STORY LINES

- The Miami Hurricanes make the quick trip north to battle the Owls of Florida Atlantic in a matchup at FAU Stadium. First pitch for the battle between Sunshine State foes is set for 6:30 p.m.
- The Hurricanes swept their 2012 set with the Owls, capturing two games at home and one game in Boca Raton. Miami outscored the Owls 21-11 in those three 2012 matchups: Feb. 29 (10-5), March 21 (8-5), and April 24 (3-1).
- Though severe rainstorms postponed both teams' 2013 season openers, the Hurricanes and the Owls are both off to perfect 3-0 starts after sweeping their respective opening series.
- After sweeping Rutgers at Alex Rodriguez Park, Miami jumped eight spots to No. 20 in the *Collegiate Baseball Newspaper* poll released Monday afternoon. FAU was receiving votes in the *Collegiate Baseball* preseason poll.
- Two freshmen southpaws will make their first collegiate starts Wednesday: for the Hurricanes, Lighthouse Point, Fla., native Thomas Woodrey, and for FAU, Lake Worth, Fla., native Brandon Rhodes.

3 JIM MORRIS 2001, 1999 & 1994 COACH OF THE YEAR • 2008 ACC COACH OF THE YEAR



In his 20th season at Miami, no other program nor head coach, has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament an NCAA-record 40 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 19 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006.

- Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 853-321-3 (.710) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,357-588-4 (.697) Division I record in 31 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 34 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,488-629-4 (.706) mark
- In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 19 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium project.

MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

- Jim Morris earned his 28th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2012 when he guided the Canes to one of 16 host sites for the first round of the postseason. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 19 seasons (1994-2012), winning 15 of his last 19 appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.
- Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris led the 2012 Hurricanes to their 40th-straight NCAA Tournament. Five players from the 2012 team were selected in last year's Major League Baseball Draft: E.J. Encinosa, Eric Erickson, Steven Ewing, Peter O'Brien and Stephen Perez.

MORRIS IN 35th SEASON AS A COLLEGE COACH

- Morris currently has a 1,357-588-4 (.697) record at the Division I level. As a head coach overall, he has compiled a 1,488-629-4 (.706) record over 30-plus years.
- Jim Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later, he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern on March 23, 2001.
- Morris entered 2013 as the fifth-winningest active coach in Division I baseball history with 1,354 wins. His impressive win total ranks him No. 12 all-time for any coach, regardless of division.



JIM MORRIS MAKING HISTORY

- The only coach in NCAA history to take a school to the College World Series in each of his first six years at a program. Morris has gone to Omaha with Miami in 11 of 18 seasons and led the Canes to 13 straight NCAA Regional Championships, an NCAA record.
- Named National Coach of the Year five times while at Miami by Baseball America in 1994 and by the ABCA and Collegiate Baseball in 1999 and 2001.

HURRICANES HEADING NORTH

- The Hurricanes make their first road trip of the season Wednesday when they make the short drive to Boca Raton, Fla., for a midweek matchup with in-state foe FAU.
- The Hurricanes took all three of their matchups with the Owls in 2012, including an 8-5 win last time out at FAU Stadium.
- Both Miami and FAU swept their respective opening series; the Canes took down Rutgers, while FAU edged Cincinnati.

COLLEGIATE BASEBALL RANKS MIAMI #20

- Miami moved up eight spots from its preseason position at No. 28 to No. 20 in the first *Collegiate Baseball* poll of 2013.
- With a perfect 3-0 weekend, the Canes' eight-spot climb marked the third-highest jump of any team ranked in the preseason poll.
- The Hurricanes' rank of No. 20 marks the first time Miami has cracked the top 25 of any major baseball poll this season

OPENING DAY MAGIC

- After leading by three runs heading into the ninth inning, Hurricanes' closer **AJ Salcines** set up a tense situation by surrendering three runs and the Canes' lead.
- **Garrett Kennedy** would provide some needed ninth-inning magic, however, dropping a pinch-hit single into left field with bases loaded that plated **Chris Barr** and **Dale Carey** for the walk-off win
- Saturday's walk-off in the opening leg of the doubleheader was the first walk-off win for the Hurricanes since their win over Bethune-Cookman on May 6, 2012.

