THE GAME

- The Miami Hurricanes continue their first season under the direction of head coach Manny Diaz on Sat., Sept. 7 against ACC Coastal foe North Carolina in Chapel Hill, N.C. Start time for the conference opener for both teams is set for 8 p.m. on ACC Network live from Kenan Stadium.
- The game will be Miami's first ever broadcast on the new ACC Network with Dave O'Brien (play by play), Tim Hasselbeck (color) and Katie George (sideline) on the call. Joe Zagacki (pxp) and Don Bailey, Jr. (color) are in the 560 WQAM radio booth for their 18th season together, while Josh Darrow will handle the sideline duty. Alfredo Alvarez (pxp) and Jose Martinez (color) will also carry the game live on WMYM 990 AM.

THE SERIES

- The series between the two programs is tied, 11-11; the two schools have met every single year since Miami joined the ACC prior to the 2004 season.
- Miami has won two straight matchups in the series, including a dominant 47-10 win last year that featured three UM defensive touchdowns.
- Neither program has won three straight matchups in the series since the Tar Heels did it from 2007-09. Prior to 2004, the two teams had not met since 1963. North Carolina leads the series in Chapel Hill, 5-3, while Miami leads the all-time series 8-6 in games played at home vs. the Tar Heels.

THE HURRICANES

- Miami returns 12 starters and 39 letterwinners from a 2018 team that finished with a trip to the New Era Pinstripe Bowl in New York, N.Y. **Mark Richt** announced his retirement at season's end, and **Manny Diaz** was named the 25th head coach in University of Miami program history on Jan. 2.
- The Hurricanes dropped their season opener against #8/#8 Florida on Aug. 24, falling to the Gators, 24-20, at Camping World Stadium in Orlando.
- On Aug. 12, Diaz named redshirt freshman **Jarren Williams** Miami's starting quarterback for the season. Williams, who beat out redshirt sophomores **Tate Martell** and **N'Kosi Perry** in a three-man battle during training camp, made his first career start against the Gators on Aug. 24 and finished 19-for-30 for 214 yards and one passing touchdown. He was the first UM freshman to start a season opener since **Brad Kaaya** in 2014.
- UM debuted the latest 'Turnover Chain' - sporting a gaudy '305' charm - and its 'Touchdown Rings,' a reward for offensive touchdowns, in the opener.
- Miami had eight players earn major preseason accolades, including multiple players named to more than one major award watch list. Among them were LB **Shaq Quarterman** (Butkus Award, Bednarik Award), DL **Jonathan Garvin** (Bednarik, Walter Camp POY) and WR **K.J. Osborn** (Biletnikoff).
- Diaz, who spent the previous three seasons as defensive coordinator for the Hurricanes (2016-18), retooled Miami's offensive staff upon his hire, bringing **Dan Enos** from Alabama as offensive coordinator and hiring four other new coaches for offense. He hired longtime colleague **Blake Baker**, who spent the last four seasons at Louisiana Tech, as defensive coordinator and added **Todd Stroud** as assistant head coach / defensive line coach.

THE OPPONENT

- North Carolina is under the direction of **Mack Brown**, who is in the first season of his second stint with the Heels and 31st season as a head coach.
- The Heels opened their season on Aug. 31 against South Carolina in Charlotte, N.C., winning, 24-20, vs. the Gamecocks at Bank of America Stadium.
- The Tar Heels were led on offense by true freshman QB Sam Howell, who threw for 245 yards and two touchdowns in his first career start at UNC.

QUICK HITS

UM OPENS ACC PLAY ON TOBACCO ROAD

- Miami plays its first conference game under under head coach **Manny Diaz** in a Sept. 7 matchup at North Carolina. Miami has opened its ACC schedule with the Tar Heels in back-to-back years; UM thumped the Heels, 47-10, in last year's matchup.
- Miami has a 9-6 record all-time in ACC openers since joining the conference in 2004, including wins in all three ACC openers while Diaz was defensive coordinator under **Mark Richt** from 2016-18.
- The Hurricanes will be opening ACC play on the road for the fifth time in six years (2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2019).
- Miami is opening ACC play with UNC for the third time; in addition to last year's win, UM fell, at home, 24-28 on Sept. 27, 2008.

