

Two-time ACC Coach of the Year, Jim Larrañaga ranks in the top 60 on the list of winningest coaches all-time, and top 15 amongst active coaches in major schools. After leading Miami to the 2013 NCAA Sweet 16 and winning the school's first ACC regular season and tournament championships, Larrañaga was honored as the AP, Naismith, USBWA Henry Iba, Adolph Rupp Cup and ACC Coach of the Year.



THE GAME

No. 10/11 Miami opens NCAA Tournament play in Providence, R.I., as the third seed on Thursday, March 17 at 6:50 p.m. against 14-seed Buffalo.

THE COACH

Head coach Jim Larrañaga has a 586-390 overall record in his 32nd season as a head coach. He is 116-56 in his fifth season at the University of Miami, with a 54-34 mark in ACC play. Coach L is 7-6 in the NCAA Tournament overall and 2-1 with the Hurricanes.

Miami's 17-consecutive weeks in the polls top the school record of 12 from 2001-02.

UM has been ranked in the AP's top 15 for 14 weeks this season, eclipsing the previous school record of 10 in the 1959-60 season.

The Canes are ranked 12-or-better in the AP for the eighth time this season, 15th time under Coach L, 19th time since 1985-86 and 26th time since 1959-60.

THE WEATHER

THE NOTE

Senior guard Sheldon McClellan is the 10th-most efficient offensive player in the country among players used in 20 percent of possessions, and 28th overall, according to KenPom.com on March 14. McClellan has posted the 14th-best shooting percentage (50.0%) in the country among guards, and has the top shooting percentage among guards in the ACC, according to stats on NCAA.org on March 14. McClellan's 2-point shooting percentage is 54.6 percent this season.

THE ANNIVERSARY

The 2015-16 season marks the 10-year anniversary of Coach Jim Larrañaga and George Mason University's Cinderella run to the 2006 Final Four.

LARRAÑAGA BY THE NUMBERS

5 - Coach Jim Larrañaga is one of five ACC coaches with a Final Four appearance to his credit. In 2006, Larrañaga became the first coach at a mid-major school to take his team to the NCAA Final Four in 27 years.

6 - In 31 years of coaching, Jim Larrañaga has a winning record in the NCAA Tournament, a 7-5 mark in six appearances.

7 - Larrañaga is no stranger to the ACC. In his seven seasons as an assistant coach at Virginia, the Cavaliers participated in the NCAA Final Four in 1981 and 1984, won three ACC Championships and finished in the Top 5 of the rankings.

10 - The 2015-16 marks the 10th anniversary of Larrañaga's Cinderella run to the 2006 NCAA Final Four with George Mason. Both associate head coach Chris Caputo and director of operations James Johnson were on that GMU staff.

16 - Larrañaga has made 16 postseason appearances in the past 27 years, including seven NCAA tournaments.

32 - Larrañaga is in his 32nd year as a head coach and has successfully transitioned three institutions into successful programs: Miami, George Mason and Bowling Green.

500 - Coach L is one of five ACC coaches with 500 or more wins.

LARRAÑAGA - WHY MIAMI?

Along with returning to the best basketball conference in the country, Coach L had a few personal reasons for accepting the head coaching job at Miami. Coach's grandfather was from Cuba, where he produced the Larrañaga [lare-en-YAH-ga] cigar. Coach's father was raised in Key West before moving to The Bronx, N.Y., getting married and raising six children. Coach L was raised in The Bronx, but vacationed to Florida as a boy. He also has owned a house in Sarasota - which he bought from Dick Vitale's daughter - and three of his siblings have retired to Florida.

MIAMI POSTS THIRD 25-WIN SEASON

Coach Jim Larrañaga has posted his third 25-win season and fourth 20-win season in five years at The U. This is also his fifth-career 25-win season and 10th-career 20-win campaign. Larrañaga is just the second coach in Miami history with four 20-win seasons, joining Bruce Hale (1954-67) and the only Miami coach with a 25-win year.

This is Miami's third 25-win year (all under Coach L) and seventh 20-win season since joining the ACC for the 2004-05 campaign.

13+ ACC WINS FOR THE SECOND TIME UNDER COACH L

Miami has won 13 games in ACC play for just the second time in school history, along with 15 wins in 2012-13. In five seasons under Larrañaga, the Canes have won seven-or-more ACC games each season. Prior to the arrival of Coach L, Miami had never won 10 ACC games in a season.

MIAMI AS A RANKED TEAM

Miami is one of 13 schools in the country to win at least five games over top 25 teams this season: 11-Kansas; 8-Oklahoma; 7-Virginia; 6-Texas, Xavier, West Virginia; 5-Miami, UNC, Michigan St., Wisconsin, Iowa, Baylor, Oregon. Miami is one of six schools to start the season unranked and defeat at least two top 15 teams: 5-Texas; 3-Iowa, Texas A&M, Xavier; 2-Miami, Oregon.

