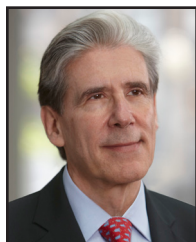

# UNIVERSITY ADMINISTRATION



## DR. JULIO FRENK

**UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT**  
UNIVERSIDAD NACIONAL  
AUTÓNOMA DE MÉXICO, 1979

Dr. Julio Frenk, a noted leader in global public health and a renowned scholar and academic, was named the sixth president of the University of Miami in April 2015. He assumed his leadership post on August 16, 2015.

Prior to joining the University of Miami, Dr. Frenk was Dean of the Faculty at the Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health since January 2009. While at Harvard, he was also the T & G Angelopoulos Professor of Public Health and International Development, a joint appointment with the Harvard Kennedy School of Government.

Dr. Frenk served as the Minister of Health of Mexico from 2000 to 2006. He pursued an ambitious agenda to reform the nation's health system and introduced a program of comprehensive universal health insurance, known as Seguro Popular, which expanded access to health care for tens of millions of uninsured Mexicans.

Dr. Frenk was the founding director-general of the National Institute of Public Health in Mexico, one of the leading institutions of health education and research in the developing world. In 1998 Dr. Frenk joined the World Health Organization (WHO) as executive director in charge of Evidence and Information for Policy, WHO's first-ever unit explicitly charged with developing a scientific foundation for health policy to achieve better outcomes.

He also served as a senior fellow in the global health program of the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation and as president of the Carso Health Institute in Mexico City. He is the founding chair of the board of the Institute for Health Metrics and Evaluation at the University of Washington. He also co-chaired the Commission on the Education of Health Professionals for the 21st Century, which published its influential report in the leading journal *The Lancet* in 2010, triggering a large number of follow-up initiatives throughout the world.

Dr. Frenk holds a medical degree from the National Autonomous University of Mexico, as well as a master of public health and a joint doctorate in Medical Care Organization and in Sociology from the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor. He has been awarded honorary doctorates from several institutions of higher learning. In September of 2008, Dr. Frenk received the Clinton Global Citizen Award for changing "the way practitioners and policy makers across the world think about health."

He is a member of the U.S. Institute of Medicine, American Academy of Arts and Sciences, and National Academy of Medicine of Mexico.

In addition to his scholarly works, which include more than 140 articles in academic journals, as well as many books and book chapters, he has written two best-selling novels for youngsters explaining the functions of the human body.



## DR. MARVIN DAWKINS

**FACULTY REPRESENTATIVE**  
EDWARD WATERS COLLEGE, 1970

Dr. Marvin Dawkins, a distinguished professor in the Department of Sociology at the University of Miami, is in his fifth year as the Faculty Athletics Representative. He was named to the post in April 2012, replacing Clyde McCoy after his 17 years of service in that role.

In his FAR post, Dawkins is responsible for ensuring the academic integrity of students participating in University athletic programs and helping to oversee institutional control of the Department of Athletics. The Faculty Athletics Representative serves as a liaison between the University and the athletic department. This individual is the University's voting delegate to the ACC and represents UM with the NCAA and ACC.

Dawkins received his doctorate from Florida State and completed his postdoctoral research fellowships at Howard University and The Johns Hopkins University. He previously served on the faculties of the University of Maryland, Old Dominion University and the University of Wisconsin-Parkside.

His research focuses on issues of race and social equity in such areas as education, career aspirations and mobility, substance abuse prevention, and sports. He has published widely in these areas, including his most recent article titled "Race and Pathways to Power in the National Football League" (with Jomills H. Braddock and Erica Smith), which appears in *American Behavioral Scientist* (2012). His research on golf includes book chapters, scholarly articles, and the book *African American Golfers During the Jim Crow Era* (Praeger 2000), coauthored with Graham C. Kinloch. Dawkins was recently appointed to the United States Golf Association Museum Committee and is currently completing a study on the media treatment of black golfers from the Jim Crow era to the present.

# ATHLETICS ADMINISTRATION



## BLAKE JAMES

**DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS**  
MINNESOTA STATE-MANKATO, 1992

Since taking over as the University of Miami's Director of Athletics in 2013, Blake James has transformed Miami Athletics, spearheading improvement in all aspects of the department, including postseason appearances, student-athlete support, facility upgrades, ticket sales and academic achievement.

Miami's recent success has garnered James and UM national recognition. In March 2017, James was selected as one of four Division I recipients of the 2016-17 Under Armour Athletic Director of the Year award, an honor given by the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA). In June 2017, James began a two-year term as Chair of the NCAA Division I Council, the group responsible for the day-to-day decision-making for all of Division I.

James has placed a strong emphasis on academics during his four-plus years at Miami. In the most recent Graduation Success Rate figures released by the NCAA, Miami student-athletes posted a GSR mark of 90%. Ten Hurricane teams posted perfect 2015-16 scores on the latest Academic Progress Report (APR). In addition, Miami's football program received the 2016 AFCA Academic Achievement Award. In 2016, Hurricane student-athletes also ranked among the nation's best in time committed towards community service.

In the department's continuing efforts to better support student-athletes and coaches, the Hurricane Club -- the fundraising arm of Miami Athletics -- completed a record-setting year in 2016-17. The Hurricane Club raised \$49 million, an all-time record and an increase of more than 80 percent from the previous record of \$26.5 million, set in 2010-11. The Hurricane Club's membership of more than 11,000 members represents an over 100-percent jump from its membership of 5,140 in 2010.

Prior to the 2016 football season, James led the university's football coaching search which resulted in the hiring of Hurricane alum Mark Richt as the football program's new head coach. Richt paid immediate dividends in 2016 as the Hurricanes posted a 9-4 record, won their first bowl game in 10 years and finished ranked #20 in the final Associated Press poll, their first season-ending ranking since 2009.

During the 2015-16 academic year, Miami was the only school in NCAA Division I to have its football team play in a bowl game, its men's and women's basketball teams advance to the NCAA Tournament and its baseball team advance to the College World Series. Overall, Miami had 10 sports programs advance to postseason competition to secure its highest finish in the Learfield Directors' Cup standings in 13 years, an indication of broad-based athletic department success.

