




1993-94 Hurricane Basketball Preview

here are no "quick fixes" in ■ the BIG EAST. Improving skills takes hard work. Building a program takes patience. Winning takes time. For the University of Miami basketball team, hard work and patience have been part of the daily regimen since the program was reinstated in 1985. Now, the time to win has begun.

Last season's 10-17 record included a phenomenal 7-2 mark in home BIG EAST play as Miami enjoyed a home-court advantage that equated into the No. 3 home record in the conference.

Reaching the seven-win mark in only their second season in the BIG EAST was a tremendous accomplishment by the Hurricanes. By

comparison, it took conference charter members Providence five years and Seton Hall nine seasons just to reach the *five*-win plateau. And the jump from just one conference win two years ago to the seven victories last season stands as the third-largest increase in wins in the history of the BIG EAST.

For 1993-94, a cast of 13 players that combine a rare blend of youth and experience look to make it time for more wins at the University of Miami.

Experience comes in the form of four returning starters. However, no seniors and only five total lettermen are back while a group of eight redshirts and newcomers round out the UM roster.

Junior guard Michael Gardner

Standing tall in the corps of returners is junior center Constantin Popa. The Bucharest, Romania native continues to spend as much time in the weight room and dining hall as he does in the classroom and on the basketball court in hopes of bulking up his frame which currently stands at 7'3" and 235 pounds. Popa continued his adjustment to the American style of play and emerged as a force in the BIG EAST last season. His 149 career blocks stands as a UM record and he was tops among league players in overall action last season with an average of 3.2 blocks per game.

Last season's leading scorer turned out to be a freshman as shooting guard Steve Edwards made the transition from Miami High School to the University of Miami with great success. Edwards averaged 17.2 points in league action which was the best average of any conference rookie and the thirdhighest scoring average among all conference players. Edwards displayed excellent range as he shattered the previous BIG EAST marks for three-pointers in a season, both by a rookie and all players with 59 in league play.

Running the offense for the third straight season is junior point guard Michael Gardner who started a total of 50 games in his first two seasons at Miami. Gardner set two school records last season as he recorded 14 assists in one game (vs. Pittsburgh) and finished the season with a UM-record 154 total assists.

The fourth returning starter for 1993-94 is junior forward Pat Lawrence. For the past two seasons, Pat battled his older brother Anthony for playing time at the power forward position. The elder Lawrence moved on to the USBL's Miami Tropics and now Pat hopes to blossom following a season in which he was Miami's second-leading rebounder with 5.8 boards per contest and shot 49.2% from the field.

The final returning letterman from last season is sophomore forward Lorenzo Pearson. In his rookie campaign, Pearson appeared in 19 contests, including the final 15

games. He was voted Miami's "Most Improved Player" and continued to develop over the summer by travelling with the BIG EAST All-Stars to Canada.

Injuries and academics produced four redshirts from last season's group of six freshmen. Center William Davis and guard Steve Frazier both suffered preseason knee injuries while guard Tshombe High

went down with a stress fracture in his foot early in the campaign. Forward Brad Timpf developed his skills in practice the entire season, but did not see action in any contests.

Davis attended Fork Union Military Academy in Virginia two years ago, the same school several Hurricanes have attended

including Popa and UM football players Stephen McGuire and Vinny Testaverde.

Timpf came to Miami from nearby Taravella High School, in Ft. Lauderdale, FL and is one of five current Hurricanes from the state of Florida.

Frazier who hails from Queens, NY, attended St. Thomas More Prep School in Oakdale, CT two years ago following a brilliant high school career at Andrew Jackson High where he led all of New York in scoring with an average of 39 points per contest.

High came to Miami from Brainerd High School in Chattanooga, TN. One of the more gifted athletes to come through the Miami program, High possesses tremendous leaping ability and is a true crowd-pleaser with his dunking skills.

All four redshirts from last season are expected back at 100% for the beginning of practice on November 1.

Coach Hamilton garnered his third consecutive Top 20 recruiting class this past season as two high school stars, one transfer and one junior college standout have committed to attend Miami this fall.

Forward Alex Fraser of Pace High School is the third UM recruit from the Miami area in as many years. Fraser, 6'8", 220, was a four-year starter at Pace, earned all-state honors and was voted "Player of the Year" by the Miami Herald.

Guard Torey McCormick of South Gwinnett High School (GA) set county records for assists with 9.7


per game and steals with a 5.5 average. McCormick was the only 4-A player in the state of Georgia to be a unanimous selection to the Georgia North/ South All-Star Team.

One of South Florida's own decided to come home as Steve Rich transferred to Miami following one semester at Wake Forest University. Rich attended Cardinal Gibbons High School

in Ft. Lauderdale, FL where he averaged in double figures in both points (21.9) and rebounds (15.9) while rejecting 5.6 shots per game in his senior year. Rich was the leading rebounder at the prestigious Nike summer camp in 1991. Prior to leaving Wake Forest in his rookie year, Rich saw action in 12 games, including one as a starter, averaging 2.4 points and 3.4 rebounds in just over nine minutes of PT.

The final UM signee is forward Jamal Johnson of Pensacola (FL) Junior College. Johnson led his squad in rebounding in both of his juco seasons as his squad posted a 31-5 record and captured the national juco championship in 1992-93.

Three walkons return to the Hurricane squad after providing Miami with invaluable depth on the practice court. Senior forwards Adam Dusewicz and Chris Parker each earned letters the past two seasons while guard Anthony Rosa enters his sophomore campaign at Miami.



Policies And Procedures

INTERVIEW POLICY: All interviews with UM players and coaches should be scheduled through the Sports Information Office. The best time to reach Coach Hamilton is between 9:00 a.m. and 12:00 noon on weekdays. Players are available for interviews prior to the start of practice. Post-practice interviews will be available on a limited basis. THERE WILL BE NO PLAYER INTERVIEWS ON GAME DAYS.

PRACTICE ATTENDANCE: The majority of UM basketball workouts will be closed. However selected workouts and scrimmages will be open to the media. For pre-practice interviews and scrimmage attendance, all media guests are required to check in with the UM Sports Information Office. THE UM LOCKER ROOM, WEIGHT ROOM AND TRAINING ROOM ARE OFF LIMITS TO THE MEDIA THROUGHOUT THE SEASON.

PRESS CREDENTIALS: Credentials for UM home games are to be used by the working media only and should be requested in writing on letterhead stationery at least two weeks in advance. Please direct all requests to Carol Recicar at the UM Sports Information Office: P.O. Box 248167, University of Miami, Coral Gables, FL 33124-0814.

TELEPHONES: Four courtside telephone lines will be available to visiting media for a fee of \$100 per line used payable in advance of the game by check made out to the University of Miami. The lines are restricted to credit card and collect long distance calls only. Please contact Carol Recicar at the UM Sports Information Office to reserve these lines. The flagship radio station for visiting teams will have priority in reserving line use. It is recommended that media with deadline concerns who do not reserve a line through the Miami SID office order phones by calling Southern Bell at 1-800-753-7289 or (305) 780-2830. STATISTICS/SERVICES: Complete game statistics including play-by-play and shots chart will be available at all UM home games. In-game statistics are available to radio and television announcers via television monitors on press row. A meal will be served approximately 90 minutes prior to tipoff and at halftime.

