MIDWEEK STORY LINES

- After wrapping up a seven-game homestand, No. 11 Miami will make the short trip to Boca Raton for the season series rubber match against FAU. The Hurricanes captured a 2-1 win last Wednesday against FAU, but fell 5-2 in game one.
- Miami leads the all-time series over the Owls by a 54-12 record, including seven of the last 10 head-to-head match-ups.
- Miami is ranked in the top 25 in every major college baseball poll. The Hurricanes check in at No. 11 in *Collegiate Baseball Newspaper's* rankings, No. 15 in *Baseball America*, No. 19 in the *USA Today* Coaches Poll and No. 19 by NCBWA.
- Bolstered by their recent 14-game winning streak, Miami has already surpassed their 2013 ACC win total (14) with a 16-5 record in league play. Miami is in a three-way tie for the best record in the ACC with No. 1 Virginia and No. 4 FSU.
- Miami is rated No. 23 in the latest *WarrenNolan.com* RPI projections (April 22), and the team boasts nine wins against teams in the top 100 RPI. The Hurricanes' strength of schedule is rated No. 39 by Warren Nolan with three ACC series left.
- Head coach Jim Morris won his 900th game as Hurricanes skipper in the team's series-opening victory over No. 3 Virginia (March 22). He also won his 1,400th game as Division I coach during Miami's sweep of Boston College (March 8).
- The Hurricanes have not lost a game started by junior lefthander Chris Diaz dating back to May 24, 2013 - a stretch of 11 consecutive starts, including his first 10 of the 2014 season. Diaz is 6-0 and ranks 14th in the ACC with a 2.48 ERA.

3 JIM MORRIS HEAD COACH

THE HURRICANES SKIPPER

In his 21st season at Miami, few programs have qualified for the College World Series as much as Jim Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament an NCAA-record 41 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 20 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006.

Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 915-358-3 (.717) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,419-625-4 (.693) Division I record in 32 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 36 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,550-665-4 (.698) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 20 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium project.

MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

Jim Morris earned his 29th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2013 when he guided the Canes to a No. 2 seed in the Louisville [Ky.] Regional. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 20 seasons (1994-2013), winning 15 of those appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.

Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris led the 2013 Hurricanes to their 41st-straight NCAA Tournament. Despite six signees being drafted in the 2013 MLB Draft, the Hurricanes reeled in a top 5 recruiting class by national publications.

MORRIS IN 36th SEASON AS HEAD COACH

Morris entered 2014 as the fifth-winningest active coach in Division I baseball with 1,391 wins. His impressive win total ranks him No. 12 all-time for any coach, regardless of division. Including his time at DeKalb C.C., Morris won his 1,500th game as a head coach in Miami's 4-1 upset of No. 1 North Carolina on March 15, 2013 in Chapel Hill, N.C.

Morris reached two coaching milestones in the first half of the 2014 season. He became just the eighth Division I coach to reach 1,400 wins in a 5-2 win over Boston College on March 8, and won his 900th game at Miami in a 7-1 upset of No. 3 Virginia on March 22.

Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later, he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern in March 2001



MAJOR LEAGUE GUIDANCE

Over 150 professional baseball players have played under Morris during their college careers at Miami, Georgia Tech and DeKalb.

Among the players Morris coached at Miami that went on to play in the Major Leagues were Yonder Alonso (San Diego), Ryan Braun (Milwaukee), Pat Burrell (Tampa Bay), Alex Cora (New York Mets), Yasmani Grandal (San Diego), Bobby Hill (San Diego), Aubrey Huff (Detroit), Ryan Jackson (St. Louis), Chris Perez (Cleveland), Cesar Carrillo (San Diego), Brian Barton (St. Louis), Eddy Rodriguez (San Diego), Gaby Sanchez (Florida), Blake Tekotte (Chicago White Sox), Charlton Jimerson (Houston), Jay Tessmer (New York Yankees), Danny Valencia (Minnesota Twins), Jon Jay (St. Louis), Danny Graves (Cincinnati) and Jason Michaels (Houston).

Standout players under Morris from his days at Georgia Tech were Nomar Garciaparra (Los Angeles Dodgers), Jay Payton (Oakland A's) and Jason Varitek (Boston Red Sox).

Morris has also enjoyed success on the International scene. From 1989-90, Morris served as head coach of the USA Baseball team that won a Silver Medal in the 1989 Presidential Cup (Taiwan), Bronze Medal at the Goodwill Games and the 1990 International Baseball Association (IBA) World All-Star Game in Atlanta. At the Goodwill Games, his USA squad won two of three games against Cuba, marking the first time in history a senior-level team won a series with Cuba. In 1987, Morris served as pitching coach under Ron Fraser at the Pan American Games (Silver Medal).

