MIAMI AND RIVAL SEMINOLES SET FOR SATURDAY IN TALLAHASSEE

► The Miami Hurricanes will play in their first of two consecutive road games when they head to the state capitol to take on Florida State in the newest edition of one of college football's greatest rivalries. Kick-off is set for 3:30 p.m. at Bobby Bowden Field at Doak S. Campbell Stadium. The game will be televised regionally on ABC and mirrored nationally on ESPN.

► Lamar Miller gained 147 against Duke to top the 1,000-yard rushing mark. His 22-yard TD run in the fourth quarter gave him 1,016 yards. Miller is the eighth player in school history to cross the plateau. The last Hurricane to top 1,000 yards was Willis McGahee in 2002, who gained 1,753 on the ground. Below is a chart of 1,000-yard rushers.

► With three more receiving yards, Miami's senior wide receiver Travis Benjamin will become just the sixth player in program history to join the 2,000-yard plateau. The Belle Glade, Fla. native is on the verge of joining former UM and NFL greats Santana Moss, Reggie Wayne, Michael Irvin, Lamar Thomas and Leonard Hankerson.

► Miami's leading tackler Sean Spence once again led the Canes with eight takedowns on Saturday against Duke, five of them solo and two tackles for a loss. The Miami native ranks 15th nationally in tackles per game and is tied for 11th in tackles for loss. He ranks second in the ACC in tackles. Spence has been named the ACC Linebacker of the Week three times this season and on three occasions has been recognized as the College Football Performance Awards Honorable Mention Linebacker of the Week. On the year, Spence has tallied 83 tackles, 46 of those solo.

The MIAMI-FLORIDA STATE SERIES

- ▶ Miami leads the all-time series, 31-24.
- ▶ Neither team has been able to win back-to-back meetings since the Seminoles did it in '05 and '06.
- ▶ Miami has won the last two meetings at Doak Campbell Stadium and are 4-1 in the past decade.

A CANES WIN OVER THE SEMINOLES WOULD...

- ▶ Give the Hurricanes their third consecutive victory at Doak Campbell Stadium.
- ▶ Give the Hurricanes a 4-3 Atlantic Coast Conference record.
- ▶ Be Miami's second straight Atlantic Coast Conference victory.
- ▶ Give Al Golden his first victory over Florida State.

The COACHES

▶ Al Golden is in his first year as Miami's head coach and owns an overall record of 31-38. Florida State head coach Jimbo Fisher sports a career record of 16-7 in his second season leading the Seminoles.

Scouting THE SEMINOLES

- ▶ Florida State is on a roll coming off of four consecutive victories, outscoring their opponents 154-39 in the process.
- ▶ The Seminoles possess one of the nation's most potent defenses, ranking 4th nationally in total defense (268 yards/gm), and 3rd nationally in rush defense, allowing a scant 78.89 yards/gm on the ground.
- ▶ Look for the Seminoles to rely heavily on the pass, redshirt junior quarterback EJ Manuel has tossed for 1,956 yards for 14 scores with an efficiency rating of 158.0.
- ▶ The Florida State receiving corps has four different receivers with 20 or more receptions with Miami-native junior Rodney Smith leading the way with 486 yards on 28 catches and three touchdowns.
- ▶ Freshman running back Devonta Freeman has racked up 376 yards on the ground, adding six touchdowns on just 70 carries while splitting carries with quarterback EJ Manuel.
- ▶ Linebacker Nigel Bradham and cornerback Mike Harris with 52 and 48 takedowns, respectively will lead Florida State's top-10 senior-heavy defense. The tandem has 12 tackles for loss and three sacks between them.

Up NEXT...

▶ The Canes continue their road trip, heading across the Sunshine State to take on the USF Bulls (11/19) before heading home to Sun Life Stadium for their final regular season game against the Golden Eagles of Boston College (11/25).