QB WILLIAMS IMPRESSES IN FIRST START

- Redshirt freshman **Jarren Williams** made the first start of his collegiate career on Sat., Aug. 24 against Florida. Williams finished 19-for-30 for 214 yards and 1 TD.
- Williams beat out QBs **Tate Martell** and **N'Kosi Perry** in a three-man battle and was named starting QB on Mon., Aug. 12.
- Williams, a consensus four-star prospect in high school, saw action in one game in 2018 vs. Savannah State (Sept. 8).
- Williams was ranked among the top-10 dual-threat passers in the Class of 2018 by every scouting service, and was ranked the No. 106 overall prospect by ESPN.
- The Lawrenceville, Ga., native picked UM over offers from Ohio State, Alabama, Florida and Georgia, among others.

CHAIN RETURNS, TD RINGS MAKE DEBUT

- One of the most recognizable sights in all of college football over the last two seasons, the latest version of the turnover chain was on full display in Miami's opener vs. Florida.
- The new chain, sporting a 10-inch '305' charm that contains more than 2,000 white sapphire stones, was worn four times vs. the Gators, including the first-ever appearance when DL **Scott Patchan** recovered a fumble.
- The season opener vs. the Gators also served as the debut for Miami's offensive reward: the touchdown rings, which combine to spell out "Hurricanes".
- The touchdown rings were first worn by TE **Brevin Jordan** and were later worn by RB **DeeJay Dallas**, who scored on a 50-yard touchdown run out of the 'Wildcat.'

MIAMI OPENS ACC PLAY ON TOBACCO ROAD VERSUS NORTH CAROLINA

- Miami opens Atlantic Coast Conference play on the road for the fifth time in the past six years when it battles North Carolina at Kenan Stadium in Chapel Hill, N.C., on Sept. 7. Kickoff is set for 8 p.m.
- The Hurricanes will be opening their conference schedule against the Tar Heels for the second straight year and for the third time ever; Miami toppled UNC, 47-10, at Hard Rock Stadium last year.
- Miami has won back-to-back meetings vs. the Tar Heels, but the all-time series is tied, 11-11. The two programs have met every year since Miami joined the ACC (2004), with UM leading, 8-7, since then.
- The Hurricanes are opening their season with two straight games away from home for the first time since 2012, when UM traveled to Boston College and Kansas State for the first two games of the year.
- Miami will be playing its first game ever broadcast on the ACC Network when it travels to play UNC.
- Head coach **Manny Diaz** will be squaring off against his former boss at Texas, Mack Brown, who is back at North Carolina after a five-year hiatus from coaching. Diaz worked at Texas from 2011-13.

HURRICANES HAVE CRUISED IN ACC OPENERS SINCE DIAZ'S ARRIVAL

- Ever since his arrival as a member of **Mark Richt**'s staff in January 2016, **Manny Diaz** and the Miami Hurricanes have cruised through ACC openers, compiling a perfect 3-0 mark in three seasons.
- In Diaz's three years as defensive coordinator, the Canes dominated at Georgia Tech (2016), at Duke (2017) and at home vs. North Carolina (2018), winning those games by an average of 25.3 points.
- Miami has a 9-6 all-time record in ACC openers and have opened play on the road nine times (5-4).
- Diaz's unit was a big reason for Miami's win last year, as his defensive group came up with three touchdowns in a 47-10 rout. The Hurricanes defense recorded six turnovers in the victory and its three defensive TDs tied a program mark, set Sept. 23, 2000 - in a 47-10 victory at West Virginia.

WILLIAMS WINS QUARTERBACK BATTLE, WILL MAKE SECOND START

- QB **Jarren Williams** was announced as Miami's starting quarterback by head coach Manny Diaz on Monday, Aug. 12 after winning a quarterback battle that started in spring ball and lasted into camp.
- In his first start as quarterback vs. Florida on Aug. 24, Williams finished 19-for-30 for 214 yards and the first passing TD of his career. He became UM's seventh freshman QB to start a game since 2008.
- Williams beat out QBs **Tate Martell** and **N'Kosi Perry** for the starting spot. Williams will make the second start of his career on Sept. 7 against North Carolina; he is the first freshman to start a season opener since **Brad Kaaya** started as a true freshman against Louisville on Labor Day weekend 2014.
- Williams saw action in one game as a substitute during his true freshman year; he finished 1-for-3 with one 17-yard pass and a one-yard rushing touchdown against Savannah State on Sept. 8, 2018.
- A consensus four-star prospect out of Central Gwinnett High School, Williams was ranked as the No. 6 dual threat quarterback by ESPN.com. He was a 2018 U.S. Army All-American Bowl selection.
- Williams chose Miami over Alabama, Auburn, Florida, Georgia and Ohio State, among other schools.