TIED FOR MOST REGULAR-SEASON WINS

Miami was 24-5 in the regular season, tied with the 24-6 record in 2012-13, for the most regular-season wins in Hurricanes history. In Larrañaga's five seasons, the Canes have the following records in the regular season: 2015-16: 24-5, 2014-15: 20-11, 2013-14: 16-15, 2012-13: 24-6, 2011-12: 18-11.

BEST FG SHOOTING PERCENTAGE IN 27 YEARS

The Canes are hitting 47.7 percent (837-1756) from the field, the best in Miami's history since the 1988-89 season when UM was hitting 49.2 percent (1024-2083) of its shots. Miami's 75.1 percent (527-702) at the line is the best since 77.1 percent (523-678) in 2001-02.

2015-16 TEAM HIGHLIGHTS

- First team in Miami history to sell out its home arena for the entire season.
- 24 regular season wins are tied with 2012-13 season for the most in Miami history.
- 13 wins in ACC play are the second most in school history, behind 15 in 2012-13.
- Perfect 9-0 at home in ACC play, 15-1 at home overall.
- Defeated five ranked teams: No. 3 Virginia, No. 11 Louisiana, No. 16 Utah, No. 22/20 Butler and No. 24/20 Duke, with back-to-back wins over Virginia and Louisville.
- Ranked in the polls a school record 17-straight weeks. Ranked top-15 for a school record 14 weeks, including current streak of six-straight weeks.
- Won the Puerto Rico Tip Off, defeating No. 16 Utah, No. 22/20 Butler and Mississippi State by 20.0 points per game. Puerto Rico native Angel Rodriguez was named MVP.
- Won ACC-Big Ten Challenge game at Nebraska, 77-72 in overtime.
- Defeated in-state rival Florida, which was receiving votes at the time.
- Posted 11-1 non-conference record with only loss on a buzzer-beater vs. Northeastern. The Canes were 6-1 at home, 2-0 on the road and 3-0 at neutral sites.
- Coach L named ACC Coach of the Year for second time in four seasons.
- Sheldon McClellan named to the USBWA All-District Team, Coach L recognized as District IV Coach of the Year.
- Three players - Sheldon McClellan, Tonye Jekiri and Angel Rodriguez - named All-ACC, while Jekiri was on the ACC Defensive Team. Davon Reed was on the All-ACC Academic Team.
- Sheldon McClellan named to the 2016 ACC All-Tournament Second Team.

MIAMI IN TOURNAMENT PLAY UNDER COACH L

Miami is 13-3 in tournament play over the past two seasons with a perfect 7-0 record in non-conference regular season tournaments, a 2-2 mark in the ACC Tournament and a 4-1 record in the NIT. In five seasons under Coach L, Miami is 26-10 in tournament play, including regular and postseason.



LARRAÑAGA GRADUATES CANES STUDENT-ATHLETES

All four Hurricane seniors will be graduates of Miami following the 2015-16 campaign. Last May Sheldon McClellan earned his bachelor of liberal arts degree and in December Angel Rodriguez earned his bachelor's of education degree with a major in sports administration and a minor in sociology, the same degree Ivan Cruz Uceda and Tonye Jekiri will both complete in May 2016.

CANES 19TH IN NATION IN FT PERCENTAGE, 26TH IN FEWEST FOULS

Miami ranks 19th in the nation in free throw percentage, connecting on 527-702 (75.1%) shots at the free throw line. UM averages 16.5 points per game at the line, and has posted a +8.8 scoring margin overall this season. The Canes have drawn 609 fouls, while committing only 530, which ranks UM No. 26 in the country in fewest fouls. Opponents have just 529 attempts at the stripe.

THE HURRICANES IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

The Canes are the No. 3 seed for the first time in UM history. Miami's highest seed has been No. 2, in 2013 and 1999.

All-time against potential 2016 regional opponents, Miami is 2-1 vs. Buffalo, 0-3 vs. Arizona, 0-0 vs. Vanderbilt and 1-0 vs. Wichita State.

The Canes are playing in the NCAA Tournament for the eighth time.

Miami is 6-7 in NCAA Tournament play.

Miami is 1-2 in tournament games played in the Northeast: Boston 1-1 in 1999; Washington, D.C. 0-1 in 2013.

Miami has played in the Sweet 16 twice, Second Round twice and played just one game three times.

Under head coach Jim Larrañaga, Miami is 2-1 in the NCAA Tournament in just four seasons. The Hurricanes were 4-6 in the first six appearances.

UM has won at least one game in the NCAA Tournament in four of the seven appearances, including two-straight and in four of the last five.

UM has won three of its last five games in the NCAA Tournament after going 2-1 in 2013 and 1-1 in 2008.

