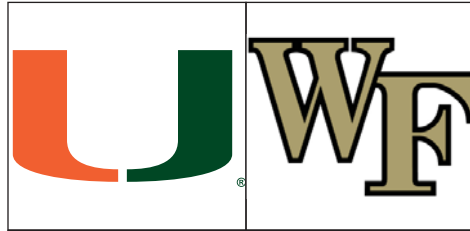

**Miami Travels to Wake Forest for ACC Road Contest...**

The University of Miami is traveling to its first ACC road opponent this weekend with a 9-8 overall record (3-0 Atlantic Coast Conference). After starting out the year 5-8, the Hurricanes have rolled out four consecutive wins – including five of the last six, using a midweek split with Illinois State a week ago prior to the ACC home sweep of Virginia Tech.

Miami has improved its hitting to .242 on the campaign, while the pitching staff continues to hold opponent to just a .205 average. Designated hitter **Rony Rodriguez** in the team leader in average, sitting at .280, followed by freshman Brad Fieger with a .267 average. Rodriguez leads the team with two home runs.

Outfielder **Zeke DeVoss** is the team leader ins stolen bases (7), followed closely by Stephen Perez (5). Outfielder **Chantz Mack**, seeing considerably more playing time this season, is batting .306 with two steals.

The pitching staff for Miami has been solid all season long, combining for an ERA of 2.65 - highlighted by sophomore **Eric Whaley** with a team-leading three wins. He enters working on a 3-1 record, with his lone loss coming against top-ranked Florida. Freshman **Bryan Radziewski** leads the squad in strikeouts (26) and sophomore **E.J. Encinosa** picked up his first win of the campaign over the weekend with a win over Virginia Tech, now holding opponents to just a .174 average against.

The UMiami bullpen has been solid as well, led by junior **Sam Robinson** with a clean 0.00 ERA in 10 appearances. He also leads the team with two saves. Over the last four contests, the 'Canes have allowed just three earned runs – and just one from the starting pitchers in that time frame. Closer **Daniel Miranda** has a 0.93 ERA in eight appearances, picking up a win out of the bullpen as well.

**Scouting Wake Forest...**

Wake Forest may have been predicted to finish fifth in the ACC Atlantic Division, but the Demon Deacons are certainly not playing that way. The Deacs took two-of-three from North Carolina last weekend in the ACC-opener, to move to 2-1 in ACC play. Overall, Wake Forest has won five of its last five – including the last three consecutive with a win over UNC Charlotte on Tuesday night.

The Demon Deacons are led at the plate by Matt Conway, batting a team-high .339, as well as a slugging percentage of .627 with a team-high tying five doubles and team-best four homers. Mac Williamson bats .321, with 14 RBI and three stolen bases. In the field, the Deacs field at .968 with 19 errors as a team. Wake bats just .230 as a team, while opponents bat at a .274 percentage.

The Wake Forest pitching staff enters the weekend with a 4.69 team ERA, highlighted by Tim Cooney with a 2.28 ERA. In four starts, he is 2-1, registering a team-high 26 strikeouts in 27 2/3 innings tossed. Behind him is Justin Van Grouw with an even 2-2 record and a 5.06 ERA in 16 frames pitched. Friday night starter Austin Stadler owns an 0-3 record with a 8.24 ERA, adding a team second-best 22 strikeouts through 19 2/3 innings.

**Miami Against Wake Forest...**

Miami owns a commanding 22-5 advantage in the series against Wake Forest. The Hurricanes swept the Demon Deacons last year in Coral Gables, and have won eight in a row in the series dating back to March 21, 2008. The 'Canes last loss to the Deacs was a 7-3 decision in the ACC Championships on May 26, 2007 in Jacksonville.

**Welcome Back, Welcome Back...**

With six hits in his last eight official at-bats, junior Preseason All-American **Harold Martinez** has come back to life at the plate. He has also laid down three sacrifice bunts and driven in four RBI in that span—all in the series finale against Virginia Tech (March 13)—serving as a team single-game high in that category this season. Before making the switch to first base, Martinez was batting a career-low .163, but has increased that average by almost .100 – now batting .245. He is batting .600 in his last three games and fielding at 100 percent since making the defensive switch.