PHOTOGRAPHERS: NCAA rules limit the shooting access areas to BEHIND THE BASELINES ONLY. NO PHOTOGRAPHERS WILL BE PERMITTED TO SHOOT ALONG THE SIDELINE OR BENCH AREAS. Members of the media requiring specific players are instructed. to inform a UM SID representative of their request. THE UM LOCKER ROOM WILL NOT BE OPEN FOR POST GAME INTERVIEWS.

University of Miami Basketball

The University of Miami is the ■ largest independent teaching and research university in the Southeast and, opened in 1926, is among the nation's youngest. The Coral Gables campus, 10 miles from Miami, is the site of most of the University's undergraduate and graduate programs. The University also operates a medical center in downtown Miami, a world renowned marine and atmospheric science school on Virginia Key in Biscayne Bay and a bio-medical research and development center on its South Campus.

Following goals established in its nationally acclaimed strategic plan, the University of Miami recently completed a five-year fund raising campaign that raised \$517.5 million for endowment, facilities and equipment.

Enrollment at the University of Miami has grown from a few hundred when classes were held in a remodeled Coral Gables Hotel to 13,153 credit-seeking students including about 8,270 undergraduate, 2,691 graduate, 1,479 law and 576 medical students. Representing all U.S. states and 110 foreign countries, the student body is composed of 50 percent Florida residents, 41 percent from other states, and 10 percent foreign nationals.

Research

As it has for more than a decade, the University ranks among the top three percent of 2,600 universities and colleges receiving federal research and development grants. During the 1989-90 academic year, the faculty was awarded more than \$133.7 million in separately budgeted grants and contracts from federal, state, local and private sources.


In addition to basic research in science, medicine, engineering and social sciences, current projects cover a wide spectrum of global concerns including climatology, oceanography, population and resource studies, spinal cord injuries, diabetes, AIDS, cancer, productivity, technology transfer and international relations.

Academics


The University offers 130 undergraduate and 175 graduate degree programs through schools of Architecture, Business Administration, Communication, Continuing Studies, Education, International Studies, Law, Marine and Atmospheric Sciences, Medicine, Music, Nursing, the Graduate School, and colleges of Arts and Sciences and Engineering.

The Rosenstiel School of Marine and Atmospheric Science is recognized as one of the top three marine science schools in the country. The University offers graduate as well as undergraduate degree programs in marine affairs and marine sciences.




April 25, 1993: The men's tennis team wins four out of six singles flights en route to its first Big East title at the Neil Schiff Tennis Center.

March 27, 1993: Miami diver Dean Panaro wins his third and fourth national titles, capturing the three-and one-meter diving titles at the NCAA Championships.

March 8, 1993: The Miami women's basketball team defeats Providence, 77-56, for its second straight Big East Championship title.

January 2, 1993: The Miami men's basketball team defeats Georgetown. 80-69 at the Miami Arena, for its first win over a top-10 ranked team since the reinstatement of the program.

December 12, 1993: Quarterback Gino Torretta becomes the second UM player to win the Heisman Trophy. Torretta went on to become the mosthonored football player in college history.

October 11, 1992: The women's tennis team captures its second straight Big East Championship at Syracuse.

June 6, 1992: The baseball team finishes third in their 12th College World Series, qualifying for postseason play for the 20th straight time along the way.

March 26, 1992: Diver Dean Panaro captures his second consecutive national title in the 1-meter diving competition.

March 14, 1992: Freshman Gillian Russell wins the national championship in the 55-meter indoor hurdles.

March 1, 1992: The women's basketball team defeats Villanova to complete its first season in the BIG EAST undefeated. It marked the first time in the league's 10-year history that a men's or women's team had gone undefeated. The Lady 'Canes go on to a 30-2 record, making the NCAA Tournament's "Sweet 16."

January 14, 1992: The Hurricane men's basketball team wins its first BIG EAST game with a 45-42 victory over St. John's in the Miami Arena. The contest was the first home conference game in UM history.

January 1, 1992: Miami defeats Nebraska 22-0 in the Orange Bowl to cap an undefeated season and win its fourth national championship in nine vears.

April 5, 1991: UM men's tennis player Conny Falk defeats the No. 1-ranked player in the country and moves into the top spot at the end of the month.

March 28, 1991: Dean Panaro wins the national championship in the threemeter diving competition.

February 5, 1991: UM joins seven other schools as a charter member of the new BIG EAST Football Conference.

December 5, 1990: Defensive tackle Russell Marvland becomes the first Miami player to win the prestigous Outland Trophy, recognizing the nation's best lineman.

November 23, 1990: UM basketball ushers in a new era under coach Leonard Hamilton.

October 22, 1990: Coach Ron Fraser is appointed head coach of the 1992 United States Olympic baseball team.

October 10, 1990: UM officially accepts a bid to become the tenth member of the BIG EAST Conference.

January 1, 1990: Under first-year head coach Dennis Erickson, the Hurricanes beat Alabama, 33-25, in the Sugar Bowl to claim their third national title in seven years.

March 15, 1989: The Lady 'Canes basketball team goes to the NCAA Tournament for the first time.

September 1988: Two Hurricane student-athletes earn medals in the Seoul Olympic Games: Mike Fiore, a gold in baseball, and Wendy Williams, a bronze in diving.

June 1988: UM golfer Tracy Kerdyk is named the Golfware Amateur Plaver of the Year, the Heisman trophy of women's golf.

February 25, 1988: Maria Rivera becomes UM's all-time leading basketball scorer, male or female.

January 1, 1988: UM defeats Oklahoma in the 54th Orange Bowl Classic to gain the undisputed national championship in football and complete its first 12-0 season.

May 23, 1987: Andrew Burrow becomes the first UM player to win the NCAA men's tennis singles title since Pancho Segura (1943-45).

December 6, 1986: Quarterback Vinny Testaverde receives the Heisman Trophy, the first UM player to win college football's most coveted award.










The photo showcases the University of Miami intercollegiate athletic facilities on the University's main campus in Coral Gables, Florida.


Athletic Facilities

- 1. Mark Light Stadium Completed in 1977, "The Light" has become home of NCAA World Series Champions in 1982 and 1985. One of the nation's most complete facilities, MLS has a seating capacity of 5,000.
- 2. Ron Fraser Building Completed in 1987 and located on the grounds of Mark Light Stadium, this structure is named for the "Wizard of College Baseball," former Miami Head Coach Ron Fraser. The plush new facility houses the Hurricane baseball offices, clubhouse and VIP skybox.



The Miami Arena has been the home of Miami basketball since 1988. A state-of-the-art structure seating 15,388 fans, the Arena is the site for basketball in the city that boasts two teams - the Hurricanes and the Miami Heat of the NBA. Located in downtown Miami near beautiful Biscayne Bay, the Arena is a 15-minute Metrorail ride from the Coral Gables campus.


