11 Among active coaches, Coach L is the **11th**-winningest coach in the country with 589 victories, and ranks No. 42 on the list of all-time winningest coaches.

1.7 Miami's facilities are undergoing **\$1.7** million in renovations with graphics and new features in the office areas and locker rooms of the Watsco Center.

15 This season Jim Larrañaga and associate head coach Chris Caputo are in their **15th** season on sidelines together, dating back to their time at George Mason.

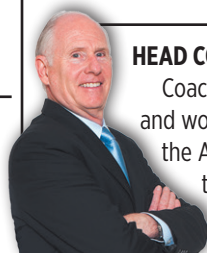
THE 2016-17 HURRICANES

Miami began the 2016-17 regular season with 10 scholarship players, led by a trio of captains in seniors Davon Reed and Kamari Murphy, along with junior Ja'Quan Newton. Sophomores Anthony Lawrence and Ebuka Izundu also return for the Hurricanes.

This season, a group of five newcomers comprising Miami's top recruiting class in program history donned a UM jersey for the first time. The Canes' coaching staff reeled in four freshmen in McDonald's All-American Dewan Huell, Jordan Brand Classic All-American Bruce Brown, Australian standout Dejan "DJ" Vasiljevic and Rodney Miller from national powerhouse Oak Hill Academy (Va.). Redshirt junior Rashad Muhammad also joins the class after sitting out a season ago due to transferring from San Jose State. The four-man group has been named one of the top 2016 classes in the country, with a No. 9 ranking from 247Sports, No. 10 from Scout, No. 13 from ESPN and No. 13 from Rivals.

CANES SIGN A TRIO OF TOP-100 PLAYERS

Jim Larrañaga has signed three ESPN Top 100 players in guard Lonnie Walker (No. 19), guard Chris Lykes (52) and forward Deng Gak (93). This marks the second straight Miami recruiting class with at least two ESPN Top 100 players, following last year's signing of Bruce Brown (26) and Dewan Huell (28). Walker is a 6-foot-5-inch shooting guard from Reading, Pa., with great ball handling skills and is Miami's highest-ranked recruit in program history. Lykes is a 5-foot-6-inch explosive do-it-all point guard from Bowie, Md., who plays at Gonzaga College (D.C.) High School. Gak is a 6-foot-11-inch forward playing his prep ball at Blair Academy in New Jersey.



HEAD COACH JIM LARRAÑAGA

Coach Jim Larrañaga has led the Hurricanes to a pair of NCAA Sweet 16 appearances and won the 2013 ACC regular season and ACC Tournament titles. He has been named the AP, Naismith, USBWA and Henry Iba National Coach of the Year, twice was both the ACC and USBWA District Coach of the Year, and was the 2013 NABC District Coach of the Year.

LARRAÑAGA BY THE NUMBERS

5 - Coach Jim Larrañaga is one of five ACC coaches with a Final Four appearance to his credit. In 2006, Larrañaga became the first coach at a mid-major school to take his team to the NCAA Final Four in 27 years.

7 - In 32 years of coaching, Jim Larrañaga has a winning record in the NCAA Tournament, a 9-6 mark in seven appearances.

7 - Larrañaga is no stranger to the ACC. In his seven seasons as an assistant coach at Virginia, the Cavaliers participated in the NCAA Final Four in 1981 and 1984, won three ACC Championships and finished in the top five of the rankings.

16 - Larrañaga has made 16 postseason appearances in the past 27 years, including reaching seven NCAA Tournaments.

33 - Larrañaga is in his 33rd year as a head coach and has successfully transitioned three institutions into winning programs: Miami, Bowling Green and George Mason.

500 - Coach L is one of five ACC coaches with 500 or more wins.

LARRAÑAGA - WHY MIAMI?

Along with returning to the best basketball conference in the country, Coach L had a few personal reasons for accepting the head coaching job at Miami. Coach's grandfather was from Cuba, where he produced the Larrañaga [lare-en-YAH-ga] cigar. Coach's father was raised in Key West, Fla., before moving to The Bronx, N.Y., getting married and raising six children. Coach L was raised in The Bronx, but vacationed to Florida as a boy. He also owns a house in Sarasota, Fla., and three of his siblings have retired to Florida.

DID YOU KNOW ...

Coach L became the first Miami coach to win 20+ games in his first two seasons at UM and only the third of 12 UM coaches to post at least three 20-win seasons.

Former Cane Rick Barry was named one of the Greatest Players in NBA History.

