THINGS TO KNOW

- Miami is one of four remaining unbeaten teams in Division I (Arizona State, TCU, Villanova).
- At No. 6 in the latest AP poll, Miami owns its highest ranking since a No. 5 standing on March 18, 2013.
- Lonnie Walker IV is averaging 17 points per game in his last three contests.
- DJ Vasiljevic is 13-for-24 from 3-point range and has averaged 14.0 points per game in his last four games.
- Miami ranks second nationally in scoring defense (56.3) and field-goal defense (34.7%) and is outscoring teams by 20.7 points per game (fourth-best nationally).
- UM is in the midst of a six-game road swing, which began Dec. 16 at GW and ends Jan. 3 at Georgia Tech, encompassing approximately 15,550 miles of travel.

MIAMI. HAWAII MEET AGAIN IN DHC

Miami and Hawai'i have met four times previously, with the Canes owning a 3-1 series edge.

The programs last met in the first round of the 2012 Diamond Head Classic, with Miami scoring a 73-58 win. Jim Larrañaga is 1-0 in his career against Hawai'i.

CANES IN HAWAII

This is Miami's fourth trip to the state of Hawaii. The Hurricanes are 4-4 all-time in Hawai'i.

The Canes played two games against Hawai'i in 1967, then returned for the Chaminade Classic in 1988.

UM also competed in the 2012 Diamond Head Classic.

LIFE ON THE ROAD

Miami is 42-32 in true road games in seven years under Jim Larrañaga, including 16-5 in non-conference action.

UM is 2-0 on the road this year, including an 86-81 win at then-No. 12 Minnesota on Nov. 29 in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge.

The Hurricanes were 4-6 in road games last season.

DEFENSE DEFENSE DEFENSE

Miami's defense has been strong in the early stages of the season, with UM limiting its opponents to 56.3 points per game (second in ACC/second in NCAA) and 34.7 percent shooting (first in ACC/second in NCAA).

The Hurricanes are holding their opponents to 25.4 percent shooting from 3-point range (first in ACC/third nationally).

UM's defense has recorded five scoreless stretches of five-plus minutes, including a five-minute, 52-second stretch in the first half against Princeton.

BEST START IN 10 YEARS

Miami owns its best start to a season since the 2007-08 team opened with 12 straight wins.

The 9-0 mark is the best start in the Jim Larrañaga tenure, topping an 8-0 start in 2014-15.

This is the fourth straight year the Hurricanes have started at least 4-0 and the fifth time in seven years under Larrañaga.

As of Tuesday, Miami was one of four remaining unbeaten teams in Division I.

ROAD WARRIORS

Miami is in the midst of six straight games away from the comforts of home. UM has a pair of ACC road games on the upcoming docket following the Diamond Head Classic.

UM is in the midst of a stretch with just one home game in 42 days.

After returning from Hawaii, UM opens ACC play at Pitt (Dec. 30) and Georgia Tech (Jan. 3).

UM's next home game is an ACC clash with No. 24 Florida State on Jan. 7.

AS A RANKED TEAM

The Hurricanes are ranked No. 6 in the Associated Press Poll and No. 7 in the USA TODAY Coaches Poll, each released Monday. As a ranked team under Jim Larrañaga, Miami is 51-18.

UM's AP ranking is its highest since a No. 5 ranking on March 18, 2013.

Miami has been ranked in five of Larrañaga's seven seasons at The U, topping out at No. 2 in both polls on Feb. 18, 2013.

MIAMI IN TOURNAMENT PLAY UNDER LARRAÑAGA

In six previous seasons under Jim Larrañaga, Miami is 30-15 in tournament play, including regular and postseason.

BALANCE ON OFFENSE

Miami put at least five players in double figures in scoring in five of its first nine games. The Hurricanes had three such games in 33 contests in the entire 2016-17 season.

Miami has no one in the ACC's top 25 in scoring, but eight Hurricanes are averaging at least five points per game, while the Canes are shooting 49.3 percent as a team.

