- 1 Miami will take part in its 40th bowl game in program history.
- 2 The Hurricanes won their final four games of the regular season for the first time since 2002.
- 3 Mark Richt will take part in his 15th bowl game as a head coach. Richt owns a 9-5 career record in bowl games. Each of his five bowl losses have come by five points or less.
- 4 Junior quarterback Brad Kaaya enters the Russell Athletic Bowl as the Hurricanes' all-time passing yards leader (9,686). He set the record in Miami's regular season finale against Duke.
- 5 Wide receiver Ahmmon Richards broke Michael Irvin's 31-year-old single season freshman receiving yards record this year. He currently leads Miami with 866 yards receiving.

## CANES RETURN TO ORLANDO FOR THE RUSSELL ATHLETIC BOWL

- For the fourth consecutive season and the 40th time in program history, the University of Miami football team will play in a bowl game. The Hurricanes will take on West Virginia on Dec. 28 in the 2016 Russell Athletic Bowl. Kickoff is set for 5:30 p.m. and will air on ESPN.
- Miami's trip to the Russell Athletic Bowl marks the third time the Hurricanes have played in Orlando for a bowl. Miami played Wisconsin in the Champ Sports Bowl in 2009 and faced Louisville in the Russell Athletic Bowl in 2013.
- Miami will face West Virginia for the 20th time in program history. The Hurricanes are 16-3 all-time against the Mountaineers. The Hurricanes have won nine of the last 10 matchups against the Mountaineers.
- The series opened in 1942 with the Hurricanes earning a 21-13 win in Miami. The Hurricanes and Mountaineers played one another every season from 1991 to 2003 when both institutions were members of the BIG EAST Conference.
- Miami defeated West Virginia 22-20 in its last meeting with the Mountaineers thanks to a game-winning field goal from Jon Peattie.
- Miami's matchup against West Virginia will mark the final college football game for Gage Batten, Kevin Carroll, Jamal Carter, Sr., Wyatt Chickillo, Adrian Colbert, Stacy Coley, Standish Dobard, Corn Elder, Frank Gabriel, Alex Gall, Danny Isidora, Rayshawn Jenkins, Malcolm Lewis, Austin Pfenninger, Justin Vogel, Michael Welch and Marquez Williams.

## WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- A win over West Virginia would hand Miami its fifth straight win. Miami has not won five straight games to close out a season since its 2001 National Championship campaign.
- Miami will look to earn its 20th bowl victory in program history. The Hurricanes' last bowl win came back in 2006 as they defeated Nevada in the MPC Computers Bowl.
- Miami will be in search of its seventh straight win over West Virginia. The Hurricanes' last loss to WVU came back in 1997.
- Kaaya will look to throw for 200-or-more yards for the 30th time his career. In 29 of his 37 career games, Kaaya has thrown for over 200 yards. He also has at least one touchdown in 32 career outings.
- Kaaya is 393 passing yards shy of moving past Bernie Kosar (3,642, 1984) for first all-time on the Miami single season passing yards list.
- Kaaya is 314 passing yards shy of 10,000 for his career. Phillip Rivers (NC State, 13,484), Tajh Boyd (Clemson, 11,904) and Thaddeus Lewis (Duke, 10,065) are the only other quarterbacks in ACC history to pass for over 10,000 yards during their careers.
- Kaaya needs just 154 yards to move past Riley Skinner (Wake Forest, 2006-09) and Chris Weinke (Florida State, 1997-00) for fifth and fourth, respectively on the ACC's all-time career passing yards list.
- Sophomore running back Mark Walton needs just 33 yards rushing to pass Edgerrin James (1997) for seventh all-time in a single season.
- The Hurricanes' defense needs just one tackle for loss to record 100 for the year. Miami has not totaled 100 tackles for loss in a single season since 2010. Miami has only surpassed 100 tackles for loss in a single season seven times since 1990.
- Junior Michael Badgley stands just 11 points shy of becoming the all-time single season leader in points scored by a kicker.
- Senior wide receiver Stacy Coley needs just one receiving touchdown to move into a five-way tie for third on Miami's all-time single season touchdown receiving list.
- If running back Joe Yearby surpasses 100 yards rushing, it would mark the eighth time in his career in which he has passed the century mark and would tie him for eighth all-time at Miami with Frank Gore.
- Senior offensive lineman Danny Isidora will look to make his 39th consecutive start. Isidora's current consecutive start streak of 38 games is the team's longest.

