NEWS & NOTES

THE WINDY CITY

Miami has only played in Chicago once before in program history, posting a 77-50 win over Loyola Chicago on November 21, 2015. The Canes did play at Northwestern, which is located just north of Chicago in Evanston, Illinois in 2000 and were tagged with a 56-48 loss.

#QUEENBEA FOR THREE

Redshirt senior Beatrice Mompremier has added another element to her game this season: the ability to consistently knock down threes. Mompremier is currently shooting .800 (4-of-5) from 3-point range this season. She ranks third on the Canes in made threes so far this year, which is even more impressive considering her typical playing position in the paint.

The Canes have played aggressive basketball so far this season, turning up the defensive heat on their opponents. Miami currently ranks 23rd in the nation in steals per game (12.3) and 59th in the nation in forced turnovers (21.0). Those marks for steals per game and forced turnovers are good for first and second in the ACC, respectively. Junior Endia Banks recorded five steals against IUPUI, the most by a Miami player since Laura Cornelius posted six against Nebraska (11/23/18).

HIT THE ROAD, JACK

The Hurricanes are headed to Chicago for their first, and only, road trip of the non-conference slate. Miami posted a 6-5 record in true road games last season, and an 8-6 mark in games away from the Watsco Center (road and neutral site). In non-conference action, the Canes were 3-3 when playing outside of Coral Gables.

MAKIN' MOVES

The Canes are up to No. 16 in the Associated Press Top 25 and No. 17 in the USA Today Coaches Poll this week. This is the highest that Miami has been ranked in the polls this early in the season since the 2016-17 campaign when the Canes opened the season in the No. 14 spot.

Miami will face North Carolina A&T in a first-round matchup on Friday, November 22 at 1:30 p.m. (CT). The winner of the game will meet either Arkansas State or No. 19/20 De-Paul on Saturday in the Championship game. Fans can listen to the game on WVUM 90.5.

 Miami and NC A&T have met twice in program history with both meetings occurring in the last 15 years. The Canes hold the 2-0 advantage over the Aggies, posting victories in the two games, both of which took place in Coral Gables. The last meeting between the two teams came on March 25, 2010, a 84-77 win for Miami in the Sweet Sixteen of the WNIT.

last time out

- The University of Miami women's basketball team secured its third win of the season on Sunday, defeating the IUPUI Jaguars 74-65 at the Watsco Center. Junior guard Endia Banks set a new career-high with 23 points in the contest.
- The upperclassmen were a vital part of the win for Miami, accounting for 71 of the Canes' 74 points on Sunday. Banks tallied five steals and three rebounds to go along with her 23 points and four assists in the contest, while redshirt senior Beatrice Mompremier recorded her second double-double of the season with 20 points and 11 rebounds.
- Ultimately the game came down to defense and getting to the free throw line. Miami outrebounded IUPUI 32-26, in addition to forcing 23 turnovers in the game. The Canes capitalized on the IUPUI mistakes, totaling 33 points off turnovers. Miami drew 24 fouls in the contest and made its trips to the charity stripe count, hitting 19-of-22 shots.

scouting the aggies

- The Aggies sit at 2-2 in 2019-20, most recently tallying an 80-69 victory over East Tennessee State on November 18. Both losses for NC A&T have come against Power Five opponents, an 80-44 setback to NC State and a 72-54 loss to Georgia.
- As a team, the Aggies are averaging 74.8 points per game. Deja Winters is leading NC A&T in both points (17.7) and rebounds (6.3), while Cinia McCray is the only other Aggie averaging double-figures this season (10.0).
- The Aggies have been particularly dominant in their wins, recording a scoring margin of 35.5 in their two victories. NC A&T is shooting .486 in their two wins, compared to a .401 mark overall.

#QueenBea

- Beatrice Mompremier returns for her redshirt senior season in 2019-20. Ahead of the season, Mompremier was named not only the 2019 ACC Preseason Player of the Year, but also an Associated Press All-American. She is just the second Hurricane in program history to earn both honors, following in the footsteps of Miami great Shenise Johnson, who received the honor as a senior in 2011-12.

Endia Banks

knock 'em down

- Through three games, the Hurricanes are shooting 48 percent from the field, which ranks 24th in the nation (third in the ACC) for field goal percentage. Four Canes are shooting above .500 this season (min. five attempts) led by freshman Brianna Jackson (.800, 4-of-5).
- The Canes are shooting .391 from 3-point range this season with junior Kelsey Marshall pacing Miami in threes made at 10. Miami knocked down 9-plus threes in back-to-back games for the first time since Dec. 2018 in the first two contests.

