THE GAME

- The Miami Hurricanes are looking to extend their winning streak to three straight games when they face Wisconsin in the 2018 New Era PinStripe Bowl at Yankee Stadium in The Bronx, N.Y., on Dec. 27. The Hurricanes will be playing in the game for the first time in program history.
- The game will be broadcast on **ESPN** with Bob Wischusen (play by play), Dan Orlovsky (analyst), Michael Golic, Jr. (analyst) and Paul Carcatera (field analyst) on the call. Joe Zagacki (play by play) and Don Bailey, Jr. (color) are in the **560 WQAM** radio booth for their 250th straight game together, while Josh Darrow will handle the sideline duty. Jose "Chamby" Campos (pxp) and Joe Martinez (color) will carry the game against Wisconsin on **990AM ESPN Deportes**. Both **ESPN Radio** and **WVUM 90.5 FM** will also be broadcasting the game live from Yankee Stadium.

THE SERIES

- The Hurricanes trail the all-time series, 3-2, including a 34-24 loss in the 2017 Capital One Orange Bowl in Miami Gardens, Fla. on Dec. 30, 2017.
- Wisconsin also won the head-to-head matchup in the 2009 Champs Sports Bowl in Orlando - the only other neutral site meeting between the two programs. Miami trails, 0-2, in bowl games vs. the Badgers. In the modern era of Miami Hurricanes football (since 1979), the series is tied, 2-2

THE HURRICANES

- With a 24-3 win over Pitt last time out on Nov. 24, Miami capped its regular season with a 7-5 record and earned a New Era PinStripe Bowl berth.
- In **Mark Richt's** three seasons as coach, Miami has posted a 16-8 record in ACC play, matching the best three-season output in history (2004-06).
- Miami enters the game ranked No. 2 nationally in total defense at 268.3 yards per game. The Canes are ranked No. 4 in opponent yards per play (4.32) - the most important metric when measuring defense in 2018, according to UM's defensive staff - and are also ranked No. 1 in FBS in team tackles for loss (10.5 per game), No. 1 in third down defense (23.7%), No. 1 in passing yards allowed (140.8) and No. 4 in first downs allowed (185).
- The Hurricanes had 11 players earn All-ACC honors in the end-of-season awards from the conference, including LB **Shaq Quarterman** (first team), DL **Gerald Willis III** (second), S **Jaquan Johnson** (second), RB **Travis Homer** (second), TE **Brevin Jordan** (second) and CB **Trajan Bandy** (third).
- Willis III, who will not play in the bowl game, earned second-team All-America recognition from several outlets, including the Associated Press.
- The New Era PinStripe Bowl represents the last game for defensive coordinator **Manny Diaz**, who officially accepted the head coaching job at Temple on Thurs., Dec. 13. Richt elevated assistant coaches **Ephraim Banda** and **Jonathan Patke** to co-defensive coordinators on Fri., Dec. 14.

THE OPPONENT

- Wisconsin is under the direction of fourth-year coach Paul Chyst, who has compiled a 41-12 record in Madison and a 59-31 overall coaching record.
- The Badgers finished the 2018 season with a 7-5 record and a 5-4 record in Big Ten play; last time out, UW loss to Minnesota, 15-37, on Nov. 24.
- Wisconsin's offense is led by the nation's rushing leader, RB Jonathan Taylor, who has compiled 1,989 rushing yards this season and 3,966 rushing yards in just two seasons. The Badgers' defense is led by ILB T.J. Edwards (104 total tackles) and OLB Andrew Van Ginkel (team-leading 4.5 sacks).

QUICK HITS

HURRICANES HEADING TO THE BIG APPLE

- The University of Miami football program earned its first-ever berth in the New Era PinStripe Bowl and will be taking on Wisconsin at Yankee Stadium on Dec. 27.
- The Hurricanes are matched up with the Badgers in bowl season for the second straight year and for the third time in program history; last year, Miami fell, 34-24, to the Badgers at the 2017 Capital One Orange Bowl.
- Miami has a 20-21 all-time record in 41 bowl games in program history, and is 1-1 in bowls under head coach **Mark Richt**.
- UM's only other bowl game in New York was the 1962 Gotham Bowl, a 35-34 loss to Nebraska at Yankee Stadium - broadcast on ABC and played in front of 6,166 fans.

MIAMI D "WREAKING HAVOC" IN 2018

- Miami's defense shined under coordinator **Manny Diaz**, who will be coaching his final game at the helm of the unit in the New Era PinStripe Bowl on Dec. 27.
- According to Football Outsiders, Miami's "havoc rate" - calculated by adding total tackles for loss, passes defended and forced fumbles and diving it by total plays) - of 24.7% ranks No. 1 in the nation while its "front seven" havoc rate (16.6%) also ranks No. 1 overall in all of FBS.
- The UM defense ranks among the best in FBS in several categories, including No. 2 in total defense (268.3 yards per game) and No. 1 in tackles for loss per game (10.5).
- Eight defensive players were All-ACC picks, led by **Shaq Quarterman** (first team).

