THE GAME

- After becoming bowl-eligible with a 38-14 win over Virginia Tech last time out, Miami concludes its regular season with a home matchup vs. #24/#25 Pitt on Senior Day at Hard Rock Stadium. Miami is looking to avenge last year's lone regular-season loss, with kickoff set for 3:30 p.m.
- The game will be broadcast on ESPN with Anish Shroff (play by play), Ahmad Brooks (analyst) and Roddy Jones (field analyst) on the call. Joe Zagacki (play by play) and Don Bailey, Jr. (color) are in the 560 WQAM radio booth for their 17th season together, while Josh Darrow will handle the sideline duty. Jose "Chamby" Campos (pxp) and Joe Martinez (color) will carry the game against Virginia Tech on 990AM ESPN Deportes.

THE SERIES

- Miami carries a commanding 25-11-1 all-time series lead vs. Pittsburgh, including a 13-5-1 lead in games played at home in the head-to-head series.
- The Hurricanes fell, 24-14, in last year's regular season finale vs. Pitt at Heinz Field, marking Miami's only regular-season loss of 2017 (10-1).
- Miami has won 10 of the last 12 matchups dating to 1998, and has only lost three times to Pitt in the modern era of Miami Football (18-3 since 1979).

THE HURRICANES

- With a 38-14 win over Virginia Tech last time out on Nov. 17, the Hurricanes snapped a four-game losing streak and became bowl-eligible for 2018.
- UM's win over the Hokies marked its sixth victory of the season and its second straight victory over its long-time rival from the BIG EAST and ACC.
- Miami is ranked No. 3 nationally in total defense at 274.5 yards per game. The Canes are ranked No. 7 in opponent yards per play (4.3) - the most important metric when measuring defense in 2018, according to UM's defensive staff - and are also ranked No. 1 in team tackles for loss (10.2 per game), No. 12 in turnovers gained (23), No. 2 in third down defense (25.3%), No. 2 in passing yards allowed (141.7) & No. 9 in first downs allowed.
- Among Miami's top defensive performers this season have been DL **Gerald Willis III** (55 total tackles, 17.0 tackles for loss) and DB **Trajan Bandy** (31 tackles, 3 interceptions, 7 PBU). Offensively, UM is paced by WR **Jeff Thomas** (563 receiving yards) and RB **DeeJay Dallas** (1,052 all-purpose).
- Willis III was named Midseason All-American by the Associated Press, ESPN and The Athletic, and a Midseason All-ACC selection by ESPN.
- Miami returned 14 starters and 44 letterwinners from a 2017 team that won 10 games (10-3) for the first time since 2003 and advanced to the ACC Championship Game for the first time ever. The Hurricanes ended the year in the Capital One Orange Bowl for the first time since 2003.
- Miami's seven wins in ACC play (7-1) in 2017 were the most in program history, as the Hurricanes captured the ACC's Coastal Division title for the first time. **Mark Richt** was named ACC Coach of the Year in a year where UM finished with a perfect 7-0 home record during the regular season.

THE OPPONENT

- Pittsburgh is under the direction of fourth-year coach Pat Narduzzi, who has compiled a 28-21 record at Pitt - the 2018 Coastal Division champions.
- The Panthers are riding a four-game winning streak heading into Saturday's matchup, and have not lost since an October 13 game at Notre Dame.
- The Pitt offense is led by QB Kenny Pickett (1,695 passing yards, 15 total TDs), RB Qadree Ollison (1,106 rushing yards, 10 TDs) and RB Darrin Hall (888 rushing yards, 9 TDs). The Panthers defense is led by DB Damar Hamlin (70 total tackles) and DL Rashad Weaver (12.0 TFLs, 5.5 sacks).

QUICK HITS

HURRICANES WRAP UP REGULAR SEASON

- 26 Hurricanes will be honored on Senior Day, as Miami wraps up its regular season with a matchup vs. #24/#25 Pitt on Nov. 24 at Hard Rock Stadium. Kickoff is 3:30 p.m.
- The Hurricanes will look to avenge their lone loss from the 2017 regular season - Miami fell 24-14 at Heinz Field in last year's regular season finale, marking its only loss after starting the season with a 10-0 record.
- Despite last year's loss, Miami carries a commanding 25-11-1 all-time series lead against the Panthers, and has won 12 of the last 13 matchups in Miami.
- Since Pitt joined the ACC prior to the 2013 season, Miami has played Pitt in its regular season finale four times and is 2-2 in those games.

MIAMI D "WREAKING HAVOC" IN 2018

- Miami's defense continues to shine under third-year defensive coordinator **Manny Diaz**, who has shaped the Hurricanes' unit into one of the nation's elite during his tenure.
- According to Football Outsiders, Miami's "havoc rate" - calculated by adding total tackles for loss, passes defensed and forced fumbles and diving it by total plays - of 24.3% ranks No. 1 overall in FBS while its "front seven" havoc rate (16.5%) also ranks No. 1 overall.
- The UM defense ranks among the best in FBS in several categories, including No. 3 in total defense (274.5 yards per game), No. 1 in tackles for loss per game (10.2) and No. 12 in turnovers gained (20).

