- 1 Saturday's matchup with Bethune-Cookman begins the 90th season of Miami football.
- 2 UM holds a 7-0 all-time mark in home openers at Sun Life Stadium, outscoring opponents 267-53 - with an average margin of victory of 30.6 points.
- 3 Miami owns a 83-57-1 record against the eight different teams it has faced from the state of Florida in school history.
- 4 Brad Kaaya was one of only 15 quarterbacks in 2014 to throw for more than 3,000 yards, 26-or-more touchdowns and 12-or-fewer interceptions.
- 5 Miami ranked No. 14 nationally in total defense in 2014, allowing an average of just 329.6 yards per game - the fourth-best mark in the ACC.

HOME, SWEET HOME OPENERS

- The Miami Hurricanes open their eighth season at Sun Life Stadium on Sept. 5 vs. Bethune-Cookman; UM holds a **7-0 all-time in home openers at Sun Life Stadium**, outscoring opponents **267-53** - with an average margin of victory of **30.6 points**.
- The Hurricanes have not lost a home opener since **2006**, when they fell to Florida State 13-10 at the Orange Bowl (9/4/2006); Miami has won **eight straight home openers since**.
- Since the start of the 2001 season, UM has opened **seven times at home** and **seven times away from home**; the Hurricanes are **6-1** in those home games.
- Since joining the ACC prior to the 2004 season, Miami has played a **conference opponent in only three of its 12 home openers**: Florida State in 2004 & 2006 and Georgia Tech in 2009 - UM is **2-1** in those games.
- Miami has played Bethune-Cookman twice in history (2011, 2012) but **never in a home opener**.
- In its 2014 home opener, Miami topped Florida A&M **41-7** (9/6/2014); UM scored touchdowns on **four of its first six possessions**, including the first two career home TD passes for Brad Kaaya.
- In the modern era of Miami Hurricanes football (since 1979), UM has **opened the season at home 15 times** and is **13-2** in those games, with losses coming only in 1985 and 2006. Miami is **27-9 in regular season openers** dating back to the start of the 1979 season.

SUNSHINE STATE DOMINANCE

- In the 89 seasons of Miami football, the Hurricanes have made a habit of winning against their in-state rivals. Miami holds a 83-57-1 all-time record against teams from the state of Florida.
- Miami will face three opponents from the state of Florida this year in the form of Bethune-Cookman, FAU and Florida State.
- In addition, Miami holds a winning record against every school in the state of Florida.

DEFENSIVE MENTALITY

- Miami ranked **No. 14 nationally in total defense in 2014**, allowing an average of just 329.6 yards per game - the fourth-best mark in the ACC.
- Of the 12 FBS teams on Miami's 2014 schedule, the Hurricanes defense held **11 of them under their season average on offense**. Miami's defense held teams to an average of **81.0 yards** under their respective season averages, all while facing the **ninth-toughest schedule** in the country.
- Miami's defensive yards allowed (compared to respective offense averages): 341 vs. Louisville (**53.7** yards under season average), 329 vs. Arkansas State (**-147.5**), 264 vs. Duke (**-134.3**), 371 vs. Georgia Tech (**-105.5**), 422 vs. Cincinnati (**-38.2**), 262 vs. Virginia Tech (**-103.3**), 258 vs. North Carolina (**-171.8**), 418 vs. Florida State (**-23.4**), 341 vs. Virginia (**-33.3**), 360 vs. Pittsburgh (**-75.4**) vs. South Carolina (**-89.4**)
- The only offense that Miami's defense did NOT hold under its season average was Nebraska, who totaled 456 yards - just 3.7 yards over their season average of 452.3.
- The average FBS offense averaged **408.9 yards** in 2014; Miami's defense allowed that total (or more) to only three teams, despite facing eight teams whose offenses ranked in the top-50 in total offense. The season high in yards allowed was 456 to Nebraska.
- Miami's 2014 opponent ranks in total offense: Georgia Tech #19, Arkansas State #20, Cincinnati #27, Nebraska #31, South Carolina #33, Florida State #35, Pittsburgh #40, North Carolina #45, Duke #66, Louisville #69, Virginia #87 and Virginia Tech #96.