TRIO OF COACHES ELEVATED FOR 2019

- Head coach **Mark Richt** promoted safeties coach **Ephraim Banda** and outside linebackers coach **Jonathan Patke** to co-defensive coordinators on Fri., Dec. 14.
- In addition to Banda and Patke, Richt promoted defensive line coach **Jess Simpson** to associate head coach as part of the same announcement.

HOMER NEARING 1K, 2K CLUB AT BOWL

- With just 31 yards in the New Era PinStripe Bowl, **Travis Homer** (969 yards) would become the 11th running back in program history to eclipse 1,000 rush yards in a season.
- Homer (1,979) needs just 21 yards to surpass 2,000 career rush yards - a feat accomplished by just 10 Hurricanes all-time.

BY THE NUMBERS

4.2

Miami's defense has allowed an average of 4.2 yards per play, the fourth-best FBS mark and the most important stat when measuring a defense, according to UM staff.

24.7

The Hurricanes defense has a nation-leading 24.7% "havoc rate" according to Football Outsiders - calculated by adding TFLs, PBU's and FFs and dividing by total plays.

31

RB Travis Homer is 31 rushing yards away from becoming the 11th Hurricane to ever record a 1,000-yard season; the last Hurricane to do it was Mark Walton in 2016.

38

LB Shaq Quarterman has started all 38 games since arriving on campus in January 2016 - the only Hurricane to accomplish the feat.

41.4

Miami's defense is forcing a three-and-out on 41.4% of its drives this season, the fifth-best FBS percentage and second-best in Power 5.

126

Miami's 126 tackles for loss are the most in the nation and just four short of the school record, set in 1999 (130).

268.3

The Hurricanes rank second nationally and first in the ACC in total defense, allowing an average of just 268.3 yards per game.

START SPREADING THE NEWS: HURRICANES HEADING TO THE BIG APPLE

- The Hurricanes will wrap up their 2018 season at the New Era Pinstripe Bowl for the first time in program history when they meet Wisconsin at Yankee Stadium on Dec. 27, 2018 at 5:15 PM ET (ESPN).
- Miami is looking to extend its winning streak to three straight games when it battles UW in New York.
- The 2018 New Era Pinstripe Bowl represents the third-ever bowl meeting between the two teams and the second straight bowl matchup; UM fell, 34-24, to Wisconsin in the 2017 Capital One Orange Bowl.
- Prior to last year's game, Miami last met UW at the 2009 Champs Sports Bowl - a 20-14 loss in Orlando.
- The Hurricanes carry a 20-21 all-time record in bowl games and a 1-1 record under **Mark Richt**; Miami's last bowl win came in the 2016 Russell Athletic Bowl, a 31-14 victory over West Virginia on Dec. 28.
- Miami's last game in the state of New York came on Nov. 30, 2002 - a 49-7 win on the road at Syracuse.
- The Hurricanes' last bowl game in New York was the 1962 Gotham Bowl - a 35-34 loss at the old Yankee Stadium on Dec. 15, 1962. QB **George Mira** was MVP with a then-UM record 321 passing yards.

LAST TIME OUT: MIAMI TOPS PITTSBURGH IN REGULAR SEASON FINALE

- The Hurricanes improved their bowl standing and ended their regular season on a high note when they topped #25/#24 Pittsburgh, 24-3, in their regular season finale at Hard Rock Stadium on Sat., Nov. 24.
- With the win, UM capped its regular season on a winning streak for the second time under **Mark Richt**.
- RB **Travis Homer** led Miami's offense with a season-best 168 yards on just eight carries, including a 64-yard touchdown run. RB **DeeJay Dallas** added a 65-yard punt return for a touchdown in the victory.
- Miami's swarming defense held the Panthers to just 200 total yards and 11 first downs; UM totaled 14 tackles for loss and six sacks. DE **Joe Jackson** had 2.5 sacks and DB **Michael Jackson** added 2.0 sacks.
- With the win, the Hurricanes avenged a 2017 loss at Pittsburgh that snapped a 10-0 start to the year.

11 HURRICANES EARN ALL-ACC RECOGNITION; SHAQ NAMED FIRST TEAM

- Headlined by junior LB **Shaq Quarterman**'s placement on the All-ACC First Team, 11 Miami Hurricanes earned all-conference recognition in the league's year-end voting selection by coaches and media.
- Quarterman, who has started all 38 games since arriving on campus in January 2016, earned All-ACC recognition for the third time; he was an All-ACC second-team pick last year and third-team in 2016.
- RB **Travis Homer**, TE **Brevin Jordan**, DT **Gerald Willis III** and S **Jaquan Johnson** were all named to the All-ACC Second Team. It was the second such honor for both Homer and Johnson (second team, 2017).
- CB **Trajan Bandy** picked up the first all-conference honor of his career, earning third-team recognition.
- CB **Michael Jackson, Sr.**, DL **Joe Jackson**, LB **Michael Pinckney**, S **Sheldrick Redwine** and OL **Tyree St. Louis** all earned All-ACC Honorable Mention recognition; it was the second honor for Jackson, Sr., (second team, 2017) and the first for the Hurricanes' other four Honorable Mention selections.