2013 RECRUITING CLASS IMPRESSES

- The Canes' incoming class was rated among the top groups nationwide by multiple publications.
- Miami's group of newcomers earned the first top 10 distinction from *Baseball America* since 2006, coming in at 10th-best in the nation. *Collegiate Baseball* ranked Miami's recruiting class ninth-best in the country.
- Eight Hurricanes made their debuts in the sweep of Rutgers: **Chris Barr**, **Ricky Eusebio**, **Frank Grandinette**, **Alex Hernandez**, **Grant Heyman**, **Brandon Lopez**, **David Thompson** and **Thomas Woodrey**.
- Four new Canes recorded their first career hits: **Eusebio**, **Hernandez**, **Heyman**, **Lopez** and **Thompson**.
- The quartet of **Hernandez**, **Heyman**, **Lopez** and **Thompson** also recorded their first career RBI's during Opening Weekend.
- **Thompson** was particularly effective in his role as clean-up hitter, finishing the weekend with a team-best five RBI's.

STARTING OFF STRONG

- Despite missing two top arms due to injury (**Eric Whaley** and **Bryan Radziewski**), the Hurricanes starters put on an impressive showing in their opening series with Rutgers.
- LHP **Chris Diaz**, RHP **Javi Salas** and LHP **Andrew Suarez** combined for 17 innings in three starts, and did not allow any earned runs.
- **Diaz** and **Salas** each allowed one unearned run in the Opening Day doubleheader, while **Suarez**, making his first career start as a Hurricane in Sunday's series finale, allowed zero runs.

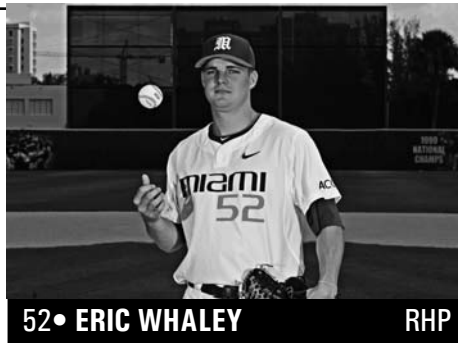

Alex Rodriguez Park took form in a three-phase process:

- Phase I called for seating modifications, new dugouts, new stadium lighting and utility infrastructure and new rest rooms.
- Phase II entailed renovating below the grand stand area in addition to adding new concession areas.
- The final phase included adding a new clubhouse, weight room, training room, meeting room, video room and academic area. In addition, a new press box – along with four VIP suites – have been built atop the grandstand. This past offseason, addition seating was added down both lines while a new scoreboard was constructed in left field.

**CANES REMAIN UNDEFEATED,
TAKE DOWN FAU 10-5**

CORAL GABLES, Fla. - Powered by an eight-run performance over the game's first two innings, the eighth-ranked Miami Hurricanes moved to a perfect 8-0 on the season with a 10-5 win over visiting Florida Atlantic University.

Shortstop Michael Broad, riding a five-game hit streak into Wednesday's matchup with the Owls, connected on his third career grand slam to put the Canes up 4-0 in the first inning.

Miami tacked on another four runs in the next frame, keyed by leftfielder Rony Rodriguez's team-leading sixth double of the season. Rodriguez, who knocked in two runs on his double to centerfield, would cross home plate on Broad's fifth RBI of the night later in the inning.

Junior Steven Ewing (2-0) earned the victory for the second consecutive start with an impressive showing against a talented FAU offense. The Owls, who scored 23 runs over a three-game sweep of Alabama, struck out eight times against the lefty and were held to only two runs in Ewing's seven innings of work.

Owls' starter Jake Meiers, who had found success facing Miami in his two starts against the Canes in 2011, was pulled after a disastrous start. Meiers allowed eight earned runs in his two innings of work, striking out two and walking two batters as well.

A bright spot for FAU was the Owl bullpen, who pitched impressively over the next six innings. Relievers Kenny Sharpe (4.0 IP, 2 H, 0 R) and Kevin Perez (1.0 IP, 1 H) combined for five straight scoreless frames, while the Canes' two runs late in the game were both unearned.

The Owls threatened late in the game, as Michael Sylvestri connected on a three-run homerun off freshman Andrew Suarez to shorten the Canes' lead to three runs. The Miami bullpen would manage to hold off the late surge, led by a scoreless ninth inning from reliever A.J. Salcines, as the Canes won by a final score of 10-5.

The Canes return to action Friday night when they host in-state rival No.2 Florida for a three-game series at Alex Rodriguez Park. Game times are set for 7 p.m. Friday and Saturday, and a 1 p.m. first pitch on Sunday.

March 21, 2012:

**No. 9 HURRICANES POWER PAST
FAU 8-5**

BOCA RATON, Fla. - The ninth-ranked University of Miami Hurricanes made the short trip up north for a midweek battle with in-state foe Florida Atlantic University on Wednesday, capturing their third-straight win by a final score of 8-5.