YIPPEE KAAYA

- Sophomore quarterback **Brad Kaaya** was named the 2014 Atlantic Coast Conference Offensive and ACC Overall Rookie of the Year after a stellar first campaign with the Hurricanes.
- Kaaya ranked second in the Atlantic Coast Conference in passing yards (**3,198**), and led the ACC in passing touchdowns (**26**), passing efficiency (**145.9**) and passing yards per completion (**14.5**).
- Kaaya finished the year by throwing for **13 touchdowns and just three interceptions** in the final seven weeks of the season.
- The California native was one of only **15 quarterbacks in the country** to throw for more than 3,000 yards, 26-or-more touchdowns and 12-or-fewer interceptions; he was the **only true freshman quarterback in the country** to accomplish this feat.
- Kaaya threw for **more than 200 yards** in nine of the Canes' 13 games in 2014.
- Kaaya threw for a **Miami freshman-record 359 yards** at Nebraska (9/20/2014).
- Kaaya threw a touchdown pass in every game during the 2014 season. **Listed below is the longest active streak of FBS quarterbacks that have thrown at least one touchdown pass:**

ONES TO WATCH

- Sophomore quarterback **Brad Kaaya** was among four Hurricanes named to major college football award preseason watch lists entering the 2015 season.
- Kaaya led all Hurricanes with three separate major award watch list nominations: the **Maxwell Award** (College Player of the Year), the **Manning Award** (top quarterback) and the **Davey O'Brien National Quarterback Award**.
- Senior linebacker **Raphael Kirby** was named to the watch list for the **Butkus Award**, honoring the nation's top linebacker.
- Junior punter **Justin Vogel** was named to the watch list for the **Ray Guy Award**, honoring the nation's top punter.
- Senior safety **Dallas Crawford** was named to the watch list for the **Wuerffel Trophy**, known as "College Football's Premier Award for Community Service."

10 CANES NAMED PRESEASON ALL-ACC BY PHIL STEELE

- Miami had 10 players featured on the Phil Steele Preseason All-ACC Teams, headlined by four second-team selections: wide receiver Stacy Coley, linebackers Raphael Kirby & Jermaine Grace, and punter Justin Vogel.
- Running back Joseph Yearby, offensive guard Danny Isidora, defensive lineman Chad Thomas and safety Deon Bush each earned a place on Phil Steele's Preseason All-ACC third team.
- Sophomore quarterback Brad Kaaya and wide receiver Braxton Berrios were fourth-team choices.

OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION

- Miami's offense of the past two seasons, both under the direction of offensive coordinator James Coley, have ranked among the **most explosive in program history**.
- Miami's **5,594 yards of total offense** in 2014 were the **second-most in program history**, trailing only the 6,074 yards gained in 2002.
- UM compiled **5,536 total yards in 2013**, which ranks as the third-best total in history.
- Miami's 2012 total of **5,282 ranks as the seventh-best**, meaning three of the top seven marks in program history have been achieved during Al Golden's tenure as head coach.

THE CAPTAINS

- Three Miami Hurricanes were chosen as team captains prior to the start of the 2015 season: sophomore quarterback **Brad Kaaya**, senior linebacker **Raphael Kirby** and senior defensive back **Dallas Crawford**. A fourth team captain will rotate weekly during the 2015 season.

THE SPECIALIST

- After spending the 2013 season with the University of Florida, walk-on sophomore punter **Justin Vogel** made a big impact with the Hurricanes' special teams unit.
- In 2014, Vogel averaged 42.8 yards per punt and 62.1 yards on kickoffs. The Tampa native was named third-team All-ACC by the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association (ACSM) for his outstanding performance.
- Vogel dropped **42.9 percent of his punts (21) inside the 20-yard line**, which led the nation.

SUN LIFE STADIUM RENOVATIONS FOR 2015

- The modernization of Sun Life Stadium is moving ahead, and Miami Hurricanes football season ticket holders will experience a new game-day environment and amenities with the kickoff of the 2015 season.
- Sun Life Stadium has been remodeled and redesigned into a state-of-the-art sporting venue with enhanced comfort for fans, improved concessions and concourse areas, multiple premium seating areas, and new technology inside and outside of the stadium.
- The extensive renovations significantly decreased the total number of seats at Sun Life Stadium and impacted all season ticket holder locations. Sun Life Stadium's new capacity is 65,069, down from 74,916 in 2014.