Dewan Huell (13.3 ppg) has hit for 10-plus points in seven of the nine contests and leads five Canes in double figures this year.

WALKER MAKING STRIDES

Freshman guard Lonnie Walker IV has stood out in the last three games, averaging 17.0 points, 5.7 rebounds and 2.0 assists.

In his first career start on Dec. 5, Walker scored 26 points and grabbed seven rebounds in a win over Boston U. He was named the ACC Rookie of the Week on Dec. 11 following that performance.

Walker averaged 6.8 points, 1.8 rebounds and 1.7 assists in his first six games.

DJ HOT FROM DEEP

Sophomore guard DJ Vasiljevic has scored in double figures in four straight games and is averaging 14 points per game in that span.

Vasiljevic is 13-for-24 (.542) from 3-point range in the last four contests.

He averaged 9.6 points per game through Miami's first five games and was 10-for-32 (.313) from long distance in those contests.

BROWN RETURNS AFTER MISSING GAME

Starting guard Bruce Brown Jr. sat out the Boston University game because of a left hand injury, the first game he has missed in his Miami career.

He returned for the GW game and is averaging 10.6 points, 7.9 rebounds and 4.7 assists per game this year.

He ranks second in the ACC in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.92), with 38 assists and just 13 turnovers, and also is the leading rebounder among ACC guards, averaging 7.9 per game.

Brown did not start the second half against La Salle after a scoreless first half and then had seven points and five boards in the second half. He then averaged 15.6 points, eight rebounds and four assists in the next three games before sitting out the BU contest.

HOLDING OPPONENTS UNDER 60

Miami has held seven of its nine opponents to fewer than 60 points.

UM limited four straight opponents to fewer than 60 points to open the season. That marked the second time that has happened in the Jim Larrañaga era.

The other was a six-game stretch from Dec. 25, 2012 to Jan. 16, 2013.

UM is 75-9 in seven seasons under Larrañaga, including 7-0 this year, when limiting its opponents to fewer than 60 points.

PLAYING WITH THE LEAD

Miami has played with a lead for the vast majority of the first nine games.

The Hurricanes have led for 310 minutes, 54 seconds of the 360 minutes thus far (86 percent). UM has trailed for just 24:32.

Miami has vet to trail in the second half this season.

HUELL OFF TO BIG START IN THE POST

Sophomore center Dewan Huell has started the season well and leads the team in scoring at 13.3 points per game. He averaged 5.6 per game last year.

He scored a career-best 23 points on 10-of-16 shooting at Minnesota and ranks second in the ACC in field-goal percentage (.652).

Huell scored in double figures in each of the first six games and recorded a pair of double-doubles, including last Saturday at GW.

He is averaging 6.3 boards per game (3.1 last year).

NOTING THE YOUTH MOVEMENT

Miami features a young group this season. Seven of the Hurricanes' 10 active scholarship players are

Ja'Quan Newton is the lone scholarship senior. Miami's starting lineup this year has featured Newton, Anthony Lawrence (junior) and sophomores Bruce Brown, Dewan Huell and Dejan Vasiljevic.

LYKES PROVIDES SPARK

Chris Lykes has given UM a big boost off the bench, particularly at Minnesota.

The rookie guard scored 10 points and added a season-best three steals in 19 minutes off the bench.

Lykes was inserted to start the second half, and Miami responded by going on a 9-2 run to break a 36-all halftime deadlock.

He is shooting 42.4 percent from 3-point range and averaging 6.7 points per game this year.

CANES LOOK FOR 70 POINTS

Miami has eclipsed the 70-point plateau in six of its nine games this year.

Last season Miami was 17-1 overall and 8-1 in ACC play when scoring 70+ points.

UM is 61-11 when scoring 70 or more points under Jim Larrañaga and 38-1 when breaking the 80-point barrier.

