THE OPENING TIP

• Duke will look for its fourth ACC road victory of the year when it visits Miami on Monday. Both teams' staffs will wear sneakers for the contest in support of Coaches vs. Cancer.

• Mike Krzyzewski has won a league-record 166 ACC road games during his tenure at Duke. The Blue Devils are 110-49 (.692) in ACC road games since the 1996-97 season.

• Duke employs one of the nation's most lethal offensive attacks, ranking fifth in the NCAA in scoring offense (85.7) and second in the country in adjusted offensive efficiency (122.7).

• Duke averages 8.9 three-pointers per game overall and 9.4 per game in ACC play, both of which lead the league. Matt Jones leads Duke and ranks third in the ACC in threes per game (2.5) overall.

• On the offensive end, Duke features two of the top three scorers in ACC play, as Grayson Allen (19.7) ranks second and Brandon Ingram (19.6) ranks third in league play.

• Among ACC freshmen in all games this season, Ingram ranks first in three-point percentage (.419) and second in scoring (17.1), three per game (2.2), blocks (1.6) and steals (1.4).

• Duke has made 370 free throws this season, tied for fifth-most among major conference teams. Luke Kennard leads the nation with a .926 free throw percentage, which would set a new Duke freshman record.

• Duke ranks ninth nationally in turnover average (10.1) and sixth in offensive turnover percentage (14.4 percent). Jones and Allen have assist-to-turnover ratios of 2.32 and 2.14, respectively.

• Marshall Plumlee is averaging a career-best 2.0 blocks per contest, which is tied for fourth in the ACC and ranks 48th nationally.

111TH SEASON OF BASKETBALL

- The 2015-16 campaign marks the 111th season of Duke basketball. The Blue Devils have compiled a 2,076-858 record in that span to rank fourth all-time in victories.
- Only Kentucky (2,193), Kansas (2,168) and North Carolina (2,157) have more wins through Jan. 23.
- Duke's all-time .707 winning percentage is the fourth-best in NCAA history, behind only Kentucky (.764), North Carolina (.736) and Kansas (.722) through Jan. 23.

COACH 1K

- Mike Krzyzewski owns a 1,033-315 (.766) record over 40-plus seasons as a head coach, including a 960-256 (.789) mark at Duke (35-plus seasons).
- Coach K became the first men's coach in Division I college basketball to record 1,000 career victories with a 77-68 win over St. John's on Jan. 25, 2015 at Madison Square Garden.
- Krzyzewski has also won a record 437 ACC games (regular season and tournament), having passed Dean Smith (422) on Feb. 4, 2015.
- Coach K owns 960 of Duke's 2,076 all-time wins, translating to 46.2 percent of the wins in the history of Duke men's basketball.

UNRIVALED LONGEVITY

- Mike Krzyzewski led Duke to its fifth NCAA championship in 2015, extending his own record for length of time between a coach's first and most recent national title to 25 years.
- Coach K and Connecticut's Jim Calhoun are the only coaches in NCAA history to win national championships in three decades: the 1990s, the 2000s and the 2010s.

INTERNATIONAL EXCELLENCE

- Having previously announced that the 2016 Rio Olympics will be his last as head coach of the U.S. Men's National Team, Mike Krzyzewski will transition to the role of special advisor to USA Basketball for the 2017-20 quadrennium.
- Krzyzewski has been on the staffs of 14 different USA Basketball teams, compiling a 125-7 (.947) record and 14 medals (10 gold).
- As a head coach with USA Basketball, he has a 94-7 (.931) record with 10 teams, claiming six golds among his 10 medals.
- Krzyzewski has guided the U.S. Men's National Team to a 75-1 (.987) record, including an active 63-game winning streak, and six total medals (five gold).

AMONG NATION'S BEST OFFENSES

- With an average of 85.7 points per game, Duke ranks second in the ACC and fifth nationally in scoring offense.
- Duke's scoring average of 85.7 points per game is the third-best mark among teams from the six major conferences.

A LEADER IN OFFENSIVE EFFICIENCY

- Duke currently ranks second nationally in adjusted offensive efficiency (points scored per 100 possessions) at 122.7.
- The Blue Devils are the only team to finish in the nation's top 10 in adjusted offensive efficiency in each of the last seven years.

BALL SECURITY A STRENGTH

- Despite playing three freshmen in its six-man rotation, Duke ranks ninth nationally with an average of just 10.1 turnovers per game.
- The Blue Devils turn the ball over on just 14.4 percent of their offensive possessions, the sixth-best rate in the country.
- Duke's five primary ballhandlers (Allen, Ingram, Jones, Kennard and Thornton) have combined for a 1.67 assist-to-turnover ratio (241:144) and combined to average just 7.1 turnovers per game.

• On the season, Duke averages 8.9 three-point field goals per game and that number bumps up to 9.4 in league play. Both averages lead the ACC.

• Since **Amile Jefferson's** injury, three-pointers have accounted for 34.1 percent of the team's scoring, up from 27.5 percent prior to his injury.

• Duke makes less three-pointers in wins (8.8) than it does in losses (9.2), but shoots a better percentage from beyond the arc in victories (.393 vs. .362).

EARNING SECOND CHANCES

• Behind a combined 5.0 offensive rebounds per game from **Brandon Ingram** and **Marshall Plumlee**, Duke is rebounding 36.6 percent of its own misses to rank 27th nationally in offensive rebound percentage.

• Individually, Plumlee grabs 13.0 percent of Duke's misses while on the floor, while Ingram checks in at 6.0 percent.

• On the season, Duke averages 13.7 second-chance points per game and has an average +1.7 margin in second-chance points per contest.

PROTECTING THE RIM

• Duke is averaging 5.4 blocks per game in 2015-16 after swatting just 3.8 per game a year ago, thanks to **Marshall Plumlee** and his team-leading 2.0 blocks per game (fourth in the ACC).

• As a team, Duke ranks 24th nationally in blocks per game. The Blue Devils' best final national ranking in blocks per game this decade is 89th (4.0) in 2011-12.

• **Brandon Ingram** ranks eighth in the ACC and second among ACC freshmen with an average of 1.6 blocks per game. His 31 total blocks rank 10th on Duke's freshman chart.

GETTING TO THE LINE

• Duke ranks 15th nationally in free throws made (370) and 19th in free throw attempts (512).

• Duke's 370 makes from the rank fifth among major conference teams this season.

• Duke, which averages only 17.0 personal fouls per game, has made 370 free throws while its opponents have only attempted 315 this season.

• Duke has a 42.2 free throw rate on the year, which measures how often a team scores from the line as opposed to the field. The Blue Devils were at 39.8 percent a year ago.

• The Blue Devils are shooting .723 from the line this season, a 2.4-percent improvement over last year's mark of .699.
