## STORY LINES

- The Miami Hurricanes will wrap up their five-game homestand Wednesday with a midweek contest against visiting Stetson.
- After a five-year hiatus in the head-to-head series, Stetson (DeLand, Fla.) will be making the trip south for the second straight season. Miami took the 2012 matchup with a 3-2 win inside Alex Rodriguez Park at Mark Light Field.
- Despite dropping two of three to fifth-ranked FSU over the weekend, the Hurricanes enter the most recent Ratings Percentage Index (RPI) at No. 17 - and with the second-toughest strength of schedule in the nation, according to *WarrenNolan.com*.
- Junior RHP **Javi Salas** will take the mound for the second straight season against the Hatters. The Coral Gables, Fla., native went 6.1 innings in last year's rendition, scattering seven hits while striking out five batters en route to the victory.
- Among last season's top performers against SU: **Tyler Palmer** (one hit, one walk) and **Esteban Tresgallo** (one hit, one run).
- **Jim Morris** and **Pete Dunn** rank among the winningest coaches in college baseball history. The two have combined for over 2,500 wins in 66 combined years as Division I head coaches.
- Miami will look to end its homestand on a high note before traveling to College Park, Md., and a weekend series with Maryland.

### 3 JIM MORRIS 2001, 1999 & 1994 COACH OF THE YEAR • 2008 ACC COACH OF THE YEAR



In his 20th season at Miami, no other program nor head coach, has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament an NCAA-record 40 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 19 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006.

- Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 871-335-3 (.724) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,375-602-4 (.696) Division I record in 31+ years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 34 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,506-643-4 (.701) mark
- In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 19 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium project.

#### MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

- Jim Morris earned his 28th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2012 when he guided the Canes to one of 16 host sites for the first round of the postseason. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 19 seasons (1994-2012), winning 15 of his last 19 appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.
- Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris led the 2012 Hurricanes to their 40th-straight NCAA Tournament. Five players from the 2012 team were selected in last year's Major League Baseball Draft: E.J. Encinosa, Eric Erickson, Steven Ewing, Peter O'Brien and Stephen Perez.

#### MORRIS IN 35th SEASON AS A COLLEGE COACH

- Morris currently has a 1,375-602-4 (.696) record at the Division I level. As a head coach overall, he has compiled a 1,505-641-4 (.701) record over 30-plus years.
- Jim Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later, he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern on March 23, 2001.
- Morris entered 2013 as the fifth-winningest active coach in Division I baseball history with 1,354 wins. His impressive win total ranks him No. 12 all-time for any coach, regardless of division.
- Including his time at DeKalb C.C., Morris won his 1,500th game as a head coach in Miami's 4-1 upset of No. 1 North Carolina on March 15, 2013 in Chapel Hill, N.C.



#### JIM MORRIS MAKING HISTORY

- The only coach in NCAA history to take a school to the College World Series in each of his first six years at a program. Morris has gone to Omaha with Miami in 11 of 19 seasons and led the Canes to 13 straight NCAA Regional Championships, an NCAA record.
- Named National Coach of the Year five times while at Miami by Baseball America in 1994 and by the ABCA and Collegiate Baseball in 1999 and 2001.

## TAKE A STAND...

- The Hurricanes will wrap up their five-game homestand Wednesday with a midweek tilt against visiting Stetson. First pitch is set for 6 p.m.
- Miami boasts an 8-3 record (.728 winning percentage) in mid-week games in 2013. 10 of those 11 games have been played inside the friendly confines of Alex Rodriguez Park at Mark Light Field.
- Two legendary head coaches will meet once again at The Light - Jim Morris (Miami) and Pete Dunn (Stetson) have combined for over 2,000 wins at their respective institutions

## BUILDING MOMENTUM...

- In the latest Ratings Percentage Index rankings from both *Boyd's World* and *WarrenNolan.com*, Miami is ranked No. 17 in RPI. Additionally, *Warren Nolan* has Miami with the second-toughest schedule of any team nationwide.
- The Hurricanes have six wins against teams ranked in the Top 20 in *Boyd's World* RPI, and boast a 9-8 overall record against *Boyd's World* Top 50 RPI teams.
- Miami's recent weekend set with fifth-ranked Florida State marked the team's fourth straight series against a ranked foe.

## STARTING OFF STRONG...

- Sophomore Chris Diaz has impressed as Friday night starter, delivering a team-best six quality starts in eight chances this season. The Florida City, Fla., native ranks eighth in the ACC with an ERA of 2.05.
- Junior Bryan Radziewski boasts a team-best ERA of 0.78 having surrendered just three earned runs all season. He has also recorded an eye-popping 49:8 strikeout-to-walk ratio through six starts.
- Radziewski (0.82, No. 1), Diaz (2.94, No. 15) and sophomore Andrew Suarez (3.18, No. 16) all rank in the top 20 in ERA among ACC starters in conference competition this season.

## CLOSING IT OUT...

- Senior Eric Nedeljkovic has been Miami's most reliable reliever out of the bullpen, and has allowed just two runs in 17.2 innings of work this season.
- The Folsom, Calif., native, who ranks second in the Atlantic Coast Conference with six saves, has allowed only 12 hits in 16 appearances, and has a dominant 20:2 strikeout-to-walk ratio.

## LAST YEAR'S MATCHUP...

- Miami starter Javi Salas scattered seven hits and two runs in 6.1 innings, earning the victory in a 3-2 win over the Hatters at The Light on April 18, 2012.
- Relievers Chris Diaz, Eric Nedeljkovic and AJ Salcines combined to pitch the final 2.2 scoreless innings, allowing just one hit while striking out four batters combined.
- Jarred Mederos and Stephen Perez each homered, while Tyler Palmer delivered an RBI single. Miami was out-hit by Stetson 8-7, but managed to hold on, as Salcines earned his second save of the season.