## A LOOK BACK AT DUKE: CANES WIN BIG ON SENIOR DAY VS. DUKE

- Prior to Miami's matchup with Duke, the Hurricanes honored 18 student-athletes on Senior Day.
- With the win over Duke, Miami improved to 12-2 all-time against the Blue Devils.
- The Hurricanes moved to 6-1 all-time against Duke at home.
- The 57,396 fans in attendance marked the sixth straight game in which Miami has totaled 50,000-plus fans.
- With the win, Miami finished the year with four straight wins to close out the regular season. Miami won four straight games to close out a regular season for the first time since 2002.

- Miami outscored Duke 10-7 in the first quarter. Miami has outscored its opponents 85-51 in the first quarter this season.
- Miami outgained Duke 568-395 in total yards.



- The Hurricanes scored points on four of their first five drives in the first half and on eight of 12 drives overall.
- Miami's 11-play, 69-yard drive in the second quarter marked the 16th time this season Miami has had a scoring drive of 10-or-more plays.
- Brad Kaaya's 76-yard touchdown pass to David Njoku marked the third one-play scoring drive this season.
- Miami has scored 40-or-more points in four games this season.
- The Hurricanes have had three players finish with 100-or-more all-purpose yards in three games this season (FAMU, Pitt and Duke). Mark Walton, Stacy Coley and Njoku all finished with 100-or-more all purpose yards in each of those games.
- **With his 396 passing yards against Duke, Kaaya passed Ken Dorsey and became the Hurricanes' all-time leading passer. He currently has 9,686 career passing yards.**
- Kaaya's four touchdown passes tied a career high.
- Kaaya now has 11 career 300 yard passing games.
- With 396 passing yards, Kaaya moved past T.J. Yates (North Carolina), Jamie Barnette (NC State), Sean Renfree (Duke), Ben Bennett (Duke) and Charlie Whitehurst (Clemson) into sixth place on the all-time ACC career passing list.
- Sophomore running back Mark Walton hauled in his second career receiving touchdown in the first quarter. Walton now has 25 career touchdowns in 25 career games. He finished with four receptions for 46 yards and added 60 rushing yards on 13 carries.
- Kaaya's first quarter touchdown to Walton marked the 32nd game in his career in which he has thrown a touchdown pass.
- Coley increased his consecutive catch streak to 21 games. He led the Hurricanes with four first half receptions and finished with a team-high nine catches for 118 yards and a touchdown. Coley's nine receptions tied a career high.
- Njoku led the Hurricanes with a career-high 134 receiving yards. His two receiving touchdowns also tied a career high.
- Senior offensive lineman Danny Isidora got the start at right guard to increase his consecutive start streak to a team-best 38 games.
- Senior Jamal Carter, Sr. led the Hurricanes with 13 tackles (four solo).
- Freshman Joe Jackson recorded a pair of sacks in the second quarter. He currently leads the team with 7.5 sacks on the year.
- Freshman Shaquille Quarterman tallied 10 tackles (four solo) and had a pass break up and two QB hurries.
- Senior Rayshawn Jenkins recorded his 33rd career start on defense. His 33 career starts are the most on the defensive side of the ball. Jenkins had 10 tackles (seven solo).
- Junior kicker Michael Badgley drilled four field goals, connecting from 47, 25, 33 and 43 yards out. Badgley has now made 21-of-21 field goal attempts between 40-49 yards during his UM career.
- With his three first half field goals, Badgley passed former Hurricane Danny Miller (1978-81) for third on the all-time career list for most field goals made.

## MEET THE NEW GUY IN TOWN - MARK RICHT

- University of Miami Director of Athletics Blake James announced on Dec. 4, 2015 the hiring of Hurricane alumnus Mark Richt as the 24th head football coach at The U.
- Richt was officially introduced to the public at a news conference at the Shalala Student Center.
- Richt, born in Omaha, Neb., and raised in Boca Raton, Fla., returned to his alma mater after leading the University of Georgia football program for the previous 15 years. During that time he compiled a 145-51 overall record and an 83-37 mark in Southeastern Conference play.
- Richt won two SEC championships, six SEC East titles and nine bowl games, and finished the season in the Associated Press Top 10 rankings seven times.

