- Pitt's three seniors: Cameron Wright, Der-rick Randall and Aron Phillips-Nwankwo. Pitt enters its Miami game with a 14-2 home record this year. Pitt is in its 13th season in the Petersen Events Center and carries a 207-29 record (.877) and 85-26 record vs.
- A win would give Pitt its 20th win for the 13th consecutive season.
- Pitt has won six of its last nine games including victories over nationally ranked teams Notre Dame and North Carolina and a recent road win at Syracuse. With two regular season games left on Pitt's sched-ule, Pitt finds itself in the mix for an NCAA
- ule, Pitt finds itself in the mix for an NCAA Tournament at-large bid. When comparing ACC basketball programs over the last 13 years, Pitt ranks second in the ACC in overall winning percentage (6th nationally, 364-117, 757), league winning percentage (160-78, .672), homecourt win-ning percentage (.877) and NCAA Tourna-ment appearances (12).

Miami plays at the Petersen Events Center for the first time. Pitt has won five of the last six meetings against Miami dating back to January 3, 2001. Pitt is 9-5 overall vs.

Miami in games played in Pittsburgh. Last year, Pitt claimed a 59-55 victory over Miami in overtime at the BankUnited Center in Miami. It was the first meeting between the two schools in 10 years.

Pitt (19-11, 8-8 ACC) plays its final home game when it hosts Miami (18-11, 8-8 ACC) on Wednesday at the Petersen Events Center. Tipoff is scheduled for 8 p.m. ET.

The game will be regionally televised by the ACC Network and broadcast locally in Southwestern Pennsylvania on WTAE (Channel 4) with Tim Brando (play-by-play) and Mike Gminski (color commentary) handling announcing duties. Rob Reichley will handle production.

NCAA Tournament status and ACC Tournament seeding is on the line as both Pitt and Miami enter the game locked in a four-team tie for seventh place in the ACC standings with

identical 8-8 records along with Clemson and North Carolina State. Pitt closes out regular season play at Florida State on Saturday.

A win Wednesday night against Miami would give Pitt its 20th victory for the 14th consecutive season. It would be the 22nd alltime 20-win campaign in school history. With two wins to close out the regular season, Pitt has a chance to win 10 league regular season games for the 13th time in the last 14 years. A victory would also close out its regular season season with a 15-2 home record at the Petersen Events Center.

ranked No. 92 in the RPI. It made 56-spot leap over a four-week, eightgame February span to No. 36. In addition, another factor in the equation is that four of Pitt's losses have come without senior Cameron Wright on the court. With two regular season games remaining-Miami (March 4) and at Florida State (March 7)-Pitt has a chance to advance to its 13th NCAA Tournament over its last 14 seasons.

Pitt is coming off a 69-66 loss at Wake Forest on Sunday. Wake Forest used an 11-1 run to erase a

seven-point Pitt lead over the game's final 5:23. Pitt led for the majority of the game. Michael Young led all scorers with 22 points and eight rebounds, Jamel Artis finished with 19 points and nine rebounds and Cameron Wright added 11 points for Pitt.

Pitt hosts Miami for the first time at the Petersen Events Center. The visiting Hurricanes are coming off a 73-64 loss to North Carolina on Saturday. Miami is led by Sheldon McClellan (14.9 ppg./4.6 rpg.) and Angel Rodriguez (12.3 ppg./4.2

apg.).

Pitt returned three starters-senior off guard Cameron Wright, point guard Robinson and power forward Michael Young- and eight of its top 10 scorers from a 2013-14 team that finished 26-10 overall, 11-7 and in fifth place in its first year in the ACC and earned a 12th NCAA Tournament appearance in the last 13 seasons. Through the season's first seven games, the Panthers have been a different team without two of their most experienced players: Wright and Durand Johnson. Wright



JAMIE DIXON REACHES 300-VIC-TORY MILESTONE

With a 73-64 win over Florida State on Jan. 14, Pitt head coach Jamie Dixon became just the second head coach in school history to reach 300 or more career wins. His accomplishment ranks among the alltime NCAA Division I records for fastest to 300 career wins in both number of games (ranks 19th alltime) and total seasons (12, will tie for third all-time). On the total

PITT'S I3-YEAR SUCCESS (2001-14)

The following is a list of accomplishments achieved by the Pitt Basketball program over the last 13 seasons:

- Compiled a 345-106 record over the last 13 seasons and .750 winning percentage, which ranks among the nation's top five best winning percentages during that span. The record also ranks second in the ACC from 2001-14.