Miami native and former Cane standout James Jones won the 2010-2011 NBA All-Star Weekend 3-Point Contest and the NBA Championship in the 2011-2012 and 2012-13 seasons.

Six-time NBA All Star Amar'e Stoudemire enrolled at UM in 2013 and took classes to earn his bachelor's degree. UM is in its 13th season in the ACC.

Coach L led the George Mason Patriots to the 2006 Final Four with big wins over some of basketball's elite teams such as Michigan State, North Carolina and UConn. He was the first coach to take a mid-major to a Final Four in 27 years (Penn '79) when his team advanced in 2006.

In 14 years at George Mason, Larrañaga led the Patriots to five NCAA Tournament appearances (2011, 2008, 2006, 2001, 1999), including the 2006 Final Four.

Miami basketball received APR (Academic Progress Rate) Public Recognition Awards for being among the top 10 percent in APR in its sport. Miami ranks in the top 10 percent of NCAA men's basketball with a 990 APR.

The Miami Department of Athletics recorded a Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 89 percent. Miami's department-wide GSR is 16th overall among FBS programs. UM has exceeded the NCAA average GSR in each of the last 10 years.

The Canes have averaged 20.0 wins over the last 11 seasons.

The Hurricanes have made at least one trey in 940 of 948 games since the NCAA adopted the 3-point shot in 1986. The last time Miami was held without a 3-pointer was Feb. 26, 2014 at Virginia.

Miami has held 799 of its last 800 opponents to less than 100 points. North Carolina was the last team to score 100+, defeating UM, 105-64, on Jan. 31, 2007.

HIGH-OCTANE CANES

Miami has scored 90+ points 11 times under the leadership of Coach L, and twice already this season. Three times, those 90-point games were wins against ranked teams: No. 1 Duke, 90-63, in 2013; No. 4 Duke, 90-74, in 2015; and No. 16 Utah, 90-66, in 2015.

MIAMI DEFENSE IS STINGY IN THE FIRST HALF

The Hurricanes have held their first two opponents to 38 total first-half points through two games, allowing Western Carolina just 18 points in the first stanza and UNF just 20 points. Western Carolina hit only 22.9 percent (8-35) from the field and 13.3 percent (2-15) from three while UNF made 29.6 percent (8-27) from the field and went 1-10 from three in the first half.

CANES ARE YOUNG, BUT LED BY EXPERIENCED SENIORS

Miami is No. 297 out of 351 teams in experience in the nation, according to KenPom.com. The Canes are led by a pair of seniors who have each played in 100 games, but Miami also has six players who have appeared in less than 35 games in their careers. Four freshmen have played in just two games apiece, while starting center Ebuka Izundu has played in 17 games and starting guard Anthony Lawrence has played just 35 games.

CANES POST HIGH AVERAGES TO START THE SEASON

To open the season, Miami is averaging 93.0 points, 49.0 rebounds, 14.5 assists, 9.0 steals and 5.0 blocks per game. The Canes are hitting 52.3 percent (68-130) of shots from the field, 39.4 percent (13-33) from three and 71.2 percent (37-52) at the line.

HIGHLY-TOUTED FRESHMEN PUTTING UP HEFTY NUMBERS

Four freshmen made their Miami debut in the season opener against WCU, led by 13 points and seven rebounds from Dewan Huell and eight rebounds and five assists from Bruce Brown. Huell continued to roll at North Florida with 15 points and eight rebounds, while DJ Vasiljevic posted double-digit points for the second-straight game.

ROOKIE McCLELLAN MAKES FIRST NBA START

Former Cane and current Washington Wizards rookie Sheldon McClellan made his first NBA start on Nov. 12 vs. Chicago, in just his fifth professional game played. Against the Bulls, he scored 15 points in 35 minutes played. His second career start was Nov. 16 against Philadelphia, when Mac had six points, two rebounds and two steals in 20 minutes.

MURPHY AND REED EACH PLAY 100TH GAME

At North Florida, seniors Kamari Murphy and Davon Reed each suited up for their 100th career game. Murphy played in 66 games at Oklahoma State before playing 34 at Miami. All 100 of Reed's games played are at UM.

The UM locker room is closed at all times. For home games, Coach L and at least one Hurricane player will report to the media room for interviews following the opposing team's press conference.

MILESTONES FOR THE CANES

1,000 Games - Coach Larrañaga opened the 2016-17 season just 21 shy of 1,000 career games coached. Miami's 21st game of the season is vs. Florida State on Feb. 1. He has coached 53 games at American International, 314 at Bowling Green, 437 at George Mason and 176 at Miami.

