STORY LINES

- After picking up their first Atlantic Coast Conference series of the season last weekend against then-No. 24 Virginia Tech, the Miami Hurricanes will look to continue momentum with a weekend series on the road at No. 9 Virginia beginning Friday.
- Though Miami owns the all-time series advantage by a slight margin of 19-18, the Cavaliers have won six straight against the Hurricanes, including a three-game sweep at Alex Rodriguez Park in April 2012.
- While Miami struggled in its early conference slate, the team's new rotation of southpaws **Chris Diaz**, **Bryan Radziewski** and **Andrew Suarez** delivered three straight quality starts against a talented Hokies offense, taking two of three games.
- Junior lefthander **Bryan Radziewski**, moved to the weekend rotation before the team's series with Virginia Tech, has dominated since returning from shoulder surgery that cut his 2012 season short. He is 3-0 with a 36:3 strikeout-to-walk ratio.
- Among last season's top performers against the Cavs: **Chantz Mack** (.333 average) and **Brad Fieger** (three runs, two RBI's).
- Five of this weekend's six projected starters are lefthanded, and all six rank in the top 25 of the Atlantic Coast Conference in ERA. Pacing Virginia's staff are FR. LHP **Brandon Waddell** (2-0, 2.60 ERA) and SO. RHP **Nick Howard** (3-1, 1.65).

3 JIM MORRIS 2001, 1999 & 1994 COACH OF THE YEAR • 2008 ACC COACH OF THE YEAR



In his 20th season at Miami, no other program nor head coach, has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament an NCAA-record 40 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 19 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006.

- Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 869-330-3 (.724) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,373-597-4 (.696) Division I record in 31+ years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 34 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,504-638-4 (.701) mark
- In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 19 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium project.

MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

- Jim Morris earned his 28th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2012 when he guided the Canes to one of 16 host sites for the first round of the postseason. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 19 seasons (1994-2012), winning 15 of his last 19 appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.
- Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris led the 2012 Hurricanes to their 40th-straight NCAA Tournament. Five players from the 2012 team were selected in last year's Major League Baseball Draft: E.J. Encinosa, Eric Erickson, Steven Ewing, Peter O'Brien and Stephen Perez.

MORRIS IN 35th SEASON AS A COLLEGE COACH

- Morris currently has a 1,373-597-4 (.696) record at the Division I level. As a head coach overall, he has compiled a 1,504-638-4 (.701) record over 30-plus years.
- Jim Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later, he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern on March 23, 2001.
- Morris entered 2013 as the fifth-winningest active coach in Division I baseball history with 1,354 wins. His impressive win total ranks him No. 12 all-time for any coach, regardless of division.
- Including his time at DeKalb C.C., Morris won his 1,500th game as a head coach in Miami's 4-1 upset of No. 1 North Carolina on March 15, 2013 in Chapel Hill, N.C.



JIM MORRIS MAKING HISTORY

- The only coach in NCAA history to take a school to the College World Series in each of his first six years at a program. Morris has gone to Omaha with Miami in 11 of 19 seasons and led the Canes to 13 straight NCAA Regional Championships, an NCAA record.
- Named National Coach of the Year five times while at Miami by Baseball America in 1994 and by the ABCA and Collegiate Baseball in 1999 and 2001.

HURRICANES HEAD NORTH...

- Miami wrapped up a six-game homestand Wednesday against FAU, finishing with a 4-2 mark and its first ACC series victory.
- The Hurricanes now boast an impressive 16-5 record (.762) inside the friendly confines of Alex Rodriguez Park, including an 8-2 mark in midweek contests played in Coral Gables.
- Including road games, the Canes are 18-7 this season inside Florida and have played just three games outside state lines (1-2). During a trip to No. 1 UNC, Miami handed the Tar Heels their first loss of the season (March 15) in Chapel Hill, N.C.

MAKING HISTORY...

- For his 16-strikeout performance in a March 23 complete game win over the Hokies, southpaw Bryan Radziewski was recognized with ACC Pitcher of the Week honors Monday.
- The complete game shutout was the first for a Miami pitcher since David Gutierrez accomplished the feat in 2009.
- The 16 strikeouts represented the sixth-most ever for a Miami pitcher, tying Jim Muelhausen's single-game mark from 1969. The total represented the most punchouts for a Miami pitcher since Joe Grahe fanned 18 in 1989, and came just three shy of the ACC single-game record.
- The Pitcher of the Week award was the first for a Miami hurler since E.J. Encinosa was recognized on April 9, 2012. Radziewski was also named a Louisville Slugger Player of the Week by *Collegiate Baseball Newspaper* and *College Sports Madness* ACC Player of the Week.

