## SEMINOLES TRAVEL TO PLAY AT NATIONALLY RANKED HURRICANES

Florida State, which has won 10 of its last 11 games played against teams from the state of Florida, travels to play at No. 11/12 Miami on Saturday, January 9, 2015 at 5:00 p.m. The game will be televised nationally on ESPN2. The Seminoles' game against Miami marks the 25<sup>th</sup> meeting between the two teams as members of the ACC with Florida State and 14<sup>th</sup>-year head coach Leonard Hamilton holding a 15-9 winning margin against the Hurricanes since Miami joined the league for the 2004-05 season. Hamilton was the head coach at Miami from 1992 through 2000 and continues to rank as the winningest Division I coach at Miami with 144 wins. Following Saturday's game at Miami, the Seminoles will continue ACC play at NC State (Jan. 13, 9:00 p.m.) before returning home to face its third nationally ranked team in the first five conference games as they play host to Virginia (Jan. 17, 6:30 p.m.) at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee.

## BACON AND BEASLEY ARE THE TOP TWO FRESHMEN IN THE ACC

Freshman phenom Dwayne Bacon and freshman sensation Malik Beasley have quickly proven they are two of the top players in the nation. They are the two top ranking freshmen in the ACC and among nation's best.

## BEASLEY IS ONE OF TWO FRESHMEN IN THE ACC

Freshman sensation Malik Beasley enters Saturday's game against Miami as one of only two freshmen in the ACC who is ranked in the top 25 of the conference statistics in **BOTH** scoring (seventh, 17.0 ppg) and rebounding (24<sup>th</sup>, 5.7). He is joined by Brandon Ingram of Duke as the only freshmen in both categories.

## HAMILTON IS FLORIDA STATE'S WINNINGEST COACH

Seminole head coach Leonard Hamilton is Florida State's all-time winningest coach in school history with 246 career victories. He is also Florida State's winningest coach with 96 career ACC regular season wins, 105 overall ACC wins (regular season and tournament) and is the 10<sup>th</sup> winningest coach in ACC history with his 246 wins since the beginning of his coaching tenure at Florida State which began in the 2002-03 season. Hamilton led the Seminoles to their first ACC Championship in 2012 and has led the Seminoles to the championship game of the ACC Tournament twice (in 2009 and 2012) for the first time in school history.

## RATHAN-MAYES CONTINUES TO LEAD THE ACC IN ASSISTS

Florida State point guard Xavier Rathan-Mayes enters Saturday's game against Miami ranked as the ACC leader in assists with a career-high 5.7 assists per game average. He grabbed the ACC assists lead during the first weekend of the season as he was credited with a career-high 11 assists in Florida State's season-opening victory over Nicholls State (Nov. 15) and is looking to become the first Seminole to lead the ACC in assists.

## RATHAN-MAYES HOPING FOR DEJA-VU ALL OVER AGAIN

In one of greatest scoring exhibitions in college basketball history, Florida State guard Xavier Rathan-Mayes scored 30 points in a span of 4:38 on Feb. 25, 2015 in the second half of Miami's 81-77 victory over the Seminoles the last time they played at BankUnited Center. At one point during the run, Rathan-Mayes did not miss a single shot -- 6-for-6 on 3-pointers, two layups and four made free throws -- for 26 points in a 3:35 span. He finished the game with 35 points. "One of the greatest shooting performances I have ever seen," Miami's Jim Larraga said after the game.