1,000 Program Wins - The University of Miami men's basketball program has won 992 of its 1719 games.

600 Victories - Coach Larrañaga is just 10 wins shy of 600 career victories. With 600 wins, he will be one of five ACC coaches with 600 victories, and the other four men are in the Basketball Hall of Fame.

100 Games - Seniors Kamari Murphy and Davon Reed each played in their 100th career game at North Florida on Nov. 16, 2016. Murphy, a redshirt senior, played in 66 games at Oklahoma State before coming to Miami as a junior. All of Reed's games played are at UM.

100 Blocks - Redshirt senior Kamari Murphy has recorded 92 career blocks, with 61 at Oklahoma State and 31 at Miami.

1,000 Points - Senior Davon Reed has scored 877 points in 100 career games at The U.

THE MATCHUP BETWEEN MIAMI AND PENN

Miami is 5-3 against Penn all-time, but is 2-0 against the Ivy League school since UM relaunched its basketball program in 1985.

Miami's first matchup against Penn came all the way back on Jan. 2, 1948. The Quakers won that one, 53-47.

The Canes' last matchup against an Ivy League school came just last season when they defeated Princeton, 76-64.

Jim Larrañaga has a 9-0 record all-time against Penn head coach Steve Donahue, including an 8-0 mark when Donahue was in the ACC at Boston College.

Coach L is 6-2 against opponents from the state of Pennsylvania since he arrived at UM.

• In three consecutive halves, the Hurricanes have scored 46+ points. In the second half against Western Carolina, Miami scored 51 points before scoring 48 in the first and 46 in the second half against UNF.

• Miami shot 50 percent from the field in both halves for the first time since last season's second round matchup against Wichita State of the NCAA Tournament. The Hurricanes shot 19-37 (51.4%) in the first half and 18-31 (58.1%) in the second at UNF.

• As a team Miami shot 37-68 (54.4%) from the field, while holding North Florida to only 21-61 (34.4%) from the field and 7-24 (29.2%) from three.

• For the second straight game, Miami held its opponent to less than 30 percent from three: Western Carolina (21.2%) and North Florida (29.2%).

• For the second consecutive game, the Hurricanes scored 90+ points with 92 against Western Carolina and 94 against North Florida. The last time this occurred was against Mississippi State (105) on November 19 and Utah (90) on November 20, 2015 in the Puerto Rico Tip-Off.

• Freshmen DJ Vasiljevic (13) and Dewan Huell (15) have scored double-digit points in their opening two games as Hurricanes. Against WCU, Vasiljevic had 11 points and Huell tallied 13.

• For the second consecutive game Vasiljevic made three 3-pointers.

• For the second time this season five Hurricanes scored double-digit points. Reed (17), Newton (16), Huell (15), Vasiljevic (13) and Lawrence (10).

• The Canes have now played 71 games under Coach L in which at least four players have scored in double figures. Miami is 59-12 in those games.

• Reed led the Hurricanes with 17 points, while Murphy set a season high with nine rebounds.

• Opening the night with five first-half assists, Newton set a career high with seven. The Philadelphia native shot 7-10 from the field, making seven consecutive to end the game.

• Miami started the game on a 7-0 run, as Lawrence opened up the scoring with a three, 24 seconds into the game. The Hurricanes held the lead for the remainder of the evening.

SELLING OUT THE WATSCO CENTER

In just his fifth season in Coral Gables, Jim Larrañaga and Miami SOLD OUT the season ticket allotment for all home games last year at the Watsco Center. It was the first time in Miami athletics history a team sold out their season. And now, the arena is sold out in back-to-back seasons.

For two straight years, fans have bought over 5,500 season tickets, more than doubling the total number of season tickets sold in Larrañaga's first season in Coral Gables. When Coach L began his reign in Miami, fans bought 2,251 season tickets for the 2011-12 campaign. After a record-breaking season on the court in 2012-13, season tickets peaked at 3,674 for 2013-14, prior to this year's 5,750 mark.

FACILITY UNDERGOING \$1.7 MILLION RENOVATION

The basketball facility is in the process of a \$1.7 million renovation that will include upgrades to the locker rooms, student-athlete lounges, office spaces, weight room and practice facility hallways.

The project is being split into two phases, beginning with the \$1.7 million remodel. The second phase will begin following the 2016-17 season.