STARTING OFF STRONG...

- Sophomore Chris Diaz has impressed as Friday night starter, delivering five quality starts in six chances this season.
- The Florida City, Fla., native ranks seventh in the ACC with an ERA of 1.58, and went a career-long eight innings last time against Virginia Tech (March 22).
- Sophomore Andrew Suarez delivered a strong outing in the series finale against No. 1 UNC (March 17), striking out a career-best seven batters through 6.2 innings of work.
- Head coach Jim Morris and his staff went with a new rotation of Diaz (Fri.), Bryan Radziewski (Sat.) and Suarez (Sun.) against No. 24 Virginia Tech. The trio of southpaws gave up just four earned runs across 23.2 combined innings of work, good for a staff ERA of 1.52.

SCOUTING THE CAVALIERS...

- Virginia has rocketed out to a 23-2 start in 2013, and ranks in the top of the ACC in both hitting and pitching. The Cavaliers are one of only three teams in the conference with a team average of over .300 (.313), and their 2.32 staff ERA ranks them third in the ACC.
- The Virginia offense has been powered by SO INF Brandon Cogswell (.391 average, 13 RBI's), SO INF/RHP Nick Howard (.347, eight doubles) and SO OF Brandon Downes (four homeruns, 23 RBI's). Four players on the Cavaliers roster have over 20 RBI's this season.
- On the hill, Virginia has been led by its weekend rotation of Brandon Waddell (2-0, 2.60 ERA), Scott Silverstein (4-0, 3.58) and Nick Howard (3-1, 1.65). RHP Whit Mayberry has been key out of the bullpen, and has a 0.53 ERA in seven appearances.

• Miami's defense has been one of the many brightest spots on the season, boasting a .970 fielding percentage - the fifth-best mark in the Atlantic Coast Conference.

• Miami's 2013 infield features four newcomers: freshman first base platoon David Thompson & Christopher Barr, junior second baseman Alex Hernandez and freshman shortstop Brandon Lopez. Junior third baseman Brad Fieger completes the infield lineup.

• The play of the Hurricanes infield has been the catalyst for a majority of the team's 24 double plays - the second-most of any team in the Atlantic Coast Conference.

QUALITY AND QUANTITY...

• Head coach Jim Morris and his staff have received 12 quality starts from their starters this season - including three consecutive in its most recent series with No. 24 Virginia Tech.

• Sophomore LHP Chris Diaz set a new personal record by going eight innings against the Hokies, allowing two earned runs.

• Sophomore Andrew Suarez has delivered three straight quality starts against Duke (March 10), UNC (March 17) and Va Tech (March 24), and ranks 16th in the ACC with a 2.73 ERA.

• Freshman LHP Thomas Woodrey went eight innings against Maine in a midweek start (March 5), tied for the second-longest any pitcher has gone this season.

• OF Ricky Eusebio leads the team with five RBI's over his past five games, hitting .308 over that stretch (4-for-13) with one double.

• A number of the Hurricanes' most important contributors were part of a recruiting class ranked in the top 10 by national publications.

• Despite starting just 12 of the team's 28 games, 1B/OF Christopher Barr ranks 17th in the ACC in walks (15). He is getting on base at a team-best .484 clip.

• RHP Frank Grandinette is tied for second in the conference in appearances (13), just one shy of teammate AJ Salcines (14).

• Junior Alex Hernandez, who has started all 28 games this season, ranks second in the conference in fielding percentage (.984).

• Freshman 1B David Thompson leads the team in RBI's (21).

• The Hurricanes' recent six-game homestand continued a stretch of 25 of the team's first 28 games inside state lines to open up the 2013 season.

The Hurricanes have dedicated the 2013 season in memory of former head coach Ron Fraser, who passed away before the season after a battle with Alzheimer's Disease.

Miami has taken special steps to remember "The Wizard of College Baseball," who helped guide the Hurricanes to over 1,200 wins and two national championships in his storied 30-year tenure as head coach.

