'CANES VISIT GEORGIA TECH IN FINAL TRIP OF REGULAR SEASON

- ▶ The University of Miami football team will play its final road game of the 2010 regular season when it travels to Atlanta to take on ACC Coastal Division opponent Georgia Tech on Saturday, Nov. 13 at noon at Bobby Dodd Stadium. The game will be televised live on the ACC Network.
- ▶ The Hurricanes (6-3, 4-2 ACC) are coming a thrilling come-from-behind 26-20 win over Maryland this past weekend at Sun Life Stadium. Trailing 20-18 with 3:06 to play, freshman Stephen Morris drove the 'Canes down the field and with under a minute to play, connected with Leonard Hankerson on a 35-yard touchdown pass that would prove to be the game-winner. Morris, who was making his first collegiate start, finished the game 18-for-30 with 286 yards, one touchdown and two interceptions.
- ▶ Redshirt freshman Lamar Miller also earned his first career start and ran for 125 yards and a touchdown on 22 carries. His 125 yards on the ground were the most for a 'Cane this season and the most for a UM freshman since Javarris James ran for a freshman record 148 yards against Houston on Sept. 30, 2006.
- ▶ Junior Travis Benjamin led the 'Canes in receiving with 127 yards on five catches, but it was Hankerson's big catch late in the fourth guarter not only won the game for the 'Canes, but it put the senior in rare company. Hankerson became one of just five players in school history to record double-digit touchdown receptions in a single season, joining Michael Irvin (11), Lamar Thomas (10), Reggie Wayne (10) and Andre Johnson (10). Hankerson's touchdown was the 19th of his career, tying him with Santana Moss for fifth all-time at Miami.
- ▶ Miami's defense is coming off another solid outing, holding the Terrapins to 254 yards (96 rushing; 158 passing) and 15 first downs. Colin McCarthy, who ranks fourth in the ACC with a 8.4 tackle per game average, led the 'Canes with six tackles against Maryland. Ray-Ray Armstrong had five tackles and recorded Miami's 16th interception of the season.
- ▶ The Hurricanes' defense continues to rank as one of the nation's best against the pass, ranking first in pass efficiency defense (92.17), fifth in pass defense (153.11 ypg) and sixth in sacks (3.00 pg). Ryan Hill, Vaughn Telemaque and Ray-Ray Armstrong are tied for the team-lead with three interceptions apiece, while Jim Thorpe Award Semifinalist Brandon Harris has an interception a team-high six pass break-ups.

COVERING THE HURRICANES

Interviews with players and coaches must be arranged at least 24 hours in advance. Practices are open to the media from the start through stretch. Head coach Randy Shannon will address the media following each practice.

UM's coaches show, "Hurricane Game Day with Randy Shannon" airs twice weekly on CSS, at 5:30 p.m. Thursdays and 10 a.m. Saturdays. The show is hosted by Joe Zagacki and Don Bailey Jr. and features Hurricanes players as coach Shannon's guests.

HURRICANE HOTLINE

Hurricane Hotline is a weekly two-hour show hosted by Joe Zagacki and Don Bailey, Jr. that airs from 7-9 p.m. Thursday nights during the season from Monty's (2550 South Bayshore Drive Coconut Grove, Florida 33133). Hurricane Hotline features interviews with UM head football coach Randy Shannon, players, coaches and other UM personnel as well as other featured guests. Fans are encouraged to listen on 560 WQAM or view the show in-person at Monty's in Coconut Grove.

The MIAMI-GEORGIA TECH SERIES

- ▶ The 'Canes are 5-10 all-time against Georgia Tech. Last year, Miami cruised to a 33-17 win in Miami, while two seasons ago in Atlanta the Yellow Jackets best UM, 41-23.
- ▶ Miami's last win at Georgia Tech was a 27-3 victory for the Hurricanes in 2004.

A 'CANES WIN OVER THE YELLOW JACKETS WOULD...