MIAMI SIGNS 12-YEAR DEAL WITH ADIDAS

- In January, adidas & the University of Miami announced a landmark 12-year partnership making adidas the official athletic footwear, apparel and accessory brand of UM through June 2027.
- The partnership, which made Miami one of adidas' 13 licensed NCAA programs, began on September 1 and includes investment, product and uniform development for all 18 UM programs.
- adidas unveiled Miami's 2015 new Primeknit football uniforms at the Fountainbleau Hotel in Miami Beach; developed in collaboration with Miami athletics, the team's new look is highlighted by

updated metallic stripes on the jerseys and pants, incorporating hurricane style cuts and patterns throughout the new uniform.

- Made with a cutting-edge, proprietary yarn blend that increases durability & abrasion resistance, Primeknit is the premier compression uniform system, featuring the latest generation of adidas TECHFIT technology.
- adidas partners hailing from the Miami football include NFL stars Jimmy Graham of the Seattle Seahawks, as well as Frank Gore and Phillip Dorsett of the Indianapolis Colts.

#PROCANES CONTINUING TRADITION

- Miami had **seven players** selected in the 2015 NFL Draft beginning in late April, the most since eight Hurricanes were drafted in 2011 and the fourth-most of any program nationwide in 2015.
- OT **Ereck Flowers** (1st round, NYG), WR **Phillip Dorsett** (1st, IND), LB **Denzel Perryman** (2nd, SD), TE **Clive Walford** (3rd, OAK), RB **Duke Johnson** (3rd, CLE), OL **Jon Feliciano** (4th, OAK) and DL **Anthony Chickillo** (6th, PIT) were all selected.
- The Hurricanes have had **five or more players** taken in the NFL Draft on **24 separate occasions** since 1980.
- **93 Hurricanes** have been picked in the NFL Draft since the start of the 2000 season, a figure that is tied for second-most among all NCAA programs.
- Miami's **28 NFL first-round draft picks since 2000**, including Ereck Flowers (No. 9 overall) and Phillip Dorsett (No. 29) in 2015, are the **most among all NCAA programs**, seven more than the next-highest total.
- Miami had **57 #ProCanes on NFL training camp rosters** heading into 2015; **27 of 32 NFL teams** had at least one former Cane on their roster, while the Miami Dolphins led all teams with five.

#SWAG16 CLASS CONTINUES TO GAIN STEAM

- The University of Miami football program has signed rising seniors Zach McCloud, Michael Pinckney, Jack Allison and Shaquille Quarterman to grant-in-aid agreements during the summer of 2015.
- Three of Miami's four grant-in-aid signees are ranked in the ESPN Top 300.

- The University of Miami football team travels to Boca Raton, Fla., to take on FAU on Sept. 11. Kickoff is set for 8 p.m. on Fox Sports 1.

AL GOLDEN

**Head Coach, Fifth Season
Penn State, 1991**

Al Golden, the University of Miami's 22nd head football coach, is in his fourth season at the helm of the Hurricanes' program. Under his leadership, the 44-year old Golden laid a foundation and process to return the storied program to prominence. Golden led the Hurricanes to a 9-4 record in 2013 and a berth in the Russell Athletic Bowl in Orlando - Miami's first bowl appearance since 2010.

The 2013 season began with a 7-0 start, including a win over No. 12 Florida as the Hurricanes jumped as high as No. 7 in the BCS rankings. Miami was led by nine All-ACC selections, including first-team LB Denzel Perryman and P Pat O'Donnell, who set the school single-season record for punting average. Miami is 11-4 in its last 15 games under Golden after the Hurricanes started 11-11 through the first 22 games.

Prior to Miami's bowl game in Orlando, Golden was the recipient of the 2013 Lombardi Award for Excellence in Coaching at the 44th Rotary Lombardi Award Ceremony.