WILLIS AN ALL-AMERICA CANDIDATE AT DT

- No player has been a bigger part of UM's dominance on defense than redshirt senior DL **Gerald Willis III**, who missed all of 2017 while taking a leave of absence from Miami.
- Willis, the first-ever recipient of the Outland Trophy National Defensive Player of the Month in September, has more tackles for loss than any defensive tackle in FBS (17.0).
- Willis was honored as a Midseason All-America first-team selection by the Associated Press and ESPN and was named a Midseason All-America second-team selection by The Athletic.
- Willis has totaled at least 2.0 tackles for loss in five of 11 games this season, and is alone in first in the ACC in tackles for loss with 17.0; he had 4.0 in the opener vs. LSU.

1.5

Gerald Willis III is tied for 13th in the nation in tackles for loss per game with 1.5; his 17.0 tackles for loss are the most by a Cane since LB Sean Spence also had 17.0 in 2000.

4.3

Miami's defense has allowed an average of 4.3 yards per play, the seventh-best FBS mark and the most important stat when measuring a defense, according to UM staff.

24.3

The Hurricanes defense has a nation-leading 24.3% "havoc rate" according to Football Outsiders - calculated by adding TFLs, PBUs and FFs and diving by total plays.

41.3

Miami's defense is forcing a three-and-out on 41.3% of its drives this season, the 11th-best percentage in FBS and fourth-best in Power 5.

274.5

Through the first 11 games of the season, the Hurricanes rank fourth nationally and second in the ACC in total defense, allowing an average of just 274.5 yards per game.

2,075

Miami has exactly 2,075 net yards rushing and 2,075 yards passing through the first 11 games of the season.

MIAMI TO HONOR 26 SENIORS IN REGULAR SEASON FINALE VS. PIT

- The Miami Hurricanes will wrap up their 2018 regular season when they host #24/#25 Pitt for Senior Day on Nov. 24 at Hard Rock Stadium. 26 seniors will be honored prior to a 3:30 p.m. kickoff on ESPN.
- The Hurricanes have won three straight Senior Day / home finale games dating to 2015, including a 44-28 win over Virginia in 2017. Miami has won both Senior Day games under head coach Mark Richt.
- Miami carries a 25-11-1 all-time series lead over Pitt, but dropped last year's matchup at Heinz Field.
- The Hurricanes are 15-3 at Hard Rock Stadium during the regular season under Richt's direction, but saw a 13-game home winning streak snapped to Duke in their last home game, a 20-12 loss on Nov. 3.
- Since Pitt joined the ACC prior to the 2013 season, the Hurricanes and Panthers have played each other in a regular season finale on four occasions and have split those decisions, with two wins each (2-2).
- Following its matchup with Pittsburgh, Miami awaits its bowl destination, to be announced on Dec. 2.

LAST TIME OUT: MIAMI SNAPS STREAK WITH 38-14 WIN IN BLACKSBURG

- Miami earned bowl eligibility and snapped a four-game losing streak last time out, capturing a 38-14 win over Virginia Tech at Lane Stadium in Blacksburg - Miami's second straight win over the Hokies.
- With the victory, Miami defeated both Virginia Tech and Florida State in the same season for the second straight year (2017, 2018); prior to Mark Richt's arrival, the Hurricanes had not beaten both the Seminoles and the Hokies in the same year since 2002, and not in back-to-back years since 2001/2002.
- QB **N'Kosi Perry** picked up the first road win of his career and improved to 3-2 as a starter in ACC competition; Perry finished 21-for-34 for 171 yards and two touchdowns and added his first rushing TD.
- Miami's swarming defense, led by LB **Shaq Quartermen** (interception, 1.5 TFLs) and DB **Trajan Bandy** (three PBUs), totaled 11 tackles for loss, three turnovers and eight pass breakups in the victory.
- Freshman RB **Cam Davis** enjoyed the best game of his career with 77 rushing yards and two total TDs.

DEFENSE WREAKING HAVOC UNDER DIAZ, A BROYLES AWARD NOMINEE

- The Hurricanes defense has continued to shine under third-year defensive coordinator **Manny Diaz**, who has molded Miami's unit into one of the nation's elite during his tenure as coordinator at UM.
- For the third straight year, Diaz was nominated for the Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant.
- According to Football Outsiders, Miami's "havoc rate" of 24.3% - calculated by adding total tackles for loss, passes defensed and forced fumbles and diving it by total plays ranks No. 1 overall in FBS.
- UM's "front seven" havoc rate (16.5%) - the same calculation but smaller player total - also ranks No. 1.
- The most important metric to measure a college football defense in 2018, according to the UM staff philosophy, is opponent yards per play; Miami ranks No. 7 in FBS (4.3) and ranked ninth last year (4.6).
- In the NCAA rankings released Nov. 18, Miami was third in the nation and second in the ACC in total defense (274.5 yards per game); its 141.7 passing yards allowed per game was second-best in FBS.
- UM ranks No. 1 nationally in tackles for loss (10.2) and No. 4 in third down conversion defense (25.3%).

ANOTHER IMPRESSIVE FRESHMAN, CAM DAVIS DAZZLED VS. HOKIES

- Earning more significant action last time out at Virginia Tech (Nov. 17) freshman RB **Cam'ron Davis** delivered another strong performance with a career-high 77 rushing yards and two total touchdowns.
- The true freshman scored a rushing touchdown on a career-long 42-yard run and caught a 16-yard TD.
- Davis saw the first major action of his career the week prior at Georgia Tech (Nov. 10), posting a team-high 48 rush yards and his first career TD. Prior to that, he had not seen any action since October 6.
- Davis scored on a 22-yard rush just before halftime in Atlanta for his first career touchdown at Miami.
- Davis, who has stepped up after third-string RB **Lorenzo Lingard** suffered a knee injury in late October, finished his high school career with more than 1,300 yards rushing and 21 touchdowns
- The Opa-Locka native chose UM over offers from Georgia, Oregon and Wisconsin, among others.