**One Whale of a Game...**

Sophomore pitcher **Eric Whaley** picked up his team-best third win of the year in Miami's series finale win (and series sweep) of Virginia Tech on

In his 18th season at Miami, no other program, nor head coach, has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament a NCAA-record 38 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 17 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006. His teams have qualified for NCAA Regionals for the last 26 years, 17 at Miami and nine at Georgia Tech.

Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 785-306-3 (.718) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,289-550-4 (.699) Division I record in 29 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 32 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,420-591-4 (.705) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 18 years, Morris has personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and has logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the new stadium project.

**MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR**

Jim Morris earned his 26th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2010 when he guided the 'Canes to the NCAA Coral Gables Regional. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 17 seasons (1994-2010), winning 15 of his last 17 appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.

Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris has led the 2010 Hurricanes to their 38th-straight NCAA Tournament. Five players from the 2010 team were selected in last year's Major League Baseball Draft. In 2008, the 'Canes reached the College World Series after winning the Atlantic Coast Conference, widely considered one of the toughest - if not the toughest - collegiate baseball conference in the country.

**MORRIS IN HIS 33RD SEASON AS A COLLEGE COACH**

Morris currently has a 1,289-550-4 (.705) record at the Division I level. As a head coach overall, he has compiled a 1,420-591-4 (.705) record over 30-plus years.

Jim Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern on March 23, 2001.

Prior to his 17 seasons in Coral Gables, Morris went 504-244-1 at Georgia Tech from 1982-1993. In his first stint as a head coach, he guided DeKalb Junior College to a 131-41 mark from 1976-79.

**JIM MORRIS MAKING HISTORY**

- Guided the Miami Hurricanes to College World Series National Championship in 1999 and 2001.
- The only coach in NCAA history to take a school to the College World Series in each of his first six years at a program. Morris has gone to Omaha with Miami in 11 of 17 seasons and led Miami to 13 straight NCAA Regional Championships, an NCAA record.
- Named National Coach of the Year five times while at Miami, by Baseball America in 1994 and by the ABCA and Collegiate Baseball in 1999 and 2001.

**SHORTSTOPS AND JIM MORRIS**

Morris, who played shortstop during college at Elon and then in the Boston Red Sox organization, has had great success developing the position while a head coach. Over the last decade Morris has taught prominent shortstops such as Nomar Garciaparra at Georgia Tech and Bobby Hill and Alex Cora at Miami.

Morris worked with Javy Rodriguez, who entered 2002 as a preseason All-American. Rodriguez led UM in just about every category as a junior in 2001, including a national-high 66 stolen bases. He currently works with sophomore Stephen Perez, a slick-fielding switch-hitter expected to bat near the upper-half of the order this year for the 'Canes.

Morris coached Hill, who played for the San Diego Padres, from 1997-99. Before Hill, it was Cora and Mike Metcalfe. Both players went on to play at the Major League level with the Los Angeles Dodgers. Cora is currently with the Nationals. Garciaparra played under Morris during the coaches' final two seasons in Atlanta and went on to become an All-Star with the Red Sox and played for the Oakland A's in 2009.

The hit would have brought the tying run to the plate with nobody out. Carey was inserted into the game in the bottom of the eighth as a pinch-runner and later on **Stephen Perez's** RBI double. He stayed in the game as the right fielder, where he proceeded to make his clutch play.

\* The Long Haul — Sophomore right-hander **E.J. Encinosa** threw 96 pitches in eight and two-thirds innings of work. Encinosa earned his first win of the season and now stands at 1-2.

\* Saturday's Starters — **Harold Martinez** and **Brad Fieger** swapped positions at the corners Friday night and were back at the positions tonight. It is Fieger's second career start at third and Martinez' second start of the season at first. Martinez played 10 games at first base during the 2009 season.