The coaches' offices and hallways of the facility will feature highlights from great moments in Miami basketball history, as well as photos of select stars from both the men's and women's teams. Also on display will be large-scale images of UM's ProCanes as well as the newest Canes adidas gear.

The players' lounge will feature a gaming center complete with couches and televisions.

The walls of the practice facility will showcase photos of celebrity Canes fans throwing up the U and images of the sold-out student section.

The overall concept will be produced by ZeDesign. The wallpaper-style graphics will be printed on Dreamscape material. Office flooring will be provided by Southeastern Surfaces and Equipment while furniture will be from DreamSeat, Apricot and ZeDesign.

Student-athletes will have custom lockers from Longhorn Lockers and ProSound will upgrade the sound system in the locker room, lounges and coaches' offices.

LARRAÑAGA ONE OF THE BEST

Among active coaches, Jim Larrañaga is the 11th-winningest coach in the country at major schools with 588 victories, and is ranked No. 42 on the list of all-time winningest coaches at major schools. Among the seven ACC coaches with five-plus years in the league, in their first five years at their current school, Coach L is second in overall wins (118), overall winning percentage (.674), ACC victories (54), winning percentage in ACC games only (.614). Among all-time ACC coaches (includes only seasons coaching at ACC schools during years as ACC member), Coach L is ranked No. 25 all-time in ACC wins and No. 29 all-time in overall wins, in just five years in the league. He is ninth all-time in winning percentage in ACC games only (.614).

MIAMI PICKED NINTH IN ACC PRESEASON POLL

Miami was predicted to finish ninth out of 15 teams in the Atlantic Coast Conference this season, as announced by the league at the 55th annual Operation Basketball. Duke was picked to win the ACC, followed by North Carolina, Virginia and Louisville.

Senior Davon Reed was tabbed to the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) 2015-16 NABC Honors Court, recognizing those men's collegiate basketball student-athletes who excelled in academics during the past season.

Reed, from Ewing, N.J., is majoring in sport administration with a minor in marketing and communications at Miami. He is expected to graduate from The U in May of 2017, after a four-year basketball career with the Hurricanes.

Last season Reed was also named to the All-Atlantic Coast Conference Academic Men's Basketball Team and the All-ACC Academic Honor Roll. Following his junior campaign, he was listed on Miami's Dean's List (3.5+ GPA), Athletics Director Honor Roll (3.2+ GPA) and Book Buster Honor Roll (3.0+ GPA).

MCLELLAN ON NBA OPENING DAY ROSTER

Miami graduate Sheldon McClellan signed a partially guaranteed contract with the Washington Wizards, and on the NBA's opening day, McClellan played in his first professional game. Against Atlanta, he scored seven points and had a steal in four minutes.

NAVY SEALS TRAINING

CANES RECRUIT TOP-15 CLASS FOR 2016-17

In the fall of 2015, Miami signed one of the top 15 recruiting classes in the country, with 247Sports ranking the class No. 9, Scout at No. 10, ESPN at No. 13 and Rivals at No. 13. The 2016 class rankings topped Miami's best mark from 2005, when the Canes signed four four-star recruits - Jimmy Graham, Brian Asbury, Adrian Thomas and Denis Clemente - in a class that was ranked No. 12 in the nation by Scout. In 2009, Miami's signing class was nationally ranked No. 19 by Scout and No. 24 by ESPN. That Hurricanes' heralded 2009 class was comprised of ESPNU 100 picks Durand Scott, Garrius Adams and Donnavan Kirk, in addition to May signee Antoine Allen.

Since 2002, Miami has signed 16 Scout top-100 players, including three five-star, top-25 players in DeQuan Jones (22, 2008), Dewan Huell (25, 2016) and Durand Scott (25, 2009).

Since Larrañaga's arrival, his staff has signed five top-100 players in Huell (25), Bruce Brown (44), Ja'Quan Newton (52, 2014), Rodney Miller (90) and James Palmer (98, 2014). Huell and Brown are the most lauded signees for Miami since Scott in 2009, Jones in 2008, No. 32 Guillermo Diaz in 2003 and McDonald's All-American Darius Rice in 2000.

MIAMI ANNOUNCES THE WATSCO CENTER

In October, the University of Miami announced the naming of its multi-purpose entertainment facility as the Watsco Center.

Watsco, Inc., based in Miami, is traded on the New York Stock Exchange and is the largest distributor of air conditioning, heating and refrigeration products with annual sales of more than \$4 billion, 5,000 employees and 563 locations throughout North America. Watsco has provided funding to the University since the 1990s through its "Watsco's Kids" program, providing children in the community free access to performance arts, sports and other events at the University.