MIDWEEK NEWS & NOTES

ROAD TRIPPING...

- After capturing their **fourth straight ACC series** by taking two of three games **against Notre Dame**, Miami will open a **brief four-game road swing** with a trip to nearby **FAU Wed., April 23**.
- Wednesday's matchup against the Owls will represent the **rubber match of the season series**. Miami dropped the opener 5-2 on Feb. 19 at Mark Light Field but **won last week's matchup** (April 16) at home by the final score of 2-1.
- Though their recent 14-game overall winning streak was snapped this past weekend, the Hurricanes **are tied** for the nation's **longest road winning streak** (eight games). Miami has a 16-5 record in league play - **tied for the best mark in the ACC**.

STREAKING SUCCESS...

- By capturing its **series finale** 7-2 against Pittsburgh (April 13), Miami completed its **third consecutive three-game ACC sweep** - the **first time the Hurricanes have accomplished the feat** since joining the conference in 2004.
- Miami ran its winning streak to **14 consecutive games**, but lost to Notre Dame in game two of it ACC series (**April 20**). The streak, which **help propel Miami to a tie for first place in the ACC**, was the program's longest since a **similar 14-game stretch in 2008**.
- Miami set a new **program record with 10 consecutive ACC wins** during the 14-game winning streak, besting the previous long (**nine consecutive**) by one win. The Hurricanes **have already topped their 2013 conference win total** (14) with three ACC weekends remaining.

HEATING UP...

- Since the start of Miami's winning streak on March 24, freshman slugger **Zack Collins** has turned it up a notch. Collins is **hitting at a .383 clip** over the past 16 games since, and leads all hitters with **21 RBI over that span**. The **next highest RBI total** during Miami's streak is 9 (Brad Fieger).
- Senior **Dale Carey** has moved his season average above .300 (.306) by hitting **.346 (22-for-63) over the team's past 16 games**. He is reaching **base at a .453 clip** and **slugging .476** since March 24, where Miami has gone an impressive 15-1.
- Another hitter who has impressed **over recent stretch** is senior Tyler Palmer (.300 over his last five games), who knocked in the **game-tying run on an RBI triple** against Notre Dame (April 21) and **scored the game-winning run** in the bottom of the eighth.

MILESTONES FOR MORRIS...

- **Head coach Jim Morris** became just the **eighth coach in the history of Division I baseball** to accumulate **1,400 wins** when Miami beat Boston College 5-2 on **March 8**.
- Two weeks later, **Morris won his 900th game** with the Hurricanes in a 7-1 upset of No. 3 Virginia on March 22. Morris ranks second in wins in Miami history **behind the late Ron Fraser (1,267)**.
- **Morris ranks fourth** among active **Division I coaches in career victories (1,419)** and **eighth all-time** in the category. He is also the **second-winningest coach in ACC history**.

BUILDING A RESUME...

- Miami used its recent 14-game winning streak, including four consecutive ACC sweeps, to **vault to No. 23** in the latest *Warren Nolan Top 25 RPI* (April 22).
- Miami has **nine wins** against teams in the *Warren Nolan Top 100 RPI*, including a series victory over **No. 1 Florida**, road win over **No. 2 Florida State**, a win over **No. 5 Virginia**, a road win against **No. 27 Georgia Tech**, a road sweep of **No. 58 NC State**.
- With a challenging ACC slate remaining including weekends against **No. 32 Clemson** and **No. 48 North Carolina**, Miami's strength of schedule is rated **No. 39** by *Warren Nolan*.

FRESHMEN PHENOMS...

- **Six freshmen** saw the field in Miami's 2-1 victory against FAU on April 16: **Zack Collins** (catcher), **Willie Abreu** (right field), **Johnny Ruiz** (third base) and **Sebastian Diaz** (designated hitter) in the field, as well as pitchers **Bryan Garcia** and **Cooper Hammond**.
- The four field freshmen combined for **all four of Miami's hits** in the game, including a **two-RBI double** from **Ruiz** that proved to be the gamewinner. The rest of the team (**non-freshmen**) went **0-for-13**.
- **Garcia** reeled in his **11th save** of the spring in the victory, while **Hammond** made an **appearance out of the bullpen** for the **eighth straight game**. **Garcia** ranks **second** in the **ACC** with **11 saves**.

DIAZ DOMINATING...

