## STORY LINES

- The Miami Hurricanes wrap up their regular season with a three-game series against conference foe Georgia Tech beginning Thursday, May 16. First pitch for Thursday's series opener, slated for live coverage on CSS/ESPN3, is set for 7:30 p.m.
- Boosted by some impressive wins in their conference schedule, the Hurricanes are ranked No. 18 in the newest WarrenNolancom Rating Percentage Index (RPI), while the team's 2013 schedule is currently ranked the second-toughest overall. - In addition to its own impressive RPI rank, the Hurricanes have seven wins against teams rated in the top 20 RPI and 13 wins against teams ranked in the top 50 RPI - both considered as important factors in postseason selection and placement.
- The Hurricanes will look to their weekend rotation of southpaws Chris Diaz, Bryan Radziewski, and Andrew Suarez to snap a two-game losing streak to the Jackets. Miami boasts a 49-31-2 all-time series advantage, but have lost seven of last 10. - The weekend series will pit two coaches with nearly 60 combined years of Division I leadership: Jim Morris and Danny Hall. Morris spent 12 years at the helm of the Georgia Tech program before accepting the head coaching job in Coral Gables in 1994. - The sixth-seeded Hurricanes and eighth-seeded Yellow Jackets met in the 2012 ACC Championship Game in Greensboro, N.C. After back-to-back wins in pool play, Miami fell to the Jackets in the championship finale 8.5 at NewBridge Bank Park.

## 3 JIM MORRIS 2001, 1999 \& 1994 COACH OF THE YEAR • 2008 ACC COACH OF THE YEAR

In his 20th season at Miami, no other program nor head coach, has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament an NCAA-record 40 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 19 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006.

- Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 883-341-3 (.724) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,387-608-4 (.696) Division I record in $31+$ years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 34 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,517-647-4 (.701) mark
- In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 19 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium project.


## MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

- Jim Morris earned his 28th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2012 when he guided the Canes to one of 16 host sites for the first round of the postseason. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 19 seasons (19942012), winning 15 of his last 19 appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.
- Affectionately known as " 3 " by those surrounding the UM program, Morris led the 2012 Hurricanes to their 40th-straight NCAA Tournament. Five players from the 2012 team were selected in last year's Major League Baseball Draft: E.J. Encinosa, Eric Erickson, Steven Ewing, Peter O'Brien and Stephen Perez.


## MORRIS IN 35th SEASON AS A COLLEGE COACH

- Morris currently has a 1,387-608-4 (.696) record at the Division I level. As a head coach overall, he has compiled a 1,518-649-4 (.701) record over 30-plus years.
- Jim Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a $16-13$ win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later, he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a $7-3$ win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000 th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a $5-3$ win over Northeastern on March 23, 2001.
- Morris entered 2013 as the fifth-winningest active coach in Division I baseball history with 1,354 wins. His impressive win total ranks him No. 12 all-time for any coach, regardless of division.
- Including his time at DeKalb C.C., Morris won his 1,500 th game as a head coach in Miami's $4-1$ upset of No. 1 North Carolina on March 15, 2013 in Chapel Hill, N.C.



## JIM MORRIS MAKING HISTORY

- The only coach in NCAA history to take a school to the College World Series in each of his first six years at a program. Morris has gone to Omaha with Miami in 11 of 19 seasons and led the Canes to 13 straight NCAA Regional Championships, an NCAA record.
- Named National Coach of the Year five times while at Miami by Baseball America in 1994 and by the ABCA and Collegiate Baseball in 1999 and 2001.

## HOME SWEET HOME...

- After a trip to Winston-Salem, N.C. for their final road series of the season, the Hurricanes return home for their last regular season clash of 2013. First pitch for Thursday's opener against Georgia Tech, set for coverage on CSS/ESPN3, is set for 7:30 p.m.
- The Hurricanes own an impressive 25.9 record at The Light this season (. 735 winning percentage), and have won six straight home contests dating back to an April 20 win over Clemson.
- 2B Alex Hernandez (. 345 AVG, 11 doubles, 21 RBI's) and LHP Bryan Radziewski (6-0, 0.63 ERA) have been among Miami's most consistent contributors at home this season.


## BUILDING MOMENTUM...

- In the latest Ratings Percentage Index (RPI) calculations from WarrenNolan.com (May 15), Miami is ranked No. 18 in the nation. Additionally, the projection site ranks Miami with the second-toughest schedule of any team in Division I.
- The Hurricanes have seven wins against teams ranked in WarrenNolan's Top 20 RPI, and have 13 wins against Top 50 RPI teams. Georgia Tech rates №. 22 in WarrenNolan.com RPI rankings.


## WATCHING CLOSELY...

- Junior Bryan Radziewski was added to the 60-man midseason watch list for the 2013 Golden Spikes Award, annually honoring the top college baseball player in the nation.
- Having surrendered just 10 earned runs all season, Radziewski boasts a team-best ERA of 1.26 , which is the best mark of any pitcher in the conference. He has also recorded a 91:23 strikeout-to-walk ratio, and his 91 punchouts are the third-most in the conference.
- Radziewski has yielded the fewest hits (40) and fewest earned runs (10) of any weekend starter in the conference. He is holding opponents to a paltry . 167 average, good for tops in the ACC.


## STARTING OFF STRONG...

- Sophomore Chris Diaz has impressed as Friday night starter, delivering a team-best 11 quality starts in 13 chances this season. The Florida City, Fla., native ranks third in the ACC with an ERA of 1.41, and third in the conference with 89.2 innings pitched.
- Over his last six starts dating back to an April 5 outing against Florida State, Diaz has allowed two earned runs over 44.1 innings, good for a miniscule 0.40 ERA over that stretch.
- Junior Bryan Radziewsski and sophomore Andrew Suarez have each been recognized with ACC Pitcher of the Week honors this season for complete game-shutout performances.
- Radziewski (1.41, second), Diaz (1.81, fourth) and Suarez (3.09, No. 14) all rank in the top 15 in ERA among ACC starters in conference competition this season.


## HEATING UP...

- Among the weekend's top performers against Wake Forest were freshmen David Thompson and Brandon Lopez.
- Thompson delivered two solo homeruns over the weekend, ending the three-game set with five hits, four runs and four RBI's.
- Lopez enjoyed a career day in game two, tying a personal best with three hits and setting a new career record with four RBI's.
- The duo combined for 10 of Miami's 28 hits on the weekend.