The Watsco Center, located in the heart of the Coral Gables campus, and formerly known as the BankUnited Center, is the largest multi-purpose entertainment facility of its kind south of downtown Miami, with more than 200,000 square feet, 8,000 seats and 25 executive suites. The venue has played host to numerous nationally televised University of Miami men's and women's college basketball games, world-class musicians and performers, community events, and several presidential debates, forums and rallies.

The Canes opened the arena Jan. 4, 2003 with an overtime win over North Carolina. Since then, Miami has won the ACC regular season championship in the building and hosted postseason NIT games. Since its opening, the arena has hosted a number of memorable events and sold-out shows, including Green Day, Coldplay, John Mayer, Drake, The Fray, and Barry Manilow, as well as being the setting for televised events and award shows such as the 2004 Presidential Debates, Unplugged featuring Ricky Martin and Thalia, Premio Lo Nuestro, Premios Juventud, Billboard's Latin Music Awards, and most recently The X Factor. The venue has also welcomed world-renowned figures and politicians, including His Holiness the Dalai Lama, former President Bill Clinton, current President Barack Obama, former Secretary of State Hillary Clinton and Senator John McCain.

STEVE EDWARDS TO BE INDUCTED INTO UMSHOF

University of Miami Sports Hall of Fame has announced its class of 2017 inductees, which includes Steve Edwards, who played basketball at Miami from 1992-96. One of the most prolific long-range shooters in Miami history, Edwards still ranks second in the record books with 265 career 3-point field goals, a mark that is still the BIG EAST Conference record. Edwards, a two-time honoree as "Mr. Basketball" in the state of Florida, was named to the conference all-freshman team in his first year for UMSHoF member Coach Leonard Hamilton. Plagued by injuries his whole career, he still led Miami in scoring in three of his four seasons and ranks 13th all-time with 1,393 points and is 10th in career steals. "Stevie" led the Canes to their first post-season appearance (1994-1995) since the rebirth of the basketball program and back-to-back-winning seasons.

RECRUITING THE STATE OF MIAMI

Coach Jim Larrañaga has put great emphasis on recruiting the "state of Miami." SEBASTIAN THE IBIS



In 1926, the University of Miami adopted the Ibis as the official mascot for the University's athletic teams. Representing the leadership, courage, knowledge, strength and speed characteristics that our student-athletes portray. As the clouds become dark and a hurricane approaches, folklore maintains that other birds look to the Ibis for leadership. The Ibis uses its instinct to detect danger. It is the last sign of wildlife to take shelter before a hurricane hits, giving warning that danger is imminent. As the storm passes the Ibis is the first to reappear, a sign that clear skies are approaching.

LARRAÑAGA AND CAPUTO TOGETHER 15 YEARS

This season head coach Jim Larrañaga and associate head coach Chris Caputo begin their 15th season on sidelines together, dating back to their time at George Mason University. Caputo started on Coach L's staff as the video coordinator for the 2002-03 season, and along the way, the native of Elmhurst, N.Y., was an assistant coach and is now the associate head coach for the Hurricanes. Caputo helped the 2006 GMU team to the NCAA Final Four and has made five total NCAA Tournament appearances with Larrañaga. Both Caputo and Larrañaga attended Archbishop Molloy High School (N.Y.) and played for legendary head coach Jack Curran.

COACHING COORDINATORS FOR MIAMI

Miami's assistant coaching staff is set up in a coordinator system, with Jamal Brunt as the offensive coordinator, Chris Caputo manning the defense and Adam Fisher handling the scout for every opponent. James Johnson is the dean of discipline.

LARRAÑAGA GRADUATES CANES

All four Hurricane seniors graduated from Miami following the 2015-16 campaign. In May 2015 Sheldon McClellan earned his bachelor of liberal arts degree and in December Angel Rodriguez earned his bachelor's of education degree with a major in sports administration and a minor in sociology, the same degree Ivan Cruz Uceda and Tonye Jekiri both completed in May.

Now all four men are playing professional basketball, with McClellan in the NBA and Rodriguez (France), Jekiri (Turkey) and Cruz Uceda (Spain) all overseas.

LARRAÑAGA CONTRACT EXTENDED THROUGH 2022

The University of Miami extended Coach Jim Larrañaga's contract through May 31, 2022, Director of Athletics Blake James announced in September 2014. Larrañaga first signed a five-year contract in April 2011, then was granted a three-year extension in 2012.