NOTING THE GW GAME

- · Miami held GW without a field goal for eight minutes. 35 seconds in the first half.
- GW's 15 points in the first half marked the fewest by a Miami opponent in any half this year (previous was 19 by La Salle in first half)
- Miami has held seven of nine opponents this season to fewer than 60 points.
- Miami shot less than 50 percent for the second time this season (the other was La Salle).
- Miami limited GW to its season lows in scoring (50) and shooting (30.2%).
- UM matched a season low with eight turnovers.
- Ja'Quan Newton played in his 104th career game.
- Dewan Huell recorded his second career doubledouble, scoring 15 points and grabbing a career-high 12 rebounds.
- Huell reached double figures in scoring for the seventh time in nine games.
- With 15 points off the bench, Lonnie Walker IV scored in double figures for the third straight game.
- Anthony Lawrence II had nine rebounds, his sixth game of at least seven boards this year.

UPTICK IN 3-POINT SUCCESS

After shooting just 34.3 percent from long distance in its first five games, Miami is now hitting on 38.6 percent of its attempts for the season.

Miami hit at least 10 threes in three straight games against Minnesota (10), Princeton (14) and Boston U. (11), going 35-for-71 (.493) in that span.

Miami is averaging 8.4 3-pointers per game this season (second in ACC). Under Jim Larrañaga, the Canes are 99-28 when making at least seven from 3-point range.

WAARDENBURG MAKES FIRST APPEARANCE

After redshirting last season and missing the first three games this year with a back injury, forward Sam Waardenburg made his college debut against La Salle.

He scored seven points in 13 minutes against La Salle and followed it up by scoring nine points and grabbing six boards in 16 minutes against North Florida.

The 6-foot-10 New Zealand native has added about 15 pounds to his frame since arriving at UM.

SELLING OUT THE WATSCO CENTER

Miami has sold out its season ticket allotment for all home games at the Watsco Center for the third straight year.

Fans have bought over 5,500 season tickets for each of the last three years, more than doubling the total number of season tickets sold in Jim Larrañaga's first season in Coral Gables.

THE WATSCO ADVANTAGE

Miami has defended its home turf well in recent years, winning 32 of its last 34 games at the Watsco Center. The Hurricanes went 14-2 at home last year and are 82-22 (.788) under Jim Larrañaga.

Miami has won 16 straight home non-conference games, dating to a 78-77 loss to Northeastern on Nov. 27, 2015.

In the first 16 years at the Watsco Center (formerly BankUnited Center), Miami is 177-66 (.728).

In seven seasons under Larrañaga, Miami is 44-7 in non-conference play and 38-15 in ACC action at home. In both 2012-13 and 2015-16, the Canes had just one loss at Watsco Center.

BROWN JOINS ELITE TRIPLE-DOUBLE COMPANY

Bruce Brown Jr. started off his sophomore season with a great all-around performance against Gardner-Webb, recording his second career triple-double, the third in school history and the 31st in ACC history.

Brown became just the sixth player in the league's storied history to earn a pair of triple-doubles.

He reached the status at the 5:36 mark of the second half with a field goal for his ninth and 10th points.

As part of the opener, Brown matched his career high in assists and fell one shy of his high in rebounds.

MORE HONORS FOR BROWN

Bruce Brown Jr. added a pair of early-season honors in the recently, as he was named to the watch list John L. Wooden Award as well as the Citizen Naismith Trophy Top 50.

In the preseason, Brown was named to the Preseason All-ACC Second Team. He also was lauded nationally on the watch lists for the Citizen Naismith Trophy, Julius Erving Small Forward of the Year Award, Lute Olson National Player of the Year Award and the Oscar Robertson Trophy.

WHO'S BACK

The Hurricanes welcome back 10 players from their 2017 NCAA Tournament squad, including starters Bruce Brown Jr., Anthony Lawrence II and Ja'Quan Newton. In all, Miami returns six players who averaged double-figure minutes.

Newton averaged 13.5 points and 31.4 minutes per game last year. After a standout rookie season, Brown (11.8 ppg, 5.6 rpg, 31.9 mpg) is back, as is Lawrence (6.8 ppg. 3.8 rpg. 26 mpg).