During a special tribute night against Milwaukee on Feb. 23, head coach Jim Morris called for the "Grand Illusion," a trick play for which Fraser became instantly famous after the 1982 College World Series. A new outfield banner portraying the legendary coach was also unveiled by Fraser's wife Karen, his three daughters and five grandchildren during the game.

The Hurricanes are wearing patches in remembrance of Fraser; #1 patches adorn the right breast of each and every jersey, while #1 decals have been placed on the back of each player's batting helmet.

A commemorative home plate painted on the field with the number 1, Fraser's retired jersey number, will remain all season.

Alex Rodriguez Park took form in a three-phase process:

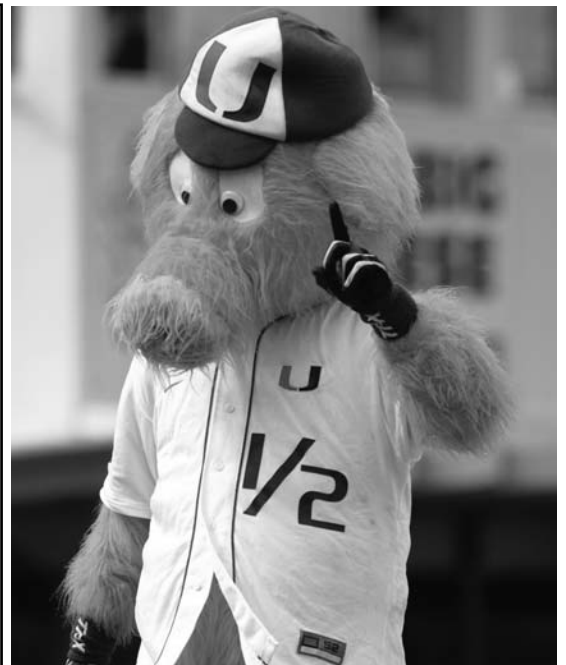
- Phase I called for seating modifications, new dugouts, new stadium lighting and utility infrastructure and new rest rooms.

HURRICANES DROP SERIES OPENER TO VIRGINIA

CORAL GABLES, Fla. -- The No. 25 Virginia Cavaliers used a five-run sixth inning to power their way past the No. 18 Miami Hurricanes 7-3 in Saturday's series opener at Alex Rodriguez Park.

The Hurricanes (27-15, 12-10 ACC), who committed three costly errors in the frame, took their first lead of the game in the previous half-inning on a sacrifice fly from Michael Broad. But the Cavaliers responded with a big sixth inning where they sent 11 batters to the plate, and the team's defense failed to provide starter Eric Erickson (6-5) with support in the field.

After a 42-minute rain delay before the start of the third inning, the Cavaliers (29-14-1, 12-10 ACC) jumped over Erickson for the game's first run once play resumed. After allowing two early baserunners in the frame on a single and walk, the veteran southpaw nearly got out of the inning unharmed after getting back-to-back outs. But Derek Fisher's two-out RBI single, which ricocheted off Erickson towards first base for an infield hit, would give the Cavaliers a 1-0 lead.

The Hurricanes, down 2-0 entering the bottom of the fourth, scored two runs of their own in the next half-inning to tie the game. Dale Carey's RBI down the left field line, which plated sophomore Brad Fieger, cut the early deficit to 2-1. The Marietta, Ga. native scored on Branden Kline's wild pitch two batters later, knotting the game up at 2-2.

Miami took its first lead of the day in the next inning, as Broad's sacrifice fly off Kline (6-3) plated Chantz Mack to give the Hurricanes a 3-2 advantage. The Cavaliers responded with five runs in the next inning, however, all of which were unearned. Shortstop Stephen Perez, outfielder Rony Rodriguez and Erickson each committed errors in the decisive inning.

Kyle Crockett pitched well in relief of Kline, who was pulled after five innings. The sophomore lefthander allowed only one hit in 3.1 innings of work, striking out four batters along the way. Reliever Justin Thompson recorded the final two outs of the inning on back-to-back strikeouts, sending the Cavaliers to their third straight conference victory.

April 29, 2012

NO. 18 CANES FALL 7-4 IN GAME TWO

CORAL GABLES, Fla. -- The No. 18 Miami Hurricanes returned to Alex Rodriguez Park for a rain-soaked Sunday night affair, dropping game two of their weekend series to the No. 25 Virginia Cavaliers by a final score of 7-4.