AFTER REDSHIRTING 2017, PERRY WILL MAKE SIXTH START SATURDAY

- After impressing vs. FIU (Sept. 22) upon entering for Miami's third series of the game, QB **N'Kosi Perry** earned his first career start vs. North Carolina (Sept. 27) and will make his sixth start vs. Pitt Saturday.
- UM is 2-0 in games started by Perry at Hard Rock Stadium; in six games there, he has 11 TDs and 3 INTs.
- Last time out at Virginia Tech (Nov. 17), Perry earned the first road win of his career with a 21-for-34, 171-yard performance. He threw two touchdowns, no interceptions and added his first rushing TD.
- In his five starts at quarterback, Perry has orchestrated Miami's season-long drives by time (7:49, vs. FSU), total yards (95, vs. Georgia Tech) and plays (15, vs. Georgia Tech). He has 13 TD passes this year.
- In his second start vs. Florida State (Oct. 6), Perry threw for a career-high four touchdown passes to help complete an epic second-half comeback. He also started Miami's game at Virginia (Oct. 13).
- The Ocala, Fla., native was a consensus four-star quarterback by 247Sports, ESPN, Rivals and Scout, and was rated as the third-best dual sport in the nation by ESPN and sixth-best by 247Sports.

WILLIS NAMED TO SENIOR BOWL, DOMINATING IN FINAL YEAR AT THE U

- Playing in his first game since Nov. 26, 2016, DL **Gerald Willis III** delivered an overpowering showing against LSU on Sept. 2 in the season opener to set the stage for a dominant final season at The U.
- Willis posted a career-high eight tackles in his first career collegiate start at AT&T Stadium and recorded an eye-popping 4.0 tackles for loss – the first such performance by a Hurricane defender since 2008.
- Willis, who was named ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week for that performance, has not slowed down since; he was invited to the Reese's Senior Bowl on Nov. 14 and has been soaring in NFL mock drafts.
- Willis played his true freshman season (2014) at Florida before transferring to Miami before the 2015 season; entering 2018, he had 33 total tackles, 6.0 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks for his collegiate career.
- This season alone, Willis has posted 55 total tackles, 17.0 TFLs, 3.0 sacks and has started all 11 games.
- The last Hurricanes defender with 17.0 TFLs in a season was **Sean Spence**, who also had 17.0, in 2008.
- The last Hurricane with 4.0 tackles for loss in a game was **Marcus Robinson** vs. Virginia Tech in 2008.
- The half-brother of N.Y. Giants' Landon Collins, Willis played at powerhouse Edna Karr in New Orleans.
- Willis III was named to the Midseason All-America First Team by both the Associated Press and ESPN, and was named Midseason All-America Second Team and best interior d-lineman by The Athletic.

OFFSEASON FOCUS ON 3RD DOWN PAID OFF FOR OFFENSE AND DEFENSE

- After the very first day of fall camp, **Mark Richt** & staff stressed an emphasis on third downs on both sides of the ball, saying Miami practiced third downs on Day 1 as opposed to waiting til later in camp.
- The Hurricanes, who finished last year ranked 125th in third down conversion percentage on offense and 75th on defense, have benefited from the offseason focus; Miami is ranked No. 31 on offense on third down conversion percentage (43.5%) and ranked No. 2 nationally on the defensive side (25.3%).
- Last time out on Nov. 17, Miami's defense held Va Tech to 16.6% conversion (2 of 12) - its third-best performance on third down of the season and second-best against an FBS opponent (UNC, 15.4%).

BALLHAWKING SECONDARY RANKS AMONG NATION'S BEST UNITS

- Miami's defense, ranked third nationally in total defense, has been especially stout on quarterbacks, holding opponents to an ACC-low 141.7 passing yards per game - the second-lowest mark in all FBS.
- Led by three apiece from Trajan Bandy, Jhavonte Dean and Sheldrick Redwine, the Hurricanes have totaled 15 interceptions through the first 11 games - the ninth-most in FBS and second-most in ACC.
- Miami's team passing efficiency defense (99.98) is the fourth-highest nationwide and best in ACC.
- The Hurricane secondary is anchored by three seniors and one rising sophomore - safeties Jaquan Johnson and Sheldrick Redwine, along with cornerbacks Michael Jackson, Sr., and Trajan Bandy.
- Miami was one of just three teams to have two Thorpe Award semifinalists (Johnson, Jackson, Sr.)
- Seven different Canes have at least one interception this season with two returned for touchdowns.

QUARTERMAN ON AN IRON MAN STREAK SPANNING CAREER AT MIAMI

• LB Shaq Quarterman has started all 37 games of his UM career - the only current Hurricane to do so.

DALLAS HAS SURPASSED 1,000 ALL-PURPOSE YARDS AS SOPHOMORE

• Running back **DeeJay Dallas** has been a big factor in Miami's offense in 2018, and is second on UM with 570 rushing yards in 11 games. He is averaging 5.9 yards per carry with four rushing scores.

• His 1,052 all-purpose yards are second-most, and he also ranks first on Miami with 313 kick return yards.

• In UM's game vs. Duke (Nov. 3), Dallas had a career-high 191 all-purpose yards, including a career-high 124 rush yards. His 83-yard TD run vs. Duke was the sixth-longest rush from scrimmage in UM history.

