Miami and FAU Ready for Round Two...

Miami (8-8) enters Tuesday's affair riding a season-long three-game win streak, taking all three games of this past weekend's Atlantic Coast Conference season-opening series with Virginia Tech. With the return of 18th-year head coach Jim Morris to the Hurricanes dugout, the 'Canes went 4-1 last week, dropping their lone contest in 9-2 fashion to Illinois State on Wednesday, March 9, at Alex Rodriguez Park.

In a surprise move in the second game of this past weekend's series, Morris moved Preseason All-American third baseman Harold Martinez from third base to first, switching him with freshman Brad Fieger. It marked the first time since 2009 the All-Atlantic Coast Conference performer stood on the first base bag, defensively. Prior to the move, the Miami native was hitting a career-low .156 with just seven hits and seven RBI. Following the move, Martinez has produced hits in his last four at-bats, and driven in four runs while laying down three sacrifice bunts in three attempts.

The preseason outlook for the 'Canes was the starting pitching, but it has been productive in weekend series since the start of the year. In the Virginia Tech series, the UMiami starters had a combined ERA of 1.04, allowing just one earned run in 22 2/3 innings tossed. Collectively, the trio of Bryan Radziewski, E.J. Encinosa and Eric Whaley carved up the Hokies, allowing just 11 hits, one walk and striking out 18.

The Hurricanes bullpen picked up two saves from junior Sam Robinson and Daniel Miranda, each tossing an inning in the series.

Other than Martinez, three Hurricanes batted above .350, including a team-leading .455 average from junior outfielder Nathan Melendres – hitting .455 with five hits (two doubles and a triple) and four runs. Behind him was shortstop Stephen Perez with an even .400 average, driving in four runs on four hits and swiping a team-leading four steals on four attempts.

In the season's only other meeting between the two South Florida schools, FAU jumped on UM starter Steven Ewing early, chasing the sophomore left-hander in just 4 1/3 innings. Despite spraying nine hits on the day, the 'Canes left 10 men on base, and the Owls drove in seven runs on eight hits. Miami's Rony Rodriguez hit his first home run of the year, but it wasn't enough as FAU starter Ryan Garton allowed no runs on four hits and struck-out three in four innings, earning the victory due to working on a pitch count entering the game.

The Hurricanes will once again throw Steven Ewing on the hill tomorrow, while FAU counters with sophomore right-hander Jake Meiers. Ewing enters with a record of 0-1, and a 4.01 ERA in three starts. He earned his only decision in the FAU contest last month. Meiers of FAU owns a 1-2 record and a 2.79 ERA in four appearances – three of them starts.

Scouting Florida Atlantic...

The Owls of FAU enter Tuesday's game hitting .300 as a team, while the FAU pitchers are limiting the opponent to just .286 hitting. Alex Hudak is the leading batter for the Owls with a .416 batting average – including a team-leading 24 hits and second-best 15 runs and 12 RBI. Andy Mee leads the power average with three homers, and Nick Delguidice bats .359 with a team-best eight doubles. Leading the nation a year ago in fielding percentage, the Owls field at .967 this year.

In his 18th season at Miami, no other program, nor head coach, has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament a NCAA-record 38 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 17 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006. His teams have qualified for NCAA Regionals for the last 26 years, 17 at Miami and nine at Georgia Tech.

Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 776-298-3 (.721) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,280-542-4 (.701) Division I record in 29 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 32 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,411-583-4 (.706) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 18 years, Morris has personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and has logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the new stadium project.

MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

Jim Morris earned his 26th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2010 when he guided the 'Canes to the NCAA Coral Gables Regional. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 17 seasons (1994-2010), winning 15 of his last 17 appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.

Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris has led the 2010 Hurricanes to their 38th-straight NCAA Tournament. Five players from the 2010 team were selected in last year's Major League Baseball Draft. In 2008, the 'Canes reached the College World Series after winning the Atlantic Coast Conference, widely considered one of the toughest - if not the toughest - collegiate baseball conference in the country.

