'Canes Travel to Midwest to Begin 2010 Slate...

The University of Miami will open the 2010 slate in the Midwest this year, taking part in the Sooner Legends/Nike Invitational hosted by the University of Oklahoma. Of the four participating teams in this year's field, three advanced to last year's NCAA Tournament—including the Miami Hurricanes.

The other participating schools include Wichita State, the University of Texas at Arlington and host Oklahoma. Wichita State advanced to the second round of last year's NCAA Tournament, while Oklahoma advanced into the field of 64.

This is the first time since 2008 the 'Canes are traveling away from the east/southeast to begin the season, winning the Century Tel Premier Tournament hosted by Texas State in San Marcos. UM also picked up the tourney title at the Houston Invitational in Texas back in 2005.

In the last two seasons, the 'Canes have opened up the year with at least two victories to start

Quick Hits on UT Arlington...

The University of Texas at Arlington comes into the 2010 season looking for a fresh start after finishing the year 12-17 (8-8 Southland Conference) in 2009. The Mavericks have all six starters back from last season, as well as the libero. With the addition of four newcomers, the Mavs have high expectations in 2010.

One of the key people back for the Mavs is last year's leader in kills, Tara Frantz, who led the squad with 232 kills, assisted by Bianca Sauls with 215 kills. Setter Raegan Daniel is back after collecting 869 assists last year. Also back is libero/defensive specialist Alicia Shaffer (393 digs), as well as outside hitter Amanda Aguilera (146k, 227d).

UT Arlington won the only other meeting between the Mavs and 'Canes, 3-2, back on Sept. 1, 2007, as part of the Marquette Kick-Off Weekend in Milwaukee, Misc.

Quick Hits on Wichita State...

Wichita State and Miami have met just once prior to this year's matchup, with that being a 3-0 decision in favor of the Hurricanes on Aug. 31, 2002. The Shockers advanced to the second round of last year's NCAA Tournament before falling to Iowa State.

The Shockers return three starters from that tournament team that ended the year 26-7

overall. Middle blocker Sarah McGee returns after registering 297 kills and 146 blocks last year. Also back is starting setter Mary Elizabeth Hooper, who handed out a team-best 1,335 assists (11.22 aps). Sarah Waldorf is the other starter back for the Shockers, while a key returnee is Lindsey Eckenrode, who ended the 2009 season with 283 kills from her outside hitter position.

Quick Hits on Oklahoma...

This will be third meeting all-time between the University of Oklahoma and Miami in volleyball. The series stands even at 1-1, with the last match coming in favor of the 'Canes back in 1979.

The Sooners finished last year with a record of 18-12 (11-9 Big 12), and advanced to the first round of the NCAA Tournament, before falling to the University of Southern California.

The Sooners five-of-six starters from last year's squad, including libero Maria Fernanda who led the team with 489 digs (4.49 dps). Also back is right side/outside hitter Suzy Boulavsky, the leading kills specialist from 2009, leading the Sooners with 320 (3.08 kps). Setter Brianne Barker is also back after recording 1,031 assists a year ago.

A Rising Sun...

After just one season, sophomore setter/right side hitter Nrithya Sundararaman has placed herself among the top 10 at UM for assists, serving as setter for most of the 2009 campaign. Last year, Sundararaman collected a team-best 934 assists, placing her fourth all-time at Miami after just one

season in orange and green.

Season-Openers Under Lantagne Welch...

Under Nicole Lantagne Welch, the Hurricanes are 7-2 in season-opening matches, including seven of the last eight—with the lone exception in that stretch being a 3-2 loss at the hands of Hofstra in 2007 as part of the Orange and Green Challenge in Coral Gables.

Gallagher Granted Medical Waiver...

After missing almost all of the 200 season with injury, setter Katie Gallagher is back this season after receiving a medical hardship waiver from the NCAA. Gallagher is listed as a redshirt junior, and will have two more years for the Hurricanes.

The Road More Travelled...