• In a win over Toledo on Sept. 15, Dallas posted the first 100-yard game of his career (110) in Miami's 49-24 victory. Dallas has already far surpassed his 2017 true freshman mark of 217 rushing yards.

• Dallas' 17 rushes against the Rockets also marked a career high for the Brunswick, Ga., native.

• Dallas did it again vs. UNC on Sept. 27, posting a career-high 114 yards on just 11 carries with one TD.

• Dallas totaled 349 all-purpose yards as a true freshman in 2017, including 217 rushing and 92 receiving.

• Dallas, whose full first name is Demetrius, served as unofficial recruiting ambassador for the Hurricanes' "#Squad17" class. He was originally committed to Mark Richt when Richt was at Georgia.

BREAK OUT THE CHAIN AGAIN! TURNOVER CHAIN 2.0 IS HERE FOR 2018

• When sophomore DB **Trajan Bandy** pounced on a loose ball in the second quarter of Miami's game vs. Savannah State, the crowd turned to observe a familiar sight from 2017: the "Turnover Chain."

• But instead of last year's chain, which was modeled in the shape of the iconic "U" logo, Bandy was presented a brand new turnover chain to wear featuring a charm in the model of Sebastian the Ibis.

• Turnover Chain 2.0 is comprised of more than 4,000 stones (compared to 900 last year), weighs roughly three kilograms (compared to two last year) and has an 8.5-inch charm (compared to 5.5).

• The Hurricanes defense totaled only 19 turnovers gained in 13 games in 2016 - the season before the Turnover Chain's inception. Since, Miami has compiled 54 in just 24 games, averaging 2.25 per game.

• No Hurricane has worn the new chain more often than Bandy and teammate Sheldrick Redwine, who have worn it four times apiece; both players have three interceptions and one fumble recovery this year.

FRESHMEN HAVE COMBINED FOR 25 STARTS, AMASSED 27 TOTAL TDs

• Both true and redshirt freshmen have been significant contributors for the Hurricanes in 2018.

• The Hurricanes' freshmen have combined to make 25 starts and, including QB **N'Kosi Perry**'s 13 touchdown passes, are responsible for 27 total touchdowns (13 passing, 14 rushing) this year. Freshmen have scored 147 total points and have compiled an impressive 1,963 yards of total offense this season.

• RB **Cam Davis**' rushing TD vs. Georgia Tech (Nov. 10) was the 10th rushing or receiving TD by a true freshman. TE **Brevin Jordan** (four) and Davis (three) lead the Hurricanes' freshmen in touchdowns.

• Jordan (10), Perry (five) OL **DJ Scaife, Jr.** (five) and WR **Dee Wiggins** (three) lead in starts.



JOE JACKSON AMONG FBS ACTIVE SACKS LEADERS, UM D-LINE THRIVING

- Junior DL **Joe Jackson**, who leads the Hurricanes with 6.5 sacks this season, is one of just 11 active FBS players with at least 21.0 career sacks; he ranks fourth among all Power 5 players with 21.5 career sacks.
- Jackson has at least a half-tackle for loss in seven of his last eight games and is fourth with 12.0 TFLs.
- In addition to Jackson's strong play at defensive end, DL **Gerald Willis III** is tied for 13th in the nation and leads the ACC in tackles for loss (1.5 per game). Right behind him is teammate **Jon Garvin**, who is close to Willis' tackle-for-loss total (14.5) and in a sophomore surge, has started all 11 games on the defensive line.
- Prior to 2018, UM had never had two players with at least 14.0 TFLs in the same year since joining the ACC; Miami could end this year with four, with Jackson (12.0) and LB **Shaq Quartermen** (12.5) in close reach.

THOMAS BACK ON TRACK, SHOWCASED ELECTRIC ABILITY IN BLACKSBURG

- Sophomore WR **Jeff Thomas** has showed off his electric playmaking abilities this year, but struggled during a second-half stretch when he posted just 48 total all-purpose yards in three game (Oct. 7-Nov. 3.)
- Thomas has rebounded over the last two weeks, posting 145 all-purpose yards at Georgia Tech (Nov. 10) and another 110 at Virginia Tech (Nov. 17), which included an electric 51-yard punt return touchdown.
- Thomas' punt return TD was the first since Braxton Berrios vs. FAMU on Sept. 3, 2016 - Mark Richt's debut.
- After a career-high six catches in the loss in Atlanta, he had his first career punt return TD at Va Tech.
- In UM's road game vs. Toledo (Sept. 15), Thomas led Miami in all-purpose yards (171) for the third straight game. Thomas has posted 100-or-more all-purpose in six games and done so in back-to-back games.
- Thomas has a team-high 22 plays of 20-or-more yards in 2018 - he also had 22 such plays during 2017.
- Against LSU (Sept. 2), Thomas started and made a number of acrobatic catches, totaling a career-high 132 yards on what was then a career-high five catches; his previous highs were three receptions and 101 yards.
- Thomas once again showcased his electric speed vs. Savannah State (Sept. 8) when he hauled in a 67-yard TD pass and finished with 183 all-purpose yards - including career-high 90 punt return yards.

- True freshman **DJ Scaife, Jr.**, has started the past five games at right tackle and graded out highest of any Miami offensive lineman vs. Georgia Tech in a road loss (Nov. 10). He has played in all 11 games this year.
- A 2018 Under Armour All-America, Scaife was high school teammate with WRs **Dee Wiggins & Mark Pope**.