- ▶ Improve Miami's road record to 4-2 this season.
- ▶ Move the Hurricanes' record to 5-2 in ACC play with one regular season conference games remaining.
- ▶ Give the 'Canes five conference wins for the second consecutive season.

The **COACHES**

▶ Randy Shannon is in his fourth season as Miami's head coach and owns an overall record of 27-20. Paul Johnson is in his third season at Georgia Tech and is 25-11 as the Yellow Jackets' head coach.

Scouting THE YELLOW JACKETS

- ▶ Georgia Tech enters Saturday's game having lost their last two games against Clemson and Georgia Tech. The game against Miami will be the Yellow Jackets first home game since Oct. 16 against Middle Tennessee.
- ▶ The Yellow Jackets lead the nation in rushing, averaging 320.6 yards per game on the ground. Seven different players have at least 100 yards rushing this season, led by Anthony Allen's team-high 817 yards. Regular starting quarter-back Josh Nesbitt (647 passing yards, 737 rushing yards) will miss Saturday's game after suffering an injury last week against Virginia Tech. In his place, back-up Tevin Washington is expected to start. Other options in the Georgia Tech running game include Owrin Smith, Roddy Jones and Embry Peoples.
- Only one Yellow Jacket -- Stephen Hill -- has double-digit catches (12) while Hill and Owrin Smith are the only two with triple-digit receiving yards as Hill has 165 and Smith has 130.
- ▶ Defensively, Julian Burnett leads Georgia Tech with 56 tackles, while Steven Sylvester has 41 tackles and a team-best 10.5 tackles for loss. Jerrard Tarrant has three of the team's seven interceptions, while Dominque Reese (45 tackles) has eight pass break-ups to his credit.
- ▶ Scott Blair handles field goal (11-for-13) and kickoff duties while Sean Poole (40.9 ypp) handles most of the punting duties. In the return game, Jerrard Tarrant averages 5.9 yards in punt run backs while four Yellow Jackets split kick return duties, led by B.J. Bostic's 13 returns.

Streak CONTINUES

- ▶ The University of Miami's impressive streak of former players scoring touchdowns in the NFL continued in Week 9 when Willis McGahee scored a touchdown against the Dolphins early Sunday afternoon.
- ▶ At least one former 'Cane has now scored a touchdown every NFL week since Week 15 of the 2002 season a span of 131 straight weeks.
- ▶ More notes on Hurricanes in the NFL can be found throughout the following pages. Updated season notes and Week 8 totals will be updated on Monday, Nov. 1.

Miami LEADS THE COUNTRY IN PASS EFFICIENCY DEFENSE

- ▶ As of this week, Miami's defense leads the country in pass efficiency defense with a mark of 92.17. The Hurricanes have allowed just five passing touchdowns all year while forcing their opponents into throwing 16 interceptions.
- ▶ The next three teams in pass efficiency defense are TCU (92.45), Ohio State (94.95) and Nebraksa (95.19).

Miami ALSO RANKS THIRD NATIONALLY IN TACKLES FOR LOSS

- ▶ Miami's defense also ranks third in the country in tackles for a loss per game with a 8.22 per game average. The 'Canes recorded 14 tackles for a loss in their opener against Florida A&M, 11 at No. 2 Ohio State, nine at Pitt, eight at Clemson, six against FSU, nine at Duke, eight against UNC, five at Virginia and four last week against Maryland.
- ▶ Sean Spence and Allen Bailey are tied for the team-lead with 10.5 tackles for loss, while Olivier Vernon has 8.0 and Micanor Regis has 6.0.

- ▶ Of the 16 seniors on this year's squad, five have already earned degrees, while the remaining 11 are all on course to graduate either in December of 2010 or May of 2011.
- ▶ The five players that have already earned degrees include: Matt Bosher (History), Richard Gordon (Liberal Arts), Ryan Hill (Liberal Arts), Pat Hill (Marketing and Management) and Cory Nelms (Liberal Arts).
- ▶ Overall University of Miami Athletics has an 86% Graduation Success Rate (GSR), the highest GSR ever and up from 82% in 2009. 83% in 2007 was our previous high.
- ▶ In May, Miami was recognized as being the only Bowl Championship Subdivision (BCS) team among 26 schools nationally that posted a multi-year APR score in the Top 10 percent in addition to finishing the 2009 season ranked in both the USA Today Coaches poll and Associated Press poll.
- ▶ 136 University of Miami student-athletes had a 3.0 GPA or higher following the Spring 2010 semester.

