


MIDWEEK STORY LINES & NEWS

- Miami will host Maine for a pair of midweek games on March 14-15 at Mark Light Field on ACC Network Extra & WVUM.
- Miami leads the all-time series with the Black Bears 63-13; the Hurricanes topped Maine 6-2 in the lone matchup between the two schools in 2016. UM has played Maine eight times since 2000 and is 7-1 in those games, all at The Light.
- Evan McKendry (1-0, 2.79 ERA) will make his first career home start in Game 1; Greg Veliz (0-1, 4.82) will pitch Game 2.
- Led by a 37-hit barrage over three games, the Hurricanes won their opening ACC series, taking two of three games from No. 23 Georgia Tech. UM won 10-8 in Game 1, fell 7-5 in exra innings in Game 2, and stormed back for a 17-7 Game 3 win.
- Head coach Jim Morris has the fifth-most wins in Division I history (1,541), the third-most wins among active coaches, a
 .695 winning percentage (sixth among active coaches), and 193 more wins than the next active coach (Mike Fox, UNC).
- The Hurricanes had four different players earn Preseason All-America recognition; Michael Mediavilla, Jesse Lepore and Johnny Ruiz were recognized by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper while Carl Chester was honored by Baseball America.
- The Hurricanes made their 25th trip to the College World Series in 2016, finishing with a 50-14 record and a 21-9 mark in ACC play, Miami was the No. 3 national seed for the postseason, and won the 2016 ACC Regular Season Championship.
- The Canes had seven players selected in the 2016 MLB Draft, including Chicago White Sox' first-round pick Zack Collins.



THE HURRICANES SKIPPER

It doesn't matter if his roster is full of rookies or veterans. University of Miami head coach Jim Morris continues to produce some of college baseball's most consistent and dominant teams entering his 24th season in Coral Gables. With a talented staff around him, Morris' Hurricanes are continually the class of collegiate baseball, having won national titles in 1999 and 2001 and the ACC Baseball Regular Season Championship in 2008. 2014 and 2016.

In his 23-season tenure at Miami, no program has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament a college baseball-record 44 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 13 of Morris' 23 seasons in Coral Gables - including most recently in 2016, when Miami was awarded the No. 3 national seed for the NCAA postseason.

Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris has won 17 of 23 NCAA Regional appearances at UM, including a record 13 straight to start his tenure in Coral Gables. His teams have qualified for NCAA Regionals for the last 32 years - all 23 at Miami and his final nine at Georgia Tech.

A three-time national coach of the year and 2008 Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year, Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 1,037-428-3 (.710) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,541-672-4 (.697) Division I record in 35 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 39 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,672-711-4 (.702) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 23 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium's renovation prior to its reopening in 2009.

Morris reached two coaching milestones in 2016, as he led the program to its 25th College World Series appearance in history, its third straight ACC Coastal Division title and the program's second ACC Regular Season Championship in a three-year span.

Morris became just the sixth coach in the history of Division I baseball to reach the 1,500-win plateau when Miami topped Louisville 8-4 in dramatic fashion on March 18, 2016. Eight days later, Miami topped Clemson 5-4 in 11 innings - also in walk-off fashion to send Morris to his 1,000th win at the helm of the Hurricanes.

Under his direction, the Hurricanes set the program record for fielding percentage with a sparkling .983 mark in 2016, a figure that ranked best nationwide. Seven Hurricanes were selected in the 2016 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft, including the program's first first-round selection since 2010 in catcher Zack Collins (No. 10, Chicago White Sox). Morris also helped guide two Hurricanes to a pair of major awards: Collins became the first Hurricane to win the Johnny Bench Award as the nation's top collegiate catcher in 2016, while Bryan Garcia set the program saves record and became the first Hurricane to win the NCBWA Stopper of the Year Award.

Morris entered 2015 as among the winningest active coaches in Division I baseball with 1,435 wins. He wasted little time in moving up the record books, moving into sole



possession of eighth place in all-time wins (1,439) on Feb. 15 with a 25-4 win over Rutgers and then seventh place with a 9-5 win over Louisville on March 7 (1,445).

Miami captured the 2014 ACC Regular Season Championship under his watch, recording 24 wins in conference play for the first time in program history.

Morris reached two coaching milestones in the first half of the 2014 season. He became just the eighth Division I coach to reach 1,400 wins in a 5-2 win over Boston College on March 8, and won his 900th game at Miami in a 7-1 upset of No. 3 Virginia on March 22.

