### STANFORD OPENS ADVOCARE INVITATIONAL WITH MIAMI

Stanford heads to Orlando, Fla. to compete in the eight-team Advocare Invitational at the HP Field House at ESPN Wide World of Sports Complex Thursday through Sunday. The Cardinal opens the tournament against Miami at 11:30 a.m. PT on Thanksgiving Day. From there, it will face either No. 21/22 Iowa State or Indiana State, depending on Thursday's results.

### ADVOCARE INVITATIONAL

The 2016 Advocare Invitational field also includes No. 11/11 Gonzaga, Florida, Seton Hall and Quinnipiac. A Thursday-Friday-Sunday format, the three-day tournament features four teams - Miami, Iowa State, Gonzaga and Seton Hall - who made the 2016 NCAA Tournament. The Championship game will take place at 10:30 a.m. PT on Sunday, with the third-place game at 1:30 p.m. PT and the fifth-place game at 4 p.m. PT. All games will be aired on either ESPN2 or ESPNU.

### BEST START IN FIVE SEASONS

Stanford's 4-0 start to the season is its best in five years, since opening the 2011-12 season 5-0. The Cardinal has won its first four games of the season just twice the last eight years.

### MILES ADDING UP

Stanford will travel more than 21,000 miles from campus and back during its first nine games of the season. The 2016-17 campaign opened in Shanghai, China, more than 6,000 miles from campus. This week, Stanford travels nearly 3,000 miles to Orlando, Fla. After the Advocare Invitational, the Cardinal will travel nearly 2,000 miles to Lawrence, Kan. to face Kansas in its ninth game of the season on Dec. 3. The three trips will total almost 50 hours in an airplane.

### GETTING DEFENSIVE

Stanford ranks third in the Pac-12, surrendering just 59.2 points per game. Last time out, the Cardinal held Colorado State to its lowest point total (49) in two seasons. Prior to that, Stanford limited Weber State to 49 points in Thursday's contest. It's the first time since the 2011-12 season Stanford held back-to-back opponents under 50 points. That year, the Cardinal limited Pacific to just 37 points on Nov. 28, 2011 and then Seattle to 49 points on the road on Dec. 1, 2011.

## TRAVIS DOMINANT IN RETURN TO THE COURT

After missing the final 22 games last season due to injury, Reid Travis has returned to action this season. He leads the team in scoring (19.0 ppg) and rebounding (10.5 rpg) through the first four contests. Travis ranks fourth in the Pac-12 in rebounding and fifth in scoring. The forward ranked 24th nationally in rebounding through Monday's games. The junior's .590 field goal percentage is also tops on the team among players who average more than 10.0 mpg. Two of his three career double-doubles have come in the first four games this season.

## TRAVIS AGAINST HARVARD

In the season-opener against Harvard, Travis posted career-highs in points (24) and rebounds (17) in 31 minutes of action to lead the Cardinal. Travis' 17 boards were the most in a game by a Cardinal since Josh Huestis posted 18 rebounds against USC on Feb. 20, 2014, a span of 80 games.

## DISTRIBUTING THE BASKETBALL

Through the first four games, Stanford is averaging 15.8 assists per game. The total average ranks third in the Pac-12, behind UCLA (25.0) and Utah (17.3). The Cardinal posted a season-high 18 assists in the win over CSUN last week. In Sunday's win over Colorado State, the Cardinal had 10 assists on its first 11 baskets of the game.

## JEROD HAASE ERA OPENS WITH OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION

While the sample size is just four games so far, the 2016-17 squad is averaging 74.8 ppg this season. The Cardinal's 96 points against CSUN on Tuesday were its most points since 2013, when it totaled 97 points in a win over Texas Southern on Nov. 21, 2013. Ten of the top 11 scorers from last season's team that averaged 69.6 ppg, are also on this year's roster.

## BALANCED ATTACK WITH FIVE IN DOUBLE FIGURES

Stanford recorded five double-digit scorers in its first two games of the season. Prior to last week, the Cardinal had five double-digit scorers in a game three times over the previous two seasons. It's the first time Stanford had back-to-back games with five double-digit scorers since the 2013 season (Nov. 21, 2013 vs. Texas Southern and Nov. 25 vs. Houston).

## STANFORD AGAINST MIAMI

Stanford is 2-1 all-time against Miami. The two schools most recently met on April 2, 2015, in the championship game of the NIT in New York. The Cardinal posted a 66-64 win over the Hurricanes to take the NIT title. Current members of Stanford - Marcus Allen (9), Reid Travis (7), Michael Humphrey (2) and Robert Cartwright (0) - each played in that win over Miami. Stanford also defeated Miami (93-59) on Jan. 16, 1989. Miami defeated the Cardinal, 71-58, on Dec. 30, 1986 in the West Palm Hurricane Classic in West Palm Beach, Fla. Miami is the most recent Atlantic Coast Conference team Stanford has faced. The Cardinal also played Duke (L, 70-59) in the 2014-15 season.