- 3. Greentree Track Completed in 1988, this all-weather surface has already played host to a dozen Olympic competitors. The six-lane track is complete with steeple chase capabilities, four jumping pits, and shot, discus, and hammer throw circles.
- 4. Knight Sports Complex Completed in 1985, this building houses practice courts, locker rooms and coaching offices for the Miami basketball program. Costing more than \$1 million, the structure is one of the nation's newest and most complete basketball practice facilities.
- 5. Hecht Athletic Center Dedicated in 1979, the Hecht Center houses all the administrative offices within the University of Miami athletic program.
- 6. Greentree Practice Fields The practice home of the 1983, '87, '89 and '91 national football champions is complete with two full-length prescription athletic turf fields and a 55-yard artificial field.
- 7. Neil Schiff Tennis Center Dedicated in 1987, the home of Miami tennis is one of the top five facilities in the country.
- 8. Tom Kearns Sports Hall of Fame Dedicated in 1989, this structure serves as a home to the history and honor of former Hurricane athletes, teams and coaches who have distinguished themselves in their sports.
- 9. Golden 'Canes Football Offices This state-of-the-art complex was dedicated in 1989 and houses the meeting rooms and offices of the University of Miami football team.






UM's weight training facility is located in the Knight Sports Complex.





Hurricane Traditions

The Hurricanes:

It began in controversy. Some reports say that the '27 football team held a team meeting to select Hurricanes, hoping they would sweep away opponents just as the devastating storm did on September 16, 1926. Another version holds that Miami News columnist Jack Bell came out to the field the day before UM 's freshmen team played Rollins in '26 and asked end Porter Norris what the team should be called. Told that the local dignitaries and University officials wanted to name the team for a local flora or fauna. Norris said the players wouldn't stand for it and suggested "Hurricanes" since the opening game had been postponed by such a storm. From time to time, opposition has arisen to the name that would "reinforce Miami's negative reputation as a weather-beaten community living constantly under the threat of destruction. "But as one UM official rationalized in the 60's. "Does anyone think Chicago is overrun by bears just because the town has a football team by that name?"

Orange Green and White:

The school colors were selected in 1926 by a committee of Ruth Bryan Owens (daughter of famed attorney William Jennings Bryan). Harry Provin and Bertha Foster. Owens was a member of the board of regents and taught speech at the University. From her suggestion, the colors of the Florida orange tree were to represent UM - orange for the fruit itself, green for the leaves and white for the blossom.

The "U":

In 1973, the UM Athletic Federation, the fund-raising arm of the athletic department at the time. commissioned a local public relations expert to develop a distinctive logo. The University had gone several years with a variety of helmet and uniform changes and the Federation noted that a number of major colleges had the initials UM. Miami designer Bill Bodenheimer suggested the "U" idea, which lent itself to inserting silhouetted athletes in the middle of the "U" to establish distinctive logos for each sport as well as slogans like "U gotta believe" and "U is great."

When presented in color, the left side of the "U" is always orange while the right side is green.

The Miami Maniac:

Serving as the official mascot at all Hurricane basketball home games is the Miami Maniac. Having been originated by UM Baseball Coach Ron Fraser in 1983, the Maniac also performs at Miami baseball games as well as special performances as the official mascot of the College World Series. The student maniacs inside the costume also portray Sebastian The Ibis, the official mascot of Hurricane football.

Sebastian The Ibis:

The school yearbook adopted the name "lbis" with its inception in 1926, and the local marsh bird was considered UM's first unofficial mascot. In 1957, San Sebastian Hall, a UM residence hall, sponsored an Ibis entry in the homecoming celebration. The next year, student John Stormont performed at games in a glued, sewn and pinned together costume that was the forerunner of today's bird. Folklore has it that the Ibis, a symbol of knowledge found in the Everglades and Egypt, is the last sign of wildlife to take shelter before a hurricane and the first to reappear after the storm.

Hurricane Spirit

Cheerleaders:


The University of Miami cheerleaders perform at all home basketball contests and the BIG EAST Tournament as well as all home and away football games. The squad also provides a valuable public relations function for the University by promoting season ticket sales, participating in recruiting events and appearing at many charity functions. The squad, which has travelled to both Japan and Europe, is under the direction of Coach Dan Reynolds and has been nationally ranked on a consistent basis.

Sunsations:

Now in their seventh year of entertaining Hurricane fans, the University of Miami Sunsations dance group is a squad of enthusiastic and talented performers that was developed specifically for Hurricane Basketball events. The Sunsations now perform at all home UM basketball and football contests. The squad is coached by former member Natalie Latronico and have received national recognition for their work.

Edward T. Foote II

Edward T. "Tad" Foote II became the fourth president of the University of Miami in 1981.

After graduating from Yale University in 1959, Foote served three years in the U.S. Marine Corps. In the early 1960s, he worked as a journalist for the Washington Star. While in law school, he worked for the Washington Daily News and later was assistant to the chairman of the Pennsylvania Avenue

Commission in Washington, D.C.

Following graduation from Georgetown University Law Center in 1966, Foote practiced trial, appellate, and labor law in the firm of Bryan, Cave, McPheeters & McRoberts in St. Louis, Missouri.

In 1970 he became vice chancellor, general counsel, and secretary to the Board of Trustees for Washington University in St. Louis, then served from 1973-80 as dean of the Washington University School of Law, where he taught constitutional law and legal ethics. Before coming to Miami, Foote was special advisor to the chancellor and Board of Trustees for Washington University, while he chaired two federal court-appointed citizen's advisory committees which helped design and implement school desegregation plans for greater St. Louis in 1980 and 1981.

Upon his arrival at the University of Miami in 1981, Foote introduced corporate-style strategic planning. Among his top priorities were reducing the number of students while increasing the number of faculty. Approximately three-quarters of the current faculty were hired by Foote, and the University's research productivity has expanded dramatically under his leadership. The 1,881 faculty members attracted \$124 million in sponsored research for the 1992-93 academic year.

ECHT ATHLETIC CENTER

Ranked among the top 50 institutions receiving federal research funding, the University of Miami is the largest, most comprehensive, private research university in the Southeast.

During the past decade under Foote's leadership, the University of Miami added the School of Architecture, School of Communication, and Graduate School of International Studies, bringing to 14 the total number of

schools and colleges. He also launched an ambitious \$400 million five year fund-raising campaign, at the time the second largest capital campaign in the history of higher education. The campaign ended in 1990 with \$517.5 million in commitments, including endowments for 45 chairs in various academic disciplines.

In November of 1991, the University launched a \$15 million Cornerstone Campaign to raise funds for the library and college of arts and sciences.

Most recently, the University secured a \$10 million federal appropriation for the North-South Center, an international academic center that promotes the exchange of ideas, technology and research between the United States and the nations of Latin America, the Caribbean and Canada.

