About Tonight's Game

The Hokies enter tonight's game as the 14-seed and are 11-21 overall ... Miami is the 6-seed and is 20-11 overall ... This is the third meeting of the season between the two schools ... Miami has won the last two meetings, most recently an 82-61 victory on Saturday in Cassell Coliseum.

Last Game: VT 81, Wake Forest 80

In an exciting contest on Opening Day at the ACC Tournament, the Hokies defeated Wake Forest, 81-80, on Monday afternoon ... After the Demon Deacons took an 80-79 lead on a three-pointer by Dinos Mitoglou with 25 seconds remaining, Hokie freshman **Jalen Hudson** scored his 32nd point of the contest with 12 seconds remaining to give Tech an 81-80 lead ... Wake had several opportunities in the closing seconds, but could not capitalize and the Hokies held on for the win ... Hudson led all scorers with a career-high 32 points and **Ahmed Hill** added 12 points in the win ... Tech committed a season-low four turnovers and shot 48.4 percent from the floor.

Hudson's Big Day

Jalen Hudson scored a career-high 32 points in the win over Wake Forest on Tuesday ... That total sets a new Virginia Tech record for points in an ACC Tournament game ... The old mark was 26 points by A.D. Vassallo against North Carolina in the 2009 ACC Tournament in the Georgia Dome .. The 32 points is tied for the third-most in an ACC Tournament first round contest.

More on Hudson's Day

The 32 points by **Jalen Hudson** is the fourth-highest point total by a freshman in an ACC Tournament game ... The record is Olivier Hanlan's 41 points in the 2013 tournament first round game ... The second-highest total was 40 points by Harrison Barnes in the 2011 semifinals and the third-highest is 33 points by Mark Price in the 1983 semifinals ... Hudson is the ninth freshman to score at least 30 points in an ACC Tournament game.

Even More About Hudson

The 32 points by **Jalen Hudson** is the most points in any game by a Virginia Tech freshman since the team joined the ACC in the 2004-05 season ... The last time any Virginia Tech player scored 30-or-more points in a game was Jarell Eddie, who scored 34 points against Winthrop last season ... The last time a Virginia Tech player scored 30-or-more points against an ACC team was Erick Green, who scored 35 points at Wake Forest in the final regular season game of the 2012-13 season ... Both Eddie and Green are currently playing in the NBA.

A Final Hudson Note

Jalen Hudson made 10 of 10 free throw attempts ... It is the 10th time in school history that a Hokie has been perfect from the line with at least 10 attempts ... It is the first time it has occurred in an ACC Tournament game ... He is just the second ACC freshman to go 10-for-10 from the line.

Two of the Young Ones

In the win over Wake Forest, **Jalen Hudson** scored 32 points and **Ahmed Hill** scored 12 points ... That marks just the second time that two Virginia Tech freshmen have scored in double-figures in the same ACC Tournament game ... The only other time that has occurred was on March, 14, 2008, when Malcolm Delaney scored 15 points and Jeff Allen scored 10 points in the Hokies' 63-49 win over Miami in the quarterfinal of the 2008 ACC Tournament in Charlotte.

Taking Great Care

The Hokies committed just four turnovers in Tuesday's win over Wake Forest ... The four turnovers for the Hokies is the fewest by Tech this season and the fewest in any game since three turnovers against Miami in the first round of the 2014 ACC Tournament ... The Hokies' school record for fewest in an ACC Tournament game is two against Wake Forest in the 2007 ACC Tournament in Tampa, which is also the Virginia Tech school record for fewest in any game.

Youthful Points

The Hokies' five freshmen are averaging 36.1 points per game and the 1,121 points account for 53.2 percent of the team's scoring ... The group, including redshirt freshman **Malik Müller**, has made 75 of the 160 available starts and has 43 games of double-figure scoring, including seven games of 20-or-more points (including Jalen Hudson's 32 points in Monday's win over Wake Forest) ... In ACC play, **Adam Smith** led the Hokies in scoring, at 15.5 points per game ... The next four players on the Tech scoring list were freshmen, led by **Justin Bibbs** at 11.6 points per game in ACC play ... In the Hokies' regular season finale against Miami, the five freshmen scored 53 of Tech's 61 points.

More Freshman Scoring Numbers

So far this season, Virginia Tech's freshman class has scored 1,121 points ... That is the second-most points by a freshman class since the Hokies joined the ACC in 2004-05 ... The top number is the 2007-08 class of Malcolm Delaney, Jeff Allen, Hank Thorns, Dorenzo Hudson, J.T. Thompson and Terrell Bell, which scored 1,230 points.