PITT PICKED TO FINISH SIXTH IN PRESEASON ACC MEDIA POLL

CHARLOTTE, N.C.—Pitt was selected by league media members to finish sixth out of 15 schools at its second Atlantic Coast Conference Operation Basketball preseason media day held Wednesday at the Westin Hotel in downtown Charlotte. Over 300 writers, television broadcasters, radio producers and other assorted media members attended the ACC's 53rd annual event.

In a vote of the league's attending media members, Pitt finished sixth with 592 total points. Duke was selected to capture first place with 935 points and 41 first place votes, followed by No. 2 North Carolina (870 points/12 first place votes), No. 3 Louisville (847/3 first place votes), No. 4 Virginia (824/7 first place votes), No. 5 Syracuse (706/2 first place votes) and No. 6 Pitt.

It was the second consecutive season that Pitt was picked to finish sixth in preseason voting. The Panthers ended up finishing fifth in their first ACC season in 2013-14.

North Carolina's Marcus Paige was selected the preseason player of the year, while Duke's Jahlil Okafor was named preseason rookie of the year. The preseason All-ACC team included Paige, Okafor, Louisville's Montrezl Harrell, Virginia's Malcolm Brogdon and Notre Dame's Jerian Grant.

In preparation for its second season in the ACC, Pitt was making its second appearance at the event. Pitt Head Coach Jamie Dixon, senior Cameron Wright and junior James Robinson represented the Panthers in Charlotte.

JAMEL ARTIS EMERGING INTO A **CONSISTENT SCORING THREAT;** EMERGES INTO ACC MOST IM-**PROVED PLAYER CANDIDATE**

Sophomore Jamel Artis has quietly emerged as one of the ACC's and Pitt's top scoring threats. He also has become an ACC Most Improved Player award candidate as his scoring average has improved from 10.3 ppg. through the season's first 16 games (Nov. 14-Jan. 14) to 19.0 in the last 14 games (Jan. 14-current).

In the last 14 games, Artis has led Pitt in scoring in 10 of those contests and scored 20 or more points seven times, including a career-best 32 against Bryant on Feb. 2. For his efforts against Bryant and Syracuse (20 points, 10 rebounds) Artis was awarded the ACC Player of the Week on Feb. 9. Over the last 14 games, Artis is averaging 19.0 points per game while converting 99-183 of his field goal attempts.

Artis leads the Panthers in scoring in both overall games (13.7 ppg.) and ACC games (16.2 ppg.). In ACC games, Artis leads Pitt in field goals made (90-181) and field goal percentage (.497).

On the year, Artis averages 13.7 points and 6.0 rebounds per game and has totaled eight 20-point scor-

CAMERON WRIGHT UNDERGOES INIURY-FILLED SENIOR YEAR

Pitt's returning leading scorer from the 2013-14 team, Cameron Wright officially returned to game action on Friday, Dec. 5 against Duquesne. Previously, he had missed the season's first seven games. It was announced in October that Wright would miss 10 weeks due to a broken left foot (fifth metatarsal).

Wright, the 2014 recipient of the Skip Prosser Award which is presented to the ACC's top scholarathlete in men's basketball, is Pitt's

leader, top returning scorer (10.5 ppg. last year) and most experienced returning player. In his five-year career, Wright has seen action in 126 career games, played in 2,609 minutes and started 68 contests. He has reached double figure scoring 37 times in his career and his veteran presence is a key ingredient for this year's team.