sweet home chicago

- The Miami women's basketball team has several connections to Chicago, most notably that it's the home of redshirt sophomore Destiny Harden. Harden attended Morgan Park High School and earned Chicago Tribune Second Team All-State and USA TODAY All-USA Illinois Second Team honors in 2017.
- For head coach Katie Meier, the trip to Chicago is a homecoming of sorts as Meier grew up just outside Chicago in the western suburb of Wheaton, Illinois. Meier's biological father, who passed away before she was born, played basketball at DePaul under legendary coach Ray Meyer.

november nuggets

- Since the beginning of the 1979-80 season, Miami has historically been successful in November games. The Hurricanes boast a .719 win-percentage in November games with a 115-45 record.
- In Meier's 15 years with the Canes, Miami holds a 74-19 record (.796) in games in November. The Hurricanes have posted two undefeated Novembers since Meier took the reins of the program going 7-0 in 2009 and again in 2015.

maggie dixon classic

- The Maggie Dixon Classic is named after the 2005-06 head coach of the Army West Point Black Knights, Maggie Dixon. In her first and only year with the team, Dixon led the Black Knights to their first ever NCAA Tournament appearance. Prior to coaching at Army, Dixon was an assistant coach at DePaul under Doug Bruno.
- The day after the NCAA Championship in 2006, Dixon collapsed, and ultimately passed away, from an arrythmia from an undiagnosed heart condition. The Classic was created to honor Dixon and her incredible success and dedication to the game.

tournament fur

- Since Katie Meier took over the reins of the Hurricanes in 2005, Miami has played in six non-conference tournaments. The Canes hold an 8-4 overall record in those tournament games and has claimed two tournament championships: Puerto Rico Classic Champions and the Florida Sunshine Classic Champions.
- This will be the sixth year in a row that Miami has participated in a tournament away from home. The Canes' last loss in a non-con road tournament came on 11/11/16 to No. 19/19 Kentucky (68-62).

#tough20

- Head coach Katie Meier signed three 2020 prospects to NLIs on Wednesday:
- Nyayongah Gony: A 6-foot, 3-inch forward from Lincoln, Nebraska, Gony is ranked as the No. 56 overall player in the class of 2020 by espnW HoopGurlz. The forward comes in at No. 13 among forwards in the 2020 class and is considered the top recruit in the state of Nebraska.
- Paula Fraile Ruiz: Standing tall at 6-feet, 4-inches, Fraile Ruiz has a wealth of international experience, most recently competing at the FIBA U18 Women's European Championship – Division B in Sarajevo, Bosnia.
- Naomi Mbandu: Mbandu is currently playing at Gulf Coast State College and is considered the No. 2 junior college prospect in the nation by ASGR Basketball. A native of Tobes, France, Mbandu represented her country at the 2019 FIBA U20 Women's European Championship.

USA basketball

- USA Basketball was full of the Canes this summer as Beatrice Mompremier represented Miami at the Pan American Games in Lima, Peru. Mompremier was one of 12 players on the U.S. team and the only ACC representative.
- The U.S. took home the silver medal from Lima after posting a 4-1 record during the competition, falling to Brazil in the gold medal game, 79-73. Mompremier started all five games, averaging 12.2 points and 7.6 rebounds across the five outings.
- Mompremier and junior Mykea Gray also had the opportunity to train with USA Basketball during their training camp in Coral Gables ahead of the AmeriCup in Puerto Rico. Training camp attendees included Sue Bird, Diana Taurasi and Tina Charles.

Brianna Jackson's father played semi-pro basketball while Sydnee Roby's mother played collegiate ball at Grambling State and Howard University. Roby's mom, Essie Washington, also played professional basketball for the Virginia Wave of the WABA.
- Cousins: Sydnee Roby's cousin, Ericka Haney, started on Notre Dame's 2001 national championship team.

- The Canes spent 10 days abroad this summer, visiting cities all across Italy. Miami played a trio of games while in Italy, posting a 2-1 record against foreign opponents.
- The Hurricanes began their trip in Rome before venturing north to Florence and then over to Venice. The trip was a mix of basketball and sightseeing for the Canes.

Katie Meier completed her 14th season at the helm of the Hurricanes' women's basketball program in 2018-19. A well-known and respected figure in women's basketball with 18 years of head coaching experience, Meier has worked tirelessly to put her mark on Miami's program and to build a winning tradition.

In 2018-19, Meier guided her team to a 10th consecutive postseason appearance, including an eighth trip to the NCAA Tournament in the last nine years and fifth straight NCAA Tournament bid. Miami also reached 20-plus wins for the ninth time in 10 years and double-digit ACC victories for the seventh time in nine years.

Through the 2017-18 campaign, Meier has a career record of 353-217, including a 277-172 mark at Miami.

Honors and Accolades

Meier has been recognized for her coaching success numerous times throughout her career. From being named a co-recipient of the 2013 USA Basketball National Coach of the Year award following a 9-0 record and gold medal at the 2013 FIBA U19 World Championship, to being inducted into the University of Miami Sports Hall of Fame in 2017, Meier's name has become synonymous with elite basketball.