Foote also introduced the residential college concept at the University of Miami to enhance the undergraduate experience. Following a tradition established at universities in England and at a handful of institutions in the United States, each residential college is directed by a Master and faculty fellows, tenured senior faculty members who live at the college and are actively involved in planning a series of academic, social and recreational programs for resident students.

Active in a number of civic and educational organizations, Foote is a director of Ryder System, Inc. and a member of the Council on Foreign Relations. He is founding chairman of The Miami Coalition for a Drug-Free Community, a nationally recognized broad-based community organization committed to reducing the problems of illegal drugs. The Coalition has served as a model for community based anti-drug groups in over 193 cities and 41 countries, including Colombia.

Foote also serves on the President's Drug Advisory Council Steering Committee for a National Organization of Community Coalitions. Among other awards, Foote has received honorary degrees from Washington University (1981), Tokai University in Japan (1984), and Barry University (1991). In 1982, the president of Peru presented him with that country's highest honor, the Order of the Sun.



Paul T. Dee

The nationwide search for the University of Miami's tenth athletic director reinforced what President Edward T. Foote II already knew—that the best candidate for the position was part of the university family all along.

Paul T. Dee was named UM's Director of Athletics on June 25, 1993. Dee had served as general counsel for the University since 1981, building a reputation among his peers for his strong

leadership, integrity, fairness and ability to get along with people.

"Paul Dee is a natural to head our Department of Intercollegiate Athletics," UM President Edward T. Foote said on the day of his appointment. "He was my first choice.

"Paul has served this institution exceptionally well over the past 12 years, including especially wise counsel in many matters concerning intercollegiate athletics. I look forward to working with him in his new capacity.

"With Paul's leadership, the Hurricanes are well established to maintain their position as one of the very best programs of intercollegiate athletics in the country."

Dee has always enjoyed serving the University of Miami, he just decided to do it in a new and challenging capacity.

"With a great deal of humility and enthusiasm I have accepted the position of Director of Athletics," Dee said. "Being an Athletic Director is a wonderful challenge. Leading the intercollegiate athletics program at the

University of Miami is incomparable."

Dee, 46, is no stranger to intercollegiate athletics, having twice served as Miami's interim athletic direct

having twice served as Miami's interim athletic director and working closely with the athletic department during his tenure as University general counsel. He has served on committees that brought former athletic directors Sam Jankovich and Dave Maggard to UM, negotiated radio and TV contracts and is nationally renowned as a speaker on educational, ethical and legal issues concerning intercollegiate athletics.

During his latest five-week stint as interim athletic director when Maggard resigned to become Director of Sports for the 1996 Summer Olympics in Atlanta, Dee showed his commitment to women's athletics, signing women's basketball coach Ferne Labati to a multi-year contract. Dee is openly committed to gender equity issues, the possible renewal of football series with Notre Dame and Florida and the need for an on-campus convocation center for Hurricane basketball.

Dee believes intensifying fund raising efforts and developing stronger interest in women's sports are vital to ensuring the continued success of the Hurricane program

"I see my role as leading the charge to sustaining the high levels of play and providing the resources that are necessary for our athletic teams to do well academically and on the field of play," Dee said. That high level of success is epitomized by the Hurricane football program, which has become the nation's elite program with four national titles in ten years.

"I have complete confidence in Paul Dee and I'm very happy with his selection as athletic director," said Head Football Coach Dennis Erickson. "He knows athletics. He knows our program. This is one of the best things to happen to the University of

Miami athletic program."

Dee has also played a vital role in Miami's transition into a Big East Conference member.

"During the two periods in which Paul Dee has served as athletic director, he has made quite an impact and developed a strong working relationship with our people," said Mike Tranghese, Commissioner of the Big East Conference. "We are all thrilled with his appointment as athletic director."

Before joining the university, Dee was with the Miami law firm of Mershon, Sawyer, Johnston, Dunwoody & Cole and was a law clerk for Chief U.S. District Judge Charles Fulton in Miami. He received his Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of Florida in

1970 and his Master's of Education and Juris Doctor degrees with honors from the University of Miami in 1973 and 1977. He is a candidate for the Doctor of Education.

While in law school, he served as editor of the UM Law Review. He is active in the National Association of College and University Attorneys, and served on its Board of Directors from 1986-89. He is active in local and state bar associations and recently chaired the Judicial Nominating Commission for Florida's 3rd District Court of Appeal. Dee was also Athletic Director at Glades Central High School in Belle Glade, Florida from 1971-74.

Dee was raised in West Palm Beach. Married to the former Elizabeth Hall, he and his wife have a son, Terrance, who is a sophomore at Harvard.

Leonard Hamilton

Head Basketball Coach

One more step.

Every day, Leonard Hamilton takes one more step

towards his goal of having the finest college basketball team in the land.

When he was hired as the new Hurricane coach on April 2, 1990. Hamilton knew that to compete with the best, he must play the best. But no one could have predicted how swiftly or emphatically the best competition would appear on the Miami schedule. After just six months at Miami, Hamilton was presented with one of the most difficult challenges a collegiate coach has ever faced — to compete in the BIG EAST Conference.

In order to raise the Hurricanes' level of competition, it was obvious that Hamilton was required to raise the level of talent flowing into the Miami program. Tremendous strides were realized in this area during the

last three recruiting seasons. Having long been recognized as a brilliant evaluator and recruiter of high school talent, Hamilton continued his legacy by producing what many consider to be the finest classes in Miami history as three consecutive UM classes have been ranked in the Top 20 nationally by recruiting expert Bob Gibbons.

The rookie class of 1992-93 contained the most promise and was ranked No. 4 in the country. However, injuries took their toll as just two of last year's freshmen were able to see action.

Those two rookies, Steve Edwards and Lorenzo Pearson, made their presence known by helping the Hurricanes jump from one conference win in 1991-92 to seven wins in '92-93 (the third-largest increase in wins in BIG EAST history). All of Miami's conference victories came at home in the Miami Arena as the 'Canes' 7-2 home BIG EAST record was the thirdbest among all league teams.

Seton Hall and Pittsburgh were the only two conference foes to escape the Miami Arena without a loss in 1992-93 and after two full seasons in the BIG EAST Conference, only one

team, Seton Hall, has yet to be beaten by Miami.


During the 1991-92 campaign, Hamilton continued his lofty expectations in the academic realm as all four Hurricane seniors earned their degrees by June of 1992. On the court, Leonard Hamilton scoffed at the critics who claimed he would not even come close to a victory in his inaugural BIG EAST campaign as the Hurricanes defeated St. John's in their conference home-opener — a victory that would prove to cost the Redmen the outright BIG EAST Championship.

Along the way, the Hurricanes surprised their opponents, fans and media as they battled every opponent with the intensity and perseverance which their head coach both demands and instills. Miami proved to be especially tough toward the end of their first BIG EAST campaign, losing their final five conference games by an average of just seven points, including a 90-82 overtime loss to eventual No. 1 BIG EAST Tournament seed Seton Hall.