It was once again reigning Atlantic Coast Conference Player of the Week Peter O'Brien, with some help from sophomore third baseman Brad Fieger, who helped power the Hurricanes to victory in a 12-hit barrage. Every Hurricane starter but one recorded a hit in the game.

O'Brien started the fireworks in the first inning with two outs and nobody on base. The senior catcher, leading the team in nearly every hitting category entering Wednesday's game, crushed the first pitch he saw over the fence in right-center field. The homerun, O'Brien's eighth of the season, was the fourth in the past seven days for the Miami Gardens, Fla. native.

Broad, who has been slotted into the Hurricanes' designated hitter position for each of the last five games, hit a grand slam early in the team's 10-5 win over the Owls in February. This time, he laced a single to centerfield that took an odd hop and skipped past Owls' centerfielder Geoff Jimenez. Fieger scored with Perez shortly behind him, but after stumbling while rounding third, Perez raced back to the base. Jarred Mederos also failed to knock in Perez, as his shallow flyball to centerfield was caught and fired back to homeplate for an inning-ending double play.

Freshman lefthander Chris Diaz started the game for the Hurricanes and pitched effectively in his brief stint. Diaz allowed only two hits and held the talented Owls' offense scoreless through his three innings of work.

With the top of the order due up in the fifth, rightfielder Tyler Palmer smacked a double to the gap in right center, and would eventually steal third after a flyout from Dale Carey. The Owls decided to intentionally walk O'Brien, and senior leftfielder Rony Rodriguez made them pay. The Miami, Fla. native crushed a double down the left field line, which plated Palmer and advanced O'Brien to third.

The Owls would strike for a run in each of the next two innings, with the Hurricanes sporting a shaky one-run lead entering the seventh. But a two-run homerun from Tresgallo that curled its way around the right-field foul pole bumped the lead to a much safer 7-4.

The Hurricanes would tack on their eighth run of the night in the top of the eighth inning before handing the ball off to closer E.J. Encinosa with his team up 8-5. Encinosa got the first two batters of the ninth swinging before loading the bases on three consecutive walks. The Miami native regained his nerve, however, striking out the final batter of the inning for his sixth save of the season.

**SALAS DAZZLES IN 3-1 WIN OVER
FAU**

CORAL GABLES, Fla. -- The No. 18 Miami Hurricanes finished out their season series with Florida Atlantic University in impressive fashion on Tuesday night, taking their midweek match-up over the visiting Owls by a final score of 3-1.

Powered by a 10-strikeout performance from midweek starter Javi Salas, the Hurricanes (27-14, 12-9 ACC) cruised to their ninth win in the past 11 tries over FAU at Alex Rodriguez Park. With his stellar showing on the hill, the Coral Gables native became the first Hurricane to strike out 10 batters all season, and the most recent since fellow starter Steven Ewing did so against Bethune-Cookman in 2011.

Though the Owls opened the game scoring in the game's first inning, Salas (5-2) would buckle down over the next five frames before his outing was ended at 94 pitches. The sophomore righthander went to a three-ball count only three times in the game, striking out two of those batters while walking the other for his sole free pass of the night. Salas scattered six hits over the outing but only one for extra bases, lowering his ERA to an impressive 2.56 in the process.

The Hurricanes struck for back-to-back runs in the third and fourth innings to gain a 2-1 lead. After junior Alex San Juan opened the third inning with his first career hit (a double down the left field line), the Canes used some smallball to plate their first run. After San Juan advanced to third on a sacrifice bunt from Garrett Kennedy, Tyler Palmer connected on a groundout to the shortstop that looked like a potential out at the plate. San Juan made a perfect slide around the tag, however, snagging home with his left hand to tie the game up at one run apiece.

Brad Fieger's RBI double in the fourth inning proved to be an early difference-maker in the contest. After Rony Rodriguez connected on a big rip down the left field line, Fieger's opposite-field, two-out hit plated Rodriguez to give the Canes a 2-1 lead they would not relinquish.

Chris Diaz, Eric Nedeljkovic and AJ Salcines combined for an impressive three innings in relief, allowing only one hit and one walk combined. Salcines earned the save for his 1.1 innings of work to close out the game, one that was ended on a terrific grab from rightfielder Julian Santos. Michael Broad tacked on an insurance run on a solo shot belted over the left field fence in the eighth, his second homerun in as many games, helping guide the Hurricanes to a 3-1 finish.