TURNOVER CHAIN 3.0 UNVEILED, TOUCHDOWN RINGS MAKE DEBUT

- When DL **Scott Patchan** pounced on a Gators fumble in the first quarter of Miami's game on Aug. 24, fans inside the stadium and across the country awaited the unveil of the newest Turnover Chain.
- The chain, which previously featured a charm in the shape of the iconic 'U' (2017) and Sebastian the Ibis (2018), features a 10-inch charm with the famous '305' Miami area code with more than 2,000 white sapphires; the charm weighs 500 grams. The chain took roughly three months to complete.
- In addition to Patchan, LB **Shaq Quarterman** (fumble recovery), S **Amari Carter** (interception) and striker **Romeo Finley** (interception) each wore the turnover chain in Miami's opener vs. the Gators.
- After QB **Jarren Williams** hit TE **Brevin Jordan** for a touchdown pass in the second quarter, the newest reward was showcased: the Touchdown Rings. Made mostly of orange and green sapphires, the Touchdown Rings weigh 100 grams and contain close to 500 stones between the pair.



DALLAS IMPRESSES IN FIRST GAME AS MIAMI'S STARTING RUNNING BACK

- After playing behind 2019 Seattle Seahawks' draft selection **Travis Homer** the last two years, RB **DeeJay Dallas** was listed as UM's starting running back after an impressive offseason and fall camp.
- In his first career start, Dallas had a game-high 131 all-purpose yards, including a game-high 94 rushing yards. He had a career-high four catches and scored on a 50-yard TD run out of the 'Wildcat' formation.
- Though he was not a starter last season, Dallas was all over the field for the Hurricanes. The Georgia native had the longest rush of any player (83 yards), the longest kick return of any player (53) and the longest punt return (65). He ranked first on the Hurricanes in all-purpose yards (1,260).
- Dallas ended the year second in rushing yards (617) and tied for the team lead with six rushing TDs.
- In 27 career games, Dallas has found the end zone 11 times (10 rushing TDs) despite starting one game.
- Dallas became a father this offseason; though his own name is Demetrius, he named his son DeeJay.

JORDAN HAS BIG OPENER, IS SETTING THE STANDARD AT #TIGHTENDU

- Playing his first season of college football, TE **Brevin Jordan** emerged as a go-to target in the Miami offense in 2018; Jordan was second in UM in receptions (32) and was second in touchdowns (four).
- Jordan was named to the All-ACC Second Team after a standout first year, starting 12 of 13 games.
- Jordan enjoyed a strong opener vs. Florida on Aug. 24, starting the game and finishing with a team-high five-catches for a career-best 88 yards and one TD, on a 25-yard pass from QB **Jarren Williams**.
- A Las Vegas native and high school teammate of QB **Tate Martell** and S **Bubba Bolden**, Jordan was named to the Mackey Award preseason watch list (nation's top tight end) and was preseason All-ACC.
- Jordan was named a Midseason Freshman All-America by ESPN. The talented sophomore was rated the No. 1 tight end in the country by ESPN.com and 247Sports.com and was the No. 2-rated TE by Rivals.
- Jordan and fellow sophomore **Will Mallory** are expected to play a major role in their first years under offensive coordinator **Dan Enos**. Jordan missed most of the spring due to an injury, helping Mallory earn major reps as the team's primary tight end. Redshirt junior **Michael Irvin II** will also be a key factor.

DIAZ SQUARING OFF AGAINST A FAMILIAR FOE FOR ANOTHER WEEK

- For the second straight week to open his career as University of Miami head coach, **Manny Diaz** will be competing against a former colleague. Diaz will face off against former boss Mack Brown, who was head coach at Texas during Diaz's tenure as defensive coordinator for the Longhorns from 2011-13.
- In his first game as head coach, Diaz was facing off against his former colleague Dan Mullen, now coach of the Gators, on Aug. 24. Diaz worked for Mullen for two seasons at Mississippi State (2010, 2015).
- Diaz left Starkville, Miss., to accepted the defensive coordinator job at Miami in January 2016.

OSBORN MAKES FIRST CAREER START, HAS BEEN LOCKER ROOM LEADER

- One of Miami's most important additions of the offseason was transfer **K.J. Osborn**, who transferred to Miami for his final year of eligibility after an impressive four-year career at Buffalo with the Bulls.
- Osborn was selected as one of two players to represent Miami at ACC Kickoff, the conference's annual media day, despite not having played a down at that point. Osborn has been cited by coaches and teammates as a key locker room influence. He was selected one of four captains for the Florida game.
- In his first ever game at The U, Osborn started and caught four passes for 41 yards - both second-most on Miami. He had a long catch of 18 yards and tied for third-most catches of any player in the game.
- In three seasons at Buffalo, Osborn totaled 1,490 yards and 12 touchdown receptions. He was a second-team All-MAC selection as a junior. Born in Ypsilanti, Mich., he went to IMG Academy for high school.