## SO CLOSE

- Miami's four losses this season have come by a combined total of 32 points (8.0 points per game average).
- Two of Miami's four losses have come by three points or less.
- Miami's loss at home against Florida State came by one point after the Hurricanes had their extra point attempt blocked late in the fourth quarter.

## YIPPEE KAAYA

- In three years as the Hurricanes' quarterback, Brad Kaaya has already posted career numbers that rank among the most prolific in program history.
- Kaaya was on the preseason watch lists for eight major honors: The Lombardi Award, the Manning Award, the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm, College Football Performance, the Davey O'Brien Award, American Football Coaches Association Good Works Team, the Wuerffel Trophy and the Maxwell Award.
- Kaaya finished the year on a high note as he threw 10 touchdowns and had just one interception in his final four games. He also surpassed 300 yards through the air in two of his final four regular season games.
- Kaaya's 9,686 career-passing yards are already the most in Miami history. His 3,238 passing yards as a sophomore in 2015 are tied for the sixth-most in a single season, while his 3,198 yards in 2014 are the eighth-most. He is the only QB with two individual seasons ranking in the top 10.
- His 9,686 passing yards rank sixth on the ACC all-time career list. Kaaya is one of only 13 signal callers in league history to pass for over 9,000 career yards. In addition, Kaaya is the only quarterback in program history to throw for 3,000 yards-or-more in three straight seasons.
- With his three touchdown passes at Appalachian State, Kaaya passed legendary Hurricane quarterbacks Craig Erickson, Gino Torretta, Steve Walsh and Vinny Testaverde on the all-time touchdown pass list.
- Kaaya's 65 career touchdown passes rank third all-time in Miami history.
- Kaaya has thrown for 200 or more yards in 29 of his 37 career games and has 11 career 300-yard performances. His career high of 405 yards came at Florida State on Oct. 10, 2015.
- Kaaya's 11 career 300-yard passing games are ranked second behind Clemson's Deshaun Watson among active ACC players.
- Kaaya was one of just three players nationally to throw for 3,000-or-more yards, 10-or-more touchdowns and five-or-fewer interceptions in 2015.
- As a freshman in 2014, Kaaya was named the ACC Offensive and ACC Overall Rookie of the Year after a stellar first campaign with the Hurricanes.

## CAN OF CORN

- Corn Elder finished the regular season with 69.0 tackles (49.0 solo), 4.5 tackles for loss, 3.0 sacks, one interception and 12 pass breakups en route to earning All-ACC honors (first team, coaches; second team ACSMA).
- His 12 pass breakups are a team best. He also leads the team with 46.0 solo tackles.
- In the Hurricanes' home opener against FAMU, Elder picked off a pass and tallied a pair of tackles.
- In Miami's first road game of the year at Appalachian State, Elder tied a then career high with 7.0 tackles. He also tallied a sack, a tackle for loss, one pass breakup and one quarterback hurry.
- Against Florida State, Elder registered 6.0 tackles and one pass breakup.
- In the Hurricanes' matchup against North Carolina, Elder posted career highs in tackles (14.0) and solo tackles (11.0). He also tallied a pass breakup and a sack.
- Against Virginia Tech, Elder made six stops and had two pass breakups.
- Elder recorded a team-best 9.0 solo tackles and had a pass breakup versus Pittsburgh.
- On Nov. 12 versus Virginia, Elder recorded 5.0 tackles (4.0 solo), a sack, a forced fumble and one fumble recovery.
- He closed the regular season with six tackles against Duke.

## KOOL CANES

- Craig Kuligowski, who is widely regarded as one of the top defensive line coaches in the country, has already made an immediate impact in his first season at Miami. The Hurricanes finished the regular season sixth in the nation in tackles for loss per game (8.3) and rank 23rd in sacks per game (2.75).
- Miami finished the regular season with 99 tackles for loss and 34 sacks. In 2015, the Hurricanes recorded 66 tackles for loss and 26 sacks for the entire season.
- Prior to arriving at Miami, Kuligowski spent 15 years at Missouri, where his defensive line units frequently ranked among the nation's best in tackles for loss and sacks.