During James' tenure, Miami has completed several facility enhancements, including the opening of the Schwartz Center for Athletic Excellence; the completion of the student-athlete training table, fueling station and dining hall; new artificial and natural playing surfaces and lights on the Greentree Practice Fields' and a center-

hung scoreboard inside the Watsco Center.

James has also led multiple, multi-million dollar capital renovation projects, including renovations of the Hecht Center and the men's and women's basketball offices. Over the past year, Miami Athletics has secured six leadership gifts of seven figures-or-more, including the largest donation in department history -- a \$14 million gift from the Soffer Family, which will serve as the lead gift for the Hurricanes' \$34 million Carol Soffer Football Indoor Practice Facility, which broke ground this year.

Ticket sales are also at an all-time high. In 2016, Miami sold a school-record 42,000 football season tickets and ranked first among Power 5 programs in attendance percentage increase (23 percent) over 2015 attendance. The Hurricanes have also sold out their men's basketball season tickets in back-to-back seasons for the first time ever.

In addition, Miami has transformed its broadcast, communications and marketing departments into one of the nation's leaders in digital media and video production. In 2016, Miami aired more live events on ESPN3 than any other ACC institution. James was also instrumental in helping Miami strike one of the largest apparel deals in the country with adidas.

Prior to being named AD, James served Miami Athletics in the roles of Interim AD and Senior Associate AD for Development and Ticket Operations, where he oversaw the day-to-day operations of development, ticket sales and ticket operations. He also was a member of the Hurricanes' senior staff and provided sport supervision.

James came to UM after spending seven years at the University of Maine, where he first served as Senior Associate Athletic Director before serving as Director of Athletics from 2005 to 2010. During his tenure at Maine, athletics experienced tremendous success, including three trips to the Frozen Four for the men's ice hockey program and NCAA playoff berths for football, baseball (two), women's basketball and softball. James implemented a comprehensive \$17 million facility improvement plan at Maine, which included an indoor practice facility and numerous other facility upgrades and renovations. Academically, the program flourished, earning the conference academic cup twice and student-athletes maintaining a 3.0 GPA or above.

Prior to his stint at Maine, James worked in athletic development at Providence College, where he established the "Friars Forever" campaign and the Friar Athletic Fund.

James is no stranger to South Florida, beginning his athletic career with the University of Miami, working in ticket sales, corporate sales and athletic development. In 1995, he was hired as Miami's Director of Ticket Sales, serving in that capacity until 1997, when he was named an athletic development officer at the University of Nebraska. He returned to Miami in 1998 as the Director of Major Gifts and Corporate Sales and was promoted to the Director of Athletic Development at Miami in 2000 before moving on to Providence in 2002.

James graduated from Minnesota State University - Mankato with a Bachelor's degree in Marketing in 1992 and later received his Master's degree in Sports Administration from St. Thomas University in 1994. He and his wife, Kelly, have two children: daughter, Haley, and son, Ryan.

Jennifer Strawley joined the University of Miami on June 18, 2012 and currently serves as Deputy Director of Athletics and Chief Operating Officer. She also serves as the departments Senior Woman Administrator.

Serving as the second-in-command, Strawley provides strategic direction for the department and assists the Director of Athletics with the day-to-day operations. She is the sport administrator for football, women's basketball and women's tennis. Strawley leads the department's strategic planning initiatives, policy development and implementation, coordination of department and coaches meetings and gender equity and inclusion initiatives. She oversees the areas of human resources, sports medicine, academic services, equipment / Adidas, video services and student-athlete development, as well as serves as a liaison to various campus groups, the ACC and the NCAA.

Strawley played a key role in the hiring of head football coach Mark Richt, serving on the selection committee. In addition, she was instrumental in the development of Miami's annual Celebration of Women's Athletics recognizing the achievements of Miami's female student-athletes while raising money to support women's athletics.

Actively engaged in intercollegiate athletics nationally, Strawley has served on various committees within the NCAA and the ACC. She currently serves on the ACC Television Committee, the ACC Women's Basketball foresight committee, the ACC Equity Committee, the ACC Infractions and Sportsmanship Review Committee, the ACC Football Schedulers Group, and the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Oversight Committee. Strawley served on the senior management team and was involved in a variety of other internal operations.

Strawley rejoined the NCAA after serving as the Associate Athletics Director for Intercollegiate Sport Programs and Senior Woman Administrator at Columbia University from 2007-10. While at Columbia, she oversaw numerous varsity sport programs including football and was the athletics program liaison for gender equity and diversity initiatives. Strawley was a member of the department's Executive Management Team.

Prior to her tenure at Columbia, Strawley was the Director of Membership Services and Student-Athlete Reinstatement at the NCAA. In this role, she provided oversight of the student-athlete

reinstatement process and was instrumental in the implementation of the student first philosophy. Strawley served as a liaison to numerous NCAA committees and task forces, including the NCAA Divisions I, II and III Student-Athlete Reinstatement Committees and the NCAA Olympic Sports Liaison Committee

Strawley first joined the NCAA in 1998 as an enforcement services intern. She is a 1998 graduate of the University of Pennsylvania where she earned her Bachelor of Arts degree in history. During her time at Pennsylvania, she was a two-year captain for the Quakers' softball team. Strawley was inducted into the William Tennent High School Hall of Fame in of 2014.



## JASON LAYTON

Jason Layton serves as the University of Miami Deputy Director of Athletics and Chief Financial Officer, a position he took over in August 2017. He initially joined Miami in December 2014 as the Senior Associate Athletics Director for Communications and Sales.

In his current position, Layton is responsible for managing the department's business office, marketing, digital strategies, communications, ticket sales, ticket operations, client experience, video production and broadcast departments.

Additionally, Layton has oversight of all departmental licensing matters, Hurricane Sports Properties, serves as the department ACC Network liaison and is the sport administrator for men's basketball.

Since his arrival, Miami has seen exceptional growth in ticket sales and video production services in both content and broadcast with ESPN and the newly formed ACC Network.

