EXHIBITION STORY LINES

- · After capturing its series with Wright State, Miami travels to Jupiter for its annual exhibition vs. the Marlins on March 3.
- Miami dropped last year's matchup 5-2 at Roger Dean Stadium (Feb. 26). Zack Collins hit a solo home run in the loss.
- Jim Morris became just the eighth coach in Division I baseball history to accumulate 1,400 wins last year. With a 25-4
 win over Rutgers in early February, Morris moved into eighth in all-time wins (1,439) for any coach at a four-year college.
- Miami is ranked in the top 25 of every major college baseball poll. The Hurricanes check in at #10 in Perfect Game's top 25, #11 by Baseball America, #13 by NCBWA, #16 in the Coaches Poll, #19 by D1Baseball & #23 in Collegiate Baseball.
- UM finished its recent four-game homestand with a 3-1 record, and has a 7-1 record at Mark Light Field this season.
- Garrett Kennedy hit UM's first walk-off homer since April 7, 2012 (Esteban Tresgallo, UNC) in Game 1 vs. Wright State.
- Junior George Iskenderian and sophomore Zack Collins are the only two players to have reached base in all 12 games.
- Junior Ricky Eusebio leads the team in multiple categories: average (.405), runs (14), walks (13), OBP (.582) & steals (6).
 All-American closer Bryan Garcia's stat line: two saves, 0.00 ERA, 1-0 record and opposing batting average of .077.
- A number of Hurricanes have earned 2015 Preseason All-America accolades, including Zack Collins, Bryan Garcia, Andrew
- Suarez & David Thompson. Collins was a unanimous first-team selection on all major Preseason All-America lists.

 Miami captured the 2014 ACC Baseball Regular Season Championship, finishing atop the ACC with a 24-6 record.
- UM earned one of 16 NCAA Regional host sites in 2014, extending its own postseason record to 42 consecutive years.



THE HURRICANES SKIPPER

Entering his 22nd season at Miami, few programs have qualified for the College World Series as much as Jim Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament an NCAA-record 42 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 21 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006.

Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 937-368-3 (.717) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,441-635-4 (.694) Division I record in 33 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 36 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,572-675-4 (.698) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 20 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium project.

MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

Jim Morris earned his 30th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2014 when he guided the Canes to one of 16 host spots in the tournament. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 21 seasons (1994-2014), winning 15 of those appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (1994-2006) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.

Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris led the 2014 Hurricanes to their 42nd-straight NCAA Tournament. Despite six signees being drafted in the 2013 MLB Draft, the Hurricanes reeled in a top-fve recruiting class by national publications, with Zack Collins named *Baseball America* National Freshman of the Year under his direction in 2014.

MORRIS IN 36th SEASON AS HEAD COACH

Morris entered 2015 as the fourth-winningest active coach in Division I baseball with 1,435 wins. He wasted little time in moving up the record books, moving into sole possession of eighth-place in all-time wins (1,439) on Feb. 15 with a 25-4 win over Rutgers. Morris won his 1,500th game as a head coach in Miami's 4-1 upset of No. 1 North Carolina on March 15, 2013 in Chapel Hill, N.C.

Morris reached two coaching milestones in the first half of the 2014 season. He became just the eighth Division I coach to reach 1,400 wins in a 5-2 win over Boston College on March 8, and won his 900th game at Miami in a 7-1 upset of No. 3 Virginia on March 22.

Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 victory on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later, he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including time at DeKalb College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern in March 2001.



MAJOR LEAGUE GUIDANCE

Over 150 professional baseball players have played under Morris during their college careers at Miami, Georgia Tech and DeKalb.

Among the players Morris coached at Miami that went on to play in the Major Leagues were Yonder Alonso (San Diego), Ryan Braun (Milwaukee), Pat Burrell (Tampa Bay), Alex Cora (New York Mets), Yasmani Grandal (San Diego), Bobby Hill (San Diego), Aubrey Huff (Detroit), Ryan Jackson (St. Louis), Chris Perez (Cleveland), Cesar Carrillo (San Diego), Brian Barton (St. Louis), Eddy Rodriguez (San Diego), Gaby Sanchez (Florida), Blake Tekotte (Chicago White Sox), Charlton Jimerson (Houston), Jay Tessmer (New York Yankees), Danny Valencia (Minnesota Twins), Jon Jay (St. Louis), Danny Graves (Cincinnati) and Jason Michaels (Houston).