HURRICANES RETURN TO NORTH CAROLINA FOR FIRST TIME SINCE 2017

- Miami will be making its first trip to the state of North Carolina since the 2017 ACC Championship Game in Charlotte, N.C. Since joining the ACC prior to 2004, Miami has made traveled to the Tar Heel State on 21 occasions and has compiled a 14-7 record in games played in the state and a 13-6 mark in ACC games.
- The Hurricanes have played 19 games that count towards ACC standings in N.C. and two that haven't; one was a 45-10 win over Appalachian State in 2017, the other a loss to Clemson for the 2017 ACC title.
- The Hurricanes have averaged 30.66 points per game in its 21 trips to the state since the 2004 season.

NINE HURRICANES MAKE THEIR DEBUTS IN SEASON OPENER VS. FLORIDA

- Nine Hurricanes made their debuts in Miami's season opener vs. the Gators, including two players who started: LT **Zion Nelson** and WR **K.J. Osborn**. Nelson was one of just four freshmen to debut vs. Florida.
- Joining Nelson as true freshmen were DL **Jahfari Harvey**, DB **Te'Cory Couch** and DB **Christian Williams**.
- Osborn was among five players who transferred to Miami this offseason and made their debuts; the other who debuted were P **Louis Hedley**, DL **Trevon Hill**, QB **Tate Martell** and DL **Chigozie Nnoruka**.
- Hedley punted four times (42.5 yard average), Hill had two tackles and Osborn had four receptions.

HURRICANE FOOTBALL'S 94th SEASON OPENED WITH TRIP TO O-TOWN

- The Hurricanes kicked off their 94th season of football in 2019, road tripping to Orlando - their first trip there since the 2016 Russell Athletic Bowl. It was the earliest season opener in Miami history.
- Miami's first season of football came in 1926 and its 100th year of football is currently set for 2025.
- In the modern era of Miami Hurricanes football (since 1979), Miami has compiled a 30-11 record in season openers - UM's streak of three straight wins in openers came to an end in 2018 against LSU.

THREE-HEADED LINEBACKER MONSTER IN MIDST OF SENIOR CAMPAIGN

- Miami's three-headed monster - senior trio **Zach McCloud**, **Michael Pinckney** & **Shaq Quarterman** - has started nearly every game together since arriving to University of Miami as early enrollees in 2016.
- McCloud has started 31 of 40 games in his career. He has totaled 131 tackles and 12.5 tackles for loss.
- One of Miami's most instinctive players, Pinckney started all 12 of the games he played in last season and finished with 74 total tackles and 11.0 tackles for loss. He was named All-ACC Honorable Mention.
- Quarterman, who has started all 40 games for the Hurricanes in three-plus seasons at The U, ranked second on UM with 82 total tackles. An All-ACC first-team selection in 2018, he has 253 career tackles.
- All three linebackers elected to return for their senior seasons after Manny Diaz, their coordinator for all three seasons, was named head coach. The trio cited the importance of their collective legacy at Miami and a disappointing 2018 as key reasons for the return. Both Pinckney and Quarterman are on track to earn their undergraduate degrees; McCloud has begun work towards a master's degree.

DIAZ RETOOLS COACHING STAFF, HIRES DAN ENOS TO RUN OFFENSE

- In one of his first moves as head coach, **Manny Diaz** overhauled the Hurricanes' entire offensive staff. Diaz hired **Dan Enos** away from Alabama to serve as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach.
- Diaz added two former colleagues of Enos during his time as head coach of Central Michigan (2010-14): offensive line coach **Butch Barry**, most recently with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, and wide receivers coach **Taylor Stubblefield**, most recently with Air Force. Both worked for Enos at CMU.
- **Stephen Field**, who worked at Oregon last year, was hired to coach tight ends and **Eric Hickson**, who worked at Kansas State, was brought in to coach running backs. Both are south Florida natives.
- One of Diaz's most important additions was director of strength & conditioning **David Feeley**, who was hired from Temple. Feeley has been credited by players and staff for UM's successful offseason.

SEVERAL HURRICANES EARN MAJOR PRESEASON RECOGNITION

- Several Hurricanes on both sides of the ball were selected as players to watch for major awards entering 2019, including some who earned preseason All-America and all-conference recognition.