**BIGS PROVIDE BOOST**

Stanford's group of Reid Travis, Michael Humphrey and Grant Verhoeven have provided a strong presence in the paint for the Cardinal through the season's first four games. The trio has combined to score 131 points (32.8 ppg) and collect 79 rebounds (19.8 rpg) this season.

The Harvard game was the first time all three recorded double digits in the scoring column in the same game. Travis and Humphrey each scored in double figures in four of the first eight games of last season, before Travis was sidelined with a leg injury for the remainder of the season.

**VETERAN GROUP**

Boasting one of the most experienced rosters in the Pac-12, four starters - Reid Travis, Michael Humphrey, Marcus Allen, and Christian Sanders - and 10 of the top 11 scorers from last season are back. Including the first four games of this season, Stanford's roster has combined for 642 appearances.

**PICKENS THE WORLD TRAVELER**

The 2016 Pac-12 China Game was Dorian Pickens' third international basketball trip in a 15-month span. He has traveled more than 20,000 miles around the globe and spent more than 80 hours on an airplane during his international basketball adventures.

In addition to the Pac-12 China game in Shanghai, Pickens competed in all six games during Stanford's 2015 tour of Italy. He visited Rome, Florence, Venice and Como during the exhibition tour. This past July, the junior was selected to play on the Pac-12 All-Star Team that competed in two games against the Australian Olympic Team in Melbourne.

**STANFORD AND KANSAS AGREE ON FOUR-GAME SERIES**

Stanford and Kansas have announced an agreement on a four-game series. The Cardinal and Jayhawks will meet each of the next four seasons, beginning Dec. 3 in Lawrence, Kansas. The two teams will meet Dec. 21, 2017 at Golden 1 Center in Sacramento, before Stanford returns to Lawrence on Dec. 1, 2018, and hosts the Jayhawks at Maples Pavilion Dec. 29, 2019. Stanford Head Coach Jerod Haase was a standout guard for Jayhawks from 1994-97.

**SCHEDULE BREAKDOWN**

Stanford's 2016-17 schedule features 15 home games, as many as 19 contests against NCAA Tournament opponents from last season, along with the Pac-12 China game, the Advocare Invitational and trips to Kansas and SMU.

**HOME SWEET HOME**

Stanford has won at least 10 home games in 23 straight seasons, dating back to 1992-93. The Cardinal posted a 12-5 home mark in 2015-16. Stanford is 3-0 at Maples Pavilion this season.

**FLOOR BURNS STAT COMES TO THE FARM**

During his standout collegiate career at Kansas, Jerod Haase was known for his energy and passion on the court, diving for loose balls and taking charges, whatever he could do to help his team win. During his time with the Jayhawks, the "floor burns" stat was created in his honor and is still tracked by the program today. One season, Haase totaled 167.

Beginning with the 2016-17 season, Stanford will be tracking floor burns as an official stat throughout the year.

**TRAVIS NAMED CAPTAIN**

Junior Reid Travis was named the Cardinal's team captain at the beginning of the season. It was the first time in Jerod's Haase's five years as a head coach he has named a team captain.

**OKPALA AND DA SILVA SIGN WITH CARDINAL**

Head Coach Jerod Haase unveiled his first recruiting class with the Cardinal, as standouts Kezie Okpala and Oscar da Silva signed with the program on Nov. 9. Okpala, a 6-8, 185-pound small forward from Esperanza High School in Anaheim, California, and da Silva, a 6-9, 210-pound forward from Ludwig Gymnasium in Munich, Germany, will begin competing for the Cardinal in the 2017-18 season.

**INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION**

Stanford's trip to China was the third international trip during the regular season in the 102-year history of the men's basketball program.

The Cardinal now owns a 3-3 all-time record in regular-season games played outside of United States territories following last week's win over Harvard in Shanghai. Stanford also competed in Cancun, Mexico, in 2009 and Paradise Island, Bahamas in 2012.

Five former Stanford standouts – Brook Lopez (Brooklyn Nets), Robin Lopez (Chicago Bulls), Dwight Powell (Dallas Mavericks), Josh Huestis (Oklahoma City Thunder) and Anthony Brown (New Orleans Pelicans) – are on NBA rosters. Brook Lopez was the Nets' scoring leader last season, averaging more than 20 points per contest. Powell and Huestis are both in their third year in the NBA. Powell signed a new contract with Dallas prior to the year. Brown signed with New Orleans Monday. Chasson Randle (New York affiliate Westchester Knicks) is currently playing in the NBA Developmental League.

