with relievers Michael Dimock (3.79 ERA, 11 saves) and Nate Jones (21 appearances, 1.20 ERA).

UNIVERSITY OF MIAMI HEAD COACH JIM MORRIS - 19TH SEASON

2001, 1999, & 1994 National Coach of the Year • 2008 ACC COACH OF THE YEAR



In his 19th season at Miami, no other program nor head coach, has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament a NCAA-record 39 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 18 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006. His teams have qualified for NCAA Regionals for the last 27 years, 18 at Miami and nine at Georgia Tech.

Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 844-338-3 (.716) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,348-582-4 (.700) Division I record in 30 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 33 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,479-623-4 (.705) mark

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 19 years, Morris has personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and has logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium project.

MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

Jim Morris earned his 27th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2011 when he guided the 'Canes to the NCAA Gainesville Regional. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 18 seasons (1994-2011), winning 15 of his last 18 appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.

Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris led the 2011 Hurricanes to their 39th-straight NCAA Tournament. Three players from the 2011 team were selected in last year's Major League Baseball Draft. In 2008, the Canes reached the College World Series after winning the Atlantic Coast Conference, widely considered one of the toughest - if not the toughest - collegiate baseball conferences in the country.

MORRIS IN HIS 34TH SEASON AS A COLLEGE COACH

Morris currently has a 1,348-582-4 (.700) record at the Division I level. As a head coach overall, he has compiled a 1,479-623-4 (.705) record over 30-plus years.

Jim Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later, he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern on March 23, 2001.

Prior to his 18 seasons in Coral Gables, Morris went 504-244-1 at Georgia Tech from 1982-1993. In his first stint as a head coach, he guided DeKalb Junior College to a 131-41 mark from 1976-79.

JIM MORRIS MAKING HISTORY

- Guided the Miami Hurricanes to College World Series National Championship in 1999 and 2001.
- The only coach in NCAA history to take a school to the College World Series in each of his first six years at a program. Morris has gone to Omaha with Miami in 11 of 18 seasons and led the Canes to 13 straight NCAA Regional Championships, an NCAA record.
- Named National Coach of the Year five times while at Miami by Baseball America in 1994 and by the ABCA and Collegiate Baseball in 1999 and

2001.

- Sent 150 players to the professional ranks, including Yonder Alonso (Cincinnati Reds), Pat Burrell (Rays), Ryan Braun (Brewers), Danny Graves (Astros), Alex Cora (Mets), Nomar Garciaparra (Dodgers), Jon Jay (St. Louis Cardinals), Gabby Sanchez (Florida Marlins), Danny Valencia (Minnesota Twins) and Jason Varitek (Red Sox).
- Has served three stints with the U.S. National Team: Assistant Coach for 1987 Pan American Games (Silver), Head Coach for 1989 Presidential Cup (Silver) and Head Coach for 1990 Goodwill Games (Bronze).

SHORTSTOPS AND JIM MORRIS

Morris, who played shortstop during college at Elon and then in the Boston Red Sox organization, has had great success developing the position while a head coach. Over the last decade, Morris has taught prominent shortstops such as Nomar Garciaparra at Georgia Tech and Bobby Hill and Alex Cora at Miami.

Morris worked with Javy Rodriguez, who entered 2002 as a preseason All-American. Rodriguez led UM in just about every category as a junior in 2001, including a national-high 66 stolen bases.

Morris coached Hill, who played for the San Diego Padres, from 1997-99. Before Hill, it was Cora and Mike Metcalfe. Both players went on to play at the Major League level with the Los Angeles Dodgers. Cora is currently with the Mets. Garciaparra played under Morris during the coaches' final two seasons in Atlanta and went on to become an All-Star with the Red Sox and played for the Oakland A's in 2009.

Wake Forest:

By The Numbers

12 - Straight losses for the Demon Deacons against the Hurricanes, a streak that dates back to a March 21, 2008 loss in Coral Gables, Fla.

14 - Homeruns for Wake redshirt junior Mac Williamson, good for tops in the Atlantic Coast Conference. The North Carolina native connected for 12 homeruns in 2011.