In his second season at the helm, Golden led the Hurricanes, which were picked to finish fifth in the ACC Coastal Division, to a 7-5 record and a 5-3 league mark, earning a share of the 2012 ACC Coastal Division title. The 2012 season was highlighted by the rise of junior QB Stephen Morris, who threw for a career-best 3,345 passing yards and racked up a school-record 3,415 yards of total offense. Freshman Duke Johnson became Miami's first All-American since 2005 when he earned second-team All-America honors as a kick returner by the Walter Camp Football Foundation and FWAA Freshman All-America honors. Johnson rushed for a UM freshman-record 947 yards and amassed 2,060 all-purpose yards in his rookie season.

The Golden Era. Golden's brand of football--tough, smart and disciplined--was accepted and strides were made in that direction. From 2010 to 2011, the Canes improved 19-plus spots among the nation's FBS schools in turnover margin (+19), fewest penalties per game (+63) and fewest yards penalized per game (+85).

Golden oversaw an offense that was one of the most efficient in the country and produced lauded 2011 seasons for quarterback Jacory Harris, wide receiver Tommy Streeter and running back Lamar Miller. His persuasion on the defense was evident, as the Canes held several top-rated offenses to 20-plus points below their season averages. The Miami defense finished the season ranked No. 21 in the nation in scoring defense and tied for ninth in red zone defense.

With a commitment to community service, Golden instituted the Be the Match-Bone Marrow drive at Miami. Members of the football staff and team took an active part in registering members of the UM and South Florida communities for the national organization.

Golden arrived in Coral Gables after spending five seasons (2006-2010) as the head coach at Temple University. Over five seasons at Temple, Golden took the Owls to unprecedented heights. Before his arrival, TU had just two winning seasons over its previous 26 years and had only won 22 percent of its games over the previous 30 years.

In 2010, Golden led the Owls to an 8-4 overall record, 5-3 in Mid-American Conference (MAC) games and saw eight players named to the All-MAC first team. The 2009 season saw the Owls reach unparalleled success. Golden guided the Owls to new heights, finishing the season at 9-4 overall and tying for first place in the MAC East Division with a 7-1 mark. Temple recorded its first winning season since 1990 and made its first bowl appearance in 30 years. The Owls' bowl game was just the third in 111 years of Temple football. The MAC East championship was the Owls' best conference finish since joining the league in 2003. TU won a single-season record nine consecutive games.

The Colts Neck, N.J., native was named the Owls' 24th head football coach on December 6, 2005, after spending the prior five seasons as defensive coordinator at the University of Virginia.

Named the 2009 MAC Coach of the Year and the Maxwell Club's Tri-State Coach of the Year, Golden also saw an unprecedented 15 Owls earn

All-MAC honors, including a school record eight first-team All-MAC honorees. All-American Bernard Pierce was named the MAC Freshman of the Year, while sophomore Adrian Robinson garnered MAC Defensive Player of the Year accolades.

The Owls also received recognition for their community service efforts. In 2009, the Temple team was awarded the Robert P. Levy Community Service Award, presented by the Philadelphia Sports Congress, and the Athletic Department's inaugural T.E.A.M. [Temple's Exceptional Acts for Mankind] Award for community service.

Off the field, Golden has mentored the Owls through the greatest academic turnaround in the NCAA APR Reform Era. In his third season, Golden guided the Owls to a 5-7 mark, the team's most wins most since 1990, and a second-place finish in the MAC East. Facing five opponents that went on to postseason play, the Owls persevered to new heights, despite losing three games on the very last play of the game.

In 2008, Golden saw five Owls earn All-MAC honors, including senior DT Terrance Knighton, Temple's then-only first-team selection. Temple showed significant improvement on special teams, leading the nation in kickoff returns. The Owls out-scored their opponents for the season for the first time since 1990. During his second season in 2007, Golden once again played the nation's most true freshmen (20) and started the nation's most true freshmen (12). He led the Owls to a 4-8 overall record and a 4-4 mark during their inaugural season in the Mid-American Conference.

Along the way, TU won three consecutive games. The fourth win tied Temple's mark for the most conference wins since 1967. Led by All-MAC players DT Andre Neblett and DB Dominique Harris, the Cherry & White defense led the MAC in total defense, red zone defense, and pass defense. The Owls' red zone defense ranked first nationally.