HURRICANES MAKE DIVISION I ATHLETICS HISTORY

Miami was the only school in NCAA Division I athletics to have its football team play in a bowl game, men's and women's basketball teams reach the NCAA tournament and baseball team advance to the College World Series during the 2015-16 academic year.

The 2015-16 Hurricanes men's basketball team played its way into the NCAA Tournament's Sweet 16 for the second time in four seasons and just the third time in school history. Miami ended the season ranked No. 10 by the Associated Press and No. 8 in the USA Today Coaches Poll. The Canes were ranked in the polls a school record 18 straight weeks and ranked top-15 for a school record 14 weeks. Miami's 27 wins were the second-most victories in school history, behind 29 in the 2012-13 season. The Hurricanes finished 13-5 in ACC action, tied for second place in the league and posted a perfect 9-0 mark at home in conference play and defeated five ranked teams.

ACC TELECONFERENCE

Miami head coach Jim Larrañaga and the league's 14 other coaches will be featured on a weekly teleconference each Monday during the 2016-17 basketball season from 10:30 a.m. to 1 p.m. Each coach will have 10 minutes to make an opening statement and answer questions. There will be an audio file available of each teleconference on the Conference's official website (theACC.com) each Monday afternoon as well as a written transcript of the call. MIAMI BASKETBALL – THE EARLY YEARS

The University of Miami basketball program was dormant for 14 years from 1971-1985. In 1983 Director of Athletics Sam Jankovich announced the resurrection of men's basketball at Miami, with the reinstatement vote by the UM Board of Trustees on Oct. 12, 1983. Head coach Bill Foster was hired March 21, 1984, adding assistants Clint Bryant, Seth Greenberg and Cesar Odio by July 1. On Oct. 15, 1984 the first men's basketball practice in 12 years was held on the patio in the center of campus, viewed by more than 200 students. Miami defeated The Citadel, 85-77, on Nov. 22, 1985, in the first game of the new era of UM basketball. Tim Harvey was the staff's first recruit, a 6-10, 240-pound center from Plainfield, N.J., who transferred from Georgia Tech.

2015-16 IN REVIEW

2015-16 TEAM HIGHLIGHTS

- First team in Miami history to sell out its home arena for the entire season.
- Third squad in Miami history to play in the Sweet 16.
- 24 regular season wins tied with the 2012-13 season for the most in Miami history.
- 13 wins in ACC play were the second-most in school history, behind 15 in 2012-13.
- Perfect 9-0 at home in ACC play, 15-1 at home overall.
- Defeated five ranked teams: No. 3 Virginia, No. 11 Louisville, No. 16 Utah, No. 22/20 Butler and No. 24/20 Duke, with back-to-back wins over Virginia and Louisville.
- Ranked in the polls a school record 17 straight weeks. Ranked top-15 for a school record 14 weeks.
- Won the Puerto Rico Tip Off, defeating No. 16 Utah, No. 22/20 Butler and Mississippi State by 20.0 points per game. Puerto Rico native Angel Rodriguez was named MVP.
- Won ACC/Big Ten Challenge game at Nebraska, 77-72, in overtime.
- Defeated in-state rival Florida, which was receiving votes at the time.
- Posted 11-1 non-conference regular season record with only loss on a buzzer-beater vs. Northeastern. The Canes were 6-1 at home, 2-0 on the road and 3-0 at neutral sites.
- Coach L named ACC Coach of the Year for second time in four seasons.
- Sheldon McClellan named to the USBWA All-District Team and Coach Larrañaga recognized as District IV Coach of the Year.
- Three players - Sheldon McClellan, Tonye Jekiri and Angel Rodriguez - named All-ACC, while Jekiri was on the ACC Defensive Team. Davon Reed was on the All-ACC Academic Team.
- Sheldon McClellan named to the 2016 ACC All-Tournament Second Team.

MIAMI POSTS THIRD 25-WIN SEASON

Coach Jim Larrañaga posted his third 25-win season and fourth 20-win season in five years at The U. This was also his fifth-career 25-win season and 10th-career 20-win campaign. Larrañaga is just the second coach in Miami history with four 20-win seasons, joining Bruce Hale (1954-67), and is the only Miami coach with a 25-win year.

This was Miami's third 25-win campaign (all under Coach L) and seventh 20-win season since joining the ACC for the 2004-05 campaign.

13+ ACC WINS FOR THE SECOND TIME UNDER COACH L

Miami won 13 games in ACC play for just the second time in school history, along with 15 wins in 2012-13. In five seasons under Larrañaga, the Canes have won seven-or-more ACC games each season. Prior to the arrival of Coach L, Miami had never won 10 ACC games in a season.