DEFENSE WREAKING HAVOC, WILL MAINTAIN CONTINUITY FOR 2019

- The Hurricanes defense has continued to shine under defensive coordinator **Manny Diaz**, who will be coaching for the last time at Miami in the bowl game. Head coach Mark Richt announced the promotion of two assistants, **Ephraim Banda** and **Jonathan Patke**, to co-defensive coordinators on Fri., Dec. 14.
- According to Football Outsiders, Miami's "havoc rate" of 24.7%- calculated by adding total tackles for loss, passes defended and forced fumbles and dividing it by total plays ranks No. 1 overall in FBS.
- UM's "front seven" havoc rate (16.6%) - the same calculation but smaller player total - also ranks No. 1.
- The most important metric to measure a college football defense in 2018, according to the UM staff philosophy, is opponent yards per play; Miami ranks No. 4 in FBS (4.2) and ranked ninth last year (4.6).
- In the NCAA rankings released Nov. 25, Miami was second in the nation and first in the ACC in total defense (268.3 yards per game); its 140.8 passing yards allowed per game was the best mark in FBS.
- UM ranks No. 1 nationally in tackles for loss (10.5) and No. 1 in third down conversion defense (23.7%).

DALLAS STEPPING UP AS SOPHOMORE, TOPS 1K ALL-PURPOSE YARDS

- RB **DeeJay Dallas** has been a big factor in Miami's offense in 2018, and leads the Hurricanes with 1,162 all-purpose yards. Among active Canes, Dallas ranks first in kickoff (313) and punt return (155) yards.
- Dallas, who leads the Hurricanes with seven total touchdowns, is second in rushing yards (609) for UM.
- Last time out vs. Pittsburgh (Nov. 24), Dallas had his first-ever punt return for a score on a 65-yard TD.
- In UM's game vs. Duke (Nov. 3), Dallas had a career-high 191 all-purpose yards, including a career-high 124 rush yards. His 83-yard TD run vs. Duke was the sixth-longest rush from scrimmage in UM history.
- In a win over Toledo on Sept. 15, Dallas posted the first 100-yard game of his career (110) in a 49-24 win.
- Dallas did it again vs. North Carolina (Sept. 27), posting 114 rushing yards on just 11 carries with one TD.
- Dallas totaled 349 all-purpose yards as a true freshman in 2017, including 217 rushing and 92 receiving.
- Dallas, whose full first name is Demetrius, served as unofficial recruiting ambassador for the Hurricanes' "#Squad17" class. He was originally committed to Mark Richt when Richt was head coach at Georgia.



OFFSEASON FOCUS ON 3RD DOWN PAID OFF FOR OFFENSE AND DEFENSE

- After the very first day of fall camp in August, **Mark Richt** stressed an emphasis on third downs on both sides of the ball, saying Miami practiced third downs on Day 1 as opposed to waiting til later in camp.
- The Hurricanes, who finished last year ranked 125th in third down conversion percentage on offense and 75th on defense, saw marked improvement from the offseason focus; UM entered bowl season ranked No. 1 nationally on defense (23.7%) and was ranked No. 48 nationally on the offensive side (41.6%).
- Last time out on Nov. 24, Miami's defense held Pittsburgh to just 6.7% conversion (1 of 15) - its best performance on third down of the year. UM's best offensive performance was at Georgia Tech (Nov. 10).

BALLHAWKING SECONDARY RANKS AMONG BEST UNITS IN ALL OF FBS

- Miami's defense, ranked second nationally in total defense, has been especially stout on quarterbacks, holding opponents to a nationwide-low 140.8 passing yards per game - the best mark in all of FBS.
- Led by three apiece from Trajan Bandy, Jhavonte Dean and Sheldrick Redwine, the Hurricanes have totaled 15 interceptions through the first 11 games - the 16th-most in FBS and third-most in ACC.
- Miami's team passing efficiency defense (100.64) is the second-best mark nationwide and best in ACC.
- The Hurricane secondary is anchored by three seniors and one rising sophomore - safeties Jaquan Johnson and Sheldrick Redwine, along with cornerbacks Michael Jackson, Sr., and Trajan Bandy.
- All four of Miami's defensive backs earned All-ACC recognition; Johnson was named to the All-ACC Second Team, Bandy was a third-team pick, while Jackson, Sr., and Redwine were Honorable Mention.
- Miami was one of just three teams to have two Thorpe Award semifinalists (Johnson, Jackson, Sr.)
- Seven different Canes have at least one interception this season with two returned for touchdowns.

QUARTERMAN ON AN IRON MAN STREAK SPANNING CAREER AT MIAMI

- LB **Shaq Quarterman** has started all 38 games of his UM career - the only current Hurricane to do so.