Under his watch, Miami has seen an increased level of season ticket sales in football and men's basketball. Under Layton's guidance, Miami saw an unprecedented growth in football attendance during the 2016 season, as the Hurricanes totaled 42,000 season ticket holders and averaged 58,572 fans per game – the 27th-highest total in the nation and leader among all Power Five schools in percentage increase on a year-to-year basis (23 percent).

In addition, Miami sold out its entire 2015-16 and 2016-17 men's basketball season ticket allotment, marking the first time in Hurricane Athletics history that a team has sold out its entire season ticket allotment in back-to-back seasons.

Layton also serves as the primary contact for ESPN with the recent launch of the ACC Network, first in digital format in August 2016 and building to the linear network in fall of 2019. Since 2015, Miami has produced over 200 live events on ESPN3/ACC Network Extra – a figure that ranks near the top of all ACC schools.

Layton, a Florida native, arrived in Miami after spending the 2013 and 2014 seasons at Colorado State University where he served

as the department's Senior Associate Athletics Director for Sales and Marketing. During his time in Fort Collins, Colo., Layton's ticket sales plans drove double-digit increases in football, volleyball, men's basketball and women's basketball revenue and tickets sold.

Before his arrival at Colorado State, Layton spent 13 years with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. In his 13 years with the club, he handled a variety of responsibilities from sales, marketing, ticketing and luxury suite operations to advertising, accounting, finance and purchasing. Layton began his career with the Buccaneers as a customer service representative in 1999 before elevating to the role of Senior Director of Business Administration in 2011. Layton received his bachelor's and master's degrees from Saint Leo University in Saint Leo, Fla.

Toole oversees the communications, digital departments and video departments, as well as assists with publicity for the football program and head football coach Mark Richt.

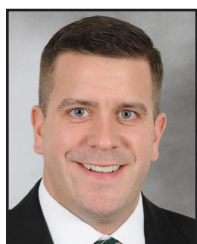

Since 2010, annual Hurricane Club Membership has increased by more than 100 percent to an all-time record of 11,500 active members and over \$14 million raised for student-athlete excellence. The Hurricane Club is consistently recognized nationwide for their use of cutting edge technology and unique campaigns to drive annual support.

Marks has been a part of two major capital campaigns at the University of Miami: The Momentum Campaign, (2000-2008) which raised over \$1 billion for the University, and Momentum2. Under Marks' leadership, athletics exceeded its goal of \$68 million and raised more than \$85 million dollars towards the Momentum campaign and raised over \$118 million towards the university wide \$1.6 billion Momentum2 Campaign.

# PAIGE YAROSHUK-TEWS

## HEAD COACH

**22ND SEASON (18th as HC) | UCLA, 1996**

An outstanding recruiter with unrivaled knowledge of the game and passion for teaching, the 2017-18 season marked the 17th illustrious year for Paige Yaroshuk-Tews as the head coach of the University of Miami women's tennis team.

The program's all-time winningest coach, Yaroshuk-Tews has turned the Hurricanes into a force nationally, leading Miami to the NCAA's Elite Eight in eight of the last 15 seasons, tied for the fifth-most quarterfinal appearances in the nation during that span. The Hurricanes have also made the Sweet 16 in 12 of the past 13 years, one of three programs to do so.

In her 17 years at Miami, Yaroshuk-Tews boasts an overall record of 337-111 (.752) and an ACC career record of 135-32 (.808). As a result of her unparalleled achievements, Yaroshuk-Tews was inducted into the UM Sports Hall of Fame in 2012.

Yaroshuk-Tews' desire to make Miami a national title contender on a yearly basis has helped the program consistently flourish with all-conference and All-American talent. The Hurricanes have not only made the NCAA Team Championship in each of her 17 years as head coach, but have also won at least one NCAA match every season. UM qualified for the ITA National Team Indoor Championships 12 straight years, from 2005-16, and was ranked in the top 10 at some point during the season in each of those campaigns. Yaroshuk-Tews annually brings in some of the top prep talent, reloading year in and year out for a program consistently ranked among the nation's best.

Since taking the head coaching position for the women's tennis program at Miami in 2001, Yaroshuk-Tews has led the Hurricanes on an unprecedented run in Coral Gables, Fla. In total, she has directed Miami to 13 Sweet 16 berths, eight Elite Eight trips and an appearance in the 2006 NCAA final, the program's first since 1985.

Miami hosted the first and second rounds of the NCAA Team Championship 13 times under Yaroshuk-Tews, including 12 straight years each from 2005-2016. The Hurricanes have turned in 16 straight ITA top-25 finishes, including 13 in the top 15. In eight of the last 13 seasons, Miami has ended the year in the top 10.

Fifteen different Hurricanes have garnered a total of 31 ITA All-American honors under Yaroshuk-Tews, the former a program record for a coach. In 14 of her 17 seasons, at least one Hurricane has been named an All-American, with multiple players receiving the honor in nine of them. Under Yaroshuk-Tews' watch, 17 Hurricanes have combined for 34 All-ACC distinctions and 23 Miami players have totaled 42 Academic All-ACC recognitions.

Most recently, Miami posted an 18-8 mark in 2018, including an 11-3 record in ACC play. After a one-year hiatus, the Hurricanes again hosted the opening two rounds of the NCAA Team Championship and advanced to the Sweet 16. Yaroshuk-Tews' team ended the season ranked No. 17 nationally, good for a 14th top-20 finish in a 15-year span. Estela Perez-Somarriba was named the ACC Player of the Year and the ITA National Player to Watch, finishing with ITA All-America accolades, First Team All-ACC distinction, a 39-8 record and the fifth spot in the final ITA rankings. Sinead Lohan, who finished her career with the fourth-most singles wins in school history (130), became Miami's third four-time All-ACC honoree and won the ITA Southeast Region Arthur Ashe Sportsmanship & Leadership Award.

Despite dealing with significant injuries throughout the 2017 campaign, Yaroshuk-Tews oversaw the team's 22nd consecutive NCAA Team Championship berth and 21st winning season in a row. The Hurricanes finished 13-12, concluded the campaign ranked No. 25 nationally and reached the second round of NCAA play. Miami had two First Team All-ACC honorees for the second straight year, as Sinead Lohan and Estela Perez-Somarriba both garnered the recognition. Perez-Somarriba, an ITA All-American, became the first Hurricane freshman to reach the NCAA Singles Championship Final Four, giving Miami a semifinalist for the third season in a row.

