**THE LAST TIME OUT - MIAMI VS. MISSISSIPPI STATE ...**

- Miami scored 105 points against Mississippi State, the first time Miami has scored 100+ points since Nov. 16, 2009 against Nova Southeastern (108-58) ... The last time Miami scored 100+ against a Division I opponent was Jan. 3, 2004 vs. Savannah State (105-65) ... The last time Miami scored 100+ against a Power 5 team was Jan. 18, 1990 - Florida State (101-97) ... The last time Miami scored 100+ away from home in regulation victory was Dec. 28, 1988 vs. Penn in the Eastern Airlines Palm Beach Classic ... This is Miami's first time scoring 100+ points and earning a win over a high-major team away from home ... Miami was three points shy of scoring the most points in a half since joining the ACC in 2004-05. The high was 61 against Nova Southeastern in 2009, second-most was 60 against Virginia in 2008 and Lafayette in 2006 ... Miami's bench outscored Mississippi State 50-25. The Hurricanes also held a 46-32 advantage in points in the paint ... The Hurricanes led for 37:52 of the game ... The Hurricanes shot better than 50 percent in both halves for the second-consecutive game ... Miami had seven players score in double figures. The Canes had six players score in double figures the last time out, vs. Louisiana, too ... All nine scholarship players scored at least eight points ... Miami's 20 assists are a season high ... The Hurricanes outrebounded Mississippi State 41-27 ... Miami improved to 14-9 in neutral site games under head coach Jim Larrañaga ... Redshirt senior Sheldon McClellan tied a season high with 18 points, connecting on 5-of-10 from the field. McClellan has now scored 10-or-more points in all three games this season ... Senior Tonye Jekiri pulled down a game-high 10 rebounds. It also marked the second time this season he has totaled 10 or more rebounds ... Ja'Quan Newton scored a season-high 15 points (just one point shy of his career high) as he connected on 5-of-10 shots from the field ... Freshman center Ebuka Izundu scored his first collegiate points and pulled down his first career rebounds against Mississippi State. He finished the game with 11 points and seven rebounds ... Sophomore James Palmer scored a season-high 14 points, connecting on 6-of-9 shots from the field.

**LIGHT 'EM UP**

Through three games this season, Miami is averaging 94.7 points per game. In Coach L's first four full seasons at Miami, the Canes scored 94-or-more points only one time, on Jan. 2, 2011 against UNCG, a 99-89 victory for UM. In those four seasons, Miami's highest ppg average was 70.7 in 2011-12, followed by 68.2 in 2014-15, 67.9 in 2012-13 and the lowest was 61.5 in 2013-14.

As a team, Miami is hitting 51.4 percent (91-177) from the field and 43.7 percent (31-71) from three. Miami's bench has outscored the opponent's bench 99-70 and scored 58 points off of turnovers, compared to just 20 from the opponents.

**100TH POINT SCORED BY SECOND-GENERATION CANE**

Freshman Anthony Lawrence, Jr. scored Miami's 100th point of the game against Mississippi State. "Amp" is the son of Anthony Lawrence, Sr., who played for Miami from 1991-93.

**BALANCED SCORING IN FIRST THREE GAMES**

In the first three games of the 2015-16 season, Miami has had five, six and seven players score in double digits, respectively. Against UT Rio Grande Valley, Sheldon McClellan (18), Ivan Cruz Uceda (16), Davon Reed (14), Ja'Quan Newton (11) and James Palmer (11) notched double-digit points, while Reed (19), Angel Rodriguez (18), McClellan (16), Cruz Uceda (13), Anthony Lawrence Jr. (12) and Newton (11) did against Louisiana. Mississippi saw seven Canes with double digits: McClellan (18), Newton (15), Palmer (14), Izundu (11), Rodriguez (11), Cruz Uceda (10), Lawrence (10).

**KAMARI MURPHY RETURNS TO THE COURT**

Junior forward Kamari Murphy will be available to play against Utah on Friday, Nov. 20, potentially making his Canes debut after transferring from Oklahoma State and sitting out last season due to NCAA transfer rules. Murphy had been suspended for the first three games of the basketball season for a violation of team rules, the school announced Friday, Nov. 13.

MIAMI EARNING VOTES IN BOTH NATIONAL POLLS

Miami is garnering votes in both the AP (48) and the USA Today Coaches (11) preseason poll. The Canes are six places out of the Top 25 in the AP poll and 12 positions out in the USA Today poll. Miami was last listed in preseason polls in 2008-09, when the Canes were No. 17 in the AP and No. 16 in USA Today Coaches poll. The 2008-09 team went on to a 19-13 record and NIT appearance.

CANES BRING EXPERIENCE TO THE COURT

Miami starts four seniors and a junior, thus entering the year with 16 seasons of collegiate basketball experience. The average age of the starting five is 22.2 years old: Ivan Cruz Uceda: 24, three seasons; Angel Rodriguez: 23, four seasons; Sheldon McClellan: 23, four seasons; Tonye Jekiri: 21, three seasons; Davon Reed: 20, two seasons.

FOUR PLAYERS BOAST NCAA TOURNAMENT EXPERIENCE

Senior Tonye Jekiri returns from Miami's 2012-13 ACC Championship and NCAA Sweet 16 team. Sheldon McClellan (Texas), Kamari Murphy (Oklahoma State) and Angel Rodriguez (Kansas State) also have played in the NCAA Tournament, each with their previous schools.

MCCLELLAN ON JERRY WEST AWARD WATCH LIST

Senior Sheldon McClellan is among the 20 players named to the watch list for the 2016 Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year Award, the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame announced.

As a junior in 2014-15, McClellan's 48.4-percent shooting was the second-best shooting percentage in the nation by a guard in the Power Five conferences, 18th-best shooting percentage by a guard in the nation, 90th-best shooting percentage in the nation among all positions, and the top shooting percentage by a guard in the ACC.

MIAMI PREDICTED TO FINISH FIFTH IN ACC

Miami was predicted to finish fifth out of 15 teams in the Atlantic Coast Conference this season, as announced by the league during Operation ACC Basketball in Charlotte, N.C., Oct. 28. North Carolina was picked to win the league, followed by Virginia, Duke and Notre Dame.

In 2012-13, the Canes were picked to finish fifth, then won the league's regular season and tournament championship. In all four of Larrañaga's seasons at Miami, the Canes have finished the season better than predicted at ACC media day.

LARRAÑAGA AMONG THE BEST IN COLLEGE BASKETBALL

Entering the 2015-16 season, Coach Larrañaga is tied for 12th on the list of Winningest Active Coaches at Major Schools and is tied for 57th on the NCAA's list of All-Time Winningest Coaches. See page 9 of the notes for a complete listing.

MIAMI SETS SEASON TICKET RECORD

In just his fifth season in Coral Gables, Jim Larrañaga continues to set records with the University of Miami men's basketball team. Miami has nearly sold out the ticket allotment for all home games this season at the BankUnited Center. Currently only 288 seats remain for the 2015-16 campaign. If Miami sells out those remaining seats, this will be the first time in Miami athletics history a team has sold out their season. Due to the record season ticket sales, seats may not be available on a single-game basis.

Entering Coach Larrañaga's fifth season at The U, fans have bought approximately 5,200 season tickets, more than doubling the total number of season tickets sold in his first season in Coral Gables. When Coach L began his reign in Miami, fans bought 2,251 season tickets for the 2011-12 campaign. After a record-breaking season on the court in 2012-13, season tickets peaked at 3,674 for the 2013-14 year.