FRESHMEN TOTALED MORE THAN 2K YARDS, AMASSED 27 TOTAL TDs

- Both true and redshirt freshmen have been significant contributors for the Hurricanes in 2018.
- The Hurricanes' freshmen have combined to make 28 starts and, including QB **N'Kosi Perry's** 13 touchdown passes, are responsible for 27 total touchdowns (13 passing, 14 rushing) this year. Freshmen have scored 153 total points and have compiled an impressive 2,087 yards of total offense this season.
- RB **Cam Davis'** rushing TD at Georgia Tech (Nov. 10) vs was the 10th rushing or receiving TD by a true freshman. TE **Brevin Jordan** (four) and Davis (three) lead the Hurricanes' freshmen in touchdowns.
- Jordan (10), Perry (six) OL **DJ Scaife, Jr.** (six) and WR **Dee Wiggins** (three) lead freshmen in starts.

SCAIFE EMERGED AS TRUE FRESHMAN STARTER ON OFFENSIVE LINE

- True freshman **DJ Scaife, Jr.**, has started the past six games at right tackle and graded out highest of any Miami offensive lineman vs. Georgia Tech in a road loss (Nov. 10). He has played in all 12 games this year.
- A 2018 Under Armour All-America, Scaife was high school teammates with **Dee Wiggins & Mark Pope**.

HOMER NEARING TWO RUSHING MILESTONES HEADING INTO PINSTRIPE

- RB **Travis Homer** has been among Miami's top offensive playmakers over the past two seasons, and was named to the All-ACC Second Team and Miami's team offensive MVP at its annual awards banquet.
- Homer needs just 31 yards in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl to become the 11th Hurricane to ever record a 1,000-yard rushing season (969), and just 21 more yards to reach 2,000 career rushing yards (1,979).
- Homer, who moved past Miami legend Frank Gore (1,975) into 12th all-time career rushing yards with 168 last time out against Pitt (Nov. 24), would move into the top 10 all-time with a 100 yards vs. UW.
- In 21 games as Miami's starting running back, Homer has compiled 1,728 rushing yards (82.3 per game).

BREAK OUT THE CHAIN AGAIN! TURNOVER CHAIN 2.0 IS BACK FOR 2018

- When sophomore DB **Trajan Bandy** pounced on a loose ball in the second quarter of Miami's game vs. Savannah State, the crowd turned to observe a familiar sight from 2017: the "Turnover Chain."
- But instead of last year's chain, which was modeled in the shape of the iconic "U" logo, Bandy was presented a brand new turnover chain to wear featuring a charm in the model of Sebastian the Ibis.
- Turnover Chain 2.0 is comprised of more than 4,000 stones (compared to 900 last year), weighs roughly three kilograms (compared to two last year) and has an 8.5-inch charm (compared to 5.5).
- The Hurricanes defense totaled only 19 turnovers gained in 13 games in 2016 - the season before the Turnover Chain's inception. Since, Miami has compiled 55 in just 25 games, averaging 2.2 per game.
- No Hurricane has worn the new chain more often than Bandy, who has worn it five times (three interceptions, two fumble recoveries); DB **Sheldrick Redwine** has worn it four times this season.

FRESHMAN CAM DAVIS DAZZLED OVER SEASON'S FINAL THREE GAMES

- Earning more significant action over the final three games of the year, freshman RB **Cam'ron Davis** finished the season third among Miami's running backs with 167 rushing yards in just six games.
- Davis had a breakout game against Georgia Tech on Nov. 10, rushing for 48 yards on six carries, including a 22-yard touchdown run - the first of his career. Davis finished the year with three total TDs.
- Davis' breakout game against the Yellow Jackets was his first action of any kind since an Oct. 6 win over rival Florida State; the Opa-Locka, Fla., native had not played in more than a month before the outing.
- A week later, Davis recorded the first multi-touchdown performance of his career on the road at Virginia Tech (Nov. 17) - he had a career-best 77-rushing yards, including a career-long 42-yard touchdown rush, and added a 16-yard TD reception - the first of his career. He had 93 all-purpose yards.
- Davis, who stepped up after third-string RB **Lorenzo Lingard** suffered a knee injury in late October, finished his Carol City High School career with more than 1,300 yards rushing and 21 touchdowns
- A four-star prospect, Davis chose UM over offers from Georgia, Oregon and Wisconsin, among others.

JOE JACKSON AMONG FBS ACTIVE SACKS LEADERS, UM D-LINE THRIVING

- Junior DL **Joe Jackson**, who leads the Hurricanes with nine sacks this season, is one of just seven active FBS players with at least 24 career sacks; he ranks fourth among all Power 5 players in career sacks.
- Over his last two starts, Jackson has compiled five tackles for loss and four sacks. Jackson earned Honorable Mention All-ACC recognition after compiling 47 tackles, 14.5 tackles for loss and nine sacks.
- The junior defensive end was tied for fourth in the ACC in sacks and tied for seventh in tackles for loss.
- Prior to 2018, UM had never had two players with at least 14.0 TFLs in the same year since joining the ACC in 2004; Miami could end this year with four, with Jackson, DL **Gerald Willis III** (18.0) and DL **Jon Garvin** (16.5) already accomplishing the feat. Not far behind is LB **Shaq Quarterman**, who has 13.0.