TIED FOR MOST REGULAR-SEASON WINS

Miami was 24-5 in the regular season, tied with the 24-6 record in 2012-13 for the most regular-season wins in Hurricanes history. In Larrañaga's five seasons, the Canes have the following records in the regular season: 2015-16: 24-5; 2014-15: 20-11; 2013-14: 16-15; 2012-13: 24-6; 2011-12: 18-11.

BEST FG SHOOTING PERCENTAGE IN 27 YEARS

The Canes made 47.9 percent (907-1895) from the field, the best in Miami's history since the 1988-89 season when UM hit 49.2 percent (1024-2083) of its shots.

Miami's 74.9 percent clip (578-772) at the line was the best since 77.1 percent (523-678) in 2001-02.

THE HURRICANES IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

The Canes were a No. 3 seed for the first time in UM history. Miami's highest seed was No. 2, in 2013 and 1999.

The Canes played in the NCAA Tournament for the eighth time.

Miami is 8-8 in NCAA Tournament play.

Miami played in its third Sweet 16, has played in the second round five times and played just one game three times.

Under head coach Jim Larrañaga, Miami is 4-2 in the NCAA Tournament in just four seasons. The Hurricanes were 4-6 in their first six appearances.

UM has won at least one game in the NCAA Tournament in five of eight appearances, including three straight and in five of the last six.

UM has won five of its last eight games in the NCAA Tournament after going 2-1 in 2013 and 1-1 in 2008.

Five different coaches have led Miami to its eight NCAA appearances. Leonard Hamilton (3: 1998-00) and Jim Larrañaga (2: 2013, 2016) are the only coaches to lead the Canes to multiple NCAA berths.

Miami and Texas A&M were the only two schools among top-three seeds who did not play in the NCAA Tournament in 2014-15.

MIAMI CONTINUES TO EXCEED EXPECTATIONS

Miami was a 3-seed in the 2016 NCAA Tournament, one of five teams among the 12 top three-seeds that was not ranked in the AP preseason poll.

ALL-ACC AWARDS FOR THE HURRICANES

Coach Jim Larrañaga was named the ACC Coach of the Year for the second time in four seasons, while three players earned postseason honors. Coach Jim Larrañaga - Coach of the Year (ACSMA/Coaches); Tonye Jekiri - All-Defensive Team (ACSMA/Coaches); Sheldon McClellan - Second Team All-ACC (ACSMA/Coaches); Angel Rodriguez - Third Team All-ACC (ACSMA); Tonye Jekiri - Honorable Mention (ACSMA/Coaches). Since joining the league in 2004-05, Miami has had 34 honorees on ACC postseason award lists, 21 of whom have come under Coach L's watch, including five of Miami's six All-Defensive Team players. Jekiri is the only Hurricane to be named to that team twice.

McCLELLAN 11TH-MOST EFFICIENT PLAYER IN THE NATION, 180 PLAYER

Sheldon McClellan was the 11th-most efficient offensive player in the nation among players with 20 percent-or-more possessions used, according to KenPom.com. He was also the third most efficient player in the ACC overall, and No. 30 in the nation. McClellan was 17th in the ACC (league games only) in 2-point field goal percentage (54.6), ninth in true shooting percentage (60.7) and 10th in free throw percentage (83.5). He was fourth in the ACC in turnover rate (9.6).

McClellan also hit 56.7 percent from two, 38.9 percent from three and 83.8 percent at the line, adding up to 179.4, nearly the mark of an 180 player.

JEKIRI EARNS MOST WINS IN PROGRAM HISTORY

In four seasons at Miami, Tonye Jekiri won 96 games, the most of any Hurricane in school history. Jekiri was the only remaining player from the 2012-13 ACC Championship and NCAA Sweet 16 team. That season, Jekiri did not play in a pair of games, playing in just 27 wins individually. He played in every victory since, with 17 as a sophomore, 25 as a junior and 27 as a senior.

NEWTON BEST SIXTH MAN IN THE COUNTRY

Dick Vitale lauded Miami sophomore Ja'Quan Newton as the "best sixth man in the country." Newton immensely improved his stats from his freshman year, and scored in double digits 21 times last season.

In the 10 ACC victories Newton played in (not vs. VT twice, Louisville and Notre Dame), he averaged 11.4 points and 2.3 assists per game, hitting 50.6 percent from the field. In the Canes' four losses he played in, he put up 6.8 points and 1.3 assists per outing, knocking down 26.5 percent of his shots.