Five different coaches have led Miami to their eight NCAA appearances. Leonard Hamilton (3: 1998-00) and Jim Larrañaga (2: 2013, 2016) are the only coaches to lead the Canes to multiple NCAA berths.

Miami enters the NCAA tournament with six tournament wins in its history. Since the field expanded in 1985 six teams have reached the Final Four in a year where they entered the tournament with six or fewer all time tournament wins. One of those teams was George Mason in 2006, led by Jim Larrañaga. - via ESPN.com

Miami and Texas A&M are only two schools among top three seeds who did not play in the NCAA tournament last year.

WHAT'S TRENDING

Ja'Quan Newton has at least 10 points and three assists in each of his last two games. Davon Reed has scored 17+ points in four of his last six games. Sheldon McClellan has tallied double-digit points in 20-straight games. Angel Rodriguez has recorded 17+ points in three of the last five outings. He also has hit a 3-pointer in 10-straight outings. He has posted 3+ assists in 12 of the last 14 games, including nine vs. Virginia Tech in the ACC Tournament. Kamari Murphy has pulled down 4+ rebounds in nine of the last 10 outings. Tonye Jekiri has scored in double digits in two of the last four games, and pulled down 5+ rebounds in 19-straight outings.

COMPARING MIAMI 'S 2012-13 SQUAD TO THE 2015-16 CANES

In 2012-13, Miami was 29-7 overall, earning the ACC Regular Season and ACC Tournament Championships. That season, the squad played in the NCAA Sweet 16.

Senior Tonye Jekiri is the lone player on both teams. Both teams were unranked in the preseason AP poll and finished the season in the top 15. Senior leadership: Both had four seniors play at least 10+ minutes per game. Both had point guards average double figure points and 4+ assists: Shane Larkin (14.5 ppg, 4.6 apg) and Angel Rodriguez (11.7 ppg, 4.4 apg). Both had sophomore guards average double figure points and 2.5+ assists: Shane Larkin (14.5 ppg, 4.6 apg) and Ja'Quan Newton (11.1 ppg, 2.5 apg). Guards were the top two leading scorers on both teams: Shane Larkin (14.5 ppg) / Durand Scott (13.1ppg) and Sheldon McClellan (15.8 ppg) / Angel Rodriguez (11.7 ppg). Both teams had transfers who played significant roles: Shane Larkin, Kenny Kadji, Trey McKinney-Jones and Sheldon McClellan, Angel Rodriguez, Kamari Murphy. Both defeated two teams who would be in the top 3 seeds in the NCAA tournament: 3-seed Michigan State and 2-seed Duke and 1-seed Virginia and 3-seed Utah.

LARRANAGA USBWA DISTRICT IV CoY, McCLELLAN ALL-DISTRICT

Coach Larrañaga was named the USBWA District IV Coach of the Year and Sheldon McClellan was tabbed to the 10-player All-District IV Team.

FOUR PLAYERS BOAST NCAA TOURNAMENT EXPERIENCE

Senior Tonye Jekiri returns from Miami's 2012-13 ACC Championship and NCAA Sweet 16 team. Sheldon McClellan (Texas), Kamari Murphy (Oklahoma State) and Angel Rodriguez (Kansas State) also have played in the NCAA Tournament, each with their previous schools.

ALL-ACC AWARDS FOR THE HURRICANES

Coach Jim Larrañaga was named the ACC Coach of the Year for the second time in four seasons while three players earned postseason honors. Coach Jim Larrañaga - Coach of the Year (ACSMA/Coaches); Tonye Jekiri - All-Defensive Team (ACSMA/Coaches); Sheldon McClellan - Second Team All-ACC (ACSMA/Coaches); Angel Rodriguez - Third Team All-ACC (ACSMA); Tonye Jekiri - Honorable Mention (ACSMA/Coaches). Since joining the league in 2004-05, Miami has had 34 honorees on ACC postseason award lists, 21 of which have come under Coach L's watch, including five of Miami's six All-Defensive Team players. Jekiri is the only Hurricane to be named to that team twice.

MCCLELLAN 10TH-MOST EFFICIENT PLAYER IN THE NATION

Sheldon McClellan is the 10th-most efficient offensive player in the nation among players with 20 percent-or-more possessions used according to KenPom.com. He is also the most efficient player in the ACC overall, and No. 28 in the nation. McClellan is 17th in the ACC in 2-point field goal percentage (54.6), ninth in true shooting percentage (60.7) and 10th in free throw percentage (83.5). He is also fourth in the ACC in turnover rate (9.6).

JEKIRI EARNS MOST WINS IN PROGRAM HISTORY

In four seasons at Miami, senior Tonye Jekiri has won 94 games, the most of any Hurricane in school history. Jekiri is the only remaining player from the 2012-13 ACC Championship and NCAA Sweet 16 team. That season, Jekiri did not play in a pair of games, playing in just 27 wins individually. He has played in every victory since, with 17 as a sophomore, 25 as a junior and 25 this campaign.