MORRIS IN HIS 33RD SEASON AS A COLLEGE COACH

Morris currently has a 1,279-540-4 (.703) record at the Division I level. As a head coach overall, he has compiled a 1,410-581-4 (.708) record over 30-plus years.

Jim Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern on March 23, 2001.

Prior to his 17 seasons in Coral Gables, Morris went 504-244-1 at Georgia Tech from 1982-1993. In his first stint as a head coach, he guided DeKalb Junior College to a 131-41 mark from 1976-79.

JIM MORRIS MAKING HISTORY

- Guided the Miami Hurricanes to College World Series National Championship in 1999 and 2001.
- The only coach in NCAA history to take a school to the College World Series in each of his first six years at a program. Morris has gone to Omaha with Miami in 11 of 17 seasons and led Miami to 13 straight NCAA Regional Championships, an NCAA record.
- Named National Coach of the Year five times while at Miami, by Baseball America in 1994 and by the ABCA and Collegiate Baseball in 1999 and 2001.

SHORTSTOPS AND JIM MORRIS

Morris, who played shortstop during college at Elon and then in the Boston Red Sox organization, has had great success developing the position while a head coach. Over the last decade Morris has taught prominent shortstops such as Nomar Garciaparra at Georgia Tech and Bobby Hill and Alex Cora at Miami.

Morris worked with Javy Rodriguez, who entered 2002 as a preseason All-American. Rodriguez led UM in just about every category as a junior in 2001, including a national-high 66 stolen bases. He currently works with sophomore Stephen Perez, a slick-fielding switch-hitter expected to bat near the upper-half of the order this year for the 'Canes.

Morris coached Hill, who played for the San Diego Padres, from 1997-99. Before Hill, it was Cora and Mike Metcalfe. Both players went on to play at the Major League level with the Los Angeles Dodgers. Cora is currently with the Mets. Garciaparra played under Morris during the coaches' final two seasons in Atlanta and went on to become an All-Star with the Red Sox and played for the Oakland A's in 2009.

Sophomore infielder Joey Porro made his first collegiate start a week ago, and this past week was once again inserted into the UMiami starting lineup. Porro, who served the 2010 season as a student-manager for 'Canes baseball, suited up at shortstop against Illinois State on Wednesday. On the year, Porro is batting .286 with three RBI in seven plate appearances.

One Whale of a Game...

Sophomore pitcher Eric Whaley picked up his team-best third win of the year in Miami's series finale win (and series sweep) of Virginia Tech, going a season-long tying seven innings — allowing just three hits and striking out three with zero walks issued

to the Hokies. The Pompano Beach native has earned wins in all three home series finales on the campaign.

Encinosa Has a Career Day in Gainesville...

Sophomore pitcher E.J. Encinosa went a career-long seven innings in Gainesville on Saturday in the second game of a three-game set against the top-ranked Gators. In a 1-0 loss to Florida, Encinosa allowed just the one game-winning earned run on five hits and three strikeouts. Though not giving up the game-winning hit, Encinosa walked the first batter he faced in the eighth frame before being relieved out of the bullpen.

The UMiami team is full of speed this year, and through the first seven games it is prevalent. Jim Morris has preached stealing bases throughout the year, and the 'Canes swiped 22-of-27 bases on the campaign. Miami Predicted to Finish Third In Coastal Division...

Miami baseball has been predicted to finish third in the Coastal Division of the Atlantic Coast Conference Coaches Preseason Poll. The poll is voted on by the league's 12 head coaches. Capturing a 20-10 league record in 2010, the Hurricanes finished the year third in the Coastal Division behind Virginia and Georgia Tech, respectively. Miami posted a 43-20 overall record en route to claiming the NCAA Coral Gables Regional title, and advancing to the NCAA Gainesville Super Regional.

To Be the Best, Play the Best...

According to Boyd's World RPI [strength of schedule], the UMiami Hurricanes have the 33rd toughest schedule in the nation. The 'Canes not only play the top-ranked University of Florida Gators on the road in the third series of the year, but there is the Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) schedule. The ACC has been ranked as one of the top three toughest leagues in the nation the past five years by multiple collegiate baseball publications.