- The Miami Hurricanes' defensive line took a hit when three of its four 2017 starters departed after the season, but one of the players who stepped up in his sophomore year has been end **Jon Garvin**.
- Garvin, who totaled just nine tackles as a true freshman in 2017 - ranks sixth on the Hurricanes with 54 tackles; he set a career high with eight vs. LSU (Sept. 2) and matched it vs. Savannah State (Sept. 8).
- Garvin ranked fourth in the ACC with 16.0 tackles for loss; he became the first Hurricane this year to have multiple games with 3.0 TFL since LB **Denzel Perryman** in 2011. Gerald Willis joined the list this year.
- The Lake Worth, Fla., native goes by "Neo" - his middle name and the name of his grandfather.

WILLIS NAMED AN ALL-AMERICAN, WILL MISS PINSTRIPE BOWL TO REHAB

- **Gerald Willis III** was named a second-team All-American by several outlets after a tremendous 2018 season where he ranked first among all defensive tackles nationwide in tackles for loss with 18.0.
- Playing in his first game since Nov. 26, 2016, Willis III delivered an overpowering showing against LSU on Sept. 2 in the season opener at AT&T Stadium to set the stage for a dominant final season at The U.
- Willis posted a career-high eight tackles in his first career collegiate start in Arlington, Texas, recording an eye-popping 4.0 tackles for loss – the first such performance by a Hurricane defender since 2008.
- Willis, who was named ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week for that performance, never slowed down; he was invited to the Reese's Senior Bowl on Nov. 14 and has been soaring in recent NFL mock drafts.
- The New Orleans native announced on Fri., Dec. 14 that he would miss the New Era Pinstripe Bowl to begin rehab on an injured hand. He started all 12 games this season and was elected a team captain.
- Willis played his true freshman season (2014) at Florida before transferring to Miami before the 2015 season; entering 2018, he had 33 total tackles, 6.0 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks for his collegiate career.
- This season alone, Willis has posted 59 total tackles, 18.0 TFLs, four sacks and started all 12 games.
- The last Hurricanes defender with 17.0 TFLs in a season was **Sean Spence**, who also had 17.0, in 2008.
- The last Hurricane with 4.0 tackles for loss in a game was **Marcus Robinson** vs. Virginia Tech in 2008.
- The half-brother of N.Y. Giants' Landon Collins, Willis played at powerhouse Edna Karr in New Orleans.
- Willis III was named to the Midseason All-America First Team by both the Associated Press and ESPN, and was named Midseason All-America Second Team and best interior d-lineman by The Athletic.

AFTER REDSHIRTING 2017, PERRY SAW FIRST MAJOR ACTION THIS YEAR

- After impressing vs. FIU (Sept. 22) upon entering for Miami's third series of the game, QB **N'Kosi Perry** earned his first career start vs. North Carolina (Sept. 27) - he started six games as a redshirt freshman.
- UM is 3-0 in games started by Perry at Hard Rock Stadium; in six games there, he has 11 TDs and 3 INTs.
- Last time away from home at Virginia Tech (Nov. 17), Perry earned the first road win of his career with a 21-for-34, 171-yard performance. He threw two touchdowns, no interceptions and added a rushing TD.
- In his six starts at quarterback, Perry has orchestrated Miami's season-long drives by time (7:49, vs. FSU), total yards (95, vs. Georgia Tech) and plays (15, vs. Georgia Tech). He has 13 TD passes this year.
- In his second start vs. Florida State (Oct. 6), Perry threw for a career-high four touchdown passes to help complete an epic second-half comeback. He also started Miami's game at Virginia (Oct. 13).
- The Ocala, Fla., native was a consensus four-star quarterback by 247Sports, ESPN, Rivals and Scout, and was rated as the third-best dual sport in the nation by ESPN and sixth-best by 247Sports.

PERMANENT CAPTAINS FOR 2018 SEASON ANNOUNCED AT AWARD SHOW

- **Mark Richt** announced UM's five team captains for the 2018 season at the end-of-season awards show: DL **Gerald Willis III**, LB **Shaq Quarterman**, S **Jaquan Johnson**, RB **Travis Homer** and DB **Jimmy Murphy**.

FUTURE HURRICANES INK WITH MIAMI IN EARLY SIGNING PERIOD

- A number of players signed with the Hurricanes for the 2019 season and beyond during the early signing period, which opened on Wed., Dec. 19. Miami signed high school players and transfers in the window.
- Among the high schoolers to sign with Miami were a number of the nation's top-ranked players, including WR **Jeremiah Payton**, ranked No. 56 overall in the annual ESPN300 high school rankings, DB **Te' Cory Couch** (ranked No. 230 in ESPN300) and DB **Keontra Smith** (ranked No. 235 in ESPN300).
- Miami also inked Auburn freshman transfer and four-star RB **Asa Martin**, who spent 2018 with the Tigers.
- Among the other Rivals four-star players to sign with Miami are DT **Jason Blissett**, DE **Jahfari Harvey** and LB **Avery Huff**. According to 247Sports, Miami inked five four-star players during the early signing period.