Miami also returns Dejan Vasiljevic, Ebuka Izundu and Dewan Huell, each of whom averaged at least 13 minutes per game last year. Izundu and Huell are the Canes' top returning post threats, while Vasiljevic averaged six points in 17 minutes per game off the bench.

CANES WELCOME STRONG CLASS OF ROOKIES

Miami added three high-touted newcomers this year in Deng Gak, Chris Lykes and Lonnie Walker IV. Each was an ESPN Top 100 recruit last season.

A 2017 McDonald's All-American and consensus top-20 recruit, Walker IV was among 20 players named to the preseason watch list for the 2018 Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year Award.

Walker recently was tabbed the "most exciting freshman in America" by ESPN.com's Myron Medcalf. Lykes was ESPN's No. 45 recruit, while Gak was rated No. 91. Gak is expected to redshirt this season.

BEST PRESEASON RANKING IN PROGRAM HISTORY

Ranked in the preseason polls for the first time since 2008-09, Miami was No. 13 in the preseason Associated Press poll. It marked the highest preseason AP ranking in program history. Miami also was No. 12 in the USA Today Coaches poll.

It is the third time Miami is among the top 25 teams to start the season. The Canes were ranked No. 25 prior to the 1999-2000 campaign and No. 17 heading into the 2008-09 season.

ACC PRESEASON POLL

Miami is ranked fourth in the 2017-18 ACC Coaches Preseason Poll, the Hurricanes' highest standing in the poll in Jim Larrañaga's seven years at the helm and matching their highest at any point during their 14 years in the ACC (fourth in 2008-09).

In each of Larrañaga's first six seasons, Miami finished the year in a higher standing than their preseason rank.

Miami followed Duke, North Carolina and Notre Dame in the preseason poll.

2017-18 ROSTER HAS SIX TOP-100 RECRUITS

Miami signed three ESPN Top 100 recruits for the class of 2017, including No. 18 Lonnie Walker from Reading, Pa., No. 46 Chris Lykes from Mitchellville, Md., and No. 92 Deng Gak from Blairstown, N.J.

The trio joins former ESPN Top 100 Hurricanes Bruce Brown (No. 26 in 2016), Dewan Huell (No. 28 in 2016) and Ja'Quan Newton (No. 58 in 2014) in the fall of 2017. In just seven seasons at The U, Larrañaga has recruited six of Miami's 11 ESPN Top 100 players since 2007.

MIAMI EARNS HIGH GSR NUMBERS

Miami's men's basketball team posted an exemplary Graduation Success Rate (GSR), in the latest numbers released on Nov. 8 by the NCAA. Miami recorded a 92 percent GSR, which is based on the four entering classes from 2007-08 through 2010-11.

In addition, the UM football (83 percent), women's basketball (92 percent) and baseball (83 percent) programs all posted GSR totals above the NCAA average.

The NCAA Graduation Success Rate (GSR) was developed in response to college and university presidents suggesting that graduation data more accurately reflect the mobility among college students today. The GSR measures graduation rates at Division I institutions and includes students transferring into the institutions. The GSR also allows institutions to subtract student-athletes who leave their institutions prior to graduation as long as they would have been academically eligible to compete had they remained.

BIG SHOES TO FILL

Miami lost a pair of 2016-17 starters to graduation – quard Dayon Reed and forward Kamari Murphy.

A 2017 Third-Team All-ACC honoree, Reed led the Hurricanes in scoring at 14.9 points per game while averaging a team-high 35.3 minutes per game. Reed was selected No. 32 overall by the Phoenix Suns in the second round of the 2017 NBA Draft, the 20th player in program history to be drafted.

Playing in 131 career games (99 starts), Reed scored 1,343 points, good for No. 16 on the Hurricanes' all-time scoring list.

The 6-foot-8, 220-pound Murphy was a force in the middle, averaging 7.1 points and 7.3 rebounds per game.

BROWN, WALKER EARN PLAUDITS FROM ESPN.COM

In October, ESPN.com listed Bruce Brown as the best college shooting guard draft prospect for the 2018 NBA Draft. Lonnie Walker was tabbed second best.