## GETTING DEFENSIVE

- Under first-year defensive coordinator and Miami native Manny Diaz, the Hurricanes are holding opponents to just 4.84 yards per play - a figure that ranks 11th among teams at the FBS level.
- The Hurricanes rank in the top 25 nationally in four different defensive categories: scoring defense (No. 13/18.9), team sacks (No. 23/2.75), tackles for loss (No. 6/8.3) and total defense (No. 27/355.3).
- Miami has allowed 26 touchdowns in its last 50 quarters dating back to last season.
- Miami has held 10 of its 12 opponents under its 2016 scoring average, including Duke in the regular season finale on Nov. 26.
- Miami has started and finished games strong, outscoring its opponents by a combined 166-88 in the first and fourth quarters of games.
- The Hurricanes have held three opponents scoreless in the second half this season (FAMU, North Carolina and Virginia).
- In its ACC opener against Georgia Tech, Miami's defense accounted for 12 points, as freshmen Shaquille Quarterman and Joe Jackson each returned a fumble for a touchdown.
- Through 12 games in 2016, nine players already have at least 5.0 tackles for loss. In 2015, just four players finished the season (13 games) with at least 5.0 tackles for loss.
- Against Appalachian State, Miami held the Mountaineers to just 2.6 yards per carry on the ground.
- Miami dominated FAU in the first half, as it held the Owls to just one yard rushing on 17 attempts. The Hurricanes also did not allow the Owls to convert one third-down conversion as they went 0-for-11. FAU finished the game with just 46 yards.
- The Hurricanes opened the year on a high note, as they held FAMU to just 43 second-half yards.

## MAKING HIS MARK

- Running back Mark Walton has rushed for over 100 yards in six games this season.
- In 25 career games, Walton has scored 25 touchdowns (23 rushing, two receiving). He currently leads the team with 15 touchdowns (14 rushing and one receiving).
- With his 120 yards rushing this at NC State, Walton became the 10th Miami running back to surpass 1,000 yards rushing in a single season. It also marked the 11th time Miami has had 1,000-yard rusher (Edgerrin James surpassed 1,000 yards twice).
- Walton's three touchdown performance against NC State marked the fifth time in his career in which he has scored multiple touchdowns.
- Walton closed the year with 106 yards of all-purpose yards and one touchdown reception in the Hurricanes' regular season finale against Duke.
- On Oct. 12 at Virginia, Walton dashed for 111 yards on the ground.
- Against Pittsburgh, Walton rushed for 125 yards and a touchdown.
- Against North Carolina on Oct. 15, Walton rushed for 82 yards on a career-high 24 carries.
- Walton has more than doubled his 2015 rushing total of 461 yards. He currently leads the team with 1,065 yards on the ground.
- Walton scored a touchdown on the first play of the game at Appalachian State, as he raced 80 yards for the score. His 80-yard run was the longest of his young career.
- Walton's 80-yard touchdown run against Appalachian State is tied for the second-longest rush in the ACC this season.
- On Sept. 10 against FAU, Walton rushed for a career-high 155 yards. He also scored a career-high four touchdowns against the Owls. His 155-yard output against FAU was the fifth highest rushing total in the ACC this season. In two career games against FAU, Walton has totaled seven rushing touchdowns.

- Walton delivered an impressive first season with the Hurricanes as a freshman in 2015, ranking second on the team with 1,054 all-purpose yards and first with 10 total touchdowns.
- Walton's 10 touchdowns - nine rushing and one receiving - were tied with Stacy Coley (2013) for second-most by a Miami freshman since 2000.
- Walton, who had 461 rushing yards and 293 receiving yards, was one of just 11 freshman running backs nationally with eight-or-more rushing touchdowns in 2015.

## AHMMON RICHARDS AMONG THE BEST UM FRESHMAN WRs ... EVER

- Freshman wide receiver Ahmmon Richards currently leads the Hurricanes with 866 yards receiving. His 866 yards are the most ever by a freshman wide receiver at Miami.
- His 866 receiving yards currently rank ninth all-time in a single season at Miami.
- His 18.83 yards per reception are tops among all FBS freshman nationally. Richards' 18.83 yards per reception are ranked 21st nationally overall.
- Richards' 866 yards receiving lead all FBS freshman nationally.
- Richards has been honored as the ACC Rookie of the Week twice this season.

## FRESHMAN PHENOMS

- Miami freshman linebackers Michael Pinckney, Shaquille Quarterman and Zach McCloud have made an immediate impact in their first seasons at The U. Most recently, both Quarterman and McCloud earned All-America honors by ESPN.
- The three rookie linebackers have combined for 167.0 tackles, 18.0 tackles for loss and 5.0 sacks. They have combined for over 20 percent of the team's tackles this season.
- The Miami freshman trio has started at linebacker in the Hurricanes' last 10 games. UM is the only school in the nation that has started three true freshman linebackers.
- Quarterman and Pinckney are ranked first (79.0) and fifth (57.0) on the team in tackles, while McCloud ranks 10th on the team in tackles (31.0).