Seven of Miami's first eight matches of the year will be on the road, so to speak, with tournaments in Oklahoma and Tennessee, respectively. Miami will open with three matches at the *Nike Invitational*, and then enjoy a brief home match against Florida Atlantic (Aug. 31), before taking back to the road for four matches at the *Blue Raider Bash* hosted by Middle Tennessee State University.

Nicole Lantagne Welch is beginning her 10th season as head coach of the University of Miami volleyball program. Under her guidance since 2001, the team has posted winning records in seven of the

last nine seasons, including a second-place finish in the team's first year in ACC play in 2004.

In 2009, Lantagne Welch helped the Hurricanes to their second NCAA Tournament appearance, competing in the Gainesville [Fla.] Regional. UM earned an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament after holding the 33rd toughest schedule in the nation according to the end-of-year RPI rankings. Earlier in the season, Lantagne Welch guided the Hurricanes to the Hampton Inn & Suites Northern Colorado Classic championship.

She would add to her growing list of All-Atlantic Coast Conference student-athletes, as well as All-America performers, seeing senior libero Cassie Loessberg and sophomore outside hitter Lane Carico named to both lists. Carico and Loessberg each collected AVCA All-America Honorable Mention selections, while both were tabbed to the AVCA All-East Region Team.

During the 2008 campaign, Lantagne Welch led the Hurricanes to a tie for third place in the Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) standings, and the team's best regular season record since 2002. During the year, Lantagne Welch collected her 150th career victory when the 'Canes defeated NC State, 3-0, on November 21, 2008. It was just two seasons ago that she posted her 100th career victory in the 2006 season-opener for UM with a 3-2 win over Alabama.



The 2008 season was special for UM as the team posted a record of 26-6 overall (14-6 ACC), finishing just one match shy of tying for an ACC Championship. Not to be overlooked was Lantagne Welch leading the 'Canes to three in-season tournament titles, including a tournament title at NCAA Tournament participant University of San Francisco as part of the Asics/Coca-Cola Invitational in San Francisco, Calif.

For those achievements and more, Lantagne Welch was tabbed ACC Coach of the Year, as well as American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) East Region Coach of the Year. It was her first ACC coaching honor, while being the second AVCA Regional honor, collecting the award in 2002 during Miami's historic run to the Round of 16 in the NCAA Tournament.

Under her guidance, Lantagne Welch would later see freshman Lane Carico named ACC Freshman of the Year, as well as AVCA East Region Freshman of the Year. Carico would go on to be named to the All-ACC Second Team, as well as teammates Angelica Ellis and Genny Mayhew. Carico would represent the first-ever ACC Freshman of the Year coached by Lantagne Welch, while Ellis and Mayhew would become the seventh and eighth players in school history to be named to the All-ACC Volleyball Team.

Overall, her career at UM is highlighted in part by three seasons with at least 20 wins (2003-04, '08) and a trip to the "Sweet 16" in the Hurricanes' first-ever appearance at the NCAA Tournament in 2002. In her nine years at the helm in Coral Gables, Lantagne Welch has averaged 18.8 wins per seasons with a career record of 169-100.

While new records were set during the 2007 campaign, the 2008 and 2009 seasons, respectively, saw even those achievements mastered as Lantagne Welch and her staff assembled one of the best marks in school history. Lantagne Welch led Miami to its best ACC record in school history. It was also the second-best record in school history on the Division I level of athletics.

Katie Gallagher moved in sole possession of second place all-time at UM for assists in a career during the 2008 season, while Cassie Loessberg would go on to become Miami's all-time leader in digs in 2009, departing from UM with 2,008 career digs. In addition, Loessberg broke her own school record from a year ago for digs in a single-season, upping the new record to 584—besting her old school-record mark by more than 20 digs.

Though missing most of the season due to injury, senior outside hitter Genny Mayhew became just the fifth Hurricanes performer in school history to collect 1,000 kills in her career. Mayhew departed from UM sitting fourth all-time in kills (1,018).

