## RIVALRY WEEKEND STORY LINES & NEWS

- No. 6 Miami welcomes in-state rival and top-ranked Florida to Mark Light Field for the annual rivalry series Feb. 26-28.
- Miami is ranked in the top 10 of every major college baseball poll. The Hurricanes check in at No. 4 in *Collegiate Baseball Newspaper*, No. 5 in NCBWA and No. 6 in the USA Today Coaches Poll, *Baseball America* & D1Baseball.
- The Hurricanes made their 24th trip to the College World Series in 2015, finishing with a 50-17 record and a 22-8 mark in ACC play. Miami was the No. 5 national seed for the postseason, and won its second straight ACC Coastal Division title.
- The two teams played each other five times in 2015, including the first two meetings ever in the College World Series.
- Miami leads the all-time series against Florida by a 127-114-1 margin; UM won the series last time as hosts in 2014.
- The Hurricanes' rotation combined for a 0.50 ERA on Opening Weekend, allowing one run in 18 combined innings.
- Miami returns several hitters from an offense that ranked No. 1 nationwide in runs scored in 2015, including Preseason All-America Zack Collins, two-time All-ACC outfielder Willie Abreu and CWS All-Tournament selection Jacob Heyward.
- Head coach Jim Morris entered 2016 with the sixth-most wins in Division I history (1,485) and the fourth-most among active skippers. With 20 more wins in 2016, Morris will move into fifth place in all-time Division I wins (Larry Hays, 1,508).
- In a preseason poll of ACC head coaches, the Hurricanes were picked to win the ACC Coastal Division in 2016.

**THE HURRICANES SKIPPER**

It doesn't matter if his roster is full of rookies or veterans, University of Miami head coach Jim Morris continues to produce some of college baseball's most consistent and dominant teams in his 23rd season in Coral Gables. With a talented staff around him, Morris' Hurricanes are continually the class of collegiate baseball, having won national titles in 1999 and 2001 and the ACC Baseball Regular Season Championship in both 2008 and 2014.

In his 22-season tenure at Miami, no program has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament a college baseball-record 43 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 12 of Morris' 22 seasons in Coral Gables - including most recently in 2015, when Miami was awarded the No. 5 national seed heading into the NCAA postseason.

Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris has won 16 of 22 NCAA Regional appearances at UM, including a record 13-straight to start his tenure in Coral Gables. His teams have qualified for NCAA Regionals for the last 31 years - 22 at Miami and nine at Georgia Tech.

A three-time national coach of the year and 2008 Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year, Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 985-405-3 (.706) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,489-649-4 (.694) Division I record in 33 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 37 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,620-690-4 (.698) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 22 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium's renovation prior to its reopening in 2009.

In 2015, Morris led the Hurricanes to their second straight ACC Coastal Division title, the 24th College World Series appearance in program history, and reached the 50-win mark for the 12th time in his 22 seasons.

Morris entered 2015 as among the winningest active coaches in Division I baseball with 1,435 wins. He wasted little time in moving up the record books, moving into sole possession of eighth place in all-time wins (1,439) on Feb. 15 with a 25-4 win over Rutgers and then seventh place with a 9-5 win over Louisville on March 7 (1,445).

Miami captured the 2014 ACC Regular Season Championship under his watch, recording 24 wins in conference play for the first time in program history. The conference win total set a new record for the program and tied the ACC's all-time single-season win total.

Morris reached two coaching milestones in the first half of the 2014 season. He became just the eighth Division I coach to reach 1,400 wins in a 5-2 win over Boston College on March 8, and won his 900th game at Miami in a 7-1 upset of No. 3 Virginia on March 22. The Hurricanes, who have never missed the Atlantic Coast Conference Championship since joining the ACC in 2004, qualified for their 10th straight conference tournament under Morris and earned a Regional host spot for their 42nd consecutive postseason trip.



Morris has reached a number of other coaching milestones in his time in Coral Gables. His 1,000th Division-I game on April 4, 2004, at his old stomping grounds at Georgia Tech. He also achieved another milestone during the 2004 season, winning his 500th game at the helm of the Miami program. Morris' 500th win came just a few weeks following his 1,000th overall win as a Division-I head coach by beating Florida State 7-3 on April 17.