The Leader

In the final regular season stats for the ACC, **Adam Smith** led the league in three-point field goal percentage in all games, making 43.1 percent of his attempts for the season ... He is 17th nationally in the category ... The Hokies led the league as a team in three-point field goal percentage, at 39.3 percent ... Tech was fourth in made three-pointers, at 7.42 per game and Smith was fourth in three-pointers made, at 2.52 per game ... Tech led the ACC in three-point field goals made in ACC games, at 8.33 per game and was second in three-point field goal percentage in ACC games, at 38.7 percent.

More About Threes

The Hokies made 150 three-point field goals in ACC play, for an average of 8.3 per game ... Last season, Tech made a school, ACC-record 106 total three-point field goals, for an average of 5.9 threes per game ... The ACC adopted an 18-game league schedule in the 2012-13 season, but the 8.3 threes per game this season is also the record for the best average of three-pointers per game for the Hokies in an ACC season.

That's A Record!

In the Duke game, **Devin Wilson** recorded a double-double with 10 points and 11 assists ... The 11 assists ties a career-high and sets a new Tech record for assists in an ACC game ... It is also one assist shy of the Virginia Tech overall record for assists in a game.

The 300-Club

In the loss to No. 4/5 Duke, freshman **Justin Bibbs** scored his 300th point of the season ... In doing so, he becomes just the third Virginia Tech freshman to score 300 points in a season since the Hokies joined the ACC in the 2004-05 season ... The other two Hokies to do so were both in the 2007-08 season ... Jeff Allen scored 388 points in his freshman season and Malcolm Delaney scored 336 points that same season ... Bibbs now has 328 points this season.

A New High for the Hokies

With the nine made three-point field goals in the loss at No. 2/3 Virginia, the Hokies set a new school record for most three-point field goals in a season, with 217, at that time ... The old mark was 215 three-pointers, set last season ... After eight made threes against Wake Forest, the Hokies now have 238 made threes this season and made 150 in ACC play.

ACC Provides Top Competition

The Hokies played No. 4/5 Duke on Feb. 25 and No. 2/3 Virginia on Feb. 28 ... That marked just the second time in school history that Tech played consecutive games against top 5 teams ... The only other time that happened was on Dec. 5 and 6, 1997, when the Hokies played back-to-back games against No. 5 South Carolina and No. 3 North Carolina at the Charlotte Coliseum ... With No. 8/9 Notre Dame and No. 2/2 Virginia playing in Cassell Coliseum earlier this season, it marked the first time that the Hokies played consecutive games against top-10 teams since Feb. 28 and March 4, 2009, when Tech hosted No. 7 Duke and No. 2 North Carolina.

The Honors Keep Coming for Beyer

Christian Beyer has been named a recipient of the Weaver-James-Corrigan Award, given annually by the ACC ... The postgraduate scholarships are awarded to selected student-athletes who intend to pursue a graduate degree following completion of their undergraduate requirements ... Each recipient will receive \$5,000 toward his or her graduate education ... Those honored have performed with distinction in both the classroom and their respective sport, while demonstrating exemplary conduct in the community.

Mixing It Up

In the win over Wake Forest, the Hokies used their 14th different starting line-up of the season ... That is the most different starting line-ups for the Hokies in a single season since joining the ACC in the 2004-05 season ... Tech used 10 different starting line-ups a season ago.

2015 New York Life ACC Tournament

Tech vs. Miami This Season

The Hokies wrapped up the regular season with an 82-61 loss to Miami on Saturday afternoon ... **Ahmed Hill** led the Hokies with 17 points, while **Satchel Pierce** added a career-high 13 points and **Justin Bibbs** scored 11 points for Tech ... In the first meeting in Coral Gables, Miami defeated the Hokies, 76-52, on Feb. 18 ... Adam Smith led three Hokies in double-figures, with 15 points.

The Hokies in Greensboro

With the win over Wake Forest, Tech has now played in the Greensboro Coliseum 19 times over the years, with a 7-12 record ... Tech is 4-11 all-time in the building against teams currently in the ACC ... Tech is 3-5 in ACC Tournament games in this arena.

The Series vs. Miami

This will be the 29th meeting between the two schools, in a series that began in 2001 ... The Hurricanes lead the all-time series, 16-12 ... Tech has lost the last three meetings in the series, most recently 82-61 in Cassell Coliseum this past Saturday ... This will be the fifth meeting between the two schools all-time in the ACC Tournament and Tech is 2-2 in the four previous ACC Tournament meetings ... This is the second consecutive season that the two teams have met in the ACC Tournament, both in the Greensboro Coliseum ... Tech is 2-2 against Miami in neutral court games and 1-2 against Miami in the State of North Carolina.

Tech in Conference Tournaments

This is the 11th ACC Tournament for the Hokies and the 12th-straight conference tournament for the Hokies ... Tech is 7-10 in ACC Tournament action ... The Hokies have a combined 33-51 all-time record in post-season conference tournaments ... Tech is 10-18 all-time against current ACC members in post-season conference tournaments.