36 - Team homeruns for Wake Forest, which is tied for second-most in the ACC with Georgia Tech. Though they rank last with a .263 team batting average, the Deacs have three hitters connecting for a .300 average or better.

Return of the Mack...

Over the past 18 games, no player has had more sizable of an offensive impact than junior outfielder Chantz Mack. The Homestead, Fla. native, who was inserted into the starting lineup mid-April after a hand injury to Rony Rodriguez, is the only player batting over .300 since that date (.317) with team-highs of 19 hits and 15 RBI.

Mack, who has been shuffled around the outfield positions, hit 3-for-9 (.333) against Bethune-Cookman. He also contributed to the Hurricanes' 12 steals on the weekend, swiping four of his own over the weekend.

Extra. Extra!...

Junior infielder Stephen Perez has had a key impact for the Hurricanes since returning from an arm injury that limited his playing time earlier in the season. The Miami native, who has played both second and shortstop, has an impressive .451 slugging percentage through his 42 starts. That figure is good for second-best on the team.

16 of Perez' 37 hits have gone for extra-bases (43%), including a team-best four triples and second-best four homeruns. His 27 RBI's are good for third-most on the team despite missing an earlier stretch in the season to rehab. His eight-game hitting streak in March is the third-longest of any player this season, and he finished the team's weekend series with Bethune-Cookman with a team-best four runs, tying for the team lead in hits (three) and RBI (three).

Veterans Stepping Up..

The Canes received a big boost in the offseason when transfer catcher Peter O'Brien and graduate student lefthander Eric Erickson were both declared eligible by the NCAA. True to their elections, the team's two captains for the 2012 season have played key roles through the team's first half of the season.

Despite missing the past 11 games to injury, O'Brien is currently the team leader in a number of key hitting categories: batting average (.354), runs (31), doubles (11), homeruns (10), slugging percentage (.677) and on-base percentage (.465).

Through his first 12 starts of the season, Erickson (7-5) is ranked in the conference Top-25 for ERA (3.20, No. 18) innings pitched (76.0, seventh) and wins (seven, fourth). He has a staff-best 58:10 K:BB ratio.

Weekly Highlights...

The Hurricanes finished last week 3-0, sweeping their weekend series with MEAC-leading Bethune-Cookman. With the sweep, the Hurricanes improved their record to its current 30-17.

◆ *Chantz Mack* finished the series tied for the team-lead with three hits and three RBI. He also tied sophomore centerfielder Dale Carey for the team lead with four stolen bases.

◆ *Eric Erickson* improved to 7-5 on the year with a stellar seven-inning showing against a talented Wildcats offense. The Sarasota, Fla. native struck out eight batters and allowed only five hits and zero runs.

◆ *Brad Fieger* connected for a team-best two doubles and tied for the team-lead with three RBI's in three games against the Wildcats. The sophomore led the team with a .500 slugging percentage over the weekend.

Battered and Bruised...

April was not a kind month to the Canes, who suffered from impact injuries throughout the lineup. While Rony Rodriguez marked his return as a designated hitter in the team's FSU series (hand injury), leading hitter and senior co-captain Peter O'Brien has missed the team's last three series with a slight fracture in his left wrist. The Hurricanes also lost starters Bryan Radziewski and Andrew Suarez to season-ending shoulder surgery earlier in March.

Conference Is The Key...

Juniors Chantz Mack and Stephen Perez, alongside sophomore Dale Carey, have powered the Hurricanes through their first eight conference series'. Mack leads the way with a .321 average (in 13 starts), while Carey (.289), and Perez (.286) follow behind him. Perez leads the team with a .425 on-base percentage and .471 slugging percentage in conference play.

Sophomore Standout...

Though he often flies under the radar, sophomore infielder Brad Fieger has become one of the key cogs in Head Coach Jim Morris' lineup. Fieger, the only Hurricane to start all 47 games so far this season, has been switched around in the lineup and made the midseason shift from first base to third base with clear success. Entering the team's weekend matchup with Bethune-Cookman, Fieger has the most hits on the team (52) and has the second-highest batting average (.295).

You're the Best Around...

For his incredible accomplishments at the plate over a five-game stretch in March, senior catcher Peter O'Brien was named ACC Player of the Week on 3/19.