TWO REDSHIRT SENIORS MADE FIRST STARTS OF MIAMI CAREER VS. GT

- Lining up as a fullback, RB **Trayone Gray** earned the first start of his collegiate career in Miami's game at Georgia Tech on Nov. 10. Gray finished with one 3-yard rush that converted a 4th-and-1 opportunity.
- Senior DL **Tito Odenigbo**, who grad transferred to Miami after spending his career at Illinois, had a career-high five tackles (four solo) against Georgia Tech. He also started Miami's game at Va Tech (Nov. 17).

JORDAN SETTING STANDARD AS TRUE FRESHMAN, WILL MISS PITT GAME

- Playing his first season of college football, TE **Brevin Jordan** has already emerged as a go-to target in the Miami offense; Jordan ranks second on Miami in both receptions (30) and touchdowns (four).
- Jordan, who suffered an ankle injury at Virginia Tech (Nov. 10) last time out, could be the next great one from #TightEndU. Both Jordan and teammate **Will Mallory** (leg) will miss the Pitt game due to injury.
- Jordan was named a Midseason Freshman All-America and a Midseason All-ACC selection by ESPN.
- Jordan was ranked the No. 1 tight end in the country by ESPN.com and 247Sports and No. 2 by Rivals.

CANES HAVE TWO-PRONGED RUSHING ATTACK IN DALLAS AND HOMER

- Miami's two-pronged running back attack in junior RB **Travis Homer** (801 rushing yards) and RB **DeeJay Dallas** (570 rushing yards) has provided a boost for the Hurricanes offense this season.
- in UM's last home game vs. Duke (Nov. 3), both rushed for 100 yards in the same game for the first time; Homer totaled 133 yards on 18 carries, while Dallas rushed for 124 yards on 12. Both had 1 touchdown.
- The two running backs have split reps over the first 11 games, with Dallas also recording 100-yard rushing games vs. Toledo (Sept. 15, 110 yards) and North Carolina (Sept. 27, 114) and Homer doing it vs. FIU (Sept. 22, 114). Homer has five career 100-yard rush games while Dallas has three such games.
- Dallas' 83-yard touchdown vs. Duke was the sixth-longest rush from scrimmage in UM history.

HURRICANES DEFENSE ON PACE TO SET UM's TACKLE FOR LOSS RECORD

- There are only 10 players in the ACC with at least 12.5 tackles for loss, and Miami has four of them in **Gerald Willis III** (17.0), **Jon Garvin** (14.5), **Shaq Quarterman** (12.5) and **Joe Jackson** (12.0).
- Miami's 112 tackles for loss are four more than the next-highest total (Clemson, 108) and lead the ACC.
- The Hurricanes' defense's total of 112 tackles for loss is already one better than last year's mark (111) and the most by a Miami Hurricanes' defense since 2010 (115); Miami still has two games remaining this year.
- Since joining the ACC, Miami has never had two players with at least 14.0 TFLs in the same season; the Hurricanes could finish with four, with Quarterman needing 1.5 more and Jackson needing 2.0 more.
- At its current pace over a 13-game schedule, Miami will total more than 132.0 TFLs to set the standard.

- Both players suffered lower body injuries against Virginia Tech (Nov. 17) and were ruled out for Pitt.
- Jordan was ranked the No. 1 tight end in the country by ESPN.com and 247Sports and No. 2 by Rivals, while Mallory was ranked the third-best tight end by ESPN.com. The two tight ends are roommates.

JON "NEO" GARVIN ENJOYING SOPHOMORE SURGE ON DEFENSIVE LINE

- The Miami Hurricanes' defensive line took a hit when three of its four 2017 starters departed this past offseason, but one of the players who has stepped up in his sophomore year has been end **Jon Garvin**.
- Garvin, who totaled just nine tackles as a true freshman in 2017 - ranks sixth on the Hurricanes with 51 tackles; he set a career high with eight vs. LSU (Sept. 2) and matched it vs. Savannah State (Sept. 8).
- Garvin is tied for fifth in the ACC and ranks No. 27 in FBS averaging 1.3 tackles for loss per game.
- Garvin, who had just 3.0 tackles for loss as a true freshman, already has 14.5 tackles for loss in 2018; he became the first Hurricane to have multiple games with 3.0 TFL since LB **Denzel Perryman** in 2011.
- The Lake Worth, Fla., native goes by "Neo" - his middle name and the name of his grandfather.

A PAIR OF DEFENSIVE BACKS NAMED THORPE AWARD SEMIFINALISTS

- The Oklahoma Sports Hall of Fame announced the 14 semifinalists for the 2018 Paycom Jim Thorpe Award on Oct. 22, and two Hurricanes made the cut: **Michael Jackson, Jr.**, and **Jaquan Johnson**.
- The Canes were one of just three teams to have two players selected to the 14-member list.
- The only Thorpe Award winner in program history is Bennie Blades, who won the award in 1987.

THREE-HEADED LINEBACKER MONSTER IN MIDST OF JUNIOR YEARS

- Miami's three-headed monster - junior linebacker trio Zach McCloud, Michael Pinckney and Shaq Quarterman - has started nearly every game together since arriving to UM as early enrollees in 2016.
- McCloud has started 28 of 36 career games through the first 11 weeks of 2018. McCloud finished with 48 tackles (29 solo), 4.5 tackles for loss in 2017. He posted a season-high 8 tackles at BC (Oct. 26).
- One of UM's most instinctive players, Pinckney started 11 of 13 games last season and ended up with 68 total tackles, 11.0 tackles for loss and 3.5 sacks. He led UM with nine tackles at Ga Tech (Nov. 10).
- Quarterman, who has started all 37 games for the Hurricanes in two-plus seasons, ranked second on the team with 83 tackles a sophomore in 2017. Quarterman was everywhere for Miami last time out against Virginia Tech (Nov. 17), finishing with four tackles, 1.5 TFLs and his first career interception.
- In a win over North Carolina (Sept. 27), the trio started, combining for 17 tackles, 5.0 tackles for loss, two sacks & one forced fumble. The trio has started alongside each other seven of 10 games in 2018.