MIAMI IN THE ACC...

The 2011 season marks the seventh season the 'Canes have played in the Atlantic Coast Conference, and last year's 20-10 regular season mark in league play was the program's second-best behind the 2008 ACC championship squad that won 23 regular season league games.

Last Meeting With FAU: Hokies Clinch Series Win for First Time vs. Miami...

Florida Atlantic University pushed four runs across in the opening two frames, never looking back en route to a 7-4 upset of visiting No. 20 University of Miami on Wednesday night in a non-conference baseball matchup played at FAU Baseball Stadium. Wednesday's game was the first of five games in five days for the Hurricanes of UM.

With UMiami 18th-year head coach Jim Morris missing Wednesday's contest due to a stomach illness – his first time missing an entire contest since at North Carolina in 2002 due to health complications at that time, Miami (2-2) used assistant head coach J.D. Arteaga at the helm against the Owls.

FAU (4-1) used three runs in the first inning and another run in the second to jump on UM starting pitcher, sophomore left-hander Steven Ewing, early-on. The Owls countered with their weekend ace Ryan Garton on the mound, a day after the Owls were defeated 13-2 by the top-ranked Florida Gators in Jupiter, Fla.

Ewing threw 50-plus pitches in the opening two innings as FAU waited patiently at the plate in their at-bats.

Right fielder Andy Mee began the three-run bottom of the first with a solo home run to right field that appeared to be caught at first by UMiami outfielder Chantz Mack. FAU's Mark Nelson followed that with a single and advanced into scoring position on a wild pitch, before being brought around to score by Alex Hudak, also plating Eddie

Cassidy on the two-run scoring double.

In the second, FAU struck again with second baseman Raymond Church singling through the right side to bring in Joey Burkhalter from second base, giving the Owls a 4-0 lead.

From there, Ewing appeared to settle down and completed the next 3 1/3 innings flawless until the bottom of the fifth when he was relieved by senior Michael Rudman. Rudman entered the game with runners in scoring position, as Church came in to score with the run being unearned (and charged to Ewing) due to an error earlier in the inning.

The Hurricanes found the scoring column in the sixth inning, using a three-run shot from designated hitter Rony Rodriguez to bring UM to within 5-3 with David Villasuso and Nathan Melendres also scoring on the homer from Rodriguez – his first of the campaign.

After FAU got an insurance run from Cassidy in the eighth, a leadoff shot to left field, and a RBI single from Burkhalter that crossed pinch runner Geoff Jimenez, the Owls took a 7-3 lead into the top-half of the ninth inning.

UM got a run from left fielder Zeke DeVoss on a RBI single by junior Harold Martinez, but FAU closed the game with a deep fly-out from freshman first baseman Brad Fieger with two men on to give FAU its first win over the 'Canes since 2008.

The win went to Garton who was on a pitch count entering the game, as he went four innings, spreading out four hits, walking three and striking out three in the decision. The loss was tacked to UMiami's Steve Ewing who dropped to 0-1 on the campaign after going 4 1/3 frames, allowing five runs (four earned) on five hits with three walks and three strikeouts.

FAU was led at the plate by Church and Hudak each collecting two hits in four at-bats, with Hudak adding two RBI.

For the 'Canes, it was DeVoss, Martinez and Villasuso all recording two hits on the night, while Rodriguez staked three RBI via the three-run homer in the sixth.

No Ordinary Joe...

Last weekend in Gainesville, UMiami assistant coach Joe Mercadante returned to his old stomping grounds where he earned varsity letters in baseball for the University of Florida during the 2002 and '03 seasons. The former Gators catcher and Gainesville native appeared in 37 games for UF, holding a .312 (10-for-32) batting average and 19 runs batted in. Mercadante is in his seventh year with the Hurricanes program, coaching at P.K. Yonge High School (also his alma mater) prior to his arrival in Coral Gables.

Recapping the 'Canes Last Game - vs. Virginia Tech (3/13/11)...

In what was the most complete game the 'Canes have played all season, the University of Miami secured a series sweep over visiting Virginia Tech with an easy 11-1 win Sunday afternoon at Alex Rodriguez Park.