\* Hits Parade — **Harold Martinez** recorded two singles in tonight for

Sunday, March 13, going a season-long tying seven innings — allowing just three hits and striking out three with zero walks issued to the Hokies. The Pompano Beach native has earned wins in all three home series finales on the campaign.

### Position Change...

In the second game of the series against Virginia Tech, Miami head coach **Jim Morris** elected to move All-American third baseman **Harold Martinez** to first, in a straight switch with freshman **Brad Fieger**. Since the move, Martinez has a 1.000 fielding percentage and has a .600 batting average. Fieger has also embraced the change well, committing just a single error in three games at the hot corner.

### Encinosa Has a Career Day in Gainesville...

Sophomore starting pitcher **E.J. Encinosa** went a career-long seven innings against top-ranked Florida (March 5). In a 1-0 loss to the Gators, Encinosa allowed just the one run on five hits and struckout three in a pitchers' duel with UF's Hudson Randall. Though not giving up the game-winning hit, Encinosa walked the first batter he faced in the eighth frame before being relieved out of the bullpen.

### Recapping the Virginia Tech Series...

\* The 'Canes opened up ACC play last Friday night with a win against the Virginia Tech Hokies. Miami has dominated Virginia Tech in Coral Gables, winning six of the seven match-ups on its home field. The 'Canes are now 5-3 all-time in ACC-opening games.

\* **Nathan Melendres** returned to the lineup as well, playing center field after a four-game absence due to a hand injury.

\* Playing Small Ball — Miami looked to manufacture runs against the Hokies, bunting six different times throughout the game — with four resulting in bunt singles and one in a sacrifice. UM also had three steal attempts on the night, with two successful tries by sophomore **Stephen Perez**. As a team, Miami improved to 17-22 with stolen bases on the season.

\* A one, a two... — Southpaw hurler **Sam Robinson** earned his second save of the season, throwing only two pitches to seal Miami's 2-1 win over Virginia Tech.

\* Making a Cameo — **Sam Robinson** made his 10 appearances to date, including a string of the last six of eight contests this month.

### Runs Come Across

Sunday's 11 runs scored was the highest runs production for the Hurricanes all season. The previous high was 10 against Appalachian State in the series finale on February 26.

\* Sunday's Starters — Six of today's starters collected hits, while all nine starters reached base safely. **Harold Martinez** posted multiple hits for the second time in as many games (third time this year), knocking in a season-high four RBI. **Nathan Melendres** registered a season-high three hits, adding a RBI and scoring twice. **Rony Rodriguez** and **Stephen Perez** both tallied multiple RBI.

\* Start Your Engines — Sophomore right-hander **Eric Whaley** had another solid production in his fourth start of the year. The Pompano Beach native went seven innings on the hill, spreading out three hits with no runs, no walks and striking out eight batters. Whaley has a team second-best 23 strikeouts on the year.

\* Playing Miami Baseball — Scoring 11 runs on nine hits meant Miami scored runs with guys on base, moving them over with bunts and driving them in with timely hits. Miami began the game with three consecutive bunt singles. UM has tallied five-plus hits in each of the last six games, including 14 against Illinois State (March 8).

\* Walking the Line — Miami showed great plate awareness on Sunday, drawing 10 walks from six Virginia Tech pitchers. The 10 walks taken was a season-high for the 'Canes.

### Catch Me If "U" Can...

This year's UMiami team is full of speed from all areas of the lineup, and through the first 17 games it's quite prevalent. Head coach Jim Morris has preached aggressive base running throughout his illustrious career, with the 'Canes swiping 22-of-27 bases this season. **Zeke DeVoss** leads the way with seven steals, followed by **Stephen Perez (5)** and **Nathan Melendres (4)**.

### The First Father/Son Duo...

Freshman catcher **Shane Rowland** has stepped right into the UMiami starting lineup and taken charge. He belted his first home run over the weekend against Appalachian State. The Tampa native is the son of former UMiami second baseman and current international scout for the New York Yankees, Donny Rowland. They are the first father/son duo to ever play baseball at the "U".