THREE-HEADED LINEBACKER MONSTER IN MIDST OF JUNIOR YEARS

- Miami's three-headed monster - junior linebacker trio Zach McCloud, Michael Pinckney and Shaq Quarterman - has started nearly every game together since arriving to UM as early enrollees in 2016.
- McCloud has started 29 of 37 career games through the 2018 regular season. McCloud finished with 48 tackles (29 solo), 4.5 tackles for loss in 2017. He posted a season-high 8 tackles at BC (Oct. 26).
- One of UM's most instinctive players, Pinckney started 11 of 13 games last season and ended up with 68 total tackles, 11.0 tackles for loss and 3.5 sacks. He had eight tackles last time out vs. Pitt (Nov. 24).
- Quarterman, who has started all 38 games for the Hurricanes in two-plus seasons, ranked second on the team with 83 tackles a sophomore in 2017. Quarterman was an All-ACC First Team selection in 2018.
- In a win over North Carolina (Sept. 27), the trio started, combining for 17 tackles, 5.0 tackles for loss, two sacks & one forced fumble. The trio has started alongside each other eight of 12 games in 2018.

TRUE FROSH TIGHT END DUO HOPEFUL TO RETURN FOR BOWL GAME

- Two key members of Miami's freshman class played bigger roles than were anticipated after junior TE **Michael Irvin II** suffered an MCL injury during fall camp. Irvin was back at practice in mid-December.
- Freshman tight end duo **Brevin Jordan** and **Will Mallory**, who became friends through the recruiting process and were ranked among the nation's best at the position, were counted on for all of 2018.
- Both suffered injuries at Virginia Tech (Nov. 17) and did not compete in the regular season finale.
- Jordan was ranked the No. 1 tight end in the country by ESPN.com and 247Sports and No. 2 by Rivals, while Mallory was ranked the third-best tight end by ESPN.com. The two tight ends are roommates.

- Lining up as a fullback, RB **Trayone Gray** earned the first start of his collegiate career in Miami's game at Georgia Tech on Nov. 10. Gray finished with one 3-yard rush that converted a 4th-and-1 play.
- Senior DL **Tito Odenigbo**, who grad transferred to Miami after spending his career at Illinois, had a career-high five tackles (four solo) in Atlanta. He went on to start the final two games of the season.

CANES HAVE TWO-PRONGED RUSHING ATTACK IN DALLAS AND HOMER

- Miami's two-pronged running back attack in junior RB **Travis Homer** (969 rushing yards) and RB **DeeJay Dallas** (609 rushing yards) has provided a boost for the Hurricanes offense this season.
- In Miami's home game vs. Duke (Nov. 3), both rushed for 100 yards in the same game for the first time; Homer totaled 133 yards on 18 carries, while Dallas rushed for 124 yards on 12. Both had 1 touchdown.
- The two running backs have split reps throughout the year, with Dallas also recording 100-yard rushing games vs. Toledo (Sept. 15, 110 yards) and North Carolina (Sept. 27, 114) and Homer doing it vs. FIU (Sept. 22, 114) and vs. Pitt (Nov. 24, 168) Homer has six career 100-yard rush games, Dallas has three.

HURRICANES DEFENSE ON PACE TO SET UM'S TACKLE FOR LOSS RECORD

- There are only 11 players in the ACC with at least 13.0 tackles for loss, and Miami has four of them: DL **Gerald Willis III** (18.0), DL **Jon Garvin** (16.0), DL **Joe Jackson** (14.0) and LB **Shaq Quarterman** (13.0).
- Miami's 126 tackles for loss are five more than the next-highest total (Clemson, 121) and lead the ACC.
- The Hurricanes' defense's total of 124 tackles for loss is already 15 better than last year's mark (111) and the most by a Miami Hurricanes' defense since 2005 (116); Miami still has its bowl game to play.
- Since joining the ACC, Miami has never had two players with at least 14.0 TFLs in the same season; the Hurricanes could finish with four, with Quarterman needing just one more TFL to reach the mark.

A PAIR OF DEFENSIVE BACKS NAMED THORPE AWARD SEMIFINALISTS

- When the Oklahoma Sports Hall of Fame announced 14 semifinalists for the 2018 Paycom Jim Thorpe Award on Oct. 22, two Hurricanes made the cut: **Michael Jackson, Jr.**, and **Jaquan Johnson**.
- The Canes were one of just three teams to have two players selected to the 14-member list.
- The only Thorpe Award winner in program history is Bennie Blades, who won the award in 1987.