MASTERING "THE PORTAL" IN THE OFFSEASON WILL PAY DIVIDENDS

- Miami head coach Manny Diaz was able to successfully address areas of concern for the Hurricanes through the NCAA transfer portal this past offseason, adding several key players entering 2019.
- The Hurricanes added WR **K.J. Osborn**, who impressed in spring practices and during summer workouts. Osborn, who totaled over 1,400 yards in his career at Buffalo, represented Miami at ACC Kickoff - the conference's annual media day in Charlotte, N.C. He had 12 career TDs with the Bulls.
- Like Osborn, QB **Tate Martell** joined the Hurricanes in January and is listed as a co-backup at QB.
- Another key addition for Miami was DL **Trevon Hill**, who totaled 94 tackles, 20 tackles for loss and 11.5 sacks in two-plus seasons of playing time at Virginia Tech. Hill will play a major role on the d-line.
- Joining Hill on the line will be tackle **Chigozie Nnoruka**, who spent three seasons at UCLA before electing UM for his final season. In his junior season (2017), he had 49 tackles and 8.5 tackles for loss.
- Former Southern Cal safety **Bubba Bolden** was added to the roster in the middle of fall camp, while former five-star recruit **Jaelan Phillips** - who played two years at UCLA - will sit out the 2019 season.

BLAKE BAKER, A FAMILIAR FACE, WILL LEAD HURRICANES DEFENSE

- Miami head coach **Manny Diaz** hired longtime colleague **Blake Baker**, who spent the past four seasons as defensive coordinator at Louisiana Tech, to run the Hurricanes' unit in January 2019.
- Baker worked under Diaz at Louisiana Tech, serving as safeties coach when Diaz was the Bulldogs' defensive coordinator. He was also a two-year grad assistant under Diaz during his career at Texas.
- Baker's unit ranked No. 4 nationally in team sacks and No. 12 nationally in tackles for loss last season.
- In Baker's first game as coordinator, Miami's defense held Florida to just 50 rushing yards on Aug. 24. The Hurricanes forced four turnovers on two interceptions and two fumble recoveries vs. the Gators.

THOMAS BRINGS EXPLOSIVENESS, DEEP THREAT ABILITY INTO YEAR 3

- WR **Jeff Thomas** was among Miami's top offensive performers in his first two seasons at The U, racking up 2,132 all-purpose yards in just 24 games - an average of 88.83 yards per contest.
- Though he did not qualify due to having just nine returns last year, Thomas' average of 24.6 yards per punt return would have ranked No. 1 in all of FBS. He totaled 221 yards and had one touchdown.
- Thomas had the longest reception of any Hurricane last year - a 67-yard touchdown vs. Savannah State - and was involved in four plays of 50 yards or more, the most of any Hurricane in 2018.
- As a true freshman in 2017, Thomas had the two longest receptions of any Hurricane (78-yard TD, 70-yard catch). He has six career plays of 50-or-more yards (four catch, one punt return, one kick return).
- Thomas has three career 100-yard receiving games; his yardage high is 132 vs. LSU on Sept. 2, 2018.
- A four-star recruit out of high school, Thomas has led the Hurricanes in 'long plays' (20 yards or more) in both of his two seasons at The U. He had 22 such plays as a true freshman in 2017 and 22 last year.

DEFENSE WAS NATION'S BEST ON THIRD DOWN A SEASON AGO

- Miami ranked No. 4 in total defense in FBS last season, but no other defense performed better on third down. Miami's unit allowed opponents to convert on just 25.3% of their chances (47 / 186).
- Prior to 2018, then-defensive coordinator **Manny Diaz** said an offseason emphasis for his defense was performing better in the category. In 2017, Miami ranked No. 75 in third down defense (39.5%).

KEEPING IT IN THE "U FAMILY"

- As is often the case at the University of Miami, a number of Canes have family ties to 'The U'
- Four Hurricanes had fathers who suited up in orange and green: TE **Michael Irvin II** (father is Michael) II, DL **Scott Patchan** (Matt), DL **Pat Bethel** (Randy), and DB **Al Blades, Jr.** (Al, Sr.)

"NEO" GARVIN READY TO BUILD ON BREAKOUT SOPHOMORE SEASON

- Miami led all of FBS in tackles for loss last season, and one of the most important factors in the equation was defensive end **Jonathan Garvin**, who wreaked havoc in his first season as a starter.
- Garvin ranked fourth in the ACC and second on the Hurricanes with 17 tackles for loss last season.
- Garvin goes by the nickname "Neo" - his middle name and the name of his grandfather - and is one of only five returning Power-5 players to have totaled at least 17 tackles for loss in the 2018 season.
- The Lake Worth, Fla., native, who was ranked a four-star defensive end by both ESPN and 247Sports coming out of high school, has totaled 20.0 tackles for loss and four fumble recoveries in two seasons.
- Garvin was named to the watch list for three major awards: the Chuck Bednarik Award, the Bronko Nagurski Trophy and the Walter Camp Player of the Year Award. Garvin had 60 total tackles last year.