### Miami Predicted to Finish Third In Coastal Division...

Miami baseball has been predicted to finish third in the Coastal Division of the Atlantic Coast Conference Coaches Preseason Poll. The poll is voted on by the league's 12 head coaches. Capturing a 20-10 league record in 2010, the Hurricanes finished the year third in the Coastal Division behind Virginia and Georgia Tech, respectively. Miami posted a 43-20 overall record en route to claiming the NCAA Coral Gables Regional title, and advancing to the NCAA Gainesville Super Regional.

### The 40-40 Club in Miami...

Once again, the Hurricanes achieved a 40-win season, finishing 43-20 and a spot in the NCAA Super Regional. All-time at UMiami, the 'Canes have achieved at least 40 wins 32 seasons – including 13 times under **Jim Morris**. In fact, UM has claimed 50-plus wins 19 times in school history, and 60-plus wins on three occasions. Miami posted at least 40 wins from 1973-1986, marking one of the longest streaks in NCAA history with a school collected 40 or more wins in consecutive years.

### To Be the Best, Play the Best...

According to Boyd's World RPI [strength of schedule], the UMiami Hurricanes have the 33rd toughest schedule in the nation. The 'Canes not only play the top-ranked University of Florida Gators on the road in the third series of the year, but there is the Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) schedule. The ACC has been ranked as one of the top three toughest leagues in the nation the past five years by multiple collegiate baseball publications.

### Miami in the ACC...

The 2011 season marks the seventh season the 'Canes have played in the Atlantic Coast Conference, and last year's 20-10 regular season mark in league play was the program's second-best behind the 2008 ACC championship squad that won 23 regular season league games.

### Last Meeting With Wake Forest: 'Canes Clinch Series Sweep of Deacs...

Wake Forest, winning 10-1 Sunday afternoon at Alex Rodriguez Park. Chris Pelaez drove in four runs and Jason Santana tossed six scoreless to earn the win as the Hurricanes improved to 20-7 overall and 10-2 in Atlantic Coast Conference at the mid-point of the 2010 campaign.

The series victory was the fourth in a row for the Hurricanes to open ACC play - a stretch that includes wins for 10 in Miami's last 11 league games.

Pelaez went 1-for-4 on the day, but provided a three-run triple to spark Miami in a seven-run third inning. David Villasuso had one of his best days at the plate, going 3-for-4 with a pair of runs. Eight of nine starters for the Hurricanes scored a run and recorded at least one hit.

Santana (3-1, 4.46 ERA) allowed just two hits and four base runners while striking out five on the afternoon. It marked the third time in four ACC starts that Santana allowed one earned run or less.

Austin Stadler (1-2, 5.53 ERA) took the loss for the Demon Deacons (9-21, 2-10 ACC) who dropped their ninth straight to Miami. Pat Blair (2-for-4) had half of Wake Forest's hits on the day.

The 'Canes scored first on a RBI groundout by Stephen Perez in the bottom of the third. A two-run single by Scott Lawson then quickly put the 'Canes up 3-0 before Pelaez's three-run triple down the line in right broke the game open. Pelaez then scored on an error by the shortstop.

Solo home runs by Harold Martinez and Villasuso added to the Miami lead in the bottom of the fifth before Pelaez collected his fourth RBI of the day on a groundout in the sixth.

Wake Forest finally got on the board with two outs in the bottom of the ninth to break up the shutout, plating its only run on a bases loaded hit-by-pitch.

### A Wake Forest Quick Hit...

Sophomore LHP Tim Cooney was impressive against Radford on Mar. 6 by starting and striking out 14 batters in just six innings of work. Cooney scattered six hits, walked only one batter and did not allow an earned run. His 14 strikeouts are tied for the second-most in a game in Wake Forest history, as John Stokoe also struck out 14 Florida batters in 1957. Erik Hanson holds the school record with 18 strikeouts in a game, doing so against Virginia on Apr. 17, 1985.