HARLEY IMPRESSING AS TEAM LEADER, IMPROVING IN SECOND SEASON

- With WR **Jeff Thomas** struggling with first-quarter dehydration against FIU (Sept. 22), WR **Mike Harley** stepped up in his absence and delivered the best performance of his career in a 31-17 win.
- Harley led all players with a career-best seven catches in the win over FIU for a career-high 76 yards.
- Harley was named a team captain vs. North Carolina (Sept. 27) and made his first career start. He led all Hurricanes with 70 receiving yards, and tied a career-long with a 42-yard reception vs. UNC.
- Harley had a team-high and game-high 45 receiving yards in UM's last home game vs. Duke (Nov. 3).
- The south Florida native ranks fourth on Miami with 19 catches for 222 yards in 2018 - besting his personal totals from 2017 already (nine catches, 91 yards). He is averaging 20.2 yards per game.

AN UNLIKELY SPLIT BETWEEN PASSING AND RUSHING OFFENSE

- The University of Miami has totaled exactly 2,075 net rushing yards and 2,075 passing yards heading into Saturday's game at Pittsburgh; Miami is averaging 188.6 yards per game in both categories.

JACQUAN BACK FOR SENIOR YEAR AFTER CONSULTING IDOL ED REED

- After discussing his future with legendary Miami safety Ed Reed, DB **Jacquan Johnson** turned down the opportunity to enter the NFL Draft, choosing to return for his senior season with the Hurricanes.
- The Hurricanes are undoubtedly happy with his decision, as Johnson - a Preseason All-America first-team selection by the Associated Press, a Preseason All-ACC selection and a watch list member for three major defensive awards - led Miami with 96 tackles and tied for the team lead with four picks.
- In his first game of 2018, Johnson served as one of four captains and totaled a game-high 11 tackles.
- Johnson missed games vs. FIU (Sept. 22) and North Carolina (Sept. 27) with a hamstring injury.
- He returned as a captain vs. Florida State (Oct. 6) and totaled a game-high 10 tackles in the win.
- The Miami native was named a semifinalist for the 2018 Jim Thorpe Award on Oct. 22.
- As a junior, Johnson was of four defensive semifinalists for the Walter Camp Player of the Year.

KEEPING IT IN THE "U FAMILY"

- As is often the case at the University of Miami, a number of Canes have family ties to 'The U'
- Five Canes had fathers who suited up in orange and green: TE **Michael Irvin II** (father is Michael) II, DL **Scott Patchan** (Matt), DL **Pat Bethel** (Randy), P **Zach Feagles** (Jeff) & DB **Al Blades, Jr.** (Al, Sr.)
- WR **Evidence Njoku** is the brother of David, who was taken by Cleveland in the 2017 NFL Draft.
- QB **Cade Weldon** is the son of Casey Weldon, former quarterback at Florida State under Mark Richt.

LINGARD POSTED LONGEST RUN BY TRUE FRESHMAN BEFORE INJURY

- With a 64-yard touchdown run on Sept. 8 against Savannah State, RB Lorenzo Lingard recorded the longest rush by a true freshman running back since Duke Johnson had a 65-yard rush against Duke in his true freshman season finale on Nov. 24, 2012 in Durham, N.C., which was also a touchdown run.
- Lingard, who saw action in seven games, suffered a knee injury leading into the BC game (Oct. 26) that required surgery, which happened that week; a timetable for his return has not been determined.

HURRICANES SET RECORDS IN WIN OVER TIGERS IN HOME OPENER

- The Miami Hurricanes opened their 11th season at Hard Rock Stadium on Sept. 8 vs. Savannah State, capturing a 77-0 shutout victory to improve to 11-0 all-time in home openers at the stadium.
- Miami's 77 points tied a program record for most points in a single game (also set against Savannah State, in September 2013), while its 77-point margin of victory was the largest in program history.
- The Hurricanes have not lost a home opener since 2006, when they fell to Florida State 13-10 at the Orange Bowl on Sept. 4, 2006. Miami has won 12 straight home openers since, a program record.

DEFENSE RECORDS FIRST SHUTOUT SINCE 2015 IN WIN OVER TIGERS

- The Miami Hurricanes' defense was able to compile its first shutout since the 2015 season opener against Bethune-Cookman (Sept. 5, 2015) in a 77-0 win over Savannah State on Saturday, Sept. 8.
- The shutout was the first under the current Miami staff, including defensive coordinator Manny Diaz.
- Diaz's last shutout as defensive coordinator came exactly six years to the day before Miami's win over Savannah State; as the coordinator at Texas, Diaz's Longhorns shutout New Mexico on Sept. 8, 2012.