...Defeat Miami and win its first game against a nationally ranked opponent since defeating the No. 23 ranked Hurricanes, 55-54, on Feb. 2, 2015 in Tallahassee;

The Seminoles have defeated Jacksonville (Nov. 17, 98-79), FAU (Dec. 19; 64-59 in the Orange Bowl Classic) and Florida (Dec. 29; 73-71) this season and have won 10 of their last 11 games against teams from the state of Florida since a victory over Florida Gulf Coast University on March 18, 2014;

**FLORIDA STATE AGAINST THE STATE OF FLORIDA**

Florida State, which has won six of its last eight games, has enjoyed the fun and sun in the state of Florida and it has won 10 of its last 11 games against teams from the state of Sunshine State. The Seminoles' streak began on March 18, 2014 as it defeated Florida Gulf Coast, 58-53, in the first round of the NIT. Included in the Seminoles' streak are two victories over Florida and one win over Florida Atlantic, Florida Gulf Coast, Jacksonville, Miami, Stetson, UCF, UNF, and USF.

**RATHAN-MAYES FOLLOWING IN HIS FATHER'S FOOTSTEPS**

Sophomore Xavier Rathan-Mayes, who has scored 30 or more points four times in his career as a Seminoles, often speaks of his desire to break his father's Florida State records. With his father, Tharon, amongst the more than 11,000 fans in attendance on Monday's night's game against North Carolina, Xavier continued to close in on his dreams of writing his name next to his father's in the Seminole record book. Xavier earned his fourth career game of 30 or more points scored and came one step closer to catching Tharon who totaled seven career games of 30 or more points scored during his career at Florida State.

**RATHAN-MAYES CLIMBING THE 30-POINTS SCORED GAME LADDER**

Sophomore Xavier Rathan-Mayes who scored 30 points against North Carolina on Monday night to mark the fourth time in his career that he had scored at least 30 points in a single game. His career high of 35 points has come against both North Carolina (January 24, 2015) and Miami (Feb. 25, 2015) while 30 points also came against Clemson in the second round of the ACC Tournament (March 11, 2015). Rathan-Mayes became the first freshman in ACC history to score 30 or more points at least three times as a freshman and added his fourth career 30-point game against the Tar Heels earlier this week.

**SEMINOLES SCORCHING THE NETS FROM THE BONUSPHERE**

Florida State is shooting .426 and averaging 9.7 made shots from the bonusphere in its last three games. Most recently the Seminoles made 10 3-point shots against North Carolina – marking the fourth time this season the Seminoles have made 10 3-point shots in a single game this season. The Seminoles are shooting nearly 13 percentage points better and making more than four additional 3-points shots in their last three games than they did in their first 11 games of the season.

**FLORIDA STATE VS. NORTH CAROLINA – THE LAST GAME**

With his team desperate for baskets, Florida State's Xavier Rathan-Mayes could not miss. He scored 30 points in the final 4:38, and even that was not enough to beat the Miami Hurricanes. Miami built an 18-point lead and survived the late heroics by Florida State's freshman guard to win 81-77 at BankUnited Center in Coral Gables on Jan. 25, 2015. Rathan-Mayes scored 26 consecutive Florida State points without missing a shot. He went 8-for-10 in the final five minutes, sinking six 3-pointers, and finished with 35 points to tie his career-high. The Hurricanes made 14 of 16 free throws in the final 2:51 to hang on to their lead. Davon Reed's two free throws with two seconds left sealed the victory. The Seminoles trailed 62-44 before Rathan-Mayes scored 19 points in a span of 3:05, cutting the deficit to 69-63 with 1:33 to go. He converted a four-point play with 1:03 to trim Miami's lead to 73-70. Rathan-Mayes' streak included five 3-pointers in a span of 2:35. Angel Rodriguez scored 25 points for the Hurricanes, who shot 56 percent in the second half.

**FLORIDA STATE AMONG ACC STEALS LEADERS**

Led by freshman Terance Mann's three steals against North Carolina on Monday night, Florida State totaled eight steals against the Tar Heels. The Seminoles are ranked third in ACC with a 7.8 steals per game average and have earned at least five steals in each of its 14 games, have totaled eight steals in seven of its 14 games and have double figure steals in four games (VCU, 13; Hofstra, 12; Nicholls, State, 11; Florida Atlantic 10). Florida State trails only Louisville (8.8 spg) and Syracuse (7.9 spg) in the steals category in the ACC statistics.