## THE SPECIALIST

- Punter Justin Vogel has lived up to his preseason all-conference honor as he earned postseason Second Team All-ACC recognition. The Tampa, Fla., native has 57 punts for 2,522 yards. His 44.2 yards per punt average ranks second in the ACC and 18th nationally.
- Vogel has 23 punts that have landed inside the 20-yard line and has 16 that have gone over 50 yards.
- Vogel earned Preseason All-ACC honors after a stellar junior season in which he was recognized with All-ACC Third-Team honors by the media and All-ACC honorable mention from the league's coaches.
- Vogel also has established himself as a leader on and off the field. This season, he was selected as a team captain four times during the regular season. He also was nominated for the Lowe's Senior Class Award for his work in the classroom and in the community.
- Vogel averaged 42.5 yards per punt in 2015, while his 73-yarder against Clemson on Oct. 24 was the

longest of any ACC punter in 2015. He totaled 13 punts of 50 yards or more last season.

- Vogel was one of 28 punters to be named to the watch list for the 2016 Ray Guy Award. Vogel is a three-time Ray Guy Award nominee and was a semifinalist for the award in 2014.
- After spending the 2013 season at Florida, Vogel averaged 42.8 yards per punt and 62.1 yards on kickoffs in 2014. He was named Third-Team All-ACC by Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association.

## THE COLEY CONNECTION

- Wide receiver Stacy Coley has established himself as one of the Hurricanes' top pass catchers of all-time. In 48 career games, Coley has hauled in 163 receptions (second all-time) for 2,167 yards (fifth) and 20 touchdowns (tied for fourth).
- His 58 receptions, 703 receiving yards and nine touchdown receptions are all single season career-bests.
- He currently stands as the team's leading pass catcher with 58 receptions.
- Following his career season in Coral Gables, Coley earned All-ACC honors for the third time in his career.
- Coley's nine receiving touchdowns this season are tied for 32nd in the NCAA and third in the ACC.
- Coley has caught a pass in 21 straight games.
- On Senior Day against Duke, Coley tied a career high with nine receptions and totaled a season-best 118 receiving yards.
- On Oct. 10, Coley was named ACC Receiver of the Week after he hauled in seven catches for 80 yards and two touchdowns against Florida State.
- Coley had a dominant freshman season in 2013, earning Freshman All-America honors and All-ACC recognition after leading the team with 1,461 all-purpose yards.
- After a quiet 2014, he returned to form in 2015. Despite missing two games with a hamstring injury, Coley finished second on the team in catches (47) and receiving yards (689).
- Coley's 79.2 yards-per-game average in conference play ranked second in the ACC last season.
- He caught at least three passes in each of his final nine games in 2015, and had 678 yards over that span.
- Following the 2015 campaign, he earned All-ACC Second Team (Coaches) and All-ACC Third Team (ACSMA) recognition.

## BADG-O-MATIC

- Junior Michael Badgley continued his impressive collegiate career this season by leading the team in scoring with 109 points. He also connected on 20-of-25 field goals and was successful in 49-of-51 extra point attempts during the regular season.
- Following the season, Badgley earned All-ACC honors from both the Coaches' and ACSMA. He also earned First Team Associated Press All-ACC recognition.
- Badgley entered the 2016 following a prolific season in 2015 as he set the Miami single-season record for made field goals (25), besting the previous school record held by Jon Peattie (22, 2003). He entered 2016 on the watch list for the Lou Groza Award, which honors the nation's best kicker.
- He is a perfect 21-of-21 in field goal attempts from between 40-49 yards during his UM career.
- Badgley has connected on 49 extra points this season. His consecutive streak for PAT kicks made ended against Florida State at 72. He has now 122 PAT kicks made for his career.
- In the Hurricanes' final road game of the year at NC State, Badgley was 2-for-3 as he booted field goals from 31 and 22 yards.
- Against Virginia, Badgley was 2-for-3 in field goal attempts as he was good from 40 and 44 yards.
- On Nov. 5 versus Pittsburgh, Badgley was 3-for-3, connecting from 46, 48 and 25 yards out.
- Against Notre Dame, Badgley was 2-for-2 in field goal attempts as he connected on attempts from 43 and 38 yards out.
- On Oct. 15 against North Carolina, Badgley hit a pair of field goals from 47 and 22 yards out.
- Against Florida State, Badgley drilled two field goals, including a season-long 51-yarder. His 51-yard field goal against FSU is tied for the fourth longest field goal in the ACC this year.
- Against Appalachian State, Badgley connected on six extra points and a 44-yard field goal.
- Badgley tied a UM record when he hit a 57-yard field goal against Georgia Tech in 2015.
- The Summit, N.J., native set a school record when he hit five field goals against Nebraska in 2015, and would tie that mark later in the season with five field goals made against Pittsburgh.
- Badgley's 2.08 field goals per game average ranked first in Division I last season, while his 25 made field goals were tied for fourth-most in the nation. He ranked 16th in scoring (9.6 points per game).