HIGHTOWER WOVS IN FIRST COLLEGIATE GAME, SCORES TOUCHDOWN

- Among Miami's most impressive freshman performers vs. LSU (Sept. 2) was WR **Brian Hightower**, who hauled in a 32-yard TD reception on a connection with QB **Malik Rosier** in the fourth quarter.
- Hightower, who saw significant action in the game vs. LSU, became the first Hurricane wide receiver to record a touchdown for his first collegiate catch since **Tyre Brady** vs. Nebraska in 2015.
- Hightower made the first start of his career on Sept. 22 vs. FIU; he has 3 catches for 53 yards this year.
- The last Hurricane to have his first catch end up in a touchdown was FB **Marquez Williams** in 2016.
- Hightower was a consensus four-star recruit ranked the No. 141 overall player in his class by ESPN.

- 15 offensive Hurricanes made their career debuts on Saturday, Sept. 8 vs. Savannah State: QB N'Kosi Perry, QB Cade Weldon, WR Mark Pope, FB Realus George, Jr., WR Marquez Ezzard, OL John Campbell, Jr., RB Robert Burns, OL Zalon'tae Hillery, OL Cleveland Reed, Jr., RB Cam'Ron Davis, TE Nicholas Ducheine, OL Zach Dykstra, K Alejandro Cardenas, OL Sam York and QB Jarren Williams.
- 11 defensive Hurricanes made their career debuts in the same game: DL Nesta Jade Silvera, DB Gilbert Frierson, LB Waynmon Steed, DB Gurvan Hall, Jr., DB James Murphy, DL Jordan Miller, LB Patrick Joyner, Jr., DB Nigel Bethel, DB Tyler Murphy, DB Colvin Alford and DL Tyreic Martin.

TRUE FRESHMEN BEGAN TO MAKE AN IMPACT FOR MIAMI DURING 2018

- Miami's recruiting class, nicknamed #Storm18, was ranked the consensus No. 1 class in Florida and a consensus top-8 class overall for the first time since 2012. It was ranked No. 6 nationally by Rivals.
- True freshmen have accounted for 10 total touchdowns already, including two from RB **Lorenzo Lingard** and four from TE **Brevin Jordan**. TE **Will Mallory** and WR **Brian Hightower** each have one.
- Both Jordan (nine games) and Mallory (one game) have earned starts in the early going of their college careers, while DB **Al Blades, Jr.**, was named special teams captain for two games this year.
- UM's recruiting class included 14 players ranked in the ESPN300, 12 in 247Sports' national rankings, 12 ranked in Rivals 250, and 10 players who were either U.S. Army or Under Armour All-Americans.
- Miami's class was ranked No. 8 nationally by both 247Sports and ESPN and ranked the second-best class in the ACC by both organizations. 247Sports, ESPN and Rivals all had UM's class No. 1 in Florida.

ZAGACKI AND BAILEY RETURN TO THE BOOTH FOR YEAR 17

- "Voice of the Hurricanes" Joe Zagacki and color commentator Don Bailey, Jr. are in the booth for their 17th year on the radio - the duo has broadcast 249 straight games together.
- Josh Darrow is in his ninth season as sideline analyst; the trio will enter its 10th year together in 2019.

DEFENSE, TURNOVER CHAIN HAS DAZZLED UNDER DADE'S OWN DIAZ

- Defensive coordinator **Manny Diaz** has directed the UM defense into one of the nation's top groups in his two-plus seasons at The U, and his 2017 unit ranked among the nation's best in several stats.
- Miami's defense ranked ninth nationally in opponent yards per play (4.5) in 2017, the most important modern metric when measuring a college football defense. UM ranked No. 16 in OYPP (4.7) in 2016.
- The Hurricanes led the nation in team sacks (3.38) and was 3rd in team tackles for loss (8.8) in 2017.
- One of college football's biggest storylines in 2017 was the emergence of Miami's "turnover chain," and after the Canes posted the ACC's best turnover margin in 2017, the chain will be back in 2018
- Miami's 31 turnovers gained were the third-most in the nation and most in the ACC, while its +1.00 average turnover margin (+13 for the season) was tied for the fifth-best mark in the nation.

RICHT RECOGNIZES MIAMI PAST, INVITES HONORARY CAPTAINS

- After his return to his alma mater, head coach Mark Richt instituted honorary captains - all of whom are Miami Football alumni - to speak to the team on the Fridays before home games in-season.
- The first honorary captain for the 2018 season was OL Dennis Harrah, who played at UM from 1972-74.
- In 2017, the list of honorary captain list included all-time Miami greats like QB George Mira, DB Bennie Blades, WR Reggie Wayne, DB Ed Reed and DB Antrel Rolle, among other Hurricanes legends.
- Richt's invitation to honorary captains further extends his dedication to his alma mater and the alumni who have passed through the program; in August of 2017, Richt hosted his first "U Network" event dedicated to helping Miami Football alumni find jobs in their post-football lives.
- Richt and his wife Kathryn personally dedicated \$1 million to the construction of the Carol Soffer Indoor Practice Facility, which helped spur more than \$2 million in gifts from former players.

CAROL SOFFER INDOOR PRACTICE FACILITY OPEN FOR BUSINESS

- On August 17, 2018, history was made at the University of Miami, as the Miami Hurricanes practiced inside the Carol Soffer Indoor Practice Facility for the very first time during fall camp.
- In September 2016, Miami announced the largest donation in the history of the athletics department as the lead gift for a state-of-the-art football indoor practice facility. In honor of their mother Carol, Jeffrey Soffer and Carol's other children made a \$14 million commitment towards the facility.
- Head coach Mark Richt pledged \$1 million towards the facility and football alumnus and linebacker great Jon Beason was among those alumni to give to the project. Beason's gift was \$250,000, as Miami alumni and former players teamed up to contribute more than \$2 million for the project.
- The 81,800-square-foot facility features two field-turf fields - one 90 yards long and one 40 yards.