In his first campaign in Owl Country, Golden played 22 true freshmen, the most in the nation, against the third most difficult schedule in the country. Only national champion Florida (10) and Stanford (9) played more bowl participants during the regular season than the Owls, who competed against eight teams that earned postseason berths. Thirty-eight players saw their first major college football action under Golden in 2006, including 27 freshmen.

Golden captured his first victory at the helm when the Owls defeated Bowling Green, 28-14, at Lincoln Financial Field on Oct. 28, 2006. The win was the largest accomplishment for the Owls on the field, but a multitude of goals were achieved off the field during Golden's initial campaign. Temple unveiled the most comprehensive academic support team in the Mid-American Conference and teamed with Adidas as the team's official outfitter. The program was also successful in assembling a regional, nonconference schedule for years to come.

Recruiting has also been a tremendous success under Golden's leadership. His initial signing class in 2006 was rated best in the MAC by CollegeFootballNews.com, while the 2007 and 2008 classes earned top honors in the league from Scout.com.

With a commitment to community service and academics at the core of Golden's program, a multitude of individual honors were bestowed upon the Owls in 2006. Seven student-athletes were named to the 2006 Philadelphia Inquirer Academic All-Area Football team, providing Temple the most honorees of the 10 Delaware Valley institutions that sponsor football. Three players were named to the 2006 Eastern College Athletic Conference Division I-A Football All-Star Team, marking the most for the Owls on the ECAC squad since a trio also earned recognition in 1997.

In addition, three football student-athletes were named honorable mention freshman All-Americans by The Sporting News. It signaled the largest number of rookies to receive national recognition in program history.

Golden was named the youngest defensive coordinator in Division I-A by Virginia head coach Al Groh in January 2001, after spending the previous season at his alma mater, serving as linebackers coach and recruiting coordinator under Joe Paterno. From 2001 to 2004, the Cavaliers' defense improved under his tutelage, ranking 108th in total defense in his first year to ranking 18th in total defense in 2004. In the same time period, Virginia's scoring defense went from 74th in the nation (27.6 ppg) to 17th (17.7 ppg) utilizing Golden's 3-4 scheme.

In addition to his responsibilities as defensive coordinator, Golden directed the inside linebackers from 2001-04 before shifting to the secondary in 2005. In 2004, he oversaw a defense that featured the nation's

best group of linebackers, according to Athlon, The Sporting News, and ESPN The Magazine. Under his guidance, Ahmad Brooks blossomed into a finalist for the Butkus Award. In 2003, Brooks and Kai Parham earned Freshman All-America honors. Golden was responsible for recruiting Brooks, the USA Today National Defensive Player of the Year--the highest ranked recruit to ever attend U.Va. Golden signed the Virginia High School Player of the Year in both 2002 (Brooks) and 2004 (Olu Hall).

During his first two seasons at Virginia, Golden helped develop two-time All-ACC linebacker Angelo Crowell, who currently plays with the Buffalo Bills, and 2003 Hula Bowl participant Merrill Robertson. Following the 2001 season, Golden was an assistant coach for the Gray team in the 64th Annual Blue-Gray All-Star Football Classic.

Golden began his coaching career in 1993 as offensive coordinator at Red Bank (N.J.) Catholic High School. He then served as a graduate assistant under George Welsh at Virginia from 1994 to 1996, where he worked primarily with the linebackers and the kickoff and punting teams. He helped develop All-ACC linebackers James Farrior and Jamie Sharper, both of whom were chosen in the 1997 NFL draft. Farrior was a first-round pick (#8) by the New York Jets, while Sharper was a second-round selection (#34) by the Baltimore Ravens. Golden then coached the linebackers at Boston College from 1997 to 1999 under Tom O'Brien. While at BC, Golden coached All-Big East and NFL linebackers Frank Chamberlin (Tennessee Titans) and Erik Storz (Jacksonville Jaguars). The Eagles finished the 1999 regular season with an 8-3 record and a top-25 national ranking, while making their first postseason bowl appearance since 1994.