## THE SOUTH FLORIDA DUO

- Miami running backs Mark Walton and Joe Yearby have combined to rush for 1,657 yards this season.
- Louisville's rushing duo of Lamar Jackson and Brandon Radcliff are the only other rushing tandem in the ACC that have more combined yards than Walton and Yearby.
- Walton (1,065) and Yearby (592) have accounted for 88 percent of the Hurricanes rushing output this year.
- In addition, Walton (90) and Yearby (42) have combined for 132 points.
- Both Walton (Booker T. Washington) and Yearby (Miami Central) attended Miami-area high schools before joining the Hurricanes.

## ALMOST PERFECT 10

- Teams rarely beat Miami when scoring 10-or-fewer points.
- The Hurricanes are 161-2 in their last 163 games when holding opponents to 10 points-or-fewer, after winning 45-10 at Appalachian State. That run goes back to Oct. 1, 1977, ironically, a season that began with Miami holding its first two opponents to exactly 10 points apiece and still losing both of those games.
- The only 10 points allowed-or-fewer losses since: Nov. 8, 2003 to Tennessee (10-6) and Sept. 5, 2005 to Florida State (10-7).

## OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION

- Miami's offensive unit has proven to be an explosive unit over the past three years. The Hurricanes' 2013, 2014, 2015 and 2016 offensive units all rank among Miami's top 10 for most total yards in a single season.
- The 2016 Hurricanes' offensive attack currently ranks ninth for most total yards. This season Miami's offensive unit has gained 5,174 yards of total offensive.
- Miami also has scored 415 points this year - a figure that ranks sixth in school history for a single season.

## #TIGHTENDU TRADITION ALIVE AND WELL

- Junior Christopher Herndon IV and redshirt sophomore David Njoku have played significant roles in the offense this season.
- Njoku (38) and Herndon IV (25) rank third and fifth on the team in receptions, respectively. Njoku (654) and Herndon IV (296) have combined for 950 yards receiving.
- The 950 combined yards by Njoku and Herndon IV are the most in the ACC by a tight end duo this season.
- Njoku's 36 receptions this season rank third and his 520 yards receiving rank fifth among ACC tight ends.
- Njoku and Herndon IV have combined for 27 percent of the team's receptions this year.
- Miami added two tight end signees in 2016: Jovani Haskins and Michael Irvin II.

### BLOCK PARTY

- The Miami Hurricanes have proven to be a force when it comes to blocking kicks and punts this season. Through 12 games in 2016, Miami has combined for eight blocks on special teams with three coming on punts attempts and five coming on field goal attempts.
- Miami is third in the nation in blocked punts and is ranked fifth in blocked kicks.
- Sophomore RJ McIntosh blocked his first career punt against FAU on Sept. 10. It marked the second straight week in which a Miami player had blocked a punt. Pat Bethel blocked a punt in the Hurricanes' season opener against FAMU.
- McIntosh also has blocked two kicks this season. His two blocked kicks are ranked fourth in the NCAA and first in the ACC.
- On Oct. 29 at Notre Dame, Miami freshman Zach McCloud blocked his first career punt.
- The Hurricanes are one of just 18 teams nationally that have blocked punts this season and one of just 65 teams that have blocked kicks this year.