HARLEY IMPRESSING AS TEAM LEADER, IMPROVED IN SECOND SEASON

- WR **Mike Harley** stepped up vs. FIU and delivered the best performance of his career in a 31-17 win.
- Harley led all players with a career-best seven catches in the win over FIU for a career-high 76 yards.
- Harley was named a team captain vs. North Carolina (Sept. 27) and made his first career start. He led all Hurricanes with 70 receiving yards, and tied a career-long with a 42-yard reception vs. UNC.
- Harley had a team-high and game-high 45 receiving yards in UM's last home game vs. Duke (Nov. 3).
- The south Florida native ranks second among active Hurricanes with 21 catches totaling 240 yards - surpassing his personal totals from 2017 (nine catches, 91 yards). He is averaging 20 yards per game.

JAQUAN BACK FOR SENIOR YEAR AFTER CONSULTING IDOL ED REED

- After discussing his future with legendary Miami safety Ed Reed, DB **Jaquan Johnson** turned down the opportunity to enter the NFL Draft, choosing to return for his senior season with the Hurricanes.
- The Hurricanes are undoubtedly happy with his decision, as Johnson - a second-team All-ACC selection and a Thorpe Award semifinalist - led Miami with 79 tackles in his final season at The U.
- In his first game of 2018, Johnson served as one of four captains and totaled a game-high 11 tackles.
- Johnson missed games vs. FIU (Sept. 22) and North Carolina (Sept. 27) with a hamstring injury.
- He returned as a captain vs. Florida State (Oct. 6) and totaled a game-high 10 tackles in the win.
- The Miami native was named a semifinalist for the 2018 Jim Thorpe Award on Oct. 22.
- As a junior, Johnson was one of four defensive semifinalists for the Walter Camp Player of the Year.

KEEPING IT IN THE "U FAMILY"

- As is often the case at the University of Miami, a number of Canes have family ties to 'The U'
- Four Hurricanes had fathers who suited up in orange and green: TE **Michael Irvin II** (father is Michael) II, DL **Scott Patchan** (Matt), DL **Pat Bethel** (Randy) and freshman DB **Al Blades, Jr.** (Al, Sr.)
- WR **Evidence Njoku** is the brother of David, who was taken by Cleveland in the 2017 NFL Draft.
- QB **Cade Weldon** is the son of Casey Weldon, former quarterback at Florida State under Mark Richt.

- "Voice of the Hurricanes" Joe Zagacki and color commentator Don Bailey, Jr. are in the booth for their 17th year on the radio - the duo has broadcast 249 straight games together.

HURRICANES SET RECORDS IN WIN OVER TIGERS IN HOME OPENER

- The Miami Hurricanes opened their 11th season at Hard Rock Stadium on Sept. 8 vs. Savannah State, capturing a 77-0 shutout victory to improve to 11-0 all-time in home openers at the stadium.
- Miami's 77 points tied a program record for most points in a single game (also set against Savannah State, in September 2013), while its 77-point margin of victory was the largest in program history.
- The Hurricanes have not lost a home opener since 2006, when they fell to Florida State 13-10 at the Orange Bowl on Sept. 4, 2006. Miami has won 12 straight home openers since, a program record.

DEFENSE RECORDS FIRST SHUTOUT SINCE 2015 IN WIN OVER TIGERS

- The Miami Hurricanes' defense was able to compile its first shutout since the 2015 season opener against Bethune-Cookman (Sept. 5, 2015) in a 77-0 win over Savannah State on Saturday, Sept. 8.
- The shutout was the first under the current Miami staff, including defensive coordinator Manny Diaz.
- Diaz's last shutout as defensive coordinator came exactly six years to the day before Miami's win over Savannah State; as the coordinator at Texas, Diaz's Longhorns shutout New Mexico on Sept. 8, 2012.

HIGHTOWER WOVES IN FIRST COLLEGIATE GAME, SCORES TOUCHDOWN

- Among Miami's most impressive freshman performers vs. LSU (Sept. 2) was WR **Brian Hightower**, who hauled in a 32-yard TD reception on a connection with QB **Malik Rosier** in the fourth quarter.
- Hightower, who saw significant action in the game vs. LSU, became the first Hurricane wide receiver to record a touchdown for his first collegiate catch since **Tyre Brady** vs. Nebraska in 2015.
- Hightower made the first start of his career on Sept. 22 vs. FIU; he has 4 catches for 60 yards.
- The last Hurricane to have his first catch end up in a touchdown was FB **Marquez Williams** in 2016.
- Hightower was a consensus four-star recruit ranked the No. 141 overall player in his class by ESPN.

- In 2017, the list of honorary captain list included all-time Miami greats like QB George Mira, DB Bennie Blades, WR Reggie Wayne, DB Ed Reed and DB Antrel Rolle, among other Hurricanes legends.
- Richt and his wife Katharyn personally dedicated \$1 million to the construction of the Carol Soffer Indoor Practice Facility, which helped spur more than \$2 million in gifts from former players.

