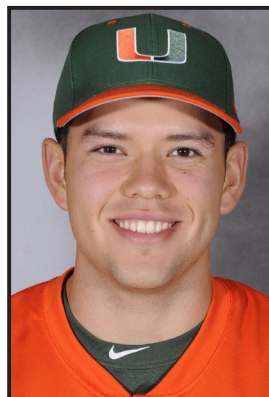

WEEKEND STORY LINES

- After sweeping Villanova in a midweek set, No. 16 Miami hosts Boston College in the opening ACC series for both teams. Miami dropped two of three on the road in Chestnut Hill in 2013, but holds a 15-6 all-time advantage over BC.
- Miami legend and 2014 College Baseball Hall of Fame inductee Mike Fiore will be recognized in Friday's pregame ceremonies.
- The Hurricanes starting staff turned in dominant performances in last year's series on the road at Boston College. Chris Diaz, Bryan Radziewski and Andrew Suarez combined to allow just two earned runs over 25 innings (0.72 ERA).
- Senior Javi Salas tossed just the 23rd perfect game in modern NCAA Division I history (since 1957) in Tuesday's 17-0 shutout of Villanova. Salas struck out six batters on 113 pitches in the second perfect game in program history.
- Miami is ranked in the top 25 in every major college baseball poll. The Hurricanes check in at No. 16 in *Baseball America*, No. 20 in *Collegiate Baseball Newspaper's* rankings, No. 23 by the NCBWA and No. 23 in *USA Today* Coaches Poll.
- After struggling to hit for power in 2013, Miami has 10 home runs through its first 12 games - the most of any team in the ACC. Dale Carey leads the team with three homers, while Zack Collins and Garrett Kennedy have two apiece.
- Miami's series against the Eagles continues a six-game homestand that started with two wins against Villanova. After a Tuesday matchup against Bethune-Cookman, Miami will travel to Stetson and Georgia Tech for four straight road games.

3 JIM MORRIS HEAD COACH

THE HURRICANES SKIPPER

In his 21st season at Miami, few programs have qualified for the College World Series as much as Jim Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament an NCAA-record 41 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 20 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006.

Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 894-350-3 (.717) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,398-617-4 (.693) Division I record in 32 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 36 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,529-657-4 (.698) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 20 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium project.

MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

Jim Morris earned his 29th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2013 when he guided the Canes to a No. 2 seed in the Louisville [Ky.] Regional. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 20 seasons (1994-2013), winning 15 of those appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.

Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris led the 2013 Hurricanes to their 41st-straight NCAA Tournament. Despite six signees being drafted in the 2013 MLB Draft, the Hurricanes reeled in a top 5 recruiting class by national publications.

MORRIS IN 36th SEASON AS HEAD COACH

Morris entered 2014 as the fifth-winningest active coach in Division I baseball with 1,391 wins. His impressive win total ranks him No. 12 all-time for any coach, regardless of division. Including his time at DeKalb C.C., Morris won his 1,500th game as a head coach in Miami's 4-1 upset of No. 1 North Carolina on March 15, 2013 in Chapel Hill, N.C.

Morris currently has a 1,398-617-4 (.693) record at the Division I level. As a head coach overall, he has compiled a 1,529-657-4 (.698) record over 30-plus years.

Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later, he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern in March 2001



MAJOR LEAGUE GUIDANCE

Over 150 professional baseball players have played under Morris during their college careers at Miami, Georgia Tech and DeKalb.

Among the players Morris coached at Miami that went on to play in the Major Leagues were Yonder Alonso (San Diego), Ryan Braun (Milwaukee), Pat Burrell (Tampa Bay), Alex Cora (New York Mets), Yasmani Grandal (San Diego), Bobby Hill (San Diego), Aubrey Huff (Detroit), Ryan Jackson (St. Louis), Chris Perez (Cleveland), Cesar Carrillo (San Diego), Brian Barton (St. Louis), Eddy Rodriguez (San Diego), Gaby Sanchez (Florida), Blake Tekotte (Chicago White Sox), Charlton Jimerson (Houston), Jay Tessmer (New York Yankees), Danny Valencia (Minnesota Twins), Jon Jay (St. Louis), Danny Graves (Cincinnati) and Jason Michaels (Houston).

Standout players under Morris from his days at Georgia Tech were Nomar Garciaparra (Los Angeles Dodgers), Jay Payton (Oakland A's) and Jason Varitek (Boston Red Sox).

Morris has also enjoyed success on the International scene. From 1989-90, Morris served as head coach of the USA Baseball team that won a Silver Medal in the 1989 Presidential Cup (Taiwan), Bronze Medal at the Goodwill Games and the 1990 International Baseball Association (IBA) World All-Star Game in Atlanta. At the Goodwill Games, his USA squad won two of three games against Cuba, marking the first time in history a senior-level team won a series with Cuba. In 1987, Morris served as pitching coach under Ron Fraser at the Pan American Games (Silver Medal).

WEEKEND NEWS & NOTES

CONFERENCE COMPETITION...