An NABC Good Works Team and Senior CLASS Award finalist, Wright is a four-time recipient of the University of Pittsburgh's Scholar-Athlete Award, and a twotime recipient of the school's Academic Excellence Award. He is also a past winner of the University of Pittsburgh-Jaron Brown Pursuit of Excellence Award and was selected to the Big East All-Academic team on three occasions. He was recently selected by the ACC for the prestigeous 2015 Weaver-James-Corrigan Postgraduate Award, a \$5,000 scholarship for graduate school and is a nominee for the 2015 Skip Prosser Award.

Wright is Pitt's fourth all-time conference scholar-athlete award winner in men's basketball. Other award winners include Joey David (1984-85), Darren Morningstar (1991-92) and Aaron Gray (2006-07). He is the second player to earn a men's basketball top scholar-athlete award since Jamie Dixon became head coach in 2003.

JAMES ROBINSON IS TRUE DIS-TRIBUTOR: IMPROVED SCORER AND ALMOST PERFECT FREE THROW SHOOTER

Junior point guard James Robinson continues to amass high assist:turnover numbers. Robinson is in his third season at Pitt with a school-record 3.29 career assist:turnover ratio (418 assists/127 turnovers), which is 0.38 points higher than the previous school record of 2.89 held by Levance Fields (2005-09).

After 30 games, Robinson is averaging 9.2 points per game, up from his 7.6 ppg. last year. He has a 3.08 assist:turnover ratio (154 assists and 50 turnovers), which ranks No. 13 nationally. Robinson also ranks No. 32nd nationally in total assists and ranks among league leaders in assists, free throw percentage and assist:turnover ratio.

A 2014 Bob Cousy Award finalist, Robinson last year set the school's season record for assist:turnover ratio with a 4.11 mark, which ranked No. 6 nationally and No. 2 in the ACC.

Robinson, who has started 98 of his career 99 games played and made 84 consecutive starts, also has the potential to be one of the best closers in school history as he sports an 80.6 percent career free throw percentage. Earlier this year, he hit 20 consecutive free throws and is



currently converting 82.3 percent (79-96) of his free throw attempts.

CBS Sports' Jon Rothstein called Robinson one of the "least appreciated" point guards in the nation. Pitt's lone two-time international Gold Medalist with Team USA, with two collegiate seasons remaining, Robinson has the opportunity to build one of the best careers for a point guard in Pitt history.

IMPROVED, QUICKER AND LEANER MICHAEL YOUNG MAKING IMPACT IN 2014-15

Pitt sophomore power forward Michael Young lost 10 pounds over the summer with the sole purpose of becoming quicker and more versatile at his power forward position. He is one of Pitt's most improved player this year.

That hard work is paying off as Young leads Pitt with a 7.4 rebounds per game average and ranks second with a 13.4 points per game average. Young ranks No. 35 nationally in offensive rebounds per game (3.27 orpg). He has already reached 20-plus points in four games, notched five double-doubles, scored in double figures in a team-leading 24 contests and in 19 of Pitt's last 22 games. After averaging 16.0 points and 9.7 rebounds, Young was named to the EA Sports Maui Invitational all-tournament team.

fourth freshman in school history to start 100 percent of his freshman contests. In 36 starts, Young averaged 6.0 points and 4.1 rebounds per game. Young reached double figure scoring in five games on the year. He also became just the 14th alltime freshman first game opening day starter at Pitt since freshmen were sanctioned to compete by the NCAA in 1972-73.

Pitt's bench has proved to be a valuable commodity as each player provides Pitt with a diverse array of strengths:

Chris Jones, 6-6, G

Jones is Pitt's top 3-point shooter off the bench as the leads the Panthers in 3-point field goals (37-97) and averages 9.2 points per game. He can play either the off-guard or small forward positions. An allaround player, Jones has also emerged as a defensive specialist. At Syracuse, he led the Panthers with a careerhigh tying 19 points and five 3-pointers.

Josh Newkirk, 6-1 • G

Newkirk can play either the point or off-guard and has proved to be one of the quickest and most athletic guards to play at Pitt in recent memory. His quickness with the basketball was on display at Boston

College when he drove the length of the floor and converted a layup with five seconds left in overtime to give Pitt a 61-60 win. Newkirk's also sports a 2.23 assist:turnover ratio.

