#### **MIDWEEK STORY LINES**

- After a midweek matchup with Bethune-Cookman, No. 24 Miami hits the road for a conference series against Virginia Tech. The Hurricanes captured the series against the then-No. 22 Hokies at Mark Light Field last season.
- Miami leads the all-time series over the Hokies by a 20.7 margin, including two of three games in Coral Gables in 2013.
- Miami enters the matchup riding momentum from a five-game winning streak, including a road sweep of then-No. 25 NC State last weekend. Miami returned to the Collegiate Baseball poll at No. 24 in the newest rankings released Monday.
- Head coach Jim Morris won his 900th game as Hurricanes skipper in the team's series opening victory over No. 3 Virginia (March 22). He also won his 1,400th game as Division I coach during Miami's sweep of Boston College (March 8).
- The Hurricanes have not lost a game started by junior lefthander Chris Diaz dating back to May 24, 2013 a stretch of eight consecutive starts, including his first seven of the 2014 season. Diaz is 5-0 with a 2.27 ERA this spring.
- After struggling to hit for power in 2013, Miami ranks second in the ACC with 17 home runs. Zack Collins ranks second with six homers, Dale Carey has five (third in ACC), and Tyler Palmer & Garrett Kennedy each have two.
- After undergoing successful surgery to address swelling in his right arm, sophomore David Thompson did not participate in this past weekend's series against NC State. A timetable for Thompson's return to the lineup is uncertain.

#### JIM MORRIS HEAD COACH

#### THE HURRICANES SKIPPER

In his 21st season at Miami, few programs have qualified for the College World Series as much as Jim Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament an NCAA-record 41 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 20 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006.

Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 905-357-3 (.717) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,409-624-4 (.693) Division I record in 32 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 36 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,540-664-4 (.698) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 20 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium project.

#### MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

Jim Morris earned his 29th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2013 when he guided the Canes to a No. 2 seed in the Louisville [Ky.] Regional. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 20 seasons (1994-2013), winning 15 of those appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.

Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris led the 2013 Hurricanes to their 41st-straight NCAA Tournament. Despite six signees being drafted in the 2013 MLB Draft, the Hurricanes reeled in a top 5 recruiting class by national publications.

#### MORRIS IN 36th SEASON AS HEAD COACH

Morris entered 2014 as the fifth-winningest active coach in Division I baseball with 1,391 wins. His impressive win total ranks him No. 12 all-time for any coach, regardless of division. Including his time at DeKalb C.C., Morris won his 1,500th game as a head coach in Miami's 4-1 upset of No. 1 North Carolina on March 15, 2013 in Chapel Hill, N.C.

Morris reached two coaching milestones in the first half of the 2014 season. He became just the eighth Division I coach to reach 1,400 wins in a 5-2 win over Boston College on March 8, and won his 900th game at Miami in a 7-1 upset of No. 3 Virginia on March 22.

Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later, he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern in March 2001



#### **MAJOR LEAGUE GUIDANCE**

Over 150 professional baseball players have played under Morris during their college careers at Miami, Georgia Tech and DeKalb.

Among the players Morris coached at Miami that went on to play in the Major Leagues were Yonder Alonso (San Diego), Ryan Braun (Milwaukee), Pat Burrell (Tampa Bay), Alex Cora (New York Mets), Yasmani Grandal (San Diego), Bobby Hill (San Diego), Aubrey Huff (Detroit), Ryan Jackson (St. Louis), Chris Perez (Cleveland), Cesar Carrillo (San Diego), Brian Barton (St. Louis), Eddy Rodriguez (San Diego), Gaby Sanchez (Florida), Blake Tekotte (Chicago White Sox), Charlton Jimerson (Houston), Jay Tessmer (New York Yankees), Danny Valencia (Minnesota Twins), Jon Jay (St. Louis), Danny Graves (Cincinnati) and Jason Michaels (Houston).

Standout players under Morris from his days at Georgia Tech were Nomar Garciaparra (Los Angeles Dodgers), Jay Payton (Oakland A's) and Jason Varitek (Boston Red Sox).

Morris has also enjoyed success on the International scene. From 1989-90, Morris served as head coach of the USA Baseball team that won a Silver Medal in the 1989 Presidential Cup (Taiwan), Bronze Medal at the Goodwill Games and the 1990 International Baseball Association (IBA) World All-Star Game in Atlanta. At the Goodwill Games, his USA squad won two of three games against Cuba, marking the first time in history a senior-level team won a series with Cuba. In 1987, Morris served as pitching coach under Ron Fraser at the Pan American Games (Silver Medal).

- After stretching its winning streak to five with a victory over Bethune-Cookman, #24 Miami travels to Blacksburg, Va., for an ACC series against Virginia Tech at English Field.
- Miami earned its first three-game ACC road sweep since March 2011 by capturing all three matchups against No. 25 NC State last weekend at Doak Field in Raleigh, N.C. The Hurricanes won the first two games by a score of 2-1, and captured the finale 12-5.
- Miami holds a commanding 20-7 all-time advantage over the Hokies, including a 10-5 all-time record on the road. The Hurricanes took two of three from then-No. 24 Virginia Tech in 2013, capturing the first two games of the series at Mark Light Field.