Golden was a three-year (1989-91) letterwinner and two-year starter at tight end for Penn State, where he received the 1991 Ridge Riley Award, given annually to a player who displays excellence in scholarship, sportsmanship, friendship and leadership. As a junior in 1990, Golden played a key role in Penn State's nationally televised 24-21 upset of No. 1-ranked Notre Dame at South Bend.

His touchdown reception late in the fourth quarter tied the score at 21 as Penn State rallied from a 21-7 deficit. Golden captained the Nittany Lions his senior year and helped lead them to a 42-17 win over Tennessee in the 1992 Fiesta Bowl. Following that victory, Penn State finished with an 11-2 record and ranked third in the nation in the final 1991 AP poll.

After his tenure as a player in State College, Golden spent one season in the NFL with the New England Patriots.

Golden earned his undergraduate degree in pre-law from Penn State in 1991 before receiving his master's in sports psychology from Virginia in December, 1996.

A 2004 inductee of the Jersey Shore Sports Hall of Fame, he is married to the former Kelly Hanna of Lock Haven, Pa. The couple has three children--son A.J. (7), and daughters Addison (6) and Grace (3).

Mark D'Onofrio is in his fifth season as Miami's defensive coordinator. In 2014, D'Onofrio guided Miami to a No. 14 overall ranking in total defense. Under D'Onofrio's leadership, the Hurricanes held opponents to just 329.6 yards per game in 2014, which was nearly 100 yards fewer than the 2013 campaign.

In his first season at Miami, D'Onofrio's defense finished the season ranked ninth in the nation in red zone defense and 21st in scoring defense, holding opponents to an average of 20.08 points per game. The defense, under D'Onofrio's guidance, finished strong and proved stingy, giving up an average of only 13.5 points in the last five games of the season.

Prior to the 2011 season, D'Onofrio saw two of his Temple standouts drafted, now are active on NFL rosters. Defensive end Muhammad Wilkerson was taken in the first round by the New York Jets and free safety Jaiquaun Jarrett went in the second round to the Philadelphia Eagles. In all, three Owls were drafted during D'Onofrio's tenure and five former players are active in the NFL.

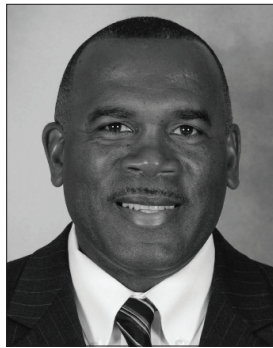

Under Harris' guidance, running back Duke Johnson posted one of the finest seasons in school history as he finished with an incredible 6.8 yard per carry average and finished with the second highest single-season rushing total in school history (1,652).

Harris has more than 24 years of high school coaching experience and returns to Miami after a second successful stint as the head coach of Booker T. Washington (2003-07, 2011-13), where he compiled a 99-10 record in eight seasons. He was named Florida Dairy Farm Florida Coach of the Year in 2012 and 2013 after guiding Booker T. Washington to back-to-back Class 4A state championships. Booker T. Washington finished No. 1 in the final MaxPreps national football rankings.

Under Kehoe's leadership in 2014, the Hurricanes' line paved the way for an offensive unit to average 430.3 yards per game, a figure that ranked fourth in the ACC. In addition, Miami's offensive line cleared lanes for three Hurricane running backs to rush for over 5.0 yards per carry. As a team, Miami averaged 180.4 rushing yards per game.

Kehoe's tenure of 28 years at Miami, a span during which he has either played or coached for six head football coaches, ranks among the longest of any UM athletics figure.

Brown originally joined the staff as the running backs coach, ascending to the post on Feb. 10, 2013.

During the 2014 campaign, Brown coached the linebackers and guided a unit that helped the Hurricanes post the nation's 14th-best defensive attack, limiting opponents to just 329.6 yards per game.

Under Brown's guidance, linebacker Denzel Perryman posted an impressive season as he was selected as a Dick Butkus Award semifinalist for the second-consecutive season. He also earned All-ACC honors first team honors for the second-consecutive season after he finished the 2014 campaign with a team-best 110 total tackles (79 solo). Perryman then became the first Hurricane player since 2007 to be awarded with *Associated Press* All-America honors.

Perryman would go on to be selected Second Round of the 2015 NFL Draft by the San Diego Chargers.