Shannon LEADS ALL FBS COACHES IN APR

- ▶ University of Miami head coach Randy Shannon leads all active Bowl Championship Series conference coaches with a 977 lifetime APR average, according to rankings released in May.
- ▶ Shannon's score is the third best nationally among all Football Bowl Subdivision schools, trailing only Troy Calhoun of Air Force and Ken Niumatalolo of Navy.
- ▶ The football team's 2008-09 score of 978, sixth best in the nation, will be factored into next year's coaches lifetime ratings, and will continue to boost Shannon's career mark.
- ▶ Miami was recognized in May as the only school in the FBS to post a multi-year APR score in the top-10 percent as well as finish the year ranked in both the Coaches and the AP polls.

Right BETWEEN THE NUMBERS

- ▶ Miami leads the Atlantic Coast Conference in total defense (303.8), pass defense (153.1 ypg) and pass defense efficiency (92.2).
- ▶ The 'Canes are averaging 28.1 points per game, 416.3 yards per game and 22.8 first downs per game.
- ▶ Damien Berry is averaging 4.9 yards per carry in eight games this season. Berry ranks third in the ACC and 41st nationally with 86.2 rushing yards per game, totaling 690 yards on 142 carries thus far. Lamar Miller is second on the team with 377 yards on 68 carries (5.5 ypc), while Mike James has 294 yards on 51 carries (5.8 ypc).
- ▶ Miami's game against Virginia this past weekend was its 903rd game all-time (567 wins, 317 losses, 19 ties)
- ▶ Miami leads the nation in pass efficiency defense (92.17) and ranks third tackles for loss (8.22 pg)
- ▶ Sean Spence leads the 'Canes with 71 tackles (35-36), while Ray-Ray Armstrong leads all UM defensive backs with 53 total tackles (28-25) and Allen Bailey leads all linemen with 35 (19-16).
- ▶ Head coach Randy Shannon's 977 lifetime Academic Progress Report average leads all head coaches in Bowl Championship Series conferences and trails only Troy Calhoun of Air Force (983) and Ken Niumatalolo of Navy (978) on the national stage.
- ▶ Orlando Franklin (35 starts) and Colin McCarthy (32 starts) have the most starting experience on the 2010 roster.
- ▶ Miami is averaging 56,952 fans at Sun Life Stadium this season. 53,674 Hurricanes fans saw the 'Canes beat Florida A&M in the season-opener on Sept. 2, a sell-out crowd of 75,115 were in attendance on Oct. 9 against FSU while 55,434 where there to see Miami beat Maryland this past weekend.
- Graig Cooper moved into third place in school history in career all-purpose yardage with his 39 yards at Virginia two weeks ago. Cooper, who now has 3,678 yards, passed Edgerrin James (3,590) and now trails only Ottis Anderson (4,265) and leader Santana Moss (4,394) for the most yards in school history.
- ▶ The 'Canes have 16 interceptions through nine games after collecting just nine in 13 games last season.
- ▶ Thirty-two former 'Canes playing in the NFL last season have earned their degree from the University of Miami.
- ▶ Six Hurricanes are ranked among the Top 150 NFL prospects according to Scouts Inc.'s Todd McShay on ESPN.com. Allen Bailey, Orlando Franklin, Brandon Harris, Graig Cooper, Colin McCarthy and Leonard Hankerson are listed, while Matt Bosher and DeMarcus Van Dyke were also rated but outside of the Top 150.
- ▶ The Hurricanes' seven turnovers created at Duke on Oct. 16 were the most for Miami's defense since tallying seven against Washington on Nov. 24, 2001. The 'Canes picked off five passes against the Blue Devils, also marking the first time since that Washington game UM has hauled in five INTs in a game.
- ▶ Eleven former Hurricanes were selected to the 2010 NFL Pro Bowl earlier this year, easily the most of any school in the country. Antrel Rolle, Ray Lewis, Ed Reed, Jon Beason, Andre Johnson, Reggie Wayne, Bryant McKinnie, Vince Wilfork, Brandon Meriweather, Jonathan Vilma and Frank Gore all represented the U at the sports' all-star game.
- ▶ Miami has had 11 more first round draft picks than any other school in the country all-time. The 'Canes have had 46 first-rounders, while Ohio State is second with 35 and Florida is third with 32.