#### **MILESTONES FOR MORRIS...**

- Head coach Jim Morris became just the eighth coach in the history of Division I baseball to accumulate 1,400 wins when Miami beat Boston College 5-2 on March 8.
- Two weeks later, **Morris won his 900th game** with the Hurricanes in a 7-1 upset of No. 3 Virginia on March 22. Morris ranks second in wins in Miami history **behind the late Ron Fraser (1,267)**.
- Morris ranks fourth among active Division I coaches in career victories (1,409) and eighth all-time in the category. He is also the second-winningest coach in ACC history.

#### **POWER SURGE...**

- Miami ranks 2nd in the ACC with 17 home runs through the first 30 games of the regular season. Zack Collins ranks second in the ACC with six home runs, while Dale Carey is tied for fourth in the conference with five.
- The offense already has **four multi-homerun games** this season (after recording **just two in all of 2013**): games one and two against **Florida** (Feb. 21 & 22), game one against **Georgia Tech** (March 14) and game three against **NC State** (March 30). **Miami is 4-0** when hitting **more than one home run**.
- Zack Collins recorded the first multi-home run game for the Hurricanes since Peter O'Brien accomplished the feat in 2012 in Miami's 12-5 win over NC State (March 30). He drove in six runs in the win.
- The Hurricane offense exploded for six home runs in its series with Florida (Feb. 21-23), the most for a Miami team in a single series since an April 2010 weekend set at Virginia Tech.

#### **DIAZ DOMINATING...**

- Junior LHP Chris Diaz picked up his third win over a ranked opponent this season in a 7-1 victory over No. 3 Virginia (March 22).
   Diaz has earned a win in five of his seven starts and is tied for first in the ACC with five wins. He ranks 14th in the ACC with a 2.27 ERA.
- Diaz, who ranked second in the ACC in ERA in 2013 (1.64), did not pick up his fifth win of the 2013 season until May 10 against Wake Forest. He finished 2013 with a 7-5 record.
- The Hurricanes have won every single one of Diaz' starts in 2014, including victories over then-No. 23 Florida (2/14), No. 1 FSU (2/28), No. 3 Virginia (3/22) and No. 25 NC State (3/28). Miami has not lost a game started by Diaz since the 2013 ACC Tournament in a



#### **WEEKEND NEWS & NOTES**

#### **HEATING UP...**

- After struggling through the first month of the season, freshman slugger Zack Collins has turned it up a notch. Collins is hitting at a .378 clip over his past 10 games with four doubles, four homers and 14 RBI. He has 11 RBI over the last five games.
- Also picking up the pace are junior catcher Garrett Kennedy who is hitting .294 over the last five games - and freshman Johnny Ruiz, batting .316 over his last five. Ruiz recorded his career-first three-hit game in the team's 4-0 shutout of FGCU (March 26).
- Over his last four starts, redshirt sophomore **Andrew Suarez** has allowed four earned runs in 30.2 innings (1.17 ERA). He went 9.0 innings against Georgia Tech (March 15) - earning a nodecision - and went 8.0 innings in a win over NC State (March 29).
- Freshman Willie Abreu is hitting an impressive .375 in ACC play, and drove in a career-high three runs in the series finale with No. 3 Virginia (March 24). His triple-slash line over the last five games is .571/.714/.643.

#### SHUT THEM DOWN...

- Miami's bullpen has not allowed a run since the series finale against Virginia on March 24 - a stretch of 16.2 consecutive innings across five games.
- Among the key contributors during that stretch are Cooper Hammond (3.0 innings, one save), Thomas Woodrey (5.2 innings) and Bryan Garcia (3.0 innings, one save).

#### FRESHMEN PHENOMS...

- Five freshmen were in head coach Jim Morris' lineup against Bethune-Cookman on Wednesday: Zack Collins (catcher), Willie Abreu (right field), Johnny Ruiz (third base), Sebastian Diaz (designated hitter) and Derik Beauprez (starting pitcher).
- The five field players combined for three hits, eight walks and five RBI, while Beauprez allowed one run in 4.0 innings. An Abreu RBI single proved to be the game-winner.
- Freshman closer Bryan Garcia is tied for second in the ACC with seven saves this season.
- Ruiz has started the past 10 games at third base, while Collins has made 10 consecutive starts between catcher and designated hitter. Abreu leads all freshmen with 28 starts this season.

#### SIMPLY PERFECT...

- Senior RHP Javi Salas hurled just the second perfect game in program history and the 23rd in modern NCAA Division I history (since 1957) in a 17-0 shutout of Villanova on March 4.
- · Salas needed just 113 pitches to get through his outing, scattering six strikeouts across his night of perfection. His perfect game was the first for a Miami pitcher since Kevin Sheary accomplished the feat on March 4, 1987.
- Miami's two perfect games are tied with Auburn and lowa for the second- most of any program all-time behind Washington State's three. Salas' perfect game was the first for any Division I pitcher since Will Roberts (Virginia) in 2011.