- **No. 16 Miami** opens ACC play this weekend with a three-game series against Boston College. Miami dropped two of three on the road in Chestnut Hill in 2013, but **holds a 15-6 all-time advantage** over the Eagles.
- The Hurricanes' challenging 2014 slate includes weekend series with five teams ranked in the most recent *Baseball America* top 25 poll: **Virginia** (No. 1), **Florida State** (No. 2), **NC State** (No. 6), **Clemson** (No. 15) and **North Carolina** (No. 21).
- Miami's nonconference competition has included series with **then No. 16 Florida at home**, No. 2 FSU on the road, **2013 America East regular season champions Maine**, and a midweek matchup with **FAU** - who qualified for the **2013 NCAA Tournament**.

SIMPLY PERFECT...

- Senior RHP **Javi Salas** twirled just the **second perfect game in program history** and the **23rd in modern NCAA Division I history** (since 1957) in a 17-0 shutout of **Villanova on March 4**.
- Salas needed just **113 pitches** to get through his outing, **scattering six strikeouts** across his night of perfection. His perfect game was the first for a Miami pitcher since **Kevin Sheary accomplished the feat on March 4, 1987**.
- Sheary and Salas, who was voted team captain for the second consecutive season, **both share the jersey No. 22**.
- Miami's two perfect games are tied with **Auburn and Iowa for the second-most of any program all-time** behind Washington State's three. Salas' perfect game was the first for any **Division I pitcher** since Will Roberts (Virginia) in **2011**.
- Salas' younger brother **Jorge**, a freshman at UM, was on the **WVUM 90.5 FM call** for his older brother's special night. Salas had **not thrown a no-hitter or perfect game at any level** before Tuesday night's masterpiece.
- Salas, a **Coral Gables native and graduate of nearby Christopher Columbus High School**, was selected in the **38th round of the 2013 MLB Draft** but elected to return for his senior season.

POWER SURGE...

- **Miami ranks first in the ACC** with **10 home runs** through its first 12 games of the regular season. **Dale Carey leads the team with three homers**, while **Zack Collins** and **Garrett Kennedy** have two apiece.
- **Carey (game two, solo)** and **Brad Fieger (game one, two-run)** each connected for home runs in the team's sweep of **Villanova**.
- The Hurricane **offense exploded for six home runs** in its series with Florida (Feb. 21-23), **the most for a Miami team in a single series** since an **April 2010 weekend set at Virginia Tech**.
- Collins **became the first Hurricane** since current San Diego Padres slugger **Yonder Alonso (2006)** to **record a home run as his first collegiate hit** - a three-run blast against Florida (Feb. 22). He also recorded home runs **in an exhibition with the Marlins** (solo HR, Feb. 26) and **on the road at Florida State** (two-run HR, March 2).
- Miami did not record its 10th home run in 2013 **until an 8-3 win over Wake Forest on May 10** - the **team's 51st game** of that season.

FRESHMEN PHENOMS...

- **Three freshmen** were in head coach Jim Morris' **Opening Day lineup**: Zack Collins (first base), Willie Abreu (designated hitter) and Johnny Ruiz (second base). Laz Rivera, Jacob Heyward and Brad Zunica have also earned starts through the first three weekends of the season.
- **Freshman reliever Bryan Garcia recorded the first two saves of his career** in back-to-back wins over Florida (Feb. 21-22). He recorded his third save of the season against Florida State (March 1), **and ranks second in the ACC with three saves** this season.
- Lefthander **Danny Garcia** earned his career-first start in March 5 tilt with Villanova, **striking out eight batters** across 4.0+ innings.
- **Abreu, Collins and Zunica** found themselves on the **same lineup card** for the first time in the **series finale against FSU** (March 2), and combined for **seven hits, two doubles, one home run, four RBI and four runs scored**.
- **Four players from the recruiting class were selected in the 2013 MLB Draft** but opted to play collegiately: **Abreu, Collins, Heyward** and righthanded pitcher **Derik Beauprez**.

THREE UP, THREE DOWN...

- Junior LHP **Chris Diaz** picked up his third straight win to open the 2014 season in a 3-1 victory over Florida State (Feb. 28).
- Diaz, who ranked second in the ACC in ERA in 2013 (1.64), did not pick up his third win of the 2013 season until March 22 against Virginia Tech. He finished 2013 with a 7-5 record.
- The Florida City, Fla., native went seven innings without allowing an earned run against No. 2 FSU, and lowered his career ERA to 2.18.

CANES LEGENDS RECOGNIZED...

- **Alex Fernandez** and **Mike Fiore** will be among the seven-member **Class of 2014** to be inducted into the **College Baseball Hall of Fame**, the College Baseball Foundation announced.
- Fernandez and Fiore join former head coach **Ron Fraser** (Class of 2006), assistant coach/player **Skip Bertman** (2006) and pitcher **Neal Heaton** (2008) as **University of Miami inductees**.
- **Fernandez was named Freshman of the Year and a first-team All-American in 1989**, where he won 15 games with a 2.01 ERA and 177 strikeouts in 147 innings. A four-year UM starter, **Fiore set 12 UM career batting marks**, including hits (341) and runs (258).

HIGH EXPECTATIONS...

- Miami entered the 2014 season **ranked among the 20 teams in every major college baseball poll**. The Hurricanes were rated No. 11 in *Collegiate Baseball Newspaper's* preseason rankings, No. 16 by *Baseball America* and No. 17 in the *USA Today* coaches poll.