Harris AND HORN NAMED ACC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

- ▶ Jacory Harris became the first Hurricane in 2011-12 to win ACC Offensive Back of the Week for his stand-out showing in a 49-14 win against the Blue Devils. Harris, who completed 14-of-20 passes for 202 yards and three touchdowns, posted his fifth 200-yard game of the season Saturday. Harris became only the second quarterback in program history to throw for over 8,000 career yards (Ken Dorsey).
- ▶ Center Tyler Horn, the anchor of an offensive line that allowed no sacks against Duke, was awarded Co-Offensive Lineman of the Week honors for his efforts. Horn also helped pave the way for 265 yards on the ground, including four rushing touchdowns, against a stout Blue Devils rushing defense. Horn and the rest of the offensive line have allowed only 12 sacks through the Hurricanes' first nine games.

Spence NAMED BUTKUS AWARD SEMIFINALIST

- ▶ On Oct. 24, Miami linebacker Sean Spence was named as one of 12 finalists for the 27th Annual Butkus Award® honoring the nation's top college linebacker.
- ▶ Spence was again the Canes' leader on defense against Duke. The prolific linebacker racked up eight tackles to lead his team. The Miami native had five solo stops and a two tackles for a loss of two yards.
- ▶ Spence has been the anchor of the defense all season and has amassed 83 total tackles (15th nationally), 11.5 tackles for loss (t-10th nationally) for 37 yards, three sacks for 23 yards and a forced fumble.
- ▶ No other player at a BCS institution has won defensive player of the week honors for their conference three times this season. Only Mike Taylor, a linebacker at Wisconsin, has won it twice.

- Miller is second in the Atlantic Coast Conference with 112.9 rushing yards per game, ranking 17th nationally.
- Through the first four games of the season, Miller was the only back in America with a rush of 40-yards or more in every game. He did not extend that streak at Virginia Tech, but did have runs of 37 and 30 yards.
- Of his 11 career rushes/receptions of 25-yards or more, nine have come after halftime.
- Miller recorded 166 rushing yards on 18 carries against Virginia Tech, posting his fifth-straight game with at least 100 yards rushing. Miller is the first Cane to open the season with five-straight 100-yard rushing games. Willis McGahee started the 2002 season with 100-plus in four of the first five games. The last time a Cane recorded five-straight 100-yard rushing games was Clinton Portis in 2001.
- Miller has nine plays of 25-yards or longer this season: seven rushes and two kick returns.
- Until the Ohio State game (184 yards), Miller's output against Virginia Tech was a career best. The Hokies' run defense came into the 2011 meeting ranked No. 4 nationally against the run, giving up only 58.20 yards on the ground.
- Miller joins former Cane Frank Gore (2001-04) with eight career 100-yard rushing games. Edgerrin James (1995-98) is the all-time leader with 15 games of 100 or more yards on the ground.

When **IT COUNTS**

► You can only bottle up the electric Lamar Miller for so long. His career shows that the second half is clearly Miller Time. Not only do his biggest plays (especially runs) come in the second half, but nearly 60 percent of his career yards have come after intermission.

GSR SCORES SHOW CONTINUED SUCCESS OF MIAMI ATHLETICS

► In what has become an annual upward trend, student-athletes at the University of Miami continue to excel in the classroom at a record pace. According to the NCAA's Graduation Success Rates (GSR), Miami established a new athletics department-wide record with a GSR of 89 percent.

► Last year, the athletics department-wide GSR was at its then-record high of 86 percent.

► The athletics department has exceeded the NCAA average for GSR in each of the last seven years.

Wieclaw **NAMED LOU GROZA SEMIFINALIST**

► The Palm Beach County Sports Commission has released its 20 semi-finalists for the 2011 Lou Groza Collegiate Place-Kicker Award presented by the Orange Bowl Committee and Miami's Jake Wieclaw is among those receiving recognition.

► The New Lenox, Ill. native has converted on all 36 of his extra point attempts and has made 8-of-10 field goal attempts, with a season-long 43-yarder coming at North Carolina.

► On 52 kickoffs, Wieclaw has recorded three touchbacks and has limited the opposition to an average starting field position of the 23-yard line.

8,000—On Saturday, Jacory Harris became the second Miami QB to pass for 8,000 or more yards in his career. He entered the game with 7,895 yards and added 202 against Duke to end with 8,097.

A GAME OF FIRSTS - DUKE RECAP

► Freshman WR Phillip Dorsett recorded his first-career touchdown, a two-yard pass from Jacory Harris in the second quarter.