### BRINGIN' IT BACK WITH BERRIOS

- Miami's punt return attack ranks 12th in the country (12.89 avg.) in large part to the play of junior Braxton Berrios, who has played a key role in the Hurricanes punt return game this season.
- The North Carolina native ranks sixth in the country and third in the ACC in punt return average (12.8 avg.). He also is one of just seven players this season that have returned a punt for a touchdown.
- His 41-yard punt return for a touchdown in Miami's season opener against FAMU was the first of his career. It also marked the first time a Hurricane had scored on a punt return since Corn Elder did so against Bethune-Cookman in 2015.
- Berrios also had a career-best 43-yard punt return, which set up the Hurricanes second touchdown of the night against Florida State.
- Berrios' punt returns of 43 (vs. FSU) and 41 (vs. FAMU) are ranked as the ninth longest punt return in the ACC this year.
- Off the field, Berrios excels in the classroom with a team-best 3.986 grade point average in finance/entrepreneurship. He also has never received a grade lower than an A- since coming to college.

### WELCOME TO THE SHOW

- Miami had 13 freshmen make their debuts on Sept. 3 against FAMU in the form of DL Pat Bethel, DB Romeo Finley, RB Travis Homer, DL Joe Jackson, DB Jeff James Jr., TE Michael Irvin II, LB Zach McCloud, WR Dionte Mullins, LB Michael Pinckney, LB Shaquille Quarterman, WR Ahmmon Richards, DB Cedrick Wright and DB Malek Young.

### **CANES TO FACE TEXAS A&M IN 2022 AND 2023**

The University of Miami and Texas A&M University announced a home-and-home-series for the 2022 and 2023 seasons on Nov. 29.

The first matchup of the two-game series will begin on Sept. 17, 2022 when Miami heads to College Station, Texas. The Aggies will return to Miami on Sept. 9, 2023.

The Hurricanes and Aggies have played one another just three times. The two teams took part in a home and home series back in 2007 and 2008. The Hurricanes captured victories in both of those contests, winning 34-17 in 2007 and 41-23 in 2008.

The first game was held in 1944 in Miami with Texas A&M defeating the Hurricanes.

Miami's matchup with Texas A&M adds to an already impressive list of future opponents, which include games against Notre Dame (2017), LSU (2018), Florida (2019) and Michigan State (2020 and 2021).

- The Hurricanes currently have over 42,000 football season ticket holders.
- Since the hiring of head coach Mark Richt on Dec. 4, 2015, Miami has added 15,000 new season ticket holders.

## #PROCANES CONTINUING TRADITION

- Miami currently has **43 #ProCanes on NFL rosters; 22 of 32** NFL teams had at least one former Cane on their roster, while the Indianapolis Colts lead all teams with four.
- Miami had two players selected in the 2016 NFL Draft: DB Artie Burns (1st round, PIT) and DB Deon Bush (4th, CHI).
- Miami had eight former student-athletes sign free agent contracts following the 2015 season: Rashawn Scott (MIA), Tracy Howard (CLE), Ufomba Kamalu (DEN), Calvin Heurtelou (HOU), Herb Waters (GB), Tyriq McCord (PIT) and Raphael Kirby (DET).
- The Hurricanes have had five or more players taken in the NFL Draft on 24 separate occasions since 1980.
- Ninety-five Hurricanes have been picked in the NFL Draft since the start of the 2000 season, a figure that is tied for second-most among all NCAA programs.
- Miami's 29 NFL first-round draft picks since 2000, including Artie Burns (No. 25 overall) in 2016, are the most among all NCAA programs.

## WISE GUYS

- University of Miami football juniors Braxton Berrios and Brad Kaaya were named to the 2016 College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) Academic All-District™ Football First Team in District Four.
- Berrios, who sports a 3.98 grade point average majoring in finance and entrepreneurship was selected to the team for the second consecutive season. Kaaya was earned a spot on the team with a 3.33 grade point average in public relations.
- Both are now eligible for CoSIDA Academic All-America honors. The CoSIDA Academic All-America® Teams will be selected later this month.

## CANES TO RECEIVE THE AFCA ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

- The Miami football program will receive the American Football Coaches Association's 2016 Academic Achievement Award at the Honors Luncheon on Jan. 9 at the 2017 AFCA Convention in Nashville.
- The Hurricanes shared the AFCA academic achievement award with Northwestern and Stanford. Miami, Northwestern and Stanford received the award after members from its freshman football student-athlete class of 2009 recorded a 100 percent graduation rate.
- Miami will receive the AFCA Academic Achievement Award for the second time in program history. The Hurricanes' first AFCA Academic Achievement Award came in 2009.