The ACC Tournament

This is the 62nd annual ACC Tournament ... This is the Hokies' sixth trip to the Greensboro Coliseum for an ACC Tournament ... Greensboro has hosted 26 ACC Tournaments ... The next most-common venue is Reynolds Coliseum in Raleigh (13) ... Of the 10 other arenas to host the event, three, the Capital Centre in Landover, Maryland, the Charlotte Coliseum and the Omni in Atlanta, are no longer standing ... Virginia is the defending ACC Tournament Champion.

Hokies in the ACC 2nd Round Games

Tech is 3-3 all-time in the second round of the ACC Tournament ... Tech's last appearance in a second round game was in 2012, when the Hokies fell to No. 6 Duke, 56-51, in Atlanta ... The Hokies are now 5-3 in ACC first round games since joining the league.

We Have the Smarts

Three Virginia Tech Hokies have been named to the 2015 All-ACC Academic Men's Basketball team ... Seniors **Will Johnston** and **Christian Beyer**, along with sophomore **Devin Wilson** have earned the honor ... This is the second appearance on the team by both Beyer and Johnston.

He's Legendary

Virginia Tech's all-time winningest men's basketball coach, **Charlie Moir**, will be the Hokies' "ACC Legend" this season at the ACC Tournament ... The Legends will be honored at this year's ACC Men's Basketball Tournament in Greensboro at the annual ACC Basketball Legends Brunch, which will be held at noon in the Guilford Ballroom of the Sheraton Four Seasons Hotel on Friday.

Virginia Tech is 4-4 all-time in games played on March 11 ... Tech won its last game on this date, 52-51, against Florida State in the 2011 ACC Tournament here in Greensboro ... Tech is 1-1 in ACC Tournament games on this date ... Tech is 3-3 in conference tournament games on March 11 ... The Hokies have never played Miami on this date.

What's Next?

Survive and Advance ... If the Hokies win, they will advance to the quarterfinal on Thursday and play the 3-seed Notre Dame at 9 p.m. ... The game will be shown on both ESPN and The ACC Network.

Family Ties

Tech senior **Christian Beyer's** step-brother, Sasha Seymore, is a senior walk-on of the UNC team this season ... This is Beyer's third season on the Tech roster, while this is Seymore's first year on the Carolina squad ... Both excel in the classroom, as well, as Beyer won the 2014 Skelton Award, given annually by Virginia Tech to the top academic male and female student-athletes ... Since the second semester has begun, Beyer was named to the Capital One Academic All-District 3 first team and was a recipient of the Weaver-James-Corrigan Award ... Seymore attends Carolina on a Morehead-Cain Scholarship, the most prestigious academic scholarship awarded at UNC and is the senior class president at UNC ... Seymore tore his ACL against UAB and will miss the remainder of the season.

Keeping an Eye Open

Entering the ACC Tournament, the Hokies are shooting 39.4 percent from three-point range, best in the ACC ... The Virginia Tech school record for three-point field goal percentage in a season is 39.5 percent, set in the 1995-96 season ... Current Virginia Tech strength coach **David Jackson** was a member of the team, along with his twin brother, Jim.

Seven the Hard Way

Virginia Tech has played seven nationally-ranked teams this season, tied for the most in one season since joining the ACC in the 2004-05 season ... Tech also played seven ranked teams in the 2011-12, 2008-09 and 2005-06 seasons.

Pointing out a Point on Points

The Hokies scored 81 points in the win over Wake Forest on Monday ... That sets a new school record for points in an ACC Tournament game ... The previous high was 76 points against North Carolina in the 2009 ACC Tournament.

Smith for 3!

In the win over Pittsburgh, **Adam Smith** was 6-for-11 from three-point range and made a three-pointer with 0.7 seconds remaining in regulation to send the game to overtime and then, with 3.4 seconds remaining in the extra session, nailed his final three-pointer of the night to give the Hokies their first ACC win of the season ... The six three-pointers ties Smith's career-high and is the most for him in an ACC game and is tied for the most by a Tech player in an ACC game.

Combining the Two

When **Devin Wilson** recorded his first career double-double with 10 points and 11 assists in the win over Morgan State, it was the first time a Tech player had a non-points/rebounds double-double since Erick Green had 23 points and 10 assists in the loss at West Virginia on Dec. 8, 2012 ... Wilson duplicated the feat with 10 points and 11 assists in the overtime loss to No. 4/5 Duke.

Young Minutes

Virginia Tech freshmen are playing 52.0 percent of the minutes so far this season ... That is the highest percentage of minutes for freshmen by any team in the ACC ... Second among ACC schools is Duke, at 48.9 percent ... In ACC play, the Hokies are at 52.6 percent, second is Duke at 51.3 percent.