CAROL SOFFER INDOOR PRACTICE FACILITY OPEN FOR BUSINESS

- On August 17, 2018, history was made at the University of Miami, as the Miami Hurricanes practiced inside the Carol Soffer Indoor Practice Facility for the very first time during fall camp.
- In September 2016, Miami announced the largest donation in the history of the athletics department as the lead gift for a state-of-the-art football indoor practice facility. In honor of their mother Carol, Jeffrey Soffer and Carol's other children made a \$14 million commitment towards the facility.
- Head coach Mark Richt pledged \$1 million towards the facility and football alumnus and linebacker great Jon Beason was among those alumni to give to the project. Beason's gift was \$250,000, as Miami alumni and former players teamed up to contribute more than \$2 million for the project.
- The 81,800-square-foot facility features two field-turf fields – one 90 yards long and one 40 yards.
- The Palm Beach native became the eighth Miami tailback to have recorded a 100-yard game in his first career start since 2000, and the fourth to do it in an Atlantic Coast Conference game.
- Homer is Miami's leading active rusher with 1,811 rushing yards and 11 career rushing touchdowns.

In just two-plus seasons as head coach, Mark Richt has made an indelible impact on his alma mater's football program -- both on and off the field.

Richt posted a 19-7 record over his first two seasons, the third best start in Miami history, and a stretch that included a 15-game winning streak -- UM's longest since 2002. The Hurricanes won 10 games in 2017, climbing as high as second in the College Football Playoff rankings. Miami captured the Atlantic Coast Conference's Coastal Division for the first time in its history and earned an invitation to the Capital One Orange Bowl for the first time in 13 years. Richt won 2017 ACC Coach of the Year honors and was also named the 2017 Walter Camp Coach of the Year.

The Hurricanes ranked first in team sacks per game (3.38), and ranked third the nation in turnovers forced in 2017 (31). Junior quarterback Malik Rosier accounted for 31 total touchdowns, breaking Vinny Testaverde's single-season school record, and helping Miami rank 15th in the nation in red zone offense (90.7 percent). Junior defensive back Jaquan Johnson had a breakout season, leading the team with 96 tackles, picking off four passes and earning ACC Defensive Back of the Week honors three times. Overall, 10 Hurricanes earned All-ACC honors, including kicker Michael Badgley, who was named first-team All-ACC.

Off the field, Richt has energized the program, from supporting the fundraising efforts for the Carol Soffer Football Indoor Practice Facility to launching The U Network, which assists former Hurricanes in networking and career placement after their playing careers have concluded. Miami was one of three schools, along with Stanford and Northwestern, to earn the 2016 American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Academic Achievement Award. In addition, the Hurricanes ranked first among all FBS programs in 2016 in the NCAA Team Works Helper Helper Community Service Competition, and helped Miami finish first among Division I schools overall in 2018.

Richt was named the University of Miami's 24th head football coach on Dec. 4, 2015. His hiring provided immediate dividends as the Hurricanes posted a 9-4 record in his first season in Coral Gables. Miami then defeated West Virginia, 31-14, in the Russell Athletic Bowl for the program's first bowl victory in 10 years. The Hurricanes were ranked No. 20 in

the final Associated Press poll and No. 23 in the final Amway Coaches Poll -- the program's first season-ending rankings since 2009.

Miami had 10 players earned ACSMA All-ACC honors in 2016, while quarterback Brad Kaaya became Miami's all-time passing yards leader. Freshman wide receiver Ahmmon Richards broke the 31-year-old freshman receiving record at Miami originally set by Michael Irvin, while sophomore running back Mark Walton became the 11th 1,000-yard rusher in program history.

Six Hurricanes were selected in the 2018 NFL Draft. Nine Hurricanes were selected in the 2017 NFL Draft, the most for Miami since 2006, including first-round pick David Njoku to the Cleveland Browns. Richt has had 99 of his players drafted as a head coach, including 14 first-round picks.

Richt, born in Omaha, Neb., and raised in Boca Raton, Fla., returned to his alma mater after leading the University of Georgia football program for the previous 15 years. He compiled a 145-51 overall record and an 85-40 mark in Southeastern Conference play. Georgia won two SEC championships, six SEC East titles and nine bowl games under Richt, and finished the season in the Associated Press Top-10 rankings seven times.

Richt's 164 career wins rank fourth among active FBS head coaches and his .744 winning percentage ranks as the seventh best among current FBS coaches with at least five years of experience. Richt is one of only seven head coaches in SEC history to record four straight 10-win seasons (2002-05).

Richt coached some of the greatest quarterbacks in Georgia history, including David Greene, a four-year starter who left Athens as the then-winningest quarterback in NCAA history with 42 career wins. Aaron Murray, also a four-year starter, is the SEC's all-time leader in passing yards (13,166) and touchdown passes (121). Matthew Stafford threw for 3,459 yards and 25 touchdowns (then a school record) as a junior for the Bulldogs.

Richt is married to the former Katharyn Francis of Tallahassee. The couple has four children -- Jonathan, David, Zach, and Anya. Jon, the Miami quarterbacks coach, was married to the former Anna Cearley in May 2010. They have two daughters, Jady and Zoe.