Sheldon Jeter, 6-7 • F

Jeter gives Pitt a quicker, more athletic look at the power or small forward positions. The Vanderbilt transfer can also step up and hit a jumper or slash to the basket. He is coming off his best performance of the year, a 22-point, 10-14 shooting game in a start against North Carolina. Two other stellar performances include

an 11-point, eight rebound game at Boston College, in which he sparked the Panthers on both ends of the floor, and an 18-point (7-9 FG) and five key offensive rebounds vs. Syracuse.

Joseph Uchebo, 6-10 • C

Uchebo gives Pitt size, rebounding ability and bulk in the middle. He also has good hands and post moves on offense.

Derrick Randall, 6-9 • C

A lefthander, Randall adds bulk and size to the center position. He grabbed an EA Maui Invitational

Aron Phillips-Nwankwo, 6-7 • F A walk-on, Phillips-Nwanko is Pitt's most physical player. He sparked the Panthers in its 73-64 win over Florida State with a career-high seven points and 12 minutes. He surpassed a career-high with 13 minutes vs. Georgia Tech on Jan. 17. He has been sidelined with a torn labrum suffered at Virginia Tech, Jan. 27.

Ryan Luther, 6-9 • F

Luther surpassed career-highs for points (13), 3-point field goals made (3), field goals (5-7) and minutes (24) in sparking Pitt to a 23-point victory against Kansas State earlier in the year. The all-around talented Luther is a good shooter and is one of Pitt's best low post defenders.

WAKE FOREST POST-GAME NOTES

- The 69-66 loss to Wake Forest drops Pitt to 19-11 overall and 8-8 in the Atlantic Coast Conference. Pitt has now won six of its last nine games with two regular season games remaining: vs. Miami (March 4) and at Florida State (March 7). Wednesday's home game against Miami represents Senior Day for Cameron Wright, Aron Phillips-Nwankwo and Derrick Randall.
- Pitt still needs just one more victory to reach 20 wins for the 22nd time in school history. It would also mark the 14th consecutive season that Pitt would register 20 or more victories.
- With its plus-15 rebounding margin (43-28), Pitt notched its best rebounding day in an ACC regular season game this year.
- Jamel Artis and Michael Young combined for 41 of Pitt's 66 points and 17 rebounds on the evening. The duo converted 14 of 29 field goals, 6-7 3-point field goals and hit 7-10 free throws.
- Michael Young led Pitt with 22 points on 7-13 field goal shooting. Young tallied his fourth career 20-point game. He has now scored in double figures in 19 of his last 22 games played and reached double figures in 24 games on the year and 29 career contests. Young also hit a careerhigh two 3-point field goals. previous career-high was one, 11 times.

- Jamel Artis registered his 14th consecutive double figure scoring game with a 19-point performance. Artis finished with a career-high tying four 3-pointers and a career-high six offensive rebounds. Artis also hit four 3-pointers at Virginia on Feb. 16, 2015. He reached double figure scoring for the 23rd time in his career and 21st time on the year.
- With his 11 points, Cameron Wright reached double figure scoring for the 12th time on the year and 37th time in his career.
- Sheldon Jeter tied career-highs for rebounds (nine) and offensive rebounds (five).
- Pitt lost a game to Wake Forest for the first time in series history. Pitt is now 2-1 vs. Wake Forest with two victories last year.

PANTHERS EXCEL AT HOME

Pitt is in its 13th regular season in the Petersen Events Center with a 207-29 all-time record and .877 winning percentage. The .877 winning percentage ranks among the nation's best homecourt records over the last 13 years (see chart page 8).

Pitt has won 93 of its last 119 league home games. At home, Pitt has won 82 of its last 100 games, 53 of its last 71 games against conference regular season opponents, 113 of its last 132 overall games and recently completed home win streaks of 20 games (Jan. 28, 2010-Jan. 24, 2011) and 15 games (Feb. 29, 2012-Dec. 31, 2012). The 20-game win streak ranks as the fourth longest streak of its kind in school history.

Pitt is 85-26 vs. league regular season opponents at the Petersen Events Center (10-7 vs. ACC, 75-19 vs. Big East). In addition, Pitt recently completed a 58-game win streak against non-conference opponents at home (Nov. 19, 2005-Nov.