### No Ordinary Joe...

When the 'Canes visited Gainesville in early March, UMiami assistant coach **Joe Mercadante** returned to his old stomping grounds where he earned varsity letters in baseball for the University of Florida during the 2002 and '03 seasons. The former Gators catcher and Gainesville native appeared in 37 games for UF, holding a .312 (10-for-32) batting average and 19 runs batted in. Mercadante is in his seventh year with the Hurricanes program, coaching at P.K. Yonge High School (also his alma mater) prior to his arrival in Coral Gables.

### Recapping the 'Canes Last Game - FAU (3/15/11)...

Three University of Miami pitchers combined to strikeout 13 while allowing just two FAU hits in a quick 7-3 win over the Owls Tuesday night at Alex Rodriguez Park.

Starter **Steven Ewing** and relievers **Adam Sargent** and **Daniel Miranda** combined to retire the final 16 batters, as a two-out, fourth-inning walk marked the last time anyone would reach base for the Owls.

The win moves Miami to 9-8 overall while FAU fell to 11-7.

Making his fourth mid-week start of the season, Ewing (1-1) recorded a career-high eight strikeouts in earning his first win. For the big left-hander, the outing looked a lot more like his last - when he allowed just one run in five innings to Illinois State last week - than it did his last time out against the Owls, when he surrendered four earned runs in 4 1/3 innings.

Tuesday night, the Orlando native allowed three unearned runs on just two hits while walking two and piling up his record strikeout total in six innings of work.

He was relieved by Sargent, who struck out three in two innings before Miranda came on to strikeout two more in a scoreless ninth.

FAU starter Jake Meiers (1-3) suffered the loss, allowing seven runs - four earned - on six hits while walking three and striking out three in 5 1/3 innings. Ahmed Garcia and Hugh Adams went the rest of the way for the Owls, holding the 'Canes scoreless over the final 2 2/3 innings.

Miami got all the runs it would need in a four-run first, but added three more three innings later. The 'Canes have combined to scored 18 over their last two games after an 11-run showing against Virginia Tech on Sunday.

**Harold Martinez** finished the night 2-for-4 with two runs scored for the 'Canes, while **Michael Broad** went 1-for-3 with a two-run triple and **Nathan Melendres** and **Zeke DeVoss** each chipped in with an RBI.

The lone FAU hits came off the bats off Colby Gratton (1-for-2, one run) and Nick Delguidice (1-for-3).

UM didn't waste any time getting on the board in this one, scoring four runs in the bottom of the first, mostly capitalizing off FAU miscues. After DeVoss scored the first run on a Melendres ground-out, a pair of FAU errors allowed three more runners to cross. Runs two and three came in on a dropped fly ball in right-center before run No. 4 came in on a throwing error by shortstop Delguidice.

Miami returned the favor in the third when a throwing error by Ewing led to three unearned runs for FAU.

But that would be as close as the Owls would get all night.

The following inning, Miami went back up by four on Broad's big triple followed by a sacrifice

fly to left off the bat of DeVoss.

The rest of the game belonged to the pitchers, who put up a bunch of zeros the rest of the way.

With 2,641 in attendance, the game lasted just 2 hours and 11 minutes, much in part to yet another impressive outing by the UM pitching staff, who boasts a 2.65 ERA and has held opponents to three runs or less nine times already this season.

### Free Baseball...

The Hurricanes are 2-1 in extra-inning games this year. UMiami began the year accomplishing a task that has never been achieved in school history – back-to-back games to open a season. The 'Canes went 1-1 in the opening two days against Rutgers.

### Morris Has Surgery to Remove Gall Bladder...

On Friday, March 25, 18th-year head coach **Jim Morris** received surgery to remove his gall bladder at the University of Miami Hospital. He stayed in the hospital a few extra days due to an infection stemming from the surgery. The skipper returned faster than expected to the 'Canes dugout, coaching against Illinois State (March 8) after missing a total of seven games - six consecutive.