TRUE FRESHMAN LEFT TACKLE PAVED THE WAY ALL OFFSEASON LONG

- An unheralded recruit coming out of high school, Sumter, S.C., native **Zion Nelson** earned first-team reps at left tackle during spring ball and has remained with Miami's top unit. He started UM's opener Aug. 24.
- Nelson, ranked a two-star recruit by most major scouting services, arrived at Miami as an early enrollee in January weighing roughly 240 pounds and has bulked up to roughly 290 in a short time.
- Nelson will become the third Hurricane in as many years to see major action on the offensive line; **Navaghn Donaldson** made 10 starts as a true freshman in 2017 and **DJ Scaife** made seven in 2018.

WILFORK NAMED HONORARY CAPTAIN, ALUMNI WERE IN FULL-FORCE

- University of Miami Sports Hall of Famer and Super Bowl champion **Vince Wilfork** served as Miami's honorary captain for the season opener against the Florida Gators. He was one of several high-profile Hurricanes alumni in attendance in Orlando. Among others: **Michael Irvin**, **Ed Reed**, **Bernie Kosar**, **Devin Hester**, **Jonathan Vilma**, **Reggie Wayne**, **Willis McGahee**, **Clinton Portis** and **Edgerrin James**.

NEW FACES ABOUND IN TALENTED BUT YOUNG SECONDARY GROUP

- 75% of Miami's starting secondary of the past two seasons was selected in the 2019 NFL Draft, leaving three open jobs entering 2019, including both starting safety roles and one cornerback spot.
- Preseason Thorpe Award watch list pick **Trajan Bandy** is the only returning starter in the group. Joining Bandy in the starting lineup for Miami's season opener vs. Florida were safeties **Amari Carter** and **Gurvan Hall, Jr.**, and cornerback **Al Blades, Jr.** Both Hall and Blades were making the first starts of their careers.
- Hall had a career-high eight tackles in the opener while Carter had the first interception of his career.
- Last season, the Hurricanes surrendered the fewest passing yards per game of any team in FBS (135.6).
- Head coach Manny Diaz listed sophomores **Al Blades, Jr.**, and **DJ Ivey** as co-starters at the cornerback position opposite Bandy. Ivey missed the opener due to a violation of team rules while Blades started.
- Two players who saw action in the opener were freshman DBs **Te'Cory Couch** and **Christian Williams**.

FIVE MORE PROCANES SELECTED, #NFLU TRADITION ROLLS ON

- Five Hurricanes were selected in the 2019 NFL Draft: **Sheldrick Redwine** (fourth round, Cleveland), **Michael Jackson, Sr.**, (fifth round, Dallas), **Joe Jackson** (fifth round, Dallas), **Jaquan Johnson** (sixth round, Buffalo) and **Travis Homer** (sixth round, Seattle). Multiple others signed free agent deals.
- For 45 consecutive years, the Hurricanes have had at least one player selected in the NFL Draft.
- Miami leads all programs in the ACC in draft picks since 2000; 115 Hurricanes have been selected.

TURNOVER CHAIN HAS BECOME ICONIC IN COLLEGE FOOTBALL

- When DB **Trajan Bandy** pounced on a loose ball of Miami's home opener vs. Savannah State in 2018, the crowd turned to observe a familiar sight from 2017: the now-famous "Turnover Chain."
- But instead of that 2017 chain, which was modeled in the shape of the iconic "U" logo, Bandy was presented a brand new turnover chain to wear featuring a charm in the model of Sebastian the Ibis.
- Turnover Chain 2.0 was comprised of more than 4,000 stones (compared to 900 in 2017), weighed roughly three kilograms (compared to two in 2017) and had an 8.5-inch charm (compared to 5.5).
- The Hurricanes defense totaled only 19 turnovers gained in 13 games in 2016 - the season before the turnover chain's inception. Since, UM has compiled 60 in just 27 games, averaging 2.22 per game.
- No Hurricane wore the 2018 chain more often than Bandy, who wore it five times in a breakout year.
- adidas and other apparel providers launched a special line of turnover chain-branded t-shirts, and the first two chains remain in a display case in the Schwartz Center lobby on the athletics campus.
- Rapper 'Solo D' performed his song 'Turnover Chain' in front of the Hurricanes at the team's annual awards banquet, and the chain was the focal point of Miami's ACC Network-branded commercial.