NEWTON BEST SIXTH MAN IN THE COUNTRY

Dick Vitale has lauded Miami sophomore Ja'Quan Newton as the "best sixth man in the country." Newton has immensely improved his stats from last year, and has scored in double digits 18 times this season.

In 10 ACC victories Newton played in (not vs. VT twice, Louisville and Notre Dame), he averaged 11.4 points and 2.3 assists per game, hitting 50.6 percent from the field. In the Games' four losses he played in, he put up 6.8 points and 1.3 assists per outing, knocking down 26.5 percent of his shots.

REED NAMED TO ALL-ACC ACADEMIC TEAM

Davon Reed was named to the 2015-16 All-Atlantic Coast Conference Academic Men's Basketball team. The junior from Ewing, N.J., is majoring in sports administration.

THE U AGAINST RANKED TEAMS

In eight games against ranked teams, Miami is 5-3 with wins over No. 3 Virginia, No. 11 Louisville, No. 16 Utah, No. 20/22 Butler and No. 24/20 Duke, and losses to No. 13/11 Virginia, No. 5/4 North Carolina and No. 3 Virginia. In those games, Sheldon McClellan averages 14.8 points per game, hitting 48.7 percent from the field. Angel Rodriguez averages 13.1 points and 4.4 assists while Tonye Jekiri records 8.6 points and 8.3 rebounds per game. Complete stats against ranked teams are on page 10.

CANES IN THE MIAMI RECORD BOOK

Senior center Tonye Jekiri has 887 rebounds in 136 career games at The U, good enough for fourth on the all-time rebounding list. Harry Manushaw is third with 914 career boards.

Jekiri is also moving up the list for career blocked shots, currently at No. 6 with 126. He trails No. 5 Julian Gamble's (2008-13) 132 swats.

In four seasons, Jekiri has played in 136 games, tied for the most with Rion Brown (2010-14).

With 141 handouts this year, senior Angel Rodriguez is eyeing Miami's top-five list for assists in a season. Rodriguez is currently seventh behind Kevin Norris (1996-97) 142, Michael Gardner (1992-93) 154 and Shane Larkin (2012-13) 164.

Sheldon McClellan has tallied 1,056 points in 70 games at Miami. Added to his 843 points at Texas, he is also closing in on 2,000 career points.

BODY CHANGES FOR CRUZ UCEDA AND JEKIRI

Seniors Ivan Cruz Uceda and Tonye Jekiri spent the summer in the weight room. Cruz Uceda dropped 20 pounds from 237 to 217, and his body fat has slimmed down from 24 percent to nine percent in just a year in Miami. Jekiri added 20 pounds to his 7-foot frame, now weighing 250 pounds.

BACK-TO-BACK VICTORIES OVER TOP 15 TEAMS

With wins over No. 3 Virginia and No. 11 Louisville, Miami earned consecutive wins over top 15 opponents for the first time in school history. The Canes had defeated top 25 teams consecutively twice: Nov. 20, 2015 - No. 16 Utah and Nov. 22, 2015 - No. 22/20 Butler, and Jan. 7, 2006 - 14/12 Maryland and Jan. 14, 2006 - No. 20 at UNC.

Since the arrival of Coach L in 2011-12, the Canes have won at least two games over ranked teams in all but one season (2013-14). Miami has five wins over ranked teams this season, topping the previous high of four, in 2006-07 and 1998-99.

This is also the second-straight year and the fourth time in Coach L's five seasons that the Canes have defeated two top 15 teams. 2015-16: No. 3 Virginia, No. 11 Louisville. 2014-15: No. 8/7 Florida, No. 4 Duke. 2012-13: No. 13/14 Michigan State, No. 1 Duke. 2011-12: No. 7/5 Duke, No. 15/16 Florida State.

MIAMI FACED THREE-STRAIGHT TOP 25 TEAMS

Miami faced three top 25 teams over eight days, including two top-10 teams within 54 hours. The Canes opened the stretch at No. 11/10 North Carolina (Feb. 20), then defeated No. 3 Virginia on ESPN Big Monday (Feb. 22) and No. 11/- Louisville on Feb. 27.

CANES HAD HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

With the BankUnited Center sold out for every game this season, the Canes were 15-1 overall and 9-0 in ACC play this year at home. The 15 wins are the most in school history, topping 14 in 2012-13, 2011-12 and 2007-08. The Hurricanes posted a 13-game home winning streak which is tied with the 2012-13 season for the second longest in school history, trailing only the 15-game streak between Dec. 15, 1964 and Dec. 1, 1965.

McCLELLAN AND JEKIRI ON NATIONAL AWARD WATCH LISTS

Senior Sheldon McClellan is currently on three national player of the year watch lists: Naismith Trophy Men's College Player of the Year, Oscar Robertson Trophy for Men's National Player of the Year and Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year Award.