**STANFORD PART OF STAR-STUDED 2017 PHIL KNIGHT INVITATIONAL**

Stanford will compete in the prestigious 16-team PK80 – Phil Knight Invitational – over Thanksgiving week of 2017. The event, which will honor Nike co-founder and Stanford alumnus Phil Knight MBA '62 in advance of his 80th birthday, will be contested in Portland, Oregon over Thanksgiving week during the 2017-18 season. Stanford will be joined in the elite 16-team field by Arkansas, Butler, Connecticut, Duke, Florida, Georgetown, Gonzaga, Michigan State, North Carolina, Ohio State, Oklahoma, Oregon, Portland, Portland State and Texas. This highly-anticipated event will be one of the largest regular-season tournaments in college basketball history.

Jerod Haase was named Stanford's Anne and Tony Joseph Director of Men's Basketball by Jaquish & Keninger Director of Athletics Bernard Muir on March 25, 2016.

Haase, the 18th head coach in the history of the program, arrives on The Farm after four seasons as the head coach at UAB. He led the Blazers to a regular-season Conference USA championship in 2016 and the program's 15th all-time NCAA Tournament appearance in 2015. Haase improved the Blazers' win total every year.

Tabbed the 2016 Gene Bartow Conference USA Coach of the Year, Haase led the Blazers to a 26-5 overall record and a 16-2 conference mark while capturing their first regular-season title since 2011. Along the way, UAB established school records for overall victories (26), conference wins (16), road wins (10) and consecutive victories (14). Also named the 2016 National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) All-District Coach, Haase directed the Blazers to an NIT berth for the 12th time in school history. UAB also finished 16-0 at home in 2015-16, extending the nation's fifth-longest home winning streak to 25.

Under Haase's guidance, UAB returned to the NCAA Tournament in 2015, shocking No. 3 seed Iowa State, 60-59, in the second round for the Blazers' first NCAA victory since 2005. UAB reached the Big Dance after claiming the program's first Conference USA Tournament title despite being seeded No. 4. The triumph marked UAB's first league tournament title since 1987, when the Blazers won the Sun Belt Conference Tournament. Haase successfully developed a roster comprised of 10 underclassmen – all players recruited by Haase and his staff – and finished 20-16 overall while guiding the third-youngest team in NCAA Division I.

The Blazers made impressive strides under Haase's leadership during the 2013-14 campaign, finishing 18-13 overall. Of UAB's 18 victories, perhaps none were more impressive than the Blazers' 63-59 home win against No. 16 North Carolina. UAB was ranked in the top five nationally in rebounding throughout the season and finished the year ranked second in the country at 44.5 boards per game.

During Haase's first year with the Blazers in 2012-13, UAB won six of its final nine regular-season Conference USA games.

Prior to arriving at UAB, Haase played for Roy Williams at Kansas and spent 13 years on Williams' staff with the Jayhawks and Tar Heels. A 1997 graduate of Kansas with a degree in business administration, Haase got his start as Kansas' Director of Operations from 1999-2003. During that time, the Jayhawks reached the 2002 Final Four and the national championship game in 2003.

When Williams was named head coach at North Carolina prior to the 2003-04 season, he brought Haase with him as an assistant coach and director of operations, a title Haase held from 2003-09. Haase then served exclusively as an assistant coach during his final three seasons with the Tar Heels.

A native of South Lake Tahoe, Calif., Haase attended California in 1992-93 before transferring to Kansas. He helped lead the Jayhawks to three consecutive conference titles and finished his career ranked in the school's top 10 in assists, three-point field goals and steals. Haase started 99 of 101 games at Kansas and scored 1,264 points, averaging 12.5 per game and reaching double figures 74 times. While at Kansas, Haase was a candidate for the Naismith and Wooden Awards.

As a senior in 1996-97, Haase started alongside Jacquie Vaughn, Scot Pollard, Paul Pierce and Raef LaFrentz as Kansas finished with a 34-2 record while averaging 12.0 points per game despite playing with a broken wrist. As a sophomore in 1994-95, Haase averaged 15.0 points and was named the Big Eight Conference Newcomer of the Year and also tabbed a second-team all-conference selection.

Haase was a first-team GTE Academic All-American as a senior, a second-team Academic All-American as a junior and a three-time academic all-conference pick. The Jayhawks' Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year in 1997, Haase later earned a master's degree in business at Kansas in 2000.

Haase started 23 games in 1992-93 as a freshman at California, teaming with Jason Kidd in the backcourt.

Haase, 42, and his wife, the former Mindy Meidinger, have three children: Gavin (10), Garrett (7) and Gabrielle (4).