CAROL SOFFER INDOOR PRACTICE FACILITY OPEN FOR BUSINESS

- On August 17, 2018, history was made at the University of Miami, as the Miami Hurricanes practiced inside the Carol Soffer Indoor Practice Facility for the very first time during fall camp.
- In September 2016, Miami announced the largest donation in the history of the athletics department as the lead gift for a state-of-the-art football indoor practice facility. In honor of their mother Carol, Jeffrey Soffer and Carol's other children made a \$14 million commitment to Miami.
- Former coach Mark Richt pledged \$1 million towards the facility and football alumnus and linebacker great Jon Beason was among those alumni to donate. Beason's gift was \$250,000, as Miami alumni and former players teamed up to contribute more than \$2 million for the project.
- The 81,800-square-foot facility features two field-turf fields – one 90 yards long and an additional 40-yard field directly connecting to the Squillante Strength and Conditioning Center. The facility features interconnectivity to the Hecht Athletic Center and Schwartz Center for Athletic Excellence.

FRESHMAN CAM HARRIS DAZZLED OVER FINAL THREE GAMES IN 2018

- Earning more significant action over the final three games of the 2018 regular season, freshman RB **Cam'Ron Harris** finished the season third among Miami's running backs with 171 rushing yards.
- Harris - who went by the name 'Cam'Ron Davis' last year - changed his last name to match his father's this past offseason. He is expected to join **DeeJay Dallas** to form a formidable backfield combination.
- Harris had a breakout game against Georgia Tech on Nov. 10, rushing for 48 yards on six carries, including a 22-yard touchdown run - the first of his career. Davis finished the year with three total TDs.
- Harris' breakout game against the Yellow Jackets was his first action of any kind since an Oct. 6 win over rival Florida State; the Opa-Locka native had not played in more than a month before the outing.
- A week later, Harris recorded the first multi-touchdown performance of his career on the road at Virginia Tech (Nov. 17) - he had a career-best 77-rushing yards, including a career-long 42-yard touchdown rush, and added a 16-yard TD reception - the first of his career. He had 93 all-purpose yards.
- Harris, who stepped up after third-string RB **Lorenzo Lingard** suffered a knee injury in late October, finished his Carol City High School career with more than 1,300 yards rushing and 21 touchdowns
- A four-star prospect, Harris chose UM over offers from Georgia, Oregon and Wisconsin, among others.

HURRICANES A REGULAR PARTICIPANT ON ESPN'S COLLEGE GAMEDAY

- Early in August, ESPN announced it would host its famous College GameDay show at Disney's Magic Kingdom the morning of Miami's game against Florida at Camping World Stadium in Orlando.
- The game vs. Florida marked the 21st time a game involving the Hurricanes has been selected for College GameDay; prior, its most recent was the 2017 ACC Championship Game in Charlotte, N.C.
- The Hurricanes and Gators have matched up for a College GameDay site clash just two other times, with the two teams splitting the other results 1-1. Prior to 2019, its most recent College GameDay matchup vs. UF was 9/6/2008 - a 3-26 loss in Gainesville. The other - on 9/7/2002 - was a 41-16 win at Florida.

MIAMI IN YEAR 5 OF 12-YEAR DEAL WITH ADIDAS

- In January of 2015, adidas & the University of Miami announced a landmark 12-year partnership making adidas the official footwear, apparel and accessory brand of UM through June 2027.
- The partnership, which made Miami one of adidas' 13 licensed NCAA programs at the time, began on Sept. 1, 2015 and includes investment, product and uniform development for all 18 UM programs.
- adidas unveiled Miami's new Primeknit football uniforms at Club LIV at the Fountainbleau Hotel.
- adidas partners hailing from the Miami football include NFL stars David Njoku of the Cleveland Browns, Jimmy Graham of the Seattle Seahawks, as well as Frank Gore of the Miami Dolphins.

ZAGACKI AND BAILEY RETURN TO THE BOOTH FOR YEAR 18

HEAD COACH | FIRST SEASON AT MIAMI (FIRST OVERALL) | 0-1 (.000)

Manny Diaz, who has deep roots in the Miami community and catapulted the Hurricane's defense to elite status during his three years as the team's defensive coordinator from 2016-2018, was announced as the 25th head coach of the University of Miami football program on Sun., Dec. 30.

"Manny is one of the nation's elite coaches and the Canes Family has already embraced him and his incredible work ethic over the past three years," said UM Director of Athletics Blake James upon his hiring. "He is absolutely the passionate and innovative leader that our program needs, and we will work together to build an incredible staff to move our program back into championship contention."