During the 2009 season, Maria Andersson and Lane Carico were selected to the All-ACC Academic Team, while helping UM to its second ever appearance to the NCAA Tournament [Gainesville Regional].

In 2008, Gallagher etched her name once again as one of the Top 10 single-season assists leaders in school history. Already sitting at third place in school history from the 2007 season where she collected 1,243 assists, Gallagher added to that total with 1,202 in 2008—good

enough for sixth place all-time in school history. Gallagher enters the 2010 season with 2,744 assists, still second all-time at UM for career assists.

Also during the 2008 season, Lane Carico broke the freshman record for kills in a single-season for UM with 369, adding her name to 10th all-time for single-season kills. In 2009, Carico went on to set a new sophomore record for kills in a season, putting down 402 for the year. Additionally in 2008, Miami tied a school-record for hitting percentage in a five-set match, collecting a .329 percentage at Florida State on Nov. 26, 2008. The 'Canes would also collect the second-best single-set hitting mark in school history with a .615 clip against Boston College in the third set on Oct. 10, 2008.

Lantagne Welch would see four more student-athletes graduate following the 2009 season. Maria Andersson, Cassie Loessberg, Genny Mayhew and Griffin Udelson earned their degrees from UM.

In 2008, Ashley Woods placed her name eighth all-time in sets played (367), as well as eighth place all-time in total attacks (1,764). Ellis now ranks ninth in attacks (1,209), while also collecting the third-highest individual single-season hitting percentage (.350) from the 2008 campaign. Overall, Ellis is third in school history in career hitting percentage with a .275 clip through 318 sets and 1,209 attacks. Woods is tied for fifth in career hitting percentage, holding a .256 clip, sitting alongside Ciara Michel (2004-07).

Lantagne Welch also coached three All-ACC Second Team members in 2008 with Lane Carico, Angelica Ellis and Genny Mayhew. In addition, Carico and Ellis were each named as AVCA All-America honorable mention, while Carico was selected the 2008 AVCA East Region Freshman of the Year. Carico was also the true definition of "student-athlete" as she was named to the All-ACC Academic Team.

Miami's team accomplishments under the guidance of Lantagne Welch in 2008 were plentiful as the Hurricanes posted the first-ever sweep of the Duke Blue Devils, as well as finishing in a tie for third place in the final league standings—the second-best finish for the Hurricanes in their ACC history. The 14-6 ACC record was the best conference record in Miami's five-year ACC volleyball history.

In 2002, she married Wesley Paul Welch of Denver City, Texas, in her hometown of Encinitas, Calif. On Dec. 7, 2004, the couple celebrated the birth of their daughter, Riley Jaye and on April 8, 2007, son Ayden Fletcher was born. Lantagne Welch and her family reside in Miami.

Hurricanes VB Media Policy

KNIGHT SPORTS COMPLEX

Press row for University of Miami volleyball matches is located on the north side of the court at the James L. Knight Sports Complex, across from the team benches. The media entrance to the arena is from the southwest corner of the Complex, and the southwest entrance is also used for Will Call pick-up of credentials. Parking is located in either the lot for Mark Light Field, or Cobb Stadium directly adjacent to the Knight Sports Complex.

MEDIA & PHOTO PASSES

Credentials for Hurricanes home matches are issued for working media only and must be requested through the sports media relations office at least 24 hours prior to the selected home event you wish to attend. Credentials are issued on a match-by-match basis and a formal request must be issued to the Miami Sports Media Relations Office. Only photographers on assignment from an accredited media agency will be issued credentials. Photographers are required to abide by the guidelines set forth by the NCAA on shooting limitations from the sidelines. Those not complying with the guidelines may be removed.

MEDIA SERVICES

Pregame media supplements including notes, statistics, media guides and gameday programs will be available prior to the start of the first set. Between-game and final statistics, plus a running play-by-play and post game notes will be provided. Final statistics will be emailed and/or faxed via Miami's broadcast system following the conclusion of the match. In-game questions or concerns can be addressed on press row by Assistant Sports Media Relations Director Bryan J. Harvey.