One of the most prestigious honors bestowed on Meier came at the conclusion of the 2010-11 season when she was named the Associated Press National Coach of the Year - sharing the award with Connecticut's Geno Auriemma and Stanford's Tara VanDerveer. That season, Meier led the Hurricanes into the NCAA tournament for the first time since 2004 and coached the Canes to their first NCAA Tournament win since 1993.

The Canes entered the 2010-11 season with high internal expectations, but were picked eighth in the Preseason ACC Poll. Miami exceeded all outside expectations posting a perfect 20-0 record inside BankUnited Center and finished conference play with a 12-2 record, earning their first regular season conference title since joining the league in 2004. As a result, Meier was named the ACC Coach of the Year and later would be selected as the WBCA/RUSSELL ATHLETIC Region 2 Coach of the Year, as voted on by her peers.

During the 2011-12 season, Meier coached the Canes to their highest ranking in program history at No. 5. Miami went undefeated at home for the second consecutive season, pushing the home win streak to 40 games.

Five people who have been assistants for Meier during her head coaching career have gone on to earn Division I head coaching positions: Lynn Bria (Stetson), Amanda Butler (Florida and Clemson), Darrick Gibbs (North Florida), Carolyn Kieger (Marquette) and Stephanie McCormick (Western Carolina). Additionally, 22 of Meier's players at Miami have gone on to play professionally after their college careers.

Hired April 19, 2005, Meier was appointed by then-Miami AD Paul Dee in front of national and local media, fans, alumni and support staff, signifying the beginning of a new era.

Following an unprecedented career as one of the greatest athletes to ever play in the Atlantic Coast Conference, Meier quickly established herself in the coaching ranks. Following an impressive four-year tenure as the head coach at Charlotte where she helped

bring the 49er program into national prominence, Meier made it clear that her goal was to make Miami one of the premier women's basketball programs in the country.

Creating a Winning Program

In her first season, Meier wasted little time in making the first steps towards those goals. After receiving little attention in the ACC preseason polls, the Hurricanes posted an impressive overall record of 17-13. Under Meier, Miami earned a berth into the second round of the 2006 Women's National Invitation Tournament and standout Tamara James produced one of the greatest seasons ever seen by a UM player, becoming Miami's all-time leading scorer. James was selected with the eighth overall pick in the 2006 WNBA Draft by the Washington Mystics.

Over the next two years, the Hurricanes continued to develop under Meier's direction. Miami's Renee Taylor emerged as the ACC's leading scorer in 2006-07, while Maurita Reid finished the 2007-08 campaign with 110 steals, good for second in the ACC and fifth in the NCAA.

With the No. 21-ranked incoming recruiting class, Meier and the Hurricanes saw significant improvement during the 2008-09 season. The freshman class was highlighted by McDonald's All-American Shenise Johnson of Henrietta, N.Y., and Riguna Williams from nearby Pahokee, Fla. Under Meier's guidance, Johnson was named the ACC Rookie of the Week on three occasions and was named to the ACC All-Freshmen team as well as ACC Honorable Mention. The

versatile guard/forward also led the U19 USA team to a gold medal finish in the 2009 World Championships in Bangkok, Thailand. The 2009-10 season was one of the most successful in program history. Under Meier's vision, the Hurricanes advanced to the WNIT Championship game. Miami posted a 22-14 overall record - the first 20-win campaign since the 2002-03 season and just the eighth all-time in history. In her sophomore season, Johnson was named first team



Following the success of the 2009-10 campaign, Meier signed a contract extension through 2015 and the Hurricanes continued their rise in the ACC. Miami earned a conference regular season title in 2010-11 and returned to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in seven seasons. Johnson was named to four different All-America squads and became the second player in program history to be named the conference player of the year (Frances Savage - BIG EAST - 1992). Williams, along with Johnson, was named First Team All-ACC and was the conference scoring leader, posting 21.7 points per game.

Miami's dominance continued into the 2011-12 season. The Canes finished second in the conference standings with a record of 14-2 and were 26-6 overall, earning a No. 3 seed in the NCAA Tournament. UM also defeated the eventual conference tournament champion, Maryland, both times they played in the regular season.

Seniors Shenise Johnson and Riquna Williams continued to shine in the ACC as the duo were second and third in the league in scoring and each were again named First Team All-ACC. Johnson was also named to the All-ACC Defensive Team for the third consecutive season and earned a place on five different All-America teams, including the WBCA squad for the second straight year. Williams earned AP All-America third team recognition in her final collegiate campaign as well.

The Hurricanes went to a school record third straight NCAA Tournament in 2012-13, earning a No. 8 seed. Meier's Hurricanes defeated two top-10 opponents during the season, besting No. 6/7 Penn State and knocking off No. 5/4 Duke on senior day, marking the first win over a team in the top four of either poll in program history and the school's first win over the Blue Devils, who went 20-1 against ACC opponents that season, including winning the ACC Tournament.