### Morris Signs Contract Extension...

On Sept. 20, 2009, former University of Miami Director of Athletics Kirby Hocutt announced that head baseball coach **Jim Morris** signed a contract extension through 2015. Morris, who is in his 17th season at the helm of the Miami baseball program, has led the Hurricanes to the College World Series in 11 of his 17 seasons in Coral Gables – including National Championship runs in 1999 and 2001.

### Miami Gets Them Drafted...

Over the last three years, Miami has produced four first round MLB draft picks, more than any other school in the nation. Last year, Yasmani Grandal was selected in the first round by the Cincinnati Reds, with four other players—David Gutierrez (Minnesota Twins), Chris Hernandez (Boston Red Sox), Scott Lawson (Houston Astros) and Iden Nazario (Washington Nationals) all taken on the second day of the Draft.

### Two of a Kind...

University of Miami head coach **Jim Morris** entered the season with 776 career wins with the Hurricanes and registered 504 wins at Georgia Tech prior to his arrival in Coral Gables. Morris is one of only two head coaches to ever amass 500 or more wins at two separate Division I schools. Augie Garrido at the University of Texas entered the year with 602 wins with the Longhorns program. Garrido logged 928 wins as head coach at Cal State Fullerton before his current stint in Austin.

### Closing In On the Luck "8"...

Jim Morris is enjoying his 18th year at the helm in Coral Gables, and the skipper is closing in on his 800th career win. Morris sits at 785 wins at UMiami entering the weekend against the Demon Deacons.

### New Era Behind the Plate...

Three catchers will be battling for playing time behind the plate this year, including junior **David Villasuso**. A season ago, Villasuso batted .245 with 20 RBI and five home runs while serving as a backup to MLB First Round Draft selection and 2010 ACC Player of the Year, Yasmani Grandal.

Others battling for playing time this season will be freshmen **Corey Janson** and **Shane Rowland**. After the fall season, Villasuso will probably make the start to begin the season, but don't be surprised if and when Rowland takes the spot behind the dish with improved confidence and skill.

### Athletics Gets a Changing of the Guard...

On March 3, the University of Miami Department of Athletics and UMiami President Dr. Donna E. Shalala announced that Tony Hernandez would succeed Kirby Hocutt as Interim Director of Athletics. Hocutt resigned a week prior to take a similar position at Texas Tech University. Hernandez has served in a variety of areas within the Department of Athletics at UM in his 13 years of service, including the last year and a half as Deputy Athletic Director.

### Fresh Faces In the Dugout...

This season, head coach **Jim Morris** has one of his youngest teams in recent memory. UMiami has 13 newcomers on this year's roster (12 freshman and one sophomore transfer). The 'Canes lost 2010 ACC Player of the Year, Yasmani Grandal, to the MLB Draft—Grandal was selected 12th overall in the Draft.

### You've Gotta Start Somewhere...

Sophomore **Joey Porro** made his first collegiate start (second base) on Feb. 26 against Appalachian State; followed by another start against Illinois State (shortstop) on March 9. Porro was a student-manager for UM in 2010, only to earn two starts and post a .286 average with two hits, three runs driven in and one score thus far in 2011.

## ALEX RODRIGUEZ PARK INFORMATION

Renovations to Alex Rodriguez Park are thanks in large part to a \$3.9 million contribution by New York Yankees third baseman and 11-time MLB All-Star Alex Rodriguez. The gift - the largest ever to the University of Miami baseball program - has assisted the program in continuing to develop first-class facilities. The official announcement of his gift was made on Oct. 10, 2002.

Alex Rodriguez Park has taken form in a three-phase process:

- Phase I called for seating modifications, new dugouts, new stadium lighting and utility infrastructure and new rest rooms.
- Phase II entailed renovating below the grand stand area in addition to adding new concession areas.
- The final phase included adding a new clubhouse, weight room, training room, meeting room, video room and academic area. In addition, a new press box – along with four VIP suites – have been built atop the grandstand. This past offseason, addition seating was added down both lines while a new scoreboard was constructed in left field.