The Hurricanes earned the respect of the entire college basketball world in their first BIG EAST Tournament appearance at Madison Square Garden when they upset Pittsburgh, 83-71, in the opening round of action at The Mecca. Miami threatened to repeat the upset in the second round of action as they led co-BIG EAST champion Georgetown, 34-33, at the half before dropping a 77-64 decision to Alonzo Mourning and the Hoyas.

Hamilton was granted one year of coaching at Miami before entering BIG EAST competition. Determined to make the most of the Hurricanes' final season as an independent, Hamilton quickly laid the groundwork for the future of the Hurricanes. Off the court, Hamilton saw to it that both seniors on his 1990-91 squad would graduate by spring. On the court, he directed the development of Joe Wylie, who was selected in the second round of the 1991 NBA Draft, and inspired his Hurricane squad to produce their absolute best at all times. The efforts paid off as Miami finished the season with what was then their highest final ranking by USA Today since the rebirth of the program.





Hamilton came to Miami from Oklahoma State University where he directed the Cowboys to consecutive appearances in the National Invitational Tournament, marking the first back-to-back post-season tournament appearances for an OSU team since 1953-54.

The 1989-90 OSU squad earned a No. 49 national ranking by USA Today, finished the year with a 17-14 record and advanced to the second round of the NIT before dropping a decision to tournament semifinalist New Mexico. Offensive firepower was a key for Hamilton's corps as the Cowboys averaged more than 80 points for the second consecutive season and just the third time in school history, while also setting school records for most points and most three-point goals.

Hamilton's last two Oklahoma State teams both won 17 games, marking only the fourth and fifth OSU squads to reach the 17-win total in the last 32 years. And of the 14 losses during the 1989-90 campaign, seven came against teams ranked in the nation's Top 10 at the time of the game (UNLV, Oklahoma, Missouri and Kansas). The overall schedule was rated one of the toughest in the nation and included a total of 17 games against teams that went on to post-season play, with wins over Ohio State, Memphis State, New Orleans and a 2-1 record against Kansas State (one of those wins coming in the Big Eight Tournament).

Prior to Oklahoma State, Hamilton served at the University of Kentucky where he spent 12 seasons with one of the top programs in the country. From 1974-80, he served as assistant coach (the 'Cats won a national title in 1978), and in 1980 he was honored by being named the first associate head coach in Kentucky basketball history, a post he held until moving to OSU. In his 12-year tenure at Kentucky, seven recruiting classes were ranked among the nation's elite and 23 former Wildcat players were drafted by the NBA. Additionally, 83% of the seniors (30 of 36) earned their degrees.

His proficiency in the recruiting game carried over to Oklahoma

State where his first two classes were rated 12th in the country by different services. He signed four of five Oklahoma High School Players of the Year and was involved with the recruitment of 30 high school All-Americans.

Hamilton played collegiate basketball at Gaston (N.C.) Community College, where he set a school

record by scoring 54 points in a game, and at Tennessee-Martin. where he is a charter member of the school's Hall of Fame. His coaching career began as a graduate assistant (1971-72) and full-time assistant (1972-74) at Austin Peay State, where he received his Master's degree.

Now in his fourth season as a key member of Leonard Hamilton's staff is Assistant Coach Thad Fitzpatrick.

The 37-year-old Fitzpatrick came to Miami from the University of Wyoming where he spent three seasons as an assistant under Head Coach Benny Dees. During his tenure at Wyoming, the Cowboys recorded a 56-38 record.

Prior to Wyoming, Fitzpatrick spent eight seasons as a full-time assistant coach at his alma mater, Auburn University at Montgomery. He served a dual role at AUM as both an assistant coach and the coordinator of student affairs. AUM enjoyed six 20-win seasons in his eight years with the Senators and totalled a 161-87 mark during that time.

A 1979 graduate of Auburn-Montgomery, Fitzpatrick lettered for the Senators for his final two collegiate seasons following a stellar career at Alabama Christian Junior College where he also was a twoyear letterman. Following graduation, he was an assistant for two years at AUM while earning his master's degree in educational administration.

Born in Montgomery, Alabama on September 23, 1956, Fitzpatrick is married to the former Madis Hooks of Bayminette, AL. The couple has two children — Dana, 7, and Thaddeus, Jr., 3.

BIG EAST Profile

Tith the position The BIG EAST Conference holds in the world of college athletics, it may still be surprising to some that the league is only entering its 15th year of existence in 1993-94. The group, which became a reality in 1979, reflects a tradition of broad-based programs, led by administrators and coaches who place a constant emphasis on academic integrity.

Today, The BIG EAST Conference enjoys a leadership role nationally. Its student-athletes boast significantly high graduation rates and their record of scholastic achievement notably reflects a balance between intercollegiate athletics and academics.

Nnenna Lynch of Villanova University is a prime example of a model student-athlete in The BIG EAST. An eight-time NCAA All-American in track and cross country, she was a member of four consecutive NCAA Division I Cross Country national championship teams.

She was the 1992 NCAA Outdoor Track 3000-meter champion and finished third individually at the 1992 NCAA Cross Country Championships. Academically, she was one of 32 Americans in 1993 to receive a Rhodes Scholarship. She also was a winner of the prestigious NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship and the NACDA/ Disney Scholar-Athlete Award. She was the 1992-93 Gillette BIG EAST Female Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

While the BIG EAST certainly made its splash with men's basketball as its signature program, the

conference also has enjoyed a steady, wide-ranging growth. For '93-94, the league has added women's soccer to its championship list which has grown to 19. Also, the women's softball and field hockey champions will receive automatic bids to the NCAA championships for the first time.

Any successful consortium enjoys outstanding leadership. Michael Tranghese, the league's first full time employee, and for 11 years the associate of Dave Gavitt, took over as Commissioner in June, 1990, after Gavitt left to take a position with the Boston Celtics. Tranghese's list of achievements is extensive. He administered the addition of the University of Miami and the formation of The BIG EAST Football Conference. His first year at the helm was a microcosm of what the BIG EAST had become – a respected and proactive player in the world of college athletics.

The University of Miami became the league's 10th full member on October 10, 1990. The largest private institution in the Southeast, Miami is a prized addition to a conference already noted for a successful co-existence of academics and athletics.

BIG EAST sports attract the interest of followers in the nation's largest media markets within New England, the New York metropolitan area, Washington D.C., Pennsylvania and Florida. Innovative concepts in promotion and publicity, particularly regarding television, have resulted in unparalleled visibility for BIG EAST student-athletes. Exclusive long-range television contracts with CBS and ESPN, as well as the unique operative known as The BIG EAST Conference Television Network, provide BIG EAST basketball with more television exposure than any other conference.

Additionally, BIG EAST championship events in track. men's soccer, women's basketball and baseball have been seen on various cable networks across the country.

While BIG EAST basketball games are regular sellouts at campus and major public sports buildings, including the annual BIG EAST Tournament Championship in Madison Square Garden, attendance figures also are significant at BIG EAST soccer, women's basketball and baseball games.