UM's pitching was the story all weekend, as seven hurlers combined to allow just three runs over 27 innings against the Hokies.

On Sunday, however, the Hurricane hitters deserve much of the credit.

Miami scored a season-high 11 runs – thanks in part to a big seven-run sixth inning – to pull away from Virginia Tech and move to 8-8 overall and 3-0 in league play.

For the third straight day, Miami got another stellar outing from its starter as Eric Whaley allowed just three hits while striking out eight in seven scoreless innings for his team-leading third win of the season. Adam Sargent and Javi Salas each tossed an inning in relief to finish out the game for the 'Canes.

While Whaley headlined Miami's day on Sunday, it was the Hurricanes' bats that also deserve some of the credit for the comfortable win. Six of the nine in UM's starting lineup finished with at least one hit, including Nathan Melendres, who finished 3-for-

ALEX RODRIGUEZ PARK INFORMATION

Renovations to Alex Rodriguez Park are thanks in large part to a \$3.9 million contribution by New York Yankees third baseman and 11-time MLB All-Star Alex Rodriguez. The gift - the largest ever to the University of Miami baseball program - has assisted the program in continuing to develop first-class facilities. The official announcement of his gift was made on Oct. 10, 2002.

Alex Rodriguez Park has taken form in a three-phase process:

- Phase I called for seating modifications, new dugouts, new stadium lighting and utility infrastructure and new rest rooms.
- Phase II entailed renovating below the grand stand area in addition to adding new concession areas.
- The final phase included adding a new clubhouse, weight room, training room, meeting room, video room and academic area. In addition, a new press box – along with four VIP suites – have been built atop the grandstand. This past offseason, addition seating was added down both lines while a new scoreboard was constructed in left field.

Melendres, who is working his way back from a hand injury suffered a few weeks back, was a much-needed spark for a line-up still trying to find its way.

Harold Martinez also broke out of a little bit of a slump, going 2-for-2 with a pair of singles, a pair of sacrifice bunts and a game-high four RBI.

Miami jumped out to an early 2-0 lead in the second inning when a Brad Fieger walk and a Michael Broad double was followed by a Martinez two-run single through the left side.

The next inning, Mack's fielder's choice grounder to short scored Zeke DeVoss from third for Miami's third run of the game.

The game stayed 3-1 in Miami's favor until the big sixth inning, which saw Miami bat around and record four hits and six walks, as Virginia Tech (10-7, 0-3 ACC) reliever Sean McDermott struggled with his command.

Miami added another run in the seventh before the Hokies plated their lone run in the ninth on a single to left off the bat of Tim Smalling.

Hokie starter Joe Parsons had his worst outing of the season in a losing effort. The senior-righthander, who had allowed just two earned runs in 19 innings coming in, was tagged for three earned runs on four hits in 3 1/3 innings before he was pulled for Jake Atwell, who was the first of five relievers the Hokies would use the rest of the way.

Michael Seaborn had three of the Hokies' six hits on the day, going 3-for-4 with a run scored.

Broad reached base in his first three at-bats, doubling in the second before drawing walks in the fourth and sixth. Rony Rodriguez also went 1-for-4 with two RBI and a run scored.

Morris Signs Contract Extension...

On Sept. 20, 2009, University of Miami Director of Athletics Kirby Hocutt announced that head baseball coach Jim Morris signed a contract extension through 2015. Morris, who is in his 17th season at the helm of the Miami baseball program, has led the Hurricanes to the College World Series in 11 of his 16 seasons in Coral Gables - including National Championship runs in 1999 and 2001.

Miami Gets Them Drafted...

Over the last three years, Miami has produced four first round MLB draft picks, more than any other school in the nation. Last year, Yasmani Grandal was selected in the first round by the Cincinnati Reds, with four other players—David Gutierrez (Minnesota Twins), Chris Hernandez (Boston Red Sox), Scott Lawson (Houston Astros) and Iden Nazario (Washington Nationals) all taken on the second day of the Draft.

'Canes In the Classroom...