Senior Tonye Jekiri is one of 11 college basketball players selected as semifinalists for the sixth Eddie Sutton Tustenugee Award. The award singles out a player who exhibits the traits of tenacity and unselfishness that Sutton advocated during his 36-year career.

DEWAN HUELL NAMED 2016 McDONALD'S ALL-AMERICAN

Miami signee Dewan Huell has been named a 2016 McDonald's All-American, as announced on ESPNU Jan. 17. Huell will become the fourth McDonald's All-American to play at Miami, joining Darius Rice (2000 McDonald's All-American), Steve Edwards (1992) and Tito Horford (1985). Since the inception of the McDonald's All American Game in 1977, only 38 players have hailed from the state of Florida, 11 of which were from 'The State of Miami' - Broward, Dade and Palm Beach counties. Just six of those players have been from Dade County, the most recent before Huell being Corey Louis in 1994.

COACH L TIES TO THE ACC

Coach Jim Larrañaga was an assistant coach at Virginia from 1979-1986, under the leadership of Terry Holland. In those seven seasons, Larrañaga helped the Cavaliers to five NCAA appearances: Final Four twice, Elite Eight once, Sweet 16 once and Round of 64 once, as well as two NIT appearances, including the Championship and Quarterfinal round.

THE BUC WAS SOLD OUT

In just his fifth season in Coral Gables, Jim Larrañaga and Miami SOLD OUT the season ticket allotment for all home games this year at the BankUnited Center. This was the first time in Miami athletics history a team sold out their season. In Coach Larrañaga's fifth season at The U, fans bought 5,500 season tickets, more than doubling the total number of season tickets sold in his first season in Coral Gables. When Coach L began his reign in Miami, fans bought 2,251 season tickets for the 2011-12 campaign. After a record-breaking season on the court in 2012-13, season tickets peaked at 3,674 for 2013-14.

MIAMI'S STARTERS SHOW EXPERIENCE

Miami starts two redshirt seniors, one true senior, a redshirt junior and a true junior. Those players combine for 399 starts and 587 games played. Sheldon McClellan has started 92 games playing in 137, Tonye Jekiri has 84 starts in 135 games, Angel Rodriguez is at 100/128, Davon Reed 62/94 and Kamari Murphy 61/94.

Those five players have been on a Division I team a combined 21 seasons, as McClellan and Rodriguez are both in their fifth year on the court, Jekiri and Murphy are each in their fourth season, and Reed is a true junior. The average age of that starting five is 21.8 years old: Rodriguez - 23; McClellan - 23; Murphy - 22; Jekiri - 21; Reed - 20.

HOMECOMING FOR RODRIGUEZ, EARNS MVP

Senior guard Angel Rodriguez was named the Puerto Rico Tip-Off Most Valuable Player. He averaged 13.7 points and 4.0 assists, including 19 points in the championship game. The native of Cupey, P.R., just 20 minutes from San Juan, was greeted by friends and family at each game.

LARRAÑAGA CONTRACT EXTENDED THROUGH 2022

The University of Miami extended Coach Jim Larrañaga's contract through May 31, 2022. Director of Athletics Blake James announced in September 2014. Larrañaga first signed a five-year contract in April 2011, then was granted a three-year extension in 2012.

COACHING COORDINATORS FOR MIAMI

Miami's assistant coaching staff is set up in a coordinator system, with Jamal Brunt as the offensive coordinator, Chris Caputo manning the defense and Adam Fisher handling the scout for every opponent. James Johnson is the Dean of Discipline.

CANES SIGN TOP 10 RECRUITING CLASS

Miami has one of the top-10 recruiting classes in the country, with 247Sports ranking the class No. 7, Scout at No. 8, ESPN at No. 9 and Rivals at No. 10. The 2016 class rankings top Miami's best mark from 2005, when the Canes signed four four-star recruits - Jimmy Graham, Brian Asbury, Adrian Thomas and Denis Clemente - in a class that was ranked No. 12 in the nation by Scout. In 2009, Miami's signing class was nationally ranked No. 19 by Scout and No. 24 by ESPN. That Hurricanes' heralded 2009 class was comprised of ESPN 100 picks Durand Scott, Garrius Adams and Donnavan Kirk, in addition to May signee Antoine Allen. Since 2002, Miami has signed 16 Scout.com top 100 players, including three five-star, top-25 players in DeQuan Jones (22, 2008), Huell (25) and Durand Scott (25, 2009). Since Larrañaga's arrival, his staff has signed five top-100 players in Huell (25), Brown (44), Ja'Quan Newton (52, 2014), Rodney Miller (90) and James Palmer (98, 2014). Huell is the most lauded signee for Miami since Scott in 2009, Jones in 2008, No. 32 Guillermo Diaz in 2003 and McDonald's All-American Darius Rice in 2000.