- ▶ Miami has appeared in a bowl game 24 times in the last 27 seasons.
- ▶ The Hurricanes own an all-time record of 19-16 in 35 bowl appearances, including a record of 8-4 in bowl games since beating Virginia in the 1996 Carquest Bowl.
- ▶ Last season, Miami lost a close battle with Wisconsin in the Champs Sports Bowl in Orlando.

- ▶ Miami is one of just 10 schools from a BCS conference that ranks in the nation's Top 40 in both total offense and total defense.
- ▶ The 'Canes rank 14th in total defense (416.33) and 37th in total offense (416.33) this season under second-year coordinators Mark Whipple (offense) and John Lovett (defense).
- ▶ Miami is joined by Ohio State, Alabama, Arizona, Nebraska, Arkansas, Michigan State, Oregon, Stanford and Kentucky as the 10 teams nationally from a BCS conference that boast similar success on both sides of the ball.

GSR SCORES SHOW CONTINUED SUCCESS OF MIAMI ATHLETICS

- ▶ In what is becoming an annual upward trend, student-athletes at the University of Miami continue to excel in the classroom at a record pace. The NCAA announced the Graduation Success Rates (GSR) for all member institutions last week and Miami established a new athletics department-wide record with a GSR of 86 percent.
- ▶ Last year, the athletics department-wide GSR was 82 percent and the previous high was set at 83 percent in 2007. The Athletics Department has exceeded the NCAA average for GSR in each of the last six years.

Notes FROM THE MARYLAND GAME

- ▶ True freshman Stephen Morris made his first career start at quarterback, finishing with a career-high 286 passing yards with 18 completions on 30 attempts.
- ▶ With a season-high 504 yards of total offense (295 in the first half), Miami has surpassed 400 yards of total offense for the fifth-straight game and for the sixth time this season. This is the most offensive yards for the Hurricanes since Nov. 7, 2009, when Miami had 515 yards versus Virginia.
- ▶ In his first career start, Lamar Miller has rushed for a career-high 125 yards on 22 carries the most rushing yards by a Hurricane back this season. The last time a freshman rushed for as many yards was on Sept. 30, 2006, when Javarris James ran for 148 yards against Houston to set a freshman record.
- ▶ He is the second Hurricane back to achieve it this season, alongside Damien Berry. He is the first freshman to record a 100-yard rushing game since Graig Cooper racked up 101 yards versus Duke on Sept. 29, 2007.
- ▶ Travis Benjamin registered a 127 receiving yards (just one shy of his career high) on five catches for his first 100-yard game of the season and second of his career. His first 100-yard receiving game was at Florida State on Sept. 7, 2009 when he had 128 receiving yards.
- ▶ Graig Cooper tallied a season-high 40 yards on a season-high 10 carries.
- ▶ Miami's defense held Maryland to 254 offensive yards with 96 on the ground and 158 through the air all under the Terps' season averages.
- ▶ Allen Bailey sacked O'Brien for a loss of three yards in the third quarter and now has a team-leading 6.5 sacks this season. Olivier Vernon sacked O'Brien for a loss of seven yards in the third quarter and now has 5.0 sacks this season second-best on the squad.
- With four catches today for 66 yards, Leonard Hankerson extended his consecutive games with a catch streak to 22. Hankerson also improved on his ACC-leading touchdown total in the fourth quarter when he recorded his 10th TD of the season with a 35-yard game-winning touchdown reception.