Though Eric Whaley was slated for his normal game two start, skipper Jim Morris bumped Steven Ewing up one day due to flu-like symptoms. Ewing pitched effectively through his first four innings before defensive miscues led to a three-run fifth inning for the Cavaliers.

After disappointing offensively in their 7-3 loss on Saturday night, the Hurricanes lineup quickly erased any lingering struggles with a four-run second inning. While Brad Fieger led off the frame with his second homerun of the season, the Hurricanes (27-16, 12-11 ACC) continued to grind away at starter Scott Silverstein, who lasted only two innings.

Already down 1-0, the senior lefthander allowed a single to Alex San Juan and then issued back-to-back walks to freshmen Esteban Tregallo and Garrett Kennedy to load the bases. Junior shortstop Stephen Perez would make him pay, connecting on an RBI double to the gap in right-center, emptying the bases to give the Hurricanes a 4-0 lead.

The Cavaliers (30-14-1, 13-10 ACC) would chip away at the Hurricanes' advantage, however, striking for single runs in the third and fourth before a big fifth inning chased Ewing out of the game. Poor defense plagued Miami once again in the frame, as the team committed two errors leading to three unearned runs.

After Perez misplayed a ball at short to help give the Cavaliers two runners on base, designated hitter Kenny Towns knocked in third baseman Stephen Bruno on a groundout to second base for the first run of the inning. Back-to-back hits from Brandon Downes and Nate Irving would plate two more runs, giving Virginia its first advantage of the night at 5-4. Perez' error was one of five charged to the Hurricanes' defense on the night.

The Hurricanes were unable to muster much offense after the big second inning, scattering only three hits through the final seven innings of the game. Despite disappointing performances from their starting pitchers, the two teams featured impressive performances from the bullpen. Cavaliers' reliever Shane Halley and Javi Salas entered the game at two different points but promptly shut down the opposing offenses; Halley finished with six innings of two-hit ball in relief, while Salas pitched three effective innings while allowing two unearned runs.

LATE RALLY CUT SHORT AS HURRICANES FALL 7-4

CORAL GABLES, Fla. -- No. 21 Miami wrapped up its series with No. 22 Virginia in disappointing fashion on Monday night, dropping the series finale to the Cavaliers by a final score of 7-4.

It was a tough finish for Miami on another rainy night as Alex Rodriguez Park, as the team struggled to develop any offensive or defensive rhythm against Cavaliers' righthander Artie Lewicki (3-2). The Hurricanes had only two hits through six innings of work, and registered a crushing five errors that led to two unearned runs for the Wahoos.

Though he was scheduled to pitch on Monday night, junior righthander Eric Whaley was scratched due to flu-like symptoms only a brief time before first pitch. Freshman lefthander Chris Diaz (0-1) took his place on the mound, but struggled in his three innings of work. The Miami, Fla. native allowed five hits and four runs, three of them earned, while striking out one batter.

The Cavaliers struck for three runs in the top of the second inning, sending seven batters to the plate in a frame powered by a two-RBI single from Mitchell Shifflett. The Cavs would tack on another run in the third on an RBI single from Jared King, as Virginia jumped out to a 4-0 lead they would not relinquish.

Miami trimmed the Virginia lead to 4-1 in the bottom of the fourth, as a single from Brad Fieger gave the Hurricanes their first hit of the day. The RBI baseknock off the end of the bat landed its way in front of Cavaliers leftfielder Derek Fisher, plating Tyler Palmer who was hit by a pitch from Lewicki to open the inning.

A big three-run inning for Virginia helped the Cavaliers regain a commanding lead in the sixth. Chris Taylor's fifth triple of the year plated Keith Werman, who had reached earlier in the inning on a throwing error from freshman shortstop Jarred Mederos. Two more runs would plate on back-to-back RBI singles from Stephen Bruno and Fisher, upping the Cavaliers' lead to 7-1.

Tyler Palmer's solo shot in the sixth inning would cut the Virginia lead to 7-2, but Miami couldn't progress much further due to strong pitching from Lewicki and relief ace Kyle Crockett, who threw two innings and allowed no earned runs with three strikeouts. After a wild pitch plated Stephen Perez and an RBI groundout from Michael Broad gave the Hurricanes two runs in the ninth, the late rally was cut short on back-to-back outs from Austin Young, who finished off the Miami bats and sent Virginia to a series sweep.