16, 2011).

Pitt also owns an impressive 118-3 record vs. non-conference opponents in the Petersen Events Center and has claimed 139 of its last 143 home games against regular season non-conference opponents. Pitt's three non-conference losses at the PEC are to Bucknell (Jan. 2, 2005), Long Beach State (Nov. 16, 2011) and Wagner (Dec. 23, 2011).

Winners of 29 of its last 36 home games, Pitt has also won 48 of its last 58 home games.

Since the Petersen Events Center opened in 2002, Pitt owns a 113-3 record combining November and December games (54-1 in November, 59-2 in December).

DECADE-PLUS OF EXCELLENCE

Over the last 14 years, Pitt has proven to be the winningest basketball program in the Big East Conference and one of the top-5 winningest programs nationally. In the last 14 seasons, from 2001-15, Pitt has continued to among the nation's top programs in overall winning percentage (364-117), league regular season wins (160-78), league championships (six) and NCAA Tournament appearances (12).

When comparing Pitt's success with other ACC schools (2002-15), the Panthers rank No. 2 in overall winning percentage, league regular season winning percentage, NCAA Tournament appearances (12 of last 13) and homecourt winning percentage (207-29, .877). The Panthers also rank No. 4 in most league championships during that timeframe. During that period, Pitt has av-

eraged 11.7 league wins and 26.5 overall victories per year. Pitt is also the only former Big East Conference program to win 20 or more overall games and 10 or more league contests in 11 of the previous 12 seasons (2001-13). Pitt's previous streak of 10 consecutive 10-win Big East regular seasons (2001-11) during that timeframe ranks second only to Syracuse's run of eleven 10-plus win seasons set from 1985-96. Pitt has won 20 or more games 20 times in school history.

In addition, Pitt Basketball was one of only three programs nationwide to advance to the NCAA Tournament and win 20 overall games and 10 league games in a 10-year span from 2001-11. Those programs include Gonzaga, Kansas and Pitt.

Since 2001, Pitt has now earned 12 NCAA Tournament berths. During that span, Pitt is one of only seven schools nationwide and one of two ACC programs to advance to the NCAA Tournament in at least 12 of the last 13 seasons. Those schools include Duke, Gonzaga, Kansas, Michigan State, Texas, Wisconsin and Pitt.

Pitt has advanced to NCAA Sweet Sixteen play in five of the last 13 seasons. Only 11 programs nationally (Duke-9, Kansas-9, Michigan State 8, Connecticut-7, Arizona-7, Syracuse-6, North Carolina-6, Wisconsin-6, Kentucky-6, Florida-6 and Louisville-6) have surpassed that accomplishment, while three other programs have matched it. Pitt also ranks among national leaders in NCAA Tournament wins over the last 13

seasons with 16.

PITT COMPLETES FIRST YEAR IN ACC IN 2013-14

- On January 4, 2014, Pitt began its first basketball season in the Atlantic Coast Conference. Syracuse, Pitt and Notre Dame join the league last year, while Louisville enter this season.
- With an 11-7 record, Pitt finished in fifth place in the ACC regular season standings.
- In its first-ever ACC Tournament, Pitt notched back-to-back victories over Wake Forest and No. 15 North Carolina to advance to the semifinal round where it dropped a close contest

to eventual champion No. 6 Virginia (51-48).

- Jamie Dixon owns a 28-12 record vs. members of the old ACC (not including Notre Dame, Louisville and Syracuse). Additionally, Dixon also owns a 51-33 overall record in head-to-head matchups vs. current ACC teams. ROAD SUCCESS

In 2013-14, Pitt tied a schoolrecord with a 7-2 league road record, a mark which also tied for the best road record in the ACC (Virginia and Syracuse both finished 7-2).

Pitt has won 11 of its last 21 road games and 16 of its last 27. In addition, Pitt has won 38 its last 66 road games.

Success on the road is nothing new for the Panthers who also concluded their 2012-13 regular season with a 6-3 road record. The 6-3 record also ranks as one of the best road records in Pitt's league history.