After reaching the WNIT in 2014, Meier	guided the Hurricanes back to the NCAA
--	--

Tournament in 2015 and the 11th-seeded Hurricanes defeated No. 6 seed Washington in the first round, before dropping their second round matchup against third-seeded lowa, the host school.

Earlier in the 2014-15 season, Meier also led the Hurricanes to the program's first win over a team in the top four of the AP Poll. They defeated No. 4/4 Notre Dame, 78-63, the Fighting Irish's only loss in their first two years in the ACC. Sophomore guard Adrienne Motley went on to be named a consensus First Team All-ACC pick after averaging 16.9 points on 49.2 percent shooting. Meier also earned her 250th career win during the season.

In 2015-16, Meier led Miami to a 24-9 record to tie for the fifth-most wins in a season in program history. Miami received a No. 5 seed the NCAA Tournament and made its fifth appearance in the field in the past six years. The 2015-16 campaign also saw the Hurricanes beat both Duke and North Carolina in the same year for the first time. The victory at North Carolina was good for the 200th of Meier's tenure at Miami. Adrienne Motley was also tabbed as a consensus First Team All-ACC honoree for the second straight year, in addition to garnering WBCA All-America Team Honorable Mention recognition.

In 2016-17, Meier guided the Hurricanes to a second straight 24-9 record. In the quarterfinals of the ACC Tournament, Miami again defeated a Florida State team ranked in the top 10, downing the No. 8/12 Seminoles, 56-54, to earn back-to-back semifinal appearances for the first time. The Hurricanes beat four top-25 teams, defeating three ranked teams – two of which were in the top 10 – away from home for the first time in the ACC era. Miami earned a No. 4 seed in the NCAA Tournament, hosting the first two rounds of play, and reached the second round for the fourth time in seven years.

Adrienne Motley and Jessica Thomas were both Second Team All-ACC picks in 2016-17, with Motley becoming Miami's fifth WNBA Draft pick. In addition, Motley, Thomas and Keyona Hayes formed the second Miami teammate trio to all reach 1,000 points and each signed a WNBA contract, the first time three Hurricanes in the same class did so.

Despite losing many talented players to graduation and injuries, Meier led the Hurricanes to a 21-11 finish in 2017-18 and surpassed 250 wins in her tenure with the program. Erykah Davenport, a Second Team All-ACC honoree, and Keyanna Harris became the first Miami seniors to make four straight NCAA Tournaments. Miami had two freshman all-league honorees for the first time since 1992-93 in the BIG EAST, as Mykea Gray and Kelsey Marshall both made the cut.

Establishing Her Legacy as a Player

Meier's success as a coach is a direct reflection of her playing career as a standout at Duke University. A four-year letter winner for the Blue Devils under head coach Debbie Leonard from 1986-90, Meier's name is scattered throughout the Duke record books.

She currently ranks among the school's all-time career leaders in scoring average (16.2 points per game), steals (232), free throws made (447) and free throws attempted (624). She is also listed among Duke's leaders in career points (1,761), field goals made (653), field goals attempted (1,283), assists (409) and rebounding average (6.1 rebounds per game).

Meier wasted no time making her mark at Duke, earning ACC Rookie of the Year and Basketball Yearbook Freshman All-America honors in 1986. Meier injured her knee in 1988 during her junior season and ultimately missed the entire 1988-89 campaign while recovering.

Meier returned to Duke for her senior season in 1990 without missing a beat, earning Kodak/WBCA District 2 All-America and All-ACC first team accolades while being named the Blue Devils' most valuable player.

In 2002, Meier was honored by Duke for her efforts as a player when she was named to the inaugural induction class in the Blue Devils' Hall of Honor. That same year, Meier was named to the ACC's 50th Anniversary Team. In 2006, she was once again honored by the conference when she was named an ACC Legend at the 2006 ACC Women's Basketball Tournament.

Meier's success on the court was only outdone by her accomplishments in the classroom. She was named to the Dean's List from 1986-88. In 1988 she also earned GTE Academic All-America Second Team honors.

After receiving a bachelor's degree in English literature with cum laude honors in 1989, Meier went on to earn a master's degree in teaching English from Duke in 1990. Following her career at Duke, Meier moved overseas to play three seasons with BBC Mini-Flat Waregem in Belgium from 1990-93. There, she helped lead her team to three First Division regular season titles and one Belgian Cup Championship. While in Belgium, Meier also spent time teaching classes of conversational English while coaching teams of 15- to 17-year-olds.

A native of Wheaton, Ill., Meier graduated from Wheaton Central High School in 1985 and in October 2009 was inducted into her high school's athletic hall of fame.