WEBSITES

As a general rule, fan-based web sites containing at least one or more of the following: chat rooms, message boards, recruiting information, scouting reports and links to news sites, as well as other fan-based features shall not be issued credentials to Miami volleyball matches. Local and national organizations that maintain a news-based web site in connection with their regular newspaper or magazine, as well as radio or television broadcast, shall be issued credentials on a match-by-match basis. Live, real-time updates will not be permitted. Fan-based web sites wishing to discuss coverage and credential options should contact the Office of Sports Media Relations at (305) 284-3244.

INTERVIEWS

Following home games, Miami head coach Nicole Lantagne Welch will return to the court to handle any media questions, and players will also be available after a brief cooling-off period following the match's conclusion. Miami's locker will be closed at all times.

TELEPHONES

Telephone lines at the Knight Sports Complex are limited to home radio and the visiting teams' "official" sports administrator/media relations contact. All media wishing to file stories should contact Bryan J. Harvey prior to the conclusion of the match in order to make arrangements to be escorted back to the Office of Sports Media Relations in order to work in a work-friendly environment. Any and all questions will be addressed in this designated area.

Carico Breaking the Records...

After being named to the All-ACC and All-AVCA East Region Team back-to-back years, junior outside hitter Lane Carico also broke more Miami class records as a sophomore—including kills and kills per set. She already holds the freshman record for both categories from the 2008 season in which she was named ACC Freshman of the Year and AVCA East Region Freshman of the Year.

Newcomers All Around...

According to 10th-year head coach Nicole Lantagne Welch, this year's class of seven newcomers may-well be the most she's ever brought in at one time in her tenure in Coral Gables. Two of the newcomers are Under Armour All-America honorable mentions—Alex Johnson (Tallahassee, Fla.) and Julia Giampaolo (Torrington, Conn.).

The other newcomers include Hannah Coleman, Taylor Hollins, Mariel Schofield, Ryan Shaffer and Emani Sims... all of whom will battle for playing time right from the start. Lantagne Welch thinks this year's team could be one of the deepest she's had in recent years.

Two Former 'Canes Playing Pro...

Two former Hurricanes teammates, Ashley Woods (2005-08) and Ciara Michel (2004-07), both signed professional contracts in 2010, adding to the growing list of players to play professionally from UM.

Woods played with Club Voleibol in Benidorm, Spain, finishing her UM career ranked in the top 10 in seven categories. Meanwhile, Michel recently signed a contract taking her talents to Alemannia Aachen, a member of Germany's 14-team national first league, Bundesliga. At UM, Michel established herself sixth all-time in kills (962), seventh in total attempts (1,993) and 10th in kills per set (2.24).

UM Present on All-ACC Preseason Team...

Junior outside hitter Lane Carico and senior middle blocker Lici McGee were named to the Preseason All-ACC Team representing the Hurricanes. McGee had a breakthrough season in 2009, ending the year ranked seventh in the league in blocks (117), while finishing second on the UM squad for total points (312) with 371 kills added to her 117 total blocks. Meanwhile, Carico led the ACC in kills (506), while leading UM in kills per set average (4.36). She currently holds records for kills in a single-season by both a freshman – finishing with 369 in 2008, and a sophomore with her total from the 2009 campaign.

Duke Predicted to Finish First in ACC Volleyball Standings...

Florida State, the defending regular season champion, and Duke, the 2009 runner-up, were predicted by the league's head coaches to win the 2010 Atlantic Coast Conference volleyball championship.

Florida State and Duke each totaled 108 points out of a possible 121, while the Seminoles collected five first-place votes to the Blue Devils' four. First place votes were awarded 11 points, second place received 10 points, etc. Coaches were not allowed to include their own team in their predicted order of finish.

The top four teams were separated by just 16 points. Receiving the final three first-place votes was Georgia Tech,