HOMER IMPRESSED IN FIRST YEAR AS STARTING RUNNING BACK IN 2017

- After a season-ending injury to Mark Walton in the early part of 2017, RB **Travis Homer** stepped up and saw action in all 13 games last year. He took over starting duties four games into the year.
- Homer has posted 801 rushing yards through the first 11 games (5.5 yards-per-carry average) and had the first 100-yard rushing game of the season in a 31-17 victory over the FIU Panthers on Sept. 22.
- Homer added another 100-yard rushing performance in Miami's game vs. Duke on Nov. 3 (133 yards).
- Homer rushed for 966 yards on 163 attempts (5.9 yards per carry) with eight rushing TDs in 2017.
- The West Palm Beach native, who was selected to the All-ACC Second Team in 2017, compiled 1,203 all-purpose yards and three 100-yard rushing games - including 170 in his first start vs. Georgia Tech.
- The Palm Beach native became the eighth Miami tailback to have recorded a 100-yard game in his first career start since 2000, and the fourth to do it in an Atlantic Coast Conference game.
- Homer is Miami's leading active rusher with 1,811 rushing yards and 11 career rushing touchdowns.

MARK RICHT

HEAD COACH | THIRD SEASON AT MIAMI (18th OVERALL) | 170-63 (.730)

In just two-plus seasons as head coach, Mark Richt has made an indelible impact on his alma mater's football program -- both on and off the field.

Richt posted a 19-7 record over his first two seasons, the third best start in Miami history, and a stretch that included a 15-game winning streak -- UM's longest since 2002. The Hurricanes won 10 games in 2017, climbing as high as second in the College Football Playoff rankings. Miami captured the Atlantic Coast Conference's Coastal Division for the first time in its history and earned an invitation to the Capital One Orange Bowl for the first time in 13 years. Richt won 2017 ACC Coach of the Year honors and was also named the 2017 Walter Camp Coach of the Year.

The Hurricanes ranked first in team sacks per game (3.38), and ranked third the nation in turnovers forced in 2017 (31). Junior quarterback Malik Rosier accounted for 31 total touchdowns, breaking Vinny Testaverde's single-season school record, and helping Miami rank 15th in the nation in red zone offense (90.7 percent). Junior defensive back Jaquan Johnson had a breakout season, leading the team with 96 tackles, picking off four passes and earning ACC Defensive Back of the Week honors three times. Overall, 10 Hurricanes earned All-ACC honors, including kicker Michael Badgley, who was named first-team All-ACC.

Off the field, Richt has energized the program, from supporting the fundraising efforts for the Carol Soffer Football Indoor Practice Facility to launching The U Network, which assists former Hurricanes in networking and career placement after their playing careers have concluded. Miami was one of three schools, along with Stanford and Northwestern, to earn the 2016 American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Academic Achievement Award. In addition, the Hurricanes ranked first among all FBS programs in 2016 in the NCAA Team Works Helper Helper Community Service Competition, and helped Miami finish first among Division I schools overall in 2018.

Richt was named the University of Miami's 24th head football coach on Dec. 4, 2015. His hiring provided immediate dividends as the Hurricanes posted a 9-4 record in his first season in Coral Gables. Miami then defeated West Virginia, 31-14, in the Russell Athletic Bowl for the program's first bowl victory in 10 years. The Hurricanes were ranked No. 20 in

the final Associated Press poll and No. 23 in the final Amway Coaches Poll -- the program's first season-ending rankings since 2009.

Miami had 10 players earned ACSMA All-ACC honors in 2016, while quarterback Brad Kaaya became Miami's all-time passing yards leader. Freshman wide receiver Ahmmon Richards broke the 31-year-old freshman receiving record at Miami originally set by Michael Irvin, while sophomore running back Mark Walton became the 11th 1,000-yard rusher in program history.

Six Hurricanes were selected in the 2018 NFL Draft. Nine Hurricanes were selected in the 2017 NFL Draft, the most for Miami since 2006, including first-round pick David Njoku to the Cleveland Browns. Richt has had 99 of his players drafted as a head coach, including 14 first-round picks.

Richt, born in Omaha, Neb., and raised in Boca Raton, Fla., returned to his alma mater after leading the University of Georgia football program for the previous 15 years. He compiled a 145-51 overall record and an 85-40 mark in Southeastern Conference play. Georgia won two SEC championships, six SEC East titles and nine bowl games under Richt, and finished the season in the Associated Press Top-10 rankings seven times.

Richt's 164 career wins rank fourth among active FBS head coaches and his .744 winning percentage ranks as the seventh best among current FBS coaches with at least five years of experience. Richt is one of only seven head coaches in SEC history to record four straight 10-win seasons (2002-05).

Richt coached some of the greatest quarterbacks in Georgia history, including David Greene, a four-year starter who left Athens as the then-winningest quarterback in NCAA history with 42 career wins. Aaron Murray, also a four-year starter, is the SEC's all-time leader in passing yards (13,166) and touchdown passes (121). Matthew Stafford threw for 3,459 yards and 25 touchdowns (then a school record) as a junior for the Bulldogs.

Richt is married to the former Kathryn Francis of Tallahassee. The couple has four children – Jonathan, David, Zach, and Anya. Jon, the Miami quarterbacks coach, was married to the former Anna Cearley in May 2010. They have two daughters, Jadyn and Zoe.