LARRAÑAGA AMONG THE BEST IN COLLEGE BASKETBALL

Entering the 2015-16 season, Coach Larrañaga was tied for 12th on the list of Winningest Active Coaches at Major Schools and is 58th on the NCAA's list of All-Time Winningest Coaches. See page 13 of the notes for a complete listing.

AMONG UNIVERSITY OF MIAMI COACHES, LARRAÑAGA ...

- has the highest winning percentage of a Miami coach in the NCAA Tournament, a .667 mark with a 2-1 record.
- is one of two Miami coaches to post four 20-win seasons. Larrañaga has recorded four 20-win seasons in three years at Miami.
- .647 winning percentage is the best mark since Bruce Hale posted a .663 mark from 1955-67, including three seasons led by Rick Barry.
- has led the Canes to 54 ACC wins in just five seasons. Miami won 43 ACC games the previous seven seasons.
- Under Coach L, Miami has posted four of the Canes' top six finishes in ACC play, including the 2013 championship, tied for second in 2016, tied for fourth in 2012 and tied for sixth in 2015. In 2008, Miami tied for fifth in league play, and in 2005, tied for sixth.
- In five seasons under Coach L, Miami has tallied seven wins in the ACC Tournament. In the previous seven seasons, Miami went 6-7.
- In two NIT appearances under Coach L, Miami is 5-2 for a .714 winning percentage. In Miami's other 10 NIT appearances combined, the Canes went 6-10 for a .375 winning percentage.

DID YOU KNOW ...

Coach L became the first Miami coach to win 20+ games in his first two seasons at UM and only the second of 12 UM coaches to post four 20-win seasons.

Former Cane Rick Barry was named one of the Greatest Players in NBA History.

Miami native and former Cane James Jones won the 2010-2011 NBA All-Star Weekend 3-Point Contest and the NBA Championship in the 2011-2012 and 2012-13 seasons.

Six-time NBA All Star Amar'e Stoudemire enrolled at UM in 2013 and took classes to earn his bachelor's degree.

UM is in its 12th season in the ACC.

Coach L led the George Mason Patriots to the 2006 Final Four with big wins over some of basketball's elite teams such as Michigan State, UNC and UConn. He was the first coach to take a mid-major to a Final Four in 27 years (Penn '79) when his team advanced in 2006.

In 14 years at George Mason, Larrañaga led the Patriots to five NCAA Tournament appearances (2011, 2008, 2006, 2001, 1999), including the 2006 Final Four.

Miami basketball received APR (Academic Progress Rate) Public Recognition Awards for being among the top 10 percent in APR in its sport. Miami ranks in the top 10 percent NCAA men's basketball with a 990 APR.

The Miami Department of Athletics recorded a Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 89 percent. Miami's department-wide GSR is 16th overall among FBS programs. UM has exceeded the NCAA average GSR in each of the last 10 years.

The Canes have averaged 20.0 wins over the last 11 seasons.

The Hurricanes have made at least one trey in 935 of 941 games since the NCAA adopted the 3-point shot in 1986. The last time Miami was held without a 3-pointer was Feb. 26, 2014 at Virginia.

Miami has held 794 of its last 795 opponents to less than 100 points. North Carolina was the last team to score 100+, defeating UM 105-64 on Jan. 31, 2007.

MIAMI BASKETBALL – THE EARLY YEARS

The University of Miami basketball program was dormant for 14 years from 1971-1985. In 1983 Director of Athletics Sam Jankovich announced the resurrection of men's basketball at Miami, with the reinstatement vote by the UM Board of Trustees on Oct. 12, 1983. Head coach Bill Foster was hired March 21, 1984, adding assistants Clint Bryant, Seth Greenberg and Cesar Odio by July 1. Tim Harvey was the staff's first recruit, a 6-10, 240-pound center from Plainfield, N.J., who transferred from Georgia Tech. On Oct. 15, 1984 the first men's basketball practice in 12 years was held on the patio in the center of campus, viewed by more than 200 students. Miami defeated The Citadel, 85-77, on Nov. 22, 1985, in the first game of the new era of UM basketball.

MIAMI PREDICTED TO FINISH FIFTH IN ACC

Miami was predicted to finish fifth out of 15 teams in the Atlantic Coast Conference this season, as announced by the league during Operation ACC Basketball in Charlotte, N.C., Oct. 28. North Carolina was picked to win the league, followed by Virginia, Duke and Notre Dame.

In 2012-13, the Canes were picked to finish fifth, then won the league's regular season and tournament championship. In all four of Larrañaga's seasons at Miami, the Canes have finished the season better than predicted at ACC media day.

MIAMI LANDS HUELL, BROWN AND MILLER

The Miami men's basketball team landed a pair of top-30 players in Dewan Huell and Bruce Brown, and top 100 player Rodney Miller.