Yaroshuk-Tews guided Miami to a 21-6 record in 2016, the team's 11th 20-win season in a 13-year span. The Hurricanes went 12-2 in the ACC for the third year in a row, finishing in second place, and reached the ACC Championship final for the sixth time in 12 seasons in the ACC. Miami advanced to the Sweet 16 for the 11th year in a row and ended the campaign ranked No. 10 in the nation, its 13th straight top-15 finish and eighth top-10 finish in the last 11 years. Sinead Lohan, Stephanie Wagner and Wendy Zhang combined for a total of four ITA All-American distinctions. Wagner, the ITA Southeast Region Senior Player of the Year, broke the program's career wins record, finishing with 134. The All-American trio combined for six ACC Player of the Week honors, with Wagner winning four, the most by anyone since 2012, to conclude her career with eight. Lohan went 40-6 in singles, tied for the third-most wins in a season by a Miami player, and became the seventh different Hurricane to reach the NCAA Singles Championship Final Four, including the sixth under Yaroshuk-Tews.

The Hurricanes went 18-7 in 2015 and finished second in the ACC at 12-2. Miami reached the Sweet 16 for the 10th year in a row and earned a 12th consecutive top-15 finish. The team also finished in the top four of the ACC for the 11th straight year, each one since it joined the conference. On an individual level, Yaroshuk-Tews guided both Sinead Lohan and Stephanie Wagner to ITA All-American honors. Both of them reached the quarterfinals of the NCAA Singles Championship, marking the third time ever—all under the direction of Yaroshuk-Tews—two Hurricanes did so the same year. Wagner was also named the ITA National Player to Watch. UM set a program record with five nationally-ranked singles players in the year-end rankings and tied the top mark set the previous season with six different players ranked in either singles or doubles.

In 2014, Miami posted its sixth consecutive 20-win season and 10th in the last 11 years, finishing at 21-6, with a 12-2 mark in the ACC to tie for first place. The Hurricanes hosted the NCAA Team Championship first and second rounds for the 10th consecutive year and reached the NCAA round of 16 for the ninth straight time. Additionally, UM made the ITA National Team Indoor Championships for the 10th season in a row. Miami ended the year at No. 12 in the nation and two Hurricanes, Monique Albuquerque and Clementina Riobueno, earned ITA All-American recognition. Six different Hurricanes ended the season ranked in either singles or doubles, a new program record.

The 2013 season saw Miami win its first ACC Championship title, as the Hurricanes knocked off a trio of top-30 teams in Cary, N.C., including second-ranked North Carolina in the semifinals. Miami went on to finish 23-6, marking the most wins for the program since 2009 and the third-most during Yaroshuk-Tews' tenure. The season also marked the fifth consecutive trip to the Elite Eight for the Hurricanes, then the longest streak in the country. UM concluded the year ranked eighth, its fifth straight top-10 finish, and Yaroshuk-Tews was named the ITA Southeast Region Coach of the Year, while her assistant coach, Alex Santos, was chosen as the ITA National Assistant Coach of the Year.

During the 2012 season, the Hurricanes advanced to their fourth consecutive NCAA Team Championship Elite Eight, before falling to eventual national champion Florida. Miami played host to North Florida and Utah in the first two rounds of the tournament, winning both matches, 4-0. In the Sweet 16, the Hurricanes exacted revenge on ACC foe North Carolina, winning 4-2 to erase the memory of a 4-3 loss to the Tar Heels in the regular season. Miami wound up ninth in the final national rankings, and Anna Bartenstein was named an ITA All-American, making it nine straight seasons Yaroshuk-Tews coached a player who received the honor.

In 2011, Yaroshuk-Tews led Miami on another deep run in the NCAA Team Championship, winning at home in the first two rounds before taking down Michigan in the round of 16 in Stanford, Calif. The Hurricanes finished the season ranked seventh nationally. Also in 2011, senior Bianca Eichkorn became the program's all-time winningest singles player (133 victories) en route to numerous All-America and all-conference honors. Among them, Eichkorn became the fourth UM player in the last seven seasons to be named ACC Player of the Year under Yaroshuk-Tews, who surpassed 200 career wins with Miami's NCAA-opening 4-0 victory May 13 against FIU. Anna Bartenstein was also named an ITA All-American in 2011, making it four straight years the Hurricanes had at least two players garner the accolade.

In 2010, Yaroshuk-Tews led the Hurricanes to the NCAA quarterfinals, a No. 10 final ranking and a 20-6 record, UM's sixth 20-win season in the last seven years. Miami also posted a 10-1 mark in ACC play to finish in second place. For the second straight year—the first time that happened since 1985-86—three Hurricanes earned ITA All-America honors, this time Bianca Eichkorn, Gabriela Mejia and Laura Vallverdu, who also won the Honda Sports Award. Vallverdu was an All-American in singles and doubles, giving Miami four All-America honors for the first time since 1988. Additionally, Vallverdu set the program record for singles wins (131) and became the fourth four-year All-American in program history and the first under Yaroshuk-Tews. Eichkorn and Vallverdu both reached the NCAA Singles Championship quarterfinals, the second straight year two Hurricanes did so after it had not previously happened in program history. Vallverdu made the semifinals, to become the program's first two-time semifinalist.

During the 2009 season, Yaroshuk-Tews claimed the ACC Coach of the Year award after leading UM to a 26-5 mark, its second-best record ever during the NCAA era (1982-present). The Hurricanes went 16-0 at home, captured the ACC regular season title at 10-1 and registered 12 consecutive victories leading into the ACC Championship final. Yaroshuk-Tews saw her team advance to the NCAA quarterfinals and concluded the season seventh in the country, its second best finish of the last 32 years. For the first time since 1988, three UM players were named ITA All-Americans, in Bianca Eichkorn, Julia Cohen and Laura Vallverdu. All three reached the NCAA Singles Championship round of 16, a first in school history. Cohen and Eichkorn became the first Hurricane duo to make the semifinals the same year, and Vallverdu finished as the second finalist in program history. In total, four Hurricanes played in the NCAA Singles Championship, marking the first time that happened, and four Miami duos were listed in the final ITA doubles rankings for the first time ever.