More than 200 BIG EAST athletes have earned All-America recognition, and dozens have won individual NCAA national championships. The BIG EAST has been well-represented in U.S., foreign national and Olympic teams, with several athletes earning gold medals in the summer Olympiads in Barcelona in '92, Seoul in 1988 and Los Angeles in '84.

Some feats of note since the inauguration of the league in 1979-80:

- Six Final Four appearances and NCAA men's basketball titles by Georgetown in 1984 and Villanova in '85.
- 1991 NCAA Women's Final Four appearance by Connecticut.
- Four straight NCAA women's cross country titles by Villanova (1989-92).
- 1992 Olympians (U.S. and others) in men's basketball, men's track and field and women's swimming.
- 1988 Olympians (U.S. and others) in baseball, men's basketball, women's track and field, and men's track and field.
- 1984 Olympians in men's track and field, women's swimming, and men's basketball.
- 1987 women's basketball Wade Trophy winner (Shelley Pennefather, Villanova)
- 11 top five NCAA team finishes in men's indoor track and field.
- 12 NCAA individual event champions and five relay event champions in women's track and field.
- 19 NCAA individual event champions and seven relay champions in men's track and field.
- 10 top 10 NCAA team finishes and eight top 10 individual finishes in men's cross country.
- 14 top 10 NCAA team finishes (three in 1989, '91 and '92) and 13 top 10 individual finishes in women's cross country.
- All-Americas in men's soccer (19), baseball (17), softball (7), men's swimming and diving (3), women's swimming and diving (10).

The BIG EAST became a reality on May 31, 1979. following a meeting of athletic directors from Providence College, St. John's, Georgetown, and Syracuse Universities. Seton Hall, Connecticut and Boston College completed the original seven-school alliance, which increased to nine with the admittance of Villanova (1980-81) and Pittsburgh (1982-83) and to 10 with Miami (1991-92).

Only two men have served as BIG EAST Commissioner. Dave Gavitt, former basketball coach and athletic director at Providence, was succeeded by longtime associate Michael Tranghese June 21, 1990. Tranghese supervises operations from the Providence league headquarters, where the conference staff administers to 5,000 athletes in 19 championship events.

The Nation's Most Televised Conference

The BIG EAST will again be the most televised basketball conference in the nation, BIG EAST teams will receive more national exposures than any other league, and the BIG EAST Television Network, the nation's largest regional college basketball network, will continue to produce games on a regional basis.

The BIG EAST has long been an innovative leader in its approach to negotiating and approving television packages for the league's member schools. BIG EAST

schools are located in six of the top 17 markets and seven of the top 23. BIG EAST television markets include almost one-third of the nation's television homes.

The league was the first to sign an exclusive contract with a major network (CBS) and a national cable network (ESPN). In 1985, the BIG EAST became the first league to act as its own syndicator by forming the BIG EAST Conference Television Network. Under the supervision of Commissioner Mike Tranghese and Associate Commissioner Tom McElroy, the BIG EAST Network produces games for telecast in each school's local market.

Currently, the BIG EAST is in the third year of a fouryear agreement with CBS. The BIG EAST and CBS have been television partners for the past 10 years, the last seven on an exclusive basis. The initial agreement was made in 1985. The current contract provides for 24 appearances per season, including seven conference games, four intersectional contests and the semifinals and championship of the BIG EAST Tournament.

The BIG EAST and ESPN have grown together. In 1979-80, ESPN began the "Monday Night Game of the Week" concept which was also the first year of existence for the BIG EAST. ESPN and the BIG EAST are also in the third year of an agreement which will run for five seasons. ESPN will televise 18 conference games as part of their Big Monday and Wednesday formats along with four intersectional games.

University of Miami Basketball — 1926-1994

It lay silent for 14 years. Collecting dust and going unnoticed, the Miami basketball I program was the Rip VanWinkle of college basketball from 1971 to 1985. Now, Hurricane Basketball is back. In a big way.

Since 1985 the Miami program has undergone such dramatic and frequent changes, it seemed that the Hurricanes were continually entering "a new era." First came the "Era of Miami Basketball "itself. Then came the "Bill Foster Era," followed by the "Tito Horford Era," The Leonard Hamilton Era, "and finally,"The Big East Era."

The latest step taken by the blossoming Hurricane program serves as the most dramatic in the 41 seasons and 66 years since the team's formation. With the entry into the Big East Conference, the University of Miami not only sheds its previous life-long status as an independent, it enters the ranks of the most competitive and successful basketball conference in the nation.

The road to conference affiliation in the Big East has not been an easy one for those who have thirsted for basketball in this continually prospering section of the country. Moreover, the previous path traveled by Miami basketball players, coaches and fans was dotted by flashes of brilliance, color and sometimes disappointment.


Here is a capsule summary of the 66 years of Miami basketball that have intermittently played a part in the history of the athletic program at the University and its neighboring community.


• The Hurricanes fielded a freshman team in 1926-27, finishing 7-1 under Head Coach Art Webb.

• In 1927-28, the first official varsity basketball team at the University of Miami posted an 8-4

mark, knocking off Rollins, 51-15, in the opener.

 Miami records list no official results from 1932 through 1938. During that period of time, representatives from the school played local AAU and church sponsored teams under Coach Tom McCann.






the nation, Miami dropped intercollegiate basketball during the war years of 1942 through 1945.

• Morris returned as head coach

along with the program in 1956 and was the UM mentor until 1952 when Dave Wike took over for a two vear stint as the UM coach.


• In 1954, the University named Bruce Hale as its head basketball coach. The retired Air Force captain and former professional basketball star held the UM head

coaching post for 13 seasons. leading the Hurricane program through its glory years of intercolle-




Bruce Hale (center) was the Hurricane head coach from 1954 to 1967.


giate basketball. Before the end of Hale's tenure in 1967, the Hurricanes won 220 games and lost 112 for a .663 winning percentage. Hale's first Miami team turned in a 9-11 record, but there were no other losing campaigns in the next 12 years. The streak of non-losing

- seasons extended in the 1968-69 season - marking 14 consecutive campaigns of .500 basketball or better for the UM.
- Hale's 1959-60 club was the only UM men's basketball team to ever advance to the NCAA Tournament. That 1959-60 edition ran its record to 23-3 before bowing to Western Kentucky, 107-84, in the first round of the tournament.
- During that historic '59-60 NCAA Tournament year, junior guard Dick Hickox became the first UM basketball player to earn All-America recognition. Hickox averaged 22.1 points per game during that season en route to becoming a second-team AP and UPI All-American.
- The Dick Hickox-led Hurricanes of 1960-61 returned to post season play — falling in the first round of the NIT to St. Louis, 58-56. The 1960-61 squad compiled a 20-7 record.
- In 1962-63, Miami advanced to the second round of the NIT before falling to **Providence**, **106-96**. An opening round NIT victory over St. Francis, 71-70, marks the only Miami victory to date in post season play.
- From 1962 through 1965, Miami recorded three consecutive twentywin seasons, rolling up a composite record of 65-16. The star of these Hurricane glory teams was a brilliant scorer named Rick Barry.
- In 1964-65, Barry became the Hurricanes' only consensus All-America selection. The 6-7, 200pound native of Roselle Park, New Jersey led the nation in scoring with a 37.4 average in his senior season. He later went on to become the only player in basketball history to win single-season scoring titles in the NCAA, the ABA and the
- The 1964-65 Miami squad, led by Barry's scoring brilliance, established a new NCAA offense record by averaging 98.4 points per game. The 'Canes, however, were not allowed to participate in the NCAA Tournament that year after posting a 22-4 record because of recruiting violations.
- Bruce Hale resigned as head coach after the 1966-67 season and UM