► Senior TE Chase Ford reeled in his first touchdown of the season, a one-yard pass from Jacory Harris on the first drive of the game.

► Junior DB Ray-Ray Armstrong picked off Duke's Renfree for his first interception of the season.

► TE Dyron Dye, RT Seantrel Henderson and S Ray-Ray Armstrong all earned their first start of the season.

► Running backs Lamar Miller and Mike James both scored two touchdowns, marking the first time this season that both have scored multiple times in the same game.

► Miami scored 49 points on seven TDs against Duke, the most points scored since the Canes defeated FAMU 48-16 on Oct. 10, 2009.

► For the first time this season, Miami scored touchdowns on its first four possessions. Each of UM's first five touchdowns were by a different player.

Streak CONTINUES

► Former Hurricanes and current proCanes Kellen Winslow (Tampa Bay) and Willis McGahee (Denver) scored touchdowns in Week 9 of the NFL season.

► At least one former Cane has now scored a touchdown every NFL week since Week 15 of the 2002 season - a span of 148 straight weeks.

Honoring A LEGEND

► UM honored Russell Maryland in an on-field ceremony in the Sept. 17 contest against Ohio State to commemorate the defensive tackle's upcoming induction into the College Football Hall of Fame in December.

► Maryland finished his college career with 279 tackles, 25 tackles for losses and 20.5 quarterback sacks. He was the Jack Harding Most Valuable Player Award winner in 1990 and led the Hurricanes to four consecutive bowl berths, two national championships and an overall record of 45-3 during his career.

Canes OPEN NEW ERA UNDER GOLDEN

► Golden owns an overall record of 32-38 and is in his sixth season as a head coach.

► Golden arrived in Coral Gables after spending the last five seasons as the head coach at Temple University. Over five seasons at Temple, Golden took the Owls to unprecedented heights. Before his arrival, TU had just two winning seasons over its previous 26 years and had only won 22 percent of its games over the previous 30 years. Quickly, Golden made the Owls a contender, leading the team to a combined record of 17-8 his last two years there. The 2009 season marked Temple's first winning season since 1990, and Golden was rewarded with MAC Coach of the Year honors.

UM HAS NATION'S MOST EFFICIENT OFFENSE

► According to footballoutsiders.com, the Hurricanes have the country's No. 1 most efficient offense. Below is an excerpt from the site:

► The Hurricanes are averaging a pedestrian 385 yards per game (67th in the nation), but unlike some of the teams at the top of those stat sheets, they play at a very deliberate pace. They are maximizing value on the plays they do run (6.5 yards per play, 15th nationally) and possessions. Last weekend against lowly Duke (No. 91 DFEI), Miami scored touchdowns on each of its first five offensive possessions, the fifth of which concluded with less than 10 minutes left in the third quarter. Garbage time hadn't officially kicked in at that point, but they were ruthlessly efficient against a weak opposing defense, as elite offenses must be.

Miller CRUISES TO 1,000 YARDS

► Lamar Miller reached 1,000 rushing yards in Miami's ninth game of the season. Edgerrin James reached the milestone in the same amount of games in 1998. Only Willis McGahee in 2002 surpassed 1,000 yards quicker, when it took him only eight games.

The numbers above show that Harris is a slow starter as his TD-to-Int ratio in the opening half is just 1.17-to-1. However, in the second half, his numbers improve dramatically to 2.54-to-1.

▶ Under the tutelage of offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach Jedd Fisch, Miami quarterback Jacory Harris' completion rate (64.1%), QB rating (166.15), yards per attempt (9.0) and longest pass (77 yards) this season are all career highs.