In 2008, Miami finished with a 17-6 overall mark, snapping a string of four consecutive 20-win seasons. The Hurricanes faced 18 ranked opponents and went 12-6 against them. UM hosted the first two rounds of the NCAA Team Championship for the fourth straight year and reached a third consecutive Sweet 16. The Hurricanes' 6-1 win over No. 45 NC State April 12 gave Yaroshuk-Tews her 132nd victory to pass legendary Miami coach Ivan Duvenhage (1982-88) for the program record. Miami ended the season at No. 14 in the nation and Laura Vallverdu was named an ITA All-American.

During the 2007 season, Yaroshuk-Tews led the Hurricanes to a 22-7 mark, the team's fourth straight 20-win season and to the NCAA quarterfinals for the second straight season. Miami went 17-1 at home, with the lone loss against eventual NCAA champion Georgia Tech. The Hurricanes finished the season ranked ninth in the nation, their second straight top-10 finish. Audra Cohen and Laura Vallverdu were both named ITA All-Americans, making it three straight years UM had multiple honorees for the first time since 1986-88. Cohen went 42-2 in singles, became the first player in program history win the national title in the NCAA Singles Championship and was also the first to win the Honda Sports Award. She also won her second consecutive ITA National Player of the Year Award and ACC Player of the Year award, making it three straight years a Hurricane earned both accolades. It marked just the second time ever a school had three straight ITA National Player of the Year winners on the women's side, and Cohen was fifth women to win the award in back-to-back years. Cohen ended the season at No. 1 in the nation for the second year in a row, marking the third straight time a UM player finished first, and she was selected to the ITA All-Star Team as well. Three Hurricanes made the NCAA Singles Championship for the third time ever, and first since 1985. Yaroshuk-Tews reached 100 wins with a 6-1 win over eighth-ranked Baylor Feb. 3, becoming the third coach in program history to get to triple digits. Her assistant coach, David Anderton, garnered the ITA National Assistant Coach of the Year award for his work with the team.

The 2006 campaign was a special one for the Miami program, as the Hurricanes advanced to the final of the NCAA Team Championship for the first time since 1985 and the second time ever. UM upset second-ranked Notre Dame in the quarterfinals and third-ranked USC in the semifinals. The impressive run came to an end in the championship match against two-time defending champion and top-seeded Stanford. The Hurricanes finished the season at 24-7 and shared the ACC regular season title for the second straight year. Yaroshuk-Tews' squad came up with big wins against some of the nation's best teams, going 5-3 against top-10 teams, including a 4-2 mark against opponents ranked in the top three. The Hurricanes finished the season ranked fourth in the country, their first top-five finish since 1987 and the fourth-best record in program history during the NCAA era (1982-present).

The same year, Melissa Applebaum and Audra Cohen were both named ITA All-Americans, making it back-to-back years the Hurricanes had a pair of honorees for the first time since the 1987-88 season. Cohen went 34-2 in singles and finished the season ranked No. 1 in the nation, the second straight year a Hurricane took the top spot. She was named the ITA National Player of the Year and ACC Player of the Year, making it back-to-back years a Hurricane won both awards, and she was nominated for the Honda Sports Award. Cohen and Applebaum ended the year ranked second nationally in doubles and made the quarterfinals of the NCAA Doubles Championship. Both of them were named to the ITA All-Star Team. Additionally, four Hurricanes made the year-end ITA rankings for the first time in 30 years.

The team flourished in 2005 under Yaroshuk-Tews, earning a 21-5 overall record, marking its second consecutive 20-win season. Miami went 9-1 in Atlantic Coast Conference play in its inaugural season in the league to tie for first place and also reached the ACC Championship final. The Hurricanes made the USTA/ITA National Team Indoor Championships and upset fourth-ranked UCLA, 4-3. UM earned an automatic bid to host the first two rounds of the NCAA Team Championship and fell to California in the second round to snap a 27-match home winning streak. The Hurricanes finished at No. 13 in the nation and both Audrey Bañada and Megan Bradley were named ITA All-Americans, the first time Miami had multiple players earn the honor since 1992. The pair also reached the quarterfinals of the NCAA Doubles Championship, the first Miami duo to do so since 1992. Bradley set a program record for singles wins with 44, finishing at 44-2 and winning 39 straight matches along the way. She won the ITA National Indoor Intercollegiate Championships title, finished the season ranked first in the nation, made the ITA All-Star Team, and won ACC/UM Female Scholar-Athlete of the Year and ITA National Senior Player of the Year. Additionally, Bradley was the first Hurricane to win ITA National Player of the Year and the first to receive the ACC Player of the Year award. Her ITA national awards were the first by a Hurricane since 1991.

In 2004, Yaroshuk-Tews led her team to yet another successful season and earned her second BIG EAST Coach of the Year award. The Hurricanes finished with a 20-4 overall record and were ranked 15th in the final poll, the team's highest ranking since 1991. Miami made the BIG EAST Championship final for the 13th straight year—every one it participated in as a conference member—and won its eighth title. Half the titles and seven of the finals appearances came with Yaroshuk-Tews on the coaching staff. The Hurricanes were part of one of the biggest upsets in collegiate tennis history in 2004. They beat previously undefeated and top-ranked ranked Florida, 4-3, in the second round of the NCAA Team Championship in Gainesville, Fla. Miami had not defeated the Gators since the 1986 season. The Hurricanes advanced to the Sweet 16 for the first time since 1999 and defeated No. 11 Tulane, 4-1, to reach the Elite Eight for the first time since the 1986. Megan Bradley was named an ITA All-American, the first Hurricane to garner the honor since 1999, which was also the last time Miami won 20-plus matches. After the season, Yaroshuk-Tews was tabbed to coach the prestigious USA Tennis Collegiate Team.