The Miami Gardens, Fla. native finished the week batting .529, with three homeruns and nine RBI over the team's five-game stretch. He also connected for three multi-hit games, including three doubles and 21 total bases.

History in the Making...

The Hurricanes became the first team to face the Miami Marlins in the brand new Marlins Park, as they helped open the stadium with an exhibition. The Canes, who earned the victory in the 2011 rendition of the series, fell on a walk-off hit in the ninth inning against the MLB club. Freshman lefthander Andrew Suarez pitched three scoreless innings in his starting debut against the Marlins.

Miami Predicted to Finish Third In Coastal Division...

Miami baseball was predicted to finish third in the Coastal Division of the Atlantic Coast Conference Coaches Preseason Poll. The poll is voted on by the league's 12 head coaches. Capturing a 19-10 league record in 2011, the Hurricanes finished the year fourth in the Coastal Division. Miami posted a 38-23 overall record en route to their 39th consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance in the Gainesville Regional.

Opening Series Sweep...

The University of Miami opened the season against Rutgers for the fourth time in as many years, and marked the beginning of its 2012 campaign with a sweep of the Scarlet Knights. It was the second time in four tries the Canes have swept Rutgers to begin their season.

Encinosa Returns to the Bullpen

Junior right-hander E.J. Encinosa, who served as a starter for the 2011 season, has returned to the bullpen for the 2012 campaign. The righty earned *Louisville Slugger* Freshman All-America honors for his work in the pen in 2010, where he posted an impressive ERA of 2.20 in 29 appearances on the hill. Encinosa recorded the first save of his season in the series finale against Rutgers, pitching a scoreless ninth inning.

The flamethrower recorded two saves in the team's opening conference series against visiting Boston College, and also closed out a 3-2 game in impressive fashion at No. 19 UCF. He recorded saves in series' against Duke and Maryland, and currently leads the team with eight saves.

One Of The Nation's Best

Catcher Peter O'Brien was recently named to the Preseason Johnny Bench Award Watch List. The award, which is given to the nation's top catcher at the conclusion of the college baseball season, is considered among the most prestigious individual honors a baseball student-athlete can achieve.

Miami in the Atlantic Coast Conference

The 2012 season marks the eighth season the Canes have played in the Atlantic Coast Conference, and last year's 19-10 regular season mark in league play was the program's third-best behind the 2008 ACC championship squad that won 23 regular season league games and the 2011 team that finished 20-10.

Staying Power

Miami was ranked 14th in this year's Collegiate Baseball Newspaper preseason poll. The Hurricanes have been ranked in the top 20 in every CBN preseason poll since 1999, a feat no other school has accomplished over the same time frame.

Miami Gets Them Drafted

Over the last four years, Miami has produced an impressive four first round MLB draft picks. The last first rounder, Yasmani Grandal, was selected in the first round in 2010. In 2011, the Canes had three players drafted: Harold Martinez (Philadelphia Phillies, third round), Zeke DeVoss (Chicago Cubs, third round) and Danny Miranda (St. Louis Cardinals, eighth round).

Two Canes Selected to Prestigious List

Catcher Peter O'Brien and righthander Eric Whaley were both named to the *Louisville Slugger* Preseason All-American Baseball teams in late December. O'Brien headlined the second team at catcher, while Whaley earned third team accolades after an impressive sophomore campaign.

ALEX RODRIGUEZ PARK INFORMATION

Renovations to Alex Rodriguez Park are thanks in large part to a \$3.9 million contribution by New York Yankees third baseman and 11-time MLB All-Star Alex Rodriguez. The gift - the largest ever to the University of Miami baseball program - has assisted the program in continuing to develop first-class facilities. The official announcement of his gift was made on Oct. 10, 2002.

Alex Rodriguez Park has taken form in a three-phase process:

- Phase I called for seating modifications, new dugouts, new stadium lighting and utility infrastructure and new rest rooms.
- Phase II entailed renovating below the grand stand area in addition to adding new concession areas.
- The final phase included adding a new clubhouse, weight room, training room, meeting room, video room and academic area. In addition, a new press box – along with four VIP suites – have been built atop the grandstand. This past offseason, addition seating was added down both lines while a new scoreboard was constructed in left field.