Over 150 professional baseball players have played under Morris during their college careers at Miami, Georgia Tech and DeKalb.

Among the players Morris coached at Miami that went on to play in the Major Leagues were Ryan Braun (Milwaukee), Pat Burrell (Tampa Bay), Alex Cora (New York Mets), Bobby Hill (San Diego), Aubrey Huff (Detroit), Chris Perez (Cleveland), Cesar Carrillo (San Diego), Brian Barton (St. Louis), Gaby Sanchez (Florida), Charlton Jimerson (Houston), Jay Tessmer (New York Yankees), and Danny Graves (Cincinnati) and Jason Michaels (Houston). Several more Hurricanes during the Morris tenure are right on the cusp of making the show, including Mike Rodriguez (Houston), David Gil (Cincinnati) and Jon Jay (St. Louis). Standout players under Morris from his days at Georgia Tech were Nomar Garciaparra (Los Angeles Dodgers), Jay Payton (Oakland A's) and Jason Varitek (Boston Red Sox).

Morris has also enjoyed success on the International scene. From 1989-90, Morris served as head coach of the USA Baseball team that won a Silver Medal in the 1989 Presidential Cup (Taiwan), Bronze Medal at the Goodwill Games and the 1990 International Baseball Association (IBA) World All-Star Game in Atlanta.

### CANES AND GATORS RESUME RIVALRY

• Sixth-ranked Miami welcomes top-ranked Florida to Mark Light Field for a weekend series beginning Friday, Feb. 26. Game times are 7 p.m., 7 p.m. & 1 p.m., and the whole series will be carried on ESPN3.

• The Canes played five games against Florida in 2015, including the first two ever contests at the College World Series, and finished 1-4. But UM took the series from the UF in its last trip to The Light in 2014, winning Game 1 (6-4) & Game 2 (5-2), but falling in Game 3 (4-6).

• The Gators, under the direction of head coach Kevin O'Sullivan, are 5-0 to start the year, including a pair of midweek wins against Eastern Michigan and a weekend sweep of FGCU in Gainesville, Fla.

• Both Miami and Florida overcame late deficits in midweek games to stay unbeaten; the Gators trailed entering the ninth against Eastern Michigan on Wednesday, while Miami trailed St. Thomas in the ninth.

• The last two games of the series will be carried on ESPN3 in both English and Spanish, the first two college baseball games ever carried on ESPN3 in Spanish. Roly Martin & Bobby Salamanca are on the call.

### FAMILIAR FOE

• The Hurricanes played the Gators five times in 2015, and the two teams have faced off 242 times in history, with Miami leading the all time series 127-114-1.

• Among Miami's top current performers against the Gators over their careers are junior closer Bryan Garcia (five appearances, 7.0 innings, 1.29 ERA, eight strikeouts, two saves), junior slugger Zack Collins (two home runs, six RBI) and senior starter Thomas Woodrey (8.2 innings, five hits, two runs, 1.04 ERA).

• Woodrey, who started Game 2 of the 2015 series in Gainesville but did not pitch against UF in Omaha, went 6.2 innings and allowed just one earned run and five hits in the 7-2 win on Feb. 21, 2015.

• The first hit of Collins' career was a 3-R home run vs. UF in 2014.

### OPENING WEEKEND SWEEP

• Led by dominant performances from the starting rotation, Miami opened its 2016 season with a sweep of visiting Rutgers.

• Lefthanders Thomas Woodrey (5 IP, 1 ER), Michael Mediavilla (6 IP, 0 R, 7 K) and Danny Garcia (7 IP, 0 R, 4 K) combined for a 0.50 ERA with two walks and 15 strikeouts in 18 innings of work.

• Junior Johnny Ruiz led the offense with a .667 (6-for-9) average against the Scarlet Knights.