Standout players under Morris from his days at Georgia Tech were Nomar Garciaparra (Los Angeles Dodgers), Jay Payton (Oakland A's) and Jason Varitek (Boston Red Sox).

Morris has also enjoyed success on the International scene. From 1989-90, Morris served as head coach of the USA Baseball team that won a Silver Medal in the 1989 Presidential Cup (Taiwan), Bronze Medal at the Goodwill Games and the 1990 International Baseball Association (IBA) World All-Star Game in Atlanta. At the Goodwill Games, his USA squad won two of three games against Cuba, marking the first time in history a senior-level team won a series with Cuba. In 1987, Morris served as pitching coach under Ron Fraser at the Pan American Games (Silver Medal).

Coach Morris and his wife Nhan live in Miami with their three-year old son, James W. Morris IV (Will).









EXHIBITION NEWS & NOTES

HURRICANES, MARLINS AT ROGER DEAN

- The Miami Hurricanes will face off against the Miami Marlins in the annual exhibition between the two teams at Roger Dean Stadium in Jupiter. First pitch for Tuesday's exhibition is set for 1:05 p.m.
- UM fell to the Marlins in last season's matchup, dropping a 5-2 decision at Roger Dean Stadium. Zack Collins connected on a solo home run in the defeat.
- The Hurricanes were the first team to face the Marlins at Marlins Park, when the two teams met in a stadium-opening exhibition on March 6, 2012.
- Miami's last victory over the Marlins came on Feb. 27, 2011 in Jupiter, when the Hurricanes pulled away with a 9-8 win. The Marlins have an all-time series lead of 10-2-1.

HEATING UP

- Miami captured its sixth straight home series victory dating back to 2014, taking two of three from reigning Horizon League regular season champions Wright State to improve its record to 8-4.
- Among Miami's top performers against the Raiders: Ricky Eusebio (5-for-10 at the plate), Carl Chester (.429, six hits, solo home run) and Willie Abreu (.429, six hits, walk-off single in game two).
- George Iskenderian is hitting .333 (6-for-18) over the last five games, including three steals and a team-high five runs scored.
- Freshman lefthander Michael Mediavilla has allowed just one run in his six appearances this season (1.69 ERA), with seven strikeouts compared to just one walk.

MILESTONES FOR MORRIS

- After leading his team to a 44-19 record in 2014, head coach Jim Morris moved into ninth place all-time in college baseball history (regardless of Division, four-year colleges) with 1,435 wins.
- Morris wasted little time in moving up that list in 2015, taking over **sole possession of eighth place** when Miami topped Rutgers 25-4 on Feb. 15, 2015 - his 1,439th win as head coach.
- Morris ranks as the fourth-winningest among active Division I coaches by career victories (1,443) and fifth in winning percentage (.694). He is also the second-winningest coach in ACC history.
- Morris became just the eighth coach in the history of Division I baseball to accumulate 1,400 wins when Miami beat Boston College 5-2 on March 8, 2014. Two weeks later, Morris won his 900th game at Miami in a 7-1 upset of No. 3 Virginia on March 22.

ONE-TWO PUNCH

- Despite the graduation of leadoff hitter Dale Carey and two-hole Tyler Palmer - who combined in those roles in 62 of 63 games in 2014 - freshman Carl Chester and junior Ricky Eusebio have delivered in their places.
- Chester opened his career on a seven-game hitting streak, has a team-leading two home runs & 26 total bases, six RBI and a .491 slugging percentage - third-best among regulars.
- Eusebio is reaching base at a .582 clip to open the season, with a .405 AVG (15-for-37) and 13 walks compared to just 4 strikeouts.
- Chester & Eusebio give UM a speedy duo at the top of the order -Eusebio is a perfect 6-for-6 on steals, while Chester has five extra base hits - tied for the team lead.

EXHIBITION NEWS & NOTES

HIGH EXPECTATIONS

- After capturing the 2014 ACC Regular Season Championship, the Hurricanes enter 2015 ranked in the top 15 of every major college baseball preseason poll. Miami's highest ranking is No. 8 by Baseball America.
- Miami is also ranked No. 10 by Perfect Game, No. 14 by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper, No. 14 in the USA Today Coaches Poll and No. 14 by D1Baseball.com.
- The Hurricanes will feature a number of Preseason All-Americans on Opening Weekend, including reigning 2014 ACC Freshman of the Year Zack Collins (consensus), All-ACC closer Bryan Garcia and Washington Nationals' second-rounder & staff ace Andrew Suarez.
- Miami's recruiting class was ranked No. 2 nationwide by Perfect Game, and includes MLB Draft picks: George Iskenderian (34th round), OF Carl Chester (38th) and LHP Michael Mediavilla (40th).