With the addition of these three players, Miami would have six top 100 players next season: Huell (25), Brown (44), Ja'Quan Newton (52), Miller (90), James Palmer (98).

Huell, at 6-10 and 218 pounds, is a five-star, top-25 power forward from Miami Norland High School. Nationally, he is ranked the No. 21 player by ESPN, No. 23 by Rivals and No. 25 by Scout. ESPN and Scout rank him fifth at his position, and Scout says he's the top player in the state of Florida, while ESPN and Rivals have him second in the state. Brown, from Wakefield, Mass., is a four-star shooting guard at Vermont Academy in Saxton's River, Vt. At 6-4 and 205 pounds, Brown is ranked No. 30 by ESPN, No. 44 per Scout and No. 49 by Rivals. Miller is a 6-foot-11-inch, 245-pound center playing prep ball at Oak Hill Academy in Virginia. A native of Laurelton, N.Y., Miller is a consensus four-star recruit, ranked No. 90 overall by Scout.com and No. 114 by Rivals.com. As a center, he is ranked No. 17 by Scout.com and No. 15 by ESPN.

ACC LEGEND - JOHN SALMONS

The ACC and Miami Director of Athletics Blake James are proud to announce Miami's John Salmons as a member of the 2016 ACC Men's Basketball Legends Class. Salmons was a two-time All-BIG EAST player, and was a 2002 NABC All-District 6 player for the Canes. He also won the 2002 BIG EAST Sportsmanship Award. From 1998 to 2002, Salmons played in four-straight postseason tournaments, including three NCAA Tournament appearances. Salmons is listed No. 19 on the all-time scoring list at Miami, and is third in career assists, third in steals and tied for fifth in games started.

COACH L REUNITED WITH JAMES JOHNSON

James Johnson is the team's director of basketball operations. Johnson, who was on Larrañaga's staff for two seasons at George Mason University, including the historic NCAA Final Four run in 2006, came to Miami after seven seasons on staff at fellow ACC school Virginia Tech, where he was the head coach for two seasons after five years as an assistant coach.

PROCANES REPORT

Former Hurricanes James Jones and Shane Larkin are on NBA rosters this season, as Jones is in Cleveland with the Cavaliers and Larkin joined a new team, the Brooklyn Nets, after playing across town with the Knicks last season. Miami has 17 former players in professional basketball at this time. A complete list is on page four of the notes.

LARRAÑAGA MEMBER OF UM FACULTY

Coach Jim Larrañaga is an Adjunct Assistant Professor of Kinesiology and Sport Sciences at the University of Miami. Due to his head coaching responsibilities, Larrañaga is a guest lecturer at several different classes in the School of Education and Human Development throughout the semester.

ATTITUDE, COMMITMENT AND CLASS

Attitude, commitment and class are the cornerstone values of the Miami basketball program. Attitude: Be positive. Life is 10% what happens to you and 90% how you react to it. Commitment: Make a total and unconditional commitment to our program. Be passionate about what you do. Class: Show pride and respect in yourself and our program. Be the best you can be in thought, word and deed.

COACHING CHANGES FOR THE HURRICANES

After having the same assistant coaching staff his first four years in Miami, Larrañaga has two new assistant coaches in 2015-16 in Jamal Brunt and Adam Fisher, following the departure of Eric Konkol (Louisiana Tech) and Michael Huger (Bowling Green). Konkol had been an assistant with Coach L 11 seasons and Huger was an assistant coach for eight years and player for four seasons.

Due to the lack of turnover, Coach L has only had nine assistant coaches in the last 14 seasons. Five of his assistants left for a D-I head coaching job, and two others who have worked their way into head coaching jobs. In those 14 seasons, only twice two assistants left at the same time, 1996 (Stan Heath and Steve Merfeld) and 1989 (Jeff Snyder and Ricky Stokes).

Chris Caputo, in his 14th season on Larrañaga's staff and fifth in Coral Gables, was promoted to associate head coach in the summer of 2015.

JIM LARRAÑAGA

Head Coach, Fifth Season
Providence, 1971

Jim Larrañaga was named the 12th head coach of the University of Miami men's basketball program on April 22, 2011.

After leading UM to the 2013 NCAA Sweet 16, and winning the school's first ACC regular season and tournament championships, Larrañaga was honored as the AP, Naismith, USBWA Henry Iba and ACC Coach of the Year. The Bronx, N.Y., native helped Miami to a No. 2 national ranking by both the AP and USA TODAY, and a No. 2 seed in the NCAA tournament. He is the 10th coach in the last 10 years to lead two top-10 programs, as Miami was No. 2 on Feb. 18, 2013, and George Mason was No. 8 in the final Top 25 poll in 2006.