From 2001-13 while competing in the Big East Conference, Pitt owned one of the league's best road winning percentages (.578) with a 59-43 record.

NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

With an 11-3 record in 2014-15, Pitt has won 10-plus non-conference games for the 14th consecutive year.

Prior to this run and since Pitt joined the Big East Conference in 1982-83, Pitt had won 10 or more non-conference games in only three previous years. Here is Pitt's nonconference record over the last 14

Pitt has amassed a 163-16 nonconference record over the last 14 years. Pitt has also won 118 of its last 132 overall games against nonconference opponents dating back to a January 2, 2005 loss to Bucknell.

Since the 2001-02 season, Pitt is 72-10 in December games and has won 69 of its last 73 November games.

PITT RANKS NO. 2 NATIONALLY IN ASSIST:TURNOVER RATIO

After 30 games, Pitt leads the nation in assist:turnover ratio at 1.72 (501 assists/292 turnovers). Should Pitt keep up that pace, it would break the school's record for team assist:turnover ratio, which is currently 1.51 set last year in 2013-14. Pitt has only turned the ball over only 9.7 times per game, which ranks No. 7 nationally and would also set the record of 10.4 turnovers per game in 2013-14. Pitt's 501 assists rank No. 9 nationally.

Futhermore, Robinson and Newkirk alone have combined for a 2.62 assist:turnover ratio (244 assists/93 turnovers).

Taking care of the basketball is nothing new for Pitt. Last year, Robinson ranked No. 6 nationally in assist:turnover ratio and the Panthers totaled a 1.51 assist:turnover ratio figure, which ranked No. 10 nationally. In 2013-14, Pitt assisted on 63 percent (563 of 895) of its field goals made. According to the final 2012-13 NCAA statistics, Pitt ranked No. 3 nationally with a stellar assist:turnover ratio of 1.48. Robinson also rated No. 9 nationally with a 2.83 assist:turnover ratio. In the 2012-13 final NCAA Statistics report, Pitt ranked No. 3 nationally in assist:turnover ratio, No. 7 in assists per game, No. 21 in fewest turnovers per game and No. 48 in turnover margin, all remarkable improvements over the previous season's performance.

DIXON: ALSO ONE OF FASTEST ALL-TIME TO 200 COACHING WINS

With a 61-46 victory over American on Dec. 22, 2010, Dixon reached the 200-career victory plateau. Dixon tied the NCAA Division I record for quickest to 200 wins in only eight seasons, matching the record held by Gonzaga's Mark Few and Kansas' Roy Williams. He ranks No. 13 among the all-time NCAA Division I coaches in quickest to 200 victories in regards to total games (see charts on page 4) and tied the NCAA record in fastest to 200 career wins by years (8). He also became the fastest coach in school history to reach the 200-win plateau and only the second coach to reach that mark in school history (see chart on page 6). The only other coach in school history to win over 200 games is H.C. "Doc" Carlson, who recorded a 367-247 record over 31 years from 1922-53.

In addition, Dixon has guided Pitt to three combined Big East titles (2003-04 regular season, 2008 tournament and 2010-11 regular season), two No. 1 seeds upon entering the NCAA Tournament (2009 and 2011), led Pitt to six consecutive 25-win seasons, 10 NCAA Tournaments and has winning head-to-head records or .500 records against 13 of the 15 previous Big East schools.

JAMIE DIXON: FOUR-TIME NA-TIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR

Jamie Dixon has earned four National Coach of the Year awards. Dixon was named the 2011 Sporting News National Coach of the Year after leading Pitt to the Big East regular season outright title. He was named the 2010 Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year after guiding Pitt to a 25-9 overall record, second place finish in the Big East and No. 3 seed in the NCAA Tournament after his squad was picked to finish ninth in the Big East preseason coaches' poll. Dixon also earned USA Basketball National Coach of the Year honors for guiding the Americans to the Under-19 FIBA World Championship Gold Medal.

Following the 2008-09 season, Dixon was named the Naismith National Coach of the Year recipient, Pitt's second all-time Naismith National Coach of the Year recipient.