REED NAMED TO ALL-ACC ACADEMIC TEAM

Davon Reed was named to the 2015-16 All-Atlantic Coast Conference Academic Men's Basketball team. The junior from Ewing, N.J., is majoring in sports administration.

HOOPS TEAMS COMBINE FOR HISTORIC SEASON

The 2015-16 season was the top combined year ever between Miami's men's and women's basketball programs. Together, they went 51-17, setting a school record for combined victories and winning percentage (.750). Additionally, it was the third time, joining 1997-98 and 2012-13, both teams reached the NCAA Tournament in the same season. Miami was one of 10 schools in the nation to have its men's team and women's team conclude the 2015-16 season ranked in the *USA TODAY* Coaches Poll, as they checked in at No. 8 and No. 24, respectively.

JIM LARRAÑAGA

Head Coach, Sixth Season
Providence, 1971

In his five seasons at The U, Coach Jim Larrañaga has led the Hurricanes to a pair of NCAA Sweet 16 appearances and won the 2013 ACC regular season and ACC Tournament titles. He has been named the AP, Naismith, USBWA and Henry Iba National Coach of the Year, twice was both the ACC and USBWA District Coach of the Year and was the 2013 NABC District Coach of the Year.

Larrañaga has posted three 25-win seasons at UM – the only Miami coach to do so – and five in his career. He also has recorded four 20-win campaigns at The U and 10 in his career. In conference action, the Canes have won nine-or-more league games in four-of-five seasons, while prior to the arrival of Coach L, Miami had never won more than eight ACC games in a season. Larrañaga has helped the Canes to 16 postseason victories, including four in the NCAA Tournament (two appearances), seven in the ACC Tournament (five) and five in the NIT (two).

Miami's 35 road wins in the past five seasons are the most among league teams, and in that time, the Canes are fourth in the conference in wins (54), and in both ACC home (31) and road (23) victories. In the five years prior to Coach L's arrival, when the ACC had only 12 teams, Miami was tied for 10th in ACC victories (29), and won just seven ACC road games.

In 2012-13, the Bronx, N.Y., native helped Miami to a No. 2 national ranking by both the AP and USA TODAY, and a No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament. He is the 10th coach in the last 10 years to lead two top-10 programs, as Miami was No. 2 on Feb. 18, 2013, and George Mason was No. 8 in the final top 25 poll in 2006.

Larrañaga came to Miami after serving as the head coach at George Mason for 14 seasons. He guided that program to five NCAA Tournament appearances (2011, 2008, 2006, 2001, 1999) - including an unprecedented run to the 2006 Final Four that captured the nation's attention, defeating Michigan State, North Carolina, Wichita State and UConn along the way. Following that run, he was selected the 2006 Clair Bee National Coach of the Year.

Larrañaga built the GMU Patriots' program into a perennial contender in the highly-regarded Colonial Athletic Association, winning more games than any other coach in program and conference history (273) en route to three conference titles (2008, 2001, 1999).

In 2006, Larrañaga became the first coach at a mid-major school to take his team to the Final Four in 27 years and earned an at-large berth for a CAA team for the first time in 20 years. Along the way, he led Mason to a school record in wins, the school's first-ever national ranking, George Mason's first-ever appearance in the top 10 and the school's first wins over top 10 teams.

Larrañaga previously served as the head coach at Bowling Green for 11 seasons (1986-1997) and at Division II American International for two seasons (1977-79). His first coaching opportunity came at Davidson College, where he served as an assistant coach to Terry Holland, then reunited with Holland as an assistant at Virginia from 1979-86. In 1976, he spent one season as player-coach for the Geronemo Basketball Club in Belgium.

A 1971 graduate of Providence College with a degree in economics, Larrañaga was a four-year letterman for the Friars. He graduated as the school's fifth all-time leading scorer with 1,258 points and was selected in the sixth round of the NBA Draft by the Detroit Pistons. He was inducted into the Providence College Hall of Fame in 1991.

Larrañaga, 67, and his wife, Liz, have two sons, Jay and John, and four grandchildren, Tia, James, Jon Temple and Henry. Jay played for his father at Bowling Green, was the head coach of the NBDL's Erie Bayhawks and his now an assistant coach with the Boston Celtics. Jon was a member of his father's George Mason teams from 1999-2003, earning First Team Academic All-American honors for NCAA Division I-AAA schools.