During the 2003 season, Yaroshuk-Tews led her team to a 17-7 record and an eighth consecutive trip to the NCAA Team Championship. Her squad advanced to the second round of the tournament and finished the season ranked 23rd in the country, marking the program's first top-25 finish since 1999. The Hurricanes had two players—Melissa Applebaum and Megan Bradley—in the NCAA Singles Championship for the first time since 1992, and placed a pair—Applebaum and Bradley—in the NCAA Doubles Championship for the first time since 1997, both ending the longest droughts in program history.

In 2002, her first season as head coach, Yaroshuk-Tews guided the Hurricanes to their seventh BIG EAST Championship title and she was named BIG EAST Coach of the Year. The team finished with a 14-7 record and reached the second round of the NCAA Team Championship for the first time in three years. Half of Miami's wins came against ranked opponents that season and the Hurricanes had a player, Mari Toro, finish the season nationally ranked for the first time since 1999.

Yaroshuk-Tews spent the 1998 and 1999 seasons as the assistant coach at Miami before being promoted to associate head coach for the 2000 and 2001 seasons. During that stretch, the Hurricanes won the BIG EAST Championship in both 1998 and 2000. In Yaroshuk-Tews' opening year on staff, UM had its first All-American—Lioudmila Skavronskaia—in three years, quickly ending the program's first two-year drought without one since its first two years of existence (1973-74).

Prior to joining the Miami staff, Yaroshuk-Tews worked at the United States Tennis Association (USTA) Player Development Headquarters in Key Biscayne, Fla., as a traveling coach with the top U.S. junior players. Before her USTA appointment, Yaroshuk-Tews played professionally in satellite and challenger events. A Miami native and Killian High School graduate, Yaroshuk-Tews stood out among Florida juniors. In the Girl's 18 Division, she held the No. 1 ranking in Florida and the No. 8 spot nationally.

Yaroshuk-Tews went on to star at UCLA, where she was a four-year letter winner and two-time ITA All-American. The Bruins made the NCAA Team Championship and finished in the top 15 all four of her seasons on the team, including a trio of top-10 finishes. She made an immediate impact as a freshman in 1993, playing No. 5 singles and No. 2 doubles for UCLA, who finished No. 13 in the nation. Her junior year, in 1995, Yaroshuk-Tews played No. 3 singles and No. 3 doubles for the Bruins, who concluded the year sixth in the country after reaching the Elite Eight. Individually, Yaroshuk-Tews made the NCAA Singles Championship and finished ranked No. 78 nationally.

As a senior in 1996, Yaroshuk-Tews played No. 2 singles and No. 1 doubles for the Bruins, who made the Final Four and ended the season ranked fourth. Yaroshuk-Tews won the PAC-10 Indoor and Outdoor Doubles Championships with partner Keri Phebus and achieved ITA All-America and All-PAC-10 honors in both singles and doubles. The Bruins' top tandem was ranked as high as No. 1 in the nation during the 1996 season and finished No. 3, while Yaroshuk-Tews achieved a singles ranking as high as No. 13 and closed at No. 21. She made the round of 16 of the NCAA Singles Championship and the quarterfinals of the NCAA Doubles Championship. In addition, Yaroshuk-Tews was honored with UCLA's "Champs Award," given to the school's most inspirational female athlete, and was named the team's Most Valuable Player. She was also appointed to the Rolex/ITA Collegiate All-Star Team.

Yaroshuk-Tews graduated from UCLA in 1996 with a bachelor's degree in sociology, while earning PAC-10 academic honors. She began UM's graduate studies program in elementary education during the spring of 1999.

Yaroshuk-Tews is the daughter of Ernie and Carol Yaroshuk. Her father was a member of the University of Miami baseball team from 1961-63, and was inducted into the UM Sports Hall of Fame in 1992. He holds the third-highest batting average (.448) in the program's single-season history. Yaroshuk-Tews and her father form the only father-daughter duo in the UMSHO.

On Jan. 10, 2004, Yaroshuk-Tews was married to Scott Tews. The couple lives in Palmetto Bay, Fla., with their daughter, Emma, and son, Landon.

# LAURA VALLVERDU

## ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH

EIGHTH SEASON | MIAMI, 2010

Laura Vallverdu completed her third year as the University of Miami women's tennis team's associate head coach in 2017-18, following two years as an assistant coach.

Before earning the title as a full-time assistant in 2013, Vallverdu was the team's volunteer assistant coach for one year and prior to that was a graduate manager for a season. She is now in her eighth year on Paige Yaroshuk-Tews' staff at Miami.

Vallverdu was a standout at Miami from 2006-10 under Yaroshuk-Tews and spent one season as an assistant coach at Barry University after graduating. There, Vallverdu helped guide the Buccaneers to a 27-1 record and their first national championship, and she was named the ITA Division II South Region Assistant Coach of the Year.

A native of Valencia, Venezuela, Vallverdu is third all-time at Miami in singles wins with 131 total, which was the record when she concluded her career in 2010. Vallverdu reached the finals of the NCAA Singles Championship as a junior in 2009 and advanced to the semifinals the next year, making her the only two-time semifinalist in program history.

As a senior in 2010, Vallverdu led the Hurricanes in singles wins with 35, finishing at 35-13, including a 21-12 mark against nationally ranked opponents. She completed the season ranked fourth in singles, her second-consecutive top-10 finish and fourth-straight top-20 finish, as well as seventh in doubles.

Vallverdu was the first player in University of Miami history to win at least 30 singles matches in each of her four years. She was a five-time ITA All-American (four singles, one doubles), the fourth four-year All-American in school history and a four-time All-ACC selection, a first in the program's history.

In 2010, Vallverdu won the Honda Sports Award in tennis, designating her as the nation's top collegiate female athlete in the sport. The honor was based on the results of national balloting among 1,000 NCAA member schools as part of the Collegiate Women Sports Awards program. She was also one of four nominees for the award in 2009, when she helped Miami earn the top seed at the ACC Championship for the first time.