They were the lone teammates on the 10-man list. Brown and Walker were listed 12th and 13th, respectively on ESPN's top 100 draft prospects for 2018, as Miami was one of 13 college teams to have multiple players on the list.

VASILJEVIC LOOKS TO BUILD ON BIG SUMMER

Sophomore guard Dejan Vasiljevic had a strong summer playing internationally with Australia's Emerging Boomers at the World University Games in Taipei.

The Melbourne native averaged 21.5 points a game on 45.3 percent shooting from the field in eight games in the tournament.

Vasiljevic scored 20-plus points and led the team in scoring in five of the eight games as the Emerging Boomers finished ninth in the field.

He closed out play with a 28-point performance in a 101-96 win over Canada.

COACHING COORDINATORS

Miami's assistant coaching staff is set up in a coordinator system. Jamal Brunt serves as the offensive coordinator, while Chris Caputo handles the defense. Adam Fisher manages the scout for every opponent.

SCHEDULE NOTES

Miami has a dozen games scheduled against eight programs that competed in the 2017 NCAA Tournament, with potential matchups with four more in the Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic.

Miami defeated Minnesota in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge on Nov. 29 and knocked off Princeton in the Hoophall Miami Invitational on Dec. 2.

Miami plays six ACC opponents (10 games total) that competed in 2017 NCAA Tournament, including reigning national champion North Carolina.

Miami competes in the Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic Dec. 22-25. The 2017 edition of the classic features five NCAA tournament participants from the past season in Miami, Middle Tennessee, New Mexico State, Princeton and Southern California.

MILES WILSON JOINS MIAMI PROGRAM

Jim Larrañaga added Miles Wilson to the Hurricanes' incoming class of 2017. A 6-foot-5-inch transfer from Mount St. Mary's, Wilson will sit out the 2017-18 season because of NCAA transfer rules, then have three years of eligibility with the Hurricanes.

Wilson averaged 11.8 points per game and 3.9 rebounds in 28.9 minutes per game and was named to the Northeast Conference All-Rookie Team.

In the NCAA Tournament's First Four, Wilson scored 17 points and grabbed 11 rebounds in a 67-66 win over New Orleans before recording a game-high 22 points with seven rebounds against top-seeded Villanova.

CANES SEEK ANOTHER 20-WIN CAMPAIGN

Jim Larrañaga posted five 20-win seasons in his first six years at The U and 11 career 20-win seasons. The 21-win campaign in 2016-17 was Miami's eighth 20-win season since joining the ACC (2004-05). Larrañaga is just the second coach in Miami history with five 20-win seasons, joining Bruce Hale (1954-67).

The Canes won seven or more ACC games in each of Larrañaga's first six seasons and have had 10 or more league victories in four years. Prior to Larrañaga's arrival, Miami had never won 10 ACC games in a season.

SUCCESS FOR BOTH MIAMI BASKETBALL TEAMS

The Miami men's and women's basketball teams both landed in the NCAA Tournament for the second straight season in 2017, the first time both Miami basketball teams played in The Dance in consecutive years.

Miami was one of seven schools, four of which are in the ACC, with both its men's and women's basketball teams ranked in the preseason USA TODAY Coaches Poll. The others on the list were Baylor, Duke, Louisville, Notre Dame, UCLA and West Virginia.

LARRAÑAGA 12TH IN WINS AMONG ACTIVE **DIVISION I NCAA COACHES**

Entering the 2017-18 season, Jim Larrañaga ranks 12th in career wins among active Division I coaches with 609. Of those 12, five are in the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame, including four from the Atlantic Coast Conference.

Now in his 34th season as a head coach, Larrañaga ranks 47th in all-time NCAA victories.

In his career, Larrañaga won 27 games at American International, 170 at Bowling Green, 273 at George Mason and 139 at Miami. He is one of 15 coaches alltime with 100 or more wins at three D-I schools, four of whom are actively coaching.