Among the players Morris coached at Miami that have gone on to play in the Major Leagues are Peter O'Brien (Kansas City), Chris Hermann (Arizona), Yasmani Grandal (Los Angeles Dodgers), Jemile Weeks (Boston), Danny Valencia (Oakland), Jon Jay (Chicago), Yonder Alonso (Oakland), Ryan Braun (Milwaukee), Ryan Jackson (St. Louis), Pat Burrell (Philadelphia), Alex Cora (New York Mets), Bobby Hill (San Diego), Aubrey Huff (Detroit), Chris Perez (Cleveland), Cesar Carrillo (San Diego), Brian Barton (St. Louis), Gaby Sanchez (Florida), Charlton Jimerson (Houston), Jay Tessmer (New York Yankees), Danny Graves (Cincinnati) and Jason Michaels (Houston), among many others. From his days at Georgia Tech include Nomar Garciaparra (Los Angeles), Jay Payton (Oakland) and Jason Varitek (Boston).

Morris has also enjoyed success on the international scene. From 1989-90. Morris served as head coach of the USA Baseball team that won a Silver Medal in the 1989 Presidential Cup (Taiwan), Bronze Medal at the Goodwill Games and the 1990 International Baseball Association (IBA) World All-Star Game in Atlanta.

CANES TO FACE BLACK BEARS AT THE LIGHT

- The Miami Hurricanes will wrap up a **five-game homestand** with a pair of midweek games against visiting **Maine** (March 14-15) at Mark Light Field. Both games will be on ACC Network Extra and WVUM.
- Miami played a single midweek game against Maine in 2016 and earned a **6-2 victory** (March 8) at The Light. **Jesse Lepore** tossed 6.0 innings in the win, while **Christopher Barr** went 3-for-5 at the plate.
- Miami carries a commanding **63-13 all-time lead** in the head-to head series, including a **50-6 lead in games played at Mark Light Field**. Miami is **23-1** in its last 24 games against Maine dating to **1990**.
- Miami freshman righthander **Evan McKendry** (1-0, 2.79 ERA) will oppose Maine freshman lefthander **Trevor Delaite** (0-0, 3.00 ERA) Tuesday; freshman **Greg Veliz** (0-1, 4.89 ERA) will take the hill against Black Bears righthander **Chris Murphy** (0-0, 11.57 ERA) Wednesday.

LAST TIME OUT: MIAMI SLUGS PAST JACKETS

- Thanks largely to a **37-hit outburst over three games**, Miami captured its **opening ACC series** against No. 23 **Georgia Tech** at Mark Light Field from March 10-13.
- The Hurricanes won **10-8 in Game 1**, fell 7-5 in 11 innings in Game 2 but came roaring back for a **17-7 win in Game 3.** Miami had **double-digit hit totals** in each game, including 15 in the finale.
- Miami hit .339 in its three games against Georgia Tech, led by a .615 average from Carl Chester (8-for-13, three doubles), .462 from Michael Burns (6-for-13, 10 RBI) and .417 from James Davison (.417, seven runs).
- Tech used **10 pitchers against Miami** in Game 3, setting a **record** for number of pitchers used by an opponent against the Hurricanes.

HEATING UP: OFFENSIVE SPARKS FLY VS. TECH

- Miami had **37 hits against the Yellow Jackets** in its most recent series win. The Hurricanes totaled **23 walks**, **reached base at a .486 clip as a team**, and **slugged .532** to win their **third straight series** against Georgia Tech dating to 2015.
- Junior **Carl Chester** batted .500 for the week (10-for-20) for Miami, including a .**615** (8-for-13) average against the Jackets. He recorded a **.666** on-base percentage and **.846** slugging percentage.
- Junior **James Davison** started at leadoff all three games against the Jackets and thrived; he reached base at a .588 clip and scored a team-best seven runs. He batted .417 for the weekend.
- Miami's 37 hits agains Georgia Tech were more than its combined total in the **previous seven games** (36). UM had double-digit hit totals in each game 10 in Game 1, 12 in Game 2 and 15 in Game 3.

LOOKING FOR A FOUR-PEAT

- Miami won its **third straight ACC Coastal Division title** in 2016, posting a **21-7 record in ACC play** to earn the division crown.
- The Hurricanes have won 67 ACC games in the previous three seasons the most wins in a three-year stretch by any program since ACC expanded to a 30-game conference schedule in 2005.
- Miami has won the ACC Regular Season Championship three times, most recently in **2016** when the Canes finished **21-7**; UM **won the ACC regular season crown & ACC Tournament in 2008**.
- The Hurricanes have won **four ACC Coastal Division titles** (2008, 2014, 2015, 2016) in history and **one ACC Championship** (2008).