PICKING UP WHERE HE LEFT OFF

- Then-freshman Bryan Garcia was named the team's closer just prior to the 2014 season opener and rewarded the coaching staff with an All-American campaign (NCBWA, third team).
- Garcia has two saves, five appearances, and has not allowed a run in 5.0 innings. He has four strikeouts compared to just one walk, and is holding opponents to a 0.77 average.
- An All-ACC Second Team selection as a reliever. Garcia set the Miami freshman saves record and tied for 11th-most saves nationally with 15 in 2014. He was a consensus Freshman All American first-team selection at reliever.
- Garcia, whose 15 saves were tied for the seventh-most in a single season in UM history, was named a 2015 Preseason All American by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper and Perfect Game.

SPIKES & STOPPER WATCH LISTS

- In addition to Preseason All-America accolades, Zack Collins and **Andrew Suarez** were among the 50 players on the **watch list** for the USA Baseball Golden Spikes Award.
- Miami was one of just seven programs with multiple players on the watch list for the Golden Spikes Award. The only Spikes winner in program history is Pat Burrell (1998).
- Sophomore closer Bryan Garcia was named to NCBWA's Stopper of the Year watch list, recognizing the top closer in the country.

DEATH. TAXES & THE NCAA POSTSEASON

- The Miami Hurricanes extended their own college baseball record with their 42nd consecutive trip to the NCAA postseason in 2014. Miami has not missed the postseason since 1973.
- The Hurricanes' 42 straight trips to the NCAA postseason are the longest active postseason streak of any Division I program in any sport nationwide.
- Jim Morris has led teams to the NCAA postseason in 30 straight years - all 21 years at Miami and his final nine years at Georgia Tech.

- Senior **Garrett Kennedy** connected on a two-run, two-out home run on Feb. 27, while **Willie Abreu** won the game on a bases-loaded single on Feb. 28.
- Miami has played **four one-run games in 2015**, and is 2-2 in those contests. The opening stretch continues a trend from last season for the Hurricanes, **who were 16-3 in one-run games in 2014**.

A WEEKEND OF FIRSTS

- A number of Hurricanes made their debuts in Miami's sweep of Rutgers, while two newcomers made their first career starts: **Carl Chester** (left field) and **George Iskenderian** (shortstop).
- Five Hurricanes recorded their first hits: Chester, Iskenderian, outfielder Malik Rosier, outfielder Justin Smith and catcher Peter Crocitto.
- Four Hurricanes made their first career appearances on the mound: Daniel Briggi, Andy Honiotes, Jesse Lepore and Michael Mediavilla. The four combined to allow just one earned run in six innings.
- Junior Enrique Sosa struck out 10 batters in his first career start against Rutgers, while Rosier connected on his first career home run a solo blast in Sunday's finale.

"THE LIGHT" RANKED AMONG BEST PARKS

- In recent rankings released by Stadium Journey, Alex Rodriguez at Mark Light Field was **ranked the No. 27 overall experience** and **second-best experience** in all of college baseball.
- Miami drew over 100,000 fans to "The Light" in 2014, averaging over 2,500 fans per game. The Hurricanes finished 23-10 at home last season.
- The famous "Mark Light Milkshake" stand has begun its **30th year of operation in 2015**. In 2013, the 250,000th milkshake was sold follow @MarkLightShake on Twitter and Instagram for more.

ACC TOURNEY IN DURHAM THROUGH 2018

- The ACC Championship will be held at Durham Bulls Athletic
 Park through the 2018 season, the conference office announced. The tournament had alternated between Greensboro and Durham in recent years.
- The ACC Baseball Championship has been held in Durham eight times previously, including three of the past six years. In 2013, tournament records for single-game attendance (11,329) and championship game attendance (8,697) were set.
- Miami was the top seed at last year's ACC Championship after finishing No. 1 in the conference with a 24-6 record in ACC play.
 The Hurricanes have not missed the ACC Championship since joining the conference prior to the 2005 baseball season.