## RICHT NAMED AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM HONORARY HEAD COACH

- Miami football head coach Mark Richt was selected as the honorary head coach for the 2016 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team®, one of the most coveted off-the-field honors in college football.
- Richt, who is in his first year as the Hurricanes' football head coach, routinely gives back to the local community and has stressed community outreach projects to his players since arriving on campus last year.
- Richt will join the AFCA Good Works Team in New Orleans for the Sugar Bowl on Jan. 2, 2017 at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome.
- This year, in recognition of the 25th anniversary, Allstate and the AFCA added three additional spots to the team, including an honorary head coach, bringing the final roster to 25 members.

## CANES RECEIVE LEAD GIFT FOR INDOOR FACILITY

- The University of Miami announced earlier this fall the largest donation in the history of the Department of Athletics as the lead gift for a state-of-the-art football indoor practice facility.
- In honor of their mother, Carol, Jeffrey Soffer and Carol's other children, have made a \$14 million commitment towards the Carol Soffer Football Indoor Practice Facility.
- The 81,800-square-foot facility will feature two field-turf fields – one 80 yards long and an additional 40-yard field directly connecting to the Squillante Strength and Conditioning Center.
- The project includes a 20,000-square-foot football operations center with a mezzanine level that will house all of the football coaches' office space.
- Head coach Mark Richt also made \$1 million commitment towards the project.

# MARK RICHT

HEAD COACH | FIRST SEASON AT MIAMI (16TH OVERALL) | 153-55 (.735)

Hurricane alumnus Mark Richt was named the 24th head football coach at the University of Miami on Dec. 4, 2015, by Director of Athletics Blake James.

The 2016 season marks Richt's first season in Coral Gables.

Richt, born in Omaha, Neb., and raised in Boca Raton, Fla., returned to his alma mater after leading the University of Georgia football program for the past 15 years, compiling a 145-51 overall record and an 85-40 mark in Southeastern Conference play, winning two SEC championships, six SEC East titles and nine bowl games, and finishing the season in the Associated Press Top 10 rankings seven times.

Richt's .745 winning percentage prior to the 2016 season, ranked eighth-best among active FBS head coaches.

Richt is one of only seven head coaches in SEC history to record four straight 10-win seasons (2002-05).

During his tenure on the sidelines in Athens, Ga., 77 of Richt's players were selected in the NFL Draft over the last 14 years, including eight chosen in the 2002 and 2013 NFL Drafts – the most Georgia players ever selected in a single year.

Off the field, Richt places a strong emphasis on academics and 292 Georgia players earned their degrees during his tenure.

Richt was the 2013 recipient of the Stallings Award given for commitment to humanitarian and community service efforts, and in 2010, he was named to the American

Football Coaches Association Board of Trustees.

Before his arrival at Georgia, Richt spent seven seasons as the offensive coordinator at Florida State. In his time in Tallahassee, the Seminoles finished in the nation's top five in scoring offense on five occasions, top 12 in total offense five times, and top 12 in passing offense five times.

The 2000 team, which played in the National Championship game against Oklahoma, finished the regular season ranked first nationally in total offense (549.0 ypg), first in passing offense (384.0 ypg) and third in scoring offense (42.4 ppg).

Richt sent six FSU quarterbacks into the NFL between 1987 and 2000. In 2000, Richt coached Chris Weinke to the Heisman Trophy, and in 1991, he coached Casey Weldon to the runner-up for the Heisman. Brad Johnson (now Richt's brother-in-law), was a Pro Bowl selection for Washington in 2000 and led the Tampa Bay Bucs to the Super Bowl title in 2003. Other Richt pro protégés include Danny Kanell (New York Giants), Danny McManus (Kansas City Chiefs) and Peter Tom Willis (Chicago Bears).

Richt played quarterback for the Miami Hurricanes under legendary head coach Howard Schnellenberger (1979-82).

He spent most of his career at Miami as a backup to former Pro Football Hall of Famer Buffalo Bills star Jim Kelly. In one of Richt's years at Miami, his teammates included Kelly, Vinny Testaverde and Bernie Kosar and quarterbacks coach Earl Morrall.

Richt is married to the former Katharyn Francis of Tallahassee, Fla. The couple has four children – Jonathan, David, Zach and Anya. Jon was married to the former Anna Cearley, in May 2010.