Over Vallverdu's 11 years associated with the Miami women's tennis program as a player or coach, the Hurricanes are 220-74 (.748) overall and 108-27 (.800) in ACC matches. In 10 of those 11 seasons, Miami has reached the NCAA Team Championship Sweet 16 and finished ranked in the top 20 in the nation, nine times ending top-15. On six occasions, the Hurricanes have made the Elite Eight and they have also finished in the top 10 six times.

In 2013, Vallverdu helped lead Miami to its first ACC Championship title. The Hurricanes then won a share of the ACC regular season title the following season, Vallverdu's first after being promoted to assistant coach. She has mentored seven Hurricanes to a total of 11 ITA All-America honors, as well as guided eight players to 15 total All-ACC accolades.

During her seven seasons on staff, Vallverdu has helped the Hurricanes tally a 135-50 (.730) record. Miami has surpassed 20 wins in four of those campaigns and earned a quartet of top-10 finishes. For three straight years, 2015-17, a Miami player reached the semifinals of the NCAA Singles Championship, the first Hurricanes do so since Vallverdu herself in 2010.

Vallverdu graduated from Miami in 2010 with a bachelor's degree in psychology with a minor in business, and then earned her master's degree in sport administration from Miami in 2012.



# JULIA RAPICAVOLI

## ATHLETIC TRAINER

**FIRST SEASON | MIAMI, 2012**

In July 2018, Julia Rapicavoli joined the University of Miami as the head athletic trainer for women's tennis and will be working as a staff physical therapist with Olympic sports.

Prior to her hiring, Rapicavoli spent over a year in the UM Sports Physical Therapy Residency Program, which she graduated from in July 2018, and as a member of the The Lennar Foundation Medical Center staff.

Rapicavoli worked with the Hurricanes football team as a student athletic trainer from 2010-12 before graduating from Miami in 2012. 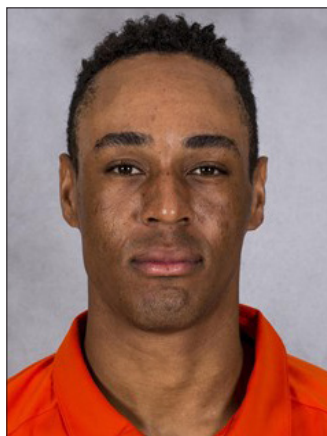

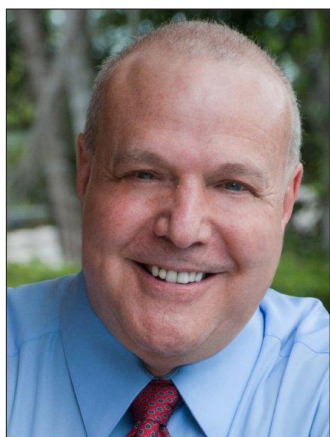

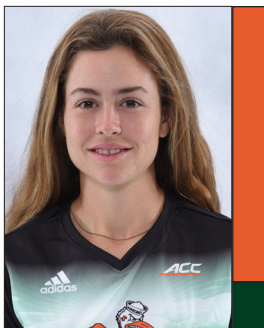

# HONORS, RANKINGS & NOTES

## 2018 Honors

Estela Perez-Somarriba earned numerous athletic recognitions during one of the finest individual seasons in program history. The Madrid native received ACC Player of the Year accolades, becoming the fourth Hurricane to garner the honor and logging Miami's fifth such recognition in 14 years in the league. Along with being a First Team All-ACC selection, Perez-Somarriba picked up four ACC Player of the Week plaudits during the season.

Perez-Somarriba also earned both ITA Southeast Region Player to Watch and ITA National Player to Watch. She is the fifth Hurricane to receive the regional distinction and the fourth, including the second in four years, to tally the national award.

Sinead Lohan also garnered postseason accolades from both the ACC and the ITA. The Second Team All-ACC pick joined Stephanie Wagner and Laura Vallverdu, now Miami's associate head coach, as the lone four-time All-ACC honorees in program history. In addition, Lohan was the ITA Southeast Region Arthur Ashe Award for Sportsmanship & Leadership, becoming the second player under Paige Yaroshuk-Tews' leadership to earn the honor, including the first since 2006.

Perez-Somarriba and Lohan were both selected to the All-ACC Academic Team and were joined by Ana Madcur, as Miami had three representatives on the list. A total of eight Hurricanes were tabbed as ITA Scholar-Athletes and the Hurricanes were picked as an ITA Academic Team for the fourth straight season.

In addition, Ulyana Shirokova received ACC Freshman of the Week distinction four times in the first season the conference gave out the honor on a weekly basis.

## 2018 Final Rankings Notes

- The Hurricanes ended the season ranked No. 17 in the country, their 16th consecutive top-25 finish and 14th in the top 20 during that stretch.
- Miami concluded the campaign as the fifth of six ACC teams in the rankings, alongside third-ranked North Carolina, fourth-ranked Duke, fifth-ranked Georgia Tech, No. 16 Florida State and No. 23 Virginia.
- Fourteen of Miami's 18 wins were against teams that ended the season ranked, including nine against the top 50, while all eight of its losses were to year-end top-25 teams.
- For the eighth time in 15 years and the first since Biana Eichkorn in 2011, a Hurricane concluded the season top-five in singles, with Estela Perez-Somarriba placing fifth, just two spots shy of her season-best mark.
- Estela Perez-Somarriba, who concluded the season as the highest-ranked player in the state of Florida, became the sixth different Hurricane to finish top-five under Paige Yaroshuk-Tews' direction and the seventh under her leadership to place top-30 multiple times.
- Sinead Lohan logged the fourth top-75 finish of her illustrious career, joining a group of fewer than 10 Hurricanes to end all four of their seasons in the national rankings.
- Miami had at least one player in the final top 30 of the singles list for the 14th time in 15 years and had a top-10 finisher for the third time in four years.
- In doubles, Miami had a pair ranked to conclude the season for the first time since 2016, with Estela Perez-Somarriba and Ana Madcur placing No. 61 and it serving as the first year-end ranking for Madcur.