- assistant Ron Godfrey assumed the head coaching responsibilities.
- · Don Curnutt closed out his Miami basketball career in 1970 as the Hurricanes' third and last player to receive All-America recognition.
- February 27, 1971 The last victory by a University of Miami men's basketball team came in the second to the last game of the season, a **100-94** triumph over Florida State at home in the **Dinner Key Auditorium.** The 'Canes shot a season-high 62.5% from the floor as all five Miami starters scored in double figures.
- March 1, 1971 After posting a four year record of 47-56 at Miami. Ron Godfrey resigned his post as head basketball coach, effective following Miami's final game of the season against nationally ranked Jacksonville.
- March 2, 1971 The last basketball game played by a University of Miami men's team until 1985 took place at the Dinner Key Auditorium where one of the largest UM home crowds in years turned out to see the Hurricanes host nationally ranked Jacksonville. The Dolphins handed Miami a 94-75 loss that would remain as the UM's last contest for the next 14 years.
- April 22, 1971 The University of Miami Board of Trustees voted to drop the sport "temporarily until such time as a permanent field house can be constructed on the main campus." Sagging attendance figures and serious financial losses were also believed to contribute to the discontinuation of basketball at the UM.
- July 15, 1983 Sam Jankovich was named athletic director at the University of Miami. Coming to the UM after a successful stint as the athletic director at Washington State, Jankovich immediately announced that the resurrection of men's basketball at Miami would be his primary priority in the early months of his tenure, enabling the UM to have "one of the nation's most complete and visible overall programs in the country.
- October 12, 1983 The University of Miami Board of Trustees unanimously voted to reinstate men's basketball at the University




Sam Jankovich and Head Coach Bill Foster - March 21, 1984


of Miami. The Board made the decision after reviewing a report submitted by newly hired Athletic Director Sam Jankovich which stated that men's basketball can be a revenue-producing venture. Moreover, nearly \$500,000 had already been raised in support of bringing intercollegiate basketball back to the University. It was also announced that the Hurricanes would be ready to compete on the Division I level in the 1985-86 season, and the downtown James L. Knight Center would serve as

the home court for the reborn

"This is an exciting day for the University and for the athletic program," UM President Edward T. Foote, II said at a press conference. "And we are keeping in mind the priorities of academics first and athletics second ... we are pleased that the changes in the economics of intercollegiate basketball allow the University to resurrect one of the country's most popular sports ... and the rise in television income during recent years makes basket-



James L. Knight (right) and James McLamore, Chairman of the UM Board of Trustees at the dedication of the Knight Sport Complex.



ball a money-maker at universities like ours. We look forward to welcoming these Hurricanes home again."

• March 21, 1984 — Bill Foster, a 47-year-old native of Hemingway, South Carolina was named the

seventh men's basketball coach at the University of Miami. Foster came to Miami after 19 years as a head coach at three different institutions: Shorter College, North Caro-

lina-Charlotte and Clemson. Foster also announced on this day that Clint Bryant, a long-time assistant at Clemson, would also join the Miami staff in a similar capacity.


- April 9, 1984 Bill Foster announced the hiring of a second assistant coach, Seth Greenberg, who was serving as an assistant coach to Terry Holland at the University of Virginia.
- April 16, 1984 Tim Harvey, a 6-10, 240-pound center, became the first basketball player to commit to the University of Miami in over 14 years. The Plainfield, New Jersey native announced that he would transfer to Miami after spending two seasons in the Georgia Tech University program.
- July 1, 1984 A third assistant coach was hired to complete the basketball staff as Miami native Cesar Odio returned home after serving as an assistant coach at his alma mater, Florida Southern College.
- October 11, 1984 Nearly one full year after the announcement that basketball would return to the University, Athletic Director Sam Jankovich announced that a million dollar-plus practice facility would be constructed on the Coral Gables campus. The new all purpose structure - located between the Hecht Athletic Center and the Greentree Track would be totally

funded through a gift from the James L. Knight Charitable Trust.


- The first phase of the 1985-86 basketball schedule was also announced on this day, and the line-up included such perennial powers as North Carolina, Georgia, Notre Dame, Marquette and Dayton.
- October 15, 1984 The first men's basketball practice session in over twelve years was held on the patio in the center of campus. More than 200 members of the student body participated as Foster and his assistants searched for prospects under the warm Florida sun.
- April 25, 1985 Foster announced that the UM's 1985-86 basketball roster would include nine freshmen, one sophomore and one junior as the spring signing period ends for NCAA basketball.
- August 16, 1985 Athletic Director Sam Jankovich announced that the 1985-86 basketball schedule had been completed and that network television coverage of the Hurricane program would include two games to be broadcast by CBS (Arizona) and ESPN (Notre Dame).
- Jankovich also announced the completion of a local television schedule (on WBFS-Channel 33) that would bring all nine UM road games back to Miami by way of live local broadcasts. Channel 33 would also carry selected home games in the Knight Center.
- WIOD Radio, the radio voice of UM football and baseball would also carry all Hurricane basketball games with veteran Hurricane announcer Sonny Hirsch at the microphone.
- October 15, 1985 Basketball practice officially begins at the University of Miami in the Knight Sports Complex.
- November 12, 1985 The Knight Sports Complex was dedicated at a gala banquet that was held on the basketball courts of the new structure. CBS basketball analyst Billy Packer served as the evening's guest speaker for an event which welcomed over 500 guests to the on-campus home of Hurricane basketball. The facility

now serves as the practice home to the men's and women's basketball programs while also housing the men's basketball coaching staff offices. In addition, the Knight Sports Complex enabled the athletic program to more than double the size of the existing strength room, while also providing meeting rooms and lecture rooms for all of Miami's student athletes. The structure is located between the Hecht Athletic Center and the Greentree Track.