MIDWEEK NEWS & NOTES

ONE OF THE GAME'S TOP SKIPPERS

- Jim Morris' 1,541 wins at the Division I level are fifth-most in the history of college baseball and **third-most** among active skippers.
- Last weekend's series against Georgia Tech pitted two of the winningest coaches in college baseball history: Morris (1,541 wins) and Georgia Tech's **Danny Hall** (1,176), who replaced Morris in Atlanta when Morris was named Miami's head coach prior to the 1994 season
- Morris reached two major milestones in 2016 he became the **fifth coach** to reach **1,500** wins on March 18 against Louisville and won his **1,000th game at Miami** on March 26 vs. Clemson.

WELCOME TO THE LIGHT!

- Miami has made College World Series trips in back-to-back seasons (2015 and 2016) thanks in large part to its **dominant play** inside the confines of Alex Rodriguez Park at Mark Light Field.
- Since the start of the 2015 season, Miami is a whopping **74-13** in its last 87 home games, including its 2017 Opening Weekend series against Rutgers and opening ACC home series against Georgia Tech.
- Miami finished **36-5** at home in 2015 and **34-6** at home in 2016. The Hurricanes went 13-2 in ACC play at The Light in 2015 and 12-3 at home in ACC play in 2016.

HIGH EXPECTATIONS

- Miami was ranked in the top 25 in preseason polls from three major college baseball outlets, including a No. 8 ranking from Collegiate Baseball Newspaper, No. 17 the USA Today Coaches Poll and a No. 21 ranking from D1Baseball.
- The Hurricanes have won three straight ACC Coastal Division titles and have won the ACC Regular Season Championship in two of the past three seasons (2014, 2016).
- Miami had four players earn **Preseason All-America** distinction: Carl Chester, Jesse Lepore Michael Mediavilla and Johnny Ruiz.

DESTINATION: OMAHA

- Miami made its second straight trip to the College World Series in 2016, marking the program's 25th all-time trip to Omaha, Neb.
- Miami's 25 College World Series trips are the second-most of any program in the country. The Hurricanes have won 48 games in the College World Series, the **fourth-most** of any program; Miami's four national championships rank fifth-most.
- Since the NCAA began award national seeds prior to 1999, Miami has been among the top eight seven seasons: 1999 (#1), 2001 (#2), **2003** (#8), **2004** (#3), **2008** (#1), **2015** (#5) and **2016** (#3).

ACC NETWORK EXTRA TO CARRY HOME SLATE

- All 34 of Miami's home games will be carried on ESPN Networks in 2017; 33 games will be broadcast on ACC Network Extra, while one game is slated for broadcast on ESPNU. In total, 49 of Miami's 56 **games** are tentatively slated for television broadcast in 2017.
- 560 WQAM, the flagship station of Miami Athletics, is scheduled to carry 15 regular season games on radio, including every Sunday home game and three full series.
- WVUM 90.5 FM, UM's student radio station, is one of the only student radio stations in America to carry all 56 games.

- Freshmen Nico Baldor, Albert Maury, Jr., Evan McKendry, Daniel Rivero, Mason Studstill and juniors James Davison and Michael Perez all made their Miami debuts against the Scarlet Knights.
 Davison starting Game 3 in left field.
- Amditis, Davison, Gali and Tackett all recorded the first hits of their Miami careers in the series victory over Rutgers.

FOUR TO WATCH

- Four Hurricanes have picked up 2017 Preseason All-America honors: junior outfielder **Carl Chester**. junior righthander **Jesse Lepore**, junior lefthander **Michael Mediavilla** and senior infielder **Johnny Ruiz**.
- Chester, a *Baseball America* Preseason All-America third-team selection, was among 55 players named to the initial watch list for the **2017 Golden Spikes Award** by USA Baseball on Feb. 15.
- Sophomore reliever **Frankie Bartow**, who was recognized as a Louisville Slugger Freshman All America last season, was named to the watch list for the **2017 Stopper of the Year Award** by NCBWA; former closer Bryan Garcia won the prestigious award in 2016.
- UM had three All-Americans in 2016: **Zack Collins** (several publications), **Garcia** (NCBWA) & **Mediavilla** (ABCA/Rawlings).

DEATH, TAXES & THE NCAA POSTSEASON

- The Miami Hurricanes extended their own college baseball record with a **44th consecutive trip to the NCAA postseason** in 2016. Miami has made the postseason each year since 1973.
- The Hurricanes' 44 straight trips to the NCAA postseason are the **longest active postseason streak of any Division I program** in any sport nationwide.
- Miami's **25 College World Series trips** are the second-most of any program all-time, trailing only Texas.
- Jim Morris has led teams to the NCAA postseason in **32 straight** vears all **23 years at Miami** & final nine vears at Georgia Tech.
- Miami is the only school in the state of Florida to have won a national championship; UM won titles in 1982, 1985, 1999 & 2001.