Diaz, who has an impressive resume during nearly two decades as a defensive specialist coaching several collegiate programs, accepted his dream job of leading a Hurricanes team he believes is destined to return to the top echelon of collegiate football in the years to come.

"Miami is home. The University of Miami is home. The U has truly been 'the job' for me since I first got into coaching," said Diaz. "Having worked here over the past three years, I came to understand what it means to be part of 'The U' and came to appreciate the passion and commitment to excellence of all who proudly call themselves Canes. We will restore the football program to its place among the nation's elite and we will do it with hard work, dedicated coaches, and outstanding student-athletes. I'm excited about working with Blake and his team to make that happen."

During his 19-year coaching career, Diaz, the son of a former Miami mayor, also named Manny Diaz, has coached in 18 bowl games, amassing a 13-5 record in bowls, and has coached numerous all-conference and NFL players at six collegiate institutions.

Miami delivered another stellar season on defense in 2018. The Hurricanes ranked No. 4 in the nation in total defense and ranked No. 1 in several categories, including tackles for loss, third down conversion percentage and passing yards allowed. Defensive tackle Gerald Willis earned All-American honors from several outlets while linebacker Shaq Quarterman was named to the All-ACC First Team - one of eight all-conference picks.

Continuing the impressive trends from Diaz's first year running the defense, the Hurricanes ranked among the nation's leaders in several defensive categories in 2017, including first nationally in team sacks, third nationally in tackles for loss and ninth nationally in opponent yards per play. Five Hurricanes on the defensive side of the ball earned 2017 All-ACC honors while another three picked up Honorable Mention recognition.

Thanks in large part to his dominating unit, Miami also ranked No. 5 nationally in turnover margin, No. 8 nationally in fumbles recovered and No. 15 nationally in passes intercepted.

Miami's defense enjoyed vast improvements under Diaz' watch and served as one of the top units both in the ACC and nationally in his first season in 2016.

At the conclusion of the 2016 season, Miami was ranked No. 20 nationally in total defense (up from No. 69 the previous season), No. 9 in yards per play (No. 86 in 2015), No. 12 in scoring defense (No. 77 in 2015), No. 5 in tackles for loss (No. 105 in 2015), No. 22 in team sacks (No. 70 in 2015) and tied for No. 8 in defensive touchdowns allowed (No. 61 in 2015).

Miami was the only team in the country to start three true freshmen linebackers, and the Hurricanes' trio of Zach McCloud, Michael Pinckney and Shaquille Quarterman helped anchor the unit. Three defensive players earned ACSMA All-ACC honors - senior defensive backs Corn Elder (second team) and Rayshawn Jenkins (honorable mention) and Quarterman at linebacker (honorable mention).

In 2015, Diaz's defensive unit helped Mississippi State to a 9-4 record and a victory over NC State in the Belk Bowl. His defensive unit held opponents to just 23.2 points per game and ranked in the nation's top 10 in red zone defense and tackles for loss.

Diaz spent one season, 2014, at Louisiana Tech and his impact was felt in a big way. The Bulldogs led the nation in turnovers gained (42) with 16 fumble recoveries and 26 interceptions. Before his stop at Louisiana Tech, Diaz coached three seasons at Texas (2011-13). His 2011 defensive unit ranked ninth in total yards per play.

In 2010, during his first stint at Mississippi State, Diaz guided a defense that ranked No. 22 in the nation in scoring defense (19.9 ppg), No. 17 in rushing defense (214.9 ypg) and No. 17 in tackles for loss (7.0 pg). MSU also finished ranked No. 13 in red-zone defense (.730) and No. 22 in turnovers forced (28) nationally in 2010.

Before his first stop at Mississippi State, Diaz spent four seasons as defensive coordinator at Middle Tennessee State. Diaz coached linebackers for two years after mentoring the safeties during his first two years. Before joining Middle Tennessee, Diaz played a significant role for one of the country's top-ranked defenses by coaching safeties in 2004-05 and handling the linebackers in 2002-03 for NC State.

Diaz spent the 2000 and 2001 seasons at NCSU as a graduate assistant working primarily with the linebackers. During that time, the Wolfpack went to two bowl games and became the first ACC team to beat Florida State in Tallahassee. Diaz began his coaching career at Florida State in 1998. In his two years as a graduate assistant, he was on the same coaching staff as former Miami head coach Mark Richt and was part of the Seminoles' national title-winning coaching staff in 1999.

Diaz and his wife Stephanie have three sons: Colin, Gavin and Manny.