**2** Freshman Dwayne Bacon is ranked second among his Seminole teammates with 16 steals. He has eight steals in his last six games for a 1.3 steals per game average including his career-high of four steals in Florida State's victory over Florida Atlantic in the Orange Bowl Classic (Dec. 21).

**5** Freshman Terance Mann is one of five Seminoles who has reached double figures in steals (11). He totaled three steals against North Carolina and totaled his career-high of four steals in his first game as a Seminole in Florida State's season opening victory over Nicholls State (Nov. 15).

**5** Sophomore Xavier Rathan-Mayes made his career-high of seven 3-point field goals in scoring 30 points against North Carolina on Monday night. His seven 3-point field goals are tied for the fifth best single game effort in school history and were the most by a Seminole since Deividas Dulkys made eight in a 90-57 Seminole victory over North Carolina on Jan. 14, 2012.

**6** Freshman sensation Malik Beasley has led the Seminoles in rebounding in both of the last two games and in six of his first 14 career games as a Seminole.

**6** Florida State's leading scorer has scored 20 or more points in six consecutive and 12 of the Seminoles' first 14 games of the season.

**10** Florida State is undefeated, 10-0 when it outscores its opponent.

**12** Florida State's 12 point rally after trailing 35-23 at halftime against Florida Atlantic to defeat the Owls is the largest rally to win a game in the ACC this season.

**15** Senior Devon Bookert has at least one steal in 15 consecutive games dating back to March 11 against Clemson in the 2015 ACC Tournament.

**17.2** Freshman phenom Dwayne Bacon is averaging 17.2 points per game – currently a record for average points by a Florida State freshman. The season-long record for highest average by a Seminole freshman is 14.9 points per game by Xavier Rathan-Mayes during the 2014-15 season.

**29** Florida State has made 29 3-points shots in its last three games (9.7 3FGM/Game) – it had made 29 3-point shots total in its previous seven games (4.1 3GM/Game).

**51.1** Senior Devon Bookert is one of Florida State's all-time greatest 3-point shooters. He has attempted 701 field goals during his career with more than 51 percent of his total shots attempted (358 of 701) coming from 3-point range.

**18** Senior Boris Bojanovsky has blocked 18 shots in the Seminoles' last nine games (2.0 bpg) including a season-high six blocked shots in Florida State's victory over VCU (Dec. 6) at Philips Arena.

**MORE ON FLORIDA STATE FROM THE 3-POINT LINE**

Florida State has made 10 or more 3-point shots four times this season (against Nicholls State, Jacksonville, Florida and North Carolina). The Seminoles are 3-1 and average 92.5 points scored per game in those four games.

**FLORIDA STATE FROM THE FREE THROW LINE**

Florida State, which has shot 70 percent or better in 10 of its last 11 games (beginning with a .727 performance from the free throw line against DePaul on Nov. 21) enters Saturday's game against Miami ranked fifth with a .722 free throw shooting percentage. The Seminoles ranked 10<sup>th</sup> in the ACC with a .669 free throw shooting percentage during the 2014-15 season.

**SEMINOLES SCORING**

Florida State has 4-1 when it scores 90 or more points and ranks sixth in the ACC with an 82.1 points per game average entering Saturday's game against Miami. Florida State scored 109 points in its season opening victory over Nicholls State (Nov. 15) and has scored 90 or more points in five different games so far this season. By comparison, the Seminoles did not reach the 100 points scored mark and only scored 90 or more points twice during the 2014-15 season.

## College hoops' most interesting people: Florida State's Leonard Hamilton

Perhaps no conversation about Florida State coach Leonard Hamilton has been complete, at least since Season 2 of HBO's acclaimed series "The Wire," without a reference to the character of Baltimore police Major "Bunny" Colvin.

Hamilton sounded almost disappointed that no one had ever clowned him about his doppelganger, who was played by actor Robert Ray Wisdom.