▶ The University of Miami has always taken pride in its defense. From years of Randy Shannon as the defensive coordinator to now John Lovett, the 'Canes have spent most of the decade ranked among the nation's elite defensively.



Hankerson AMONG THE BEST ALL-TIME

- ▶ Senior wide receiver Leonard Hankerson had one of the best seasons in recent memory for a pass catcher at the U in 2009. He is having an even more impressive season here in 2010, ranking among the nation's elite in receiving.
- ▶ His 801 receiving yards last year were the 10th most in school history and the most since Andre Johnson recorded 1,092 yards in 2002.
- ▶ Hankerson has now caught a pass in 22 straight games and leads the 'Canes in catches (48), yards (747) and touchdowns (10) through nine games this season.
- ▶ Only two Hurricanes have ever recorded back-to-back 800-yard receiving seasons Michael Irvin and Andre Johnson. After 801 yards in 2009 and 743 through nine games this year, it appears Hankerson is 57 yards away from becoming the third.
- ▶ Hankerson had his first multi-TD game of his career in the 'Canes opener against FAMU, before hauling in a careerbest and UM record-tying three against Clemson on Oct. 2.
- ▶ Hankerson is one of just five 'Canes all-time to record double-digit receiving touchdowns in a season, joining Lamar Thomas, Michael Irvin, Reggie Wayne and Andre Johnson. One more touchdown for Hankerson and he ties Irvin's 1986 mark of 11 for the record.
- ▶ Hankerson has 19 receiving touchdowns in his career, tying him with Santana Moss for fifth all-time.
- ▶ He has scored at least one touchdown in seven of UM's nine games.
- ▶ Hankerson is the only ACC player and one of just nine players nationally with 10 or more receiving touchdowns.

- ▶ University of Miami junior cornerback Brandon Harris has been named as one of 10 semifinalists for the Jim Thorpe Award. Harris is the only student-athlete from the Atlantic Coast Conference to be named a semifinalist for the award, which is given annually to the nation's best collegiate defensive back.
- ▶ This marks the second straight year Harris was named a semifinalist for the Thorpe Award. Other Hurricanes to be named semifinalists for the award include Kenny Phillips (2007), Brandon Meriweather (2005), Antrel Rolle (2004), Sean Taylor (2003), Ed Reed (2001), C.J. Richardson (1994), Ryan McNeil (1992) and Bennie Blades (1987). Taylor was named a semifinalist in 2003 and Blades won the award in 1987.

Elite COMPANY

- ▶ Damien Berry joined elite company in Miami's win at Duke on Oct. 16, becoming just the fifth UM player since 1975 to rush for 100 yards in three straight games. A week later against UNC, he made it four straight with 109 yards on the ground. He is the only ACC player to have run for four straight 100-yard games this season.
- ▶ Berry, who leads UM with 690 rushing yards this year, recorded 101 at Clemson, 101 against FSU, 111 at Duke and 109 against UNC in Miami during his streak.
- ▶ The only four players to accomplish the feat at Miami since 1975 are Willis McGahee, Edgerrin James and Clinton Portis.

McCarthy's success continues

- ▶ Senior linebacker Colin McCarthy has picked up right where he left off last season, when he averaged 8.1 yards per carry over UM's last seven games. Now in the middle, McCarthy is second on the team with 66 tackles in eight games and ranks fourth in the ACC with an 8.4 tackle-per-game average.
- ▶ McCarthy is the most experienced Hurricane defender, having played in 45 and started 32 games in his career. Heading into the Georgia Tech game, he has a team-best 255 career tackles.