Giving to Us, Not to Them

Devin Wilson took great care of the ball during ACC play ... During the ACC regular season, Wilson had 77 assists and just 33 turnovers in 561 minutes of action ... He continued that strong play in the win over Wake Forest, as he had five assists and no turnovers ... At Clemson, Wilson handed out his 250th career assist as a Hokie, in just his 56th game ... Wilson now has a career average of 4.5 assists per game, higher than Malcolm Delaney, Jamon Gordon, Al Young or Dell Curry, second through fifth on the all-time assists list ... All-time leader Bimbo Coles averaged 4.8 assists per game ... Wilson enters tonight's game with 136 assists this season, one short of becoming the only player with his freshman and sophomore seasons on the Virginia Tech top-ten single-season assists list.

Three's Company

In the Duke game, Virginia Tech made 12 three-point field goals, tied for the most three-pointers in a game this season ... The 12 three-pointers is tied for the most by a Virginia Tech team in an ACC regular season game ... Tech also made 12 threes earlier this season in the win over Pittsburgh and last season in the road win at Miami ... The last time the Hokies made more than 12 three-pointers in a single game was on Nov. 22, 2013, when the Hokies made 13 three-pointers against No. 1 Michigan State in the Barclays Center in Brooklyn ... The school record for threes in a game is 16 against Marquette in 1989.

All Five

All five Virginia Tech freshmen have scored in double figures in a game this season and three, **Justin Bibbs**, **Jalen Hudson** and **Malik Müller**, have recorded 20-plus point games and Hudson has a 30-point game ... That marks the most freshmen to score in double figures in a game in a single season since the 2007-08 season, when Malcolm Delaney, Jeff Allen, Hank Thorns, Dorenzo Hudson and J.T. Thompson all had single games in double figures.

A Young Three

In Tech's win over UMES, freshmen **Malik Müller**, **Justin Bibbs** and **Ahmed Hill** all scored in double-figures ... That marked the first time since Nov. 18, 2000 that three freshmen making their collegiate debuts for the Hokies all scored in double figures ... That night, a 92-68 win over VMI, Carlos Dixon (21 points), Chris Exilus (20 points) and Bryant Matthews (17 points) pulled off the same feat ... Four more times this season Tech has accomplished the same feat, most recently in the regular season finale against Miami, as Hill, Bibbs and **Satchel Pierce** all scored in double-figures.

Bibbs was Honored

Freshman guard **Justin Bibbs** was named the ACC Rookie of the Week, for the week ending Dec. 28, 2014.

397 and Counting

The Hokies have hit at least one three-pointer in every game since joining the ACC in the 2004-05 season ... Tech has now hit a three in 397 consecutive games, the most in school history ... Since the three-point arc was added for the 1986-87 season, the Hokies have hit at least one three in all but three games ... The last time Tech did not record a three-point field goal in a game was at Providence on Feb. 1, 2003.

Beyer Earns Academic Award

Christian Beyer was named to the Capital One Academic All-District 3 first team ... The senior from New Bern, North Carolina, a former walk-on who has earned a scholarship, will graduate in May with a degree in human nutrition, food & exercise and has accepted a place in medical school at UNC next year.

Hokies in Overtime

The Hokies are now 61-47 all-time in overtime games ... Tech is 1-1 this season and was 1-1 in overtime games last season ... Tech is 27-24 in road overtime games, 27-10 in home overtime games, and 7-13 on neutral courts ... Tech is 14-7 in ACC overtime games ... Tech is 3-8 all-time in overtime games against ranked teams ... Tech is 5-9 in double-overtime games and 1-2 in triple overtime games.

Finally a Two

After hitting a two-point field goal in the loss at Miami, **Will Johnston** has made 67 field goals and all but six of them have been three-pointers ... He made a career-high four three-pointers in the win over Furman, a feat he matched at FSU last season.

It Runs in the Family

Virginia Tech senior **Will Johnston** is not the only student-athlete in his family ... Older sister, Paige, ran track at Arkansas ... Younger sister, Marie, runs track at Virginia Tech this season after transferring from Wake Forest ... Youngest sister, Kari, was a freshman on Virginia Tech's nationally-ranked women's soccer team ... Will has seven sisters in all.

Off the Road, Again

The game on Feb. 21 at NC State was the Hokies' final game of a second, three-game road swing during the ACC regular season ... Earlier this season, Tech played at Florida State, No. 6 Louisville and No. 15 North Carolina in succession ... The most recent stretch saw the Hokies play three road games in eight days ... Tech is one of four ACC teams with a stretch of three-consecutive conference road games, but the only ACC team with two such stretches.