PITT IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

In the 15 2014-15 national polls, Pitt has gone unranked. That is an uncommon place for Pitt, which has been ranked among the nation's top-25 in 73 percent of the national polls since the 2001-02 season.

Since January 7, 2002, Pitt has been ranked among the nation's top-25 in 73 percent and 180 of the last 248 national polls. In addition, Pitt has been ranked among the nation's top-10 teams for at least one week in 11 of the past 14 seasons (2002-15).

In 2008-09, Pitt ascended to the No. 1 national ranking for the first time in school history. It spent a total of three weeks as the nation's consensus No. 1. The 2008-09 Pitt men's basketball team became the first Pitt team to hold the No. 1 national ranking since the 1982 Pitt football season. The 1982 Pitt football team entered the season ranked No. 1 and held the top spot for three weeks during the year (Sept. 7, Oct. 26, Nov. 2).

CLOSE QUALITY LOSSES

Over the last 12 years under Jamie Dixon, Pitt's 107 losses have come by a combined 835 points for a 7.8 average points per loss.

Since Jamie Dixon became head coach, only 33 of his 107 losses during his 12-year tenure came by 10 or more points:

on Jan. 3, 2015 marked Pitt's largest margin of defeat in an ACC game.

Pitt's 23-point loss to Rutgers on Jan. 11, 2012 was its largest Big East regular season loss since Dixon became head coach.

Amazingly, Dixon has dropped 39 of his 107 career games by four points or less and 74 of his 107 losses by fewer than 10 points (69 percent).

DIXON AND NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

Combining his non-conference games, Dixon owns a 143-15 overall record vs. non-conference foes (.905 winning percentage). Dixon won 45 consecutive games in November and December before dropping a contest at No. 7 Wisconsin on Dec. 16, 2006. He won his first 35 November games until a loss to No. 3 Texas in 2009.

UNDER 70 DEFENSIVE MENTALITY

Defense has been a key ingredient to Pitt's success over the last 14 seasons. Following are some defensive notes:

- This year, Pitt has held eight of 30 opponents to 60 points or less and 20 of 30 to 70 points or less.
- In 2013-14, Pitt held 19 of its

36 opponents under 60 points, 26 of 36 below 70 points and has yielded 41.2 percent shooting.

- In 2012-13, Pitt held 19 of its 33 opponents to 60 points or less and 29 of its 33 foes to 70 points or less. Against Pitt, opponents averaged a school-record low 56.0 points per game and shot just 39.2 percent (627-1598) from the floor.
- Since Jamie Dixon became head coach in 2003-04, Pitt has held 156 of its 206 conference regular season opponents to 70 points or less.
- Additionally, since Jamie Dixon became head coach, Pitt has held 323 of its 414 opponents to 70 points or less. Pitt's record is 307-107 during that span.
- Over the last 12 seasons under Dixon, Pitt has posted 10 of the top-12 best defensive seasons in school history. That achievement has made it the best defensive era in school and Big East Conference history.

HOME SWEET HOME

In a *Sports Illustrated* poll in 2012-13, Big East Conference players voted Pitt's Petersen Events Center as the most difficult place to play in the league. Also, a 2009 AOL Fanhouse poll of Big East players rated Pitt's fans as the "Best in the League."

Pitt's Petersen Events Center was recently rated the sixth mosthostile arenas for opponents to play by ESPN's Jeff Goodman and rated the sixth-loudest stadium in college basketball by ESPN The Magazine. Also, the Petersen Events Center ranked among the nation's top-10 in toughest places to play (7th, Bleacher Report), best game-day atmospheres (2nd, USA Today) and best overall college basketball arenas (8th, ESPN.com). The Oakland Zoo has also earned the reputation of being rated as the one of the nation's top college basketball cheering sections.