Feat FIRST

- ▶ For the first time in school history, the University of Miami recorded a punt return for a touchdown and a kick return for a touchdown in the same game. On Set. 7 at Ohio State, Lamar Miller returned a kickoff 88 yards for a touchdown in the first quarter before Travis Benjamin followed Miller's return with a 79- yard punt return for a touchdown with 3:04 left in the first half.
- ▶ The last time, a Miami player returned a kickoff for a touchdown was Devin Hester at NC State on Oct. 23, 2004. Hester's return went for 100 yards. Benjamin's punt return of 79 yards tied for the 10th longest in school history. It also was his first career punt return for a touchdown and the first for Miami since Thearon Collier's 60-yard punt return last season against Virginia.
- ▶ The returns also marked the first time is OSU history that an opponent scored on a punt return and a kick return in the same game against the Buckeyes.

University OF MIAMI CELEBRATES NEW TOP RANKING

- ▶ The U.S. News and World Report released their official rankings of the top colleges and universities in the nation for 2011. Coming in at number 47 was the University of Miami, which claimed the honor of the top-ranked school in the state of Florida.
- ▶ This was the first time that UM had been named aTop 50 institution, part of a nine-year span which has seen the school jump 20 spots in the rankings.
- ▶ The Hurricanes were among seven Atlantic Coast Conference schools ranked among the Top 50 the most Football Bowl Subdivision schools for any conference. ACC members joining Miami among the national leaders are: Duke, Virginia. Wake Forest, North Carolina. Boston College and Georgia Tech.
- ▶ Ranking criteria included peer assessment, graduation and retention rates, faculty resources, student selectivity, and giving by alumni.
- ▶ The editors of U.S.News & World Report have ranked the nation's top universities and colleges for the past 27 years. The 2011 edition of "America's Best Colleges" hit newsstands on August 31, and the rankings can be viewed on the magazine's website at www.usnews.com.

'Canes PREDICTED SECOND IN COASTAL

- ▶ Miami was voted to finish second in the ACC Coastal Division by media members at the 2010 ACC Football Kickoff earlier this fall. After finishing the season 9-4 (5-3 ACC) and advancing to the Champs Sports Bowl in Orlando, the Hurricanes picked up 444 points from members of the working media, while collecting 20 first place votes within the Coastal Division.
- ▶ Virginia Tech was predicted on 50 ballots to win its fourth ACC crown. Florida State finished second with 26 votes, followed by Miami (10), Georgia Tech (8), Boston College (2) and North Carolina (2). The Hokies were also tabbed to win the ACC's Coastal Division, earning 532 points and 62 first-place votes.
- ▶ Miami followed in second place (444 points, 20 first-place votes); Georgia Tech was third (408); North Carolina fourth (379); fifth was Duke (169); and Virginia (126) rounded out the six-team Coastal Division.

Miami's SHANNON SIGNS NEW FOUR-YEAR CONTRACT

▶ University of Miami Director of Athletics Kirby Hocutt announced on May 12 that head football coach Randy Shannon has signed a new four-year contract.

"There's no other place I'd rather be than coaching Hurricanes football. I'm excited about the momentum we continue to build and our strong recruiting classes," said Coach Shannon. "We have dedicated student athletes and experienced and committed coaching staff, a strong athletic program and the University leadership's support -- all important components consistent with long term success."

▶ Shannon, 44, took over the Hurricanes' program in 2007 and has led Miami to two bowl game appearances in three seasons. After going 5-7 in his first season as a head coach, Shannon led the Hurricanes to a 7-6 record in 2008 with an appearance in the Emerald Bowl. In 2009, the Hurricanes had a breakout season winning three games against Top 25 opponents to start the season enroute to a 9-4 campaign and a third place finish in the Atlantic Coast Conference. Miami ended the season with an appearance in the Champs Sports Bowl.

"We are very proud of the positive steps our football program has taken under the leadership of Coach Shannon," said UM Director of Athletics Kirby Hocutt. 'With a commitment to excellence in the classroom, in the community, and in competition, we are well on our way, once again, to the top of the college football world."