## 2018 NCAA Singles Championship

Estela Perez-Somarriba competed in the 2018 NCAA Singles Championship in Winston-Salem, N.C. It marked the second appearance in as many collegiate seasons for the Madrid native, as she became the 15th Hurricane to take part in the event multiple times. In addition, it was the 16th season in a row and the 33rd time in the 37-year history of the tournament Miami was represented in the field. Perez-Somarriba earned the third overall seed in the event, good for the top mark by a Hurricane since 2009, when Julia Cohen received the tournament's second seed.

After advancing to the Final Four as an unseeded freshman in 2017, Perez-Somarriba reached the Sweet 16 in 2018. She defeated Michigan's Kate Fahey, her 2017 Elite Eight foe, in three sets, 6-3, 3-6, 6-1, to open play. After that, Perez-Somarriba topped Oklahoma State's Megan McCray in straight sets, 7-6 (7-3), 6-3. Her run came to an end against No. 9-16 seed Andrea Lazaro of FIU, who recorded a 6-1, 5-7, 6-0 victory in a matchup of Spaniards from schools in Miami-Dade County. Her defeat snapped a three-year streak of a Hurricane reaching the Final Four.

Despite the loss, Perez-Somarriba became the ninth player in program history to reach the NCAA Singles Championship Sweet 16 multiple times, including the seventh to do so in back-to-back years. She also gave Miami its 14th Sweet 16 participant in a 15-year span and its 24th overall, as well as helped the Hurricanes tie a program record by placing a player in the Sweet 16 for the fourth year in a row.

# PROGRAM STREAKS

## Consecutive Top-Five Regional Finishes: 11

- In each of the past 11 years, the Hurricanes have ended the year ranked in the top five of their ITA region (South 2008-10, Southeast 2011-present)
  - \* In all but one year (2018) during that stretch, the Hurricanes logged a top-four ranking in their region
  - \* Miami finished third or better for eight straight years, doing so each season from 2009 through 2016, including placing second from 2009-11

## Consecutive Top-Four ACC Finishes: 14

- The Hurricanes have finished in the top four in the ACC all 14 years they have been in the conference
  - \* Miami has finished tied for third or better in 11 of those 14 years and has won or shared the regular season title four times
  - \* In 2013, one of the three seasons the Hurricanes did not finish top-three in the ACC, along with 2017, they went on to win the program's first ACC Championship

## Consecutive Top-25 National Finishes: 16

- Miami has capped the season ranked in the top 25 by the ITA each of the last 16 years, with 13 top-15 finishes and eight top-10 finishes in the span

## Consecutive Seasons with an NCAA Singles Championship Participant: 16

- At least one Hurricane has made the NCAA Singles Championship for 14 years in a row, going back to Paige Yaroshuk-Tews' second year as head coach
  - \* In nine of those seasons, Miami had multiple participants, including four in 2009 and three in 2007
  - \* Additionally, during those same 15 years, a pair of Hurricanes have been in the NCAA Doubles Championship all but six times (2004, 2012, 2013, 2016, 2017 and 2018)

## Consecutive Seasons with an NCAA Victory: 17

- In each of Paige Yaroshuk-Tews' 17 years as the Miami head coach, the Hurricanes have won at least one match in the NCAA Team Championship
  - \* Miami has won multiple NCAA matches, advancing to the Sweet 16, in 13 of those 17 seasons, including winning at least three matches to reach the Elite Eight in eight of them
  - \* The Hurricanes have opened NCAA Team Championship play with a shutout victory in each of the past 14 seasons

## Consecutive Seasons with a Player in the Final ITA Rankings: 17

- In all 17 Paige Yaroshuk-Tews' seasons as Miami's head coach, the Hurricanes have had at least one representative in the final ITA singles and/or doubles rankings
  - \* Miami has had multiple players in the year-end rankings 16 straight seasons, including 10 of the past 11 with at least four and six in two of the last five
  - \* Since the start of the NCAA era (1982-present), at least one Hurricane has been in the final rankings all but two times (2000, 2001)

## Consecutive Seasons at .500 or Better: 22

- The Hurricanes have finished no worse than .500 each of the last 22 seasons, a streak that began in 1997
  - \* Miami has been over .500 in 21 of those 22 years and at least seven matches over .500 in 19 of them
  - \* In the program's 46 years, Miami has finished under .500 just twice and has been over .500 43 times, including 39 times with a record of at least five matches over .500

## Consecutive NCAA Team Championship Appearances: 23

- Miami has made the NCAA Team Championship each of the past 23 seasons
  - \* In 2018, Miami hosted the opening two rounds for the 13th time in 14 years and opened with a 4-0 victory against LIU Brooklyn before defeating UCF, 4-3, to reach the Sweet 16, where it fell to top-seeded Vanderbilt, 4-0
  - \* The 2017 campaign snapped a streak of 11 straight Sweet 16 berths that was the third-longest in the nation behind just Stanford and Florida

## Consecutive NCAA Team Championship Home Wins: 24

- Miami is a perfect 24-0 the last 12 times it has hosted the opening round of the NCAA Team Championships (2006-16, 2018)
  - \* Overall, the Hurricanes are 25-1 on their home court in NCAA Team Championship play, splitting their two matches in 2005 when they hosted for the first time
  - \* Miami has outscored its opponents by a 97-6 margin during the 24-match winning streak, posting 22 shutouts, and has a 104-10 margin overall with 23 shutouts in home NCAA Team Championship action

## Consecutive Season Opener Wins: 24

- The Hurricanes have won their first match of the season in each of the last 24 years, dating back to 1995
  - \* Overall, Miami is 44-2 in season openers, with the lone defeats coming in 1994 and 1986

## Consecutive Home Opener Wins: 47

- In all 47 years of the program's history, the Hurricanes have won their first match on their home court

Since the NCAA Team Championship began in 1982, Miami has made the field 33 of 37 years (all but 1990 and 1993-95) and posted an overall record of 53-33 (.616). Miami has made the NCAA finals twice, falling to USC, 6-3, in Oklahoma City in 1985 and dropping a 4-1 decision against Stanford on the Cardinal's home court in Stanford, Calif., in 2006. Additionally, the Hurricanes made the Final Four in 1986 and defeated Trinity (Texas), 5-4, in Austin, Texas, in the third-place match.