• November 22, 1985 - The brand new era of Hurricane basketball was ushered in by a young UM squad which defeated The Citadel, 85-77, in front of a sellout crowd of 4,984 at the Knight Center. Dennis Burns (24 points), Kevin Presto (22) and Eric Brown (21) combined to lead the Miami offense, while Bryan Hughes enjoyed the distinction of scoring Miami's first



- November 30, 1985 Miami stuns 1985 NCAA Tourney participant Georgia with a thrilling 81-78 victory to capture the first AMI Classic Championship at the James L. Knight Center.
- March 5, 1986 An 84-62 loss to Marguette in Milwaukee closed the Hurricanes' first season since 1970-71. Miami finished the year with a 14-14 record, giving Bill Foster his 19th non-losing record in 20 years as a collegiate head coach.
- The 1986-87 season Though still considered "America's Youngest **Team.**" Miami compiled a 15-16 slate - recording upset victories over Marquette, Stanford and Florida State, while losing by only four points to future BIG EAST foe Providence – a team that advanced to the NCAA Final Four.
- The 1987-88 season Thrilling victories over both Providence and Virginia Commonwealth propelled the 'Canes to continued improvement with a 17-14 record. Following the season, center Tito Horford announced his intention to enter the NBA Draft without completing his final two seasons of eligibility. Miami was left with anything but a depleted roster as ten lettermen, including eight seniors, returned for the UM's fourth season of basketball.
- April 12, 1988 Athletic Director Sam Jankovich announces plans to move Hurricane Basketball to the new \$56 million Miami Arena, Also home to the NBA's Miami Heat, the state-of-the-art basketball facility signifies a new era in the rise of South Florida basketball.
- December 10, 1988 A UM record crowd of 6,654 watch the Hurricanes run neck-and-neck for 40 minutes with ACC powerhouse Duke. Blue Devil Danny Ferry needs a superhuman performance to stop the 'Canes as he connects on 23 of 26 shots en route to 58 points. Ferry later calls Miami "a definite Top 40 team."
- January 12, 1989 Joel Warren's free throw, his only point of the evening, with two seconds remaining clinch Miami's first victory over

- a Top 20 team as the 'Canes upset defending national champion and No. 16-ranked Kansas, 87-86, at the Miami Arena.
- March 6, 1989 The Hurricanes post an 89-82 win over Florida International University in the first annual Carnival Miami Cup. The win leaves Miami with a 19-12 slate, good enough for the best record in 24 years and ten seasons at Miami. Eric Brown ends his brilliant Miami career with 2.270 career points, just 28 back of All-America Rick Barry's Hurricane record of 2,298.
- * December 6, 1989 Miami hands an 87-82 loss to eventual NCAA tournament participant University of Dayton as a Hurricane squad that includes six freshmen and no seniors jumps out with three consecutive wins to start the season.
- January 18, 1990 Nearly 5,000 fans turn out to watch one of the most exciting Hurricane games ever as Miami edges Florida State in two OTs, 101-97.
- February 19, 1990 Miami storms back to post a 62-59 victory over the University of Florida, ending the Gators 11-game win streak over the 'Canes that began during the 1964-65 season.
- March 6, 1990 The Hurricanes send Head Coach Bill Foster out on a winning note as one of the most successful and respected collegiate coaches in the nation leaves Miami following an 83-55 win over Florida International. Foster's six-year rebuilding record at Miami stands at 78-71 (.523) while his overall career mark tallies up to 431-247 (.636) in 24 seasons.
- April 2, 1990 UM Athletic Director Sam Jankovich ends a national search for a new coach that spanned an entire season with the hiring of **Leonard Hamilton** from Oklahoma State University, "After meeting with Leonard Hamilton for just five minutes," said Jankovich, "with that smile and that enthusiasm, there was no question who I wanted as coach of the University of Miami."
- October 10, 1990 On the combined recommendation of President Edward T. Foote and Athletic

- Director Sam Jankovich, the University's Board of Trustees unanimously votes to accept an invitation to become the tenth member of the BIG EAST Conference. The Hurricane Basketball program will begin BIG EAST play in the 1991-92 season.
- December 28, 1990 The Hurricanes rebound from back-to-back double overtime defeats to upset No. 28-ranked Mississippi State, 74-67, in the consolation contest of the Eastern Airlines Palm Beach Classic. Joe Wylie is voted to the all-tournament squad after breaking seven tourney records including total points with 60 in the two games.
- January 3, 1991 Joe Wylie becomes only the 17th player in the history of UM basketball to score 1000 career points. Wylie would later go on to finish his UM career ranked No. 8 for both scoring and rebounding in the UM record books.
- March 6, 1991 Leonard Hamilton's inaugural season ends with a 9-19 won-lost mark. However, there were large doses of success layden throughout the year as the 'Canes were victorious in six of their final nine contests and finished ranked No. 128 in the USA Today computer rankings - Miami's highest finish since the rebirth of the program (including 1988-89 when the 'Canes produced a 19-12 record).
- April 10, 1991 Leonard Hamilton's first recruiting class is completed with the signing of Ochiel Swaby of Miami, the nation's leading HS scorer with 47.1 points per game. Added to Hamilton's three signees in the Fall of 1990 - Michael Gardner of Fredericksburg, VA, Pat Lawrence of St. Petersburg and 7'3" Constantin Popa of Bucharest, Romanina – the freshmen class for the 1991-92 season is ranked in the Top 25 by recruiting expert Bob Gibbons.
- January 2, 1992 Miami tips off in its inaugural BIG EAST contest at the University of Connecticut's Gampel Pavilion. It is a baptism by fire for the young Hurricanes as the

game at UConn is the first of four consecutive conference games in 10 days for Miami.

• January 14, 1992 - In the first home conference game in UM

history, the Hurricanes shock the nation with a stunning 45-42 upset of perennial BIG EAST power St. John's. The UM victory would ultimately cost the Redmen the


- outright conference championship as they completed the regular season in a tie with Georgetown and Seton Hall.
- March 12, 1992 Miami turns the Big Apple upside down with a convincing 83-71 victory over Pittsburgh in the BIG EAST Tournament at Madison Square Garden. The Panthers had beaten Miami in the two regular-season contests by a total of 52 points, but Jerome Scott (30 points) and Trevor Burton (25 points) led a spirited Miami squad past Pitt and into the second round of the conference showcase. Earning the respect of the league and nation. Miami led Georgetown, 34-33, at the half of their quarterfinal contest before dropping a 77-64 decision to the Hoyas. The 1-1 performance in New York ended the Hurricanes' 1991-92 campaign at 8-24 and conjured visions of the tremendous future that awaits the Miami program. For his individual performance, Jerome Scott is honored as a member of the BIG EAST All-Tournament Team.
- April 28, 1992 Head Coach Leonard Hamilton takes another giant step in the development of Miami basketball with the completion of his second recruiting class. Six prep standouts, including Steve Edwards of Miami Senior High School, make up the new Hurricane class which is ranked No. 4 in the nation.

- January 2, 1993 For the second consecutive season, Miami opens its home BIG EAST schedule with a victory as the Hurricanes upset No. 10-ranked Georgetown, 80-69. The resounding victory marks the highest-ranked team the 'Canes have defeated since the rebirth of the program.
- March 6, 1993 Miami finishes the regular-season campaign with a thrilling 77-76 win over Villanova at the Miami Arena. The victory gives Miami a 7-2 record in home BIG EAST games and an increase of six victories over the Hurricanes' first season in conference play (1-17 to 7-11) to mark the third-largest jump in the win column in BIG EAST history.