"I'm going to have to go back now and look at it," he said. "I'm intrigued a little bit."

Hamilton doesn't take himself that serious, it just seems that way. Anyone who has watched him on the sidelines during his 28 seasons as a collegiate head coach has probably had the thought cross their mind at some point. Hamilton trails only Duke's Mike Krzyzewski and North Carolina's Roy Williams in ACC wins over the past decade. His first win this season will make him the winningest coach in Florida State history. He's still the winningest coach at Miami, where he coached from 1990-2000.

Once you get past his glare -- that might take a while, because few coaches stay as stone-faced throughout the course of a game like Hamilton -- Hamilton is not defined by the scowl he keeps on the sideline.

He'd rather be defined by how he helps others. To that end, Hamilton partnered up with producer Kyle Bynoe and launched his own gospel music label, 5ive Oceans Music, a year ago.

"I'm the complete opposite of the image that it seems as though I've projected," Hamilton said. "Whenever I speak to groups or churches I always tell people, 'Please tell people I have a little personality.'"

Hamilton has to plead with folks because he's not a self-promoter. If he were, he'd let everyone know of the recruiting momentum the Seminoles have right now with freshman guards Dwayne Bacon (No. 14) and Malik Beasley (No. 28) headlining what RecruitingNation ranks as the No. 11 recruiting class.

Hamilton is off to a good start with the Class of 2016 with commitments from small forward Jonathan Isaac, who is ranked ninth, and guards Trent Forrest (No. 47) and C.J. Walker (No. 81).

"I'm real excited with where we are and what we can become," Hamilton said. "I'm looking forward to this year and years to come. But hey, I'm just as excited about 5ive Oceans and my gospel. I'm going to tell you something, I have some really good music."

Hamilton knows good music. One of his ways to combat the stress that comes with a high major college basketball job is listening to concerts. But he doesn't just cue up a live album on his iPod. He has a collection of about 500 DVDs of live concerts, and as he plays them on his home entertainment center with surround sound and a big screen, they transport him to the front row of a show.

There's James Brown live in the Boston Garden in 1968, Frankie Valli and the Four Seasons live in Chicago in 1962, and Ray Charles and Gladys Knight in the Los Angeles Coliseum in 1971.

His love of music started from watching his grandmother sing in the church choir growing up in Gastonia, North Carolina. Hamilton followed in her footsteps and was an officer on the choir even directing songs on occasion.

His involvement in the church goes back to his earliest memories. To this day, one of his favorite pictures is him dressed in a double-breasted suit when he was about 4 years old (he'd tell you he was looking "clean") holding hands with his cousin as they're entering the sanctuary.

Hamilton had been looking for a way to perform outreach that would blend with the demanding schedule of being a head coach. He knew some gospel artist whom he said were “talented but struggling to realize their dreams” and he wanted to help because he believed in their ministry as gospel singers.

It led to the creation of 5ive Oceans.

“I go to church every Sunday and try to participate as much as possible, but I haven’t been nearly as active as I would like to be,” Hamilton said. “I felt that this would be my ministry.”

Hamilton isn’t involved in the day-to-day operations of his label but is aware of everything that is going on with it. He can rattle off the release dates of three artists on the label as if he’s a skilled A&R for Sony Music.

“You will be shocked by how good they are,” Hamilton said. “I fully expect to win awards with all three.”

If you judged Hamilton strictly off his sideline demeanor, you’d probably envision Hamilton’s acceptance speech going like the infamous rant by Suge Knight, the former head of Death Row Records at the 1995 Source Awards.

*Any artist out there that wants to be an artist, that wants to stay a star, and not worry about the executive producer trying to be all in the videos, all on a record, dancing -- come to 5ive Oceans.*

Of course, Hamilton is nothing like that. So the next time you see him looking stoic during a game, just remember he’s smiling on the inside.

“I don’t think there’s anyone who has more fun or enjoys themselves more than me,” Hamilton said. “But no one wants to believe that.”