- The Hurricanes have **won every one of Chris Diaz' starts** in 2014, including victories over **No. 6 Florida (2/14)**, **No. 4 FSU (2/28)**, **No. 1 Virginia (3/22)** and **No. 25 NC State (3/28)**. Miami has **not lost a game** started by Diaz since the **2013 ACC Tournament** in a 7-1 loss to NC State (May 24).
- **Diaz picked up his third win over a ranked opponent** this season in a 7-1 victory over **No. 1 Virginia** (March 22). Diaz has earned a win in **six of his 10 starts** and is tied for third in the ACC with **six wins**. He ranks **14th in the ACC** with a **2.48 ERA**.
- **Diaz, who ranked second in the ACC in ERA in 2013 (1.64)**, did not pick up his **sixth win of the 2013 season until May 17** against Georgia Tech. He finished 2013 with a **7-5 record**.

CALLED UP CANES...

- Miami's current **nine Major League players** are tied for the **most of any school in the ACC** (North Carolina) and the third-most of any program nationwide. The Hurricanes trail only **Arizona State (11)** and **Long Beach State (10)** in Major League players.
- Seven former Miami Hurricanes found themselves on **2014 MLB Opening Day** rosters: **Yonder Alonso** (San Diego), **Ryan Braun** (Milwaukee), **Yasmani Grandal** (San Diego), **Jon Jay** (St. Louis), **Chris Perez** (Los Angeles Dodgers), **Gaby Sanchez** (Pittsburgh) and **Danny Valencia** (Kansas City).
- **Jemile Weeks** (Baltimore) and **Chris Herrmann** (Minnesota) opened the season on their respective team's 40-man rosters, and were **called up from AAA** within the first two weeks of the season.

MIDWEEK NEWS & NOTES

#CARDIACCANES...

• Miami is 9-1 in one-run games in 2014, including wins in a road sweep of Virginia Tech (April 4+5), a 6-5 victory decided in the ninth at UCF (April 9), an extra-innings win over Pittsburgh (April 12) and its most recent 3-2 walk-off win over Notre Dame (April 19).

• Through their first 41 games (28-13), the Hurricanes have scored 106 of their 222 runs (47.7%) in the sixth inning or later. Miami is 8-7 when its opponent scores first and have played four extra inning games (2-2).

• Freshman slugger Zack Collins has had the game-winning hit in three of Miami's one-run games, including both of Miami's first two wins over Virginia Tech (April 4+5). Freshman Willie Abreu delivered a walk-off single a win against Pittsburgh (April 12), while Brad Fieger delivered a walk-off sacrifice fly against Notre Dame (April 19)

POWER SURGE...

• Miami is tied for sixth in the ACC with 17 home runs after hitting just 14 in all of 2013. Freshman Zack Collins leads the team and is tied for fourth in the ACC with six homers, while Dale Carey is tied for eighth in the conference with five.

• The Hurricanes (74) are one of just five teams in the ACC that will enter the week with 70 or more doubles, joining Clemson (83), Florida State (77), Georgia Tech (75) and Maryland (71).

• The offense already has four multi-homerun games this season (after recording just two in all of 2013): games one and two against Florida (Feb. 21 & 22), game one against Georgia Tech (March 14) and game three against NC State (March 30). Miami is 4-0 when hitting more than one home run.

• Zack Collins recorded the first multi-home run game for the Hurricanes since Peter O'Brien accomplished the feat in 2012 in Miami's 12-5 win over NC State (March 30). He drove in six runs in the win.

SIMPLY PERFECT ...

• Senior RHP Javi Salas hurled just the second perfect game in program history and the 23rd in modern NCAA Division I history (since 1957) in a 17-0 shutout of Villanova on March 4.

• Salas needed just 113 pitches to get through his outing, scattering six strikeouts across his night of perfection. His perfect game was the first for a Miami pitcher since Kevin Sheary accomplished the feat on March 4, 1987.

• Miami's two perfect games are tied with Auburn and Iowa for the second-most of any program all-time behind Washington State.

CANES LEGENDS RECOGNIZED...

• Alex Fernandez and Mike Fiore will be among the seven-member Class of 2014 to be inducted into the College Baseball Hall of Fame, the College Baseball Foundation announced.

• They will join Ron Fraser (2006), Skip Bertman (2006) and Neal Heaton (2009) as College Baseball Hall of Fame inductees from Miami.

• Fernandez was named Freshman of the Year and a first-team All-American in 1989, where he won 15 games with a 2.01 ERA and 177 strikeouts in 147 innings. A four-year UM starter, Fiore set 12 UM career batting marks, including hits (341) and runs (258).