### HIGH EXPECTATIONS

• Miami was ranked in the top 10 in preseason polls from nearly every major college baseball outlet, including a No. 4 ranking from Collegiate Baseball Newspaper and a No. 6 ranking from Baseball America, D1Baseball.com, NCBWA and the USA Today Coaches Poll.

• The Hurricanes, who have won back-to-back ACC Coastal Division titles, were projected to once again win the division in 2016 in a preseason poll of ACC head coaches.

• Miami's preseason ranking of No. 4 from Collegiate Baseball Newspaper is its highest from the publication since 2005; its No. 6 ranking from Baseball America is its highest from BA since 2007.

• The Hurricanes are ranked as high as No. 4 (CBN) and as low as No. 9 (Perfect Game), but are in the top 10 of every poll.

**MAKING AN EARLY MARK**

- Among Hurricanes delivering offensively in the team's 4-0 start: junior **Zack Collins** (.400 average, .684 on-base percentage, eight walks), junior **Johnny Ruiz** (team-high .538 average, team-high seven RBI) and junior **Willie Abreu** (.385 average, five hits, one homer).
- Those who have impressed on the mound include all three starting pitchers, freshman reliever **Frankie Bartow** (three appearances, 5.0 innings, 0.00 ERA two hits allowed), closer **Bryan Garcia** (0.00 ERA, two saves) and junior sidewinder **Cooper Hammond** (three appearances, 2.1 innings, 0.00 ERA).
- Five Hurricanes have made their debuts in the field - freshman third baseman **Romy Gonzalez**, junior infielder **Randy Batista**, redshirt freshman outfielder **Ryan Alvarez**, junior outfielder **Barry Buchowski**, junior catcher **Joe Gomez**.
- Gonzalez (.267, three doubles) is the only newcomer to **have started all four games**. He has at least one hit in all four contests.
- Three Hurricanes made career-first appearances on the hill: Bartow, freshman **Andrew Cabezas** and redshirt freshman **Keven Pimentel**.

**CLIMBING UP THE RECORD BOOKS**

- Miami closer Bryan Garcia entered the year with the **fifth-most saves in Miami history**, and recorded saves in back-to-back games against Rutgers to open the year.
- Garcia is chasing the **all-time record for saves in a career**, which is **39** - held by **George Huguet** (2001-2004). Garcia's 15 saves as a freshman in 2014 tied for the **seventh-most in a single season**.
- Garcia needs **two more saves** to tie **Danny Graves** (1992-94 for fourth (29), seven more to tie **Robbie Morrison** (1996-98) for third (34), 10 more to tie **Rick Raether** (1984-86) for second (37) and is 12 behind **Huguet** for first.

**DESTINATION: OMAHA**

- Miami made its return to the **College World Series in 2015**, marking the program's first trip to Omaha, Neb., since **2008**. Miami's **24** College World Series trips are the **second-most of any program** in the country.
- The Hurricanes have won **48 games** in the College World Series, the **fourth-most** of any program nationwide; Miami's **four national championships** (1982, 1985, 1999, 2001) rank **fifth-most**.
- Since the NCAA began award national seeds prior to the 1999 season, Miami has been **among the top eight six seasons: 1999 (#1), 2001 (#2), 2003 (#8), 2004 (#3), 2008 (#1) and 2015 (#5)**.

**LOOKING FOR A THREE-PEAT**

- Miami won its **second straight ACC Coastal Division title** in 2015, posting a **22-8 record in ACC play** to earn the division crown.
- The Hurricanes, who were picked to win the ACC Coastal Division once again in 2016, have won **46 ACC games over the past two seasons** - the **second-best two-year stretch by any program since ACC expanded to a 30-game conference schedule** prior to 2005.
- Miami has won the ACC Regular Season Championship twice, most recently in **2014** when the Canes finished **24-6**; the Hurricanes won the **ACC regular season crown & ACC Tournament in 2008**.

- Both players have earned All-America recognition in their two-year Hurricane careers; Collins was a **third-team ABCA/Rawlings All America** choice last season, while Garcia was a **NCBWA third-team All American** after his freshman year in 2014.