J12 AMONG THE BEST

- ▶ With his 202-yard performance against Duke on Nov. 5, Jacory Harris remains in second place in Miami's all-time records book with 8,097 career passing yards, surpassing Gino Torretta and trailing only Ken Dorsey (9,565).
- ▶ Harris is among the nation's best quarterbacks with a passing efficiency of 166.15 - ranking 6th nationally. Harris has connected on 125 of 195 passes with 18 touchdowns and four interceptions.
- ▶ Players since Oct. 1 with at least 14 passing TDs and 1 or fewer interceptions: Case Keenum and Jacory Harris.
- ▶ Over the last six games, Harris carries an efficiency rating of 174.9. Over that same span, Stanford's Andrew Luck's rating is 174.3.
- ▶ Harris entered the season ranked among Miami's top signal callers as he appears in six different career records categories.
- ▶ Harris is ranked second all-time in passing yardage, pass completions, pass attempts, touchdowns thrown and total offense, while ranking third in completion percentage. Harris is on track to upend Ken Dorsey in two categories, needing to complete 26 passes and attempt 89 passes to surpass Dorsey as the record holder. Last season he connected on 148 passes and attempted 270.
- ▶ He moved into sole possession of second place all-time in career passing TDs on Oct. 23, 2010 when he threw touchdown passes to LaRon Byrd, Travis Benjamin and Leonard Hankerson against the Tar Heels.
- ▶ With his three TD passes against Duke, Harris moved into a fourth-place tie with Darian Durant (North Carolina, 2001-04) on the ACC's Career TD passes list with 68. The senior is now only eight touchdown passes shy of Russell Wilson (NC State - 2008-10). NC State's Phillip Rivers is the all-time leader with 95.
- ▶ Harris passed Wake Forest's Brian Kuklick (1994-98; 8,017), with his 202-yard performance against the Blue Devils, for 17th place on the ACC's career passing yardage stats, as he now has 8,097 career passing yards.

Four TO ENTER UM HALL OF FAME

► The University of Miami Sports Hall of Fame announced on Sept. 22 that four former Hurricane football players will be among those to be enshrined in its Class of 2012. Current Baltimore Ravens Ed Reed and Bryant McKinnie as well as Rich Mercier and Ray Bellamy - the university's first African-American football player - will be enshrined into the hall on March 29, 2012.

► Ed Reed (1998-2001)

Consensus First Team All-America and All-BIG EAST selection in 2000 and 2001... Set UM career records for interceptions (21) and interception return yards (389)... His nine interceptions in 2001 is the second-highest single-season total in UM history... Recorded eight interceptions in 2000 (third-best in UM history).

► Bryant McKinnie (2000-2001)

Outland Trophy winner as college football's outstanding interior lineman in 2001... Named a First Team All-American by *The Football News* in 2000 and a consensus first team All-American by every national service in 2001, including the Associated Press, Football Writers Association, *The Football News*, *The Sporting News* and the Walter Camp and the National Football Foundations... The 2001 National Player of the Year by CNNI.com... The 2001 College Football Offensive Player of the Year by *The Football News*... Did not allow a quarterback sack during his entire UM career.

► Ray Bellamy (1967-1970)

Miami's first African-American football player... Endured hardships and led the way for future African-American athletes... In 1968, had 37 receptions for 549 yards and two touchdowns... ► When the NCAA's Academic Progress Report (APR) was announced in May, the Canes' football program headlined an outstanding academic showing by the University of Miami this past school year. The football team (along with baseball, men's basketball and men's tennis) improved upon its APR score for an impressive seventh straight season. In fact, the UM football program's APR score (978) ranked eighth among all FBS schools.

Eight CANES GO IN 2011 NFL DRAFT

- The University of Miami's success in the NFL Draft continued this past spring, as eight Canes were selected in 2011. Orlando Franklin (2nd round to Denver), Brandon Harris (2nd round to Houston), Leonard Hankerson (3rd round to Washington), DeMarcus Van Dyke (3rd round to Oakland), Allen Bailey (3rd round to Kansas City), Colin McCarthy (4th round to Tennessee), Richard Gordon (6th round to Oakland) and Matt Bosher (6th round to Atlanta) were all taken off the board in the Top 200 picks.
- Miami's eight draftees trailed only USC (9) and North Carolina (9) for the most in the country in 2011.
- Since 2000, only Ohio State (78) and USC (77) have had more players drafted than the Canes (75).
- Miami continues to comfortably lead the nation in first round draft picks in recent years, as 26 Canes have been selected in the first round since 2000. Ohio State (17) remains a distant second.