In 2014-15 Larrañaga led the Hurricanes to the championship game of the NIT, the first time Miami played into the month of April. Larrañaga's Canes played in his home state of New York, his first game competing as a head coach in Madison Square Garden. The Hurricanes' 25-13 record marked the second-most victories at the school, behind UM's 29 in 2012-13, and Larrañaga's fourth 25-win season as a head coach. In January, the Canes downed eventual national champion then-No. 4 Duke, 90-74, at Cameron Indoor Stadium, the only team to defeat Duke at home this season. Miami also defeated No. 8/7 Florida and Syracuse on their home courts, two of Miami's 10 regular season wins away from home. The Canes ranked 13th in the country in turnovers per game (10.1), were 22 in the nation with a 74.6 percent clip at the free throw line and No. 53 with 7.7 3-pointers made per game. Miami finished the season sixth in the ACC after being projected to finish 10th, the fourth-straight year the Canes have exceeded expectations. Junior forward Tonye Jekiri was named to the All-ACC Defensive Team and third in voting for ACC Most Improved Player, and along with classmates Sheldon McClellan and Angel Rodriguez, all three were honorable mentions to the All-ACC team.

In 2012-13 Larrañaga directed the Canes to a 27-point win over No. 1 Duke and three other 20+ point wins over ACC opponents that season, including North Carolina (+26), Florida State (+24) and Boston College (+22). UM's 29 overall and 15 ACC wins in 2012-13 were program-bests, as was the 14-game winning streak and 13-0 start in conference play. Other program firsts include defeating all three teams in the North Carolina Triangle in the same season, beating a trio of teams in the Top 20 since joining the ACC and hosting five sellouts at the BankUnited Center.

Individually, Coach L saw Shane Larkin earn the ACC Player of the Year and Lute Olson National Player of the Year awards, as well as All-American status and finalist nods for the Bob Cousy, John Wooden and James Naismith player of the year honors before declaring early for the 2013 NBA Draft. Larkin was also the ACC Tournament MVP, on the All-ACC Defensive team and a defensive All-American. Durand Scott was the ACC Defensive Player of the Year, three players – Larkin, Scott and Kenny Kadji – were listed on all-conference teams and four were on the ACC All-Tournament Team – Larkin, Scott, Julian Gamble and Trey McKinney Jones. All six seniors on the Sweet 16 team earned academic degrees from the University of Miami and one player was listed on the All-ACC Academic Team.

Larrañaga came to Miami after serving as the head coach at George Mason for 14 seasons. He guided that program to five NCAA Tournament appearances (1999, 2001, 2006, 2008, 2011) – including an unprecedented run to the 2006 Final Four that captured the nation's attention, defeating Michigan State, North Carolina, Wichita State and UConn along the way. Following that run, he was selected the 2006 Clair Bee Coach of the Year. Larrañaga built the GMU Patriots' program into a perennial contender in the highly-regarded Colonial Athletic Association, winning more games (273) than any other coach in program and conference history en route to three conference titles (1999, 2001, 2008). A two-time CAA Coach of the Year honoree, Larrañaga earned the accolade in 2011, leading the Patriots to a 27-7 overall record and 16-2 conference mark en route to the CAA regular-season title and their fifth NCAA Tournament appearance under his leadership. Seeded a program-best eighth in the NCAA Tournament, George Mason rallied from a double-digit deficit to defeat ninth-seeded Villanova, 61-57, before falling to overall No. 1 seed Ohio State in the third round. In 2006, Larrañaga became the first coach at a mid-major school to take his team to the Final Four in 27 years and earned an at-large berth for a CAA team for the first time in 20 years. Along the way, he led Mason to a school record in wins, the school's first national ranking, George Mason's first appearance in the Top 10 and the school's first wins over Top 10 teams.

With 31 years of head coaching experience, the native of The Bronx, N.Y., previously served as the head coach at Bowling Green for 11 seasons (1986-1997) and at Division II American International for two seasons (1977-79). His first coaching opportunity came at Davidson College, where he served as an assistant coach to Terry Holland. Davidson captured three Southern Conference regular-season championships and an NIT berth in his five years there, and he compiled a 47-12 record doubling as the freshman team coach. In 1976, he left Davidson and spent one season as player-coach for the Geronemo Basketball Club in Belgium. A 1971 graduate of Providence College with a degree in economics, Larrañaga was a four-year letterman for the Friars. As the team captain in his senior season, he led Providence to a 20-8 record and an NIT appearance. He graduated as the school's fifth all-time leading scorer with 1,258 points and was selected in the sixth round of the draft by the Detroit Pistons of the National Basketball Association. He was the team's top scorer as a sophomore and junior and was named New England's Division I Sophomore of the Year in 1969. He was inducted into the Providence College Hall of Fame in 1991.

Larrañaga and his wife, Liz, have two sons – Jay, who played for his father at Bowling Green and is an assistant coach with the Boston Celtics, and Jon, who was a member of his father's George Mason teams from 1999-2003 – and four grandchildren: Tia, James, Jon Temple and Henry.