▶ Shannon has also had a tremendous impact on the football program off the field. The program was among those honored by the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) for its latest Academic Progress Report score (APR) released yesterday. It was recognized as having posted a multi-year APR score in the top 10 percent. Miami was the only Bowl Championship Subdivision (BCS) team among the 26 schools recognized that finished ranked in the final USA Today Coaches Poll and Associated Press poll after the 2009 season. UM and Duke were the only two Atlantic Coast Conference football programs recognized.

Spring GAME RECAP

- ▶ Travis Benjamin hauled in six catches for 171 yards and a touchdown and quarterbacks Stephen Morris and Spencer Whipple combined for 321 passing yards and three TDs as the Hurricanes defeated Miami, 58-53, in the University of Miami football team's annual spring game Saturday at Traz Powell Stadium in front of an estimated crowd of 10,000.
- ▶ Team Hurricanes were comprised of the second and third team offenses and the first team, defense while Team Miami was comprised of the first team offense and second and third team defenses. The offenses earned six points for a touchdown, three points for a field goal, one point for an extra point, one point for crossing the 50-yard line and one point for every first down. The defenses earned one point for a three-and-out, two points for an interception, two points for a fumble recovery and six points for a touchdown.
- ▶ Morris completed 12-of-21 passes for 209 yards, two TDs and one INT. Whipple went 7-of-16 for 112 yards and one touchdown. A.J. Highsmith quarterbacked UM and went 11-of-20 for 131 yards with three TDs and two interceptions.
- ▶ Kendal Thompkins caught a game-high eight passes for 84 yards and one touchdown for the Hurricanes. Leonard Hankerson had three receptions for 61 yards and two touchdowns.
- ▶ Linebacker Sean Spence led the Hurricanes with eight tackles. Vaughn Telemaque added six tackles for the Hurricanes. Brandon McGee had seven tackles and two pass breakups for Miami while safety Ray Ray Armstrong intercepted two passes.

Gino TORRETTA ENSHRINED IN COLLEGE FOOTBALL HOF

- ▶ Former University of Miami quarterback Gino Torretta was enshrined into the National Football Foundation (NFF) College Football Hall of Fame in South Bend, Ind. on July 17. Torretta is the sixth Hurricane to be selected for induction, as he joined former student-athletes Bennie Blades, (2006), Don Bosseler (1990) and Ted Hendricks (1987) along with coaches Andy Gustafson (1985) and Jack Harding (1980) in the Hall.
- ▶ Torretta, along with the 23 other inducees in this year's class, took part in two full days of activities in conjunction with the enshrinement, which was held Saturday night at the Century Center Convention Center.
- ▶ A key factor in many of Miami's national championship-contending teams, Torretta became one of the most decorated players in college football history, claiming unanimous First Team All-America honors, the Heisman Trophy, Davey O'Brien, Johnny Unitas Golden Arm, Maxwell and Walter Camp awards in 1992.

Miami-NOTRE DAME FOOTBALL SERIES SET

- ▶ The University of Miami and the University of Notre Dame have officially come to an agreement on the dates and sites of a future three-game football series between the schools.
- ▶ The series will open with a neutral site game at Soldier Field in Chicago on Saturday, Oct. 6, 2012. Game two of the series is scheduled for four years later, with the Hurricanes traveling to South Bend, Ind. to face the Fighting Irish on Saturday, Oct. 8, 2016 at Notre Dame Stadium. The final game of the contract will be played at Sun Life Stadium in Miami Gardens, Fla. on Saturday, Nov. 25, 2017.
- ▶ The last time the two teams met in Miami, the Hurricanes cruised to a 27-10 win over Notre Dame at the Orange Bowl in 1989. Three of Miami's wins over Notre Dame came during the regular season of the Hurricanes' 1983, 1987 and 1989 national championship years. Notre Dame leads the all-time series between the two schools, 15-7-1.
- ▶ Miami and Notre Dame recently made national headlines when it was announced the two programs would share the American Football Coaches Association's 2009 Academic Achievement Award, as both schools recorded a 100 percent graduation rate for members of its freshman football student-athlete class of 2002.