Here are some facts to support those statements:

- Pitt has won 211 of its last 242 home games which includes a 40game home win streak from 2002-04 and a 31-game home win streak from 2008-10.
- Over the last 14 seasons, Pitt is a combined 220-30 in home games. Its 19 home wins in 2003-04 set a school record for most home victories in a season.
- Pitt has lost just 29 times in the Petersen Events Center and sports a 207-29 record (.877) in the 13-year old arena. Louisville is the only opponent to defeat Pitt three times in the arena, while Notre Dame, Georgetown, Cincinnati, West Virginia, Syracuse and Rutgers are the only opponents to defeat Pitt two times at the Petersen Events Center. Pitt has lost just three non-conference games to the likes of Bucknell, Long Beach State and Wagner.
- Pitt won its first 34 consecutive games in the Petersen Events Center. The 34-game win streak to open the arena ranks third alltime among winning streaks to open new arenas (51-UCLA in 1964, 41-Providence in 1971-72 and 34-Pitt, 2002-04).
- Pitt has won 91 of its last 116 league home games and is 85-26 against conference opponents in the Petersen Events Center.
- Pitt recently won a school record 58 consecutive home games against non-conference opponents at the Petersen Events Center. Its 58-game win streak spanning from Jan. 2, 2005-Nov. 16, 2011 surpassed the previous record of 28 consecutive nonconference home wins at the Petersen Events Center recorded from Nov. 23, 2002-Jan. 2, 2005. It currently has a 31game home win streak vs. nonconference opponents intact.
- Pitt owns a 118-3 record vs. nonconference opponents in the Petersen Events Center.
 Wagner, Long Beach State and Bucknell are the only three non-



conference teams to defeat the Panthers there.

- Pitt has won 139 of its last 143 home games against regular season non-conference home opponents.
- Pitt currently has a string of 239 consecutive regular season home sellouts dating back to a January 12, 2002 game at Fitzgerald Field House against Notre Dame (232 regular season games at PEC+the final seven Fitzgerald Field House games in 2001-02). All 232 regular season games at the Petersen Events Center have been sold out. Note: Pitt has played 236 total games at PEC, four of which were postseason games in the College Basketball Invitational in March, 2012.

PITT ACADEMIC NOTES

The following notes include academic achievements by the Pitt basketball program over the last 12 years:

- In its inaugural season in the ACC, Pitt led the league with four Academic All-ACC team selections: Cameron Wright, Jamel Artis, Josh Newkirk and Michael Young. Seven of its 14 players incredibly were nominated for the team.
- Cameron Wright earned the prestigious Skip Prosser Award as the ACC's top scholar-athlete for men's basketball.
- Achieved three top-10 percent ratings in the NCAA's Academic Performance Rankings over the last four seasons (2013-14, 2011-12 and 2010-11), one of only three ACC programs to achieve that honor (Pitt, Duke and Notre Dame). Pitt consistently achieves high APR scores, ranked tied for second among Big East men's basketball programs in 2009 and 2011. Pitt has also ranked among the nation's top-20 percent of basketball programs in each of the last five years of APR rankings.
- Over 80 percent of Jamie Dixon's players have graduated from the University of Pittsburgh.
- Pitt Basketball has earned a Team Academic Achievement Award in three of the last seven years. Pitt won awards in 2004, 2006 and 2008.
- Thirty-six (36) men's basketball student-athletes have earned their degrees over the last 11

years. Virginia Tech's Adam Smith hit a deep 3-pointer with three seconds left in overtime to give the Hokies a 70-67 home win...Smith also converted two 3-pointers in the final 52 seconds of regulation, the second coming with two seconds remaining to send the game into overtime (62-62)...In overtime, Pitt battled back from a three-point deficit to tie the game at 67-67 on a Chris Jones layup with 1:07 left, but the Panthers didn't gain possession until after Smith hit his 3-pointer to put VT up with three seconds left...Pitt outscored Virginia Tech 14-4 over a three-minute span to take a seven-point lead (58-51) on a Jamel Artis drive and dunk with 3:20 left in regulation...But the Hokies outscored Pitt 7-2 over the game's final 2:11 to send the game into overtime...Pitt shot a season-low 52.9 percent (9-17) from the free throw line...Virginia Tech hit a Pitt opponent season-high 12 3-pointers...The loss snapped Pitt's seven-game win streak in overtime games...Pitt fell to 2-1 in overtime games in 2014-15...Pitt played its second straight OT game vs. Virginia Tech and dropped to 6-4 all-time vs. VT.
